A Blow to Anti-Semitism

President Zaimis of Greece has signed a decree abolishing the separate electoral list for the Jews of Salonica. Former Premier Venizelos, who had advocated a discriminatory anti-Jewish measure, was defeated in the Senate by a substantial majority. The new decree deals a severe blow to the elder statesman who, as a last resort, turned to anti-Semitism for his political resurrection. Venizelos had built his reputation in Greece and abroad as a liberal. When he met with defeat during the elections, especially in Salonica, he allied himself with the anti-Semitic elements in Greece in the hope of returning to power. He overestimated the Nazi agitation and influence in his country, and will in all probability meet with overwhelming defeat at the next elections.

The Hylan Candidacy

Judge John F. Hylan, former Mayor of New York, who afterward found himself eliminated from the good graces of Tammany Hall, is trying to run for Governor on his "Recovery" ticket. Hylan's record as Mayor of New York hardly justifies that his candidacy for Governor of the Empire State be taken seriously. He was perhaps a well meaning but a distinctly ineffectual Mayor. He added to the gaiety of the nation whenever he discussed municipal or social problems. When he commenced to take himself seriously as Mayor and endeavored to disentangle himself from his Tammany affiliations, his intentions were good but his methods were crude and often ludicrous. But the pathetic Mayor had one good quality that made him rather sympathetic. On one point Mr. Hylan was always correct. He never identified himself with any special religious or racial groups and never encouraged prejudice on racial or religious grounds. That would be the last thing that the people would expect of "Honest John."

Now Mr. Hylan, through a peculiar irony of fate, finds himself the candidate for the Governorship of New York endorsed chiefly by the Nazified German-Americans. The program of these Nazified German-Americans is such that American candidates for office, municipal, state or Federal, are judged by Hitlerite standards, and the injection of racial and religious issues into the campaign is thus forced upon American political life.

By accepting the official endorsement of the Nazified German-Americans, any candidate gives his own endorsement to their alien, un-American and undemocratic program, unless he declares in unmistakable terms that he is definitely opposed to it.

Hylan Obtains Place on Ballot Over Protests

Flynn Ignores Evidence of Fictitious Names and Forgeries

Secretary of State Edward J. Flynn in Albany yesterday refused to bar the bigot-endorsed "Recovery Party" ticket from the ballot, despite protests up-state of Democratic leaders who presented an imposing array of evidence that many of the names on the petition nominating John F. Hylan for the governorship are either forged or fictitious.

Further action by opponents to Hylan's candidacy was being awaited late yesterday, in the form of Supreme Court injunction proceedings designed to restrain Flynn from certifying the nomination and to force him to keep Hylan's name off the ballot.

The "Recovery Party"—which thus far has indicated that it stands for recovery of political jobs by disgruntled former office holders, who are basing their hopes on a concerted anti-Semitic back-

Mizrachi in Poland Balk on Finances

WARSAW, Oct. 16.—Announcement that the party council of the Polish Mizrachi, orthodox Zionist group, would not participate in the raising of Zionist funds unless the Mizrachi demands are carried out concerning the observance of the Jewish religious tenets by settlers on land purchased by national funds, was made today.

The statement of the council also declared that the generally desired peace within the ranks of the Zionist movement was possible only if it embraced all groups within the movement.

LONDON, Oct. 16.—Sir Leonard Lionel Cohen, forced by the state of his health to resign from the presidency of the Jewish Colonization Association (ICA) which he has headed for about five years, was elected honorary president of the association at its annual meeting here today.

Sir Osmond E. d'Avigdor-Goldsmid will succeed Sir Leonard as president of the ICA.

Zahne Damages Nazi Hold Here By His Impatience for Power

Louis Zahne's vaulting personal ambition may yet hurl him clear over the peak of the German-American preeminence to which he aspires and into the limbo of oblivion beyond.

While Yorkville still buzzed with the repercussions of the political and pseudo-political activities which turned that section into a veritable beehive last week-end, a Jewish Daily Bulletin reporter made a flying survey of the situation there and found that sentiment among important leaders is veering definitely away from Zahne and his henchmen.

With the chairman of the German American Independent Voters

League himself off somewhere in the middle west, trying to establish additional branches of that new-born, squealing brainchild of his, chieftains of the German-American Conference and almost all its subsidiaries were rubbing their hands gleefully in delighted contemplation of his failure to obtain the chairmanship of the Conference political committee.

Zahne, who in recent months has mushroomed up out of nowhere has been just a little too impatient and high-handed for his own best interests, an information-hungry reporter was told.

Although no longer ago than early last week he had made no

Zion Council Is Opposed By Hadassah

Protest Given Through Jewish Agency; Asks for Further Study

(Special to the J.D.B.)

WASHINGTON, Oct. 16.—Present proposals for a legislative council to constitute the governing body in Palestine were bitterly opposed today by the twentieth annual convention of Hadassah in one of a number of resolutions seeking improved conditions for Jews in the holy land.

Expressing its protest through the Jewish agency, Hadassah urged that the British government further study the question, "in the hope and faith that a constructive plan will be found for the gradual establishment of self-governing institutions in Palestine in consonance with the Balfour declaration and the mandate of the League of Nations."

Urged Increased Immigration

Another resolution called upon the British government to increase the number of Jewish labor certificates "commensurate with the

Quiz Links Reich Nazis to 'Friends'

Kruppa Reveals Reprisals Against Anti-Nazis' Families in Germany

Disclosures linking the Friends of New Germany directly to the German Nazi Party, were made before the Congressional Committee investigating subversive and un-American activities in an open hearing at the Bar Association Building yesterday.

An elaborate system of reprisals in Germany against relatives of German-Americans who refused to join the Friends of New Germany was described by Frederick Karl Kruppa, who told the committee he held eight important positions in the Nazi movement here.

Other witnesses were Ernst Berkenhoff, a member of the German Nazi Party visiting here, who was subpoenaed after he lost a wallet containing his Nazi credentials.

New Hospital Cornerstone Laid in Zion

Speeches Broadcast to Hadassah Conclave in Washington

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

JERUSALEM, Oct. 16.—Impressive ceremonies today marked the laying of the cornerstone of the new Rothschild-Hadassah-Hebrew University Hospital on Mt. Scopus.

Members of the Palestine Administration, leaders of the world Zionist movement and local dignitaries participated. The speakers included Acting High Commissioner John Hathorn Hall; Dr. Judah Magnes, president of the University; Dr. Nahum Sokolow, president of the World Zionist Organization and of the Jewish Agency for Palestine; M. M. Ussishkin, president of the Jewish National Fund; Miss Henrietta Szold, first president of Hadassah, the American women's Zionist organization, and Haim Yassky.

In a speech praising the organizations and individuals involved in giving Jerusalem one of the outstanding medical institutions in the Near East and a center for scientific medical research, the Acting High Commissioner announced the impending capital grant by the government toward the cost of construction of the medical center.

Recalls Temple Destruction

Dr. Sokolow, in a short address, paid tribute to the work of Hadassah and recalled the days in 1918 when an American medical unit sponsored by the Hadassah, arrived in London en route to Palestine to cope with the then serious condition here.

Mr. Ussishkin, the head of the Jewish National Fund, which holds title to the land on which the medical center is being erected, pointed out that 1,865 years ago, the generals of the legions of Rome directed from the very site of the hospital, the military operations leading to the destruction of the Temple.

Following the open-air ceremonies, the five speakers retired to the offices of Chancellor Magnes in the University and from there took part in an international broadcast to the United States where, in Washington, the Hadassah is holding its twentieth annual convention. Julian Meltzer, staff correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, introduced the participants in the broadcast to the radio audience.

2 Refugee Professors 'Lost' Revisiting Reich

ISTANBUL, Oct. 16.—Anxiety regarding the fate of two German Jewish refugee professors, Liepmann and Schutz, who failed to return from what was to be a brief visit to Germany, has been aroused in Jewish and university circles.

The professors held posts at the university here and were to have spent a short vacation attending to personal affairs in Germany.

Berenson Will Leaves Sums To Academies

Fourth of Residuary Estate to Go to 8 Outfits

The will of Kalman Berenson, who died September 21, was filed for probate in Surrogate's Court here yesterday, distributing twenty-five per cent of his residuary estate among eight Jewish organizations. The estate was valued formally at "more than \$10,000."

After bequeathing \$1,450 in small amounts to six relatives and friends, Berenson left \$100 to the Jewish National Fund and \$50 to the Esros Torah Fund, 224 East Broadway.

Twenty-five per cent of the residue is to be apportioned as follows: Rabbi Jacob Joseph School, 165 Henry street, five per cent; Yeshiva Talmud Torah, Jerusalem, five per cent; Kollel Kowno and Kollel Beth Israel Talmudical Academy of Lithuania, 186 Hooper street, Brooklyn, four per cent; Yeshiva Chofetz Chaim Radum of Vilna, 238 East Broadway, three per cent; American Relief Society for the Yamenite Jews of Jerusalem, three per cent; Yeshiva Slobodka of Poland, Kovno, Lithuania, two per cent; Chevroner Yeshiva of Vilna, Jerusalem, two per cent, and Romalyas Yeshiva of Vilna, Vilna, one per cent.

An additional twenty per cent of the residue is bequeathed to a granddaughter, Paula Michael, of 125 Louisiana avenue, Brooklyn, and the remainder goes to the testator's daughter, Mrs. Eva Hoffman, of 1125 Nostrand avenue, Brooklyn.

The document, which was dated August 1, 1930, names Julius Goldsmith and the City Bank Farmers Trust Company, executors.

Department Store Owner Died Monday of Heart Attack

Robert I. Cohen Dead

GALVESTON, Texas, Oct. 16.—Robert I. Cohen Sr., successful department store operator here and in Houston, and the president of the American Maid Flour Mills of Houston, died here yesterday after a brief illness. Born in London, England, the son of an art dealer, Mr. Cohen was seventy-eight years old.

Landing in Boston, he came to this country at the age of sixteen. Five years later he settled in Galveston and in 1882 he married Miss Agnes Lord of this city who now survives him. Mr. Cohen was active in religious circles and was for thirty years president of Congregation B'nai Israel. At the time of his death, he was president emeritus.

Besides his widow, Mr. Cohen is survived by his sons, Robert Jr. and George S.; a daughter, Mrs. Gladys Cohen Blum; a sister Mrs. Fannie Buena de Mesquita of Ramsgate, England, and several grandchildren.

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Equal Rights

THE contemporary tragedy of the Jewish people, both the outer tragedy and the inner tragedy, is not least to be attributed to the superficial and unrealistic interpretation of the terms "rights" and "equal rights." This interpretation, which has done us immeasurable harm, derives from the eighteenth century Enlightenment, a period and a movement never to be mentioned without honor, but a period and a movement that did not know enough, that did not and would not reckon with the basic facts of human nature.

IT assumed that all men were alike; hence it reasoned that identical rights were equivalent rights, and proceeded to plead for equal, meaning identical rights, for all men. Along came Napoleon Bonaparte, that harsh realist, and summoned the Sanhedrin to Paris. He placed before that assembly certain questions. He said, in brief: You shall have civic rights equal to those of other French citizens if you will sell out spiritually and ethically, if you will abandon all separateness not only of action but of feeling, give up the Messianic hope, consider all Frenchmen your brethren and no one else across the frontier and, as a proof of your sincerity, approve of intermarriage. Well, poor old Sinzheimer and the others writhed and whimpered. They were no fools. But they accepted. What else could they do? But did they have equal rights? What other group of citizens had been asked to give up all that was dear and all that was venerable and all that they and their ancestors had cherished and had lived and died for during millennia? It was and it is to this day a ribald joke to say that for Jews or for any cultural minority identical rights are equivalent rights. We have never during the entire period of the emancipation had rights equal in value to us of the rights accorded to our fellow-citizens, for the glaring reason that identical rights could not in the nature of the case be equivalent rights to us. In the deepest sense we have never been emancipated; nor can we ever be except by a state that is based upon the concept of cultural and ideological pluralism sincerely and ab initio.

LET us revert in illustration once more to the ghastly situation in Vienna. Anyone at all in touch with the German situation knows that the cruellest part of it is the spiritual suffering of our children in the German schools, the psychical wounds (traumas) inflicted on them which through them will corrode generations yet unborn. Can any Jew, can any human being possessing a last rag of humane feeling, think of this tormenting of children without unbearable grief and rage? Well, those Jewish children in German schools have on paper equal rights. Does anyone doubt that in Vienna today the situation is rapidly becoming identical with the German situation? To speak of five Jewish children in a class of fifty in a school corrupted by anti-Semitic demonology as having any rights, identical or equivalent, is a joke of deathly gruesomeness. The first step toward giving them any rights is to concentrate them in Jewish schools, to make these schools nobly and self-affirmatively Jewish and thus to take away from them the burden of hatred, the corruption of soul and mind that has attacked their fellow-countrymen like a foul disease. Take it at its worst. Take it that the Austrian government has the quite literally insane brutality not to staff the Jewish schools with Jewish teachers. Well, in the face of a class of fifty Jewish children even a Nazi teacher would be powerless to insult, to wound, to harry. There is still a vestige of world-opinion. I do not think even Austria would proceed against Jewish children for quiet non-cooperation with a teacher who did not respect their Jewish sensibilities.

THIS simple but quite crucial example illustrates the fact that identical rights far from being equivalent rights (rights equal in value and effectiveness and the opportunity of exercising freedom) can become the source of the most fiendish tyranny and inhumanity. And this example can be multiplied a thousandfold. For the pagan neo-nationalistic state has tended all through the past century more or less toward totalitarian structure and tribal stupor. Both have arrived in country after country. The old pagan disease (see Plutarch on the Spartan state) has reached a virulent and poisonous crisis that may destroy civilization as we know it. Let us Jews at least think clearly; let us at least think the matter through. In the still libertarian and civilized countries let us decrease friction and train both ourselves and our Gentile fellow-citizens by making it clear that identical rights tend to impoverish us and irritate them. We need equivalent rights. Thus and thus only can a gradual process of happier readjustment set in. Once more I call attention to the fact that Catholic minorities in Protestant countries have always most wisely and most honorably sought in education, in the question of marriage and divorce, in the solution of still other problems, to achieve equivalent rights and have refused to avail themselves of identical rights which would have been to them not rights but oppression and injustice.

Benjamin Prins, Artist, Is Dead in Holland

AMSTERDAM, Oct. 8.—Benjamin Prins, famous Dutch Jewish painter, is dead. He was seventy-four.

A son of Liepmann Prins of Frankfurt-am-Main, Germany, he studied at Amsterdam, Antwerp and Paris. His works were hung at exhibitions in many cities of Europe and in 1904 one of his paintings was bought by Queen Wilhelmina.

Interment was in the Jewish cemetery of Muiderberg, near here. Members of his family were not present.

He Must Have Invincible Spirit, Abandon Delusions, Writer Says

New Jew Will Rid Self of Defeatist Viewpoint, Compel Respect and Admiration, Find Driving Ambition Is Curse

This is the fourth of a striking and important new series by the author of "Jewry Must About Face!" which the Jewish Daily Bulletin printed last month. So unprecedented was the response of readers to the earlier articles that it has been decided to regroup the two series and publish them in pamphlet form. The author's trumpet-like command to action represents a new force in Jewry, a new Jewish philosophy which will seize the hearts and minds of those in whom the spark of pride and manhood still burns bright. He presents no vague theories, but a concrete program, machinery for which already has been placed in motion.

The new Jew must not only depart from the vaporings and self-delusions of the past; he must have a theory of life. He must possess an invincible spirit. He must have pride and personal stature from which he can continuously draw strength. He must know what he is doing and have a business-like plan of operating.

He requires therefore not only a corporate structure enabling him to defend himself as a group, but an individual philosophy as well.

He will not dare to become once more what the Arabs graphically call "the children of death." He must not only rid himself of the defeatist, wailing, cringing viewpoint, but give over all theories of human regeneration in favor of a practical common-sense solution of his own difficulties.

The new Jew will be neither a ghetto mystic nor a dehydrated imitation of his gentile fellows.

He will discipline himself to an orderly viewpoint and curb his intense individualism in favor of the common welfare.

The Pragmatic Jew

He will regenerate himself into a hardy, purposeful man who will compel respect and admiration by his very existence.

He will make an effort not only to understand his position in the world but to understand himself as well.

He will not withdraw from communion with his civilized fellows, but will evolve a virile, definitely Jewish, ethical viewpoint on which he can rest.

He will more especially reanalyze the Jewish spectres of extreme ambition and endeavor to weigh them for their true worth.

It will occur to him finally that this driving ambition is the curse of modern Jewry since in itself it is a distortion of normal life. A Jewry which seems to feel that every sacrifice of spiritual and physical health is necessary in order to attain professional success is an unhealthy body.

Our group attitude toward success itself is nothing more than at attempt at escape from the repressions surrounding the Jewish group. It becomes thus a mere translation of the mystic one-sidedness of the Yeshiva into physical terms. In this sense at least it is the product of a weak attitude. It is by no means a sound compensation for a satisfactory emotional and balanced life.

In large degree it represents abandonment of the Jewish cultural strength, since it depends upon acceptance by the non-Jewish majority, thus inevitably fostering apprehension and an ingratiating attitude.

It is a pleasant thing for a man to be successful and to stand above his fellows. It is an unpleasant thing, however, when this success becomes the purpose of life itself, and exposes the individual to emotional intensity, and spiritual collapse.

A Revised Outlook

It is not necessary for a man to be a lawyer or doctor in order to live successfully.

It appears to me that we must revise our outlook, borrowing our substance again from the old He-

braic mind. Without derogating ambition in itself, we could rationally conceive that the really great success of life is merely in being happy, healthy and spiritually normal. There is no sense in making an obsession even of self-evident injustice, and it is here that the resourceful integrity of the race should make itself felt.

We young Jews have no fanatic viewpoint on this subject unless the desire to be strong, dynamic, healthy and serene, constitutes fanaticism. We simply feel that our birthright as men is a calm, balanced, pleasant life, and we do not wish to exchange it for a mess of pottage, whether that goes under the name of professional success or any other.

We have made up our mind that our great obligation at the moment is to ourselves, and that we are going to cease being an abnormal, neurotic people.

As a matter of first principles, the new Jew will value his own manhood. He will consequently give no ground whatever and make no concessions. When it comes down to the question of his rights as a man, he will feel himself unable to make any compromise.

The Counter-Attack

Far from merely resisting renewed assaults, he will lead a counter-attack upon existing disabilities.

He will say to the railroads and utilities that they are semi-public institutions which are kept up by the taxes and industry of all citizens. If they present us with a de facto condition whereby they do not give Jews employment, we can tell them in cold simple language that we do not acquiesce. As a matter of our pride alone, we cannot agree to this unprovoked assault upon our prerogatives.

If necessary we will lead a counter-assault, preaching public ownership of these behemoths. If required, we will go back to kerosene lamps. But we will not agree to any liquidation of our quality as men. We cannot allow anyone to consider us as obsequious pariahs.

We can at least adopt a non-cooperative attitude with any

corporation of any kind which fosters this mean, unkindly attitude. We must rigidly deny the right of any corporation to deprive our people of the privilege of work in accordance with their abilities.

We can at least serve notice all around to all these supercilious arrogant dealers in hate that they are looking at a New Jew, who, come what will, cannot agree to accepting this condition.

Meeting Social Snobbery

We can even face the lines of social snobbery drawn against us with the same indomitable will. While none of us who have strength wish admission into these forbidden circles, we are never going to agree to the inference of inferiority implicit in the denial. That attitude at least is manly, and if we absolutely refuse to have anything to do with any individuals who participate in this kind of hateful arrogance, we can live our lives at peace with ourselves.

Spineless poltroons can safely be predicted who will arise and argue the consequences in matters of dollars and cents.

As far as we are concerned, we politely wish them to the devil.

Every attitude that I postulate must be done with the cold, proud dignity with which the Jewish character should gird itself, as befits the sons of the oldest of all the civilized races. We must repress our noisy, disgusting individuals who carry their complaints and chest-beating to high heaven. We must be calm granite, not pitiful, sniveling outcasts.

We should turn the full force of our anger with equal impartiality to those bad mannered, cringing, unctious Jews who are making a shambles of our Jewish pride and spirit. We should visit them with the utter contempt they deserve. We should treat this Jew who besmirches the Jewish character with his actions, to the same thundering dislike that we do the non-Jewish anti-Semite.

A Warning to Anti-Semites

This latter we should warn in few words that he is not dealing with the acquiescent Jew he has grown used to. He should be told that any attempt to deprive us of our full civil rights will be successful only over our prostrate bodies—and perhaps his.

If necessary, we will break rocks in the desert, but we will not agree to whittling off one shaving from our manhood here or anywhere else.

After all, why shouldn't we Jews take this position? On the face of it it may sound impolitic, but it is our true position. The disgusting amenability of our past leaders has not served to halt even the least rabid of our foes.

Can we not say that we have won every right we claim? We have contributed our good citizenship, our labor, intellect and industry. Our blood has flowed freely on every battlefield in defense of our countries' welfare. What

Students Assail Einstein Plea For Support of Exile's Relief

Professor Albert Einstein yesterday received a protest, signed by Joseph Cohen, executive secretary of the National Student League, and by Theodore Draper, editor of the Student Review, against the scientists' endorsement of the International Student Service as the exclusive agency for raising funds for exiled German students.

The chief charge made by Cohen and Draper against the International Student Service is that the organization sends students from Fascist Germany to Fascist Italy. The protest quotes from the official report of the I.S.S., which states: "We have succeeded in finding a collaboration in Italy with excellent relations to the University in Rome."

"We ask you to reconsider and retract your endorsement of the International Student Service," the letter reads in part. "It must renounce its claims to such a high trust by its alliance with Fascism in Italy. We must not let the left hand go ignorant of what the right hand is going. We cannot oppose Fascism in Germany if we accept Fascism in Italy as our ally."

we ask for belongs to us by right and we cannot quietly see it taken away from us, not even by degrees.

Protecting Our Native Land

In the years to come history will perhaps say that in protecting ourselves, it was we who protected our country from the collapse of her free democratic institutions, and live to thank us for it.

The course I suggest is obviously difficult. Spiritless Jews have already rubbed their hands together and whined that it was faced with monumental hardships. These are the contemptible creatures who simply parade in men's clothes, and are willing to let someone else fight their battles for them and if no one will, to sacrifice spirit, honor and name.

It is axiomatic to those of us who have faced the world with some attempt at gallantry that what is worth getting is worth fighting for. We can only agree to a courageous, spirited race which will meet its troubles with a grim smile and a will to win through.

We do not even admit that there is any Jewish question. There is certainly no Jewish question of our own making. The very term is an affront to us. All we can admit is that there is an anti-Semitic question.

Neither can we admit that anyone can set up as a "friend of the Jews." There is a disparaging, patronizing air to the entire assertion which we cannot accept. We require no professional friends and simply ask to be treated as men and to be judged as men. We want the same decent respect which exists between a Baptist and a Methodist, and require no specious handling.

We young Jews have no intention of being combative or self-assertive. We will face our lives with quiet strength and self-respect.

But we intend to give no ground anywhere.

Beth David Hospital Opens Drive Tonight

State and city officials will initiate a campaign for \$100,000 for the Beth David Hospital at a reception tonight in the Ball Room of the Hotel Commodore, it was announced by Charles D. Loventhal, treasurer of the institution.

United States Senator Royal S. Copeland, Supreme Court Justice Samuel Rosenman, Magistrate Louis B. Brodsky, and Magistrate Benjamin Greenspan will be guests of honor at the function.

The Beth David Hospital is located at Lexington avenue and 113th street, in the lower Harlem district. It recently purchased a new building, now occupied by the Manhattan General Hospital, which will increase the present bed capacity to 250 beds.

\$300,000 Short In German Aid, J. D. C. Reports

Forced to Reduce Allotments in Last 6 Months by One-Half

The Joint Distribution Committee has been forced to reduce its allotments for German-Jewish aid for the last six months of the current year by half, it was revealed in a report by Paul Baerwald, chairman of the executive committee. While, for the period from January 1 to June 30, the organization allotted approximately \$600,000 for the program of German aid, including activities within Germany and in refugee countries, for the last six months it was forced to reduce its allotment to \$300,000.

"In all," Mr. Baerwald reported, "about \$910,000 has been allotted for the German aid program this year, and about \$240,000 for the program in Eastern and Central Europe (including Russia) and cultural activities."

The total grants to the Zentral Ausschuss in Berlin were approximately \$275,000 which the Zentral Ausschuss, in turn, added to its own collections for its affiliated organizations for emigration and repatriation aid, including grants to the Hilfsverein and the Palestine Amt; for economic assistance through free loan Kassen for vocational training and retraining (Berufsumschichtung) and economic readjustment; for education and schooling; and relief and welfare aid, especially in the smaller communities throughout Germany.

France Leads

France, which granted haven to the greatest number of refugees, has received the largest allotments during the first six months of this year \$205,000.

For the refugee activities in this country, the committee has made grants to the Emergency Committee in Aid of Displaced Foreign Physicians, the National Coordinating Committee for German Refugees.

Mr. Baerwald also announced that Mr. and Mrs. Pierre duPont of Wilmington, Delaware, have contributed \$1,000 to the non-sectarian campaign for the aid of German refugees of that city.

Toledo Synagogue Installation

TOLEDO, Ohio, Oct. 16.—The B'nai Israel Synagogue of this city installed officers this evening at a banquet. Ben Silverblatt, president; Joseph Feerer, vice-president; and Jacob Romanoff, treasurer were reelected for the third time.

Bulgarian Order on Teachers Rouses Jews to Indignation

Pedagogues in Language, History, Religion and Gymnastics Are Affected Under Mandate Issued by Ministry of Education

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
SOFIA, Oct. 8.—Indignation is sweeping the Jewish population as the result of an order, issued by the Ministry of Education, that teachers in the private schools must be Bulgarians and Bulgarian citizens.

The order applies to pedagogues in the following subjects: Bulgarian language, history, religion and gymnastics.

Teachers in other subjects may be non-citizens, but on condition that they have obtained a higher pedagogic education.

All permits which have been issued to teachers who have had no pedagogic training, such as those who have gone through non-pedagogic high schools, are being withdrawn and the teachers concerned will no longer be allowed to teach in private schools. In addition, the order provides that the schools must be closed on Sundays and Christian festivals.

Had Special Privileges

Hitherto the private Jewish schools have had the right to be open on Sundays and holidays and were allowed to be closed on the Jewish sabbath and festivals.

The Jews consider the order as almost tantamount to a degrada-

tion to the rank of second-class citizens. The order will bring about the deprival of about 150 Jewish families of their means of livelihood.

It will also result in a heavy blow at the movement which is being carried on for the Hebraization of private schools in Bulgaria, because most of the teachers carrying on this work will lose their positions.

Communities Must Pay

The introduction of Bulgarian teachers by means of this order is not accompanied by any assumption of responsibility for the finances of these schools by the state. The maintenance of these schools continues to fall upon the Jewish communities.

There are reports that the intention of the government reform is to reorganize the schools of national minorities in Bulgaria on lines which will accord better with the interests of the country, and it is not aimed directly at the Jews.

The Jews are brought in, however, because of the necessity to generalize the reform for all private schools. The order speaks in this regard of Turkish, Armenian and Jewish schools.

Samuel, in Holland Studies Zion Work

Palestine Official Confers With Dutch on Refugee Aid Work

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
AMSTERDAM, Oct. 8.—Edwin Samuel, sub-director of the emigration department of the Palestine government and the eldest son of Sir Herbert Samuel, leader of the British Liberal party, was a recent visitor to Holland.

He had conversations at the British legation and with the Dutch emigration commissioner of the Jewish Agency, Dr. I. Cohen of Rotterdam. He evinced deep interest in all questions connected with the training of Palestine pioneers and the emigration of German Jewish refugees.

He conferred with the leaders of refugee relief work here and also with the secretary of the Dutch Keren Hayesod, Dr. B. A. Kahn.

New Nazi Book Traces All Ills To Jews' Door

Weekly Which Reviews It Also Hits Hebrew School Plan

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
BERLIN, Oct. 9.—A new anti-Semitic book, "Jude and Arbeiter" by J. O. H. Schulz, a resume of which appeared in the Berlin weekly, Die Wahrheit, has just been published in Berlin.

The book, according to Die Wahrheit, deals with the "sinister" influence of the Jew on German workers from the time of Max Beer and Karl Marx down to the World War and afterwards. The book charges that every Marxist celebration in the last ten years had a Jewish stamp on it; that the revolt of 1919 was led by Jews and that the German republic was created by a Jew. Not satisfied with conquering the worker, the writer states, the Jew set out to dominate the theatre, the movies, the arts. This domination of every phase of German life, he finds, was a conspiracy toward world domination by Jews. Thanks to Hitler the Jew was defeated in his ultimate plans.

The same paper expresses indignation at the proposed erection of a Hebrew school on Joachimsthaler street, Berlin, by the Jewish builder Sohn. With hidden threats the weekly urges that the plan for erection of the school be set aside on the ground that "Aryan" tenants living nearby will be annoyed by the chatter of Jewish children and will be obliged to move away. The school will be erected directly opposite the German school, and that, the weekly claims, is inadvisable in that German children will be brought face to face with Jewish children when school hours are over.

Ask Holland to Act Against Dutch Nazis

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
AMSTERDAM, Oct. 9.—The permanent committee for the affairs of the Ashkenazi Jewish community in Holland has asked the Dutch government to act against the Dutch Nazi party. The basis for the request is a statute which outlaws the sowing of hatred. The leader of the Dutch Nazis is Major Kruyt, who produces anti-Semitic utterances verbally and in print. His party is virtually a branch of the German Hitlerites in Holland.

Experts Dig Up Historic Finds In Gezer Ruins

One of Solomon's Wives Brought Him City as Part of Dowry

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)
LONDON, Oct. 8.—Gezer, the Canaanite city near Jaffa which formed part of the dowry of one of King Solomon's wives, is the scene of important discoveries by an expedition working under the auspices of the Palestine Exploration Fund and led by Alan Rowe, the Jerusalem correspondent of The News-Chronicle reports.

Experts have unearthed a head of the Goddess Ashtoreth, a cat fashioned of agate and an image of the cat-headed Egyptian Goddess Bast, all dating from 2,000 B.C.

Additional references to the Gezer excavations are contained in the following cable from The Herald's correspondent:

"This once royal city of Canaan, on the boundary of Ephraim, actually formed part of the marriage portion of one of Pharaoh's daughters, whom Solomon married early in his reign.

"Years before the city had been captured by the invading Egyptians and its return was a typical result of Solomon's reputed wisdom.

"By marrying Pharaoh's daughter he not only secured the friendship of the Egyptians, but also acquired control of this important Canaanite stronghold.

"As soon as he got it back Solomon rebuilt the fortress which Pharaoh had attacked and left in ruins.

"Apart from the discoveries relating to the ancient history of Gezer, the Palestine Exploration Expedition, led by Mr. Alan Rowe, has found further traces of the Egyptian occupation of the city.

Tombs dating back more than 4,000 years have been unearthed. They are just as they were when first built and through the centuries have escaped the depredations of robbers."

Requests for Insane

"At Manchester last week he proved his optimism," the newspaper says, "by proclaiming his belief in the survival of the Liberal racehorse.

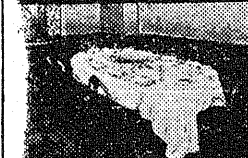
"Now he has written a book on ethics, which is shortly to be published. The title has not yet been fixed but may be 'Problems of Conduct.'

"Sir Herbert has long been a keen amateur philosopher. Last year he published a pamphlet on the same subject called 'The Tree of Good and Evil.'"

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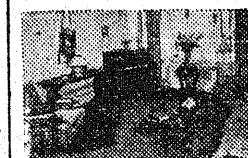

The Bulletin's Day Book

The Nazis in Yorkville are a happy lot these days. Up in the gently rolling hills of East Eighty-sixth street and environs, the Hitler shadows and "ja" men are dancing in the halls and in the alleys, in the highways and in the byways. In the Tyrolean cafes and in the Bavarian beer stubes, the laddies and the lassies are beating the drums and crashing the cymbals.

Such sterling American patriots as Dr. Herbert Schnuch of the Friends of New Germany and Louis Zahne of the German American Independent Voters League are walking on air. Their eyes sparkle with a new hope. Their chests bulge with a new pride. Their tongues wag with a new purpose.

Sheep and shepherd, all Yorkville seems to be imbued with an amazing amount of zip, zest and ginger.

Where does it all come from? What's happened to a section of the city and the city's population that but a few weeks ago had appeared to be in a more or less moribund condition, that had to resort to scratching swastikas on Jewish shop windows to get in the news?

When so much good cheer and so much ebullience suddenly descend upon a normally gloomy people, it makes one wonder as to the cause? In crime fiction, detectives exclaim "cherchez la femme" for the answer. But in Yorkville, "cherchez la femme" would be merely an empty phrase, signifying, as an eminent author once wound up an equally eminent phrase, nothing. The nifties, somehow or another seem to shy away from the Hitler camp which consigns them to an everlasting grind of Kueche, Kinder und Kirche.

What then, has brought the happy glint into the Yorkville eye?

The Day Book will keep the reader in suspense no longer.

It's Red Mike Hylan, formerly New York's shoutingest Mayor and now an Associate Justice in the Domestic Relations Court hearing children's cases at a measly little salary of \$17,500 a year.

Hylan, it seems, who used to shout long and loud for a five cent fare from Van Cortlandt Park in the Bronx to Coney Island by the ocean, is on the verge of shouting for a five-cent fare from New York to Albany or vice-versa. If a five-cent fare between these two cities isn't part of the good Judge's platform in his gubernatorial race, then we'll be terribly disappointed. He couldn't possibly get a better plank to stand on—unless it is demanding the five-cent fare for a round trip between Albany and New York.

But what the Nazis up in Yorkville are delighted about is not what Red Mike's platform is going to be—they probably don't give a hoot about that trivial item. They're kicking up their heels in glee at the fact that Red Mike is running at all and is accepting their "heils" and their endorsements.

For Red Mike is a 100 per cent. "Aryan" and Red Mike is a famous man, or he used to be, and Red Mike makes a mighty noise when he mounts a soap box and, all in all, Red Mike is the most outstanding man the poor Nazis up in Yorkville have ever been able to snare at least partially into their camp.

And Red Mike will be the only non-Jewish candidate in the race against Lehman, Moses and Solomon.

No wonder the York-villians are in high good humor.

But the Nazis are in for a humpty-d umpty of disillusionment. They're singing hosannas

and beating the drums for the wrong guy. They're rooting for the wrong horse.

Red Mike, although he's turned very seedy by comparison with the days when he was in his prime as a member of the ruling triumvirate of Hearst, Hylan and Hirshfeld, is still an astute politician; we say this despite the fact that he seems to be doing everything in his power to belie that estimate of his ability.

Hylan is too smart a bird to try to fight the Jews in their home bailiwick. He's too smart a bird to wage an openly anti-Semitic campaign. He may not be above taking advantage of the anti-Jewish sentiment that will swing the German-American vote to him, but he is all too keenly aware of the black future New York will hold for him if he dares in so much as one speech to cater to that sentiment with even an ambiguous remark that might be remotely interpreted as an attack on the Jews.

In the privacy of Yorkville's cellars, Red Mike, in order to seal the support of German-Americans may promise to do this and that and the other thing once he gets up in Albany, but those promises if they're concerned with anti-Semitism at all, will be a dark secret from the public. And if they're hinted at in the press, then Red Mike will publicly deny them and publicly denounce racial feeling.

Yes, Red Mike will promise the Nazis everything. But the Day Book will bet better than plugged nickels that he'll give them nothing—like the smart politician he is.

And come election day, the Yorkville Nazis, their bellies full of Red Mike's beer and puffing Red Mike's cigars, will lose that gay glint in their eyes. Their footsteps once more will drag along East Eighty-sixth street. They'll once more begin to think about taking it out on the Jews by scratching swastikas on their shop windows. And, they'll take up a chant made famous by the Jewish manager of Max Schmeling, the Black Uhlan: "We wuz robbed!"

Polish Consul Defends Government's Action On Minorities Treaties

(Special to the J.D.B.)

DETROIT, Oct. 16.—J. Matusinski, Polish Consul, has issued a statement in defending his government's action on the minorities question.

Arguing that Poland's decision "has no connection with the actual interests of minorities," Mr. Matusinski said that "These interests are and will be protected by the Constitution of the Republic of Poland. . . . Poland, however, is unwilling to accept supervision from states, which are not themselves bound by any guarantees of minorities residing in those States."

The Polish Consul further declares that "general consensus of Jewish public opinion in Poland, as voiced by the Jewish press there, shows that Jewish citizens of the Republic join with their Polish fellow citizens in loyal support of this stand of their government."

Detroit Pastor Defends Hitler, Angers Jews

Says Chancellor Did Not Create Anti-Semitism

(Special to the J.D.B.)

DETROIT, Oct. 16.—A defense of Hitler and Hitlerism in the pulpit and over the radio today had stirred the Jewish population of Detroit to indignation.

Dr. Frederick B. Fisher, minister of the Central Methodist Episcopal Church, in one of a series of addresses on Germany from his pulpit, which was broadcast over the radio, declared that he refused to become exercised over "Germany's current excursion into racial extravagance."

Dr. Fisher said that anti-Semitism had its roots planted in the past and was not the creation of Adolf Hitler. He declared:

"As for my Jewish friends who have written me bitter letters because I find some commendable trends in the new Germany, let me say to them that I see in this awakening of a nation something much bigger than racial bigotry."

Following Jews' Example

Analyzing the causes of what he called the "weird and unwholesome" antagonism between the Hitlerites and the Jews, Dr. Fisher offered the theory that the Gentiles in Germany are attempting to pattern their lives after the German Jews. He proceeded to state:

"In Munich, only two per cent of the population has been Jews, yet this two per cent, through an intense cooperative effort and by keeping their racial bloodstream pure, managed to gain fifty per cent of the leading positions in the business, professional and artistic life of that city."

"These Jews of Munich became more clever, developed more finesse, educated their young in law, in banking, in music. As a result, they dominated Munich. So, in Munich, the ninety-eight per cent attempting to imitate the highly successful two per cent, has become race conscious and would attempt to develop a bloodstream as pure as that of the Jews."

Urges Calmness

Dr. Fisher said he deplored the "mad movement against Hitler" in which many churchmen are taking part.

"With these men," he said, "I greatly regret the anti-Jewish policy, but vilification never solved a problem. We must work it out calmly and we must help Germany in its desperate effort to arise out of its difficulties and gain parity with other civilized nations of the world."

Vienna Group Demands New School System

Peoples Party Suggests Special Jewish Schools

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)

VIENNA, Oct. 6.—The Jewish Peoples' Party, in a statement issued today on the school question, declares the government's statement that there is no intention to affront the Jewish pupils by segregating them is not doubted but insists that the order has this effect all the same.

The statement, signed by ex-Deputy Robert Stricker, also suggests the establishment of a public Jewish school system. It follows:

"The opening of the school year of 1934-35 has raised anew the Jewish school problem. An order issued by the Ministry of Education has provided for the segregation of Jewish pupils in the Viennese schools from the Catholic pupils and their placing in separate classes together with Kofesslose pupils.

Denies Affront Intended

"This measure, it says, has created the feeling in Jewish quarters that there is a segregation of Jewish pupils. In view of this feeling, the education authorities have declared officially that there is no intention of an affront to the Jewish pupils and that the measure is based on purely practical reasons.

"A further order provides for the modification of any hardships resulting on the removal of certain pupils from their previous class organizations.

"The Jewish Peoples' Party has investigated this matter and has come to the following conclusion:

"The statement by the authorities that there is no intention of an affront to the Jewish pupils is not doubted, but it cannot change the fact that the order in its application has this effect. Practical school reasons alone, such as the difficulties in arranging for religious education in the mixed classes, cannot justify a measure which arouses in Jewish pupils the feeling that they are being segregated as an undesirable element from the general body of the school attendance.

"The Jewish Peoples' Party therefore repudiates this method of class division. It is aware, however, that this repudiation does not solve the Jewish school problem, and that this demands a positive attitude both on the part of Jewry and on the part of the Government.

"The Austrian Government, on entering into office and subsequently, has announced that it sees one of its tasks in the transformation of the existing school system into the national religious education of the youth. The national Austrian Jewry has understanding for this plan. It recognizes the right of the Government to educate the German Christian youth in the German Christian spirit.

Must Aid Jewish Youth, Too

"But there is in the State of Austria, which has established the equality of rights of all nations and religions as a fundamental, a Jewish youth for whose education the Government has to provide according to the same principles and in the same manner as for the education of the German Christian youth.

Artisans' Body In Poland Quits Pending Probe

Executive Unit Awaits Inquiry of Attack on Its President

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

WARSAW, Oct. 16.—Pending an investigation of allegations that its president, M. Rassner, had engaged in demoralizing activities injurious to the interests of Jewish artisans, the executive council of the Federation of Jewish Artisans has resigned, it was officially announced today.

A congress of Jewish artisans will be convoked shortly to investigate the suspicions regarding M. Rassner, who has also been excluded from membership in the United Committee of Jewish Artisans until the congress has pronounced its view of the case.

Fight for Future

Polish Jewish artisans have of late been engaged in a bitter fight for their future existence. According to a new law no one may be engaged as an artisan without first having obtained an artisan's license. Because of the specific requirements to be fulfilled before the license is issued, the Jewish artisans find it very difficult to obtain such license cards. Nevertheless, some ten thousand Jewish artisans are of legal status. This was brought about by concerted efforts on the part of the United Committee representing the Joint Distribution Committee, the Jewish Colonization Association, the Central Artisans' League and the ORT, which promotes technical trades among Jews.

A campaign to revoke the licenses of the Jewish artisans was recently begun by several non-Jewish artisans' groups, on the ground that the Jewish workers do not hold master's diplomas. It is expected, however, that the ministry of trade will not accede to this demand.

lection of Jewish pupils in separate class-rooms, where they will be educated by non-Jewish teachers in a thoroughly un-Jewish manner is to be rejected from every point of view. It is in crass contradiction to the principle of national religious education. It is equally in conflict to the law which applies in Austria for equality of rights for all nations and religions, because it does not take account of the needs of the Jewish youth in the same way as it does of the German Christian youth.

Urges Special System

"The Jewish Peoples' Party believes that the time has come to submit to the Government a proposal for the establishment of a public Jewish school system in Austria. Those Jewish citizens who desire that their children should be trained under Jewish direction in the national religious spirit, in loyalty to their nation and faith, and as loyal Austrians, should be given an opportunity by the creation of a Jewish school system. Such a Jewish school system will not only satisfy a just demand of the Jews who are loyal to their nation and religion, but will also contribute to clarifying the relations between the non-Jewish and Jewish citizens, shaping them on harmonious lines, and especially of removing the differences that exist in the sphere of the school system. The creation of a class of Jewish teachers necessary for the establishment of a Jewish school system is of extreme social importance, and will also benefit the abnormal Jewish occupational composition.

"All these reasons lead the Jewish Peoples' Party to submit to the Austrian Government a motion for the establishment of a public school system."

"We are going to make plans for the most important drive ever undertaken by Federation, which does the major portion of organized Jewish charity in the Bronx and Manhattan," Mr. Goldman stated in making known the details of the initial meeting.

Vice-chairmen of the Bronx division are: M. Maldwin Fertig, Abraham Krasne, Max J. Schneider, and Isidor Teitelbaum. Other group chairmen who will be actively involved in the Bronx division this year are: Emil Leitner, chairman Real Estate Division; William Klapp, chairman, professional groups; Bernard Mogilesky, chairman, district organization; William Lyman, associate chairman, district organization, and Bernard Trencher, chairman, speakers' bureau.

Dr. Louis Levy was re-elected president and David Gensburger, ninety years old, and for seventy-two years a member of the congregation, was elected to an honorary life membership.

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Reich Keeping Faith on Games, Sherrill Says

Found Jewish Athletes Training for the Olympics

Germany is apparently keeping faith with the American Olympic Committee in her promise to permit Jewish athletes to train for the 1936 Olympics, it was asserted by General Charles H. Sherrill, former United States Ambassador to Turkey, and a member of the International Olympic Committee, on his arrival yesterday aboard the Ile de France.

General Sherrill has been in Europe since last April and spent much of the time in Germany.

"I went there to satisfy myself that Germany is carrying out her agreement not to exclude Jews from training for the Olympics," General Sherrill said. "I found that Germany has already invited seventeen leading German Jewish athletes to train for the Olympics and they are training. I talked to several of them and they had no fear of later reprisals."

All Won't Qualify

General Sherrill pointed out, however, that not all of these seventeen could be expected to qualify.

"My job," he said, "is to see that they get a chance to qualify and I shall do nothing else between now and 1936."

Asked whether he saw Jewish athletes participating in training activities in Germany, the General snapped:

"You bet I did see them."

General Sherrill was the member of the International Olympics Committee who, when it met a year ago last June, insisted that Germany put in writing her promise not to discriminate against Jews in the Olympics.

No Compliance Yet

He also revealed yesterday that the Nazi officials in charge of the Olympics training program have asked the two leading Jewish athletic associations in Germany, the Maccabim and the Jewish War Veterans, to suggest the names of more athletes who should be given training facilities.

Thus far, General Sherrill asserted, the associations have not complied with this request.

In discussing the matter of the seventeen athletes now in training, he advanced the following argument which has been used by German officials and other apologists for Nazi discrimination against Jews:

"Of course the seventeen men will have to qualify. In this connection it should be noted that there was no Jewish question in Great Britain two years ago and yet there was only one Jewish athlete on the British Olympic Team and on our American team of 448 only five of the athletes were Jewish."

Reich Publishes New List Of Sports Regulations

New regulations for Jewish sports organizations in Germany, issued by the Reichs Sport Leader, have been published in the C. V. Zeitung, organ of the Central Union of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency reports from Berlin.

Under these regulations Jewish sports organizations are permitted to function, except only in single cases when they are prohibited by police order for anti-state activities. These organizations must adhere to some worker's community known to the Reichs Sport Leader. The simultaneous adherence of these sports organizations to approved world Jewish organizations is not affected.

recognized present economic condition in the country."

The convention also voted recognition of the work of James G. McDonald in rehabilitating German Jewish refugees.

The resolution calling upon the British government to increase the number of labor certificates pointed out that the British government has distinguished itself by "humane protest against the barbarous treatment of the Jews in Hitler's Germany."

By its hospitality to Jewish refugees and displaced scholars it has recognized "that all civilized nations must somehow meet the situation to offset this barbarity perpetrated against the Jews in Germany."

In a report of expenditures, Mrs. Samuel J. Rosensohn, of New York, national treasurer, reported that last year Hadassah sent \$310,000 to Palestine toward support of its medical and health work and toward the Jewish National Fund, the Zionist land purchasing agency.

For next year the convention approved budgets totalling \$276,000, of which \$35,000 is for the Jewish National Fund.

Mrs. Edward Jacobs of New York, was elected president of Hadassah to succeed Mrs. Samuel W. Halprin of New York, who will go to Palestine with her family to make her permanent home. The convention adopted a resolution commending the work of Mrs. Halprin as organization president and, in recognition of her services, ordered her name inscribed in the golden book of the Jewish National Fund.

H. A. Gordon, Jewish Lawyer, Places Name on Hylan Ticket

Harry A. Gordon stood revealed yesterday as the Jewish red herring across the trail of anti-Semitism which leads directly to the campaign headquarters of former Mayor John F. Hylan, Nazi-endorsed candidate for the Governorship on the "Recovery Party" ticket.

Gordon's name was one of five submitted by the party as substitutions for those it had previously announced on its state ticket. He is running for an associate judgeship in the Court of Appeals in place of Russell Kruppenbacher of Queens.

Characterizing himself as "a good Jew" and "the son of Orthodox parents," Gordon branded as ridiculous the charge that Hylan has solicited and obtained almost exclusively Nazi backing, and professed never to have heard that the former mayor has won solid

Undaunted by 'Jewish Intrigue,' Says 'Chief' Pelley in Circular

ASHEVILLE, N. C., Oct. 16.—William Dudley Pelley, commander of the Silver Shirts, denies in a circular letter appealing for subscriptions to the Silver Shirt Weekly that he has "shot his bolt."

In the letter, Pelley makes no bones about the fact that he wants more financial backing for his magazine:

"Before me on my desk lies a national list of 1,708 people who were formerly enthusiastic readers of Liberation but who have not as yet permitted me to hear from them in the matter of our present publication. Figured at the annual subscription price of \$5 per reader, that represents a potential capital of \$8,540."

Patting himself on the chest, Pelley's letter says:

"The enemy has tried his utmost this past summer to shatter and

erase us by demolishing our beautiful and efficient headquarters, impounding records, intercepting mail and carrying his campaign of criminal intimidation abroad to the individual.

"Despite mistakes of all judgment due to pressures on me of which the nation can never know, I have gathered up the remnants of our staff, brought out seven numbers of a new magazine, re-established headquarters, and successfully battled to the moment the strategies of Jewish legal intrigue against me."

The epistle, which is two pages long, single-spaced, announces that the Asheville "bad boy" has prepared a new booklet, called "Put Yourself in My Place," in which he has "rigorously" answered the "calumnies, defamations and libels" which, he claims, are being circulated concerning him.

bones about his confident expectation of being named head of the political committee, he discovered at the last minute that he had over-rated the forces he could hope to marshal under his standards.

Thus, when delegates from the various societies which comprise the German-American Conference met in Turn Halle last Friday night, Zahne made a tactical decision to withdraw his candidacy for the chairmanship and to be satisfied with mere membership in the unit.

If he had pushed his claims to the office, a reporter learned yesterday, he would have been subjected to the merciless fire of most of those present, who have viewed with distaste his recent extremist statements on the racial issue and his open avowal of Nazism.

As it turned out, however, Zahne stepped down in time to save some of the shreds of his prestige, and William Fust, conservative leader of the Plattdeutsche Verein of Brooklyn, was appointed to the chair.

Of the eight members of the committee, which now has been instructed to act purely as an information bureau, two are definitely aligned with Zahne. They are Fred Staademann and Carl Nicolai.

The other four members are George Schattner, John H. Werdermann, Dietrich Wortmann and C. K. Froehlich, who serves in an ex-officio capacity by virtue of his presidency of the Conference.

Hitler to Rule Reich for Life, Aide Declares

Chancellory Official Asserts August 1 Law So Provides

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Oct. 16.—While the rumblings of revolt were rising from the throats of more than a thousand Protestant ministers in Germany, Reichsfuehrer Hitler is resorting to the time-honored pastime used by rulers in a crisis of whistling in the dark.

"I shall rule Germany for the rest of my life"

The quotation is not directly from the mouth of Hitler. But it came in substance last night from the lips of Dr. Hans Lammers, State Secretary of the Reich Chancellory, in the course of an address before the Academy of Administrative officials.

The statement by Dr. Lammers was based, he said, on the law of August 1, 1934, under which Hitler took over the duties of the late Field Marshal von Hindenburg. This law, he pointed out, means that "previous constitutional provisions on duration of the office were rescinded."
