### Propaganda Racketeers

John L. Spivak, writing in this week's New Masses on "Plotting the American Pogroms," devotes the fourth article of his series "Rich Jews who finance anti-Semitism." He states that a number of prominent wealthy Jews, directors of well-known corporations, have directly or indirectly contributed funds to anti-Communist racketeers in America who are at the same time promoting Fascism and anti-Fascism in this country, and who are using these funds to disseminate in the United States the "Protocols of the Wise Men of Zion."

Mr. Spivak writes in the New Masses:

"Harry A. Jung, of Chicago, is the head of a widespread espionage organization, the American Vigilante Intelligence Federation, Post Office 144, Chicago. This organization was originally founded to spy on Communists and Socialists, but Jung found that he needed a new terror-inspiring 'issue' with which to collect money from suckers. There are anti-Semites who actually believe the stuff in the 'Protocols of Zion,' but others, active in spreading the seed of hate against Jews, do so only because it has become a money-raising proposition. Jung is in the latter class."

"When Hitler came into power this Prince of Racketeers discovered that he could get cash by fanning the smoldering flames of anti-Semitism in the United States. With five years of economic crisis for millions of Americans, and failure on the part of most of them to understand the causes, putting the blame on the 'International Jew' came easy. This 'patriot' promptly made connections with Hitler's anti-Semitic propagandists in this country and started disseminating the 'hate the Jew' creed on a large scale. And in the course of this activity he used money collected from Jews to distribute the 'Protocols of Zion' as well as other anti-Semitic propaganda. Today Jung is in constant touch with directors of anti-Semitic propaganda in Germany, and receives his instructions from Hitler's stronghold in Munich."

"The man to whom this hundred and twenty percent American 'patriot' reports is Frank Schuller, c/o Frederick Deckel, Waskirnerstrasse, 7-13, Munich, Germany."

"When Jung heard how Pelley and others were capitalizing anti-Semitic propaganda in this country, he got busy and discovered that the Jews were plotting not only to seize the United States but the whole world, Scandinavia included. 'The Protocols of Zion' long discredited as forgeries, were raked up and armed with these Jung's

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## Probe Aide Acts to Halt Nazi Charter

Dickstein Carries Fight  
on 'Friends' to  
Albany

Congressman Samuel Dickstein, vice-chairman of the Congressional Committee investigating subversive activities, will leave for Albany today or tomorrow morning to take the first step in the Committee's fight to block the incorporation of the Friends of New Germany, pro-Nazi organization, he informed the Jewish Daily Bulletin yesterday.

The first move he will make, he said, will be to halt final approval of the certificate of incorporation until a hearing can be held before Secretary of State Edward J. Flynn on the desirability of granting the organization a charter.

Should Have Held Hearing

"With every justice of the peace in the country knowing that the Friends of New Germany is being investigated," he said, "the court should have held a hearing before approving the certificate."

Failing forestalling of final approval of the charter through the Secretary of State, Mr. Dickstein said he will seek through the Attorney General and the courts to have the charter nullified.

"I stopped incorporation of the organization in New Jersey and other states," he declared. "The reason they are so anxious to incorporate is that they are losing members and they think they can recapture these by the sanctity they will gain through incorporation."

Write Secretary of State

In a letter to Secretary Flynn, Mr. Dickstein asserted that "this organization is a mask for the Nazi party to gain a foothold in the United States, with the object, of converting this country from a democracy into a dictatorship on the Hitler model."

The letter, written on the letterhead of the Congressional Committee, voiced the Committee's protest against granting the charter.

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## Nazi 'Friends' Violate Pledge, Chicago Pow-wow Has Odor

CHICAGO, Oct. 21.—The Friends of New Germany, American pro-Nazi organization, met here last night in the grand ballroom of the Palmer House to celebrate the anniversary of the organization. More than 1,600 attended. The audience stood to attention as eight American and twenty swastika flags were carried into the room by a uniformed color guard. The Hitler salute was given at the opening and closing of the meeting.

Officials of the organization described the ceremonies as "purely for the promotion of friendship between the United States and Germany." The program of the evening, which was of a marked military nature, opened with a parade through the ball room by

## Reich Conditions Grow Worse, Joint Foreign Body Reports

LONDON, Oct. 21.—Legally, the position of the Jews in Germany has remained unchanged in recent months, but in actual practice the Jews are much worse off, owing to the introduction of further restrictions in all occupations involving state recognition, a report submitted at today's meeting of the Board of Deputies of British Jews declared.

The report, which was submitted by the Joint Foreign Committee, made up of representatives of the Anglo-Jewish Association and the Board of Deputies, stressed the fact that even such positions as teaching the blind and instruction in sports has now been closed

to German Jews.

Leonard Montefiore, president of the Anglo-Jewish Association, declared that the world-wide hostility of Catholics, Protestants and Jews will have little effect on the Nazi regime.

"But Nazi propaganda abroad is shattered and we hope will never recover," he stated.

Polish Situation Described

Neville Laski, president of the Board of Deputies, who recently returned from a trip to Poland, described the "dreadful, incomparable misery of the Polish Jews." He expressed the belief that the present Polish government is sympathetic toward the Jews and

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## Police Arrest 15 for Part in Haifa Clash

30 Injured When Labor  
Group Attacks Meeting  
of Revisionists

HAIFA, Oct. 21.—Fifteen participants in the clash which occurred late Thursday night between Revisionists and Laborite sympathizers were arrested in the last two days, communicate issued by the police today disclosed.

Thirty were injured, the report stated, including seven policemen. All but two of the injured were discharged after treatment at the Hadassah Hospital.

According to the police version of the affair, some ninety Revisionists attended the meeting in Hadar Hacarmel, admission to which was by ticket only. Police guarded all approaches to the building.

A large crowd made up of Laborite sympathizers numbering about 1,500 gathered outside and jeered the Revisionists. When the first Revisionist orator began to speak, bricks were thrown through the windows and a shower of stones was hurled into the hall from all sides.

Police reinforcements were called.

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## Lipsky Warns Against World Jewish Parley

Says Meet Would Injure  
Cause of Palestine,  
Reich Brethren

BALTIMORE, Oct. 21.—Louis Lipsky, vice-president of the American Jewish Congress and only American member of the World Zionist Executive, today warned that the Palestine cause and defense of German Jews would be jeopardized by the proposed World Jewish Congress.

Speaking before several hundred delegates attending the semi-annual conference of the Seaboard Zionist Region here, Lipsky declared that a World Jewish Congress is not essential to protect the rights of Jewish minorities in various countries.

The function of such a gathering, which is being planned for the Summer of 1935, Lipsky said could be performed as well by the creation of a central executive committee located at Geneva to cooperate with the League of Nations.

Would Bring Conflict

"Under the heading of World Jewish Congress," he declared, "a conflict is imminent in American Jewry which is bound to damage our position in America if the question involved is not dealt with resolutely and dispassionately by responsible Jewish groups. The American Jewish Congress proposes the convening of a World Jewish Congress in the Summer of 1935 and the American Jewish

## Hungary Sends Two Nazis to Jail

BUDAPEST, Oct. 21.—Two Hungarian Nazis, Albert Hajdo and Ludwig Hatvani, have been sentenced to serve a week in prison for having published an insulting anti-Semitic article in a Hungarian National Socialist newspaper.

Attempted anti-Semitic demonstrations during the trial proceedings were suppressed by the court. A number of fines were imposed and additional prison terms were threatened for those who would create any further disturbance.

## Parents Ask Abolition of Ghetto School

Vienna Protests Mount  
With News of Nazi  
Instructors

VIENNA, Oct. 21.—News that known Nazi teachers in the Vienna school system are being transferred to the ghetto schools for Jewish children created by the Austrian government has resulted in renewed demands by Jewish parents for the complete abolition of the schools.

Government authorities explain that transfer to the all-Jewish schools is intended to humiliate the Nazi teachers, not the Jews.

The failure of the government to rescind the decree providing for the segregation of Jewish from non-Jewish children in the various public schools has forced the leaders of the Jewish community to intervene.

Ignor Requests

The Jewish community's executive officers have asked for an interview with the city school commissioner to discuss the problem. Despite the fact that Chancellor Kurt Schuschnigg has issued instructions that the complaints of individual Jewish parents be considered, the interview has yet not been granted.

In the meantime, the ghetto system has been extended to include manual training high schools. Jewish children learning various crafts will henceforth receive instruction in specially arranged classes, it was announced.

The school ghetto decree was promulgated September 21, having been passed at a secret cabinet session July 4. In actual fact it prescribes the separation of Catholic children from non-Catholics, but in effect it is resulting in the separation of Jewish from non-Jewish pupils. Repeated attempts by Jewish leaders to halt promulgation of the law met with failure.

## Vienna Acts to Curb Sale of Nazi Papers

VIENNA, Oct. 21.—Police today prohibited the street sale of four new Nazi anti-Semitic papers, which appeared in the last few days. Subscribers, however, are permitted to receive their copies through the mails and news agents are also permitted to handle and sell the papers.

The appearance of the new Nazi papers, the first since the crushing of the Nazi revolt, is an indication of the recovery of confidence in the Nazi ranks.

## Namm Confers Today In Fish Controversy

Benjamin Namm, appointed by Mayor LaGuardia to act as his representative in disputes between wholesale and retail fish dealers will confer this morning with representatives of the United Retail Fish Dealers' Association and of wholesalers at the American Arbitration Association, 521 Fifth avenue.

## Dinner Nov. 11 Launches Drive For Federation

**Over 650 Leaders Will  
Serve on Committee  
for Astor Event**

More than 650 Jewish leaders will serve on the dinner committee of the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies, it was announced yesterday by Arthur Lehman, Lawrence Marx, Paul M. Rosenthal and Percy S. Straus, chairman of the Federation's 1934 Emergency Campaign to raise \$2,071,000 to complete its budget of \$3,655,000.

The campaign will be launched with a dinner at the Hotel Astor on November 11. Henry Ittleson is chairman of the dinner committee and Mrs. Arthur Lehman is associate chairman.

"Although the committee is by no means completed," Ittleson declared, "it is already certain that we shall have the most distinguished sponsorship for the event. Our greatest fear has been that the Jewish community has come to take Federation and its continuance too much for granted."

"Present indications give us real grounds for hope that the public is being aroused to the emergency. There is a growing awareness of the critical situation in Federation, and it is clear that the threat of its collapse is being deeply felt."

The dinner on November 11 will usher in six weeks of intensive fund-raising.

### Clothing, Woolens Firms Seek Worker Support

An effort to gain the support of employees of 250 leading men's clothing and woolen concerns, through group appeals, has been launched by the clothing and woolens division of Federation, it was announced yesterday by Jerome I. Udell, chairman. Isidore M. Cohen will direct the campaign as chairman of the division's employees committee.

Cohen announced that he has received pledges of support in the drive from more than sixty salesmen, inside men and junior executives. The division's quota is \$90,000.

## Legal Leaders To Help J.N.F. By Will Advice

**To Urge Clients to Make  
Fund Beneficiary  
of Bequests**

A committee of jurists and prominent lawyers to aid the Jewish National Fund, the agency of the Zionist movement dedicated to the reclamation of the soil of Palestine as national property, has been formed, according to an announcement made yesterday by Dr. Israel Goldstein, president of the Fund.

Called the Advisory Bequest Committee, it includes many prominent legal lights and is headed by David L. Podell. Under his signature a letter was recently addressed to 2,000 members of the New York bar urging them in their fiduciary relations with their clients, particularly in the drawing up of last wills and testaments, to recommend to their clients the inclusion of the Jewish National Fund as a beneficiary of such charitable bequests as they might wish to make.

## Fitness Only Criterion for Job, Says Newman, Hitting Race Tie

Discrimination against applicants for jobs on account of their racial and religious ties was attacked in a sermon yesterday morning by Rabbi Louis I. Newman at Temple Rodeph Shalom, 7 West Eighty-third street.

Any criterion for the selection of employees other than fitness for the job applied for was denounced by Rabbi Newman as un-American. Jewish employers who for various reasons limit Jewish members of their establishments to a minimum, as well as Gentile employers who admit no Jews at all, were subjected to Rabbi Newman's fire.

"American employers," he declared, "must not establish racial tests in giving work to applicants, and Jews should not be forced to conceal, if they can, their Jewish origin. Excellence alone should be the criterion for the selection of employees, and any other considerations should have no place in American life."

The objections advanced by employers who bar Jews were scored by the rabbi as of little moment.

### Scores Mythical Objections

"The fact that Jewish employees may wish to be excused on the High Holy Days should not militate against their receiving employment," he said. "The religious holy days of other denominations are recognized by schools and commercial groups, and there is no

high pressure salesmen wandered about the country, collecting shekels from sacred Christian businessmen, and getting their commissions.

"But—there are a lot of wealthy Jewish business men. These certainly would not fall for the 'Protocols of Zion,' and yet—their checks are good. So Jung's nimble agents sell the Jewish business men the idea that the Third International is on its way here to take their businesses away and nationalize their wives and daughters. The wealthy Jews, half scared out of their wits, contribute to fight Communism. In this way Jung's salesmen collect from anti-Communist Jew and from anti-Semitic Gentile simultaneously. Among the contributors to the American Vigilante Intelligence Federation are business houses owned by prominent Jews and other businesses in which Jews are heavy stockholders."

The New Masses telegraphed a number of these prominent Jews, mentioned by Mr. Spivak, asking for their explanations. Most of them could not be reached in time. Only one answer is published in the New Masses. It came from Mr. Max Epstein, chairman of General American Transportation Corporation, Chicago. The telegram from Mr. Epstein reads as follows:

"In response to your telegram very much appreciate it if this company or my name were not mentioned in the article you intend to have appear in your next issue but the information you are now giving will be remembered by me and in future I will act accordingly."

This naive request of Mr. Epstein, in response to the inquiry addressed to him by the New Masses, practically contains the admission that the Jewish-controlled firm had been taken in by the anti-Jewish propagandists.

It is of course absurd to suspect that some of the Jews

mentioned by Mr. Spivak had knowingly subsidized the anti-Jewish propaganda, the distribution of the "Protocols" in this country. Some of the Jews mentioned in that list are closely identified with Jewish organizations combating anti-Semitism. They are known to be devoted to American and Jewish ideals. They are also regarded as practical and capable businessmen. Is it possible that they have been fooled by the propaganda racketeers into financing anti-Semitic propaganda under the guise of combating Communism?

All those Jews mentioned in the list published in the New Masses this week owe it to themselves and especially to the Jewish people to give immediate frank and complete explanations of their contributions to these propaganda organizations. It would be extremely unwise to ignore the Spivak accusations and insinuations merely because they appear in the New Masses.

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## Austria Heaps Many Obstacles In Path of Jewish Physicians

**None Appointed to Hospital or Welfare Posts Since February, Survey Reveals — More Dismissals on Flimsy Grounds Planned**

VIENNA, Oct. 10.—The plight of the Jewish medical man in Austria is revealed in a survey recently made by a knowing insider who must of necessity maintain anonymous. The report, compiled even before the latest anti-Semitic manifestation, the dismissal of Jewish doctors in the Sick Funds, is illustrative of the tragic condition under which Jewish doctors and all Jewish intellectuals must live in Austria.

During the past year and a half, the survey reveals no Jewish promotions. It was officially stated that in the Vienna General Hospital, for instance, there would be no appointment of a Jew until the relationship of Jews to non-Jews had fallen to a ratio of twenty per cent. As many Vienna hospitals number very few Jews on their staffs and most of the hospitals out of the city have no Jews at all on their staffs, the average of Jewish doctors in the country has long been below this ratio.

### None Since February

Since February, 1934, no Jews have been appointed or promoted in the hospital or welfare institutions in the city of Vienna. In the matter of appointments, not only religious but racial considerations are taken into account. In some cases the baptismal certificates of the parents of the applicant are demanded. A statement by the Lord Mayor of Vienna, Dr. Schmitz, that henceforth only children of Christian parents will be appointed, is in concurrence with this condition often made by the hospital authorities.

Of doctors holding permanent positions with the city of Vienna, over forty-five have been dismissed and only a few of them have been pensioned. Of this group all were Jews but two, and of the Jews there were but an insignificant number dismissed on political grounds.

### Plan More Dismissals

In the case of the Sick Funds and Social Insurance institutions, a general reform is being announced for the next few weeks, and according to semi-official rumor, the first of the dismissed will be Jewish doctors who obtained their citizenship in Vienna after 1919. Then will follow those who obtained their citizenship between 1914 and 1918, and then those who became citizens before 1914, but were not born in Vienna. A number of contracts have been annulled even before this new reform is due to enter into force.

The Union of Christian German Doctors with about 400 members, about eight per cent. of the number of doctors in Vienna, demands thirty seats, which would give them an absolute majority in the executive of the professional organization of the doctors in Vienna, which has a total of fifty-seven seats. Such a ratio would give this small group the power to damage Jewish doctors of all categories.

### Medals of No Avail

A "Front-fighter" qualification has been introduced in the professional institutions, obviously with the intention of removing those who do not qualify. The dismissals which have taken place, however, have not taken any account of front services, or war decorations. Among those dismissed there was a holder of the Golden Medal of Valor, which is equivalent to the German Iron Cross First Class. Such a dismissal is going Germany one better for in Germany an Iron Cross Medal owner is immune from dismissal for religious reasons.

In any consideration of statistics attempting to show a high

proportion of Jewish doctors in Vienna, it must be remembered that there are practically no Jewish doctors in the rest of Austria. This is a condition found in all intellectual fields of endeavor in Austria for never did the Jew have any chance at all outside of the city. And, further, the percentage of Jews in the hospitals of Vienna has been for many years much smaller than among the Gentile physicians. Positions in clinics, in hospitals and in universities were only rarely if ever filled by Jews, certainly never in any proportion to number of application and their qualifications.

### Citizenship Issue

The entire matter of citizenship as a qualifying factor in hospital and government positions is a false one. Vienna for centuries has been the capital of an empire of about sixty million persons of various races and languages. It has always had a large number of inhabitants from various parts of the country, so that hardly fifty per cent of the present population of the city were born in Vienna.

The peace treaties of 1918 gave all the inhabitants of the former Austro-Hungarian monarchy free option to choose citizenship in whichever of the so-called succession states, of which Austria is one, that they desired. The treaty guaranteed full citizenship rights. Further, the constitution makes no distinction between citizens of older or more recent date.

### All Born in Old Empire

The so-called non-native doctors, a term which is applied to the Jewish doctors, were almost without exception born on the territory of the former Austro-Hungarian monarchy, lived there until 1918 and fought on the Austrian side of the war, or had members of families who did.

To illustrate the point about non-native inhabitants, it should be pointed out that the present Chancellor, Dr. Schuschnigg; the Lord Mayor of Vienna and the Vice Mayor, the Messrs. Dr. Schmitz and Dr. Kresse, were themselves not born in the territory which is now Austrian. The intent behind the nativity clause becomes obvious when it is seen that large numbers of Christian doctors who were not born in Vienna are retained when Jews, whose circumstances are exactly the same, are dismissed.

In other fields of intellectual work, it is the same. Dr. Jacob Ehrlich, one of the Jewish members of the Vienna City Council, speaking on the school question at the Council recently said that there are in Vienna 5,000 teachers in the elementary schools, of whom only twelve are Jews.

### Dr. Mendes Recalls Van Buren Protest In Damascus Affair

Dr. H. Pereira Mendes, rabbi emeritus of the Spanish and Portuguese Congregation, spoke Saturday afternoon before his congregation on the protest made by Secretary of State John Forsyth at the instance of President Martin Van Buren on the occasion of the Damascus persecutions of Jews in 1840.

Dr. Mendes pointed out that the Secretary of State in his letter to the American consul at Alexandria voiced the President's feeling of "surprise and pain, that in this advanced age, such barbarous measures be resorted to in order to compel the confession of imputed guilt."

## POLITICAL PROFILES



F. F. GREENMAN

Frederick F. Greenman, candidate for the State Senate from the Fifteenth Senatorial District on the Republican-Fusion ticket, is one of the senior members of the law firm of Cook, Nathan & Lehman.

He was born in New York City on September 3, 1932. He was awarded scholarships to Harvard College, which graduated him in 1914. Two years later he received a degree from Harvard Law School.

At college he was president of the Harvard Menorah Society and the Harvard Zionist Society. He was a member of Phi Beta Kappa and of the two debating organizations, Tau Kappa Alpha and Delta Sigma Rho.

After leaving law school he was employed by the then firm of Leventrutt, Cook, Nathan & Lehman. In 1922, he became a junior partner in the firm, then known under its present name, and in 1928 a senior partner.

He has specialized, he says, "in acting for stockholders and bondholders who have required protection either because their rights had been disregarded or because a corporation in which they had invested their money had gotten into financial difficulties."

He campaigned for John Purroy Mitchell in 1917, and became interested in the Fusion movement during the various Seabury investigations.

He was a member of the City Party, organized in 1932, and was on its advisory council until the organization of the City Fusion Party, which gave him a similar post and placed him on the campaign committee headed by Judge Seabury. On December 28, 1933, he was appointed a member of the city executive committee of the party, to whose principles, he says, "I subscribe fully."

He was a deputy attorney general under George Z. Medalie in 1928, and in 1933 both he and his wife were elected to the Republican county committee pledged to vote for a new county leader. When the new Republican Club of the Ninth Assembly District was organized he became a member of its executive committee.

For about four years he has been chairman of the board of the Menorah Association, which is associated in publishing the Menorah Journal.

He is a member of Temple Emanu-El and vice-chairman of its committee for the American Union of Hebrew Congregations.

His candidacy has been endorsed by Rabbi Stephen S. Wise and by Aldermanic President Bernard S. Deutsch.

## Streicher Sway Grows Weaker, Survey Reveals

**Masses Disgusted With Anti-Semitism of Franconian**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)  
MUNICH, Oct. 21.—Among the ranks of the National Socialist masses there is a growing opposition to Julius Streicher, arch anti-Semite of Franconia, a special investigation conducted by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency reveals.

The disapproval of Streicher is largely the result of a general repugnance to his Jew-baiting efforts, which are termed a disgrace to Franconia. Streicher appeals to the base feelings of the German masses in his attempts to increase anti-Jewish sentiment, commentators say, pointing to his most recent attack upon the Jews, whom he holds responsible for the spreading of antagonistic rumors which have recently appeared concerning him.

The rumors include stories that Hitler has broken with Streicher and has even gone so far as to whip him, has scolded him and has ignored his presence at the Nuremberg airport. The last rumor is being spread by Storm Troop and Schutz Staffel men, who say that Hitler deliberately avoided welcoming Streicher.

The population generally expects Streicher's political career to be terminated shortly.

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## The Zionist Parleys

The negotiations which the World Zionist Executive started in London with representatives of different Zionist groups for bringing internal peace and unity into the Zionist ranks enter their third stage today.

Two weeks ago the Executive completed its negotiations with the representatives of the Revisionist party. Last week it completed its negotiations with the General Zionists. Today the Executive opens its negotiations with the representatives of the Mizrahi group.

At no other time was unity in the Zionist ranks as imperative as it is at the present moment, when Palestine Jewry is facing the danger of having a Legislative Council established in the country. The mobilization of all Zionist forces for the sake of forming a united Jewish front was never as urgent as it is now, when Jewish rights in Palestine are threatened by the projected Legislative Council.

It is therefore regrettable to see that the negotiations which the Executive has opened for the purpose of consolidating the Zionist movement have so far not produced the desired results. The Revisionists, it seems, do not find their way clear to accept the peace terms of the Executive, since the basic condition in these terms provides for subjecting the Revisionist party to a discipline which they find it impossible to obey. Similarly, this seems to be the case with the General Zionists, who could not come to terms with the Executive during the negotiations of last week with regard to the problem of employment and labor in Palestine.

One need not be too pessimistic to predict that the negotiations which the Executive opened today with the Mizrahi will also fail to result in a complete understanding. Too great is the opposition of the Mizrahi toward the present Executive and too antagonistic are its demands. A peace conference lasting a few hours is hardly likely to straighten out the differences existing at present between the Mizrahi and the Executive.

The efforts of the Executive to bring about internal peace in the Zionist movement are nevertheless to be commended. They show that the Executive is seriously thinking of ways and means to reconcile the various groups in the Zionist movement. Whether or not these efforts bring any concrete results at present, they will serve a good purpose. They will mark the beginning of negotiations for armistice. And where there is armistice there will be peace.

## TIME FOR DECISION

I am not actively or officially associated with either the American Jewish Congress or the American Jewish Committee. I have friends in both groups. Furthermore, I have no axe to grind. I am perfectly content in my present position and am not seeking any other job. Perhaps, therefore, I may be given credit for a certain objective of approach impossible to violent partisans of both sides. I do not propose to discuss personalities but issues, methods, and ideas, for it is on that plane alone so momentous a question should be decided.

According to the report in the Jewish Daily Bulletin of October 8, the executive committee of the American Jewish Congress "decided to launch a campaign for the organization of national democratic elections throughout the United States on April 28, 1935, for an enlarged American Jewish Congress and delegates to the World Jewish Congress." Thus the issue is clearly drawn and every Jewish community in the United States will be called upon to take a stand in favor of the World Jewish Congress at Geneva or against it.

It would be futile to bemoan the fact that the Congress has decided to go ahead with its plan or even to raise the issue that the Congress, when it joined the Joint Council in New York, pledged itself to take no separate action. Recrimination and charges will get nowhere. Do American Jews wish to enlarge the American Jewish Congress and support the World Jewish Congress idea or not? If they do, they will join heartily in the elections and enlarge the present Congress. If they do not, they will abstain from participation in the elections and if the Geneva Congress is held it will be a congress of individuals such as the last two Geneva conferences, it will not be a World Jewish Congress in any sense of the word. Leaders in our communities should begin to consider these issues now.

## Support of Claims

The first question that naturally arises is this: what warrant has the American Jewish Congress to claim a larger measure of support from American Jews? What service has it rendered that justifies it in displacing the Committee or the B'nai B'rith or the Joint Council made up of representatives of the three organizations?

It is commonly asserted that the Congress is the only organization which has taken a forthright stand on the Nazi issue; that it roused American public opinion and directed it against the present Reich rulers; that it acted while others delayed; that it fought Israel's enemies in Germany and in the United States.

It is unquestionably true that the Congress has been more vocal and more aggressive. It is still an open question as to whether these tactics, especially where the leadership was so obviously and publicly Jewish, did more harm than good to Jews in Germany and here. It is not true that other organizations did nothing; it is not true that the Congress and its methods were the only and most effective means to protect our German brethren or to defend American Jews against attack. In city after city the Congress was spreading its propaganda that it and it alone was taking up the battle for German Jewry and

building up its membership among groups not familiar with the situation and who heard only Congress, while at the very same time the Committee and B'nai B'rith were doing quiet, effective contact work which by its very nature could not be given blasts of publicity.

## The Committee's Error

I frankly admit that I myself accepted for a time this statement of the Congress that it alone was working in Jewry's behalf till I took the trouble to investigate and find out what was being done. The Committee made the grievous error of not taking into its confidence a larger group of representative leaders throughout the nation who were entitled to know what was being done and on whose good judgment it could rely. I say at the very time the Congress was loudly denouncing other organizations for inactivity and building up a clientele in some quarters, with this argument, the Committee was active and effective with such methods as by their very nature could not be given widespread publicity. People heard the Congress; they did not hear the Committee. I do not, therefore, see what claim the Congress has to put itself before American Jewry as offering the most effective leadership at this time.

Again, such tactics, perfectly obvious to one whose eyes are open, do not make for confidence in the Congress leadership. And when other things are added, one is tempted to repudiate that leadership entirely. I mean this: a Joint Council was established representing the Congress, the B'nai B'rith and the Committee. It was agreed that no important action should be taken alone. The Congress agreed, as the other two organizations agreed, to this limitation on individual organization procedure. But is it not true that the American Jewish Congress violated this agreement? Did the Congress submit to the Joint Council their open letter to Hindenburg, asking him to depose Hitler? Did the Congress submit to the Joint Council their plan for the 1934 Madison Square Garden demonstration? Did the Congress submit to the Joint Council their endorsement of the Jewish boycott, the participation in the World Jewish Conference, the forthcoming trade fair, etc.?...

## Not a World Congress

It is not difficult to rouse excitement among the masses of the Jewish people on the Nazi issue or on the issue of anti-Semitism in America. It may be that the Congress will probably increase its membership.

But even if it does, the group that meets in Geneva next summer will not be a world Jewish congress in any sense of the term. That has been brought out already. An interesting fact not hitherto mentioned, however, is the fear with which Jews in Germany looked upon the Geneva gathering last summer.

I was in Berlin at the time. I did not meet one responsible Jewish leader who did not regard that Conference with dismay. That goes even for one of the outstanding Zionists in Berlin. And the Judische Rundschau found it necessary the week after the Geneva meeting to write an editorial explaining the situation. German Jews feared the effect on them of violent utterance.

## A Question of Method

Fundamentally, the question is one of method. What are the best methods to employ in the situation which faces world Jewry and American Jewry? While giving every consideration of sincerity on the part of Congress leadership in its belief that its methods are most effective, it might be suggested that there are others who believe other strategy at this particular stage not only will be more statesmanlike but more effective. I hold that point of view. I hold it because of long study of the situation, because of the contacts made this summer not only with leading Jews of every group in Germany but with leading Christians, government officials and men in the field of diplomacy. This is not the time for speeches, no matter how eloquent, nor for denunciations and resolutions. We stand to lose far more than we shall gain. It is the time for statesmanlike methods, if you will, for intimate personal contacts, for building bridges. We need Jewish diplomats, not emotional dipsomaniacs.

We must not be swept off our feet by any spurious appeals, however sincere, for Jewish unity. Of course, we want Jewish unity. But we do not want unity at the expense of the elimination of sincere honest differences of opinion. We do not want gleichschaltung after the manner of the National Socialists.

## Expect Discipline

After all, we cannot expect unity of opinion on the issues involved. Profound differences in philosophy of life, temperament, training background and all the rest enter into the question. But we have a right to expect concert of action and self-restraint and discipline from leading national Jewish organizations.

No one organization is great enough to disrupt even the semblance of harmony established by the Joint Council. No one organization is great enough or powerful enough to flout all others and demand its methods be adopted. The three great national Jewish organizations should play the game.

If a difference of opinion arises as to procedure, a majority vote in the Joint Council should determine action. Is it too late for the Congress to recall its decision and abide by the vote of the Joint Council? If it is, then let thoughtful American Jewish leaders inform themselves on the issue and exercise the judgment of wisdom. There is no necessity for heated discussion which will split communities wide open. Merely refrain from participation in the Congress elections. After all, the governments of the world know who are the responsible spokesmen for the Jews of the world.

## Between the Lines

## Watching Greece...

Central Jewish organizations interested in protecting Jewish rights will now have to watch more closely the Jewish situation in Greece.

The agreement reached this week between the Greek government party and the anti-Semitic party led by former Premier Venizelos may cost the Jews in Greece a good deal of the government party patronage they enjoyed till now.

## The Jewish Vote...

It was with the assistance of Jewish votes that the present government party came into power in Greece. It was for this assistance that the oppositionary Venizelos party started a campaign against the Jews. Venizelos himself was quite frank in emphasizing that were it not for the ten thousand Jewish votes cast in Salonica in favor of the present government during the last election, he would not have been defeated.

It was for the purpose of isolating the Jewish votes that Venizelos and his party started a campaign to segregate the Jews into a separate electoral college. The government party, being friendly to the Jews, has made it clear on many occasions that Jewish patriotism in Greece cannot be questioned and that no special ghetto voting would be introduced for Jews during the forthcoming elections.

## Anti-Semites Win...

Now the startling news comes that after weeks of severe anti-Jewish campaigning the anti-Semitic Venizelist party has won its point. Despite the assurances given several weeks ago by President Zaimis of Greece that the Jewish electoral college will not be restored and that the Jews will vote with the non-Jews, on the same equal basis, an agreement has been reached, resulting in isolating the Jews into special electoral units.

This breach of promise on the part of the government party towards the Jews, which is a complete victory for the anti-Semitic Venizelist party, may lead to more serious consequences for the Jews. As long as no agreement existed between the anti-Semitic Venizelist party and the government party the Jews in Greece could always figure on full protection from the government party. Is such protection, however, to be expected at present?

## A Governor Speaks...

Only two weeks ago the governor of Salonica, condemning the violent anti-Semitic agitation which is being carried on by the Venizelist press, declared that he may be forced to put the anti-Semitic press under censorship in order to prevent the growing anti-Jewish propaganda in the country. Will the governor of Salonica change his mind now that a truce has been reached between the government and the anti-Semitic party?

The agreement just concluded between the government and the oppositionary party in Greece will no doubt give a free hand to the Venizelists in their anti-Semitic propaganda campaign. It will expose the Jews in Greece to greater danger than hitherto. A government which is bound by an agreement with an anti-Semitic party is certainly cautious about using oppressive measures against anti-Semitism.

There is where the danger for the Jews of Greece lies. That is why central Jewish organizations interested in protecting Jewish rights should be on the alert.

**Criticizes Rabbi Steinberg**  
To the Editor, Jewish Daily Bulletin:  
In today's editorial notes of the Bulletin, Mr. Herman Bernstein quotes Rabbi Milton Steinberg of New York having declared at a banquet of the Hadassah in Washington that the "position of the Jew in Europe was "completely impossible" and that Zionism was the "only logical answer that the Jewish world can give to its needs and problems."

It is highly deplorable that a speaker entrusted to address an important meeting which was attended by the wife of the President, Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt and other important Washington personages and which was widely reported by the daily English press should permit himself to make such sweeping and ill-considered statements as Rabbi Steinberg did.

It is poor statesmanship to declare that the position of the Jew all over Europe is "completely impossible." To declare, however, that Zionism was the only logical solution for the problems of European Jewry is a plain and misleading falsehood.

Rabbi Steinberg should know that Palestine, at best, can only absorb a small number of our people. How in the world can Zionism solve the problem of millions of Jews in central and eastern Europe who are now suffering from political and economic disabilities and persecutions? Instead of asserting with some satisfaction that the tragedy of European Jewry is a confirmation of Zionist ideology, Rabbi Steinberg missed a splendid opportunity to plead at the Washington meeting for the moral and material support of the American government and American people to alleviate the tragedy of European Jewry and to assist in the removal of the very discriminations and persecutions of which the Jews of Europe are the innocent victims. Such half-baked statements only tend to discourage every other political and humanitarian effort which may be contemplated by well meaning liberal and democratic forces both in America and in Europe.

### Utilities and Discrimination

To the Editor, Jewish Daily Bulletin:  
Dr. Frank's article, "Public Utilities and Anti-Jewish Discrimination," in the Jewish Daily Bulletin of September 12 has come to my attention. Permit me to compliment him on the fact that he discusses calmly a matter which frequently is not so temperately treated.

He says: "Yet, as is well known, there exists anti-Semitic discrimination in the employment offices of the companies engaged in gas, electric and telephone service." So far as the gas and electric companies affiliated with Consolidated Gas Company of New York are concerned, there is no discrimination as to race, color or religion in hiring, retaining or promoting employees. The test is fitness for the job. We have in these companies representatives of many nations, races, colors and doubtless creeds. We have many employees who are Jews—some of them in responsible positions. How many, I don't know because no question is ever asked as to an applicant's or employee's religion and so there is no record of the number of Jews any more than there is of the number of Methodists or Roman Catholics. We come to know an employee as a Jew through years of personal acquaintance or because that employee, being orthodox, observes the Jewish holidays.

As a sociological matter, we would not, and do not, discriminate against Jews. As a business matter, we could not afford to, for

we would be shutting out of our companies people of ability and intelligence who might be the best equipped individuals for specific jobs.

## Polish Merchants Split Boycott Front

Join Move to Boost Imports of German Products in Accord With New Reich Pacts

WARSAW, Oct. 21.—The anti-German boycott front is being broken by the Jewish merchants' association, which has joined the Polish-German move to increase the import of German goods into Poland in accordance with the new Polish-German treaties, the local Jewish press reveals.

Germany has resumed the practice of employing Jewish agents to sell German products to Jewish merchants in Poland it was further learned.

## Ancient Tomb Yields Secrets Of Herod's Time to Excavator

JERUSALEM, Oct. 10.—An ancient cave-tomb, which dates from the time of Herod, and was found to contain several inscribed grave mounds and a number of pottery lamps and jugs, was recently excavated in the Kedron valley by Dr. E. L. Sukenik, archaeologist of the Hebrew University.

The inscriptions show that the burial place of an Egyptian Jewish family, which had settled in Jerusalem in the first century B.C., had been uncovered. The names are inscribed in Hebrew characters and some are also accompanied by their Greek equivalents.

One of the women is described as "Apphia, daughter of Athenagoras." Both names are new in Jewish nomenclature in Palestine. "Apphia" is of special interest, since it is mentioned in a later period in the New Testament in the epistles of Paul.

Another of the names mentioned is that of "Onias son of Alexander." Onias was also the name of the High Priest who built the famous Jewish Temple named after him in Heliopolis, Egypt. He had quarreled with his family in Palestine and left to settle at the Egyptian city.

### Jewish Greek Dialect

Another engraving on an ossuary gives, for the first time, the Greek name of the coffin, namely, "ostophagos." There is no source in early Greek writings where ossuaries are so indicated. It is apparently a word coined in the Jewish Greek dialect, as were a number of other Hellenic words which do not appear elsewhere save in Jewish literature. Coincidental is the fact that in Talmudic language the ossuaries are called "glos-

koma," a short form for the Greek word, "Glosokomon."

The opening of this rock tomb by Dr. Sukenik is part of the general exploration of the ancient Jewish necropolis around Jerusalem which the archaeological department of the Hebrew University recently undertook. The work is to be continued as funds permit.

## Talk Ship Purchase For Salonica Line

Planned Route Seen Playing a Considerable Role in Palestine Tourism

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)  
DANZIG, Oct. 7.—Negotiations for the purchase of a 15,000-ton vessel as the first step toward the establishment of a Palestine-Salonica line are under way, the Danziger Echo reports today.

Reduction of through traffic rates is also being discussed with the Greek Yugoslavian and Hungarian railway officials, the report reveals.

A Palestine - Salonica traffic route is considered by observers to be very desirable, providing the shortest sea route between Palestine and Central Europe and connecting with a short railroad route opposite Piraeus, and is expected to play a considerable part in Palestine tourist trade from Central European regions.

Such trade is on the increase because of visiting between Europeans and the members of their families who have settled in Palestine.

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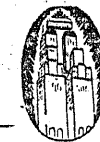

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## Arab Problem Is Nationalist, Not Economic, Says Stein

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)

LONDON, Oct. 13.—Jewish life in Eastern Europe with its constant problem of anti-Semitism was contrasted with the constructive and creative problems of the Jews in Palestine in a speech delivered by Leonard Stein, former political secretary of the World Zionist Organization, before the Near and Middle East Association.

"In Eastern and Southeastern Europe, the persecution of the Jews—unlike Germany—is not part and parcel of the official government policy," Mr. Stein declared. "But the condition of the Jews there is almost as desperate; and they are confined permanently to an inferior status. A deliberate attempt is being made to annihilate them economically."

"The situation there is black. But in Palestine the phrase 'constructive' has acquired a real meaning for the Jews. This despite the fact that Palestine represents a difficult, although not hopeless problem for the Jewish settlers."

### Populations Grow

"Official figures," Mr. Stein said, "show the extraordinary growth of both the Jewish and non-Jewish population of Palestine. Very few countries in the world can show figures that even approximate the growth of the Arab population in Palestine since the beginning of intensive Jewish colonization there. This shows that the Arabs were not driven out of Palestine and refutes the theory that they were dispossessed."

"Problems created by the Jews in Palestine consist of problems for themselves, the Arabs and the British administration. The Palestine government, which is of the highest value to the population is, however, handicapped by the struggle between contending factions in the country. This struggle has become a problem for the

British Empire and for British relations with the Moslem world.

"The problem of the Arabs in Palestine is the center for a whole complex of problems. But the Arab problem is not one of economics. Government inquiries prove that there are absurd exaggerations current as to the number of dispossessed Arabs. The total number is 889, including the Bedouins. The actual dispossessed number only 350. The Bedouins are only nomads and require only fresh grazing lands."

### Profits Enormous

"Arabs in Palestine profited greatly from Jewish settlement there. But the Arabs opposed the Jews, not on the ground of economics, but through Arab nationalism, which made itself felt in Jerusalem."

"Should the British administration resign itself to the role of the central balancing factor?" Stein asked. "Are Jews and Arabs to be hampered in constructive work by this feud? Much had been lost by constantly looking at Palestine under the microscope instead of under the telescope. All parties regarded the problems in a petty spirit. There is at present an unparalleled chance for constructive work. An extraordinary force of Jews is coming into Palestine which is not empty-handed, and is of value to the whole Middle East. The German Jews are bringing scientific knowledge and technical skill in agriculture and industry and in applied science. Palestine might become the medical center of the Middle East and Germany's loss would be Palestine's gain. The Jews come to Palestine as pioneers and as exiles to make their home there. The difficulties must be recognized, but they are not unsurmountable. Is there no means of solving the problem for the lasting advantage of them all?"

## N. Y. U. Official Praises Spirit Of Reich Jews

### University Dean Stresses Need of Free Worship at Dinner

Expressing admiration for the spirit of the Jews in Germany "who suffer from the intolerance of the governing power," Dean John T. Madden, of the New York University School of Commerce, Accounts and Finance, discussed "Religion in the University" at a Newman Club dinner held at the Hotel Pennsylvania.

"The Newman Club, the Christian Association and the Menorah Society," Dean Madden said, "working through the Interfaith Council, are vital forces in our university life. And while we live and dream in the free air of our university, let us not forget that these rights which we enjoy are not the privilege of all. We admire the spirit of the Jews in Germany who suffer from the intolerance of the governing power."

"It is only by education that free worship may be preserved and fostered," Dean Madden stated.

may not be content with inadequate wages and they may protest if unjustly treated, but the net effect for the entire community is beneficial."

### Resorts Targets of Sermon

Rabbi Newman's sermon also attacked the practice of summer resorts and hotels in excluding Jews.

"It is only natural," he said, "that in the environs of New York City, in New England and elsewhere the number of Jewish summer residents should be large and the effort to keep out the Jewish newcomers can injure, not so much the Jews, as the Gentiles who discriminate against them."

In this connection, Rabbi Newman pointed out that the failure of many resort and hotel enterprises in recent years could be directly traced to their policies of racial discrimination.

"Economic and social life in the United States," he concluded, "must have a free and natural flow of forces. Snobbery and racial bigotry have no place in democratic, cosmopolitan America. The quota laws in our university, fraternity, resort and business life are the worst form of applied intolerance and they should be rooted out of the American scene."

#### A New Philosophy of Life

DR. MORDECAI N. KAPLAN, Society for the Advancement of Judaism, 15 West Ninety-first street: Our civilization has reached a point where it is increasingly difficult for us to make the most

of our lives. The situation calls for a thorough rethinking of our entire philosophy. Our practical men have, of course, always deprecated philosophies, but events have proved them to be tragically wrong. The present crisis has gone a long way in making "hard-headed" synonymous with "soft-brained."

The tremendous sweep and power of communism and fascism in the modern world are due to their having philosophies, wrong as these may be. It is by virtue of these philosophies that they are threatening to supplant and supersede the authoritative historical religions. One is dedicated to the creation of class-consciousness, the other to the creation of nation-consciousness. The opportunity is thus presented to vital religion to develop a humanity consciousness based on the recognition of the equal right of all human beings to the maximum realization of their powers for good and of the right of individuals and groups to maintain their respective differences.

Such a new philosophy should be founded on a thorough understanding of human nature. Such a new philosophy would be ethical in the sense that it would refrain from appealing to the motives of hatred, pugnacity and self-assertion made glamorous by mob psychology and seek to elicit the highest aims and strivings of human nature under the dominance of reason.

## Marty Glickman, Of Madison High

With the sport pages screaming the results of the Columbia-Navy scrap and the Fordham-St. Mary's tilt, the football fan, unless he has a son or daughter in high school, is entirely unaware of the bitter struggles that are fought every Saturday afternoon on the scholastic gridirons.

A year ago it was Sid Luckman, the six-foot Jewish backfield ace of Erasmus Hall High, who was burning up the turf. Once again Sid is playing great ball this year. But, with the defeat that Erasmus suffered at the hands of Milt Torgan's men from Madison, Luckman has been eclipsed by a new star in the high school galaxy.

Marty Glickman, a senior at Madison is another Jewish youngster who is destined for big things on collegiate gridirons. For the second year he is quarterback of the Golden Tornadoes. Marty is a brilliant field general, a good line buckler, a perfect passer, and at the same time is the fastest sprinter in the city. He can step 100 yards in 10.2 while in football togs.

When Madison trimmed Erasmus some time ago as a result of Glickman's bang-up ball playing, Coach Torgan was all smiles.

"It took us four years but it looks like we're in," he said.

And well he can say this. His wingmen, tackles, guards, and centers average over 200 pounds from end to end to make up the heftiest squad of linesmen, scholastic or collegiate, in New York City.

"My backfield is pretty light," continued Torgan, "but it's got sprint champion Marty Glickman and Arty Rosenblum, who is just as good. We should come through this year in the same fashion as 1929."

Mike Torgan will be remembered as the man who developed Jack Grossman, Babe Scheuer, Irv Resnick and Leo Lynn, all Jewish youngsters who went on to earn national gridiron recognition for themselves. Jack Grossman, all-American back at Rutgers, is now playing with the Brooklyn Dodgers; Resnick, a great guard and tackle at the Raritan institution also, is now with the Perth Amboy professional club. Babe Scheuer, after earning an enviable name for himself at N. Y. U., has played with the Giants and the Dodgers, and is now with the New Rochelle Bulldogs.

It will not be long before the name of Marty Glickman will be in the sporting headlines of the press when Columbia will tackle Navy again. Marty is to enroll at Columbia at the end of the term.

## Along Cauliflower Row

"We Wuz Robbed" Joe Jacobs, manager of Maxie Schmeling, was greeted by your sports scribe on his return from Europe last month.

"Schmeling will be in the running again for the title before the end of the year," Jacobs said. "His decisive victory over Neusel leaves only that conclusion for any sensible man—and I'll see to it that he's considered."

Some time after this little chat with Jacobs, Art Lasky, the Jewish scrapper from the Coast, breezed into town to settle an argument with Steve Hamas, the Pride of Penn State. The winner of the scrap was to be considered the logical opponent for Maxie Baer next June.

# Prominent Lithuanians 'Solve' Race Affairs in Questionnaire

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)

KAUNAS, Oct. 8.—In connection with recent aggravation of relations between Jews and Lithuanians, the Kaunas newspaper, Dos Folk, sent out a questionnaire in which it asked a number of leading Lithuanians for their opinions on Jewish-Lithuanian relations.

The former premier and leader of the Ludininks, M. Sleshevitchius made, among others, the following statement:

"For me and my associates, anti-Semitic hatred of Jews is an absolutely alien and inadmissible feeling. Not only in regard to purely humane feelings, the modern and terrible epidemic which is called anti-Semitism, the frightful and infectious bacilli of which lately have been spread to us by neighboring countries must be alien to us. In it is danger of the destruction and downfall not only for the Jews, but it even threatens other nations in Eastern and Northern Europe. In my innermost conviction, the danger emanating from Nazi Germany is much greater for Lithuania and the Lithuanians than for the Jews."

"A part of our youth has also been infected with these bacilli, a youth which is not able to reflect logically about events and ideas. We therefore are obliged, with mutual powers to take all possible steps in order to halt the further spreading of this dangerous epidemic. Jews are able to support Lithuania strongly in the field of international politics. These politics comprise mainly two problems, i.e. Wilno and Klaipeda (Memel). In this respect, there is certainly a broad field for mutual co-operation. Lithuania has been an Eretz Israel for Jews and we hope that in the future it will also be one of the most pro-Semitic powers."

## Lectures Jews on Morals

The Assistant-Procurator of the Supreme Court, M. Kavalis, found it necessary to give the Jews a lecture on morals. Firstly: Jews still today speak only Russian. It is true that Jews in recent years have made progress in knowledge of the Lithuanian language, but it has not become as familiar to them as, for instance, Polish with the Polish Jew and Latvian with Latvian Jews. Jews are widely represented in the Lithuanian Communist party and show a high percentage there, he complained. This gives material for argument against Jews. M. Kavalis also protested that the Jews very seldom give up their criminal elements to the authorities, especially to the courts. He also voiced the opinion that the frequent bankruptcies of Jewish merchants do not make a good impression, as they harm the credit of Lithuania in other countries.

He added that the Jews must understand the movement of Lithuanian youth from the villages into the cities. It is a fact that, as the Jews are an urban population they busy themselves mostly with business and industry. Before the war, Lithuanians did not enter the economic field. Now, since state offices are overcrowded, Lithuanian intellectuals are seeking an outlet in the economic field.

## Advocates "Loud Patriotism"

M. Kavalis also stated that certain friction between the different national groups in Lithuania can not be avoided but said it must be expressed only in civilized forms and must lead to constructive results. He declared that Jews as well as Lithuanians have many common enemies, which makes it necessary for them to approach each other and to undertake mutual discussion. This can be done, he claimed, by co-operation, and in societies which aim at common interest for the state. A Jewish periodical printed in Lithuania so that the Lithuanians would be able to hear the Jew's voice would be of great advantage, he said.

tion and leader of the Christian Democrats, Dr. Bistros, declared:

"In these grave historical times we must not permit people to be oppressed for the simple reason that they belong to a different nation."

Loud patriotism is a "best seller" at the present time, he said. It is easier to accuse foreigners than to admit one's own faults and shortcomings. Lithuanian Jewish citizens have just the same right to be employed and to find a livelihood as other Lithuanian citizens, he declared.

Regarding political dangers which threaten Lithuania, he said there is a possibility that the Jews may be hit just as hard as others. The Jews, he pointed out, can do much in connection with Lithuania's principal problems in the international forum, since Jewish influence is proportionately greater than the number of Jews.

## Complains Jews Isolate Selves

The President of the Lithuanian Journalists Association and leading Lithuanian editor, Dr. Puritskis, expressed the opinion that the Jews isolate themselves too much and do not display enough energy in seeking a closer contact with Lithuanian society. To underline his words he gave a number of examples. Jewish journalists, he said, do not participate in meetings called by the Lithuanian Journalists Association.

When a short while ago, a Lithuanian journalist made an anti-Semitic speech at one of these meetings, no Jewish journalist was present to reply to the speech.

Only five Jews have entered the Society for Economic Studies as members, but only one attends the meetings, Dr. Puritskis said. Often important Jewish problems are debated at the Society sessions and Jews certainly would have the possibility of giving vent to their opinions on important questions in economic life, he said.

## Passaic Bans German Films

## Anti-Nazi Body Stops Picketing Of Shopkeeper

### Exacts Promise From Jewish Store Owner to Consider Boycott

Rain which made picketing activities uncomfortable, combined with a promise to reconsider a previous abrupt refusal to comply with demands of the Anti-Nazi Minute Men of America, brought to an abortive end a picketing campaign started yesterday afternoon by that militant organization in front of the cutlery and sewing machine parts shop of Louis Kadish at 111 Delancey street.

The picketing, carried on by a squad of six blue-hatted anti-Nazis, was the result of charges that Kadish bought and sold German-made goods. The merchant, a Jew, had previously been warned on several occasions to discontinue selling Nazi articles under pain of being boycotted and picketed.

When the final deadline set by the anti-Nazi group for compliance with the request had passed, the squad went into action. Under the gaze of a large crowd of the curious, the picketers alternated in carrying a sign which read as follows:

"For humanity's sake, don't buy German goods. Kadish sells German goods. Cooperate with the Anti-Nazi Minute Men, headquarters 276 Fifth avenue."

#### Rain Intervenes

After several hours of parading in front of the Kadish establishment, both Mr. Kadish and the picketers showed signs of being fed up. When it began to rain, Kadish perked up and the picket-line seemed ready to wilt.

At this psychological juncture, a Jewish Daily Bulletin reporter arrived on the scene. Bringing Joseph Rosen, chairman of the Minute Men's boycott division, and Kadish face to face, a compromise was finally decided upon.

Although continuing in his refusal to sign the pledge of abstinence from Nazi merchandise, which Rosen sought to exact from him, Kadish consented to ponder the matter and to call at the Minute Men's headquarters next Friday. The picketing was immediately declared non-est and the picketers seemed considerably relieved. They're hoping it doesn't rain next Friday in the event that Kadish refuses to come through with the pledge.

## Glass Works First Of Kind in Region

### Plant Will Employ 120 Men; Sponsors Are German and Netherlands Jews

(J.T.A. Special Correspondence)  
HAIFA, Oct. 10.—Work began here yesterday on the construction of a factory for the manufacture of glass, the first of its kind in the entire Near East.

The plant, which will employ 120 workers, is located in Emek Zebulun on land owned by the Jewish National Fund. A group of German and Dutch Jews are sponsoring the project. The factory will manufacture window glass and will be known as Phoenicia, Ltd.

Specialists, engineers and skilled workers have been engaged abroad and will teach the trade to local workers. The directors of the concern are experienced manufacturers from Europe who have been selling their products in the Near East for many years. Sponsors of the plan are investing \$156,000 in the necessary plant and equipment.

## Only 92 Men Left in Samaritan Community

**Congress Probe a Burlesque**  
Referring to the Congressional Nazi investigating committee he said: "Dickstein and his burlesque show are turning the tables against the Jews themselves. He promised to skin our leaders alive, instead he and his people are being skinned alive. Despite Dickstein, Untermyer and Wise our movement is going ahead in this country," Schnuch asserted.

Dr. J. R. Jaeger, German Consul General in Chicago, appeared for a few minutes, bringing greetings from Germany, expressing his interest in the organization and wishing it well.

Walter Kappe, editor of the New York Nazi weekly, Deutsche Zeitung, said: "I am glad to see the interest which has been awakened among Americans in our movement. They also are up against the so-called chosen people." He echoed the "skin 'em alive" statement made previously by Schnuch.

Louis Zahne of New York, unbridled anti-Semite, addressed the meeting in English on the subject of promotional membership work for the organization. During his speech he referred to "five million garlic eaters who are trying to run things in the United States."

Delegates from various cities, who are here for the DAWA convention, which opens tonight in the Stevens Hotel, were presented to the audience. A Brooklyn delegate declared that he was "looking forward to the day when we will have parades in every city in this country and thousands will carry our swastika banners through the streets of all American cities."

#### Mayor Regrets Absence

A letter from Mayor Edward J. Kelly of Chicago was read in which he stated that he was unable to attend owing to the pressure of city business and the necessity for leaving for the American Legion convention in Miami, Florida. "I am sorry that I cannot be at the Palmer House with the Friends of New Germany and hope you will have a pleasant and enjoyable evening," the mayor's letter concluded.

Despite a written pledge given to the Palmer House officials, the audience sang the Horst Wessel song and followed it with the German flag song.

## Steuben Society Hears Woman Flay Nazi Rule

### Mrs. Panken, Candidate for Congress, Does it in Yorkville, Too

Members of the Steuben Society, German-American group which has strongly resisted Nazification, were today still discussing the ringing denunciation of the Hitler regime they listened to over at Mozart Hall in Yorkville.

The denunciation was delivered by Mrs. Rachel Pally Panken, Socialist candidate for Congress in the Fourteenth Congressional district, who appeared before the society by invitation of its officials.

Pointing out in her speech that she belongs to the groups that have been singled out for persecution by the Hitler regime, she also took occasion to reprove, by inference, those of her audience who approve of the Nazi policies.

"It is fortunate," she declared, "that the traditions of the American people and their love for freedom of thought and opinion makes it possible for me to speak to you at this gathering, even though there are some here who approve the policies of the present German government."

"As a Socialist," Mrs. Panken went on, "I detest all that Hitlerism stands for. I know of nothing that reveals how far a nation could revert to primitive barbarism. Its racial intolerance, its destruction of every form of democratic procedure, its elevation of the lowest instincts have filled the world with a sense of revulsion that it will take generations to overcome."

"The constitution and by-laws," he wrote, "are modeled directly on the organization of the Nazi party in Germany."

"It is my belief that the incorporation of this association is fraught with danger to our American democracy; that it will promote racial hatred and bigotry and bring about a cleavage among the citizens of this country belonging to a different religious faith or of different racial origin."

None of the prominent Nazis leaders in New York could be reached for comment yesterday. Most of them are attending the convention of the DAWA, anti-Jewish organization, in Chicago.

Committee, supported by the Independent Order B'nai B'rith, is opposing it.

Pointing out that there is no important difference of opinion either in principle or purpose between opposing factions, Lipsky called upon leaders of American Jewry to "be big enough to overcome their prejudices and to find some way to cooperate in Jewish service. Steps should be taken at once, at any rate, to mitigate the campaign of reciprocal abuse which is now going on."

#### Accord Now at Peak

"Contrary to the general impression," he continued, "there never was greater accord and cooperation among Jews than prevails today. The differences in principle that raged in years past about Zionism are today fairly adjusted in the practical work for the building of the Jewish National Home in Palestine through the extended Jewish Agency, which is recognized as an international Jewish body in the Palestine Mandate."

Mr. Lipsky concluded with a suggestion that the American Jewish Committee, B'nai B'rith and the American Jewish Committee hold a conference to establish maximum cooperation and thus avoid "a conflict which will destroy, if allowed to continue, all that has thus far been achieved in the way of cooperation in the upbuilding of Palestine as the Homeland and in the measures to aid the Jewish victims of the Nazi government."

Attending the conference at which Lipsky was the guest of honor were Zionist representatives from Maryland, North Carolina, South Carolina, Virginia and the District of Columbia.

#### Austria Is Flayed

The Anglo-Jewish leader sharply criticized the Austrian government for its anti-Semitic policies, contrasting the promises made by Chancellor Kurt Schuschnigg in Geneva to the actions of his government in Vienna.

"The terrible tragedy of the Jews in Austria approximates the German-Jewish tragedy," President Laski said.

In a survey of the Jewish situation in Europe, he also called attention to the unfortunate lot of the Jews in the Baltic states and expressed the hope that the British government would look into the situation "in the spirit of the statements made by Sir John Simon and Captain Anthony Eden in Geneva."

Referring to the recent Jewish conference in Geneva, Mr. Laski declared that the Board of Deputies did not participate in the sessions because the board as such had never associated itself with the boycott movement.

## Rabbi, Bishop Exchange Notes Of Good Will

### Follows Montreal Parley at Which Anglicans Assailed Nazis

MONTREAL, Oct. 18.—After the Anglican Church of Canada assembled at its General Synod here in Montreal passed a resolution voicing protest against the persecution of Jews in Germany, Rabbi Harry J. Stern of Temple Emanu-El of this city sent a telegram to Rt. Reverend Farthing, Bishop of Montreal, expressing his thankfulness for "the brotherly spirit which your statements manifest toward the Jewish people."

It brought back the following letter from Bishop Farthing, a notable statement of good will. "While we may differ on many points," if read, "at the same time we are all servants of the one God. We owe a great deal to your race through whom the revelation of Jehovah came. As Christians we feel that we have had a revelation of the Spirit of Jehovah our God and Father through Jesus Christ, and we are assured that if we are loyal to Him there can be no bitterness, no persecution, but love of men even of our enemies."

"The Synod was very enthusiastic in the resolution that was passed, I think, unanimously, in both Houses, and there can be but one thought, that is of sympathy with the persecuted and condemnation of the persecutors. I trust that through the troubles afflicting us we may be all drawn closer to our God and so in Him closer to each other."
