

Turks Agree To Pay for War Damage

American Jews Will Get \$1,300,000 in Reparations

(Special to the J.D.N.)
WASHINGTON, Nov. 15.—American Jews who suffered damages under the Turkish regime in the Turkish army will receive compensation as the result of an agreement the United States will sign with Turkey within the next ten days, it was announced here today.

Turkey will pay American claimants damages to the extent of \$1,300,000 for losses inflicted by the Turkish army in Palestine during the World War, the agreement provides.

It is estimated that American-Jewish claims will reach \$750,000 in settlement of their claims against the war-time Turkish government.

Claims Date From War
The claims date from the World War and are primarily for damages suffered by American citizens through acts of the Turkish military forces who destroyed forests and uprooted fruit trees and vines in the Jewish colonies. Much of the damage could not even be executed on the ground of military necessity.

A number of abortive attempts were made by American officials to initiate negotiations with the Turkish government.

Selects Stevedores For Haifa Wharves

WARSAW, Nov. 15.—Hundreds of Polish Jewish porters, baggage movers and dock workers, specially chosen for their sturdy physique, will shortly leave for Palestine, where they will be employed in the newly created harbor of Haifa, it was announced here today.

Abu Chushi, of Palestine, a special delegate of the Jewish Agency is now in Poland, where he is selecting the candidates for dock work in Haifa, from thousands of Jewish applicants in every section of Poland.

A similar procedure was followed at Salonica, Greece, where the Jewish Agency chose 130 young Jews for work in Haifa harbor. The Salonica Jews, however, have been harbor workers for generations.

Czechoslovakia Seizes Edition of 'Protocols'

PRAGUE, Nov. 15.—The entire edition of the Czechoslovakian version of the "Protocols of the Elders of Zion" was confiscated today by orders of a Czechoslovakian court. Circulation of the "Protocols" anywhere in the country was strictly forbidden by the court.

Mosley and 3 Cronies Held for Riot Trial

LONDON, Nov. 15.—Sir Oswald Mosley, "fuhrer" of the British Fascists, and three of his henchmen were committed to stand trial at Workington today on a charge of riotous assembly after a blackshirt meeting in that city on October 9. They were also charged with inciting the riotous assembly. All four were released on bail after pleading not guilty.

Thirty witnesses testified during the preliminary hearing, which lasted four days. The prosecution contended that after the meeting, Fascists led by the four accused men walked up and down assaulting innocent and inoffensive pedestrians.

N. Y. Kashruth Situation Now At Standstill

Rival Groups Busy Lining Up Forces for Showdown

All was quiet yesterday on the troubled poultry kashruth front. Markets throughout the city, some under Kashruth Association supervision, others supervised by independent rabbis, were scenes of bustling activity as poultry was slaughtered in preparation for the Sabbath.

The Kashruth Association ban on all poultry not bearing the metal leg-bands of supervision by Association rabbis has sent about 150 market owners scurrying to sign contracts for Kashruth Association supervision, an official announced yesterday.

Expert Action on Rebels
In the meantime, most of the large Bronx markets were being supervised by a group of three rabbis, headed by Raphael M. Baruch, who signed a contract with the Live Poultry Association of New York, wholesalers' organization. The Kashruth Association is expected to take some action on this dissident group in the near future.

Rabbi Benjamin Fleischer, who was prohibited by a rabbinical tribunal from supervising slaughtering, continued to supervise a number of East Side markets. The Kashruth Association is expected to take some action on this dissident group in the near future.

Vienna Leaders Call for Action To Protect Pledged Equality

Declare at Mass Meeting That Jews 'Will Never Voluntarily Resign Citizenship Rights' Guaranteed by Peace Treaties and Constitution

VIENNA, Nov. 15.—Austrian Jewish leaders will never voluntarily resign its citizenship rights and all other rights guaranteed by the peace treaties and the Austrian constitution, leading Austrian Jewish personalities declared today at a mass meeting called by the Austrian Zionist Organization. They called on the entire Jewish population for united support in the struggle to defend Jewish rights.

The principal speakers at the meeting were Dr. Desider Friedmann, president of the Vienna Jewish community; Dr. Lowenherz and Dr. Ehrlich, vice-presidents of the community. Dr. Gruenbaum, Austrian Zionist leader, presided.

"We demand living room for the Jews of Austria," the Jewish leaders declared in discussing the newly-proclaimed Corporate Fascist State in Austria.

"We want the world and all the governments of the world to know that Jews will never voluntarily resign our citizenship rights, which are 'sacra non tangere' (sacred and not to be touched)."

Fulfill Duties
"We are not pensive, but we react when we are hurt and facts and occurrences causing justified complaints necessitated these declarations. We know that ninety per cent of the Austrian population is Christian and German and that they are entitled to a constitution of their own choosing."

"We are fulfilling our duties to our country, but at the same time we are a national and religious minority and we demand the same equality of rights, not only constitutionally, but in actual administrative practice."

"Force may do much, but we will never surrender one iota of the rights safeguarded by the peace treaties and by the constitution," the Austrian Jewish leaders said.

Drs. Friedmann and Ehrlich also stated that they will present the viewpoint of the Austrian Jews to the Austrian government. They appealed to the entire Jewish population, regardless of party or faction, for united support for the program presented at the meeting.

New Anti-Jewish Paper Appears As Deutsche Zeitung Sheds Bias

What may or may not be the final chapter in the lurid history of the conviction of William L. McGaughrin, the Deutsche Zeitung, a Yorkville weekly, was written yesterday.

In a lengthy and effusive apology for the criminally libelous articles it wrote about former Magistrate Joseph Goldstein, which led to the conviction of William L. McGaughrin, managing editor, the newspaper promises to eschew all expressions of anti-Semitism in the future. The apology was a condition made by County Judge Franklin Taylor when he acquiesced to a dramatic plea by Mr. Goldstein and Samuel Untermeyer that

he suspend execution of a year's sentence in city prison on McGaughrin.

While the apology, which is accompanied by a statement announcing a complete change of editorial policy, the crux of which is its intention to eliminate all "encouragement of racial prejudices," was being received with satisfaction in Jewish circles, a new publication was born.

The new paper, also a weekly, is called the Deutscher Beobachter. It is a weekly publication of the American League of the Friends of New Germany, of which Dr. Herbert Schnuch is president, the paper gives evidence of assuming

the toga of anti-Semitism publicly discarded by the Deutsche Zeitung.

In a page one announcement, the Beobachter, under the signature of Dr. Schnuch, accounts for the new publication as being the result of "special circumstances as they were reported in detail in the daily press of Greater New York on November 12 and November 14."

Friends' Quit Paper
The special circumstances alluded to were the reports of the McGaughrin conviction. As a result of this, Dr. Schnuch announced, the Friends of New Germany have been obliged to sever

Common a Body Settles Kosher Case

'Court' in Jersey City Penalizes Butcher on Charge

(Special to the J.D.B.)

JERSEY CITY, Nov. 15.—By consent of the Hudson County prosecutor, a kosher food law violation was settled here by the Jewish Community Court, which barred Jack Gottlieb, a butcher, from engaging in the kosher food trade for five years and compelled him to contribute twenty-five dollars to the United Jewish Appeal. The first indictment in the history of this county for a kosher food law violation was handed down against Gottlieb last June after William H. Werelowsky, rabbi, lawyer and chairman of the local Kashruth Committee, had accused Gottlieb of selling non-kosher meat under kosher labels. The Jewish community asked for permission to handle the case, and it was placed before the Jewish Community Court, consisting of Judge Morris Barison, H. J. Goldstein and I. Charles Lissand. The court found Gottlieb guilty and sentenced him to a year in the engaging in the kosher meat trade in the county for five years and to pay a twenty-five dollar "fine" to the United Jewish Appeal. The indictment will be nullified. Rabbi Werelowsky today served notice that he intends to prosecute to the limit all violators of the kosher food law.

Mrs. Schomburg, who spoke under the auspices of the School of the Jewish Woman, declared commercial entertainment "leaves these women and their children at the mercy of war propaganda, increasing each day, and of a growing Fascist philosophy."

Arabs Demand Mount Canaan Under 500-Year-Old Document

SAFED, Palestine, Nov. 15.—Development of the northern Jewish settlements in this district is seriously threatened as the result of a dispute begun by Arab agitators imported from Jerusalem concerning ownership of land on Mount Canaan.

In Jewish lands for forty years, the land on Mount Canaan is now being claimed by the Arabs as part of Moslem religious property. Subhi Bey Khadra, notorious Moslem agitator, whom the Shaw Commission called "a sinister figure," appeared at Safed accompanied by the extreme nationalist lawyer, Auni Abdul Hadi Bey, and produced a document alleged to have been written 500 years ago, purportedly proving that the land belonged to the Moslems. This document, if upheld, would annul the rights of the Jewish Colonization Association, which purchased the land forty years ago.

The document produced by the Arabs describes the boundary of the land as being "a spring and a pomegranate tree," neither of which are to be found on the territory.

District Commissioner S. H.

Perowne immediately declared the land under dispute and prohibited any work there. Jewish farmers who tried to plough the land were arrested after the Arabs had turned out in force to prevent work. None of the Arabs was arrested, but M. Stern of the Anglo-Palestine Bank in Safed, who supervised the ploughing, was ordered to post a £100 bond with Safed, from which he has resided since birth.

All plans for the urban development of Safed, including construction, town planning and the building of a resort on the mountain, are at a complete standstill. The land was sold under the old Turkish administration and approved by the Turkish government. Under the British administration the title of the Jewish owners was upheld in 1925. Subsequently the land was divided among a number of colonization groups, including an American unit.

Not only do many investors face heavy losses if the Arab claim is upheld, but such a result, it is predicted, would mark the beginning of numerous suits contesting the validity of Jewish land titles in every part of Palestine.

Brooklyn Dinner to Net \$85,000 for Federation

The Brooklyn Federation of Jewish Charities reported yesterday its expectation that at least \$85,000 will be taken in at its annual dinner and ball, which will be held Sunday night at the Hotel St. George.

Reservations at \$50 a plate have been made by 1,700 persons. According to Magistrate David L. Mablin, chairman of the entertainment committee, Eddie Cantor, Milton Berle and Louis Armstrong will appear and speeches will be taboos.

Mosley Raked By Rundschau; Italy Is Cited

Zionist Paper Gives Lie to 'Fundamental' Opposition

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN.—"It is not our business to engage in polemics with Sir Oswald Mosley, because this is an instance of concern of British politics," the Zionist Juedische Rundschau says in a long article on Mosley's attack on the Jews at his recent Albert Hall meeting.

"Those who know British conditions must be astounded at what Mosley said. For even if it were true that the majority of the Jews in England are opposed to British Fascism, the same holds good of the majority of the British people, right up to the most conservative."

British statesmen and members of parliament, leaders of public life, the British press, which is almost entirely without Jewish influence, are united in opposition to the Mosley group. Why then does Sir Oswald complain of the Jews? Is it because he thinks that agitation against the Jews will create new sentiment for his movement?

His Explanation

"Mosley says that his movement is not anti-Semitic, and that it is calumny invented by the Jews that it is anti-Semitic, and in order to punish them for this calumny he now becomes actually anti-Semitic. The assertion that Jews are fundamentally opposed to Fascism is not tenable."

"In Italy many prominent Jews are definitely adherents of Fascism and entirely in the service. In Italy, Fascism is not anti-Jewish; in England the Jews are as little Fascist as the non-Jews. And with Mosley's present attitude, it is hardly to be expected that the Jewish population should be more favorable to him than the others."

Meanwhile the Jewish community reports an article which appeared in the Hammer, written by the English Fascist, Leese (the leader of the Imperial Fascist League, which is anti-Mosley), in which he writes:

Offshoots: Blood Jewish

"Sir Oswald Mosley married a woman of Jewish blood, so that his children, too, have Jewish blood. The paid agents of the British Union of Fascists spare no effort to hide this important fact in order to confuse it. It is obvious that all the threats which Sir Oswald directs against the Jews are as false as the blood of his children."

"When Mosley created his party he said, according to the Jewish Chronicle of August 28: 'I shall not conduct any kind of anti-Jewish propaganda,' and in the Daily Mail of January 29, 1934, he wrote: 'We are accused of anti-Semitism and racial and religious persecution. This charge is untrue.'"

Samuel Phocas Fettel, Austrian historian of the seventeenth century, wrote the "Tit ha-Yawen" describing the horrible excesses perpetrated in the Cossack's uprising under Bogdan Chmelnytsky.

Gamoran Finds Security Lies in Unity Alone

Integrate With Group For Anchorage, His Admonition

"There is need of anchorage and of a feeling of security. The Jew can find such anchorage only by integrating himself into the life of his group."

This warning was laid down by Dr. Emanuel Gamoran, educational director of the Commission on Jewish Education, in an address explaining the objectives of the Jewish religious schools.

"It makes no difference whether we conceive of ourselves as essentially a religious group or a cultural group," he declared. "If we conceive ourselves to be a religious group, we must remember that religion with us never meant a divorce from life, which it sometimes seems to mean to those who use the term."

"Certainly, if we think of ourselves as a cultural group, and if we are true to Jewish history, we must recognize that our culture is essentially a religious culture."

"It includes, however, a great many other elements. It includes art and literature and music and ways of life—in short, the life of a people dedicated to the search for higher values."

Dr. Gamoran asserted achievement of happiness depends upon recognition that "it is our first duty to be true to ourselves."

MONTREAL, NOV. 15.—The Jewish community council announced a severe setback today when a local court lifted temporary injunctions restraining shochet breminers from practicing his occupation as slaughterer of cattle and sheep.

The court declared itself reluctant to interfere in ecclesiastical laws, particularly where such laws are not clearly established.

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S. O. S.

The call which the Jewish leaders in Austria issued yesterday "to the world and to all governments," stating that the Austrian Jews will have to resign their citizenship rights voluntarily, must be taken as a signal that the Jewish position in Austria has reached the point of gravest danger.

This call is the S. O. S. of the Austrian Jewry. It has been issued by the three leading figures of the Jewish community. The people who issued it and who constitute the presidium of the Jewish community of Vienna, have more than once been accused of not being brave enough to fight openly for Jewish rights in their country.

Now even they have raised their voices. Not only do they no longer hesitate to declare that they "demand living room for our own Jewish people," but they even further. They address themselves to the world and to all governments.

This urgent call for help must be picked up by the American Jewish Committee, the American Jewish Congress, the B'nai B'rith, the Joint Consultative Council, and every other existing Jewish organization interested in the fate of Austrian Jewry. Immediate rescue must be organized.

It may be true that international organizations are in our present time merely scraps of paper. It is, however, reasonable to think that the Austrian government in its present situation could not afford to ignore the international mission which has been imposed upon her by the Saint-Germain treaty, if existing Jewish organizations would see to it that the League of Nations institute an inquiry as to how the Saint-Germain treaty is being carried out in Austria.

The case of Austria's mistreatment of its Jewish population must come up before the League of Nations. There is sufficient ground for bringing this case up before the League. The equal rights for organized minorities, stipulated by the Saint-Germain treaty, have been sufficiently violated by the Austrian government.

Simultaneously with taking up this case in Geneva, something must be done by organizations in America to make the Austrian government feel that the Jews have no more patience with Austria. Immediate action is the crying need of the hour.

JERUSALEM'S MAJOR

By ISAAC GRUENBAUM

(Member of the Executive of the Jewish Agency)

The recent municipal elections in two Palestinian cities have shown to what extent the Yishuv has grown during the past few years. We have four Jewish councilmen in Haifa and six in Jerusalem. In Haifa, the Jewish councilmen are a third of the council; in Jerusalem, they are half. In Haifa, the Jewish councilmen formerly were only a fifth of all the members; in Jerusalem, they were a third. It is acknowledged quite without dispute that the vice-mayor of Haifa will be a Jew; the same is true in Jerusalem.

But in Jerusalem the Jews are laying claim to the mayoralty, for they are really the strongest group, one which is uniform as well. The Arabs are divided into Moslems and Christians and, moreover, lack political commitment. The Arab opposition has suffered a major defeat: its leader, who has been mayor under the British for the last five years, his place has been taken by Dr. Khaldi, an Arab of lofty lineage, who was supported by the Muttahida party, the closest ally of the Muttahida party. Dr. Khaldi thus brings upon the scene a third titled family to add to the Huseini and the Haddad families who are fighting for the control of Arab society. The internal fight in the Arab community has become extremely more involved and complicated.

Nashshibi Clings to Post

Nashshibi refuses to step aside. He is still looking for some way in which to remain in the saddle. The post he held as mayor of Jerusalem was not only an honor to him and a position of power, but was also a good source of income. During his tenure in office, there was considerable corruption in the city council and the city administration. That is why he is exerting every effort to keep his power, which is not impossible to do despite the fact that he was not elected to the city council by the Jewish voters. Members of which the mayor is chosen. He can enter a protest against the voting in the district in which Dr. Khaldi was chosen; at the same time, one of his adherents, who was elected, can withdraw. In both cases new elections are ordered and Nashshibi could win. Should he be elected he is certain of being appointed mayor by the government so great is his belief that the Government will take his position toward him. Whether or not he has definite grounds for this certainty may perhaps be disputed, but it is undisputed that one would think.

The situation is further complicated by the fact that among the Arab councilmen Dr. Khaldi is the only one suitable to hold the post of mayor. All the other likely candidates are among the Jews.

Thus the question of appointing a Jewish mayor has arisen for the government. It is a bit the government is having difficulty swallowing. For should such a thing be done, it would constitute an admission that Jerusalem is really a Jewish city, that Jewish influence has greatly increased, that the Jews have gained the leadership of the capital of the country, of the Holy City in which the Christians have so many sacred places and where the Moslems are making every effort to increase their holy places.

It is evident that all this will not readily be admitted.

Question of Tactics To Be Considered

Should the fight for the Jerusalem mayoralty be begun now? The answer to this important political question is being generally sought. As usual, the question has already been exploited in various intrigues and an attempt has been made to accuse the Labor Party and the Agency (or rather, the head of the political department), of not wanting a Jew as mayor of Jerusalem, of being afraid to make a demand to the effect of renouncing the idea at the outset. An attempt was even made to stir up public opinion in the matter.

It is not a question of whether the demand should be made—there can really be no two opinions about this—but of whether it should be made at a certain time. That is, in the event that the demand is set aside, should the mandates in the city council be surrendered and the council left to the Arabs? That was done in a previous council when it became impossible to bear any longer the Arab majority's refusal to consider the Jewish minority. The municipal council was not dissolved—it continued to function without the Jews, that is, without the Jewish interest in Jerusalem gained nothing by this state of affairs does not need to be pointed out. But at that time there was really no alternative: the Jewish interests would not in any case have been taken into consideration, so that it was better not to

share the responsibility.

But now the situation is somewhat different. The Jews have ceased to be a minority. If the Arabs, the Moslems and the Christians, the Muttahida party and the opposition—are not in agreement, the Jews may even win a decisive place, and the High Commissioner take advantage of his right to appoint one or two members of the council, whom he would like to have better to be content, this time, with the demonstration, and to concentrate on transforming the post of vice-mayor into a position of real power. To attain this, the vice-mayor should be given the opportunity to work. That is, he should be paid a salary and be allowed to administer municipal matters.

Christian Demands For Vice-Mayoral Post

This, too, is not easily done. Christian circles are pressing the government to appoint a Christian as second vice-mayor, so that none of the faiths will feel excluded. Meanwhile, the question is not so much that of the actual title of vice-mayor, but of power and influence. The honor might be foregone, but the power attendant upon the conduct of the city's affairs is quite another matter. The same problem has already arisen in Haifa, and is now being faced in Jerusalem.

The opinion that the striving should not be for honors, no matter how great they may be, but for a true opportunity to work, to influence the municipal administration and to help carry out the Jewish objective of winning. No one has any great eagerness to declare war to the limit—that is, to withdraw from the city council and to demand that a Jewish mayor be appointed is rejected.

Politics Intensified With Yishuv's Growth

The intensification of political questions in connection with the growth of the Jewish Yishuv. It no longer suffices to be content with declarations and demonstrations of the political demands are no longer general, expressing our desire to achieve our highest aims all at once. One struggles for the realization of the demands, one goes into a series of battles, as is every great war. Every battle won is a new position for us, a new opportunity to go forward to the goal. In the mixed cities, especially in Jerusalem, a new situation is arising which will have growing importance for the Jewish Yishuv in Haifa. In Jerusalem, because of the holiness of the city and its historic role, and in Haifa, because of the economic importance of this seaport which is growing apace and because of the international character which will in time be attained.

We have not as yet the opportunity in Haifa which we now have in Jerusalem. In the latter city, the Jewish majority—citizens entitled to vote are only fifty per cent. of the population. In Haifa, however, through the tempo of increase of the Jewish population is rapidly quickening, the Jews are but thirty per cent. of the total population and are thus still far from being a majority.

The struggle will concentrate in Jerusalem for the present. It will be a difficult fight fraught with responsibility. It is not to be waged with the utmost care, but at the same time with

Between the Lines

The Jewish Congress Postponed
The postponement of a World Jewish Congress in 1935—a matter which for the last four years and up till now has been the cause of the deepest conflict between the leading Jewish organizations in America—has now practically been postponed.

The American Jewish Congress has indicated its willingness to forego its determination to summon the World Jewish Congress in 1935 if the opposing Jewish bodies in America would agree to the creation of a united council in which all groups and parties should participate.

The plan proposed by the American Jewish Congress may not be accepted by the opposing groups exactly in the form suggested. It will however serve as a good basis for the reconciliation of the groups in American Jewry which have been divergent since the summoning of the first American Jewish Congress, seventeen years ago.

Unity Is Possible

That unity in American Jewry is possible has been demonstrated in an entire form within the past few years. The Joint Consultative Council is one example of possible unification.

The United Jewish Appeal conducted by the Joint Distribution Committee and the American Palestine Campaign is another example of unity in American Jewry.

But while these efforts for unity have been of temporary nature only, the plan suggested by the American Jewish Congress may result—after some modification—in a permanent unity. It may bring unity not only to the American Jewish Jewry, but also in the ranks of World Jewry.

Never before has the need for a united Jewish front been so acute, now, when the solution of Jewish problems throughout the world must receive the most serious consideration. Jewish needs today is a permanent organization planning long-range action and prepared for emergency action such as the one in Germany, such as the one now cropping up in Austria, such as the one in Poland.

Following the American Line
The American Jewish Committee, just as the American nation has withdrawn from its isolationist policy in practice, if not technically, is now following the American line, in the light of the peculiar anti-Jewish conditions now existing in many parts of Europe, must follow the American line, in the light of the Jewish situation in the fate of European Jewry.

American Jewry is today the most dominant factor in the solution of Jewish problems, in the cause of its favored position as the largest, freest, richest Jewish community in the world. United American Jewry would lead to unity in world Jewry and to a better protection of Jewish rights.

A plan which would make such unity possible is therefore to be welcomed. The further developments of the offer made by the American Jewish Congress will therefore be watched with great interest.

Role of Zion in Zion

Dr. Mordecai Soltes, national director of education of the Jewish Welfare Board, will speak on "The Role of American Jewish Youth in the Rehabilitation of Palestine" before Young Israel of Manhattan. The lecture will take place Tuesday evening, November 29, at 229 East Broadway.

Digest of World Press Opinion

Concerning Appeal Of Jewish Congress

The Yiddish press in America comments widely on the resolution to discontinue the committee of the American Jewish Congress, asking cooperation of the American Jewish Committee and the B'nai B'rith in the formation of a united Jewish representative body.

The *Day*, in an editorial, states: The American Jewish Congress has extended a hand of peace to the American Jewish Committee, the B'nai B'rith and other Jewish organizations, which have so far not been drawn into the movement for a Jewish World Congress.

It is peace and cooperation with all groups in American Jewish life which the American Jewish Congress seeks to achieve by its latest step, and not a trade in the basic principles of the Jewish World Congress. The idea of the Jewish World Congress remains as was. The Jewish World Congress will be fought with the various groups in a democratic basis.

But before the Jewish World Congress is convoked, another attempt is made to talk things over with the various groups in the Jewish people, in order to see on what conditions they can join the movement.

Expresses Hope

Expressing the hope that the manifesto for the Jewish World Congress, which the Jewish World Congress will be warmly received, Mr. Jacob Fishbein comments in the *Morning Journal*:

There can be a difference of opinion on one of the points in the decisions. That is, the so-called referendum, which asks whether there should be a single representative body acting as agent for all the Jews and whether the Jewish World Congress should be brought into being.

This referendum is, in the first place, quite superfluous. It is certain that those who come to vote in the elections to the American Jewish Congress are for both. Otherwise they would not bother to vote. And why should the American Jewish Congress ostensibly "challenge" the Jewish World Congress and vote against these two principles?

And because it is superfluous, this may arouse a certain confusion, and present an obstacle to the peace negotiations.

The decision to hold a superfluous referendum bears the stamp of a concession to the stormy petrels of the Congress movement. That is to say: true, we are going to a round table with the opposition, but we shall show them that we are strong as iron.

This is a bit of a dissonance to the other decisions and to the generally peaceful spirit of the action. In the same way, it was unnecessary to say what the American Jewish Congress will do should, God forbid, the unity

not come. The present opponents of the Jewish World Congress will not be impressed by such a referendum, which will prove nothing, for the great majority of Jews will stay at home.

That is why I believe that the chances for achieving harmony would be greater if this superfluous referendum were to be omitted.

Views of Coughlin Are Disputed

Dr. S. Margoshes, commenting in the *Day* upon the views which the Rev. Charles E. Coughlin expressed in his interview with a representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, states:

Father Coughlin's is, perhaps, one of the most important and surely one of the most resonant voices in America. When he speaks, people listen, and certainly when he chooses to sound his views on Jewish questions, as he did yesterday in an interview, Jews are bound to give him a respectful hearing. We doubt, however, whether they will take his advice.

Father Coughlin advises Jews in America to pay no attention to the efforts now made to provoke an anti-Semitic movement in the U. S., since Jew-hatred in America is "either dead or dying."

We wonder where the Rev. Father takes his information. Has he followed the spread of the "Silver Shirt" movement throughout the South West? Has he watched the rising growth in the Eastern part of the U. S. of the diverse anti-Semitic organizations, such as the "Order of 76," "Security League" and other groups parading in the cloak of patriotism, but really preaching racial and religious nationalism to the Jew? Is he familiar with the machinations of the far-flung Nazi campaign in America, and has he kept an eye on the astounding facts brought to light by the McCormack Congressional investigation into the insidious and un-American activities of the Nazi agitators in the U. S.? We are afraid that in his zest to convert the country to a silver program, he has not. For otherwise he would not have taken this opinion, but they do not.

Irak Anti-Zionist, Not Anti-Jewish

The anti-Jewish persecutions in Iraq are aimed not against the Jews, but against Zionism, it is reported, in the Palestine Post in a letter from Baghdad. The correspondent also asserts that the German consulate in Baghdad is financing the anti-Jewish movement in Iraq. He declares:

While the danger of serious persecution of Jews is hardly more acute as would appear from certain press reports spread abroad, there does exist,

in view of what has occurred quite recently in other Arab countries, ground for anxiety. The undoubted latent hostility towards Jews is obviously exploited and strengthened, morally and financially, by the German consulate in Baghdad. The German Consul, who till lately was esteemed a man of liberal thought, and who was friendly with the Jewish merchants in whose hands a large proportion of the import trade lay, now openly and completely follows the instructions of the Hitler government. Since the Baghdad Jews are increasingly disinclined to patronize German firms, he endeavors to destroy the influence of the Jewish merchants and leading officials.

Young Zionism in the newly-created State of Iraq sees in Nazism its ideal and in Hitler a hero of national emancipation: the Consul's propaganda falls on fertile soil. The fact that in many stores and on boardings Hitler's photograph with Arabic texts are to be seen, is certainly due to German propaganda. A Hitler film was a short while ago to be shown before King Ghazi and high officials and other influential persons at the German consulate, had not the otherwise always available projector failed just on that night.

Irakian Jewry is too weak and too poorly organized alone to resist the danger which threatens them. The British Government also has certainly no interest in discrimination against an important section of the population and a feeling of in-

security arising in a State which is being established by its cooperation.

Monitor Describes Biro-Bidjan

The *Christian Science Monitor* carries a report from its Moscow correspondent on Biro-Bidjan, which describes conditions there as follows:

Contrary to the usual impression, Winter is more pleasant than Summer. The long Winters are dry and sunny, but the Summers are wet and unpleasantly warm.

The natural resources are sufficient to make the region virtually self-sufficient on present plans to industrialize Biro-Bidjan have been completed. The Province has unlimited arable land, rich mineral resources, and great forests. Transportation facilities are already available through the Amur River and its tributaries and the Trans-Siberian and Vladivostok railways.

The town of Biro-Bidjan, with its population of 6,000, has become a cultural as well as industrial center. It has a theatre seating 400, with a permanent company of actors from the Jewish State Theatre in Moscow. Actors travel to smaller communities and collective farms.

New Paper Dons Anti-Semitic Toga Discarded by Zeitung

its connections with the Deutsche Zeitung. "Consideration of its great responsibility to its members and friends," the Schuchow announcement continues, "to guarantee the necessary support for the furtherance of the ideals and aims of the League and of all Germanoid by an unimpaired combative newspaper, the leadership of the Deutsche Zeitung to continue with the aid of the 'Deutscher Beobachter' the fight already begun."

Although concluding his statement with the apologetic remark that the first issue, comprising four tabloid pages mostly in German, with a few paragraphs of English, is "a makeshift,"

Among persons who have observed the dogged perseverance of the Nazi leaders both in prosecuting the war against Jews, the opinion is being openly expressed that the Beobachter is nothing but a palimpsest subterfuge to enable the managers of the Deutsche Zeitung to evade the spirit of their promise to Judge Taylor.

Lending credence to this suspicion are two outstanding facts. The first is the sudden appearance of the publication simultaneously with the announcement of the German community's "heart of heart" on the anti-Semitic problem. The second, and of even greater significance, is the connection between the period of the new paper and the old.

Dr. Schuchow, who has assumed editorial responsibility for the Beobachter, is the author of an official statement published by the Deutsche Zeitung was listed as one of the three stockholders of the D. Z. Publishing Company, publishers of the Yorkville paper.

At the same time, it was learned that Walter Kappe, editor of the German newspaper, the Deutsche Zeitung, is no longer connected with that publication. An unconfirmed report stated that Kappe is now the guiding editorial spirit of the new weekly.

In the meantime, McLaughlin, whose name is signed to the apology, holding up as prototype of the D. Z. Publishing Company, Carl Voelcker was formerly listed as the titular head of the organization. McLaughlin emphatically denies that he has any connection with the Deutsche Beobachter and says he has no intention whatever of being connected with it in any way whatever.

The full text of the Deutsche Zeitung apology follows:

"We cannot believe that any fair-minded person will think the less of us if in a spirit of sincerity and self-respect we make public confession of a very serious blunder. We are very conscious of it and ask the pardon of all concerned."

post—Turkish government, but all such attempts ended in failure. In February, 1933, both countries signed an agreement providing for the creation of a mixed claims commission, consisting of three Americans and three Turks. All claims and evidence concerning the war have been referred to the commission by August 15, 1933 at Istanbul, where the tribunal held its sittings.

Owing to the fact that one of the Turkish members of the commission was dispatched by his government on an important mission, more than a year elapsed before the commission held its final and decisive session in September of this year.

integrity of Hon. Joseph Goldstein of Brooklyn. After having carefully deliberated this matter and having come to a full realization of the gravity of our act, we now wish to retract that statement and we most humbly apologize for what Judge Goldstein and the Jewish community of which he is a member. We freely acknowledge that our attack upon this gentleman and through him upon the Jewish community was a vile, unconscionable and unfounded. This incident shows how necessary it is to use care in the editing of a newspaper so as not to wrongfully attack the character of any person or people.

"We have begged the pardon of Judge Goldstein and have been magnanimously favored by his assurance that he entertains no ill-will. We are fully aware of how deeply our unfortunate utterance has hurt him and we deeply regret it. We have placed him in an entirely false light before all who saw the offensive article and we are the more conscious of his gracious and generous indulgence. Knowing that in connection with this matter Judge Goldstein was subjected to a great deal of inconvenience and expenditure of valuable time and effort, we felt it was only right and proper to offer to compensate him by way of damages for the injury we had done him and it is worthy of note that he steadfastly refused to accept money damages from us because he believed that his graciousness entirely a moral issue which could not be expressed in terms of money and that the wrong done him, really concerned the Jewish community rather than himself individually. We are happy to acknowledge that the attitude of Judge Goldstein is a well-known fact of Jewish history and our profoundest respect. We also crave the forgiveness of the reading public and particularly of the Jewish people who we sincerely trust, in keeping with their splendid traditions and precepts of forgiveness which permits them to harbor no vindictive feelings, will find it possible to overlook our transgression."

The text of the announcement regarding the paper's change of policy follows:

"We wish to inform all of our subscribers in particular and the reading public in general that after very careful consideration of the matter, we desire to proclaim our unswerving allegiance and fidelity to the high principles and traditions of this land in which we live and work and of which we consider ourselves an integral part."

"Accordingly we very earnestly wish to disclaim and disavow any incitement to racial or religious animosities for which this publication may hitherto have been accused. Henceforth we will permit no article to appear in this paper which can in the slightest degree either by direct expression or by

indirection, by inference or by innuendo be construed as an attack upon the character of any race or people or of any individual. We are sorry by our past action to the disparagement of any such race or people."

"We will adhere strictly and unwaveringly to the highest principles of decent and lawful journalism and not only will we eschew all encouragement of racial prejudices but we will absolutely refrain from any article, editorial, or statement of any kind."

"We shall have nothing to do with any propaganda or movements which made for strife and friction between various groups of citizens and persons who reside in this country. We have come to the conviction that those persons in this land who sincerely feel that the boycott of the merchandise of any foreign land is held only for the purpose of which to combat the inhumanity of which the government of such foreign land may be guilty are fully entitled to the aid of this newspaper. We will not support any counteraction against such boycott."

"We have not now and will never in the future have any political or association either financially or otherwise with any foreign government or with the propaganda agency of such government in this country. We will remain faithful to the best interests of the people of the United States."

"We earnestly trust that this announcement will be found to be a change of editorial policy will receive the favor and approval of all our readers as well as of all who have interest in the Jewish people in the promotion of good will and a better understanding between the peoples of various racial and religious origins who reside in this country."

Paul reported that in the first nine months of 1934, the organization handled approximately 3,000 cases, including passports, entry permits, affidavits, citizenship applications, and other fields in which Jewish immigrants required help. He stated that 445 Jewish immigrants had been helped to enter the United States through intervention with American authorities.
