To Oust Jews As Editors

Publishers Also Target of Decree Ordering New Licenses

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
VIENNA, Nov. 23.—Austrian
Jewish publishers and editors today, became a target for the Schuschnigg government when a decre was issued requiring special li-censes for all aewspapers. The new licenses require all publishers to state their religion.

All newspapers in the country, even those in existence for many years, must now obtain special licenses. The oid forms, which merely required that the publisher prove himself of good character, have been with rawn. The new application demand to know the religion and origin of the pub-

In Jewish circles here, the gov ernment decree is regarded as a direct blow against the Jewish publishers and editors on the general daily newspapers, owing to the avowed aim of Chancellor Schuschnigg's regime to oust them from the general press.

Rosalsky Pleads for Jewish Faith On Eve of JEA's 13th Birthday

The Jewish Education Association comes of age next month. It will be thirteen years old Decem-ber 2 and the occasion will be celebrated by a Bar Mitzvah party at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel, at which will be present a host of men and women noted for their contributions to the political, economic and social life not only of Jewry but of the nation as well.

Not the least prominent among the persons who will help to cele-brate the association's thirteenth anniversary is its new president, Judge Otto A. Rosalsky, who has distinguished himself in all the fields listed above.

Long a champion of Jewish education for Jewish young, Judge Rosalsky has devoted much of his time and effort to bringing the Jews of New York City to an active realization of the necessity for such education.

On the eve of the Bar Mitzvah celebration, Judge Rosalsky, in an interview with the Jewish Daily Bulletin yesterday issued an ap-peal for support of the Jewish

Education Association "Throughout the world," he said,

"Jewish life is being lived under conditions of great stress and strain. Even against the stormy background of Jewish history, the present appears to be a period of exceptional uncertainty, turmoil and danger. We are absorbed and preoccupied by the emergency problems that confront us. In most countries in the world, including our own, there are many Jews who are not only distressed but bewildered by the hostile forces have raised their heads

against us.
"In these circumstances, anxious thoughts are naturally directed towards our children. What kind of world, we ask ourselves, will they have to live in? Are we preparing them to cope with the problems that are going to face them as Jews and as citizens of America? There are parents who think that this question is to be answered in terms of material possessions. Such possessions, they seem to think, will insure the

happiness of their children under all conditions. But they are mistaken Material possessions, important as they are, offer no guarantee of happiness and security in a vindictive world where established ideals and relations are being disintegrated. It is needless to enlarge on this truth. An ounce of example is more convincing than a ton of argument. Germany, today, offers us the example,

"Our history is our surest guide. Many a time in the past we were confronted with similar emergencies and dangers. Many a time in the past our ship was tossed about by bitter storms of malice

and cruelty. Nevertheless, it sailed on. It carried a wonderful ballast; the ballast of our faith and our incomparable way of life. One word expresses it all: the word Torah.

Pleads For Faith

At all times Jewish life was like deep ocean, its surface broken by storms, but calm and strong in deeps.
"Does Jewish life today consist

of surface only? Are its deeps no more? Were that so, our lot would be tragic indeed. As for our children, all our anxiety is futile unless the Jewish faith and the Jewish way of life is made part and parcel of their being. "Our Jewish community of New

York, not excluding its leaders, is not sufficiently aware of the magnot sufficiently aware of the mag-nitude of the problem of the Jew-ish training of our young. There are over 350,000 Jewish children of school age in the City of New York, of whom less than 100,000 are receiving Jewish instruction.
All Jews. and our leaders in par-All Jews, and our leaders in par-ticular, should be deeply disturbed by these figures. We have nearly 500 Talmud Torahs and other Jewish schools and most of them are still engaged in a bitter struggle against the effects of the economic and spiritual depression. Thousands of parents, eager to see their children instructed in the

New Austria Curb

The day after the Executive of the American Tewish Congress made a special trip to Washington to intervene with the Austrian Minister there for the Jewish rights in Austria, the Austrian government came out with a new decree aimed to oust Jewish journal-ists from the Austrian press.

The decree issued requires that each publisher and editor he can obtain a permit from the government to continue his work. This decree is nothing but an imitation of a similar order issued last year by Goebbels in Germany. Under the best circumstances it can be interpreted as nothing else but a measure to curb the free press and to put Jewish editors and publishers under a special control.

The anxiety reported from Vienna in connection with this decree therefore has its justifications. The Jewish news-papermen in Austria still have fresh before their eyes the decree issued by Goebbels which led to the elimination of all Jewish journalists from the general press in Germany.

History repeats itself. What took place in 1933 in Germany is now taking place in Aus-The process of eliminating the Jews from public life in Austria, though carried out less openly and more diplomatically than in Germany, is nothing but an imitation of Germany's way of ousting Jews from their professions and from public life.

About 1,200 Jewish journalists lost their positions on German newspapers as a result of Goebbels' decree last year. Nobody can tell how many Jewish journalists will lose their positions in Austria as a result of the new decree issued by the Schuschnigg regime. It is, however, clear that the "Aryan paragraph" is now being silently intro-duced in Austria in full force and in every branch of economic life.

One wonders, therefore, whether the sending of a delegation to the Austrian Minister in Washington is an insufficiently strong measure. The anti-Tewish developments in Austria are reaching the point where stronger measures must be taken. The new press decree is the best proof of this.

Relief and reconstruction aid was given by the Joint Distribution Committee during the year to the Jews of Poland Austria Czechoslovakia, Rumania, Russia and other countries where the JDC has been operating since the very first days of its existence. The work of the JDC in Poland was especially helpful this year, since the misery of Polish Jewry has assumed unprecedented proportions

The JDC report made public this week by Mr. Hyman is therefore a document which will be thoroughly studied by every student of European Jewish life. It gives facts and figures on the actual Jewish position in many countries and illustrates the great need which European Jewry is now facing. The wide scope of the work

which the JDC is conducting in Europe makes this organization Europe makes this organization outstanding as compared with other Jewish relief organiza-tions. No other Jewish relief organization existing today has such a variety of activities to its credit as the JDC has. While other Jewish organizations limit themselves to specific fields of work, the JDC is active in almost every phase of Jewish life requiring aid.

Palestine Benefits

Through JDC Funds
It must not be forgotten that in addition to the large sums of money which the JDC spends annually, this organization is also responsible for immense activities conducted with revolving capital by institutions such as

the Palestine Economic Corporation, the Joint Foundation, the Loan Kasses and other institutions which are recognized as great factors in the reconstruction of Jewish economic life. The Palestine Economic Corporation. which was organized in 1926 on a business basis, for productive aid in Palestine, has been sub-stantially supported by the JDC. The JDC has turned over to the Palestine Economic Corporation approximately \$1,800,000. It was with this asset that the Pales-tine Economic Corporation was able to conduct its work of assisting the economic development of Palestine

This brings indirectly to the forefront the present conflict be-tween the JDC and the Zionist Organization, which is growing behind the scenes of American Jewish life. This conflict—which I believe will eventually be set-tled peacefully—is due to the fact that the Joint Distribution Committee wishes to renew the arrangements with the Zionist Organization of America for a united campaign for funds, on condition that the Zionist Organization should receive not fifty per cent of the funds raised, hitherto, but a smaller propor-

I shall still have the opportunity to explain why the Joint Distribution Committee is justified in its demand. Aside from the fact that the Jews in Palesthe fact that the Jews in Fales-tine today live more prosper-ously than the Jews in Eastern Europe, where urgent JDC re-lief is now required, there are also other motives as to why a larger proportion of relief funds must in the forthcoming year be ssigned for countries other than Dalagting

This report, though coming from Arab circles, ought to be taken seriously. Though the figure of 400,000 dunams may be exaggerated, there is some truth in the report that large stretches of Huleh land will now come into Jewish possession.

American Fascists

Austria and Germany Show No Letup

While the Jewish growth in Palestine is expanding, Jewish persecutions in the countries of Eastern Europe are assuming a more and more serious charac-ter. In Germany a new drive against the Jews was started this week in many provincial this week in many provincial cities, where the German popu-lation is beginning to feel the first signs of the approaching hunger. Under the pretext of "Jewish speculation" the local "Jewish speculation" the local Nazis have invaded many Jewish stores in different districts of Germany and have attacked Jewish merchants.

In Austria the government of Premier Schuschnigg made an-other step this week to invali-date the citizenship of 410 more Jews. A delegation of the Amer-ican Jewish Congress visited this week the Austrian Minister in Washington and told him what American Jews think of the anti-Jewish discriminations now going on in Austria. The Austrian Minister will convey the opinion of American Jews to his government in the form of a special memorandum.

Laski Urges Pressure on Poland

The Jewish situation in Po-land is still growing worse. Bombs have been thrown this week by anti-Semites into Jewish stores and anti-Jewish riots

have taken place in the Krakow university. The Jewish position in Poland has reached a point where Neville Laski, the most reserved Jewish leader and president of the Board of Denuties of British Jews, came out openly this week and urged that pressure must be used against Poland, since no signs of alleviation are seen.

NAZI REPENTANCE WEEK

This was hair-shirt week along the Nazi front.

Walter Kappe, militant Nazi editor who had lustily assailed the Jews from the editorial offices of the Deutsche Zeintung, and quit that paper when its editor's apology in a criminal libel action resulted in a change of policy with regard to the Jews, himself joined the ranks of apology-makers.

Among us it is often, tragically often, as I have said, the free, the enlightened and the gently bred who seek out of flight from their Jewishness to set on fire the civilizatory structure that houses us all, Jew and Christian alike.

We know, too, how Abie Finkelstein felt about the entire matter and how the bearing of that name and the knowledge of the false and brutal associations it had in the pagan world wounded and warped his tender child's soul so immedicably from the start that it was, as it were, only by a thousand immedicably from the start that it was, as it were, only by a thousand fires that he could ever (that trauma suffered once and for all) become a proud and self-affirmative Jew and is probably today a violent assimi-lationist, whether polite or Communist, and is in full flight from his people, in full flight from the early half-conscious but indelible hurts which the bearing of his name, which he identifies with his people, inflicted upon him.

But Points Out Plan's Weakness in Speech at Rensonhurst

Both praise and criticism of the American Jewish Congress pro posal for a united front on Jewish affairs was expressed Friday night by Bernard G. Richards, an organ-izer of the Congress and for many years its executive secretary.

The trouble with the plan, Mr. Richards declared in an address at the Bensonhurst Jewish Center, "is that the American Jewish Congress is now the weakest link in the chain of different groups and organizations which it is planning to bring together."

very little."

"The gratifying fact of the mat-ter is that some order has been brought out of the chaos of confused and extravagant ideas and fused and extravagant ideas and those who put forward and carry through the unity plan deserve a lot of credit for what they did." Mr. Richards declared that the

Pioneer Draws Lively Contrast Between Old and New Palestine

Mrs. Jacobs Tells of First Trip to Holy Land 22 Years Ago

"Twenty-two years ago, on my wedding trip, I went to Palestine. At that time such a journey was ething quite extr Palestine had not yet become the fashion—but my husband and I were both ardent Zionists and so we decided to make Palestine our

goal. I was quite young—a gradu-ate of Teachers' College—I had just started to teach school-I was embarking on this great adventure, now I was on my way to Palestine, my heart filled with enthusiasm and expectations.

Experience, of course, I had none.

Even my Zionism, sincere and eager as it was, had yet to meet the test of reality. For it was life than the enthusiasm engendered by a book which had made me accept the Zionistic tenets. The book was 'Auto-Emancipa-tion,' by Leo Pinsker, and if I ever had a striking intellectual experience, it was certainly in reading that book. It created for me a new heaven and a new earth. This was, then, the background and nood in which we undertook our trip.

Life Out of Focus "Well, the contact with reality was not quite what I had expected. There is only one word to de-scribe the conditions as I found them at that time in Palestine. and that word is: hopeless. Life there assumed somehow the quality of a nightmare, terrible and unreal at the same time.

Changes Miraculous "Since then I have been in Pa-lestine six times and lived there once for a whole year and the changes that have been wrought in those years are simply miracu-lous. Life there is now full of

hope, full of energy and endeavor.

STATE CONTROL

The power and authority of the State have been augmented even those countries where no actual dictatorship exists. Everywhere the State is step-ping in to check the power and scope of the individual. The



democratic apparatus which middle class individualism advanced to being safeguard its rights is being pushed aside or discarded. There are no areas which are exempt from group control and interference. The individual is steadily being deprived of his "inalienable rights." The Stafe is to dominate not only the political fortunes of its people but their eco-nomic fortunes as well—and their cultural and spiritual lives, too.

The slogan of "State Control" has become popular in recent years, especially among those sec-tions of our population who dis-like to use the more forthright and definitive term "Socialism." Young Jews are especially capti-vated by it. But few of them have taken the trouble to inquire what a maximum state control would mean to a minority group like ours. In Russia it has destroyed the Jewish group culturally and religiously. In Jermany it is destroying it politically, socially and scornwicelly. To Bolond and scornwicelly. econemically. In Poland, whenever a government monopoly is established over a trade or an in-

As a free individual, secure in As a rree individual, secure in his constitutional rights, in an open, competitive market, the Jewish business man and working man could hold his own with the non-Jew. But where government in a capitalistic country controls and determines its economic life, it will represent, as a matter of course, the preferences and prejudices of the majority, and the Jewish minority group will always be distavored. Our political and economic security in the last century lay in constitutional guarancharters of fund human liberties in the doctrine of man's inalienable rights to "life, liberty and the pursuit of happi-ness." When these liberal decness." When these liberal doc-trines are discarded, and all constitutional guarantees are scrap-ped, we become an unprotected and defenseless minority, left to the mercies and the moods of dictators or their underlings.

Liberalism and democracy in the 19th and early 20th centuries gave us the opportunity in the Western World to live free lives and to advance to new positions of equality in all fields of human endeavor. The recent tendency towards state absolutism with its mystic yearnings towards "coordination,"
"Gleichschaltung" and the "monolithic society" has begun to play havoc with our people both materially and spiritually.

Those Jews who sing the praises of state control are, of course, thinking exclusively in terms of the Russian model. They should bear in mind, however, that long

before the Russian model will be the dominant form in the world (if ever) the other form of maximum state control-the Eascist and the Nazi-will, unless it is strenuously opposed, come to master the countries of the earth. And Fascist state control is everywhere anti-Jewish. If Italian Fas-cism, on the face of it, seems to be an exception, it is only because the Jewish group in Italy is numerically negligible. Everywhere else, Fascism is avowedly and determinately anti-Semitic.

State absolutism may be inevitable but what reason is there for Jews to welcome it with hallelujahs? . .

In all Fascist lands, side by side with the absolute totalitarian with state, runs the doctrine of militant and aggressive nationalism which always claims as its first victim the Jewish group. Fascist nationautomatically makes the Jewish group suspect and tends to ghettotize and disfranchise it anew. For state control, carried to its logical conclusions, does not stop at economics. It is omnivorous and insatiable. .

In Germany, Fascist nationalism is still further narrowed by the concept of race. Nationalism is made synonymous with racialism. Only those belonging to the racial Only those belonging to the racial stock of the dominant majority are recognized as citizens. It is clear that in a state where race becomes the criterion and prerequisite for rights and preferments the Jew is sacrificed. It is no longer a question of personal char-acter or of ability but of hereditary fatalism. One's claim to equality can no longer be based upon constitutional rights or upon a shared human destiny or upon shared human destiny or every worth or merit but upon a factor which is beyond the individual's ingly high mountain and shown all the kingdoms of the world and

The Jew would do well not to permit himself to be beguiled in his quest for social justice by the millennial promises of state mes-sianism. All dictators promise so much and achieve so little. They rights and liberties on the glow-ing promise of achieving "King-dom Come"—the Golden Age—in dom Come"—the Golden Age—in no time. And hard-pressed men are easily beguiled. They yearn for some quick escape from all their difficulties. They surrender their charters of liberty. They even condone at first the terroristic means which dictators employ to achieve the promised goal. But somehow the promised goal is never achieved. They never behold that But the means they do behold and experience—all the brutalities and oppressions which devastate their lives.

that liberalism is as much a mat-ter of means as of ends. Liberalism is decidedly a matter of method and technique. If the methods are those of democratic justice, fairness, tolerance and freedom, then human life is enriched in the very process of attaining the faroff goal. But if the methods are those of tyrannic force, oppression and intolerance then human life becomes brutalized in the process and the goal becomes increasingly more difficult of approximation. Liberals undermined their own nosition is the world because a great hope prompted them to sanction the sacrifice of means to ends, leading them into the tragic intellectual morass of endorsing and condoning illiberal and dictatorial methods and practices in one part of the world and of condemning the self-same methods and practices in another.

Liberals seem to have forgotten

their glory and-they succumbed to the great temptation. Jewish liberals, with so much more at stake, seem to be commit ting the same folly.





Although all the critics join in Although all the cricks join the game of selecting a "best ten" list, only Mr. Mantle achieves the distinction of a place between cloth covers. Mr. Mantle is an astute picker, a devotee of no isms and extremes, and his list annual-ly approximates the critical consensus. Therefore, with the great Jewish participation in the theatre, it is interesting to note how Jews fared in Mr. Mantle's list. Do they, as some anti-Semites charge, produce the dregs of the theatre or do they hold their own or better in the more worthy ef-forts that see the light of New York production?

This is the message to American This is the message to American Jewry of Dr. George Landauer and Dr. Martin Rosenblueth, who artived in New York this week to acquaint America with the story of the great migration. The former is secretary of the Central Bureau for the Settlement of German Jews in Palestine with his post in Jerusalem. The latter is head of the London office.

Dr. Landauer's work is to usher the bewildered refugees out of the Old World. When they dock in Haifa, they come into Dr. Rosen-

thara, they come into Dr. Rosen-blueth's hands.

The Palestine Bureau finds po-sitions for them, trains them for the new life, seeks out homes for and tries to mitigate the subtle psychic torments of settling in a strange land. them, extends credit where needed

Paint Rosy Picture

"There have been settled to date some 20,000 German Jews, consti some 20,000 German Jews, consultating the largest number that has been absorbed by any country since the flight of the refugees from Germany began," said Dr. Rosenblueth. "It must be emphasized that this is not the maximum that Palestine can settle, but represents merely the amount of work that could be done with the lim-ited funds placed at our disposal."

ited funds placed at our disposal."
The two proceeded to explain that, of the 20,000, between 6,000 and 8,000 are capitalists. The rest are professionals and laborers. When the refugees arrive in Palestine, they are encouraged-al-most forced-to enter agriculture rather than a profession. This is accomplished by providing homes for them only in agricultural col-

When the refugees come to Palwhen the rerugees come to Far-estine, they are no longer refugees— they are settlers. Dr. Landauer spoke glowingly of the enthusiasm with which the German Jews set about remolding their lives.

To erect new colonies would require more money than the Bureau can at present command. Even those in the capcommand. Even those in the cap-italist category—owning £1,000 or more—need assistance in the new land. Besides cultural acclimati-zation, the bureau supervises collective purchase of land for groups of capitalists, provides the necessary irrigation and digs the wells. The initial outlay is repaid by the

"In Germany itself," said Dr. Rosenblueth. "the Jews feel that their only hope of permanent sal-vation from the conditions which vation from the conditions which burden them—particularly for the youth—is emigration to Palestine. We have on hand applications from 5,000 Jewish families in Germany to settle in Palestine within the next six-month period.

"It is a matter of profound regret that we do not have the funds to make possible the colonization in Palestine of this entire number.

In Germany, even the non-Zion ists are clamoring to go to Pales-tine, added Dr. Rosenblueth. And Dr. Landauer attested to the ju-bilation with which the non-Zion-ists greet their new-found freedom

"You should see," he said, "how

The budget for the next two vears, which covers an irreducible minimum for the activities of interesting German Jews into the agricultural and economic life of Palestine will necessitate \$1,875,-000, it was pointed out. Of this \$800,000 has already been collected.

With these funds, it is estimated that 1,000 families without means and 500 capitalist families can be transported from Germany to Palestine. A "meanless" family is es-timated to contain two members and a capitalist family, four.

The German Jews are especially desirable in Palestine, the interviewer was told. They are readily assimilated into the Jewish life of Palestine. They bring with a certain characteristic talent for organization and thoroughness much needed in the New Land.

Drs. Landauer and Rosenblueth who are staying at the Hotel Roosevelt, will remain in New Hoosevelt, will remain in New-York for at least three weeks. Dur-ing this time they will negotiate with the United Jewish Appeal and speak at mass meetings to explain the work of the Central Bureau for the Settlement of German Jews in Palestine, headed by Dr.

Since these gentlemen have no conception whatsoever of what a brave purpose a id a gallant idea are, it is practically impossible to tell them that actually I like the British since that is the case.

If recognition of their virtu constitutes liking a people, there can be no doubt 'hat far from becan be no doubt hat far from be-ing against them I am actually pro-British. On the stage alone, British girls are handsome and talented and British men are

equally engaging.

In all the arts English ability causes me to turn with admiration. Even their smug, self-cen-tered lovalty to Britain is an object of envy and I think many Jews could study this quality and gain much thereby.

Zion Above British

I was raised on the kind of pap, just as most Jows were, that caused me to look to England as a great and impelling force for legal justice and social fairness Moreover, paraphrasing the usual statement, I have many friends among the English.

However, personal admiration is one thing and the recognition of physical enmity is another.

Much as I actually like the Brit-ish for all their acknowledged virtues, I love the cause

I merely view these British as determined antagonists, none the

less worthy people for all that.

If the English set their minds on a course which robs the Jewish people of the only refuge they can hope for in this world, that degives them of their chance of ultimate timate security and ruthlessly smashes the dream-world which is the only thing that the mass of Jewry lives by today, then I say that we too must prove worthy antagenists. We must forget everything else except that they everything else except that they are our active enemy, that not only are their actions proving unjustified and cold-blooded, but in view the obligations involved under the mandate-hypocritical as well

Do Not Yield!

I would have siked nothing better than to see Palestine a free British dominion working harmo-niousl; and happily with the British community of commonwealths throughout the world. But if the British have set their faces against this; if they have condemned the Jewish dream to death; if they are giving the Jews of Eastern Europe the unenviable choice between Communism and degradation, we must rise as one man in anger. We must say to these English that they made a mistake: that they have ruet men who will not yield a jot of what is theirs.

Everywhere inroughout the world those who love Zion must join with the other myriad enemies gom, with the other myriad enemies of England. We must make our yery anti-British attitude so thorough-going that it will put us in a position for barter. We will give over our own anti-British outlook only when they give over the defacts anti-Jewish attitude they

can look to us as their unquestioned allies.

We want no benedictions or nice words We would much rather be on good terms with the British and their devoted friends; but if they are deliberately ruining an enterprise which to us is sacred we must face them with an implacable enmity that will leave no stone unturned and will make itself felt! Sugar-Coated Words

We would rather be men and enemies than fawningly accept the saccharine words of Lord Cecil. Chairman of the Governing Council for the League of Nation's High Council Refuge Committee who yesterday wrote of Dr. Weizmann that he is among the greatest statesmen living today, saving "He has been able to make Eng-lishmen realize what the Zionist ideals and aspirations really are to a very remarkable degree."

If there is anyone present who can actually tell me what these words mean I will be glad for the enlightenment. I will also be glad to know whether the poor Jews grinding out an existence in Poland, Rumania, Austria, and Ger-many, sustained only by the great hope of Zion, can view his Lordship's words with any enthusiasm

I would like to know this particularly, when these poor Jews are informed that despite the flood of Jewish money and effort flow-ing into Palestine, despite all the facts, and despite all reason, the smug Colonial Office says that it recognizes an absorptive capacity for the country which will allow accommodations for 9,700 visas in the next six months.

Visa Cut Condemned

The natural increase of Jewish population in Palestine alone is probably three times that.

Those Jews, who view this British munificence with so many British munincence with so many thankful hallelujahs, will be shocked to learn today that according to cable dispatches the figure 9,700 was granted by the British Office merely as an estimate of what could be allowed. They actually were granting only 7,500 visas for the next six months. They will undoubtedly knock 2,000 or 3,000 off of this meagre amount to arbitrarily cover tourists who slip into the country and cannot be apprecountry and cannot be appre-hended. Thus you have the Jew-ish immigration reduced to nothing, with the exception of those always welcome gentlemen bring in large sums of money

Are we to regard Palestine as one of these "cultural centers" that these inexplicable leaders rant about? V Where Herzl's dream of the Jewish State? Are all of these suffering, tortured Polish, Rumanian, Austrian, and German Jews to be simply consigned to the devil?

Recommends Fighters
Are we to understand then that

these huge sums of Jewish money flowing into the country are designed to build up an Arabian em-pire in which a "Jewish center of culture" will be tolerated for the moment?

I am, for one, against the snivelling hush-hush policy. I am against anything that is cowardly against anything that is cowardly and disreputable. I am against anyone who harms a hair on a Jew's head any place. I am against any whittling of Jewish rights, no matter how small. I regard the entire British action under the mandate as being illegal. if there is international legality at all. I therefore am violently opposed to the British in this situ I recommend this course as a primary necessity for the mo-ment, if we are to get anywhere.
