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## BOYCOTT UNITY PLEDGED

### Praha Police Guard Jews

#### Patrols Halt Looters as Riots Flare

Government Assures Protection; Provinces Reported Quiet

PRAHA, Nov. 26.—Tension throughout the city was considerably relaxed this evening as heavy police guards continued their patrols. Jewish-owned shops and the larger stores were partly shuttered. The provinces were reported quiet.

Jewish leaders were in session tonight to consider the situation.

PRAHA, Nov. 26.—The anti-Jewish riots in Praha which started yesterday and in which forty were injured were repeated today despite the strong measures taken by the police.

Anti-Semitic crowds made attempts to break into the old synagogue on Yarozolimska street but were dispersed by the police. Another attempt was made by anti-Semitic mobs to attack the Beth Haam, where all the Jewish and Zionist organizations have their offices but the police arrived in time to check it.

Attempts to loot Jewish shops were made in different districts of the city but were hindered by the police patrols which are now guarding the Jewish-populated sections of Praha.

Today's anti-Semitic demonstrations were very similar in strength and in character to yesterday's. Agitators were endeavoring to direct the demonstrators to Jewish enterprises. Crowds of Czech nationalist youths were especially active in the attempts to raid Jewish business firms.

Dr. Cerni, the Czechoslovakian Minister of Interior, has issued assurances to the Jewish leaders that "the government is firmly determined to protect all citizens irrespective of creed, and possesses sufficient forces to carry out its determination." The Jewish leaders were empowered by the Minister to make this assurance public.

Dr. Angelo Goldstein, the Jewish member of the Czechoslovakian parliament, intervened today with the government, pointing out that "the fact that the demonstrations of the Czech nationalists directed against the Germans, exists that the entire movement is turning against the Jews, standing the fact that the movement is in no way associated with the anti-Semitic movement."

#### Menuhin Inspects Giant British Liner

GLASGOW.—As the result of a casual wish expressed to a group of admirers after a concert in Edinburgh, Yehudi Menuhin, boy violinist, was able to inspect at close range the new British ocean liner, Queen Mary.

Menuhin told his admirers that he had paid a visit to the Forth Bridge and above all was anxious to see the new liner.

Standing among the admirers of the violin virtuoso was M. D. Skeffington, manager of the John Brown Shipyard, where the liner is being built. He immediately offered to escort Menuhin to the yard and take him around.

#### 500 Religious Leaders Back Catholics' Fight

All Sects Sign Petition Pledging Aid Against Mexican Drive

The names of more than 500 Protestant, Jewish and Catholic clergymen who have signed a statement expressing concern over the threat to religious liberty in Mexico were made public yesterday by the National Conference of Jews and Christians. In view of the fact that ninety-five per cent of church-goers in Mexico are Catholics, the conference invited Jews and Protestants to take the initiative in the petition. Over nine-tenths of the signatories are Protestant ministers and rabbis.

#### Ask Protest Against Nazi School Policy

2 Groups Tell Parents to Keep Pupils Home on Certain Days

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Nov. 26.—The Jewish Women's League of Germany issued an appeal to all Jewish parents to abstain from sending their children to the German schools on the days when state political instruction is given in the classrooms.

The German government has made it clear that Jewish children who do not wish to attend the classes in state political instruction may do so. The course of political instruction given to the children consists of numerous anti-Jewish charges which would make it very unpleasant for Jewish children to be present in the classroom when the anti-Semitic allegations are made.

The Reichsvertretung, the supreme representative body of German Jewry, also issued an appeal today saying that Jewish parents should obtain the release of their children from school attendance on Saturdays, since these days are devoted in the German schools to the anti-Semitic curriculum exclusively.

"Our Jewish school youth," the appeal of the Reichsvertretung says, "have now been given an opportunity of having the Sabbath hours to themselves. Jewish pupils can obtain release from schools on Saturdays upon the application of their parents or guarantors."

#### Dickstein Sees Editor-Nazi Financial Link

Issues Subpoena for 'Irish Weekly' Head in Congress Probe

A subpoena ordering Raymond Healey, twenty-two-year-old editor and publisher of Healey's Irish Weekly, to appear before the Congressional Committee to investigate un-American activities at an executive hearing next Monday was issued last night by Congressman Samuel Dickstein, vice-chairman of the inquiry.

Dickstein hopes to bring out evidence to prove a monetary connection between the Friends of New Germany and Healey's anti-Semitic activities.

#### World Unit Is Formed to Combat Nazis

London Delegates Hail Finish Fight in Battle for Rights

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, Nov. 26.—Establishment of an international boycott organization to fight Hitlerism until the Nazi regime fell or all rights were restored to labor, churches, anti-Jewish legislation revoked, Masonic property restored and German women freed again, was decided upon today at the opening session of the international boycott conference.

The new organization will be known as "The World Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi Council to Champion Human Rights," and will have its headquarters in London.

##### Fight to the Finish

The five-point resolution adopted by the conference declared:

1. We will vigorously prosecute and enforce economic sanctions against Germany in every country until Hitlerism has been driven from power by the force of world opinion, as expressed in economic isolation or until the Hitler regime has restored to German labor all the rights taken from it by the Nazis.

2. Until the Hitler regime has abandoned attempts to interfere by state authority or to destroy the Catholic and Protestant Churches, or to discord or repudiate the Old Testament or parts of the New.

3. Until the Hitler government has repealed all recent laws and decrees against its Jewish citizens and residents and ceased to persecute and discriminate against the Jews in an attempt to exterminate them.

4. Until the property and rights of the Masonic lodges have been restored.

5. Until womanhood in Germany has been reinstated and full rights and privileges restored as in pre-Hitlerite Germany.

Other resolutions adopted by the conference fixed the composition of the governing body of the new organization and the nature of the local groups in every country; provided for London headquarters and for raising a preliminary sum of \$150,000 to carry on the work. Some \$10,000 has already been subscribed to this fund.

##### Guedalla Renews Pledge

On behalf of the Jewish groups represented at the conference, Philip Guedalla, Anglo-Jewish historian and boycott leader, condemned the Nazi regime and pledged Jewish allegiance to the boycott.

#### Baptist Surprises with Panegyric Instead of Anti-Semitic Sermon

A local anti-Semitic scare blew up Sunday evening right in the faces of a determined group of protectors of Jewry's honor.

An investigator from the McCormack-Dickstein Congressional Committee, a representative from the New York Times advertising department, reporters from the Democratic Day, the Republican Morning Journal and the Socialist Forward, not to mention your own correspondent, attended services at the First Baptist Church, Broadway and Seventy-ninth street. So, too, did a representative gathering of local Jews.

All were present to hear the

Reverend W. H. Rogers sermonize on the subject: "The Jew, the Jonah of the World. Why Is He in New York? Why Can't We Get Rid of Him?"

##### Had Advertised Sermon

Right in the center of one of the best Jewish residential sections in New York, a minister was talking on how to "get rid of the Jews." Moreover, he had advertised his sermon in the religious columns of the New York Times.

Earlier in the day the Jewish Daily Bulletin was harried with telephone calls by indignant readers telling the editor what he already knew. And judging from the turnout, other newspapers had

similarly been called.

With such a build-up, the sermon proved a distinct anti-climax in which a Baptist minister merely related the disobedience of the Jews that caused Jehovah to chastise them with the suffering they have endured through the centuries. An audience with ears cocked for anti-Semitic utterances heard a Baptist minister describe Jews as everlasting people, a people with a glorious future.

##### Reaction in Lobby

Judging from the reaction of his parishioners, gleaned in the lobby after the sermon, the net impression was that the Reverend Doc-

## 2,000 Hear Rothenberg in St. Louis Drive

### Zionists Pledge \$2,500 to Further Extension of Projects

(Special to the J.D.B.)

ST. LOUIS, Nov. 26.—St. Louis Jewry today is hailing the speech delivered by Morris Rothenberg, president of the Zionist Organization of America, last night before 2,000 people who filled the United Hebrew Temple to hear him outline the extension program sponsored by the American Zionists. He was here on a two-day visit in conjunction with his country-wide tour, which previous to his arrival in this city found him in Kansas City.

Minus the usual drive publicity, St. Louis Zionists accepted the quota of \$2,500 toward the \$100,000 fund sought for the extension program, which seeks to extend American interest in Palestine.

Rothenberg spoke at an impressive Baron Edmond de Rothschild memorial meeting at the temple. Mendel N. Fisher, national field director of the Zionist Organization, who accompanied the Zionist leader here, and Professor Gustave Klausner, head of the St. Louis Zionist district, who presided, also addressed the audience. Earlier in the day a luncheon was given Rothenberg at which were present prominent leaders of the Jewish community, including Emil Mayer, Bernard Greensfelder and others.

During the Zionist leader's visit to Kansas City the Kansas City Star paid tribute to him in an article headed "A New Phase for Jewry," featured on its first page. A fund of \$1,500 will be raised by Zionists of that city, under the direction of B. T. Hurwitz, to further the extension program. Leaders of all Jewish organizations attended a dinner given Rothenberg. Later he spoke at the K. I. B. S. Synagogue.

Rothenberg was to speak in Memphis today, Cincinnati and Indianapolis tomorrow and to wind up his tour Wednesday.

tor had enlightened his flock about the Jews. To so favorable an extent, indeed, that many who might have been anti-Semites, may have reconsidered as a result of the minister's talk. One woman even remarked that she had learned for the first time that Jesus was a Jew.

Rev. Rogers explained the persistence of the Jews in the world in three words, his text for the evening: "Jehovah hath said." A hard-hitting Baptist preacher recently from west of the "Bible belt" he proclaimed that "the Jew is not in the world by accident to be forgotten, to be slighted. He is here by God's choice and by God's wish and by God's authority."

Rev. Rogers, it soon became apparent, was preaching good old-fashioned Baptist gospel. By a series of quite amazing and lucid quotations from the Scriptures he was attempting to show the congregation, including the Jews that the Baptist was the right faith.

### Invites New Members

When the sermon was over, the minister invited his hearers to approach him about joining the church. But when asked if he was seeking converts the minister answered in the negative.

"I have," he said, "no other aim than the preaching of the gospel."

Asked why he had chosen the misleading title for his sermon,

Dr. Rogers made the following explanation:

"I have been asked that," he said, "by many others. The title viewed through the eyes of the sermon is not possible of misinterpretation. That is how I viewed it. I couldn't foresee the manner in which others unacquainted with my beliefs would view it."

To the suggestion that the title had publicity value Dr. Rogers entered no denial.

### Rabbi Promises Answer

Rabbi Jerome Lawn of a Washington Heights temple, the minister disclosed, had called him regarding his announced title and promised he would answer it in a sermon Sunday morning. Dr. Rogers couldn't understand how he could be answered before he had spoken. But he added: "I said nothing that would offend a Jewish minister unless he was afraid that Jews might be convinced to my way of thinking by what I said."

Dr. Rogers has been in his present parish for the past eight months. He came to New York from the Hinson Memorial Baptist Church of Portland, Ore. A Canadian, he received his seminary training at Brandon, Canada, and his academic training in England.

### Samples From Sermon

Among the minister's utterances during the sermon are the following:

"The story of the Jew is the

most romantic story in the world." "Israel has a wonderful past, a tragic present and a more glorious future."

"Until the Jews see the glory of Jesus, they will live in the House of Desolation."

"There is little difference between the orthodox Hebrew and the devout Christian. The Jew prays for the Messiah. The Christian prays for the Second Messiah. Both will be the same person, Jesus. And Israel will be his chosen people."

### 'Undigested Jonah'

Explaining the Jonah simile in the title, Dr. Rogers referred to the Jews as the "world's undigested Jonah."

"One of these days," he said, "he (the Jew) will repent and his commission will be renewed. With this national repentance will come the glory of the Lord upon the Jews."

The Baptist minister said the Lord is not through with the Jews. He pointed out that all his enemies have suffered. Haman, he said, expressed hatred and contempt for the Jews and was hanged. The Jews who were thrown to the lions were unhurt. The Babylonian Empire tried to banish the Jews and fell. The Roman Empire tried to destroy the Jews and was itself destroyed. The Russian Czars tried to get rid of the Jews but they were exiled and today there is Communism.

"No modern attempt," he said, "will ever destroy the Jews and overthrow the purpose of God for the Jews are a people with a mission."

Morris Tannenbaum considered himself a good Jew. Annually he contributed to the Federation of Jewish Charities, his temple, and sundry other organizations. He had paid his dues to the B'nai B'rith for years. His moral and financial support were at the disposal of all "worth-while" charities.

Although his intentions were the best, he could find no time to be an active Jew. He was smug about his place in the scheme of things without being overbearing. Too many "important things" occupied his time.

## Butchers Plan Protest Strike On 'Tag' Issue

Will Hold Parley Sunday to Set Date for Move Against Control

A city-wide mass meeting of butchers to organize for a strike against Kashruth Association control of poultry markets will be held next Sunday, it was learned yesterday.

The strike decision came late Sunday night at a conference of executives of borough butcher organizations at headquarters of the Federation of Kosher Butchers, 147 West Forty-second street. At next Sunday's meeting, an official of the Federation said yesterday, a strike committee will be appointed and the date of the strike set.

The stoppage, in which chicken dealers are expected to join, marks the climax to poultry retailers' opposition to the Kashruth Association system of attaching leg-bands to fowl to certify kosher slaughtering. Butchers complain that they cannot afford the one-cent per fowl tax which the leg-band system entails and that the innovation has resulted in inferior grades of fowl being forced upon them.

Bronx butchers yesterday were under orders from the Bronx Strictly Kosher Butchers Association not to remit to wholesalers the cost of the leg-bands which was being included in their bills for poultry.

Although the strike is expected to completely paralyze the poultry industry, an official of the New York Live Poultry Institute, yesterday expressed sympathy with the strike and said Bronx wholesalers would support it.

The avowed purpose of the butchers in striking is to force the Federal Government to investigate Kashruth Association control of kosher poultry slaughtering.

## Dr. Honor Named To Chicago Board

Succeeds Alexander Dushkin as Executive Director of Education

CHICAGO, Nov. 26.—The Chicago Board of Jewish Education announces the election of Dr. Leo L. Honor to the post of executive director, made vacant by the resignation of Dr. Alexander M. Dushkin, who has accepted the chair in education at Hebrew University in Jerusalem.

For the past five years Dr. Honor has been director of the College of Jewish Studies in this city, and on the lecturing staff of the University College of the University of Chicago.

Before coming to Chicago he was associated with the Bureau of Jewish Education of New York, and for thirteen years served also as registrar of the Teachers' Institute of Jewish Theological Seminary. He was lecturer in Jewish history at the Graduate School for Jewish Social Work, and for the religious education department of Columbia University.

## Rabbi Gordon, Talmudic Scholar, Dies in Toronto

## Loss of Club Founder Mourned by Many

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 26.—The mission district of this port yesterday mourned the loss of Miss Eva Wolfsohn, who with her sister founded the Girls' Club thirty-five years ago. Loved by all in this section of the city, "Miss Eva," as she was called, died Wednesday.

Under her guidance the club has grown from a small room and a bare handful of members to spacious quarters and an enrollment of 500, in which seventeen nationalities are represented. Her sister died twenty years ago.

## Danzig Head To Pursue Nazi Policy on Jews

Rauschnig Resignation Brings Fears of Further Repressions

DANZIG, Nov. 26.—The resignation of Dr. Hermann Rauschnig, president of the Nazi-controlled Free City Senate, coupled with the reversal of his moderate policy toward the Jews, was seen today as an ominous sign of what is in store for the Danzig Jews. Rauschnig's resignation was made public yesterday.

Dr. Rauschnig has been on a leave of absence for some time, ostensibly because of ill health, but actually because the Danzig Nazis and, it was said, the Berlin regime have frowned on policies of conciliation pursued by the head of the Free City government.

He has now been replaced by Dr. M. Greiser, vice-president of the senate, under whose direction a vigorous anti-Jewish policy is being carried out. Works of Jewish writers have been removed from Danzig libraries and book stores. Jewish professionals are being discriminated against through the "Aryan paragraph." Jewish artisans are finding it difficult to work at their trades.

While there have been no overt acts against the Jews, the Jewish quarter has frequently resounded with the cry "hang the Jews."

Danzig Nazis were tremendously encouraged by the fact that in the election this year they received fourteen per cent. more votes than they did two years ago, when they captured the government.

## Academy Inducts 14 New Members

Represent Many Fields of Life in Added Membership to Arts, Sciences Group

Fourteen new members, including scholars, journalists, teachers and rabbis, were inducted into the Jewish Academy of Arts and Sciences at a meeting of the group held Sunday night at Temple Rodeph Sholem.

Daniel Frohman, veteran theatrical man and president of the Actors Fund of America, who became an honorary fellow, was the only speaker. Others who were elected honorary fellows were Professor Franz Boas, Rabbi H. Pereira Mendes, Professor Morris R. Cohen and Franklin Pierce Adams, "F. P. A."

Members elected include Rabbi Louis I. Newman, Professor Milton Handler, Dr. Elias Lieberman, Dr. Hyman Halpern, Robert B. Brodie, Rabbi Israel Goldstein, Rabbi David de Sola Pool, Dr. Jacob Greenberg and Morris Ryskind, one of the authors of "Of Thee I Sing."

## Delegates Form World Group To Push Boycott, Pledge Unity

"In view of the German government's continued policy of discrimination and denial of rights to citizens and residents as well as denial of freedom of conscience, this assembly of delegates representing Jewish communities in all parts of the world, realized the need for the extension of the present basis of the boycott movement. We are resolved to join and co-operate with organizations and persons of every creed and race who are making efforts to ensure just treatment of all German citizens without any distinctions," he declared.

A prediction that extension of the boycott would result in "unavoidable and profound developments in Germany, not later than next Spring," was made by Walter Citrine, noted British labor leader, who was the chief speaker at the conference today.

Mr. Citrine, who is president of the International Federation of Trade Unions, stated that his organization had decided to attend the conference officially and "to support and co-operate with the conference."

A. F. of L. Assures Support

"This boycott movement is not against the German people, but for its liberation," the English labor leader declared, adding that "the boycott is the most important means of accomplishing and accelerating changes in Nazi Germany."

In his opening speech to the conference President Untermyer read a message from William Green, president of the American Federation of Labor, condemning Nazism and pledging his organization to support the anti-Nazi boycott in the United States.

"The rights of minorities in all countries must be respected," the American labor leader declared in his message, "if international good-will and peace are to be promoted and maintained. Labor in the United States has regarded the persecution of the Jewish people in Germany with feelings of resentment and horror."

Mr. Untermyer was vehement in his protest against Hitlerite Germany's race hatred and "the grotesque 'Aryan' fetish for destroying civilization."

"Against such a war," he declared, "there is no effective weapon except the refusal of the world to deal with Germany, which has inflicted upon an entire race new forms of refined torture compared with which witch burning was a harmless civilized pastime."

Unity Call Sounded

Rev. Paul J. Tisonaires, head of the Unitarian Church in Brussels, Belgium, pleaded with Jews, Protestants and Catholics to forget "differences of faith and creed and to unite in defense of human freedom and the progress of civilization, which is menaced by Hitlerism."

The conference was flooded with messages of greeting and good-will from all parts of the world. There were greetings from France, Belgium, Egypt, Palestine, the American Jewish Congress, the Canadian Jewish Congress and various League for Human Rights in Europe.

Americans Report on Work

A significant message was received from Flora Drummond, who spoke for the British Empire Women's Guild, declaring that "it is the obvious duty of British women to support the boycott, because if the Nazi government is successful, then the women of the world will

realize that the emancipation they won was in vain."

Mrs. Mark Harris, Dr. Paul Hutchinson and James Beamish, American delegates, reported on the achievements of the anti-Nazi boycott movement in the United States.

The conference continues tomorrow.

To Receive 10 Per Cent of Net Estate After Payment to Kin

After payment of \$50,000 to five relatives, many charitable institutions will receive ten per cent of the net estate of the late Abraham Cohen, according to the terms of the will filed for probate in Surrogate's Court yesterday. Mr. Cohen, who died November 19 at his home at 336 Central Park West, was formerly associated with Hearn's Department Store. His estate was valued at "more than \$10,000."

The institutions that will benefit are Mount Sinai Hospital, Hospital for Deformities and Joint Diseases, Deborah Benevolent Sewing Society, Sisterhood of Congregation Rodeph Shalom, Hebrew Orphan Asylum, Convalescent Home for the Hebrew Child at Rockaway Beach, Home for Hebrew Infants, Montefiore Home for Chronic Diseases, Henry Street Settlement, Jewish National Home for Consumptives in Denver, National Farm School in Buck County, Pennsylvania.

Stanley Weiss of 33 Riverside drive and Mrs. Frieda Heidelberger of 336 Central Park West receive the residue of the estate after the specific bequests are taken care of.

## Three Students Beaten in Lwow Endek Attack

Assaulted in University Auditorium; Warsaw Homes Raided

LWOW, Nov. 26.—Three Jewish students in the University of Lwow were severely injured yesterday when Endek anti-Semitic students attacked them in the university auditorium.

The attack is the latest in a series of anti-Semitic student riots in Polish universities. In the University of Krakow, Jewish students were brutally beaten on three different occasions.

Students' Homes Raided in Warsaw

WARSAW, Nov. 26.—Jewish student quarters in the University of Warsaw were the object of a severe attack by anti-Semites Friday. Desks and furniture in the hall of the Jewish Student Association for Mutual Help were destroyed and all posters appealing for work for unemployed Jewish students were torn from the walls.

Growing anti-Semitism in the Polish universities, coupled with the attack on such innocuous activities as employment for poverty-stricken Jewish students, have created a grave impression on the Jews of Poland.

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## The Praha Riots

The speed with which the Czechoslovakian government acted to suppress the anti-Jewish riots which took place yesterday in Praha is the best proof that the Czechoslovakian authorities are not to be held responsible for the regrettable incident in which forty Jews and non-Jews were injured and many Jewish stores demolished.

The riots in Praha were directed not so much against the Jews as against the Germans. The Czech nationalists have for many years been waging war against the German element in Czechoslovakia. They object to the fact that German culture and the German language are still dominant in Czechoslovakia. They protest against the fact that movies in Czechoslovakia are still mostly German.

In this fight against German influence the Czech nationalist elements have always considered the Jew as siding with the Germans. They have maintained that the Jews in Czechoslovakia are helping to spread the German language. They were under the impression that the Jews were "Germanizing" Czechoslovakia.

The riots which occurred in Praha yesterday as an outgrowth of anti-German demonstrations prove that this impression has not disappeared even now, when the entire world knows that the Jews are bitter against Germany. To the Czech nationalists, the Jews are still agents of German culture.

Fortunately, the opinion of the Czech nationalists is not the opinion of the Czechoslovakian government. The government of Professor Masaryk is well known for its friendliness towards the Jews. Dr. Benes, the Foreign Minister of Czechoslovakia, has more than once helped Jewish delegations in Geneva fight for Jewish rights. Professor Masaryk has more than once expressed his deepest feelings for the Jews.

The Jews of the world trust Czechoslovakia. We are certain that the Czechoslovakian government will deal strictly with the rioters. We have no doubt that the guilty will get their punishment and that measures will be taken to prevent any agitation which may lead to the repetition of anti-Jewish events in Czechoslovakia.

There is always embarrassment in discussing personalities in connection with their birthdays. No special significance attaches to a day or birth. It is merely a marked date on the calendar; it serves to suggest striking a balance; it intimates the closing of a period, the creaking preparations for an obituary. And what man likes that?

The sixtieth birthday of Dr. Weizmann finds him keen, active and creative, as absorbed in Zionist work as on the day he entered into leadership over eighteen years ago. Although no longer the official head of the Zionist Organization, he is an ever-present force in all international Zionist affairs; last year he assumed the leadership of the Central Committee for the Settlement of German Jews in Palestine; and he is now in Rehoboth, engaged in setting up the Chemical Institute, of which he is the director. He is still the mind that leads in constructive, far-visioned building of the Jewish homeland and the renaissance of the Jewish nationality.

I have had the privilege of personal association with Dr. Weizmann since the Vienna Zionist Congress in 1913. He was then one of the younger men of the Democratic faction and a proponent of the Hebrew University. They were then talking of the University; it seemed fantastic and premature; it was dismissed by the more astute political Zionists as the emanation of the *batlon* mind. Dr. Weizmann was given the privilege of reading a *referat* at Vienna, but it was Ussishkin who ran away with the honors by making announcement of actual contributions to a University fund. Dr. Weizmann also functioned at that Congress as chairman of the Permanent Committee, and was a loyal supporter of the Zionist Executive, then composed of Otto Warburg, Sokolow, Tschlenow, Levin, Jacobson and Hantke.

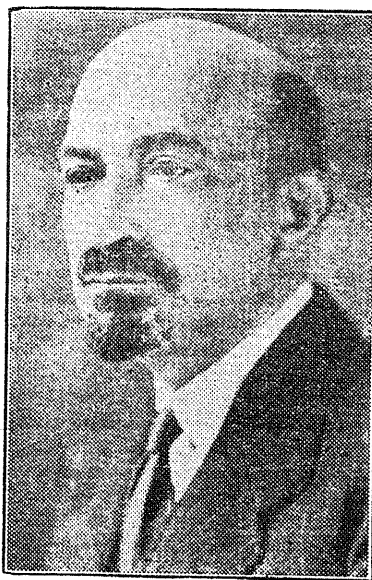
He played the part of parliamentary adjuster with Bohemian light-mindedness, and regarded with indifference the battle royal that was fought out between David Wolffsohn and the Executive, seeming not to care much when Wolffsohn won on the question of control of the Zionist bank.

## Foresaw Britain's Future Role

The World War transformed Dr. Weizmann. It made an earnest, responsible man of the easy-going raconteur and wit, of the controversialist who specialized in humor and satire. Even in the early days, he foresaw as others did, but with more conviction, the possible role Great Britain would play in Jewish destiny. He had settled down in Manchester as a professor of chemistry, and was making trial of his powers in conversations with British politicians and intellectual men. What he learned of leadership, which he applied later in the Zionist movement, came from his British contacts. He knew the leaders of the Allied nations, the men who shaped policies and directed the War. He made a deep personal impression upon Balfour, Lloyd George, Robert Cecil, General Smuts and the French statesmen. In fact, all the men who later sat at Versailles and remade the map of Europe had been drawn to Dr. Weizmann as the exponent of a fascinating ideal.

He learned all the ways of statesmanship from these men. They were engaged in liquidating the War. They were called upon to make decisions that would carry the willing support of the Allies and would make

the right impression upon the civilized world. Whether the decision was right or wrong, necessity drove them to draw the balance as best they knew how, and make an end of the business. The important thing was to get through with it. They could not allow themselves to be controlled by dogmas or prejudices, but had to adjust all their thinking to the need of stabilizing the world. They regarded the logical as a straight-jacket. They had to be mobile, eclectic, using imagination and improvisation to get them over the rocky road of realistic difficulties. The responsibilities of the world were on their shoulders; they had to take it out of the War and as soon as possible set it on the road to

"business as usual." They were therefore adept in compromise and adjustment; for they had to be opportunists if they wanted to end the discussions.

It was this spirit which seems to have impressed Dr. Weizmann. He had surpassing mobility and great energy. He had a mind which could make plausible and consistent even the most contradictory ideas. He always managed to work his way out of a tight corner. It was these qualities which enabled him to carry the responsibilities of the Zionist movement over a longer period of years than any other personality had ever managed to sustain. He saw the movement through its formative period of reality—from the embryo of the Balfour Declaration, through the days of the Zionist Commission in Palestine, through the establishment of the Keren Hayesod and up to the aftermath of the Passfield Paper, which brought about his resignation to make way for a new Zionist administration which faced the necessity of creating a new method for the building of the National Home.

## Dominant Figure For Fifteen Years

He was the dominant personality in Zionism over the period of 1915 to 1930. I have seen no man during all that time who could so quicken the pulse of the movement and engross its interests in dramatic changes, who could with such charm and clearness expound plans and aspirations to the larger world as did Dr. Weizmann. He built up a network of world opinion favorable to Zionism through per-

## Tells of Palestine Trip

To the Editor, Jewish Daily Bulletin:  
In reference to the articles of William B. Ziff concerning England's unjust immigration restriction upon the Jews who wish to enter Palestine, I want to relate a personal experience.

For various reasons, but more so because I was an ardent Zionist, I stowed away on the Aquitania, which was bound for Palestine some time early in March of this year. After twelve hours at sea, I decided to give myself up as an unintentional passenger, knowing eventually I would be found out. Well, the next thing I found myself in the ship's brig. The ship's sergeant greeted me with the good news that my fare had been paid by my brother, who was informed by the ship's company that I was a prisoner on ship and that I would be jailed in Gibraltar if my fare was not paid. Thus I became a regular passenger on the boat and was treated accordingly.

The ship being bound for Palestine, naturally there were many Zionists on it with whom I became acquainted. They raised the necessary funds to get me a passport, since I had only a few cents in my pocket. The Zionists on the boat were unable to obtain a visa from the British Consul for me. However the problem was cleared when it was decided to wait until the ship reached Palestine and they could have me admitted on a Hechalutz certificate. The boat finally reached its destination at Palestine.

I found I was a prisoner once more—not in the brig, but on the ship—despite the fact that I was a passenger and my fare had been paid. I was put under heavy guard. Beside the sergeant I had two

Palestine Police and two ship stewards. In all, I had five guards surrounding me all the time the boat was docked in Palestine. They threatened to put me in the brig if I attempted to evade the guards.

I finally was brought up to the immigration authorities on the ship. The clerks for the Immigration Department were from the Jewish Agency. It seemed that they were aware of my plight but took no action to aid me. Finally, the British officer of the Immigration Department approached me and asked me various questions concerning entry into Palestine. He told me that the passport was not sufficient to permit entry. I tried to persuade him to let me in on a chaltutz certificate. This he admitted could be done provided I was to go Syria and get a temporary visa from the British Consul thus making entry into Palestine possible. To my amazement, he refused to let me leave the ship claiming without a visa I couldn't set foot on Palestine, despite the fact that it was only an hour's ride to Syria. All means to persuade him to let me land were ignored, he could not be reasoned with. I then went on deck with the five guards around me.

The ship began to leave the harbor at dusk. I was free to roam the decks now that the ship left Palestine. I sat alone by the ship's railing watching the ship move slowly out. I began to feel depressed, to think that in the land of Israel, the Jewish Homeland that I loved so, the land I would sweat blood just for the sake of eternal Israel, would shut the gates on one of its own sons. Such was fate, the irony of it.

## The Silent J.D.C.-Zionist Fight

A silent fight is now going on between the Zionist Organization and the Joint Distribution Committee—a fight which chiefly concerns the Jews abroad. The issue is: Should the Zionist Organization of America continue to get fifty per cent from the funds raised by the United Jewish Appeal of America or should it get a smaller percentage?

The Joint Distribution Committee, which agreed last year to partnership with the American Palestine Campaign, claims the fifty-fifty arrangement of last year would not be justified this year, when the need of East European Jewry has grown so great. It suggests that if the arrangement is to be renewed for next year, the Zionists ought to be satisfied with less than fifty per cent of the funds raised.

## Who Is Right?

There is no doubt that the Zionists will have to give in to the demand of the Joint Distribution Committee if they are actually interested in raising any substantial sum for Palestine in the United States.

The Zionist Organization of America, in its present negotiations with the Joint Distribution Committee, ought to take into consideration that about a million dollars has been collected by different Zionist groups in the United States this year for Palestine, despite the agreement existing between the American Palestine Campaign and the Joint Distribution Committee. Zionists in America—those who are actually interested in contributing for Palestine—have given their contributions not to the United Jewish Appeal, in which the Zionist Organization and the Joint Distribution Committee are partners, but to the specific Zionist funds. This explains why the Jewish National Fund has raised more money in America this year than a year ago. This explains why the Zionist Labor Campaign has raised about \$180,000 this year as compared with the \$117,000 of last year. This explains why the Hadassah Organization has raised more than half a million dollars. This explains why the income of the Mizrahi was larger this year than during previous years.

## Partnership—Before and Now

When the Joint Distribution Committee entered, in 1929, into partnership with the Zionist Organization for a united campaign, this campaign included also the Hadassah and the Mizrahi. In other words, the Zionist women of America as well as the religious Jews here had a direct interest in making the united campaign a success.

Such was not the case this year. On the one hand, a partnership existed between the Zionists and the Joint Distribution Committee, and on the other hand—despite this partnership—each Zionist group in America conducted its own drive for funds. The result was that instead of contributing to the united Zionist-J.D.C.-campaign, the majority of Zionists contributed to the specific Zionist drives.

Such a state of affairs naturally affects the activities of the Joint Distribution Committee for countries where relief is actually necessary. It hampers the work of the J.D.C. in countries like Poland, Germany and Austria, where large-scale relief is now essential. For this reason alone the Distribution Committee is justified in refusing to fifty-fifty arrangement with the Zionist Organization.

## Anti-Semitism in America

It is a common habit of foolish minds to go whole-hog on any proposition on which they get a

glimmering of light. Unfortunately for us, our best minds tend to isolate themselves in various types of individual activity and are rarely articulate in matters of affecting Jewish problems as a whole. We are therefore, largely reduced to having, for the most part, a number of dull-witted fellows who take leadership into their own hands and for want of anything better, are commonly accepted.

Their inane blatherings have caused so much disgust in the average Jewish mind that they will have nothing whatsoever to do with them, alluding to these gentlemen as "post-professional Jews." Now there should be nothing whatsoever uncomplimentary in being a professional Jew, provided that such a professional Jew uttered something once in a while that might be construed to be meaningful, and struck an occasional attitude that filled the onlookers with admiration. I will admit that there are a few exceptions to this unhappy rule. But for the most part, those who speak for Jewry lift their thoughts right out of their hats, like a conjurer does rabbits. They know all the words but the words don't make any sense.

### Magnitude of Anti-Semitism

The net result is that it is rarely that more than a few dozen people can be induced to come down of an evening to listen to them. Their ridiculous distortions of reality have made the Jewish press a byword for uninviting stuffiness.

Sometimes their habit of going off at a complete tangent is merely a remarkable performance in mental agility, and hence amusing; at other times it becomes tragic for its complete non-relation to facts.

Their silly attitude toward anti-Semitism in this country and complete obliviousness to existing conditions is perhaps most remarkable of all.

I assert that there is just as much anti-Semitism in the United States as there is in any country in the world, Germany not excluded. Of course, if one considered merely the current effects of anti-Semitism and not the mere fact of its existence, he is apt to be misled. In Germany for instance, it is a great error to conclude that all Germans are anti-Semitic. Quite the contrary, just as in the United States of America, it is only a minority who are badly bitten with this virus. This minority while large, is not the entire German nation. At the moment it is vociferous and dictating its impression on German political life.

### 'Aryanism' and Business

What I am trying to say is not that American anti-Semites might convert all Gentiles to this ugly creed, but simply that they might at some time seize power, in which case a condition exactly duplicate to which has occurred in Germany, and is occurring in Austria, will take place here.

Considering Germany for the moment, in the face of the most severe anti-Semitic legislation, and in spite of an actual Nazi terror that exists, it has been difficult to stop the romantic feelings and love affairs between Jews and non-Jews

## Digest of World Press Opinion

### No Such Thing As a Pure Race

Lord Ponsonby, writing in the *Manchester Guardian* on the subject of race, comes to the following conclusions:

What a mixed lot racially we all are! The idea that there is a pure, uncontaminated race of beings which constitute a nation has no semblance to the truth. Some races of tougher fiber favor their own kind and are more or less easily recognizable. But the mixing of races goes on, and will in future continue more rapidly. Many of us have a Celtic strain of some kind or another, and quite a number can find not many generations back a foreign forbear. To be 100 per cent English would be difficult to prove scientifically, not so difficult perhaps as to prove to be 100 per cent American. Racially speaking, what is a Swiss, a Rumanian, or, indeed, a Russian or a Turk? A nation is a geographical expression which constantly requires a new definition. The sea and mountains do not move but frontiers do very frequently. A nation, unfortunately, can only be defined in one way: a people organized for war. That, again, is only temporary.

### Herr McLaughlin and The New Beobachter

Commenting editorially on the Nazi newspaper situation in New York City in connection with the retraction by W. L. McLaughlin, editor of the *Deutsche Zeitung*, and subsequent formation of the *Deutscher Beobachter*, the *Kansas City Journal-Post* states:

The *Deutsche Zeitung*, German language newspaper published in New York, supporting the anti-Semitism of the Nazis, attacked the character and legal integrity of former Magistrate Joseph Goldstein. Evidently there is a New York law providing imprisonment for libel, for when Mr. Goldstein took the matter to the courts and won, he refused to accept monetary damages, and a prison sentence of a year was imposed upon the publisher of the offending publication.

Thereupon, with the consent of Judge Franklin Taylor of Brooklyn, a compromise was arranged. The prison sentence was suspended in return for a retraction by the publisher, who printed a statement saying that he had lied about the former magistrate. Also, he announced a change of policy whereby the

The pro-Hitlerites of the United States are angry with Herr McLaughlin. Though the *Deutsche Zeitung* statements about Goldstein were shown in court to be libelous, the "Friends of Germany" do not approve of the decency of retraction. So they have established another publication in which they intend to continue their slandering of an entire race in imitation of the vicious crew that is ruling Germany and that they admire.

### Dr. Mendes Discusses Youth Problem

The problem of American Jewish Youth is discussed by Rev. Dr. Pereira Mendes in the *Synagogue Light*, a monthly publication of the Wall Street Synagogue.

Dr. Mendes says:

We contend that there is, and there can be no Jewish Youth without Jewish education, mere Jewish birth is not enough. The

Jewish girl or boy grows up to maidenhood or youth, ignorant of Hebrew language, except homeopathically, ignorant of Jewish history except superficially, ignorant of Jewish literature except exceptionally. But for decency sake he has got to belong to some religion or other. The parent takes good care that the child shall know that he or she is Jewish, without doubtless a Rabbi in the family in the old country. The result of such parental or parricidal inadequacy is a nominal Judaism of phenomenal elasticity.

Then we grumble at the Jewish youth. Then we wonder that after the farce of Bar Mitzva the boy drops synagogue attendance and the girls find other attractions. We rail and lament, but whose fault is it? Manifestly the parent has something to do with it.

sonal contact with the leaders of opinion in various lands. He made Zionism appear in their eyes as something imbued with mystic fervor, something Messianic, with an exotic tinge that aroused the deeply religious and the imaginative. He was not a Zionist theoretician, but a composer of the elements of Zionist idealism. He was never dead sure of himself, and could always see the doubtful that fringed even his most earnest convictions. He was a poet whose thinking was determined by his mood.

Nevertheless, taking all the years of his service together, he maintained a steady and straight line, and from certain fundamental convictions he never deviated. From the first, he identified himself with *Chalutzim* (labor pioneers). He always felt it as the finest expression of Zionist idealism. Although it brought a great deal which he could not accept, he regarded it as the most dependable factor in the renaissance. It represented courage, sacrifice; it represented determination to have Jewish life entangled in the very roots of the economic and social system in Palestine. It stood for the authentic realities of nationalism.

### Always Believed In Great Britain

He also never deviated from the line that represented confidence in the Mandatory Government. He believed in Great Britain. He felt that more was to be achieved through co-operation with Great Britain than through the pursuit of any alternative policy. It was easy to pick flaws in the British Administration; it was harder to abide by its policies and to keep on building. You might win your argument against the Government without much effort, in your own mind, in the mind of the public; but that was not a sufficient basis upon which the actual building could be continued. He regarded always the continued piling on of reality upon reality in Palestine, the gradual increase of power through numbers and resources, as the determining factor in every phase of Zionist policy.

He staked his leadership upon

his faith in Great Britain. Often, he took upon himself the defense of its policies, with disastrous results to his influence in the movement. With a certain perversity derived from his dialectical experiences in the Yeshivah, he would take up the case for Great Britain at a time when it was entitled to no such advocacy on his part. He wanted to offset the extremists with over-moderation. It was quixotic and foolhardy, but showed the strength of his faith in that justice which was ultimately to come from Great Britain.

### Spirit Dominates Organization Today

The reminiscent mood involves the past tense, and the past tense in this connection suggests finality in Dr. Weizmann's career. All that has here been said in the past tense continues in the present, for I am firmly convinced that Dr. Weizmann continues to be, in fact, an integral part of the Zionist leadership even though he has officially taken a leave of absence. His spirit dominates, insofar as it represents faith and confidence, much of Zionist policy of today. His temperamental outbursts may now be looked upon with affectionate regret. But his single-minded devotion to the day by day effort to build up strength for the Jewish people in Palestine remains a dominant note of the Zionist Administration of today.

Dr. Weizmann maintains all the ties he formerly had with Palestine, and continues in the most friendly and cooperative spirit to work hand in hand with the Zionist Executive. He is accorded the admiration of all who believe in gallantry in political life. To a large extent, it is a matter for himself to decide now whether the influence he exercises in Zionism shall be transformed into terms of official leadership. The Organization has grown in power and influence during the past four years. Should Dr. Weizmann return to the place he is entitled to occupy in the leadership of the Zionist Organization, he will find a larger and more experienced group of men with whom to be associated in the further development of Jewish Palestine.

## BLACK ON WHITE

This is the story of one whom we may call Abe Hyman and of how he moved all unawares through stark melodrama.

But before I tell about Abe Hyman I must tell you about black leather coats. Bear with me, friends—there is a connection.

Well, in Moscow, capital of the new Russia, coats, which are hard to get in any event, may be roughly divided into two classes: just coats and black leather coats. It happens that the latter can be bought only in the shop run by and for members of the redoubtable G. P. U. or secret service. A batch of them had once been imported and turned over to that exclusive store.

A black leather coat is therefore as good as a uniform. It is as good as an advertisement that the wearer belongs to the feared and fearsome "three letters" and is a creature apart. The coat in itself, of course, has no official standing. The merest mortal is allowed to wear one, except that it is not available anywhere but in the G. P. U. emporium.

Thus it comes about that a black leather coat—especially if coupled with a portfolio—gets respect, attention and a wide berth. It moves with an aura of power. The Muscovite who knows his horseshit shows a healthy deference for that garment.

### Enter Abe Hyman

And now your patience will be rewarded. I am down to the story. One day a meek-looking individual appeared in the offices of a certain Soviet Russian trading organization in New York. He explained in broken English that his name is Abe Hyman and that he has been unemployed ever so long. He explained that he knew Russian and was willing to do anything, from sweeping up to editing a paper, for a living.

These offices, like most others in New York, are pestered by desperate job-seekers often enough. It turns them out quite as perfunctorily. Normally Abe would never have passed the first barrier. But the canny office boy regarded Abe Hyman with suspicion, not untouched by awe. The fact is that Abe was wearing a black leather coat of precisely the cut so well known in Moscow, and in addition carried a portfolio!

So he was passed on delicately to a minor official. This official squirmed uncomfortably and regretted that there were no vacancies. But he was too smart to take any chances with a stranger thus accoutred. Who knows? Maybe he was sent. . . . Anyway, he passed Abe one rung higher. And the second official relayed him to a third.

Eventually Abe Hyman, persistent but not too hopeful, stood before one of the big bosses of the organization. Stood in his black coat, a portfolio under his wing. And he got the job. A job, in fact, was improvised for him. He was given the care of the library.

### Questioned . . .

So every morning of every working day Abe arrived, hung his coat on a hook, and proceeded to earn his tiny stipend. He dusted the books, filed away the magazines and pattered around. He liked the job. What he liked above all was the attention he was receiving. Everyone was so comradely and kind and anxious to

## Critical Moments

Despite the number of cinema holdovers—witness "The Gay Divorcee" as a prime example, picture fans still have a large variety of attractions this week. At the Paramount Joe (Wanna Buy a Duck) Penner rambles through a hodge-podge of non-sense, dancing and singing in a vehicle called "College Rhythm." He is aided and abetted by the syrupy-voiced Lanny Ross, metallic-rhythmed Lyda Roberti, the slapstick Jack Oakie and a group of lesser performers. Mr. Penner is surprisingly entertaining. Of course, the tunes supplied by Mack Gordon and Harry Revel, especially the "One to Ten" number which is as catchy a song heard in some weeks, helps more than a little.

Fannie Hurst's novel, "Imitation of Life," has been made into a picture by Universal and although it was shamelessly conceived to jerk tears, it remains a rather moving and poignant film. The mother-love question, always good for a long weep, has been used with little regard for the wear and tear on handkerchiefs. Claudette Colbert plays the leading role of the young widow torn between love for her daughter and a man, and executes her part with much feeling.

An unusual film is being shown at the Criterion. It is "The Battle," an adaptation of the novel by Claude Farrere. Leon Garganoff is presenting the picture in this country after great success with it abroad. It is well-played by Charles Boyer and Merle Oberon, who portray the roles of two Japanese. Boyer, as the husband, is so intent on furthering the welfare of the Japanese nation that he sacrifices not only his honor but that of his wife. His tragic ending is a logical conclusion to a gripping and sensitively-made and acted film.

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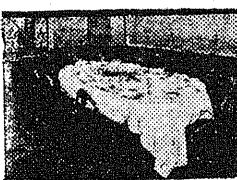

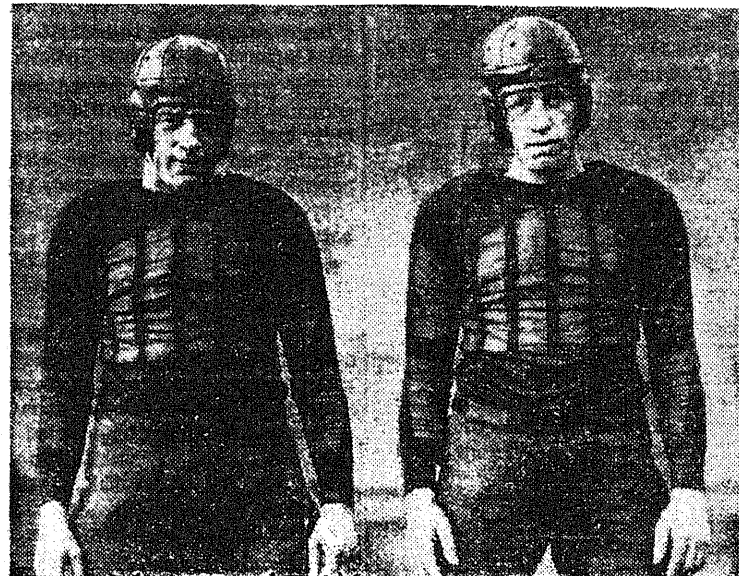

the present strife going on between the Czech and the German students. Deputy Goldstein was assured by members of the cabinet that the strictest measures will be taken to restore immediate order and to protect Jewish lives and property.

Despite the fact that over 100 Czech nationalist students are now in prison as a result of the riots and will be kept there until trial, fresh disturbances sprang up today in different parts of the city, organized by Czech students and by crowds of Czech youths. The demonstrators were instigated by conspirators to extend the anti-German disturbances to include the Jews.

Increased police forces were guarding the city all day long and were busy dispersing the demonstrations which continued to spring up here and there. Special police forces were stationed in the streets with concentrated Jewish population.

In a statement to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, Deputy Goldstein declared that not the slightest anti-Jewish occurrences have taken place in the provinces and that all the reports about alleged anti-Jewish disturbances outside Praha were absolutely false. Deputy Goldstein, who is the recognized leader of the Czechoslovakian Jews, declared that the Czechoslovakian Jews deplored the exaggerations which appeared in certain newspapers abroad about the disturbances in Praha.

A number of Czechoslovakian nationalist newspapers were confiscated today for publishing inciting reports. The rector of the Czechoslovakian university has issued an appeal to the students to maintain order. The chief of police has posted throughout the city a public warning that no gatherings will be permitted in the streets. Military forces have been mobilized to assist the police in maintaining order.

The riots broke out as a result of a clash between German and Czechoslovakian students which had nothing to do with the Jews. The German students tried to prevent the Czechoslovakians from obtaining the ancient insignia from

The statement, in part, expresses concern "at the present juncture over the situation in Mexico, where many unprejudiced observers report that in the endeavor to achieve social justice and political reform otherwise desirable, religious liberty is being imperiled... While refraining from discussing the immediate issues at stake in the controversies in Mexico, we desire to give our moral support to those who labor for freedom of worship there, and to express the anxiety with which we view every threat to liberty of conscience and the freedom of the soul."

The decision to circulate the statement was made at a meeting of the executive council of the conference last month under the chairmanship of Newton D. Baker, co-leader of the conference with Prof. Carlton J. H. Hayes and Roger W. Straus. The statement was presented by Dr. E. R. Clinchy, director of the conference.

in that country. We therefore read of Gentile girls who are barbarously treated because of affection for some Jewish boy.

Despite the entire weight of the government controlled anti-Semitic policy, Jewish stores continue to exist and do business. Mere popular opinion alone was insufficient to throw the Jews out of the professions. Their presence there as a result, had to be made illegal in order to remove them practically.

The friendly feeling between Jews and a large portion of the German population is no better illustrated than in Goebbels' complaint: "Every Nazi seems to have his pet Jew whom he wants removed from the restraint which is placed on the Jews. If we listened to this we could act against no Jews, and we must consider the policy of our party."

It is perfectly obvious that even in Germany there is no absolute homogeneity of opinion directed against the Jews, since to argue otherwise would be to indicate that all Germans had gone insane.

The group which seized power was not only anti-Semitic but bitterly so. It would be futile to estimate just what portion of the population they represented. What they did represent however, was better than mere majority: they were tightly organized, unrelenting in their purpose, and unprincipled in their actions.

It may seem odd in an article on "anti-Semitism in America" to talk at such length on the German situation, yet the German situation is a complete counterpart of the situation here. It varies from it only mildly. Everything which has gone to make for anti-Semitism in Germany exists to create it here.

### Virus Carried From Old World

We have the same middle-class antagonisms, the same unreasoning Old World hatreds transplanted in full form.

In virile essence it is shown in the complete ostracism of Jews from social life everywhere. It shows in the ads which call for Gentiles only. It shows in the many attempts to exclude Jews from the professions, residential localities, utilities and other corporations. Merely because it is not violent does not at all argue its non-existence.

Its latest manifestation is a large number of alleged patriotic societies which by linking Jews and Communists, are attempting to build a common unified ground between all anti-Semites.

## Dickstein Sees Financial Link

Semitic publication, which first appeared last week. Healey, who has been a frequent speaker at meetings of the Friends, has been a flagrant advocate of violence against what he terms the "Jewish peril."

Several other notorious Nazi agitators will be called to testify next week, Dickstein said last night.

Working on evidence submitted to it by the Jewish Daily Bulletin, the committee also expects to summon before it an active "anti-Communist" who has been distributing the forged "Protocols of the Elders of Zion" and other anti-Semitic literature. Indication that this person is being financed by socially and financially important interests will be probed in an effort to establish a new link between Wall Street and an organized campaign to spread prejudice in the United States.

As Dickstein prepared material for further executive hearings of his committee he also was awaiting the decision of Supreme Court Justice Edward J. McGoldrick on

an appeal for a State charter by the Friends of New Germany. It appeared likely yesterday that a ruling on this question will be handed down by the middle of this week.

Interest in a purported Fascist plot, revealed last week by Gen. Smedley D. Butler, continued unabated yesterday, when it was learned that the movements of Robert Sterling Clark and his attorney, Albert G. Christmas, both now in Europe, are being watched. The committee already has announced it will ask both men to explain financial transactions between Clark, who according to Butler, was represented as being willing to finance a Fascist coup here, and Gerald B. MacGuire, bond salesman and supposed go-between in the scheme.

Charges that CCC camps were to be used as focal points for dissemination of Fascist propaganda are being investigated by Department of Justice agents, it was also learned yesterday.

Dickstein expressed the opinion that MacGuire "is shielding somebody, I believe; probably a lot of people."

"But we're determined to investigate all the principals in this thing," he said, "and I'm convinced important results will follow."
