A special invitation has been sent out by the conference committee, of which Nathan D. Liepmann Charges Germany Of Future Use of Poison Gas

(Special to the J.D.B.)

BOSTON, Dec. 2.—Declaring that he has documents to prove his assertions, Heinz Liepmann, exiled German writer, speaking be-fore several hundred members and friends at the Temple Ohabei Sholom Brotherhood monthly dinner, stated that the German War Ministry has furnished instructions to its secret agents containing poison gas formulae and the use of dis-ease bacilli for military purposes.

Dr. Wise Sees Jews of America Lithuania Bows In Unsafe Economic Position To Anti-Semite

ing yesterday at the Free Syna-gogue in Carnegie Hall, asserted that the Jews of the United States are not safe.

"In speaking of the safety of the American Jew," he said, "one does not think of physical safety, of the personal safety of the in-dividual Jew. There may be the completest physical safety for the Jew and still the Jew may be un-

"I mean by that that the American Jew is unsafe if he must be ceaselessly fearful that at every turn he, as a Jew, must equivocat and compromise and dissemble and surrender. The American Jew is not safe if he must feel that he dare not be as completely and unequivocally and rejoicingly Jewish as any member of any other racial or religious group has pride and joy in his racial or religious heri-tage."

Attacks Utilities

Dr. Wise attacked economic anti-Semitism of public utilities in New York, charging there are today between 200,000 and 300,000 jobs in the city "which no Jewish man or woman can hope to

occupy."
"If 200,000 jobs are definitely and permanently shut to Jews— and the number is probably much larger—then 60,000 or 70,000 young Jews are denied their rightful part and share in the world of industry. the speaker continued. "This de-nial makes life unsafe for them insofar as it unjustly burdens and handicaps and exposes them to moral temptations to which some of their number are bound to succumb."

Turning to the German situa-tion, Dr. Wise declared the German Jew today under the "hideous" regime of Hitlerism is inwardly safer than before the days of Naz

"Knows Where He Stands" "He knows where he stands and once again he deeply believes that he is a member of a great and

ancient and honorable people. As a result of this inner security, he may even take pride in the circumstance that he is under attack because he stands for the things

which Hitlerism opposes."

The speaker called upon all civilized peoples, "and above all to Christendom," to see to it that the Jew is not given "a crushing sense

of insecurity."
"The safety which I crave for the American Jew," he said, "is something more than mere physical safety. I would have the Jew understand by reason of the at-titude of the vast number of non-

Sees Jews Safe Here

Jews, or any other minority in America, are safe because the United States government is not a pure or absolute democracy. This was the view expressed yesterday by Rabbi William Margolis at Con-gregation Ohab Zedek, 118 West Ninety-fifth street.

"Current exposures of subver sive, anti-American forces in this country may have struck a note of terror in the hearts of Jews and other minorities who live and thrive here by the grace of Amerithrive here by the grace of American democracy," said Rabbi Mar-golis. "Yet I emphatically believe that no minority in America is ever in danger, because of the very fundamental nature and construction of the United States ideal in government.

He declared that the founders of the nation established a true representative-democratic republic which protects the minorities and predicted that "American leaders today and tomorrow will annihilate the wild impulses of pagan 'isms,' the opposite and discordant ideas which can never unite with basic, truly democratic principles."

Speaks on Chanukah

"The festival of Chanukah is a reaffirmation of the ideal of human liberty against oppression," said Rabbi Louis I. Newman at services yesterday at Congregation Rodeph Sholom, 7 West Eighty-third street. "George Washington and other leaders of the Revolution took courage from the example of the great Judas Maccabeus who liberated his people from the yoke of the imperial oppressor."

Rabbi Newman urged those

his hearers who believe that dic-tatorships will continue in power to turn to the books of history and to turn to the books of history and read how "with effort, organiza-tion and valor, it is possible for freemen to overcome their perse-cutors, however great the numbers arrayed against them." Charges Anti-Semitism Directed

Rabbi Israel Goldstein, speaking at Congregation B'nai Jeshurun, 257 West Eighty-eighth street, said the "vicious poison" of anti-Semitism is being felt in the United States. The movement of hatred against the Jews, he declared, is not a spontaneous one but is or-ganized and directed.

The speeches broadcast by the government radio station called on the population of the country to boycott the Jews in every branch of life. The Versias organization embraces Lithuanian merchants and artisans engaged in competing with Jews and in spreading bitter anti-Semitic agitation throughout the country. The anti-Semitic movement con-

The anti-Semitic movement con-ducted by the Verslas organiza-tion is silently supported by the government, which has fallen under the influence of this organiza-tion. The general secretary of the party of which Smetona, the Lith-uanian president, is the leader, is also the theoretician and the back-Verslas. The Deputy Minister of Finance is the honor ary president of this organization.

The influence of the anti-Semitic Verslas party has reached the point where many law projects are practically dictated to the government by the leaders of the las. As a result of this influence upon the government, anti-Semitic elements have succeeded in inducing the authorities to issue ordinances which will make it impossible for Jews to become lawyers sine for Jews to become lawyers or doctors in the country and which are greatly affecting the en-tire economic position of the Jew-ish population.

Belgium Eases Up On Reich Refugees

Police Order Not to Molest Those Going Overseas Follows Protests on Arrests

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BRUSSELS, Dec. 2.—Orders not to molest Jewish refugees here awaiting permits to emigrate over-seas were issued to the police by higher authorities, it became know vesterday.

The orders are the outgrowth of representations made by a Jew-ish delegation to official circles after the arrest last week of over a hundred persons found without proper identification evidence. The last of those held following police raids in the Jewish quarters were set free yesterday.

Germany Rejects Peace

The statement made by Dr. Frick, the Nazi Minister, that any offer of peace by Jews to Germany will be rejected, is the best proof that Germany does not intend to modify its anti-Jewish policy, not even after the appeal made by Lloyd George and other British statesmen last week to the Hitler government, urging a reconciliation with the Jews.

The Hitler government needs a scapegoat. It needs somebody upon whom to heap blame for the hard Winter Germany faces and for the dissatisfaction which is already brewing in the nation. A reconciliation with the Jews would be tantamount to an admission by Hitler that he has done injustice to tens of thousands of loyal German citizens.

Of all the twenty-six points of the Nazi program, the anti-Jewish paragraph alone been fully carried out by the Hitler government. The rest of the program has so far remained mere phraseology. would therefore be an illusion on the part of any Jewish group to expect that Hitler will admit that even the Jewish point of his program must be

modified.

A lucrative racket—peddling copies of the forged 'Protocols of the Elders of Zion" the gullible and receiving financial support for doing so from equally gullible and hood-winked people — flourishes in the United States. Masking their anti-Semitic attacks be-hind the veil of a fight on Communism, these purveyors of libel and race hatred find a ready market-and more important for them-ready support and financing.

Investigation by the Jewish Daily Bulletin, reported in these pages, reveals how the John B. Snows, the Robert Edward Edmondsons and other purveyors of anti-Semitic filth operate.

great idea in a great man, the outgrowth of the vision of a man who pierced through the present and into the future needs of "The man was Rabbi Joseph Krauskopf of Philadelphia; the idea, that of taking city boys and giving them a thorough, practical and scientific education in agriculture, and thus benefiting the country at large.

"The union of the man and the idea has resulted in an institution which is considered by educators and agricultural leaders the ideal type of educating our youth for the farm,"

The above-quoted paragraphs are an excerpt from the cata-logue of the National Farm School, Jewish-supported non-sectarian institution situated one mile west of Doylestown, Pa., which opens its thirty-eighth

school year on April 1, 1935.

Between the covers of this catalogue is contained a story which is all the more inspiring because of its cool, factual pres entation of an ideal which h grown into a splendid reality.

While Jewry is torn with vexation in many portions of the world, the realization that constructive work of the sort being accomplished with ever-increas-ing success at the National Farm School acts as a tonic to those who even momentarily doubt the sinewy fibre of their those heritage.

"The National Farm School is. and has been from its inception. on a non-sectarian basis, in the strictest sense of the worl," the catalogue states. "No worthy boy has been refused admission on account of religion. Its splen-did equipment and opportunities are open to any deserving youth wishing to train for a life as a progressive farmer.

With No Regard

To Creed
"Though Jewish contributions have largely supported the insti-tution, this has in no measure kept the school from its undeviating "tandard, which regards creed as irrelevant to its pur-pose, and which accepts boys from seventeen to twenty-one years of age—whether they be Jew or non-Jew. What matters is that they are deserving and eager to profit by the training offered."

This, then, is the first admisslon requirement—that prospective entrants be between the ages of seventeen and twentyone. Other specifications are simple To become a student a boy must be in good health. He must have completed at least one year in high school. the full three years' course?

Above all, he must bear in mind the purpose behind formation of the school, which its charter states as follows:

Little Lithuania, toward whom the Jews of the world always have been friendly disposed, is now beginning to attract world-wide attention with its anti-Jewish discriminations,

A number of reports this week show that the Lithuanian government is gradually falling un-der the influence of the anti-Semitic elements in the country centered around the Verslas organization. Anti-Semitic speeches of Verslas members are broadcast on the government radio station and laws and ordinances are being issued with the sole purpose to eliminate Jews from all branches of public and economic life.

It is no longer a secret that a numerus clausus for Jewish students is silently practiced this year by the Lithuanian university. An unusual "health exami-nation" has been irtroduced for all students wishing to enter the medical faculty, and as if by prearrangement practically all Jewish applicants were declared physically unfit and thus were not admitted to the university. Nothing faulty, however, was found with their health when they were later taken into the Lithuanian army as soldiers.

Emulating the Nazis

Emulating Germany and Austria, the Lithuanian government has introduced regulations which aim in one way or another to oust Jewish lawyers in Lithuania who already lost their right to practice because of the new regulations which provide that all those who have been practicing law less than five years are no longer to be recognized as fullfledged lawvers.

Simultaneously an ordinance has been issued preventing Jews altogether from becoming lawyers in the future. This ordinance requires that every graduate of the law faculty must work for a number of years in court as an official before being admitted to the bar. Since no Jew is employed in the court system this precludes the possibility of Jews becoming lawvers.

Drastic anti-Jewish ordinances have been issued recently also with regard to Jews acquiring land in Lithuania. A large proportion of Lithuanian Jews make their living from agriculture. Now a new law decrees that no Jew can acquire land in Lithu-ania unless he has been tilling the soil for not less than ten

Anti-Semites Influence Officials

As to commerce, the position of the Jews in Lithuania becomes more and more critical every day. The anti-Semitic organization Verslas which united the Lithuanian middle class carries on a systematic anti-Jewish boycott campaign and is success-

fully influencing the government.

To make the situation worse for professionals and artisans, the Lithuanian government has now issued a law which will re-quire special examinations in the Lithuanian language for every employee in the country. This law affects not only the Jewish artisans who are not so well versed in the Lithuanian tongue, but the bulk of Jewish book keepers and other white-collar employees. It includes even employees, it includes even servant girls. No person in Lithuania has a right to employ a servant girl if she has not passed a special examination in Lithuanian language.

The training course requires a full three years, twelve months a year, minus twenty-eight days each year for vacations. The year is divided into two terms of twenty-four weeks each, with the student body separated into two sections, one of which at-tends classes while the other carries on practical work, dur-

ing alternate terms. In physical appearance the school is the equivalent of any good small college, except for its additional extensive fields and equipment. It has an attractive campus, mcdern dormitories, libraries, laboratories and class-

All the extra-curricular opportunities which are open to col-lege students are available to youths at the National Farm School. These include athletics. student clubs and organizations a band and orchestra and a bimonthly publication.

Placement Bureau

Most Successful
Applications from boys desiring to enter next April are now being received. It is also pointed out that prospective graduates from high school in June, 1935, will be considered for admission on July 1, 1935, provided their applications are filed on or be-

applications are filed on or be-fore next February 1.

Perhaps one of the most in-teresting paragraphs in the catalogue, which may be obtained by r quest from the school's Philadelphia offices, refers to placement of students:

"The school operates a placement bureau, at the service of its graduates. Many calls come to the school throughout the year for graduates capable of filling positions in all branches of agriculture. This ureau has most successful in placing practically every graduate prior to the day of graduation in a promising opening at a good wage; and also in aiding grad-uates to advance to higher work, as their e perience and capabilities increase." A historical review of the

How Jews Aid Arabs in Palestine

The Morning Post, a London daily newspaper, commenting upon Arab complaints because the influx of Jews to Palestine,

In 1933 alone, Jewish settlers brought £7,000,000 into the coun-try, whilst in the first eight months of this year they brought £10,000,000. It is inevitable that the investment of this money which is only a part of the total capital introduced by Jews into Palestine in agricultural, industrial, and commercial undertakings should have conferred material benefits in various ways upon the Arab population. recent investigation carried

out by the Executive of the Jewish Agency has shown that in regard to Jewish orange plantations, about one-half are worked exclusively with Arab labor, and that, in the other half, a con-siderable amount of Arab labor is also employed. In 1932 there were employed in the Jewish agricultural settlements between 14,000 and 15,000 Jews, and between 5,000 and 6,000 Arabs. Since then about 6,000 Jews

have left agricultural work for the towns, owing to the shortage of labor and higher wages there their places have been taken by Arabs, many of whom come from Transjordan, and even from Egypt and from the Hauran in Syria, since there is a shortage of laborers in Palestine, not age of laborers in Palestine, not only among the Jews, but also among the Arabs. Moreover, there are large numbers of Arabs employed by Jews in the building trade in towns.

Fund Organ Hits American Zionists

American Zionists are criticized in Karnenu, a monthly published by the Jewish National Fund in Jerusalem, for failing to contribute as much to the fund this year as British Jews, who number only 300,000. The official organ of the JNF writes editorially: Had we received in time sev-

eral sums which have been col lected for the Keren Kavemeth in various countries, our receipts for the year 5694 would have exceeded the highest ever attained. That is an achievement. which must give a certain satisfaction. The economic position of Jewry on the whole has not improved, it has in Europe even worsened, and the better response to the K. K. L., therefore, at a time when other calls have not ceased upon the purse, is encouraging. Without doubt of Zionist sentiment caused by the collapse of the assimilation philosophy and the physical need also of Eretz Israel. It can only be regretted that this recognition of the truth of Zionist principles did not come earlier when the Jewish position

was materially better. There are, however, negative aspects of the year's results. So powerful a community, in spite of the economic decline, as American Jewry still is, has failed to raise as much as British Jewcomprising 300,000 souls. The highest sum in any one country -£43,000—while creditable to Great Britain and Ireland, is not figure sufficiently imposing to hold first place among lands contributing to a Nation's Fund.

Magazine Discusses Zionist Peace Pact

Nea East and andia, semi-official organ of the Colonial Office, commenting on the peace regotiations between the Laborites and the Revisionists in Palestine.

Turmoil was caused in the Jewish sphere by a mass attack of young laborers on a Revisionist meeting held in Haifa. When the Revisionist meeting was held, a crowd of 1,500 assembled outside and hurled stones

through the window, over twenty persons being injured and some police hurt during the disnavenie One immediate effect of the incident was o draw attention to the active hostility existing between the Labor and Revisionist elements, and a com-Revisionist elements, and a com-mittee of inquiry was sent to Haifa by the Jewish Agency and General Council of Palestine Tews.

The entire issue now promises to be buried, as perhaps also the whole hatchet of party hatred, with the recent exclusion in London of the first part of an agreement between Mr. David Ben-Gurion and Mr. Vladimir Jabotinsky, leaders of the Jewish Labor and Zionist-Revision-ist parties, respectively. This was part of the genera. Zionist Organization discussions to achieve an inter-party peace within its ranks, and may, if the agreements are observed, not be without their beneficial effects upon the Jewish effort

Savs Teachers Need More Religion

The Crthodox Union, a monthly published by the Union of Orthodox Congregations of America, demands that Hebrew teachers the United States be more reli-gious than they are. The paper writes as follows:

Intelligent Jews are realizing, more than ever before, that the survival of American Israel depends upon the well-grounded religious education which we can give to Jewish children. While the proportion of those receiving religious training is still woefully small, registration reports from some of the larger religious

schools are really encouraging.
There is one vital aspect of
Jewish education, however, to
which many worthy, well-meaning institutions are pitifully blind The Hebrew School teachers are those in whose hands are the plastic minds of our children. We look expect-antly to them to train our youth in religious understanding and

VIENNA.—While Jews of this city are being subjected to a pow-erful assault on their economic and material security, Christian zealots motivated by missionary ambitions are attacking them on the spiritual front,

Taking advantage of the intense economic pressure being applied to Jews by the government, which is driving thousands into a state of helplessness, strong Catholic groups have launched a vigorous

conversion campaign. Although previously the Jewish community, harried by economic problems, has taken little cognizance of conversion attempts made by these missionary elements, reor these massionary elements, re-cent large-scale activities have brought its leaders to a sharp realization of the inroads made upon the community.

A Catholic publication recently announced that several hundred Jews of this city had submitted to Daptism and that many more would soon embrace Christianity as a way out of their economic troubles.

Jewish Leaders Act

A new Catholic periodical, "Ful-filment," in its first issue discusses diment," in its first issue discusses possibility of an "understanding" between Christians and Jews and definitely declares that such understanding must revolve around missionary activity to convert Jews to Christianity. The publication features two articles by Johannes Oesterreicher, a converted Jew, who goes to considerable pains to point out that salvation for Jews will be found only when they submit to baptism.

These open and velled attempts, velled when they are disguised under the expressed desire to create an understanding between the two faiths, have finally stimu-lated leaders of the Jewish com-

Reich Applies New Pressure Against Jews

London Times Reports 10,000 Forced Out of Professions

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) LONDON, Dec. 2.—Further evidence that the economic screw is being tightened against German Jewry by the exclusion of "non-Aryans" from a number of pro-fessions is presented by the Lon-don Times in a column-long ar-ticle dated from Berlin.

Asserting that 10,000 Jews have recently been deprived of the chance to earn a livelihood in Germany, the article points out that the recent tendency to assume that the effects of the anti-Semitic legislation of the Nazis have been exaggerated (the assumption be-ing based on the fact that Dr. Hjalmar Schacht, Minister of Economics, discourages interference with Jews in commerce) is mis-leading. Dr. Schacht's measures. the article declares, were taken merely to prevent disturbance of the economic life of Germany, Pressure Grows

Despite these measures, the ar-ticle continues, it is now apparent that the pressure is continu-ously increasing, especially against the Jewish professional and small trader. Propaganda Minister Goebbels' Chamber of Culture is ruth-lessly applying the "Aryan" prin-ciple, not only to artists, as was recently reported, but also to persons through whom their works are sold. Thus 2,000 Jewish families have been deprived of their livelihood.

By the same method, the Times says, the Chamber of Plastic Arts has succeeded in ousting 500 Jewhas succeeded in ousting 500 Jew-ish artists and their families, and thousands of Jews connected with the press have been deprived of their means of making a living by

Goebbels' press chamber.
Only where Schacht's edict is enforced is the lot of the "non-Aryan" somewhat eased, the article says in conclusion, citing as an example an instance in Brunswick where recently Schacht in-tervened to stop the anti-Jewish boycott arranged there after a visit of Julius Streicher, arch anti-Semite and publisher of the Stuermer. When Minister of Economics ordered the withdrawal of pickets from Jewish shops, the public, apparently not agreeing with the anti-Semitic fanatics who placed the pickets, flocked into the Jewish shops to make their purchases.

"Judaism is not an abstraction," said Judge Hofstadter. "It is a way of life reaching back to great and historic past and leading forward and upward to our appointed destiny of contributing to the civilization of the world the indispensable category of holiness in human life.

"And the chart for this way of

life—the only path by which it may be trod—is Jewish education." A report headed "The Concrete fork of the Jewish Education Association" was submitted to each guest. It pointed out that the JEA scholarship fund has paid tui-tion fees for thousands of poor children in the Jewish religious

The JEA has introduced higher standards of safety, sanitation and administration in these schools, the report said, in many cases through loans and outright grants. The department of statistics and information has proved extremely useful, the paper added.
