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U. S. Appears Set for Deal With Hitler

Hope That Trade Treaty Will Be Defeated Seen Waning

(Special to the J.D.B.)
WASHINGTON, Dec. 6.—Negotiations for a \$30,000,000 cotton barter deal with Nazi Germany are expected to be "drawn to a head" in the next two or three weeks, Secretary of Agriculture Henry A. Wallace revealed today.

All indications pointed to completion of the deal soon, in spite of objections filed by Samuel Untermyer, world anti-Nazi boycott leader, who in a recent communication to Secretary of State Cordell Hull warned that predicted benefits would prove without substantial basis.

According to the best information available here, only the approval of the State and Treasury Departments is required before the transaction is consummated.

The Export-Import Bank, directed by George N. Peek, Oscar Johnston, manager of the Agricultural Adjustment Administration's cotton pool, and the AAA have already given their approval, it is understood. The Hitler government has communicated its sanction.

To Ship 500,000 Bales
Under the barter plan at least 500,000 bales of American cotton will be shipped to the Reich in exchange for goods of equal value. Among the Nazi products mentioned as possibly acceptable are nitrates, but it is known that manufactured goods will bulk large.

Simon Is Ready To Defend Self

Surrenders to Court Today to Answer Bribe Charge

Arthur Simon, former Health Department investigator, will surrender himself in General Sessions Court today to answer an indictment for bribery and gratuity returned by the New York County Grand Jury, he told a reporter yesterday. Bail of \$1,000 has been arranged.

Simon, who lives at 420 Fiftieth street, Brooklyn, was indicted Wednesday after Abraham Gellis of the Isaac Gellis Kosher Meat Products Company had appeared before the Grand Jury, where it is understood he charged Simon had accepted a \$250 bribe to "fix" a kosher food law violation summons served on Gellis.

Simon denied acceptance of the bribe and yesterday repeated his counter-charge that he is being "framed."

Poland Fires Priest For Racial Agitation

WARSAW, Dec. 6.—Minister of Education Wladaw Jendrzewicz today suspended a Catholic priest, Father Twalkowski, on the ground that he was using his post in the public school system to engage in anti-Semitic agitation.

Twalkowski circulated questionnaires among the children asking "whether the Jews spread demoralization."

Nazi City Wins Right to Keep Jew's Bequest

Surrogate Here Rules \$25,000 Must Be Paid Mannheim

Nearly seventeen years ago Ludwig Dreyfuss, a Jew born in Mannheim, Germany, died here, leaving an estate of \$1,029,446.

Among the bequests left by Dreyfuss, whose estate was finally evaluated on December 31, 1930, was one of \$25,000 to the mayor and the president of the Chamber of Commerce of Mannheim, to be administered by them in the interests of various charities.

Yesterday, disclosing the existence of a bitter controversy that has raged over payment of the bequest, Surrogate James A. Delehanty ruled that the \$25,000 must be turned over by the estate to the Mannheim officials.

The controversy arose over the anti-Jewish policies pursued by the Nazi regime in Germany.

Opponents to Payment
Opposed to payment of the bequest are the following:

Walter S. Sachs, Howard J. Sachs, trustees of the estate; the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies and the Jewish Social Service Association, residuary legatees; and Robert Levy, formerly Robert Stein, a grand-nephew of Dreyfuss.

In a memorandum submitted to the Surrogate's Court, the court was asked to invalidate the bequest on the ground that political conditions in Germany have changed drastically since Dreyfuss died.

Under the Nazi government, the memorandum pointed out, members of Dreyfuss' own race would not benefit under the terms of the bequest. The memorandum asked a construction of the will invalidating the bequest because the trustees are incompetent to act and

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Reich - Zion Barter Pact Held Vital

Has Brought \$250,000 to Palestine Funds, Haavara Reveals

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
JERUSALEM, Dec. 6.—A sum of not less than 450,000 German marks (approximately \$200,000) has been received by the existing Zionist funds and other Zionist institutions in Palestine as a result of the barter agreements between Germany and Palestine, it was disclosed here today in a formal statement issued by Haavara, organization supervising the transfer.

Haavara declares that the existing transfer agreement represents the only way for transferring to Palestine Zionist funds contributions collected in Germany for Zionist activities.

Lacking this arrangement, the statement points out, activities conducted in Germany on behalf of the Jewish National Fund and the Keren Hayesod, would be threatened with total paralysis by the impossibility of sending out the sums collected to Palestine.

The announcement also discloses that not less than 40,000 marks—about \$16,000—have been transferred by this organization to the Jewish Agency during the last month alone.

"Until recently," Haavara announces, "the German government used to transfer in foreign exchange to the Jewish Agency for Palestine the special emigration tax raised by the German authorities from German Jews who migrated to Palestine. Owing to the growing scarcity of foreign exchange in Germany, the German government has now suspended the transfer of money in foreign exchange to the Jewish Agency."

Family Denies Dreyfus Nears End of Road

PARIS, Dec. 6.—Col. Alfred Dreyfus, central figure in the "Affaire" which forty years ago shook the French republic to its foundations, is recovering slowly from an operation performed two months ago, members of his family said today, denying reports that the aged man was near death. Col. Dreyfus recently celebrated his seventy-fifth birthday.

Hitler Promotes Julius Streicher

Given New Post

Names Franconia Overlord Governor Of Upper Silesia

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
BERLIN, Dec. 6.—Julius Streicher, notorious anti-Semitic Nazi leader, was promoted today by Reichsfuhrer Hitler who appointed him Nazi Commissioner for Upper Silesia, to replace Hellmuth Brueckner, the Governor of Silesia, who was dismissed on Monday "for activities injurious to the Nazi party."

Herr Streicher's new appointment was announced this afternoon to counteract the rumors that Streicher had been suddenly dismissed as Nazi ruler of Franconia. The announcement states that he will be transferred from Franconia to Silesia and indicates clearly that the transfer means a promotion for Streicher and approval of his activities in Franconia.

The appointment of Streicher as Governor of Upper Silesia comes as a shock to the Silesian Jews whose national minority rights have been guaranteed by Germany to the League of Nations. It is expected that under Streicher's administration the Jewish population in Upper Silesia will now face serious anti-Jewish assaults similar to those suffered by the Jews of Franconia, especially in the city of Nuremberg, where Streicher was the supreme authority.

Simultaneously with the promotion of Streicher, Hitler today dismissed Gottfried Feder, one of the leading Nazi theoreticians and the

Protest Lodged On Saar Pact

European Defense Body Tells France 1-Year Proviso Is Futile

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
PARIS, Dec. 6.—A memorandum requesting full and unlimited protection for Jews in the Saar was submitted to the French government today by the Committee for the Defense of Jewish Rights in Central and Eastern Europe. Senator Justin Godart is president of the committee, and Premier Pierre E. Flandin is honorary president.

The memorandum took exception to the one-year limitation on protection for the Jews in the event that the Saar reverts to Germany, pointing out that such protection is useless.

The committee is also negotiating with the French government on issuing labor permits to German refugees equivalent to the number of French workers employed in firms founded by the refugees.

Agency Selects New York for Its Next Meeting

Administrative Body to Open Sessions Here on Dec. 31

LONDON, Dec. 6.—The next meeting of the administrative committee of the Jewish Agency for Palestine will be held in New York on Dec. 31 it was announced here today.

Decision to hold sessions of the committee in the United States this time was reached after a consultation with Sir Osmond D'Avigdor Goldsmid, president, and Dr. Cyrus Adler.

Sir Osmond will leave for the United States about the middle of this month to attend the meeting. Prof. Selig Brodetsky, head of the Jewish Agency, will also sail for New York. Others who will participate in the New York parley will be Neville Laski, president of the Board of Jewish Deputies, Dr. Maurice Hexter, executive member of the Jewish Agency, and Dr. Bernhard Kahn, European director of the Joint Distribution Committee. They will leave for the United States on Dec. 24.

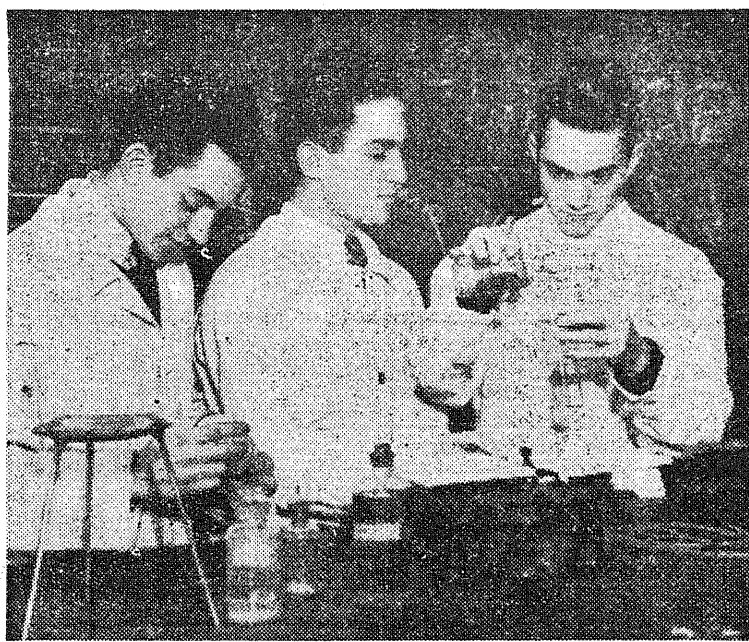

man responsible for the anti-Jewish so-called "Aryan paragraph" in the Nazi program. Feder was one of the first aides of Hitler from the very beginning of the Nazi party. He occupied the position of Under-Secretary in the Ministry of Economics. He will be pensioned and isolated from any activities in the government and in the Nazi party.

The promotion of Streicher to a higher position came as a surprise even to Nazi leaders. It was Streicher who only a week ago closed down the existing Jewish department stores in Nuremberg, asserting that they would be taken over and run by the state and that the hundreds of employees there would lose nothing. The stores, however, have so far not been reopened, simply because the drastic anti-Jewish measure taken by Streicher was not approved by Berlin. It was believed that Streicher, as a result of this independent action, toward which the Ministry of Economics objected strongly would be put under a stricter control.

The appointment of Streicher to the position of Governor of Upper Silesia indicates that Hitler's personal attitude towards him has by no means weakened, despite the opposition of the Ministry of Economics toward Streicher's uncensored activities to oust the Jews economically in Franconia.

Der Stuermer, the Jew-baiting organ published by Streicher in Nuremberg, will continue its publication despite Streicher's departure, it was stated here today. It was predicted that with Streicher in Upper Silesia, a similar anti-Jewish publication would be started there.

Streicher's promotion came despite the great dislike which Premier Goering has taken towards him and also despite the fact that the "Gestapo," secret political police, has more than once clashed with the Franconian overlord after it confiscated the issue of the Stuermer which was devoted to spreading the "ritual murder" libel against the Jews and which caused open protests on the part of the Jews of Germany and official interpellations in the British Parliament.

Poland Holds 25 Jews After Communist Hunt

Margolis Discounts Reich Saar Pledge

'Sounding Brass and Hollow Sham,' Rabbi's Comment on Nazi Promise

Speaking at the Chanukah gathering of the New York Junior Haddassah last night, Rabbi William Margolis of Congregation Chab Zedek branded Germany's promises of safety for Jews in the Saar "a sounding brass and a hollow sham." The meeting was held at the Y. W. H. A., 31 West 110th Street.

"The world knows that Hitler's peace protestations in the past were the low lies of a hypocritical demagogue," said Rabbi Margolis. "For it is by this time universally known that the stupendous exhibition of 'scientific' diabolism, of which Germany boasted during the World War, is dwarfed and beggared by the munitions resources and military preparations at the hand of Naziland today.

"And who does not know of Hitler's consuming ambitions with regard to the Saar region?"

"In the face of characteristic despotic dishonesty, in the face of the devilish treatment accorded innocent Jews and the resulting debacle of German culture, in the face of facts which have proved Hitler a pervert and a liar, German promises and assurances to minorities in the Saar are a sounding brass and a hollow sham!"

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South Africa to Barter Wool For £2,500,000 in Nazi Goods

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
CAPE TOWN, South Africa, Dec. 6.—A barter agreement with Nazi Germany involving £2,500,000 has been signed, Finance Minister Havenga announced today. The South African government guaranteed to buy German goods to that amount and pay for it with South African wool.

Commercial circles are waiting to see in what manner the government will dispose of the German goods, particularly in view of the fact that Jewish firms and distributors are determined to refuse to handle German-made products.

Debate Rages Over Minister's Boycott Talks

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
CAPE TOWN, South Africa.—Jewish circles are still engaged in heated debates over the speech made by Minister of the Interior Jan H. Hofmeyer, in which he deplored the persecution of the Jews in Germany, but declared that the anti-Nazi boycott must be dropped because it is harming South Africa.

Rumors are afoot here that a compromise proposal is being discussed between the government and Jewish leaders providing for the end of the anti-German boycott in exchange for a ban on the Greyshirts, South African Nazis. In this way the government hopes to induce Germans to buy South African wool, while satisfying the Jews at the same time.

Greyshirts Lose Ground
There is much opposition in some Jewish groups to giving up the boycott. It is contended that such a drastic step is altogether unnecessary in view of the oppo-

sition the Greyshirts are meeting from Jews and Gentiles alike.

In many country districts the Greyshirts have not only failed to make appreciable progress, but have met with opposition in their attempts to blacken the character of the Jews.

Dr. S. S. Hoffman, a Jewish physician of Ladysmith, attended a Greyshirt meeting and interrupted Weichardt, the "fuehrer," calling him a "damned liar." When the Greyshirts attempted to eject him, Gentile neighbors formed a cordon around him, shouting that he was a respected citizen and had every right to speak. Dr. Hoffman continued his denunciation of the Greyshirts until the meeting broke up in disorder. Dr. Hoffman was the only Jew at the meeting.

Port Elizabeth Trial Scores
At a meeting held in Vryheid Greyshirt speakers who attempted to attribute widespread immorality to Jews were so heckled by Jews and Gentiles that the meeting broke up in disorder. The Greyshirt leaders, afraid to appear on the street, sneaked out via the back door.

The Port Elizabeth trial, which exhibited the cowardice and the stupidity of Greyshirt theories, has also had an adverse effect on their propaganda.

Mayor Gradner of Cape Town loses no opportunity to denounce the Greyshirts for their attempts to stir up racial hatred by villifying the Jews, declaring that Jews are entitled to all rights enjoyed by other citizens.

The South African Labor party also devoted part of its recent annual meeting to a denunciation of Fascism, particularly the Greyshirt version, and called for severe measures against them.

Mr. Beamish, Catholic of Irish descent, opened his address with a demand for action and organization. "This organization of ours, properly financed and organized throughout the civilized nations, has the power to destroy Hitlerism within a year, perhaps even within six months," he said.

"I want to see sales stopped of all German goods in all department stores; I want to see German ships without passengers; I want to see German representatives in this free country ringed around with icy silence," he shouted.

Would Spread Boycott
"Every embassy and consulate and steamship line and importing house that handles German goods would be quarantined as though afflicted with smallpox. I would carry the boycott into nations like Argentina, Brazil and Chile, that have not yet been reached by us," he said.

"In contemplating the fate of women in Germany, Mrs. Harris pointed out, 'we must regard their cruel treatment as a danger signal to women all over the world. What has happened to women under the Nazi regime may happen to women in America and other countries, if we do not use our rights to preserve our rights.'"

head of Alabama, who have been assisted in their efforts by several other Southern Senators.

Untermeyer wrote Secretary Hull last night that were the transaction to be "an outright sale, for cash or credit, to a responsible purchaser who keeps its bargains, its desirability would be beyond question."

Since this is not the situation, the boycott leader added, the damage the deal would do to American manufacturers would more than offset the benefits gained by the cotton producers.

Late last month reason for hope that the United States would not go through with the deal was pointed out in usually well-informed circles after the State Department, through Ambassador William E. Dodd, had told the Berlin government in strong language that it was discriminating against

American bondholders as compared with citizens of other countries.

However, it was recalled today that in September the Secretary of State made what was obviously intended as an assault on the anti-Nazi boycott when at a press conference he said he deemed boycotts exceedingly unwise.

For appearance's sake transfer of dollars and marks will be gone through, with the Export-Import Bank used for the purpose. No denial is made by anybody, however, that the trade will be by barter.

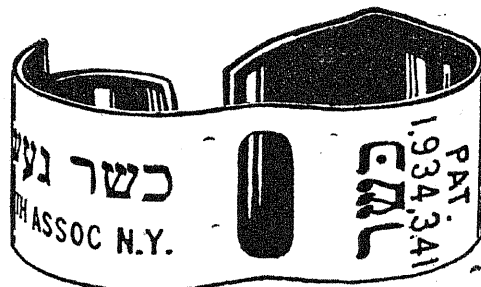

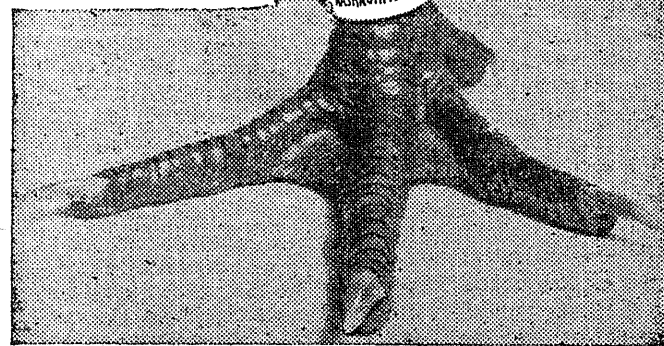

Rabbinic Decree Against Poultry Not Bearing Authorized Token

The Orthodox Rabbinate of the City of New York, at a solemn assembly held on Monday, November 5, 1934, promulgated an Issur (religious prohibition) against unidentified poultry. The Rabbinic decree reads as follows:

"THEREFORE we earnestly exhort all co-religionists in the City of Greater New York to purchase only such poultry as has been killed at a slaughterhouse which is under effective Rabbinical supervision of the Kashruth Association, and which bears an authorized token of Kashruth; and in accordance with the authority specifically vested in us by the Torah, for safeguarding the observance of its Dietary Laws, we herewith do solemnly declare, pronounce, issue and publish an Issur

(religious prohibition), to go into effect forthwith—on poultry not slaughtered in accordance with the above regulations or not bearing an authorized token, declaring that such poultry is forbidden to be consumed by Jews.

"Utensils in which birds not killed in accordance with these regulations have been cooked may not be further used without previous inquiry of a Rabbi, who shall determine whether they may be used again."

Boycott Leader Assails Barter

Untermeyer Speaks at Welcome to London Parley Delegates

A stinging attack on the League of Nations and the proposed cotton barter with Germany was made by Samuel Untermeyer to the evident delight of more than 1,500 supporters of the Anti-Nazi League who crowded the Hotel Edison Wednesday night to greet the world boycott leader and his associate American delegates to the International Boycott Conference in London.

Throughout his address Mr. Untermeyer emphasized the fact that the boycott is not entirely Jewish. He cited organized labor, the Catholic and Protestant Churches, the women of the world, the Masonic orders and the Jews as the bulwarks of the boycott.

Athletes Won't Compete
No Jewish athletes, he predicted, will compete in the Olympic Games at Berlin in 1936. "I do not believe that any lover of true sport or fair play will lend encouragement to this gangster government by participating in the games," he said.

"I have numerous letters from non-Jews, champions and world renowned sportsmen, assuring me that they will not have anything to do with these games if held in Berlin—if the Hitler regime is still in existence," the boycott leader declared.

Battle Is Chairman
George Gordon Battle, chairman, greeted the delegates. He paid special tribute to the activities of Mr. Untermeyer. Other speakers included Richard J. Beamish, former secretary of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and Mrs. Mark Harris, both delegates;

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Washington Yields

Everything points to the fact that within a few days the American government will, after long deliberations, enter its first barter agreement with Nazi Germany.

The Jews of the United States are the last persons in the world to hamper American export. They will, however, greet with mixed feelings this new pact, since it implies that Washington is, after all, giving in to Nazi Germany.

It was only two weeks ago that the State Department sent a strongly worded protest to Berlin against the specific discriminations practiced by the Nazi government with regard to American investors. We have not heard so far that the Nazi government has taken the American protest seriously. What we do however hear is that a thirty million dollar cotton barter deal with Germany is nearing its completion and is being financed by the Export-Import Bank.

This is very regrettable. Regrettable because it will be interpreted to mean that the American government is beginning to give way to the Germany of Hitler. Once the first concession is made, one can never tell when other concessions will follow and what their nature may be.

The half million bales of cotton which the United States will export to Germany under the barter agreement may be of assistance to certain groups in America. The fact, however, that the millions of organized labor in America, supported by millions of Jews and Catholics, are refraining from buying German goods in the United States, should also have been taken into consideration by the American officials during the negotiations on the deal.

The deal with the Nazis, if officially approved by the United States government, will not receive the moral support of those millions of American citizens who should like to see Germany treating its Jewish and Catholic population more fairly. It is not for nothing that the German Embassy in Washington insists that the transaction should be carried out quietly. The average American citizen is certainly not for any such transactions with countries where there is no freedom and liberty.

ROME.

After the "March on Rome," the Fascist movement placed the Jew of Italy in a peculiar position. At that time, the main attack of Fascism was not directed so much against Socialism and Communism, which had already been defeated in the fight against the "Fascist cadres," but against the whole tradition of the liberal regime, which had ruled over the Peninsula since the foundation of the united Italian state—since 1870. The Jews, however, had gained their emancipation in this tradition and their full equality as citizens.

During the half century of the liberal regime, Jews had attained the highest official positions, and had been able to develop these activities unimpeded in all fields of cultural, social and economic life. Sydney Sonnino and Luigi Luzzatti, two Italian Prime Ministers of Jewish descent, were examples of the full political equality the Jews enjoyed.

The open war which Mussolini had declared on liberalism, obviously caused uncertainty amongst the Jews over their future status in the state. Now, after twelve years of Fascism in Italy, it must be stated that the change of regime has not narrowed down the position of Italian Jewry. From the first moment on Il Duce held the correct judgment regarding the social and economic value of the Jews and appreciated their honest exemplary patriotism. And he took pains to enlist them in positive work for the state.

Italian Fascism Foe of Anti-Semitism

Although Fascism brought about a spirit of extreme nationalism, it was a nationalistic spirit unmarred by anti-Semitism. Mussolini's government did not let itself be seduced into wandering onto the wrong path of anti-Jewish policy, to which several Fascist writers tried to lead it. These guides did not find an echo of response among the masses of the Italian people.

The best proof of the nature of the relations between leading circles, especially Il Duce, himself, and Italian Jewry, is the new law about the Jewish communities. In the first place, its principal purpose is the estab-

lishment of an autonomous body, the "Union of Jewish Communities in Italy."

The special tasks of this new representative body of Italian Jewry include the maintenance of relations with Jews every where, and particularly with those communities which, by tradition, are concerned with Italian Jewry. Besides this, there are also many problems regarding organization and religious education. The communities mentioned consist of those situated along the coast of the Mediterranean, in the Balkans, Syria, Egypt, Greece, Palestine—in all those countries, where Italy seeks to extend its political and economic influence.

The Italian government supports the rabbinical seminary at

Rodi, and maintains a benevolent policy towards the Jewish population of the Aegean islands. The new Union of Jewish Communities has been entrusted with fortifying the tradition which links the Jewries of these countries with Livorno, Florence, Ancona and Rome.

Italian Fascism Clashes With Nazism

The discord in the relations between Fascism and National-Socialism, which has even taken the form of a strong enmity, has also been a good omen for Italian Jewry. The critical position taken by the press and the Italian public toward Nazi "race theory" was underlined, with full force, by the highest government circles. It is only

A Roll Call for U. S. Jews

The Zionist Organization of America has started a roll-call movement to enroll no less than 250,000 Jews in the United States as members for the purpose of having a stronger backing in the Zionist grievances against Great Britain.

Very few Jews in the United States are aware of the fact that the American government, though not represented in the League of Nations, is nevertheless a party to the Palestine Mandate by a special treaty. The United States can always have a say in matters concerning the status of Palestine. Though not through the League of Nations, the American Government is in a position to use pressure in the ordinary diplomatic way whenever changes in Palestine are about to take place.

This position of the American government can be utilized greatly in behalf of Jewish interests in Palestine if properly influenced by American Jewry. The larger the number of American Jews backing Jewish interests in Palestine, the greater the pro-Jewish attitude of the American government could be.

American Influence on England

Practice has shown that whenever American Jewry is successful in influencing the State Department to intervene for Jewish interests in Palestine, such intervention is always taken very seriously by the British government. This was the case during the Palestine riots in 1929. This was also the case when Lord Passfield, as Colonial Minister, issued his famous letter which aroused the indignation of Jews all over the world.

The Zionist Organization of America now counts about 20,000 members. This is not sufficient if one considers that there are over 4,000,000 Jews in the United States. Different would be the situation if the present roll-call campaign of the Zionist Organization would raise this membership to 250,000. A quarter of a million Jewish voices in the United States is something to which the American Government will always listen.

The Anglo-Jewish Friction

The relations between the British government and the Zionists today, although very smooth on the surface, still leave much to be desired. Despite the millions of dollars which the Jews are bringing into Palestine, the British government is still determined to keep the doors of the country shut to Jewish immigration and to hamper the development of Jewish initiative in Palestine.

Nobody can tell to what results the Jewish grievances against Britain may lead. The mobilization of Jewish forces is therefore something in which every Jew must be interested.

One need not necessarily be a Zionist to feel that Jewish interests in Palestine must be properly protected. One need not be a Zionist to answer the roll call. Every Jew, whether Zionist or non-Zionist, must recognize it as his duty to lend a hand in the efforts which the Zionists are making for Jewish development in Palestine. The thousands of non-Zionists who have recently found refuge in Palestine best substantiate this viewpoint. The roll-call of the Zionist Organization deserves the full-hearted support of every Jew in the United States.

BLACK on WHITE

Even the most constant and God-fearing of my readers, I know, will fidget a little when I talk of this matter. None of us is without guilt. I should like to spare your feelings and my own. But the thing can no longer be evaded. It cannot remain there sniveling in its subconscious lair but must be dragged into the honest daylight and faced courageously.

I refer to our common weakness for stealing or borrowing a little of this and that out of a neighbor's newspaper or book in street-cars and such places.

No use any of us protesting. You have done it yourself. You have craned your neck and shifted your person and strained your eyeballs to filch a little of someone else's reading matter. You have suddenly discovered a magnetic glamor in some news item in a stranger's hands as you peeped sidewise—maybe the very item you skipped indifferently in your own paper.

As for myself, I confess readily that what the other fellow is reading in a public place fascinates me more than anything I read myself. It has the flavor of forbidden fruit, a touch at least of the thrill of eavesdropping and key-holing.

An imperfectly deciphered headline bothers me until a fortuitous refolding of my neighbor's paper brings it more legibly into focus. If I can't find out the title of the book that young lady two seats away is reading, the subway ride is positively spoiled. When the straphanger next to me turns his page before I have quite digested some item in his paper, I feel offended enough almost to protest aloud.

One of the strangest things in a strange world, indeed, is the fact that the contents of your neighbor's newspaper are always more exciting than anything you can find in your own. This is true even if you have the same edition of the same paper in your hands.

News-peeping is too prevalent to be ignored. Since it cannot be cured, we ought at least to cease being embarrassed by it. It would be better for everyone concerned, I think, to throw off the false modesty that makes the news-peeper behave like a pickpocket. Let us divest ourselves of inhibitions in this regard. The time is ripe, my countrymen, to recognize the thing as inevitable and to accommodate ourselves to it.

News-peeping is not really so frivolous an occupation as it seems at first flush. The seasoned peeper, if he brings to the enterprise a measure of philosophy, gets more out of a neighbor's columns than ever was put into them. He observes and meditates upon a thousand and one tell-tale relationships between individuals and their literary fare.

At any rate I do. How often a book that seemed wholly impossible is instantly made credible when I realize who reads it. . . . How often the apparent stupidity of a magazine is revealed to me as truly inspired subtlety when I become aware who reads it. . . .

I contemplate the most astonishing incongruities between printed matter and its readers. I watch down-at-heel, unshaved fellows studying the financial pages. I find

No Protection For Saar Anti-Nazis

The *New Republic*, commenting upon the Franco-German agreement on the Saar, states:

The French capitulation virtually tells the voting public in the Saar district that every vote against Germany is a vote wasted. It leaves the anti-Fascist groups, which have borne the brunt of its fight, in a dangerously isolated position. There is nothing in the Franco-German agreement that gives the political opponents of the Third Reich security or protection against its vengeance, nothing to prevent a general round-up of these courageous fighters on the day after the election and their arrest in prisons and concentration camps—unless they flee from the Saar before the vote is taken.

Committee Reports On Austria, Poland

The Joint Foreign Committee in London issued a report on the Jewish situation in different countries which states inter alia:

The equal rights of Jews under the new Austrian Constitution are being interpreted in a manner which cannot but arouse apprehension. There are only two Jews in the Councils recently set up, one in the State and one in the Cultural Council. No Jews have been appointed to the Councils of Industry, Trade or Finance. The Chancellor, Dr. Schuschnigg, in a broadcast address a short time ago, drew a distinction between the rights that should be granted to those citizens who had been Austrians for generations and those who had recently been naturalized. This suggestion of different grades of citizenship has caused much perturbation among Austrian Jewry.

Reports from Poland continue to paint a gloomy picture of the increasing impoverishment of the Jewish population there, the further ejection of Jews from their economic positions and renewed activities of the anti-Semitic parties. Jewish parliamentary representation has now been

As a first step towards putting news-peeping on an intelligent and scientific basis, I propose that community leaders devise a set of rules, a kind of Etiquette of News-Peeping, with a view to eliminating the present embarrassments and obstructions.

This is not the place to elaborate such rules. Just to indicate the need, I pose a few questions that should be settled once and for all:

If your neighbor is engaged in reading a piece in your paper, should you wait until he or she is through before turning the page?

Is it permissible to wriggle in one's seat or to cause a commotion in some other manner with the object of forcing your neighbor to shift the position of a book or magazine?

Such questions cannot be answered offhand. They will have to be studied patiently. The resources of psychology, sociology and other sciences will have to be brought to bear upon them. And the tendency to news-peep must somehow be harnessed for the general good. It is too great an educational medium to be overlooked. A research movement should easily line up the financial support of Hearst, Macfadden, Landau and other great publishers.

With the small number of Jewish Deputies in the present Sejm, it will be difficult for Jewish grievances to be adequately represented in the Polish Legislature.

The Effects Here Of the Boycott

Did the anti-German boycott in America affect the import of German goods into the United States?

The *New York Times* editorially gives the following answer to this question:

The American "boycott" against German imports has been comparatively ineffective; the "new import plan" which went into effect in Germany on September 24, on the other hand, has been very effective in reducing American exports to that country. This is one of the interesting facts revealed by the October figures of our foreign trade. American exports to Germany fell from nearly \$18,000,000 worth in October of last year to only \$6,000,000 in the same month of this year, while imports from Germany fell from less than \$8,000,000 worth in October, 1933, to \$5,000,000 worth this October. The Nazis came into power in February, 1933, and the boycott, it is true, was in effect here a year ago; but the comparative figures of our exports to and imports from Germany in October of four successive years show clearly enough what has happened on both sides of the balance:

	Exports	Imports
1931	\$17,326,503	\$12,071,259
1932	15,754,264	7,151,846
1933	17,719,610	7,666,577
1934	6,274,773	5,212,938

The greatest fall in our imports from Germany occurred in 1932, before any boycott was talked of. Compared with October of that year our exports to Germany have dropped 60 per cent, while our imports from that country have declined only 27 per cent, and even part of this decline may be attributable to the Nazis' own policies in restricting imports.

NEW YORK. — The Steuben Society German Day celebration at Madison Square Garden turned out to be a glorification of Hitler while representatives of German Jewish societies were forcibly expelled from the meeting.

LAUSANNE. — Speaking before the autonomous governing body created by the League to deal with the problem of refugees from Germany, Dr. Chaim Weizmann urged settlement in Palestine as the best solution for the refugees.

Suspicious Zeal In Jerusalem

The *Palestine Post*, speaking of the unusual zeal exhibited by the Jerusalem municipality in collecting taxes from Jews, states editorially:

In the game of politics it is perhaps permissible to rush through measures of particular concern on the eve of the loss of power to legislate or administer further. The dying municipality of Jerusalem proposes evidently to exploit to the maximum the few days left of its lustreless career. It has shown unusual zeal in the collection of the house tax from ratepayers who have been coolly informed that the tax has been increased to correspond to the Urban Property assessment, which, determined anew only last year, bore particularly harsh on Jewish property owners.

Previously permitted to pay this tax in quarterly instalments, householders are now told that only half-yearly payments can be accepted. This excessive zeal to increase the financial resources of the Council, of which the chief burden is naturally borne by Jewish ratepayers is, to say the least, suspicious. The responsibility for the administration of the city is about to pass into new hands, more fully representative of all inhabitants, and a responsible Council might have left the uncollected taxation to be dealt with by the people who will have to disburse it.

necessary to draw attention to the words of Mussolini, when, speaking to a huge audience at Bari, he declared that Italy, from the height of a 3,000-year-old history, "could look down with deep pity only, at theories propounded by descendants of those people which did not even know the art of writing, when we already had our Caesar and our Virgil."

It was, therefore, no accident that on the same day, Il Duce opened the Palestine Pavilion at the Levantine Fair at Bari, where he strongly praised the work of Jewish colonization in Palestine and also spoke of the expectation of development of economic and cultural relations with the new Palestine.

Premier Mussolini's outspoken condemnation of the Nazi persecution has attracted much attention and aroused the fury of the Nazi press on more than one occasion.

Recently the Italian radio system broadcast a declaration, attributed to Mussolini himself, which lauded the Jews of Italy

and contrasted their treatment south of the Alps with the persecution by the Nazis.

"The Jews of Italy," the statement declared, "enjoy equal rights with all other citizens. Italy has never known anti-Semitism and there is no prejudice against the Jews in our country. On the contrary, the Jews have proved themselves loyal and devoted citizens, and in the war they fought bravely and honorably at the side of their Italian comrades."

"They are therefore appointed like all other citizens to the highest positions in the state and the army. The highest posts in Italy are open to Jews. The Jews of Italy are patriotic and are loyal adherents of the state, which knows no race theory."

"In Germany, however, the Jewish minority has always been made responsible for every misfortune and used as a scapegoat. For this purpose a 'race theory' has been evolved according to which the 'Aryans' stand above the Jews, although Gobineau, on whom the race fanatics base themselves, established that the Jews are the purest race."

"The head of our government, Premier Mussolini, has repeatedly drawn attention to the grave injustice being committed against the Jews in Germany," the statement concluded.

On another occasion, Il Duce turned to a Rumanian Fascist delegation, paying him a visit, and vigorously condemned Rumanian anti-Semitism, declaring that it was "absurd to link Fascism and anti-Semitism."

After twelve years of the Fascist regime, the Jews of Italy can state that the emancipation and the equality of rights which Italian liberalism had given them have in no way been impaired by the government of Premier Mussolini. In the country of Mazzini and Garibaldi, the theories of Nazi Germany cannot be practiced. They are met only with "pity and contempt."

no substitutions for them would be made.

Surrogate Delehanty expressed disagreement with this latter view and ruled that "the gift is not valid because made to trustees in a foreign country."

The surrogate's decision continued: "If there were inability of trustees to act, the trust would nevertheless be subject to administration. If counsel are unable to agree on the fact respecting existence or non-existence of the officers in the city of Mannheim, answering the description in the will, or upon their powers, the court on application of counsel will fix a date for hearing and will take proof thereon."

In the memorandum submitted for Robert Levy, it was charged that the bequest is invalid because of "anti-Semitism and anti-Catholic feeling of the Hitler or Nazi government which controls Germany today."

Levy asked that the court take judicial account of the "plight of Jews and Catholics" in Germany in that they are being "persecuted by the so-called Nazis."

The charges contained in the Levy memorandum were emphatically denied in an answer submitted in behalf of the German officials by the law firm of Donovan, Leisure, Newton and Lumbard, 90 Broad street.

"No doctrine of Nordic or 'Aryan' supremacy," the attorneys declared, "has been officially adopted by the German government. No poor relief has been denied any one in Germany on account of religion or race."

The bequest by Dreyfuss was made in memory of his parents, Daniel and Wilhelmina Dreyfuss, with the provision that it was to be distributed by the Mannheim officials "among such benevolent and philanthropic or educational corporations or associations of a charitable nature in the city of Mannheim as they may determine."

Medical Students In Plea for Bodies

Need Jewish Corpses to Enter Anatomy Courses in Polish College

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
LWOW, Poland, Dec. 6.—Jewish medical students demonstrated today in front of the Jewish community offices demanding that the community furnish Jewish bodies for dissection purposes, since they were refused admission to the anatomy courses until they had Jewish bodies to dissect.

In Polish universities, Jewish students are not permitted to dissect bodies of Christians. The Jewish law forbids dissection.

A similar protest by Jewish students of the University of Warsaw, which was made yesterday, resulted in a decision to supply the bodies of Jewish indigent dead who die in hospitals and are without kin to Jewish medical students.

Dr. Flexner Praises Montefiore Hospital

Montefiore Hospital is an "outstanding example in a long succession of notable scientific and cultural institutions built through individual generosity and effort," Dr. Abraham Flexner, director of the Institute for Advanced Study, declared last night at a dinner in the Waldorf-Astoria, which climaxed the celebration of the fiftieth anniversary of the founding of the hospital. More than 1,000 persons were present.

Prof. Albert Einstein was guest of honor.

Club Leaders Hear Janowsky Lecture

Course in Training Opened at 92nd St. Y. M. H. A.; Lasts 15 Weeks

Dr. Oscar I. Janowsky last night opened a training course in club leadership at the Ninety-second Street Y.M.H.A. His audience heard an address on "The International Jewish Scene."

The course is being offered for the purpose of recruiting and training leaders in group work. Two sessions will be held each Thursday evening for fifteen weeks. It is sponsored by the Metropolitan League of Jewish Community Associations.

Among those slated to lecture are Herman Bernstein, journalist and former United States Minister to Albania; Prof. Charles Cranford of the physical education department, New York University; Prof. Arthur L. Swift of Union Theological Seminary, and Dr. Charles S. Bernheimer, director of studies of the Jewish Welfare Board.

Boycott Parley, British Caution To Hitler, Stressed in Letters

Podway's Winning Letter (Non-Student Division)

For eighteen months a nation that laid claim to the "Kultur" of the world suddenly became a seething mass of unbalanced hatred, primarily using the Jew as a pawn in an anti-Semitic attack, the likes of which we have not seen during this modern era.

During this period, here and there, there arose a spasmodic protest by individual groups or organizations. However, this nation, our own United States, the crucible of all races and religions, founded upon the doctrine of liberty, has stood by and uttered not one word in protest to the German government in regard to the treatment accorded their Jewish citizenry.

It is, therefore, a revelation to note that England has openly denounced the Hitler government, when on November 29 three of its finest diplomats during the debate in Parliament, namely, Sir John Simon, Stanley Baldwin and David Lloyd George, openly threw down the gauntlet to the German government and told them that Great Britain is closely watching the discrimination of the Nazi against the Jews.

This to my mind is the outstanding piece of news, not only of the week but during the past eighteen months. Why was not the United States the first one to protest? Surely it had a wonderful precedent. As far back as July 14, 1903, I am mindful of the protest to the Russian government by President Theodore Roosevelt during the Kishineff massacres.

Even though our present government has not seen fit to act

thus far, let us hope that they will follow the shining example of England and add their dissatisfaction to the "Kultur" of Germany as it exists under the Hitler regime.

Anne Silverman's Letter (Collegiate Division)

The establishment of the world non-sectarian anti-Nazi Council to Champion Human Rights plus the fact that this recently organized body is determined to combat the principles, policies, and program of Hitlerism until that vicious uncivilized state that exists today in Germany, and which has rooted elsewhere, is completely eradicated is absolutely the biggest Jewish news of the week.

The pledging of Jew and gentile to fight their common enemy, should provide necessary strength and influence to launch a great offensive in the war against Hitler.

If this campaign should succeed, the enemies of Jews and the foes of the oppressed throughout the world will be dealt their death blow. Hitler would be seen in the true light of a fanatical religious despot. His cohorts and followers, wherever they are spreading their insidious poison, would be exterminated.

This boycott movement emphasizes the fact that this war is a battle against the ruthless treatment of Jews, Catholics, Protestants, liberals, and women. Gathering together the oppressed, where Jew and gentile fight side by side, reveals its essential non-sectarian characteristics.

But Greenwald Is Still Seriously Ill at Hospital

Aaron Greenwald, reserve City College back, was still in a critical condition late yesterday at Morrisania Hospital, where he has been since November 10, when he was injured in the C. C. N. Y. N. Y. His condition steadily grew more serious. On Monday several members of the City College football team were called in and gave their injured team-mate blood for transfusions. He is now in an oxygen tent.

Local Organizations to Celebrate Election in Soviet Area

The opening of the first congress of Soviets in Biro-Bidjan, autonomous Jewish district created by the Russian government, will be hailed Tuesday night at a mass meeting and concert at St. Nicholas Palace, Sixty-sixth street near Broadway, under the auspices of ICOR, the association for Jewish colonization in the Soviet Union.

At the Biro-Bidjan congress the first government of the district will be elected, ICOR announced yesterday. Jewish organizations here will gather at St. Nicholas Palace in a demonstration of their approval of the policy of Moscow in making the settlement of Jews in Biro-Bidjan a reality.

A list of notables will participate, including Yoichi Hiraoka, Japanese xylophonist; Victor Chenkin, renowned vocalist; and Peretz Hirshbein, Professor Alfons Goldschmidt, Reuben Brainin, Rabbi Benjamin Goldstein, Anna Cohen, Louis Tyman, J. Opatashu and M. Olgin.

Many Cities Join Fete
Artef, the Jewish Workers Theatre and the Freiheit Chorus are also on the program. The former group will present "Shetl Tantz" and mass recitations, while the singers will render workers', Russian and Biro-Bidjan airs.

"The great day of December 11 will be celebrated throughout the world," ICOR announced, adding that 5,000 are expected to turn out for the local celebration alone.

Philadelphia, Chicago, Detroit, Cleveland, Pittsburgh, Buffalo, Milwaukee, Minneapolis, Grand Rapids, Mich., and Rock Island, Ill., have already scheduled observances of the event, but these will not occur Tuesday. Pittsburgh starts today and, according to information available yesterday, Chicago will bring up the rear, with the celebration in that city not due until December 23. Events will be held in the Soviet Union, as here, Tuesday.

Besides the Biro-Bidjan local representatives who will attend the congress, delegates from all the republics comprising the Soviet Union as well as representatives of Jewish organizations from many countries will take part. After the congress the Jewish people will participate in the Russian government as a separate national entity.

effective was seen in the House of Commons when that parliament sent Hitler a warning against his present and future campaigns. This boycott, of which Samuel Untermyer is the backbone, will also reveal to the world that there are weapons more powerful than guns and bullets. It will show that the down-trodden, the oppressed, and the suffering are still in possession of the most salient factor in modern civilization. Their united front aims at the lifeblood of modern nations—trade—and armed with a righteous cause they must succeed.

Sander's Winning Bid

It was a barbarous Nazi regime that one year ago forced the Jews of the world to take up arms, and organize a boycott to fight for the restoration of privileges of their unfortunate brethren in Germany.

It was also a result of general religious agitation that Catholics and Protestants likewise instituted a boycott of all German goods.

One year has passed and Hitler has found that the destructive work of the boycott has brought

Germany to the brink of financial bankruptcy and almost disaster.

In spite of the unfavorable balance of trade, he and his cabinet have managed to keep their regime from toppling off the precipice.

When the various non-sectarian anti-Nazi organizations from the world over gathered in London last week, the delegate knew only too well that only by doubling and redoubling the pressure of the boycott could they ever hope to achieve complete isolation of Germany. Therefore the conference is relying on two very important factors, which, it hopes will be the straw that will break the camel's back.

First, they realized that without the combined forces of all the religious denominations, fighting side by side, they could never accomplish and maintain a stronghold on German trade.

Secondly, knowing that in addition, international unity must be achieved to bring about complete isolation, the delegates agreed to wage the boycott as a single body, thrusting their entire energies and resources together.

Polish Business Backs Anti-Semitic Publication

WARSAW, Dec. 6.—The most important commercial firms in Poland are placing large advertisements with the new anti-Semitic paper, *Podaj Dale*, which is dedicated to campaign for an anti-Jewish boycott, it became known today.

Insane Enjoy Holiday Fest

Chanukah Party Staged at Ward's Island Hospital

The Friends of the Mentally Afflicted played host to 700 mentally diseased at the Chanukah celebration Wednesday night in the auditorium of the Manhattan State Hospital for the Insane on Ward's Island in the East River.

On the ferry which bore reporters to the Island, Oscar Maxwell, president of the Friends of the Mentally Afflicted, explained the purpose of the organization.

"When someone gets cancer or

diphtheria," he said, "his family isn't ashamed. He's sick, that's all. But when he is sick in the mind, they ship him to the Island and never visit him. They are ashamed. When the patient needs sympathy most, his family doesn't come to visit him.

"So we give the patients the sympathy their families withhold. We give them Seders on Passover sure, the Christmas too. We give them the Chanukah entertainment. You should see how happy they are. It's worth a million dollars just to see the gratitude they show when somebody is kind to them."

15 in the Group

The group is made up of fifteen Jewish men and women who bring the patients newspapers, gifts and entertainment on Jewish holidays, with the cooperation of city authorities.

In the auditorium the 700 patients listened to a phonograph playing songs by Yusselle Rosenblatt. They applauded on the slightest pretext.

Mr. Schechter, the secretary, spoke. When he mentioned Hitler, the audience jeered. He apologized for the absence of Rabbi Martin, the chaplain, who is in California recovering from an illness.

'Scapegoat' Role Scored by Rabbi

NEW BRITAIN, Conn., Dec. 6.—A warning against using the Jews as a scapegoat for unfavorable economic conditions was delivered here yesterday by Rabbi Louis I. Newman, who spoke before the Men's Club of Congregation B'nai Israel. Rabbi Newman denied that a majority of American Jews were Communists, pointing out that Jewish political opinion ranged from extremely conservative to extremely radical.

Polish Papers Hail Purchase of Huleh

WARSAW, Dec. 6.—Polish Yiddish newspapers were openly jubilant over the transfer of the Huleh area in Palestine for Jewish colonization. They declared the purchase would end the disproportion between the number of Jews in the towns and on the land, promote cooperation between Arabs and Jews, and increase the absorptive capacity of the country.
