This proposal of the Government Party, which is tantamount to the disfranchising of the milto the distranchising of the mil-lions of Jewish voters in Poland, will be carefully examined by the Constitutional Committee and will probably be adopted, since it comes directly from those circles directly linked with the present Polish government

The proposal, if adopted, will for the first time in history deprive the three million Jews in Poland of actual participation in the Polish Sejm, where they could voice their grievances from time to time at the parliamentary ses-sions. It will thus be a great blow to Jewish rights, especially since the Jews constitute ten per cent the Jews constitute ter of the total population.

LONDON, Dec. 12.—The British

Heroism in C.C.C. Blaze in Tennessee Proves Fatal to Youth

Morris Klein of 651 Fox street, the
Bronx, New York City, lay in a
hospital here today suffering from hospital here today suffering from severe burns, unaware that his younger brother, Jacob, had died in an effort to save him from a Civilian Conservation Corps bar-racks fire early this morning in which two others were killed.

Morris told hospital attendants he believed Jacob also had escaped.

Other members of the camp revesled that Iscob who was twenty years old, had died a hero. Af-ter he had fought his way clear of the flames, he was unable to find Morris and returned to the flaming barracks, where fellow members of the camp last saw him fighting the blaze with a fire extinguisher, calling for his brother.

90% to Back Move in Albany Against 'Ouotas'

Ninety per cent of the members of the State Legislature from Brooklyn have pledged their sup-port to legislation which would deprive colleges exercising "quota systems" in their registration from njoying the benefits of tax exemption, according to Samuel S. Leib-

owitz, president of the Brooklyn Jewish Democracy, Inc. At the same time, Leibowitz announced that the organization, at a meeting Tuesday night, had adopted a resolution calling upon the legislative body to amend the tax law so as to take away from non-sectarian educational institutions the privileges of tax exemp-tion if they restrict registration, according to race, color or creed.

Text of Resolution The resolution follows:

Resolved that the tax law of the State of New York be amended as follows: 'That no educational institution that holds itself out to the public to be non-sectarian shall be entitled to the privilege of tax exemption on its real and personal property if it bars any applicant for admission to such institutions by reason of the said applicant's race, color or creed.'

Civic Liberties Council to Resist Assaults on Jews

LONDON.—The National Coun-cil for Civic Liberties, a non-partisan body fighting encroachments on civil rights, has announced that it will fight attempts made to foment racial prejudice for political ends. The Council stated that it will resist the sinister attack on the civil rights of "our Jewish fellow citizens." References have been made at

public meetings, a resolution adapted by the society states, to "the sweepings of the foreign ghettos." It has also been stated that "the organized power of Jew-ry in the racial quarrel had consistently striven for the last eighteen months in favor of war. Directly and indirectly, they had striven in favor of the feelings and passions for war with the nation which we made peace with in 1918." The resolution states that it is

clearly false to suggest that either Gentile or Jewish protest against Hitler excesses were inspired by militarist motives or international hatred.

"Tresponsible utterances," the resolution declares, "such as are being made that suggest the organization of anti-racial feeling might well result in persecution, particularly in time of panic or emergency."

Many Readers Calls Shylock Only Real

'Red' Daily Complains of Alarming Drop in Circulation

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
MOSCOW.— The circulation of
the Jewish Communist press is

constantly decreasing among the Yiddish speaking workers in factories and works, the Kharkov Yiddish daily Stern complains.

Berditchev, which a couple of years ago had a large number of subscribers to the Stern, has only subscripers to the Stern, has only 118 now. Mostly they are mem-bers of the artisan cooperatives and very few of them workers.

and very few of them workers.

At Dniepropetrovsk (Eketeranoslav) the industrial center with thousands of Jewish workers in the metal works and in other the metal works and in other works, the Stern has no more than 331 subscribers. The total number of subscribers to any of the Yiddish papers in towns like Zaporke, Herson, Nikolao, Zinovievsk, Stalino, Poltava, etc., is ridiculously small. Nikolae, for exculously small. Nikolae, for ex-ample, has thirty-seven, and Zino-viesk eleven. The same decline is observed also in small towns. "The belief that most of Jew-

"The belief that most of Jew-lah readers are not interested in Yiddish must be emphatically re-reduct," the paper said, "The blame lies with the local party and trade union organizations. We have found in practice that where there is a big political enlightenment movement there is a demand for the Yiddish press and the Yiddish book. For instance, the town Shpole is no bigger than the town Vasilkov and yet there are fifty-four subscribers to the Stern in Shpole and only four in Vasilkov. Zvenigrodko has sixty-two sub-scribers and Korostishev nineteen Scribers and Korostishev nineteen.
Horodnice, Kanive and several
other towns have one subscriber
each, while Bar, which is no bigger, has 112."

The paper concluded by demand-ing that the local party workers see to it that another 1,000 readers are obtained for the Stern in time for the tenth anniversary for the paper, which occurs shortly.

Family Security Linked to Progress

Must Re-establish Home as Center of Society, Says Mrs. Schonberg

The home must be re-established as the cultural center of society before the American nation can before the American nation can again tread the road of progress, Mrs. Mary G. Schonberg, execu-tive secretary of the National Council of Jewish Women, declared last night in a talk broadcast over Station WMCA by the Federal Housing Administration.



Poland's Constitution

A brief paragraph in today's cables from Warsaw states that the Constitutional Committee of the Polish parliament has begun the examination of the draft of a new constitution for Poland

This deserves the utmost attention of our Jewish Readers. It deserves the continued vigilance of those who are interested in protecting rights of the national minorities in Poland.

It was to the present Polish constitution that Colonel Beck. Polish Minister of Foreign Affairs, referred in Geneva a few months ago when he re-nounced Poland's national minority obligations under the League of Nations. The Polish minister then stated that Polish constitution sufficiently guarantees the rights of the national minorities in Poland and that no other obligations are therefore neces-

Now the Polish constitution is going to be revised. Will this new constitution contain the same paragraphs guaranteeing national minority rights for the Jews and other national minorities in Poland, or, will these paragraphs also be modified?

We hear that the Government Party is now definitely determined to see to it that no Jewish deputy should be elected to the next Polish parlia-This would amount to practically disfranchisement of the entire Jewish population. This would also mean that the Jewish voice in Poland would he cilenced

It will be a calamity for the Jews of Poland if the new constitution does not contain at least the same provisions for national minority rights which the present constitution contains and to which Colonel Beck referred before the League of Nations.

With national minority obligations under the League of Nations being renounced and with the Jews being deprived representation in the next Polish parliament, something must be done to make sure that the changes which the Polish constitution is now about to undergo will not affect the Jews as a national minor-The duty of our central Jewish organizations is to look into this matter-the earlier the hefter

DANZIG UNDER FORSTER

By ROBERT MILLER

The Danzig of today is very much unlike that of last year, much unlike that of last year, recent visitors to the Free City on the Baltic report. A complete change in the tenor of life in Danzig has been wrought dur-ing the year and a half of Nazi supremacy in Germany as re-flected in the administration of the old Hansa city, which is still nominally under the League of Nations.

While Albert Forster head of the Nazi party in Danzig, and a largely Nazified senate presided over by Herman Rauschnigg and Arthur Greiser have not succeeded in introducing the actual terrorisms of the Nazi regime in Germany, the Nazis have virtual control of the city for over a

A year ago every person in Danzig wore the swastika symbol of the Nazi party and swastika banners were to be se every window. Blackshirted and brownshirted Nazis thronged the streets and looked with hauteur upon inhabitants in ordinary garb.

City's Decline Under Nazis

Today most of this is gone Nazi flags and banners are no longer in such great evidence, longer in such great evidence, except at Nazi headquarters Fewer persons—one in every fifteen or twenty—wear the swastiká. Not so many store-keepers greet their customers headquarters with "Heil Hitler!" as they for-merly did, and there are fewer storm troopers in the streets

So that externally the Nazi influence might seem to have diminished. But as a matter of fact a heavy brownness hangs over the city and over Zopport, the nearby health and gambling resort. The leading restaurants are closed and the cafes are deserted except for scattering dull

Danzig residents in search of amusement go to Gydia, and the once gay and charming Danzig and Zopport are sombre and reminiscent for all the world of "Bruges la mort," where beau-tiful buildings and stagnant canals are all that remain of the once teeming commercial city.

Economic Crisis,

Unemployment Grow Conversation with the inhabitants of Danzig reveals that the Hitler regime has not found great favor there and that the former enthusiasm for Hitlerism wore off quickly when it failed to bring the promised plenty. Despite the thirty million marks spent for public works in Dan-zig by the Germans, who boast-ed that they had reduced the number of the unemployed from forty thousand to less than twenty thousand, the economic crisis in the city is greater than ever. Germany has stopped sending money and unemploy-ment is on the increase.

Except for a few days following the first and the fifteenth of the month, when salaries are generally paid, there is practi-cally no trade, merchants re-port. Factories are on reduced schedules.

The general state of dissatis-faction with the Nazis has led to increased activity and support of the oppositions al parti and particularly of the Social Democrats. Their courageous stand against the Nazis has won them many new adherents, and they have become the center of the opposition.

The Jewish Question In the Free City

Of course, with a League of Nations High Commissioner on the scene, the Nazi government of the Free City cannot introduce all the anti-Semitic propaduce all the anti-status programs and anti-fewish acts which have been forced upon Germany, but as a matter of fact the dominant policy is very much like that in Germany, so far as the Jews are

A short time ago all the "coordinated" Danzig newspapers printed the six commandments for Nazi party members formu-lated a while back by Rudolph Hess, "representative of the leader Adolph Hitler." Accord-ing to these principles of behavior guidance, a Nazi may not represent a Jew in court or interne for a Jew in governmental or other institutions

He must not take a Jew's money for party purposes. He must have no public dealings with Jews and he must not wear party insignia during hours that he is engaged as an employee of a Jew.

Stores Picketed, Trade Banned

Infringements of these rules are punishable, the circular says, by measures for party discipline. To enforce them Nazis picket Jewish enterprises, as in Con many. Stories of various Nazis, great and small, who have been embarrassed when they bought or attempted to buy clothes and other products in Jewish stores

are common property. Needless to say, the head of the Nazi party, Albert Forster, was behind Rauschnigg, who presided over the Senate until illness forced him out in favor of the then vice-president, Greiser, who is even more amenable to the Hitlerite dictates.

Threaten Removal Of Businesses

Some time ago a delegation of Jewish merchants and lawyers called upon Rauschnigg to complain that the Horst Wessel song plain that the morst wesser song and other Nazi airs were being freely sung in the streets of Danzig. When the delegation Danzig. When the delegation threatened that if the singing of such ballads continued the city's lumber merchants, all of whom are Jewish, would move their businesses to Gydnia, Rausch-nigg promised to introduce a law which would provide punishment for all who insulted the honor of the Jews. He also prevented the closing of a German language Jewish publication which refused to be coordinated.

Illness, apparently, prevented Rauschnigg from keeping his word with regard to the "honor-protection law."

The incident precipitated quite a conflict between him and For-ster, and this, together with Rauschnigg's illness, cleared the way for Greiser, who was elected president of the Senate within the fortnight.

Public Frowns On Boycott

When another Jewish delega-When another Jewish delega-tion inquired of Greiser' as to the fate of the "honor-protec-tion law," they were told it was unnecessary, for anti-Semitic songs could kill no one. And songs could kill no one. And besides, the Jews weren't being h aten in the streets of Danzie

The delegation repeated the threat that the lumber merchants would withdraw to Gvdnia. Greiser's answer, the story goes, was:
"I must tell Forster about

Desnite this official or semi-

official — attitude, the general public still shows no actual inclination to carry out a boycott of Jewish enterprises, and even prominent Nazi frequently choose to buy at Jewish stores.

Good News

The news that the Soviet government has agreed to permit the entrance of the first fifteen hundred Jews from Poland to Biro-Bidjan will no doubt be received with great interest, not only in Poland, but also in the United States.

The Jews of the United States are interested in aiding Polish Jewry in its desperate plight. The Jews of the United States no less than the Jews in Poland -know that Biro-Bidjan in its present state is hardly a desirable place of refuge. But Dr. Suritz, leader of the Agro-Yid, was quite right in pointing out to the Polish Ambassador in Moscow that "a million destitute Jews in Poland would now migrate anywhere." The Naked Truth

It is useless to close our eves to the fact that these million Polish Jews who have been reduced to a state of beggary and who have no hope for the future in Poland have nowhere to go at present except Biro-Bidjan. Most of them would certainly prefer not to go to this distant land. Most of them would prefer to remain in Poland. A goodly number of them would like to go to Palestine. Many would have no objection to migrating to America.

But the doors of America are. But the doors of America are, unfortunately, closed. The doors of Palestine also are not at all open. And Poland? Is the Polish government making even the slightest attempt to help the million of her unfortunate citi-

The Perspective

It is to be assumed that many of the Polish Jews coming to Biro-Bidjan will not feel happy there. A goodly number of them will, however, be satisfied, especially when they look back to the miserable conditions in which they lived in Poland.

As for those Polish Jews who will not succeed in acclimatizing themselves to Biro-Bidjan, I am certain that they will find their way to other places in Soviet Russia. Once admitted into the U. S. S. R., they will be able eventually to leave Biro-Bidjan and settle in other regions. They will sooner or later be absorbed into the 160,000,000 people in Russia and will assimilate with the Soviet Jews.

Different Treatment

The movement to settle foreign Jews in Biro-Bidjan is only at its beginning. The Soviet government is interested in showing the Jews of the world that the experiment in Biro-Bidjan is on the way to success. Soviet substitute in the superiment in Biro-Bidjan is on the way to success. Soviet authorities know that the Jews of the world will be watch-ing how the first group of Polish Jews adapt themselves to Biro-Bidjan.

It can, therefore, be expected that the Jews who migrate now from Poland to Biro-Bidjan will receive the best treatment possible and will experience less of those difficulties which the first Jewish Soviet settlers faced there. In the search for new terri-

tories for settling Jews from Poland, Germany and Austria, the Biro-Bidjan territory in the Far East cannot be overlooked. Especially for the Jews from Poland. Everybody knows that if the Soviet government would open its gates wide thousands of Polish Jews would flock to Russia, while very few Soviet Jews would go to Poland.

In general, the temptation of type under one's fingers is irresisti-ble. Even a typewriter is too much for me. Luckily is imprint is only ink and can be crossed out or destroyed. But the linotypist plays with solid, imperishable lead. The slightest whim of his imagination, the most offhand gesture of his racing fingers, is indelible. He knows well enough that the last thing a proofreader thinks of doing is to read proof, and that his own typographical fancies are therefore final. How he foregoes the pleasure of doing more jum-bling and embellishing of the dull words that come endlessly to his machine is beyond me.

So, far from being offended by So, far from being onended by the typographical disasters, I am really grateful. With some effort I was able to find a few lines that had been set exactly as written. I am not unmindful of the subtle compliment.

Reprints Article On Montefiore

The Brooklyn Jewish Center Review reprints a condensed of an article published fifty years ago in the London Times on Sir Moses Montefiore, the "campaigner for Jewish rights," the 150th an-niversary of whose birth is now being observed. Mr. I. Davis, the author of the article, relates:

Till 1828, only twelve Jews at Till 1828, only twelve Jews at a time were permitted to carry on business as brokers in the city of London. Even in 1853, when a Jew presented himself to the Benchers of Lincoln's-inn. for call to the Bar, a solemn dis-cussion was held until the young man's petition was granted. Owing to the survival of tests at Oxford and Cambridge, Jews did not take the degree there till a much later date. A year before Montefiore's birth the Irish Parliament especially excluded Jews from the benefits of the Naturalization Act, and it may be partly due to this disability that up to 1881 only 453 Jews had settled in Ireland.

First Jew on 'Change

Relating that Montefiore was one of the first twelve Jews who were permitted on the London Stock Exchange as brokers, Mr. Davis continues.
Sir Moses crossed the desert

to the city of Morocco in 1863 and obtained the Sultan's promise of protection for the Israel-He was too weak to ride, but travelled for eight days in a chaise a porteur, over burning sands, being then at the age of 79. The Moors saw with sur-prise one of the despised Hebrews arrive in an English gov-ernment vessel, and escorted to the capital by British officers. The Sultan's edict, though often

violated, has remained a pledge and point d'appui for remonstrar ce. He went to Roumania four years later, though threatened with assassination at Bucharest. In 1872, at the age of 88, Sir Moses went to Russia to pre-

sent an address to Tsar Alexander II, on the occasion of 200th anniversary of the birth of Peter the Great, and thereby won assurances for the better ment of the condition of the Russian Jews. Sir Moses' public acts and appearances in be-half of Jewish rights were infrequent after that

In no other country have the Jews succeeded in winning so little political influence as in England. The English have, to be sure, sometimes placed Jews like Disraeli and Lord Reading unreservedly gave their who threservedly gave their services to England's cause, in prominent positions. But for the most part the Jews still live and are conscious of living in a sort of invisible Ghetto,

Naturally, as almost all of them have touched Germany on their way from Poland and Rus-sia westwards, and left behind relatives and connections, they conduct anti-German propaganda in England. But their success, as compared with results in other countries is

Of all the measures adopted by the German government, the oughly approved by the English people has been the treatment of the Jewish question. Only the

ruins of Liberalism, now obsolete in England as elsewhere, and the Labor Party, slowly but surely disintegrating still afford the Jewish men of letters a field of action—a field, nevertheless, not to be under-estimated. The everincreasing number of scandals involving members of the Jewish race convinces the English people about the nature and actions of the Jews more than any pro-

paganda could do. Jewish propaganda has been successful, however, in one thing: in its assertion that National Socialism has robbed Germany of the best part of its intellectual and artistic heads, by which, of course, such people as Einstein, Theodor Wolff and their co-racials are meant. This success can be put to the acco of the German non-Jewish intelor the German non-Jewish intel-ligentsia, who were formerly only too ready to proclaim and extol the so-called "superiority" of Jewish intellectuals.

leans comments editorially upon the spread of anti-Semitic propa-ganda by the Nazis in the small Latin-American countries. The paper states among other things:

The latest nation to join the anti-Semitic family is the midget Central-American republic of Costa Rica. The presence of an anti-Jewish movement in that Latin-American State is really tragi-comical. The whole popu lation of Costa Rica is no larger than that of New Orleans, and the Jews form about one-fif-teenth of one per cent. Yet the agitation against them is so strong that they are living in constant fear. Only 350 Jews reside in all Costa Rica and their residence dates back only a few They possess neither nor influence. Ninetenths of them barely earn a living, and the other tenth does no more than earn a living, yet the "Protocols" are circulated and the press is succeeding in mak-ing the populace believe that the Jews are conspiring to dom-inate Costa Rica.

Expelled by Dutch Van Severen Is Apprehended After Meeting—17 Illegal Entrants to Go

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) AMSTERDAM.—Jos van Seve-en, leader of the Belgian Dinazos, Hitlerite party, was deported from The Netherlands after he had adpeared here suddenly and deliv-ered an anti-Semitic address at a mass meeting.

Dutch detectives trailed him after the meeting and arrested him. He was immediately taken

to the Belgian border. Seventeen Jews were arrested when detectives conducted a series of raids in the Jewish quarter in a hunt for illegal immigrants. All those arrested were found to have no passports and to have slipped the country at unguarded points along the frontier.

The entire group will be deported.

The Theatre Union is the only theatrical group in New York that devotes itself successfully and ex-clusively to the production of plays which have some revolutionary sig-nificance, and which point out some of the weaknesses in our capital-ist civilization. Its first produc-tion, "Peace on Earth," was di-rected against the greed of the munitions manufacturers and the stupidity of war. "Stevedore" was a plea for racial tolerance and de-picted the plight of the Negro in

America.

Now we have "Sallors of Cat-taro" which, by comparing the philosophy of naval officers with that of the common sailor, vividly shows the struggle of the proletarlat against their oppressors.

Revolt of Seamen Vividly Portrayed

As a basis for his play, Mr. Wolf used an actual historical incident which occurred in 1918 in the Bay of Cattaro on the Adriatic, when the sailors of one of the warships in the Austro-Hungarian navy atthe Austro-Hungarian havy ac-tempted to revolt against the war, the arrogance of their officers and the conditions under which they were forced to exist. For a time the mutiny was successful, but under the assurance that conditions would be bettered, the mutiny was broken and the leaders who had een promised immunity were exe-All this Mr. Wolf has captured within the boundaries of his two-act play, but he has done more than a mere job of propagandizing the struggle between the sailors and their officers; he shows how they might have been successful had they maintained some unity. He points out how they, after cap-turing the ship, formed a sailors' committee which spent its time arguing endlessly over meaningless things until the power of the revolt dissipated itself in inaction.

Capture of Ships
And End of Revolt
There is much action in the six
scenes which make up the play.
You are shown the sailors in their quarters, grumbling over the bad food, and how the stupidity of an root, and now the staphinty of an officer's brutality inspires the men to plan mutiny. In an exciting scene you are shown the actual capture of the ship and the attempt to get other ships in the fleet to join, but the men who refuse to accept the leader begin to quarrel among themselves and dissension soon becomes the dominating force soon becomes the dominating force.

which steams into the bay, and

guages of mankind.




