BERLIN.—Connections between Judaism and Marxism and between Judaism and Freemasonry were clearly shown in the recent London boycott conference, Der Angriff claims.

The links were revealed, the Nazi journal asseverates, in the demands drawn up by the dele-gates to that parley, which are listed as embracing the following:

"The restoration of the trade unions to their previous rights and the return of their property; "The removal of specific leg-

islation against citizens and in-habitants of Jewish faith; "The restoration of their rights;

"The restoration of the Freemason lodges to their previous positions and property." Calling the London gathering "the all-Jewish boycott congress,"

the Nazi sheet warns: "This indirect admission of the solidarity of Judaism and Marxism

must be closely observed."

Attack Untermyer

Samuel Untermyer, anti-Nazi boycott leader, is described in the boycott leader, is described in the Angriff article, which is headed "The London Comedians," as "the Jewish lawyer from the United States who is afflicted with perse-cution mania."

He is attacked for deliving "his incitement .speeches, not only against Germany, but also against all other states that have put a bar up against the Jewish loycott agitation."

Non-Jews who participated in e conference are characterized as "allies from degenerate non-Jewish quarters."
"The Jewish passion for talking

a lot and boasting a lot does have its good effects," the article concludes. "The comedians of London and their journals deserve our cordial thanks."

George Fredman, former head of the Jewish War Veterans, called several witnesses to prove that the Friends of New Germany had actively spread anti-Semitic propa-ganda and had tried to create

prejudice against the Jews. Chief of Police Jenkins of Union City testified that he had received several complaints regarding noise and disorders at meetings of the cau utsorders at meetings of the Friends and had prohibited further meetings after the Nazi riots in Irvington, N. J., in order to pre-vent similar disturbances in Union City.

At this time his manager believed that young Olin was wised up to all the tricks of the resined arena and matched him with an Irishman, Larry Hogan— a top notch light heavy. Bob kayoed the Irisher in the first round of their scheduled six round tussle.

From then on Olin, the fighter from Brooklyn, had his mind set on the championship and he came


