

# Youth Relief Budget Shows Vienna Plight

**2,500,000 Schillings Set Aside to Aid Destitute**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)  
VIENNA, Dec. 20.—(Revelatory of the present state of the once highly prosperous Jewish community of Vienna is a tentative appropriation of 2,500,000 schillings in the preliminary budget of the community organization for the coming year for social relief purposes. The relief appropriation is the largest single item in the organization's budget of 8,000,000 schillings. It has been made necessary by the growing impoverishment of the Jews in Vienna, partly by reason of general economic conditions and largely as a result of the discriminatory decrees virtually barring Jews from public office and the professions and restricting their activities in trade, commerce and the crafts.

Other items on the budget include 600,000 schillings for education. Part of this sum will be used for teaching the Hebrew language to Vienna Jewish youths, many of whom are desirous of emigrating to Palestine because of the dark outlook for the future here. Allocation of funds for teaching Hebrew here is a significant sign of the present state of the Jews of Austria.

The Vienna municipal council, sitting last night in a session to consider the present state of the 1935, heard a vigorous demand for

# Nazis Win Right To Hold Rallies In Union City

**But Must Stay Within the Law, Chancery Court Ruling States**

JERSEY CITY, N. J., Dec. 20.—A permanent injunction restraining the mayor and police of Union City, N. J., from prohibiting meetings of the Nazi friends of New Germany was granted today by Vice Chancellor James F. Fielder in Jersey City Chancery Court.

The court ruled that the city of Union City has no right to interfere with the meetings as long as they are lawful, but if the meetings are conducted in an unlawful manner then the police may prosecute under the criminal statutes.

Condemns Nazis  
-Vice Chancellor Fielder severely condemned the Nazified organization for anti-Jewish propaganda and anti-Semitic and anti-Jewish leaflets. He urged the police to watch the meetings carefully for violation of existing laws.

Friends of Union City, and John Drewen, former prosecutor of Hudson County, argued against granting an injunction. The Friends of New Germany were represented

He pointed out that while the Committee had declined to participate in conferences in connection with a world congress, it "stood ready, as always, to confer on other matters common to Jewish interest."

# Bureya Shows Lively Interest In Soviet Parley

**Planes Soar Over Town of Biro-Bidjan, Drop Leaflets**

MOSCOW, Dec. 20.—The first All-Biro-Bidjan Soviet conference, now in session in the town of Biro-Bidjan, is the greatest political event in the life of the territory. The entire town is draped with red flags and with posters relating the achievements and future plans of the Jewish autonomous area. Airplanes circling over the town dropped leaflets extolling the congress with the slogan "The Jewish Region, the Socialist Homeland, Grows and Ripens."

The second session of the conference was devoted to speeches by S. Dimanstein, who spoke on behalf of the All-Union Central Executive Committee, the highest body in the land; Khark, who represented the White Russian Republic, and F. Sprakha, who spoke for the Communist Soviet Jewish colonization organization.

All the speakers compared the present freedom and hopes of the

# Sejm Aide Pleads For Polish Jews

**Max Lieberman Is Ill in Germany**

BERLIN, Dec. 20.—Professor Max Lieberman, 57, dean of Germany's artists and one of the great impressionist painters, is seriously ill at his home. Professor Lieberman's work, banned in Nazi Germany, is now on exhibit in London. A group of notable English personalities is sponsoring the exhibit.

Gives Budget Body Figures Showing Their State

WARSAW, Dec. 20.—A desperate plea for government intervention in behalf of the destitute Jewish population of Poland was sounded here tonight at a meeting of the Parliament budget committee by Dr. F. Raustenreich, Jewish member of the Sejm.

Citing figures showing the extreme plight of the Jews of the country, the Jewish deputy visibly moved most of his hearers with his impassioned recital.

"Sixty per cent of the Jews in the small townships are in dire need of charity," the former member of the Senate told the budget committee.

One in Four Starving

"One out of every four Jews in Warsaw is starving. Fifty per cent of the Jews in the city of Lwow are in a similarly desperate position and so are thirty per cent of the number of Jews in Lodz and Bialystok."

His appeal for immediate assistance for the destitute Polish Jewry impressed all but the National Democratic (Endek) anti-government deputies. The Endeks launched a bitter attack on the speaker for giving subsidies to the free loan societies maintained by Polish Jews with funds largely subscribed by foreign Jewish relief agencies. A large part of the Polish Jewish artisan class and small merchants are dependent on these societies for funds with which to continue at their trades. The Endeks protested that the societies "strengthen the competitive ability of the Jewish merchants."

Despite the fact that the 3,500,000 Jews of Poland pay more than forty per cent of the taxes, the government assigned only 182,740 (approximately \$24,000) dollars for Jewish educational needs out of a total educational budget of 500,000,000 zlotys. Deputy M. Sommerstein complained that in the debate in the budget commission.

He blamed the government for the liquidation of the Jewish public schools in Poland and the withdrawal of rights from Yiddish, Hebrew and artisans schools.

The Jewish deputy also pointed out that university students, the medical and law schools were applying a strict numerus clausus against the Jewish students, and that the exclusion of the Jewish medical students were being aggravated by the demand that Jewish students dissect only Jewish corpses.

Jewish students recently besieged the offices of various Jewish communities demanding bodies of

# Montreal Has Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi Unit

**Rush, Farthing, Mooney Lead Movement to Spur Boycott**

MONTREAL, Que., Dec. 20.—A Canadian Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League is in the process of formation here, it was announced today. Well-known non-Jews, including Howard Rusk, Professor J. S. Farthing and George Mooney are cooperating in this foundation of the new organization.

Letters were dispatched to twelve hundred Jewish manufacturers and storekeepers in Montreal asking them to abstain from buying or selling German goods. About one-third have already pledged themselves to heed the boycott.

At the same time, a movement has been set on foot to have a law passed making it mandatory for the country of origin to be marked on all goods entering Canada. The Manufacturers Association and the Trade and Labor Congress have already endorsed the proposed law, it was reported to the Canadian Jewish Congress.
