Senate Votes New **Polish Constitution**

Charter Abolishes Dictator of Poland **Electoral System**; Blow to Jews

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
WARSAW, Jan. 22.—The Polish
Senate today adopted a new constitution which abolishes the proportional electoral system and deals a severe blow to the Jews of the country, who were represented in the lower house by six deputies. Passage of the new constitution in the Sejm is regarded as a foregone conclusion, since the government bloc has an absolute majority there.

sentatives of the German and Ukrainian minority groups in the Senate voted against the new constitution, since they also would be affected adversely.

Jewish leaders are convinced that under the new system not a single Jew will be elected to Par-liament as such.

Shrinkage of American exports to Germany is in no way trace-able to the anti-Nazi boycott, G. E. Harriman, executive secretary of the Non-sectarian Anti-Nazi League to Champion Human League to Champion Human Rights, declared yesterday in reply to a statement issued by Dr. Albert Degener, secretary of the Board of Trade for German-American Commerce, but is the direct result of "the hampering effects of (Dr. Hyllamar) Schacht's import restrictions."

Closing Session Adopts Many Resolutions on Vital Problems

TORONTO, Ont., Jan. 22.—A. J. Freiman, for many years president of the Canadian Zionist Organization, was re-elected last night at the closing session of the twentyfourth annual Zionist convention held at the Royal York Hotel

The convention adopted resoluthe convention adopted resolu-tions readifirming its conviction of the principle of organized Jewish labor for Jewish enterprise; de-termined to petition the Jewish Agency for a larger allotment of chalutzim pioneer certificates; pro tested against the Nazi regime; voted support for the Habonim organization; voted to establish ag-ricultural training centers for Canadian Jewish youth; expressed confidence in the Canadian Jewish Congress; went on record as op-posing a legislative council in Pal-estine, and commended the World Zionist Executive for bringing peace between Zionist factions.

A. M. Shinbane, Mr. Levine and H. S. Rosenberg were elected vice-presidents of the Canadian Zion-ists, while Joseph Fineberg was elected treasurer.

In answer to a question put to him before the closing of the convention, Mr. Freiman declared that Vladimir Jabotinsky, Revisionist leader, was "not a Zionist."

"I do not recognize Jabotinsky as a Zionist," Mr. Freiman said,
"since he broke the discipline of
the World Zionist Congress."

Johnson Lauds Jews in NRA in Reply to Critics

Appointments Made Regardless of Religion, General Writes

In discussing his much publi-cized quarrel with Donald Richberg in an article in this week's Saturday Evening Post, General Hugh S. Johnson, former NRA head, not only ridicules the charge that he had appointed too many Jews to office, but takes occasion to praise his Jewish subordinates in highest terms for their ability and loyalty.

After telling how Mr. Richberg was appointed and the criticism levelled at him for his choice, Gen-eral Johnson says: "It was also levelled at him for his choice, Gen-eral Johnson says: "It was also asserted that I had appointed too many Jews to important posts, and Mr. Richberg was cited against me on that score too.

"Just for the sake of record, Mr. Richberg is not a Jew. If he Mr. Hichberg is not a Jow. If he had been, it would have made no difference to me. I tried to get the best staff I could persuade to serve, and I did not stop to inquire about whether they were dure about whether they were Jews or Gentiles. I had several able Jews, but they were a very scant minority and every single one of them did an outstanding job. Not one was either disloyal or self-seeking."

Vote for Jews Is in Doubt, Frick Declares

Nazi Official Tells Hearst Man Rights Depend on the Future

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
BERLIN. — Dr. Wilhelm Frick Minister of the Interior, is reported by the Voelkischer Beobachter to have told a correspondent for the Hearst newspapers that the question of whether the Jews will be permitted freely to exercise the suffrage depends on "the further shaping of State citizen rights in the German Reich."

"The general, equal, direct and secret suffrage will continue to resecret suffrage will continue to re-main valid," Dr. Frick told the cor-respondent, according to the Voel-kischer Beobachter, "for both sexes of all German State citizens."

According to the principles for-mulated for the National Socialist party by Reichsfuehrer Hitler, only Germans may be citizens and only those are German who are of Ger-man "Aryan" blood. "The German Reich is a Na-

tional State at whose head stands the Leader and Chancellor, Adolf Hitler," Dr. Frick is reported to have said. "His appointment as Fuehrer of the Reich was confirmed by the German nation in a gen-eral and secret plebiscite on August 19, 1934, by ninety per cent of the New Constitution Withheld

The correspondent asked whether there was any intention to give Germany a new Constitution.

Dr. Frick's reply was as follows: "The Fuehrer and Reich Chan-cellor, Adolf Hitler, after he assumed power on January 30, 1933, deliberately held back from consolidating his position immediately through a ready-made Constitution

"Nor did Adolf Hitler need that, for he himself was at the head of the National Socialist revolution. This movement embraced the entire German nation, and carried through the ideas of Adolf Hitler, who is the creator of the National Socialist movement and of its pro-

"Today the government is work ing to realize the inner political principles of the National Socialist State conception, and is complet-ing along the legal road the new upbuilding of the Reich. Plan New Charter

"Thus, there is growing organ-ically with the advancing development day by day a new bit of the Constitution, and at the conclusion c? the four-year term asked for by the Leader, the work will exist complete-at least in the rough.

"The German nation will have the opportunity to express itself with regard to it."

Dr. Frick has been one of the violent anti-Semites in the Nazi movement, of which he has been a leader almost from the start, despite an order he issued a year ago which instructed the chief administrative officers of the Reich and the governors of the several states to see that German Jews lawfully engaged in business were not molested by Nazi zealots.

He first gave Germany a taste of what National Socialist rule would be like when, as Minister of Education in Thuringia, he introduced anti-Semitic prayers as part of the program in the public

Addressing a mass meeting at Chemnitz last month, Dr. Frick warned that the Hitler regime will never relent in its application of the "Aryan paragraph" to the

"Germany is for the Germans,"

he said, "and no difficulties will divert us from exerting our efforts in this direction." In September, 1933, it was Dr.

Frick who issued instructions that "non-Aryans" were all persons of Jewish descent, even though their Jewish religious community, and also even if the father or forefather was a convert to the Christian religion.

Just one year ago he urged haste in dismissing Jews employed in public positions, referring to them as "undesirable elements."

The expected happened, The Polish Senate yesterday adopttion abolishing the proportion-al electoral system, This means that henceforth Jews will have practically no chance for election to the Polish Parliament as Jewish representatives.

The Jewish population in Poland—ten per cent of the entire population - will thus have to remain mute. Having no representative in the Parliament it will no longer be in a position to voice its grievances except through the Yid-

dish press.

Little as the Jewish deputies in the Polish Parliament could influence Polish politics. their voices nevertheless were embarrassing to the government. The recent address delivered by Dr. Joshua Thon, in which he pictured Jewish privation in Poland and criticized the government for the heavy taxation system, has not yet been forgotten by many in Poland and abroad. The same is true with regard to the address delivered recently by Deputy Rotenstreich,

Now, with the voting sys-tem changed, the Polish gov-ernment will be spared any further such embarrassing ad-dresses. With no Jews in the Parliament the Jewish question can hardly come up for discussion there.

The fact that the Polish Jews will be able to voice their plight only through the Yiddish press, their remaining channel for reaching the world abroad, is of little consolation Everybody knows that the Yiddish press in Poland is thoroughly censored although no official censorship exists in

Poland. The full text of the revised Polish constitution is not yet obtainable. It is therefore difficult to say at the present paragraphs in the old constitution concerning the protection of the minority rights have also been affected. In renouncing been affected. In renouncing Polish national minority obli-gations, Colonel Beck, Polish Minister of Foreign Affairs, declared last September in In renouncing Geneva that these international obligations are not necessary because they are already guaranteed by the Polish constitu-tion. It is, therefore, to be hoped that Col. Beck's statement will be substantiated also by the new constitution.

Struggle for Rights Goes On Everywhere

Such is the Jewish position in Germany, Austria, Hungary, Roumania, Poland, Lithuania and other lands. With the exand order lands. With the exception of Germany, which I have avoided due to the boycott, I have recently visited every one of the above-mentioned countries, and our Paris Committee is continually receiving information from all of them.

The Jews of all lands are struggling today for their rights. We have always known that our lot is organically bound up with the lot of Democracy and that there where Democracy in jeopardy, Jewish rights, too, are in jeopardy. Unfortunate-ly, the democracies and parliamentary governments generally have been replaced in many Eastern European countries by reactionary governments, Fas-cism, dictatorship, etc. And if in Soviet Russia Jews are not suffering as Jews, religion, He-brew and Zionism are nevertheless persecuted, and this is be-ing done by the Jewish section the Communist Party.

Problem Is Where To Find Assistance Unfortunately, European Jew-

ry is not in a position to help itself. What then shall become of them? Who shall interof them? Who shall inter-vene, and who shall champion Jewish rights?

Already in 1931, at a conference following the Zionist Con-gress, called at the intiative of the American Jewish Concress there was brought up the qu tion of creating a united Jewish World Organization, founded on democratic principles, and en-dowed with the prerogative of championing our rights before the whole world. A praesidium of six was then elected, ing of Dr. Motskin, Dr. Wise, Bernard S. Deutsch, Isaac Greenbaum, Oscar Kahn and myself. It was then that the idea of a World Jewish Congress was first proclaimed. Running on Anti-Semitism

The new presidential elections in the ITnited States are still distant, but campaign drums are already being sounded. And for the first time in the history of the United States, one of the candidates has projected a definitely anti-Jewish platform.

Completely repudiated in the last elections, a group of viduals has now organized a so-called "Independent Republican Party" and, under the slogan "Christianity against Judaism," Louis T. McFadden as its candi-date for President of the United States in the 1936 elections.

From the Mayflower Hotel in Washington, where the large Zionist convention concluded last Monday, the country is now being flooded with the campaign propaganda for McFadden, replete with poisonous anti-Jewish allegations. The old story the League of Nations is a tool of world Jewry to enslave the Christian nations" is one of the legends spread by the Indepen-dent Republican Party in its propaganda campaign for the propaganda campaign for the forthcoming presidential election. The not so original story that the Roosevelt administration is dominated by Jews is another legend upon which the McFadden party is building its campaign propaganda

The Forces Behind

It is needless to say that the new party, whose ambition it is to bring McFadden into the presidency through anti-Semitic slogans has nothing to do with the real Republican party. It is, however, of importance to know that there are politicians in America who believe that by agitating against the Jews they can make their way through to the White House in the 1936 elec-

The fact that the Independent Republican Party has deliberate-ly adopted anti-Semitic slogans as a basis for its campaign propaganda should put Jewish leaders in America on guard. A presidential campaign based on anti-Semitism is undoubtedly backed financially by forces interested in spreading anti-Semitism in the United States. The campaign conducted by the new party, though it will not bring McFadden to the White House should nevertheless not be minimized as to the effect it may have in in-stilling millions of Americans with anti-Semitic thoughts.

Allegations of Bigots

The allegations spread by the new anti-Semitic party, that "the hew and-Semilic party, that "the League of Nations is a Jewish institution," are made in view of the expected suggestion that America become a member of the League of Nations and of the World Court. Some of the most powerful individuals and groups in the United States hold that unless the United States enters the League of Nations the world's peace machinery will not function properly.

Whether the movement to bring America into the League of Nations will be successful or not, the propaganda carried on by the Independent Republican Party that "the League is a tool rarry that "the League is a tool in the hands of world Jew.y" will be ridiculed by every right-thinking person. In the light of the recent action of the League with regard to the Jews in Saar, only bigoted anti-Semites can assert that "the League of Nations is controlled by Jews."

This is particular noteworthy in that it provides a basis for approach to the great masses of American Jews who have not been American Jews who have not been drawn into the sphere of Zionist activity by the Zionist Organiza-tion of America with its limited membership. In a way it provides a means of tapping that g reserve of sympathy for Palestine aims which the executive commit-tee of the Jewish Agency for Palestine recognized at its recent session here and planned to profit by through formation of a non-Zionist constituency for the Jewish Agen-

Added Strength

This should result in a great strengthening of the American Zionist organization not only because it will have new hands v ing with it but because it will be enriched by infiltration of many inactive sympathizers drawn into the organization's orbit by these co-workers.

Perhaps most significant of all, was the decision of the conference to establish an economic commission to survey the position and re-quirements of Palestine, coordinate public and private agencies and develop a concerted program of Palestine economic activities.

Hailed as Constructive This is probably the most con-

structive idea put forth with regard to Palestine in many years. In America alone, there are scores of agencies pouring money into Palestine without regard to any comprehensive plan. Throughout the world there are hundreds more public and private. How much duplication, how much waste has sulted from this, despite the remarkable results accomplished may not be known until a thorough survey is made by experts. How much more could be accomplished with the same effort and energy, their reports and plane may show. —We know that one result of the flood of private capital into Palestine has been a land boom that has seriously hampered the nor-mal growth of the country. We know that there is a tendency for private capital to concentrate in certain fields with the concomitant danger of overproduction and unmarketable surpluses. We know too, that there is a tendency to-ward concentration of population in cities.

To Survey Jobs Field Just how serious these things e, the economic commission would determine and would reveal alternative fields for employment of capital

Nazareth Land Court Upholds Fund in Contention

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) NAZARETH, Palestine.—... NAZARETH, Palestine.—An appeal against a judgment of the Nazaret Land Court, dismissing a claim to grazing rights on certain land near Nahalal, was lost by Arab villagers and tribesmen in the Court of Appeals here.

The Land Court handed down its judgment following a dispute as to rights held in land in the possession of the Jewish National Fund. The peasants claimed that three years ago the National Fund had interfered with their grazing rights and had erected a fence around the area in question.

The Land Court held that the plaintiffs had failed to establish their claim, and that the area un-der dispute had not been grazing land "ab antiquo" for Bahloul vil-lage and the Mazarib tribesman.

When the case was taken to the Court of Appeal, counsel for the National Fund asked that it be dismissed on the plea that the grounds of appeal had been filed forty days after notice of the ap-His request was granted.

The disputed area was the cen ter of a hostile outbreak in December, when two Jewish plow-men were injured during an attack by villagers and tribesmen.

SHANGHAI.—The slaying of a
Jewish boy at Harbin by a group
of White Russians was called to
the attention of Sir Alexander Cadogan, British Minister to China, by N. E. B. Ezra, editor of "Israel's Messenger," monthly journal pub-

lished here.
Sir Alexander was told that Mr. Igguchi, a high Japanese police official at Harbin, had issued a statement to the press in connecstatement to the press in connec-tion with the kidnaping and mur-der of Simon Kaspe, a French citi-zen, in which the Japanese said the crimes were justified.

"He stated that in his opinion "He stated that in his opinion Kaspe was put to death by the White Russians because he was a Jew," Ezra said. "He said that the White Russians, exiled from their homeland, have grievances against the Jewish people for ruining their country and identifying themselves with Communism.'

Because of these circumstances, the journalist reported that Mr. Igguchi said the killers are en-titled to leniency.

"The exoneration of the cul-prits," the journalist said, "has thrown the Jewish community in Harbin into a state of panic and terror. It implies that Jewish lives are no longer safe when criminals are shielded and even lauded."

Jewish Community Needs in Palestine

The New Judaea, official organ of the World Zionist Executive sults of the session of the Palestine Assefath Hanivcharim;

The Third Elected Assembly of Palestine Jewry concluded its final session after adopting a series of resolutions.

One resolution emphasizes the fact that the program of ex-penditure of the new £2,000,000 loar of the government, provid-ing for £133,000 for Arab school buildings, contains no provision at all for Jewish schools, in spite of the poor accommodation for the latter. Notwithstanding the present economic well-being of the country and the rising plus revenue of government, the public services of the Jewish community are in financially stringent circumstances and urgently needed requirements are not satisfied. Specific representations made

are; an education grant on the basis of the present numerical proportion of the Jews to the whole population, in accord with the expected government education budget for 1933-36: grant for Jewish school build-ings in the towns; increased grant for Jewish medical serv-ices for which the Vaad Leumi is responsible; and a grant for new hospital buildings.

Another Chapter Added to History

Writing on the results of the faar plebiscite, the Jowish Exditorially:

For the five thousand or more Jewish residents of the Saar, as well as for the others upon whom the Nazis are pouring their wrath, there is no alternative. Unless something entirely un-foreseen happens, these will have to liquidate their affairs and, with the proverbial wanderstaff in hand, go out to seek shelter, possibly comfort and security, elsewhere.

Quite likely neighboring countries will do what they can to assuage the immediate pain. As assuage the immediate pain. As in the past, the Jews in other parts of the world will come to their assistance. For all we know the Saar plebiscite may become a passing incident. The world will forget; and another chapter will be added to the painful story of Jewish exile.



Boxing Sense

The scarcity of Jewish fighters in the amateur and prelim ranks is due to this boxing sense. Hav-ing spoken to more than a dozen of fair-to-middling fighters who quit the ring, we are sure of it. These lads were willing to serve an apprenticeship before galleries partly filled with disinterested spectators who had come early to spectators who had come early to secure choice seats. They were willing to wait their turn in pre-liminaries for very little money but for necessary experience and prestige. But, if the first three or four fights disclosed that they were not good enough to climb out of this class, they were the first to recognize their shortcomings and quit while the quitting was good

Parental objection had to do somewhat with their quitting also. However, whatever the reasons for this, we believe that the mere fact that so few Jewish boxers are in the amateur and preliminary ranks of the fight game is a healthy sign. There is nothing more pitiable than a punch-drunk fighter who refuses to quit or who cannot afford to drop out of the game.

Greek Agitator Lays Trade Loss Gets Jail Term ForRaceAttack

Editor of Makedonia Was Involved in Salonica Pogrom of '31

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) SALONICA, Jan. 22.—The noto-rious Greek anti-Semitic agitator, Fardis, editor of Makedonia, most violent anti-Jewish paper in Greece, was sentenced today to serve four months in jail for having written a series of anti-Jewish articles in a new paper, Elephteros.

Under his editorship Makedonia, organ of the Venizelist group, con-stantly incited the population of Salonica against the Jews. On several occasions Makedonia succeeded in arousing a virtual po-grom sentiment in Salonica, necessitating posting of heavy guards around the Jewish quarter.

Fardis was accused of having instigated the brutal pogrom of 1931, which led to the burning of the entire Jewish quarter by anti-Semites. He was later released for

lack of evidence Subsequent to his release, Fardis offered to give one of the Salonica Jewish newspapers the names of all those who took part in the actual pogrom on payment of 1,000 drachmas.
