

Austria Jews Boycotted by State Project

Vienna Restaurant Chain Openly Upholds Move; Buys Only Gentile

VIENNA, Jan. 23.—A wholesale boycott of Jewish merchants by the state-maintained municipal chain of low-priced restaurants is in progress here, officials of the chain making it a point of refusing to buy from Jews even if they offer lower prices than their Gentile competitors, Neue Welt, Jewish newspaper, reported today.

Charging that officials of the "WOEF" not only conduct the movement, but actually permit widespread agitation for an anti-Jewish boycott, with full knowledge of the government, Neue Welt publishes letters from a number of Jewish merchants attesting to the open anti-Jewish boycott.

"WOEF" is a semi-state institution which daily feeds tens of thousands of officials and employees of the municipality and the government.

Officials also point out the inconsistency of the government and the municipality, which tolerate an outright anti-Jewish boycott, but at the same time continue to issue denials that there is any official anti-Semitism in Austria.

Recently Viennese anti-Semites distributed lists of merchants on every street, marking the names of Jewish tradesmen and urging the population to refrain from buying in Jewish shops. The name of the printer of the leaflets was given, but no action was taken by officials.

Rosen Denies Biro-Bidjan Bar To Polish Jews

Says Soviet Frowns on Immigration Through Agro-Yid Group

Reports that the Soviet government had decided not to permit the entrance of Polish Jews to Biro-Bidjan were termed "not correct" by Dr. Joseph Rosen, head of the Agro-Yid group, an immigration establishment in Poland for this purpose, he said.

"The Soviet government," Dr. Rosen stated, "wishes to be certain that the work of sending the Jews from Poland to Biro-Bidjan and of settling them there will be carried out by an organization which has sufficient funds and experience. It was no surprise to me to learn that the plans of the Agro-Yid were rejected, in view of the fact that the organization has no funds and has never had

Refugees to Resettle Abandoned Colony

JERUSALEM, Jan. 23.—The colony of Tel Hai in Galilee, established by the PICA, will be resettled by German Jewish youth. The buildings have not been used since 1919, when Joseph Trumpeldor and his comrades died defending Tel Hai against Bedouins.

The land meanwhile has been cultivated by the neighboring colony of Kfar Giladi, which will assist the newcomers, expected here shortly. The village will be under the care of the Bureau for Settlement of German Jews, which has signed a twenty-two year lease with the PICA and is spending \$1,000 for building repairs.

Trade Pickup Will Not Affect 'Aryan' Policy

Goebbels Rebukes Zionist Organ for Giving Voice to Hope

BERLIN, Jan. 23.—No improvement in economic conditions, no matter how great, will cause the Nazis to alter their attitude toward the Jews, Adolf Hitler, minister of Propaganda, said. He rebuked the Zionist mouthpiece of Joseph Goebbels, stated today.

The Angriff rebuked the Judenrat Runderbau, organ of the German Zionists, which stated that the Nazi persecution of the Jews might be relaxed with the improvement of economic conditions. The Runderbau pointed out that Jewish merchants benefited from improved business during the past Christmas, which also saw a waning in the fanatic anti-Jewish viewpoint of the Nazis.

"Only Jews are capable of sacrificing their ideals for business," the Angriff retorted, "while Nazism, based on the concept of race and will never pocket or abandon racialism for material abundance."

Goebbels' organ recently took German Jewish papers to task.

Palestine Permits Rosenblatt to Enter

Revisionist Was Refused Entry Monday After His Return From Poland

JERUSALEM, Jan. 23.—Zvi Rosenblatt, youthful Zionist Revisionist, who on Monday was refused permission to land in Palestine on the ground that he was on the government blacklist, was finally permitted to re-enter this country today.

Rosenblatt returned to Palestine from Poland after attending the sessions of the World Revisionist conference in Krakow. He was one of three Revisionists accused of the murder of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, Laborite leader. Together with Abraham Stavsky and Abba Achmeleer, he was acquitted by the Palestine courts.

Seat Auster, End Quarrel In Jerusalem

Rival Jewish Aldermen Reach Compromise on Vice-Mayoralty

JERUSALEM, Jan. 23.—The crisis in the municipal council of Jerusalem came to an end today when Daniel Auster, Jewish vice-mayor, was permitted to assume his duties by the Jewish organizations which had opposed his appointment.

After deliberations lasting for four days, a compromise was reached between the organizations opposing A. pointment and those supporting it. As a result of this compromise the Vaad Leumi, the Jewish National Council of Palestine, today issued an official communique, stating that "the Vaad Leumi and the Agudath Israel regret that the Palestine government has appointed Daniel Auster as vice-mayor and did not take into consideration the decision of the Jewish institutions that the Jewish councillor Haim Solomon should be appointed to this post."

A meeting of the Sanhedric Jewish community in Palestine today adopted a resolution to support Mr. Auster in his work as vice-mayor of Jerusalem. The Palestine Executive of the General Zionist party has also adopted a resolution requesting Mr. Auster not to resign from his post despite the opposition.

Poland Dissolves Council of Lwow

Appoints Government Agent to Supervise Jewish Community

LWOW, Jan. 23.—The council of the Lwow Jewish community, an official body, today was dissolved by government authorities and a government commissar was immediately appointed to supervise the Jewish community.

The commissar will be assisted by an advisory board consisting of representatives of Jews regarded as pro-government, and five Zionist members.

The council was dissolved on the ground that the terms of the members had expired.

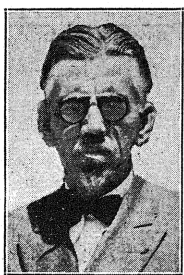
McFadden Barrages Country In Anti-Semite Presidency Bid

Saar Community Voices Its Anxiety

Awaits Sentence

Pelley, Guilty, Faces 5-Year Prison Term

He and Aide Out on Bail of \$2,500 Each Pending Sentence Feb. 18

ASHEVILLE, N. C., Jan. 23.—Found guilty late last night of two counts in an indictment charging them with violation of the North Carolina "blue sky" laws, William Dudley Pelley, anti-Semitic Silver Shirt leader, and Robert C. Summerville, one of his aides, were ordered temporary liberty under bonds of \$2,500 each.

Sentence will not be passed until February 18, Judge Wilson Warlick announced today. The pair face imprisonment for as long as five years on each count, or fines of \$1,000, or both.

A third co-defendant, Don D. Kellogg, was free of all counts, while Summerville and Pelley were acquitted of the seventh count in the indictment.

In the first count the two guilty defendants were charged with offering stock for sale through an advertisement in the magazine

Chief Rabbi Places Hope in Rome Agreement

SAAERBRUECKEN, Jan. 23.—Two declarations, one expressing anxiety over the language of Jewish institutions in the Saar, and the other expressing hope that the "Aryan paragraph" will not be applied to Saar Jews, were issued today by the Jewish community. Simultaneously, Dr. Lothar Rothchild, new Chief Rabbi of Saarbruecken, gave an interview emphasizing the fact that the situation of Saar Jewry is "dark and uncertain" and that the community places its hopes entirely on the guarantees secured by the Franco-German agreement in Rome.

The first manifesto of the Federation of Jewish Communities in the Saar, issued today, stated: "We hope that the quieted atmosphere and the state of appeasement into which Europe is now entering will also favor more peaceful and more just judgments of the entire Jewish problem. We are now fused with German Jewry. We desire to work together with the German Jews for the honor of Judaism."

Anxious Over Institutions
"Our main anxiety, however, is for the existence of the Jewish communities of the Saar and the institutions which they maintain. It is not possible in the same direction of the future of these institutions. We hope that our synagogues,

New Setup Seen For Jerusalem As Vaad Acts

Financial Committee, Dr. Eugene Mayer Frame Plans

JERUSALEM, Jan. 23.—Steps have been taken by Vaad Leumi for a thorough reorganization of the Jewish Community in Jerusalem, it is understood here.

A financial committee was appointed to prepare plans for this purpose. The committee consists of Chaim Solomon, Mr. Brande and Dr. Senator. As a further step in the same direction, Dr. Eugene Mayer has been asked by the Board of the Jewish Community and the Vaad Leumi to prepare a comprehensive plan for the upbuilding of the Jerusalem community and its institutions.

Dr. Mayer, who settled in Jerusalem some years ago, has been an active Zionist since his student days and has numerous friends among Jewish residents here.

On completing his legal studies and after having worked for number of years with TICA in
