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French Bring Order After **Algiers Riots**

No Jews Injured in Setif Arab Clashes, Paris Reports

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
PARIS, Feb. 3.—Order was completely restored in Setif, Algeria, following the two-day outbreak of rioting, the French Home Office announced today. Not a single Jew was injured in the outburst, but three natives, one a soldier in an Algerian rifle regiment, were killed, the Home Office disclosed.

French troops were in control of the situation, which developed from a brawl in a wine shop. Native Algerian soldiers were engaged in a fight when police intervened. The soldiers resisted the police, who fired, killing one. They were immediately attacked by the soldiers in the cafe and retreated to their station house, which was sacked by the mob.

Anti-Jewish Rumor Spreads

In the meantime the rumor spread that a Jewish policeman had killed a Moslem soldier and mobs of excited Moslems invaded the Jewish quarter of Setif, loot-Jewish shops and shouting, cill the Jews." Heavy police reinforcements were rushed to the district and the rioters were repulsed.

Troops were also rushed to the district and heavy cordons surrounded the section and patrolled the town. Hundreds of arrests were made by police, aided by military forces.

Constantine Jews Organize for Defense

Police Dispel Crowd of Blind **Demanding Licenses From** Jewish Community

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) WARSAW, Feb. 3.—A crowd of cited, blind beggars invaded the offices of the Jewish community here, demanding that they be supplied with licenses which would permit them to beg in public places. Police, called in to quiet the disturbance, had to use force to remove the supplicants.

A crowd of more than a hundred beggars invaded the community house a short time ago, insisting that a police ban on begging had left them without means of subsistance and asking for aid from he Jewish community. Raising a fremendous uproar by playing their various instruments all at once and stamping with their crutches, the beggars threatened at the time that unless they were assisted they would return to press their demands.

Brother, Rabbi, Prays To 'Save' Litvinoff

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) LONDON, Feb. 3.—While So-viet Foreign Commissar Maxim Litvinoff is living in "luxury and power in the Kremlin," his brother, Rabbi Jacob Wallach of Lodz, Poland, deeply grieved by the "Godlessness" of the Commissar, is praying and fasting, hoping for his return to the true faith, the London Daily Express reported today in a sensationally featured story.

Commenting editorially on the report, the Express asks the rhetorical question as to which of the two one would rather be. Commissar Litvinoff's name was originally Wallach, but he assumed the name Litvinoff as a "nom de guerre" when he entered the Russian revolutionary movement early in the 1900's.

Testified Against Inch | Inch, Grahamstown Figure, Forged 'Protocols'

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) JOHANNESBURG, South Af-

rica, Feb. 3.—Harry Victor Inch. discredited Nazi Grey Shirt leader, who was found guilty of perjury as an aftermath of the famous Grahamstown "Protocols" trial, was yesterday sentenced to serve six years and three months in prison for forging documents defaming the Jewish race and swearing under oath that those documents were genuine. Inch and his fellow defendants, David Hermanus Olivier and Johannes Strauss von Moltke still face other charges which grew out of the Grahamstown trial.

The result has been widely hailed here as a complete vindication of the Jewish people and of Rabbi Abraham Levy of Port Elizabeth, who brought suit against the Grey Shirt leaders.

See Extinction of Movement

Another result expected here is the early dissolution and complete extinction of the Grey Shirt movement, which patterned itself after the Nazis and attempted to stir up race hatred in South Africa.

The case arose when Inch and his colleagues read a document at Nazi rallies which purported to be an account of a Jewish meeting held at the Western Road Synagogue, of which Rabbi Levy is the head. The document, written in bad English, told of an alleged Jewish plot to capture control of the world and also contained slanderous statements against Christianity. It closed by saying: "We shall achieve our wish. The Gentile dogs shall crave for mercy and our refusals. Our Bolshevic (sic) Propaganda Scheme."

The document also contained Hebrew characters which was alleged to prove its authenticity, but turned out to be merely the phrase "May be used for Passover," and other illegible Hebrew characters.

Austria Bids for Palestine Commerce

As a 'Feeler' Prince Would Restore All

Trade Official Declares 'Economic Laws' Will Further Business

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

VIENNA,-A deliberate bid for Palestine trade on the part of the Austrian government was seen here in an exhaustive article on the nature of Palestine's foreign business published by Dr. M. Sattler, secretary of the governmentcontrolled foreign section of the Austrian Chambers of Commerce. Dr. Sattler attended the Levant Fair last year as the official Austrian representative and made every effort to strengthen Austrian trade with Palestine.

Citing figures showing that Germany's trade with Palestine has increased heavily in the last two years, being now second only to Great Britain, Dr. Sattler reaches the conclusion that national and political antipathies are meaningless where economics are concerned. He shows that despite the mutual hatred between the Germans and the Jews, trade between them has gone on and even increased where it was economically profitable.

Britain in Lead

"The figures for the first half year of 1934," he writes, "reveal that Palestine imported during this period goods to the value of £7,046,528, compared with £4,873,-000 in the first six months of 1933. Great Britain came first with £1,-380,000, compared with £903,174 in the same period in 1933, Germany came second with £858,744. compared with £810,700 in 1933, and the United States third with £591,228, compared with £450,000

"Palestine exports in the first six months of 1934 amounted to in America can be of considerable £2,459,019, compared with £1,900,-744 in 1933, of which Britain took movement. £1,369,418, compared with £1,202,-879 in the same period of 1933, and Germany £589,135, compared with £307,302 in the same period

"These figures prove that Germany holds second place in Palestine trade, coming immediately after Great Britain. It should be observed that though Britain as Mandatory does not enjoy direct preference, the influence of the orders placed by the government and quarters standing close to the government is easily discernible in the import statistics. All orders for the Palestine and Transjordan governments, for the police, the military and the Iraq Oil Company naturally go to Britain.

Orange Export Concentrated

The fact that the British-Palestine trading balance was almost equalized in the first half year of 1934, is explained by Palestine's oxange exports being practically concentrated in the first three months of the year, and the balance salet for the whole of the year does not run at all on the same lines. It is estimated that the imports for 1934 will amount to £14,000,000 or £75,000,000, while exports, in view of the small crange exports for the second half of the year will increase by little more than £4,000,000, so that Palestine will have an excess of in ports of about \$10,000,000.

Rising Reich Loewenstein, Seeing Nazis' Fall, EWS Exports Cited Bids for Leadership of Germany

Rights to Jews Under New Democracy

Prince Hubertus Friedrich Loewenstein, arriving in the United States Saturday on his first visit here, predicted the downfall of Adolf Hitler within two years and announced he would assume all responsibility of leadership. His democratic system of government, he promised, would relieve the desperate situation of German Jews at once.

The Prince, a young man of twenty-eight, was founder of the Republican Reichsbanner organization in Germany, a countermovement to the Nazi government in its early days, and is now a voluntary exile from his native land. His enmity to the Hitler regime is regarded with such seriousness that a price has been placed on his head by the Nazis. He is here on a lecture tour, during which he hopes to solidify anti-Nazi feeling in this country.

"Hitler, we hope," said the former leader of the Catholic Centrist party in Berlin, "will remain in power for another year or two. By that time our plans will be matured, our organization strengthened, and Hitler's fall a certainty due to the economic crisis and the dissension in the

Working for Organization

"For the last two years," he continued, "I have been constantly working to create an organization of all Germans who are not Communists and who do not like Hitler." Nazi Germany is not identical to the real Germany. There are 35,000,000 people in the world who are sympathetic to our cause for restoring a democratic system of government in Germany. The Jews help to us by supporting our

"For that matter," he went

"If we analyze German exports to Palestine, we find that the increase has been in productive articles, mainly machinery, while the figures in respect of articles of consumption show a decline.

Sees No Let-Up

Prince Loewenstein is of the opinion that the Jews in Germany are still suffering as many hardships and restrictions now as when Hitler first assumed power.

"The situation," he remarked, "has not been relieved whatsoever. Only the Nazi propaganda machine works a little better and the real stories do not get out. No Jew can become a lawyer, a doctor, or an official of the state. Neither have the conditions of shopkeepers or commercial Jews been bettered.

"I am not ambitious," he earnestly stated, "but I am willing to assume responsibility of leadership. With this democratic system of government that our party will set up the condition of German Jewry will be relieved at once. That is why Jews throughout the world should support our organi-

Works With Ochs

The question, then, is: "Who is this man so worthy of honor?"

And the answer is that, next to Mr. Ochs himself, he is the man most responsible for the development of the Times from a moribound and obscure newspaper to a publication that is rated as one

Louis Wiley was born in Hornell, N. Y., May 31, 1869, the son of Benjamin and Ernestine Brickner Wiley. His father was a merchant of Hornell and Mt. Sterling. And it was in the latter town that young Wiley started his career as a reporter for the Democrat, a weekly.

A short time later the family moved to Fort Wayne, Ind., where Louis displayed his first real flair for newspaper work as a reporter for the Journal of that town.

Ambassadors, Educators to Be on Dais at Affair Here

ey in 1886, the Wileys moved to Rochester. Young Louis thereupon landed a job with Post Express. A reporter's salary didn't satisfy him and he founded Rochester's first Anglo-Jewish weekly, the Tidings, an eight-page paper, which met with immediate success.

For six years the Tidings occupied Louis Wiley's time. It drew the attention of others, and in 1893, at the age of twenty-four, he was offered the business managership of the Post Express, the paper that eight years before had paid him a wage of six dollars a

Takes Job on Old Sun

The way was already pointed toward New York. Two years later he was working on Dana's Sun under William Laffan. A year later he joined Ochs in the seemingly impossible task of resurrecting the Times.

Adolph Ochs had come on from Tennessee to take over the Times. It had lapsed from its former high position when, with the Tribune and the Herald, it was one of the important papers of the metrop-

The paper was ready to die, at least to merge. None of the New York newspapermen thought the gazette worth preserving. It remained for a young southern Jew to re-create a new paper under the slogan, "All the News That's Fit to Print."

It was this man whom Wiley, looking for opportunity, decided to connect with. In an address many years later, he said:

"I sought and fought to join the New York Times in 1896 and With the death of the elder Wil- I hitched my wagon to a star.

Time and the Times have proved that this star is the mightiest in the journalistic heavens.'

Adolph Ochs, on the occasion of a dinner given to Mr. Wiley in Rochester on his sixtieth birthday by the Press Club of that city, which he had helped found many years earlier, reminisced in the following vein:

'Sprightly Young Man'

"Shortly after I had rescued the Times, when a derelict about to sink with a gallant crew of able journalistic seamen, a sprightly young man, still in his twenties, called on me and sought a position with the organization.

"He had some newspaper experience, notably at Rochester, and had come to New York City to seek a larger field for the development of his ambition. He had made a survey of the newspaper situation, and was so impressed with what he thought were my prospects with the New York Times that he declined more lucrative offers and presented himself to me for employment in any position so long as he might become attached to the business organiza-

"I was, of necessity, moving cautiously in adding to the staff, because of the expense, and was not very receptive to his overtures. But the talent that he has since developed to a pre-eminent degree asserted itself and, as usual, what he went after, he secured.

"He accepted a modest position and a modest salary. It was one of the best trades I ever made."

Becomes Business Manager

Ten years later Louis Wiley was business manager of the Times, a position he still fills with great distinction. Under his direction. the Times has led the way toward a new level of ethical practice in the field of advertising. In every respect, he kept pace with the Times as it steadily developed the greatest world-wide news service of any newspaper on earth.

Because of his early reportorial training, or possibly just because of the breadth of judgment that seemed inherent with him, Wiley

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Fading Optimism

It was expected that after the Saar is returned to Germany certain modifications would be made by the Nazi government as far as anti-Jewish legislation is concerned. Hopes were expressed by optimistic Jews in Germany that "things will somewhat change for the Jews" after the Saar plebiscite.

This optimism is now fading away. Not only does the Nazi government not think of alleviating the condition of German Jews, but on the contrary everything points to the fact that the movement to push the Jews out of commerce is acquiring a new impetus among the Nazi leaders.

The efforts which Julius Streicher has made in Munich to stimulate the anti-Jewish boycott along the same lines as in the early days of the Nazi regime are not a mere incident. Herr Streicher is now being followed in his campaign by Dr. Ley, the leader of the German Labor Front and dictator over all the employers and employes in Germany.

Dr. Ley, in special instructions, recommends the boycott of Jewish shops and urges patronizing only those enterprises which carry the signs: "This is a German firm."

It is true that the large masses of the German people are not antagonistic toward Jewish-owned stores. It is also true that a person like Dr. Schacht may be of the opinion that the boycott of Jewish stores is but harming the German economic system. The rulers in Germany today are, however, fanatics and not ones to look more soberly at mat-

The renewal of the anti-Jewish boycott is indicative. It shows that the wind now blowing from the "Brown House" is definitely against Jewish trading. It warns against optimism with regard to the Jewish situation in the Reich. It illustrates that Streicher and his company feel that their side is now much stronger than the side of those in the Nazi ranks preaching a more tolerant attitude towards the Tews.

The renewal of the anti-Jewish boxcott is clearly a warning to those Jews abroad who have begun to believe that everything is becoming normal in Germany.

TROUBLE IN MANCHUKUO

HARBIN,

The American Consul-General and the British Minister in Manchukuo were approached here by a Jewish delegation to intervene with the Manchukuo government against the alarming growth of anti-Semitism, stimulated here by Japanese officials, especially by the Japanese Chief of Secret Service, a Mr. Eguchi.

A Jewish delegation consisting of Rabbi M. Z. Ashkenazi, Hillel Epstein, editor, N. E. B. Ezra and B. Topas, representing the Jewish community of Shanghai, also approached the Japanese Minister to China, M. Ariyoshi, at the Japanese Legation in Shanghai, presenting to him the fears and grievances of the Jewish community in Harbin and stating that they are also shared by the Jewish leaders of Shang-


The delegation drew the attention of the Japanese Minister to the anti-Semitic campaign in which Japanese officials are participating in Manchukuo, by encouraging the anti-Semitic propaganda of a section of the White Russians in Harbin.

'Patriots' Slew Jewish Youth

The delegation emphasized to the Japanese Minister that the inner story of the kidnaping and murder of Simon Kaspe, son of I. A. Kaspe, of Harbin, as revealed by police inquiries, was the signal for new outbursts on the part of Eguchi, Chief of the detective police. He gave his "personal opinion" in an amazing manner before handing his report to the procurator.

This occupied sixty pages of Japanese text and thirty-two pages of Russian. His conclusion is written in chronological order, describing the crime and assessing the responsibility of every person. He concludes with his "personal opinion," shocking as it is to decent-minded people, as head of the criminal department. The "finding" runs thus:

"Having become fully acquainted with all the circumstances of the kidnaping of Simon Kaspe, I have come to the conclusion that the accused Martinov, Shander and others showed ardent patriotism. The crime enacted by them is apparently an ordinary criminal act, but the motives for the crime are far from ordinary, being those of a political nature and

Sought Funds By Kidnaping

"The accused are perfectly sure that those guilty for the ruin of Imperial Russia, the murder of the Emperor himself and his family, are Communists and leaders of the Commurist movement Jews, and, therefore, the accused decided to have revenge for their homeland, being imbued with extreme anti-Soviet and anti-Jewish feelings.

"Last year the accused plotted a considerable anti-Soviet rising on U.S.S.R. territory, and knowing that former risings had not succeeded owing to the lack of means, they decided to secure the same. However, being convinced that it was impossible to get a large sum by ordinary means, they, against their own will, decided to get money by extraordinary measures, i. e., to kidnap somebody for the purpose of ransom.

"For this purpose they selected the son of Joseph Kaspe, Si-

mon, as in their opinion the Bolsheviks during the time of the revolution had sold valuables of the Russian Empire to Joseph Kaspe and the latter had made a huge capital out of them, working with the G. P. U., selling the valuables of the Russian crown, church plate, museum rarities and confiscated valuables belonging to private individuals.

Thus the accused considered that Joseph Kaspe had made his money in a criminal manner and decided to take his money away from him and spend it in a struggle against the Bolsheviks.

The City of Cordoba, together with other Spanish and foreign organizations, is making extensive preparations to commemorate the eighth centenary of one of its greatest sons, Rabbi Moses ben Maimon, philosopher known to the civilized world as Maimonides.

Born March 30, 1135, this great scholar, through his illustrious work, "The Guide of the Perplexed," and other volumes, earned the appellation by his biographers of the "greatest fixed star of

The exemplary life led by Maimonides during his exile in Egypt,

when he was the court physiciand of the Sultan Saladin, bears eloquent testimony of his wisdom. In the year 1204 death overtook him and he was buried in Tiberias. His career was a happy expression of a genial and distinguished person-\$ 40 D

Literary festivals, which will glorify his name; publications, which will renew his fame; commemorations in stone which will perpetuate the public exaltation; all will find their climax in Madrid, Egypt and other countries glorifying the universal fame of Maimonides.

The Organizing Committee for the commemorative festivals has opened a public competition-in which everybody writing in the Spanish language may participate for three papers, dealing with the following subjects: "Maimonides as Philosopher," "Maimonides as Physician" and a "Biography of Maimonides."

The three works to be accepted will bear a prize of 500 pesetas each. The prizes have been offered by the "Academia de Cordoba" on behalf of medical organizations and educational centers

The papers, which must be accompanied by the name of the author in a sealed envelope, must reach the "Catedra de Hebreo del Instituto Nacional de Segunda Ensenanza de Cordoba" before March 1, 1935. They will be judged by a committee of Spanish professors.

The Organizing Committee has granted the right to the "Academia de Cordoba," to publish the prize-winning papers.

A committee has also been formed in Madrid, entrusted with the organization of the Cordoba festivals. Cristobal de Castro is president.

At a meeting of the committee it was decided to erect at Cordoba a monument for the Rambam. The committee will further publish, by subscription, the works of this great mediaeval thinker. The committee also decided to sponsor memorial meetings at Madrid, Cordoba, Morocco and Egypt, where this famous Andalusian lived and wrote. Members of the committee will approach the High Commissioners of Spanish and French Morocco, as well as the Jewish communities in Morocco and Egypt, to ask their support in organizing celebrations in these

Hannen Swaffer, writing in the London Daily Herald on the impressions brought from Palestine by one of his Jewish friends, says:

Eretz Israel, Not Palestine

Under the headline, "Avoid the Word 'Talestine,'" the Jewish Tribuno of Bombay makes the following suggestion to the Jews of

Some time ago there was a movement afoot to avoid the use of the word Palestine as the nomenclature for the Holy Land. The name suggests by its etymology the land of the Philistines and it is a curious survival of a race that has not inhabited that country for decades. In the holy language, the country is known by the name of Eretz Israel—the land or country of the Jews. Every Jew should endeavor by his example and suggestion to see that the country is described as Eretz-Israel not only by his co-religionists but also by non-Jews.

With the rapid nationalization of the country, the steady increase in the number of the Jewish population, and the marvelous progress in the employment of Hebrew as a language, it should not be long before Palestine becomes the Land of Israel and is known internationally as Eretz Israel. This must be a duty of every individual, for we have no Minister of Education empowered to make the correction world-wide.

Seeks Backers Of McFadden

The American Israelite, commenting on Louis T. McFadden's race for the presidency on an anti-Semitic platform, says:

Non-sectarian newspapers virtually have ignored Mr. McFadden's presidential candidacy. He is a political curiosity. But he is dangerous-because he is well-financed and deaf to truth.

The Israelite strongly recommends to readers the following two precautions:

1. That you take pains to ascertain the names and interests of Mr. McFadden's backers—and cease doing business with them.

2. That you incuire from the Hotel Mayflower in Washington, D. C., just how it finds it convenient to harbor such an inciting, un-American influence as is Mr. McFadden's headquarters.

Asks Consideration Of Jewish Problem

Commenting on the position of Tews in European countries, the South African Jewish Chronicle savs editorially:

The situation is extremely serious and calls for immediate assistance. If there is really such a body as World Jewry as our enemies would have us believe there exists, the representatives should come together and decide about what is to be done in order to save these poor people, not only from starvation but from national degeneration. Many of the Jews of these countries are of the finest and noblest types-their services could be of the greatest value in many directions: today they have fallen on evil times and it is the duty of those in more fortunate circumstances to raise and succor

Emigration cannot solve the problem, though every effort should be made to bring as many of these unfortunate people out of their miserable and sordid surroundings as possible. But for the majority the problem will have to be solved in the country in which they are unfortunately situated, and it is hoped that with the beginning of a new year a real and earnest effort will be made at ameliorating the sad lot of these unfortunate people.

Influences Against Germany's Trade

The New York Times, speaking of Germany's unfavorable trad balance, says editorially:

While it is possible to point

to some of the forces that affect a trade balance, it is seldom possible to say what the precise quantitative effect has been of any one of them. Among the general influences that we have to consider in the case of Germany, in addition to the intricate and rigid governmental control, are the drastic changes in German domestic economy, her absurdly low gold reserve, and the economic boycott.

Entry Restrictions And Nazis in U. S.

The Philadelphia Jewish Exp nent says under the headlin "Jingoes in our Midst:"

Among those who are advo cating a greater restriction o immigration to this country, re vived since the opening of the United States Congress, there are a number of Jewish names This is regrettable. In th course of the past two years th Hitler propagandists have don all they could to foment hatre of the Jews. In his annual report, Justice May asked for continued support of the Federation's activities and stressed the necessity for "increased giving" after pointing out that the Federation ended the year 1934 with a deficit of approximately \$17,000.

Former Supreme Court Justice Joseph M. Proskauer, president of the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies of New York City, and Marcus C. Hankinson, president of the Brooklyn Association for Improving the Condition of the Poor, were the chief speakers on the program.

A musical program featuring Elizabeth Harmon, contralto: Leonidas Coroni, baritone, and Orsola Tucciarelli, coloratura soprano, was given under the supervision of Max Abelman, chairman of the annual meeting committee.

Outlines Federation History


"A group of pioneers, under the leadership and inspiration of Nathan S. Jonas, founded the Federation late in 1909 and launched its program of activities in 1910," Justice May said. "Our Federation at that time was one of the very few community chests in the country. The idea had not yet taken hold, and Brooklyn was one of the very first to join the small group who had the vision to experiment with that form of community organization.

"During the twenty-five years of our existence, tremendous changes have taken place in the make-up and composition of our Jewish community. The Jewish population of Brooklyn has grown from 400,-000 in 1910 to over a million today. Whereas, twenty-five years ago Manhattan, with a Jewish population of 601,000, led all the other boroughs in this respect, today Brooklyn has a Jewish population greater than that of Manhattan and The Bronx combined.

Yearly Increased Noted

"Some of the changes that took place in the growth and development of our Jewish social service agencies in this branch borough are best reflected in a few comparative figures which I give you. In 1910 the United Jewish Aid Societies, our family welfare agency, had 414 families under care and received an allotment of \$12,250 from Federation. In 1930 the agency was serving over 6,000, of whom 2,600 were major cases, and Federation's allotment had increased to \$245,000. In 1910 the Brooklyn Hebrew Orphan Ayslum numbered 494 wards and received an allotment of \$18,000. By 1930 the agency was taking care of 1,033 children, and its allotment from Federation was \$91,125. . .

"Ladies and gentlemen: That deficit with which we ended the year 1934 is not very large. But it would have been greater-much greater-had we done with Federation what we should have liked (Continued on Page Eight)

cused, and not going into consideration of whether it was bad or good of them, the fact must be stated that they showed themselves staunch fighters for their native land, who considered all means good to accomplish their aim. We know of many such cases in history. These people have lost their native land, but they always remember the fact, and fight for it, even violating the law.
"The endeavors of these peo-

ple fighting for their native land may be sympathized with, but they carried out crime in Harbin, violating peace and order in the city, and as they exceeded the law of Manchukuo which stands for peace and order in this country, I consider that, notwithstanding the motives of their crime, the violation of the law cannot be left unpunished."

British Consulate

Hears Story
Prior to the publication of these "findings" of the Japanese official in the press, a Jewish delegation headed by Mr. Ezra was received officially by Sir Alexander Cadogan, at the British Consulate, and took the opportunity of giving an account of the ill-treatment of the Jewish population in Harbin at the hands of the Japanese judicial officials who encourage the anti-Semitism of a part of the White

Sir Alexander listened attentively and seemed deeply moved, promising, in the interest of humanity to have matters investigated with a view to making friendly representations to the proper authorities.

Similar assurances were given also by Edwin S. Cunningham, U. S. Consul-General, who promised to write to the Consulate in Harbin with a view to making friendly representation.

Grievances Laid

Before Japan Envoy A Jewish delegation consisting of Rabbi M. Z. Ashkenazi, Messrs, Hillel Epstein, N. E. B. Ezra and B. Topas, representing the Shanghai Ashkenazi Jewish Communal Association, was received by Minister Ariyoshi, Japan's Minister to China, at the Japanese Legation, before whom was laid the grievances of the Jewish community in Harbin regarding the anti-Semitic campaign and the ill-treatment to which they are subject.

The carriation which had control delegation was

founded three years ago, in order to protect the interests and rights of the Jews in Shanghai, the delegation explained. It was egistered in Nanking and recognized as a constitutional body with full rights to speak in the name of the Ashkenazic Jews. The recent alarming reports which reached Shanghai from Harbin had formed the subject of a meeting by the association, and a resolution deploring the rise of anti-Semitism nd hoping to check its growth was unanimously adopted.

Mr. Ezra took the opportunity of drawing the attention of Minister Ariyoshi that Jews had rendered yeoman service to Harbin in its initial states, contributing their share in developing its economic life. He said:

Criminal Agitation Pointed Out

"Your Excellency!—The occasion that brings us here is one which concerns the futur, welfare of the Jews in Manchukuo. We cannot view without concern the present unwholesome display of activities in Harbin insofar as the Jewish community as a whole is concerned. For the past twenty months there had been persistent agitation in the press to slander them and accuse them of all crimes. That this criminal agitation by a group of White Russians should be tolerated by the police is hard to understand. The motive be-hind it should be investigated and we hope the Manchukuo Government will not overlook this vital question.

"We must also bear in mind that the Jews in Harbin are entitled to full protection and consideration. They claim, and rightly so, to be pioneers in upbuilding the country and promoting its economic life and growth. Joseph Kaspe, whose son, Simon, was kidnapped and murdered by the White Russians, has himself lived in Harbin for three decades, contributing his


"Soskin, a financier, Frizer a banker, Kaufman, a leading physician and other, have made Harbin what it is today. Their names cannot be obliterated from the tablet of the history of Harbin. It is, therefore, unfair and unjust to permit a gang of hooligans to invade the country and encourage them to vilify and slander these pioneers and the whole Jewish community. I repeat again that the motives behind this movement should be investigated and the culprits punished and removed.


"There are plenty of rumors circulating in Shanghai concerning the matters complained of, but I shall not touch upon one of them. In June, 1933, His Excellency M. Christian Protest Would Carry Weight, Rabbi Rosenblum Says

A suggestion that the National Conference of Jews and Christians arrange a protest meeting over the radio against "the new offensive which is being engineered against the Jews in Europe" was made yesterday by Rabbi William F. Rosenblum in his sermon at Temple Israel, 210 West Ninety-first

"Let men of international prominence be invited to speak on this 'Church of the Air,' all of them Christians—the President of the United States, the Cardinal at New York and men of similar stamp-and let them place themselves on record as Christians against the misrepresentation of Christian teachings abroad," Rabbi Rosenblum recommended.

The value of the broadcast, he said, would be its religious character, as opposed to previous appeals made on national lines.

Appeal to Co-Religionists

"It will impress Germans little if Americans or Englishmen protest as such," the rabbi asserted. They will reply that political considerations in one country demand what political considerations in another may reject.

"But even in this confused world, an appeal from Christians in one country to Christians in another should have some weight. The language of Downing street, of the Quai d'Orsai or of Washington may be foreign to the ears of German, Polish and Austrian citizens. But the language of Christ is universal, and American Christians are bound to be understood by the Christians of Central Eu-

Defense by Radio

Declaring that the teachings of Christ have "circled the centuries." Rabbi Rosenblum continued:

"Surely these words can now encircle the globe and electrify real Christians everywhere with the determination to keep their faith divine.

"Does this seem so gigantic a project? Not at all. If Hitler wished now to broadcast an attack against Christianity he could summon the radio facilities of the world to his aid. Should it be any more difficult to do so in defense of Christianity?"

European Assimilation Vs. American Adaptation

Assimilation means one thing to European Jews and something quite different to the Jews of the United States, Rabbi Isaac Landman said yesterday in his sermon at Congregation Beth Elohim, Eighth avenue and Garfield place,

In pre-Hitler Germany, Rabbi Landman asserted, the word meant total absorption of the Jews in the majority population. In the United States, however, it means that the Jew adapts himself to the institutions and the culture of his environment in every way excepting the religious.

Confusing Issues

"To say that in the United States assimilationists seek to sink their Jewish identity is to state that which is false and vicious," Rabbi Landman said.

"The groupings and the differences in outlook among the Jews of America are entirely due to the background of the European countries from which they or their fathers came to the United States.

"In mid-Europe, for instance, the grandfathers of the present generation of American Jews made reforms in the synagogue ritual and service; whereas the present generation of American Jews, whose fathers came from East columns have been used most success-Europe, are entirely averse to the fully. Describes Judaism as Religious Civilization

Rabbi Milton Steinlerg of the Park Avenue Synagogue, 50 East Eighty-seventh street, lecturing before the Sunday morning forum on "What Are the Jews-Race, Religion or Nationality?" said the only valid description of Judaism is that of a religious civilization.

He denied the contention that the Jews constitute a race of complete racial purity, declaring persons of alien blood have attached themselves to the Jewish group all through history. He described the varieties of physical types among the Jews as a further demonstration that the purity idea is a myth.

American Jews' Inheritance

Rabbi Steinberg said the test of Jewishness is not religion, "for a Jew remains a Jew even though he may become an irreligious person." He rejected the word "nationality" because, he said, it carries suggestions of divided political loyalty.

"The only characterization which holds water is that Judaism represents a religious ivilization. That means that Judaism includes among its elements not only religion but the Hebrew language and literature, folkways and customs, folklore and ethics, and all the other elements which go to make up any civilization.

"Practically speaking, that

means that the American Jew 10 the heir to two civilizations-the American civilization of the land o. his residence and the Jewish civilization of his descent."

Nations Warned of Hitler's Pretensions

Adolf Hitler may seem to be muddling through, but the nations of the world must not be misled as to the German dictator's pacific pretensions, Rabbi Louis I. Newman said in his sermon at Congregation Rodeph Sholom, 7 West Eighty-third street.
"The return of the Saar was ex-

pected," Rabbi Newman pointed out, warning that the development must be regarded as an additional reason for humanity's vigilance against the Third Reich.

Fears New Offensive

"After a pause," he said, "it is entirely possible that Hitler will launch a new offensive among German-speaking groups in Europe, which will embroil him with

"The Reich is isolated among the nations, and alliances have been formed to guarantee protection against a possible Nazi attack. Whatever the seeming tenacity of Hitler's rule, liberals cannot look with sympathy upon his regime until he opens up the concentration camps and frees the prisoners, until . . . he ceases the propaganda against cultural and humanitarian values which have thrust Germany back into medievalism."

Bishop McConnell

Deploring the tendency to exggerated nationalism which he declared will lead inevitably to war, Bishop Francis J. McConnell of the Methodist Episcopal Church asked for better understanding among nations in an address yesterday at services of Temple Rodeph Sholom, 7 West Eighty-third

He asserted that there must be a "divided loyalty" among people a loyalty to the respective nation and to humanity. "The great contribution of the Jews," he said, "is that they are loyal to the nations among which they live and to their own people." Rabbi Louis I. Newman conducted the services.

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Urge Religious Liberalism for Jews of Reich

New Start Seen Bringing Closer Bond, Rabbis **Tell Parley**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN.-Jewish religious liberalism must strengthen the religious sense and faith in the future of German Jewry, who must recognize that the Jewish community is no longer something that has arisen out of the work of individuals, but rises above all individuals, speakers at the conference of Religious Liberal Jews of Germany declared.

Expressing complete faith in the mission of liberal Judaism in Germany and confidence in the survival of liberal Judaism there, Rabbi Dr. M. Dienemann formulated the following theses for the future program of the organization.

Enumerates Vital Points

1. Jewish religious liberalism proceeds from the revelation of God, and evaluates it as a gift to man, which he should use with the force of his feeling and his reason and build it into his work.

2. Jewish religious liberalism stands aloof from dogmatic rigidness; confers upon the Jewish community super-individual rights and does not recognize the right of the individual to create the form of his religious life without association with the community.

3. The movement regards as an all-unifying order of religious life as indispensable.

4. Jewish religious liberalism aims at the development of religious life, but does not seek to decide Judaism from the political aspect and its day-by-day manisfestations.

5. While fully comprehending the idea of Palestine and Zionism, Jewash religious liberalism holds that life in the countries of the world is not of inferior value, but it recognizes that no matter where Jews live, they must live a life of activity in Judaism, and live together with the nations.

"We want to make a new start," Rabbi Dienemann said. "We stand today where our fathers stood 100 years ago. At that time the call was from the community to the individual; today the call is to the community. The accept has shifted, but the basis is the same."

(Continued from Page Six) Excellency for receiving today a Jewish delegation and giving it a chance to express itself about the present situation in Harbin. I hope that your Excellency will kindly convey our feelings and suggestions to the Manchukuo Government and assure them of Jewish desire to see peace and prosperity maintained throughout the country. No special favors are asked for from the former to the latter, except adherence to law and the punishment of those who transgress it and challenge it.

"We are not unmindful of the fact that the principal foundation of all states are good laws and good arms. We respectfully withdraw from your presence and thank you again for giving us the privilege to lay before your Excellency the grievances of the Jews in Manchukuo, which are shared by us and which we hope will be redressed and the majesty of the law vindicated.'

Minister Ariyoshi replied, expressing sympathy with the object of the delegation, to help the Jews in Harbin, and promising to forward the copy of the resolution to the Foreign Office.

"The phenomenon is explained by the growing emigration of German Jews to Palestine during the last two years. Palestine immigrants previously came mostly from Poland and Russia. According to German statistics, ten thousand German Jews emigrated to Palestine in the last two years. According to Palestine statistics, the number was over fifteen thousand. The latter figure should be the correct one, since German statistics only count those who went to Palestine direct from Germany, and many must have gone after an intermediary stay in another country.

Exchange Agreement

"Most of these immigrants from Germany are people who were active in Germany industry and commerce, and belonged to the well-to-do classes, and who go to Palestine not only with their labor power and their skill, but also to invest their capital in economic enterprizes. Thus German emigration to Palestine has meant also an emigration of German capital into Palestine.

"To prevent this emigration of capital exercising an unfavorable influence on the tense currency conditions of the German Reichsbank, Germany has successfully transformed this export of capital into an exports clearing system or transfer arrangements, regulated by an order of the Ministry of Economic Affairs of August 28, 1933, which has for the last eighteen months made it possible to carry out the transfer.

Economic Laws' Cited

"On this basis, the prospective emigrant pays his money into a special account in the Reichsbank, and the importers in Palestine, who are required to pay for their goods in German currency, make angements thro heir ar Templar Bank in Jaffa, which acts as trustee, paying in Palestine pounds, and the prospective emigrants receive payment for their German deposits from the Templar Bank in Palestine in Palestine pounds. The emigrant is not at liberty to use the money as he wishes. It is available only for two purposes, the import of German goods and long-term investment of capital.

"These circumstances explain the increase in German trading relations with Palestine, but they hardly explain why they have doubled, since practically the whole of the economically active population of Palestine consists of Jews, and the new Germany certainly cannot be assumed to belong to those countries that enjoy the special sympathies of the
