Moscow Art Players To Give Repertory

The Moscow Art Players will open at the Majestic Theatre on February 19 and will give a repertory of classic and Soviet plays until March 3. This will be the first time an American audience will have had the opportunity of witnessing a Russian company performing popular plays of present-day Russia in the Russian language.

Brought here by S. Hurok, the Moscow Art Players are under the direction of Michel Chekhov nephew of the famous playwright and writer. The younger Chekhov in his own right is an actor and director of fine and discerning talent. He will act in several of the productions himself and will be supported by such well-known stars as P. Pavlov, Vera Gretch and M. Krijanovskaya.

Each Sunday evening, while the Moscow Art Players are here, will be devoted to scenes from the works of Anton Chekhov. Besides these performances, the repertory includes "Revisor," "Poverty is No Crime," "The Seagull," and "Marriage." Although all the plays will be done in Russian, Mr. Hurok has arranged devices whereby the audience can understand and follow the scenes with little difficulty.

Among the legitimate attractions slated for the coming week are "Bitter Oleander" (Lyceum), and "The Elder Set" (Ritz), for Monday night; a revival of "Rain" (Majestic), for Tuesday night; and "The Longacre for Wednesday; "The Closed Garden," for Thursday; and the Moscow Art Players at the Majestic on Saturday.

"Merely We Roll Along," the Kaufman-Hart hit which has been doing just that for many months, will close this Saturday evening. To take the road, motion picture rights have been sold for a large sum, but when the picture is made a new scene will be added. The play which runs backwards, comes to a close with the young playwright graduating from college and filled with desire to do worldly-wise things in the theatre to further the cause of mankind.

Necessity to say, this is not the German view; and confirmation of the conception of a Germanic type, embodying all the virtues of a superman, is found in the evidence of archaeology and racial history.

Cites Hitler's 'Mein Kampf'

Herl Hitler himself affirms in "Mein Kampf" that the Aryans alone among the peoples of the world have been "founders of culture," and another prominent official of the Reich, Dr. Frank, is reported to have declared that from the substance of the Germanic race have issued the highest achievements of mankind, so that it might be considered the duty of the entire human race to safeguard this basic element.

This may come as a surprise to those who are not familiar with certain lines of argument in the racial question. It is a view which derives from the middle of the last century and the theories of the Comte de Gobineau, in which the Aryans, the white races par excellence, were regarded in their mission to mankind at large as only a little more than the angels.

Modern Models

Of 'Aryan' Race Briefly, the German doctrine of the "Aryan" race is that the tall, long-headed, fair-complexioned Nordic peoples of northern Europe are the modern representatives of the original "Aryans." To this race is due the high standard of culture found throughout the civilized world. Not only is this true in antiquity, in the civilizations of Mesopotamia, Egypt, the Mediterranean and so forth, but even the contribution to culture of Romance countries in modern times is to be attributed to descendants of the Nordic race. They were endowed with certain bodily characters, which represent the highest evolution from the human form; and in addition they possessed, as a racial inheritance, certain outstanding mental qualities.

It was in virtue of these physical and mental characters that they became the ruling classes in most ancient and modern societies. Wherever the Nordic strain is mixed with other breeds, it is said, it deteriorates. The aim of the state, therefore, must be to preserve the purity, integrity and dominance of the Aryan race, biologically, socially and politically.

Earliest 'Aryans' Proto-Nordics?

It would be beyond the present purpose to enter into a detailed examination of these interpretations of ethnological, archaeological and historical fact, or to weigh the probabilities of the earliest "Aryans," speaking people were Proto-Nordics, who carried their tongue to the other races of Europe.

But the Nordics were a far wandering people who irrupted into many lands is unquestioned; and as nomads their early culture was crude, and the people they conquered must almost invariably have been of a higher culture than themselves. But whatever their cultural status, a strict anthropometric measure applied to the modern population of Germany would find Nordic in all their racial purity in an embarrassingly small minority.

Dogma Could Not Stand Test

That Germany has adopted a highly colored interpretation of history, which in the greater part of its detail would not stand the test of a moment's impartial examination, is a matter of lesser import beside the fact that, by the forcible imposition of certain views on race and racial history, assumption has been taken as proof; and research and its results, unless orthodox, have been hampered by a number of questions such as racial heredity, racial admixture, the relation of race, mentality and culture, and the issue upon which science would hesitate to pronounce finally in the light of the evidence available.

Such dogmatic assumptions, unfortunately, have their attraction for the political doctrinaire and the agitator; and it is perhaps to be regretted, therefore, that the International Congress of Anthropological and Ethnological Sciences did not see its way to promote a discussion into such racial problems on broad lines. The machinery may seem overwrought; but at least the truth would have been made available in authoritative form to all.

Jewish Women of British Isles Raise \$125,000 for Palestine

JERUSALEM.—A pile of Jewish women in the British Isles as well as in the large cities of England and Ireland, banded together to raise their share of the funds for the settlement of German-Jewish refugees, was drawn by Mrs. I. M. Sieff, chairman of the Women's Committee for German Jewish women and children and president of the Women's Zionist Federation of Great Britain and Ireland, whom she was interviewed in Jerusalem.

Mrs. Sieff, who has had her finger on the pulse of fund-raising in England since the beginning of the Hitler episode, arrived in this country with her husband. She has visited several of the Palestine projects into which she has put so much energy in the British Isles, although the welcome accorded her by old friends and the attending of conferences in connection with WIZO work have curtailed her touring program. Before leaving she plans to visit Ben Shimon and some of the colonies in the East.

\$125,000 Raised

Response to plans for money in England was very generous, Mrs. Sieff said, pointing out that there are over 800,000 Jews in the United Kingdom.

Although there was some difficulty in organizing quickly and efficiently the committee which initiated the quota of £100,000, the huge sum was raised after tremendous effort. Almost every shilling came from the pocketbooks of women, she said.

Mrs. Sieff asserted that human interest "lurks behind" the cold figure of the £25,000. Included in the sum are £10,000 for more or less well-to-do paid to

attend a single luncheon in London, as well as the hard-earned pennies of small-town folk in other parts of England and Ireland, who attended more modestly priced luncheons, bazars, card parties and other functions to aid Jewish women and children from Germany.

There will be increased difficulty in raising this year's quota, Mrs. Sieff felt. The drive began as long ago as last October.

No Settlement in Isles

While the mechanical work of organizing committees did not have to be repeated, she said, the sharp reaction to the German attack has subsided and it will be necessary to appeal to the intellectual rather than to the emotional generosity of the donors.

The settlement of German children in large numbers, Mrs. Sieff said, has not been attempted nor encouraged in England. Since there are no communal settlements to rely upon, German children must be placed in private homes or institutions.

This system of rehabilitation cannot be as satisfactory as in Palestine where, through the communal settlement, the child becomes part of a group and is eventually taken into the warp of the country.

Farm Desertion Disturbs When Mrs. Sieff visits the Eneke colonies she may recognize many young friends. Last September Mrs. Sieff, while in Germany, saw several groups of children just returning to their departure for Palestine.

She is disturbed by the report that there is a tendency for young women to desert the agricultural settlements for the cities, but she is gratified by the progress being made in the WIZO centers at Napier and in the East End of London, that by intensive and intelligent guidance Jewish young women can be bound to the soil.

British Uphold Palestine Act On Revisionists

Secretary Says Colonial Regimes Have Powers of Revocation

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
LONDON, Feb. 6.—Colonial governments in the British Empire have the power to revoke citizenship rights of individuals they consider as undesirable, Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister declared today in the House of Commons when the question of revocation of the citizenship rights of Aba Achmeier by the Palestine government was raised.

Questioned by Colonel Josiah Wedgwood, Sir Philip answered that he had never approved of the action and that he had no power to approve, since such a prerogative belonged to the various colonial governments.

Achmeier, acquitted of the murder of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, Lehorote leader, was held in jail for twenty-one months for membership in the Briti Habryinnon, alleged secret terrorist organization. The sentence was reduced by the Court of Appeals to eighteen months.

The Palestine government recently notified Achmeier that unless he should allow himself to be contrary his citizenship would be cancelled.

Protests from Revisionist groups all over the world followed on the basis of the notice of revocation. Dr. Yevin and Joshua Lichter, convicted with Achmeier in the Briti Habryinnon case, were also notified that their citizenship rights had been withdrawn.

Revisionists to Protest To British Consul

At a meeting protesting the imprisonment and asking the release of Aba Achmeier, Zionist Revisionist, will be held Saturday evening by the Youth Zionist Revisionist Organisation of America at the Williamsburgh Y.M.H.A., Broadway and Rodney street, Brooklyn. Resolutions adopted at the meeting calling for the release of Achmeier will be forwarded to the British Consul's in New York.

Speakers at the meeting will be William B. Ziff, Belish Epstein and H. Shulman.

Achmeier, acquitted of complicity in the murder of Dr. Arlosoroff, is at present serving an eighteen-month sentence for membership in an alleged Revisionist terrorist organization.
