HungerStrike At Acre Jail In Third Day

Jewish Prisoners Reject Even Water; Officials Ignore Bail Plea

JERUSALEM, Feb. 14.—The
Palestine government left unanswered a memorandum submitted by Jewish organizations today urging the release on bail of more than 100 Jewish hunger strikers in the Acre jail. The local authorities in Acre declined to give information as to the state of health of the strikers who have not tasted food for three days.

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) JERUSALEM, Feb. 14.—The more than 100 prisoners in the Acre jail who have been arrested for illegal entry into Palestine, today entered upon their third day of hunger striking, making the strike complete by rejecting even water.

The strike, undertaken as a protest against protracted delays in their trials, is attracting tremenattention throughout the country. Newspaper offices are besieged by crowds demanding action on the part of the Jewish Agency, the representative Jewish body. The judicial committee of the Jewish Community Council is also bombarded with demands by Jewish crowds that action be taken with the government to end the unlawful prolongation of imprison-ment of those under arrest and

thus end the hunger strike. Petition Wauchope Several Jewish delegations today

visited the authorities at Acre and at Jerusalem. A delegation of Jewish leaders is also intervening with the High Commissioner for justice for the striking prisoners. The Palestine press devotes long articles to descriptions of the tragedy of the prisoners, who have been held for a long time without trial. The newspapers accuse the Palestine authorities of acting unlawfully by keeping in prison even such immigrants as have been recommended by the court to be permitted to remain in

Many of the prisoners who are still in jail have long served the which they have been sen tenced for illegal entry. The government cannot deport them, however, because they entered the country without passports and refuse to disclose the lands of their origin, to which they would have to be deported. The majority are men without countries, holding documents which would not permit them to re-enter any country.

Arabs Fell Watchman In Attempted Robbery

Jaffa Police Search Citizens to Halt Crime

JAFFA, Feb. 14.—The increase in violent Arab attacks in which knives and revolvers have been used today led the police to search pedestrians for firearms and other weapons.

Cars and carriages were also stopped by the police who searched the passengers. The police believe that this hunt for criminals will tend to decrease crime in Palestine.

Danzig Seen Veering Closer To Reich Rule

Nazi Move for New Vote Seen Changing City to Second Saar

DANZIG, Feb. 14.—The Nazi
ambitions to convert Danzig into a second Saar so that it may eventually rejoin Germany today assumed a concrete character when the majority of the Danzig Senate, consisting of Nazi members, officially applied for the dissolution of the Danzig parliament and for new parliamentary elec-

The new elections, which will probably take place on April 7, are expected to result in a victory for the Nazis and may eventually bring the status of the Danzig Jews to the same as that of the Jews in the Saar.

The Jewish population in Danzig has long been terrorized by the Nazis, even before they became a majority in the Danzig Senate. Sean Lester, the High Commissioner appointed by the League of Nations for the Free State of Danzig, has done little to curb the openly anti-Jewish activities Danzig. The propaganda against the Jews has been conducted in Danzig by means of leaflets, posters, the Nazi press and even by private business enterprises.

Danzig Jews are awaiting with fear the expected anti-Semitic Nazi propaganda which will appear in connection with the forthcoming new elections. Hundreds of Jewish families will be compelled to move from Danzig if the elections should turn the Free City over entirely into the hands of the

Rosalsky, the Mayor's mediator in poultry affairs, gained almost unanimous support of the 300 members for a reorganization program abolishing the offices of president and chairman of the board of directors.

Kashruth Body Mond Is Named Reorganized at Head of British Stormy Parley Boycott Body

Elected His Aides on Joint Council

LONDON, Feb. 14.—Sir Robert Mond, one of the leading Jewish industrialists in England, was elected president of the Joint Representative Council for the Boycott of German Goods at the first annual meeting held by the Council here this week.

Rabbi Dr. Moses Gaster, R. D. Blumenfeld, the internationally known editor, Philip Guedalla, well known writer, and Norman Haire were elected vice-presidents of the Council.

The Council amended its constitution to read that the object of the organization shall be the taking of all lawful measures to ensure that the Jews of the British Empire abstain from purchasing or using German goods until such time as complete freedom of belief and restoration of full civil rights is accorded to all German subjects without distinc-

In Palestine

Report Wa hope Plans Steep Ta. 3 on All New ()ves

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) JERUSALEM, Feb. 14.-A system of overtaxation will be introduced in Palestine on new orange groves for several years, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learned today from a reliable source.

This drastic measure will be introduced by the government in order altogether to stop or limit the planting of new orange groves in Palestine. The measure is proposed by the High Commissioner himself.

The Executive of the Jewish Agency, fearing that the proposed measure will affect Jewish growth in Palestine and may also affect Jewish employment in the country, conferred with a number of Jewish experts today on plans to oppose the government's project.

"The government should not interfere with private initiative," is the opinion of the Jewish Agency. Leaders of the banking institutions in Palestine are also opposed to the projected restrictions which the government contemplates in the citrus industry.

In view of the fact that the measures against the development of new plantations may also affect the Jewish banking system in Palestine, Mr. Hoofien, director of the Anglo-Palestine Bank was one of those present at the conference which the Jewish Agency held today in an effort to counteract the government plan. Mr. H. Viteles, director of the Central Cooperative Bank, and Mr. Tolkowski, director of one of the largest orange ship-ping companies, also participated in the conference.

Italy Gives Rabbi Order of the Crown

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) ROME, Feb. 14.—David Ephrato, chief rabbi of Alexandria, Egypt, formerly of Florence, was awarded the title of Grand Officer of the Order of the Italian Crown by the Italian government today. Rabbi Ephrato was the leader of the Jewish National Fund in Italy.

Lazzar Otreve, a Jewish industrialist, was awarded a gold medal by the government today in recognition of his contributions in the field of education.

Spread Race Knowledge, Nazis Order Health Men

The manifold activities of Arnold Bernstein, German-Jewish shipping magnate who retained control of his Arnold Bernstein Line after the Nazi advent to power, have kept European shipping circles buzzing. Only a few weeks ago, Herr Bernstein announced a new line-the Palestine Navigation Company-which would operate steamers under the Palestine flag, manned by Jewish crews, between Palestine and Europe. The first of the line's steamers was christened the Tel Aviv.

Last week, Herr Bernstein startled London shipping circles by snatching two Red Star liners out of the hands of a British syndicate

which had bid for them. He and nounced from Antwerp that the liners would fly the flag of a new line which he will operate between New York and Europe in addition to the Arnold Bernstein Line.

Herr Bernstein will thus have the distinction of operating under two flags-the modified Union Jack of the Jewish National homeland and the Swastika of Nazi Germany. \$ \$ \$

Leslie Hore-Belisha, youthful British Jew who fills the post of Minister of Transport in the present government, has set London tongues a-wagging with his rapidfire innovations. Everyone talks about them and wherever one goes, one finds their evidence. Hore-Belisha thought there was too much noise in the city streets. Therefore, unnecessary "hooting" is now punishable by fines. Then he decided to give the poor pedestrian a break. So, at important intersections now, one finds a large orange colored glass globe mounted on a triped pole. At these "Belisha beacons" the pedestrian has the right of way. Theoretically, automobiles must halt at the heacons to permit the pedestrians in for boxing in a big way. Lonto cross.

There has been a noticeable reluctance on the part of pedestrians an impressive pair of mitts and to put the beacons to the test, the majority preferring the safety of the white-sleeved traffic officer's arm to the mute beacon. However. the beacons are gaining in popularity as the pedestrians find that autos do occasionally stop when the former signal from the curb their desire to cross at the beacon.

The beacons have also furnished 2,000 to Attend Reception for a new London sport and their breakage, as a result, has been terrific. Target practice, with the beacons as targets, has been a popular pastime. The current vogue is to swipe the orange globe and bring it home as a trophy to one's daring.

Dissension in A. J. C.

It seems that the American Jewish Congress has changed its mind about holding democratic elections throughout the country on April 28. The sudden call issued yesterday for an extraordinary session of the Congress to be held on March 16 in Philadelphia indicates that not all is well in the ranks of the administrative committee.

This call makes it clear that the Philadelphia gathering "will have to determine the date and the method of the referendum on the World Jewish Congress and the elections to the American Jewish Congress." Since the date has long been set for the 28th of April, one wonders why a special session should be called now for its determination.

The same question arises as to the methods of the referendum and of the elections. It has long been announced that the elections and the referendum would be carried out on a 100 per cent democratic basis. Even the details of the electoral plan were made public. Why, then, an extraordinary session to again determine this method?

The Projected Revision

The sudden decision to call a special session of the Congress in Philadelphia just a few weeks before the democratic elections to the Congress are scheduled to take place is nothing more than an attempt to revise not only the date, but also all the plans for the forthcoming elec-

Sharp differences of opinion have arisen recently in the ranks of the administrative committee of the American Jewish Congress as to whether the principle of democratic elections can altogether be carried out in the United States. While some were of the opinion that this principle should be abolished, others insisted upon carrying it out at all costs.

This issue loomed larger when certain members of the administrative committee realized that the date for the democratic elections was rapidly approaching and that no efficient machinery had yet been prepared to carry out the elections on the fixed date. Furthermore, there are a good many financial complications which could not be avoided if the elections were actually to be held on a democratic basis.

A Pledge Modified

Already committed to the pledge that the elections to the American Jewish Congress and the referendum on the World Jewish Congress would be conducted on a democratic principie and on April 28, the administrative committee has seen no other way out than to call the extraordinary session in Philadelphia. It is at this session that the date for the elections will be definitely postponed. It is also at this session that the question whether these elections are to be democratic will come up for serious discussion.

Nobody can tell how many delegates from the provincial cities will attend the session in Philadelphia. One thing is certain, however. This session will be one of the stormiest the American Jewish Congress has ever had. Should the principle of democratic elections be rejected at this session, there will be more than one resignation from the administrative committee of the American Jewish Congress.

World Press Digest

Marshall Voices Views on Fascism

How should the Jews in America act in the coming struggle with Fascism in the United States?

James Marshall, young Jewish leader and member of the Executive of the American Jewisa Committee, in an interview in the New York World-Telegram answers this question as follows:

First of all, they must rid themselves of the false notion that Fascism is their problem, that it is aimed especially at Jews. It is not, and all the Hitlers in the world cannot make it so. It will destroy the liberty of all people. It will suppress freedom of press, of speech, of action. It will crack down on all labor organizations and every rival political party. nothing could be more in violation of the spirit of the American Constitution and of the American Revolution than the pro - American programs and propaganda of our Fascist groups.

'Jews Not a Nation'

Secondly, a large group of Jews must eliminate from their psychology and vocabulary the theory that the Jews are a nation. This is a ghetto survival, and the sooner it is forgotten the better it will be.

From the Jewish point of view it is ridiculous because it accepts the racial theory of nationalism of the Nazis. I do not mean that Jews should cease to be Jews. They have accepted the land of their birth and its institutions with devotion; they have loyally fought for it and helped develop it without abandoning this Judaism.

Assimilation Not Solution

Assimilation has been demonstrated to be an impossible solution by the savants of Herr Hitler, who have told us that, ordinary laws of eugenics notwithstanding, it takes only one grandparent or a marriage ceremony to make a Jew.

In the third place, merely because a large proportion of Jews are middle class merchants and manufacturers and professional men, they must not permit themselves to be lured into the Fascist movement. They cannot hope to buy the salvation of their fellow Jews orexcept rarely-of themselves. If there is anything which Germany teaches us it is that the support of Fascists, whether they be like the Hitler Nazis or like the Hugenburg Nationalists cannot offer escape.

Avoid Movements

Not only must Jews not be drawn into Fascist movements such as the National Liberty League and America First merely because as business and professional men they are oppressed by taxation and labor costs, but they must not let themselves be brought in more to show that they are not Communists.

Of course, the Jewish banker and merchant are not Communists and there are many ways of showing their opposition, of illustrating that they are not disciples of Marx and Trotzky, without becoming converts to Hitler and Mussolini.

The fact that Italian Fascism is not anti-Semitic is due to the circumstances that there are few Jews in Italy. They form an inconsequential minority



there. But in Italy, too, that freedom and democracy which are the result of the French and American revolutions has been destroyed, and it is in that freedom that Jews have thriven.

Shun Timidity

In America, however, Fascism will, if it comes, be different than in Italy. Here Jews will be lumped with other minorities, the Negroes, the foreign born and labor, as the special objects of Fascist animosity. The literature of the budding American Fascist movement gives ample proof of this.

Jewish people of America should not be either timid or inactive. They should not refrain from participation normally in the industrial, professional, scholarly and political life of the country in the hope that if they are demure the angel of death will pass their door. Retreat behind curtained windows will only result in psychoneurosis and a new ghetto.

Farm Report Reveals Jews Stick to Land

Society Granted Loans of \$7,167,000, Davidson Discloses

The Jewish farmers in the United States are holding on and are determined to remain on the land despite the depression, Gabriel Davidson, general manager of the Jewish Agricultural Society, announced yesterday, in the fiftyfifth annual report of the society.

The report discloses that more than \$7,167,000 has been granted by the society through its farm loan department to Jewish farmers in forty different states. The repayment of the loans is spread over a long number of years. Bonuses as commissions and payment of renewal charges are not required by the society, according to the report.

The society maintains a department which gives advice and guid-ance as well as aid to those who desire to buy farms and take up farming as their life work. During the past seventeen years advice has been given by this department to about 18,000 persons and farms were established for 1,356 Jewish families.

The society maintains a staff of agricultural experts who advise the Jewish farmer on every conceivable branch of farming. More than 17,000 Jewish young men have secured farm employment through the society since its establishment.

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) PARIS, Feb. 14.—The Executive

of the World Revisionist Union issued a statement here today charging that the immigration department of the Jewish Agency and the Palestine Offices in various countries are systematically violating provisions of the agreement between the Revisionists and the Executive which restored the rights of Revisionists to receive immigration certificates for

"In some countries," the statement says, "the Palestine offices have not received any notification from the Executive to restore the Revisionists in their rights for Palestine immigration certificates. Representatives of the Revisionists are not admitted in those countries to the meetings of the Palestine offices and therefore have no way of defending their rights.

"In Poland," the statement complains, "Revisionist representatives are not admitted to the meetings of the Palestine offices on the pretext that they took part in a demonstration against the Warsaw Palestine Office some months ago. The presiding board of the Palestine Office in Warsaw includes representatives of all Zionist parties except the Revi-

The statement of the Revisionist Executive also protests that the Immigration Department of the Jewish Agency sent telegraphic instructions to the most important Palestine Offices in Europe to the effect that he Revisionists be given the certificates due them, not in one lot but in monthly in-

Didn't Inform Palestine Tel Aviv, Manned by Jews, Then Sails to Casa Blanca

LISBON, Feb. 14.—Flying the flag of Palestine, the steamer "Tel Aviv," the first Jewish boat of the Palestine Shipping Company, arrived in the Lisbon harbor and was given a great reception by the Jewish community here. The Jewish community here. The steamer sailed at midnight for Casa Blanca.

The "Tel Aviv," which has a tonnage of 10,000, is operated as a single class boat, and is built to accomodate 400 passengers. A large proportion of the crew is Jewish. There is a school on the ship in which fifteen to twenty men will be trained for service at sea while serving apprenticeship.

The Palestine Shipping Company was founded by Arnold Bernstein, who operates a regular passenger line between New York and Europe. The company is capitalized at \$300,000.

Wilno Bomb Throwers Again Elude Capture

WILNO, Feb. 14.—A bomb was a hurled into the premises of a Jewish store here today, causing damages but no casualties.

The police could find no trace of the bomb-throwers. It is believed, however, that an organized gang of anti-Semitic youths exists in Wilno for the special purpose of throwing bombs into Jewish houses, since during the last few weeks several bombings have occurred in the Jewish districts of the city and the bombers have eluded capture.

he accused the Polish government of leading the 3,500,000 Jews of Poland into a catastrophic situation. The statement described specific discriminations practiced by the government against the Jews. It emphasized the systematic ejection of Jews from Poland's economic system. It accused the government of putting obstacles in the way of efforts to productivize the Jewish masses in the country.

"We are vitally disturbed and hit by the fact that the government is not making even the slightest endeavor to ease the fate of the Jewish population," Dr. Thon declared in his statement, made from the parliamentary tribune. "The government behaves towards the Jews if not with complete hostility at least with a great measure of ill will."

Dr. Thon then pointed out that while the government is not permitting violence against the Jews, it disregards the disgraceful insults and calumnies which the Jews are now compelled to face on many sides in Poland.

"It is the conviction of the Jew-

lish population," Dr. Than states, that the government desires to eliminate the last vestiges of the Jewish autonomy guaranteed to the Jewish communities under the Polish constitution. At present the government is planning to unjustifiably liquidate the administrations of the Jewish communities throughout Poland, though no one is able to understand the motive behind this consideration.'

Emphasizing that the Polish government hinders rather than assists the extension of the Jewish school system Dr. Thon declared that the Jewish opulation is being crushed under the weight of heavy taxes. Intimately bound to the State, the Jews have a right to claim full rights and protection from the government, Dr. Than

"I wish to place here on record that in every step and in every sphere of public life the Jews are being treated by the government like a step-child. It is therefore no wonder that with such a state of affairs the feeling of indignation and embitterment grows among the Jewish population, generating a condition of hope-less despair," Dr. Thon concluded
