

Keep Up Fight Against Jews, Is Nazi's Plea

Von Leers Boasts of New Friends Reich Has Made in East

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, March 7.—Despite the belief that no further anti-Jewish propaganda would be conducted by the Nazis within Germany, Dr. Johann von Leers, the leading authority on the Jewish question, today delivered a bitter attack against the Jews at a meeting in Dusseldorf.

"The exclusion of Jews from all state offices is only the first victory in our battle. The fight must be continued. We may carry it further against the Jewish spirit," Dr. Leers said.

Claims New Friends

Denying that Germany's anti-Jewish attitude has damaged the commercial interests of Germany, Dr. Leers said that what counts most in the syndicates gained of many eastern countries.

"We have gained the sympathy of many eastern states in our fight against the Jews, and the Jews is coming also in the western democracies," he stated.

Echoing Dr. Leers in an article which appeared today in the Dusseldorf paper, *Volksparole*, which says that "the Jewish question is the crux of the world problem."

"Many people," the paper writes, "make the mistake of judging political, cultural and economic events only by their external aspects. This is the only reason that sinister powers like Jewry have been able to gain so much influence. We must all do our part to unmask the Jew." The article also learns to have solid knowledge of the Jewish question. With implacable will we shall succeed in crushing these sinister powers, and completely," the paper concludes.

Memel Jews Are Scored For Their 'Aloofness'

The trial of the ten will open Tuesday. They are all members of the Shomre Shabbath organization, formed to stimulate observance of the Sabbath in Palestine. They are accused of smashing the windows of Jewish shops open on the Sabbath, and of attacking Jews whom they found riding in taxis.

Palestine Hails 85th Birthday Of T.G. Masaryk

Mass Meetings, Prayers at Walling Wall for Czech President

JERUSALEM, March 7.—The eighty-fifth birthday of President Masaryk of Czechoslovakia was enthusiastically celebrated in Palestine today.

A large mass meeting arranged by the Executive of the Jewish Agency opened the celebration. Representatives of Czechoslovakia as well as Jewish leaders were among the speakers at the meeting, at which Professor Masaryk's sympathies for Jews and for Zionism were highly praised.

Special prayers for Professor Masaryk were said at the Walling Wall in Jerusalem by religious Jews, wishing the Czechoslovakian president a long life.

The entire Hebrew press of Palestine today devoted long editorials to Masaryk, emphasizing his fight for human rights and for the rebirth of the Czechoslovakian nation.

Yiddish Actors Evicted From Warsaw Quarters

Would Halt Assimilation In Rumania

Dr. Vaida Voevod Warns Jews It Will Spur Anti-Semitism

BUCHAREST, March 7.—A warning to the Jews in Rumania not to assimilate with the Rumanian population was sounded today by Dr. Vaida-Voevod, ex-Premier and leader of the anti-Semitic movement here, addressing a mass meeting in Transylvania.

"Those Jews who are attempting to assimilate with the non-Jewish population are only causing more anti-Semitism," Dr. Vaida-Voevod said in his speech. "The Jews are a minority within Rumania and must consider themselves as such."

Jews Ask Censorship

The anti-Jewish agitation which is growing throughout Rumania has forced the Union of Rumanian Jews to suggest that the government censor anti-Semitic publications.

The Union of Rumanian Jews point out that the Hilbert newspaper in Bukowina are publishing articles full of insults and lies about the Jews, despite the government order prohibiting racial incitement in the press. The Union also emphasizes that anti-Semitic pamphlets 100 years old are being used in the anti-Jewish campaign headed by ex-Premier Vaida-Voevod.

"Even the 'ritual murder' lie is being revived now in Rumania, and the censor is silent. Nobody protests against all this, which may lead to serious consequences," the Union of Rumanian Jews complains.

Rallies Barred For Hauptmann

Canadian Unit Urges Executive to Act for Peace

MONTREAL, March 7.—The World Zionist Executive was urged today by the Zionist Organization of Canada to call a round table conference of representatives of all Zionist parties, in order to bring peace in the Zionist movement.

A resolution to this effect was adopted by the National Council of the Zionist Organization of Canada at a special meeting. The resolution, which was transmitted to the World Zionist Executive in London, reads:

"We strongly urge the importance of calling a round table conference of all Zionist parties at this juncture in the belief that a meeting of responsible men of each party may create a spirit of compromise and result in the peace reconstruction of Palestine so sorely needs."

Revisionists Quit Shekel Board Over Text Change

ORT to Get Big Loan for Bureya Plan

Soviet Will Guarantee Sum, Bodenheimer Discloses

A huge loan to settle 25,000 Jewish families in Biro-Bidjan, the Five Eastern Jewish Autonomous Soviet district, will be raised by the ORT, the world Jewish relief organization, it was announced yesterday by Henri Bodenheimer, president of the World ORT Federation and one of the leaders of French Jewry, who is now here on a short visit. Those to be settled are Jews from Poland and German Jewish refugees.

In a statement to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency Mr. Bodenheimer declared that Dr. Lwowitch, the well-known ORT leader, has now been asked to consummate a deal with the Soviet government by which Moscow will assume the liability as to the principal and the interest of the loan.

Soviet to Repay Loan

The loan, it is understood, will be fully guaranteed and repaid by the Soviet government. The first payment will be made in 1940. The entire loan, with interest, will be paid off by the Soviet authorities within fifteen years.

"It Dr. Lwowitch's negotiations in Moscow are completed successfully we shall begin the settlement of Jewish refugees in Biro-Bidjan by this summer," Mr. Bodenheimer stated.

"The importance of reorganizing Jewish economy to place more Jews in industry and agriculture was stressed at a reception given Wednesday night to Mrs. Bodenheimer by the People's ORT Federation at the Pennsylvania Hotel. More than 100 persons were present."

"The Jew must be made self-sustaining in agriculture and in industry," M. Bodenheimer said. He outlined the impoverishment of the Jews in Poland, where, he said, the ORT maintains forty-nine institutions for vocational training.

Previously Morris Waldman, secretary of the American Jewish Committee, had declared that "Jews should be able to find work on any occupations they are fitted for." Other speakers were Louis Boudin and Mrs. Frances Dolowitz, Dr. Henry Moskowitz presided.

Levin Pledges \$1,000 Yearly To Hadassah's Health Projects

Maurice Levin, president of Hearn's, and Mrs. Levin have pledged an annual gift of \$1,000 during their visit to the Hadassah chapter of Hadassah, to be used for the Hadassah health work in Palestine, it was announced yesterday by Mrs. David de Sola Pool, president of the chapter.

In announcing the gift, Mrs. Pool said that Mr. Levin's interest in Palestine is concerned with the first phase of the development in that country.

"Mr. Levin's broad philanthropic and civic interests are well known in this country," Mrs. Pool said. "Every community in which he has lived has benefited by his understanding and support. His keen interest in the development of Palestine is one of the same high quality."

Mr. Levin recently pledged an annual donation of \$2,500 during his visit to the development of Palestine to be used in purchasing land in Palestine.

The North African Situation

Trouble is afoot again in the French possessions in North Africa. A wave of discontent, inspired by foreign agitators, native politicians, French anti-Semitic propagandists and other disloyal elements, is being set on foot. The Jews will have an opportunity to fulfill their ancient role of being first to bear the brunt...

That there is a clearer realization of that in official circles is being made is shown by the fact that President Lebrun presided at a ministerial council to discuss the situation in North Africa...

The authorities are beginning to realize that the disorders in North Africa are not merely manifestations of anti-Semitic feeling despite the careful nurturing anti-Semites has had there from Nazi propagandists, French Fascists and native nationalist leaders such as Ben Djelloul who relishes the appellation of "Arab Hitler"...

For the purposes of these agitators, the Jews fit in admirably. They furnish an excellent target for the present. The Jews are the possession of keeping France too busy with her colonial possessions to bother with anything else.

What the French government must recognize, and again the beginning to understand, is that the attacks on the Jews in Algeria are the beginning of the open attack on the Jews in France...

France, pointed this out clearly in an article in which he declares that the present religious tension in Morocco, Tunis and Algeria is not due to the unfortunate economic situation and gives rise to considerable danger of taking an anti-French turn. He calls for urgent measures to meet this situation.

Newspaper correspondents report from North Africa that photographs of Hitler are to be seen everywhere in Algeria, that Moslems are using the "Heil Hitler" greeting and that nationalist leaders like Charles Netter, founder of the Alliance Israelite Universelle, the letter reported Nazi activities and pointed out that "even before the beginning of the war, it came into power, the German government counted on the anti-French movement among the Algerians to help it to complete its hold on the 19th Corps on the other side of the Mediterranean."

Dr. Netter also warned that "if we leave unprotected the Jews who have embraced the Jewish nationality for the past sixty-four years and who have played an important role in the defense of our country during the World War, the enmity (toward the Jews) would be extended also against the French inhabitants and against all other inhabitants of French nationality."

Youth Group to Honor Jewish Olympics Squad

A farwelled reception to the American Maccabi team which is to participate in the World Jewish Olympics at Tel Aviv in April will be given tomorrow at the U. S. Hilton, foot of Ninety-seventh street and the Hudson River.

The reception is under the auspices of the youth division of the American Jewish Congress, which is combining it with its annual dance. The entire Maccabi squad of athletes is expected to be present.

Young Judaea President Making Tour of South

David Levine, national president of Young Judaea, is touring the various Jewish communities in the South to stimulate expansion activities of the organization in that section of the country. It was announced that Mr. Levine's visits have been arranged in conjunction with the nationwide celebration of Young Judaea's Month during the month of March.

Zionist Overtures to Nazis

Dr. Joseph Rumschauer, official organ of the Zionist Organization in Germany, has more than once been criticized for its overtures to the German government. It has been pointed out more than once that this organ, while expressing the views of the Zionists in Germany, acts in contradiction with the interests of the general Jewish population in the Reich and with the attitude of world Jewry toward the Nazi regime.

The overture, which this official organ of the Zionists in Germany has just made, demanding from the Nazi government economic equality with the Jews, is another Jewry demands the restoration of full rights for German Jews, will again give ground for a new criticism of the German Zionist Organization, which is responsible for the views expressed in the "Juedische Rundschau."

Similarly, criticism may be expected also of the suggestion by the "Juedische Rundschau," that the Jews in Germany should demand autonomy under control of the Nazi government. By reducing the Jewish demands to cultural autonomy, the Nazis are conceding full rights for German Jewry. The Zionist paper actually agrees to limit the Jews of Germany to a ghetto life.

It is needless to say that the Jews of the world, fighting for the rights of the Jews in Germany, will not agree to the economic misdeeds which the Zionist organ in Berlin suggests. The slogan of world Jewry is that there can be no peace with Hitler until the Jews are restored to their full and equal rights. Tolerating Jews in commerce is not enough. Limiting Jews to a cultural ghetto life is not in accordance with Jewish demands.

Sansfellowing the Nazi Policy One can understand why the Jewish newspaper which appears in Germany may not be in a position fully to support the demands of world Jewry with regard to the restoration of Jewish rights. This, however, does not justify any attempt of the Zionists to come to an agreement with the German government. The last is exactly what the "Juedische Rundschau" has done.

By demanding only economic rights and cultural autonomy under the Nazi control, the "Juedische Rundschau" actually is conceding the Nazi policy of limiting the Jews to commerce and to their noncultural life. It does not demand anything more than the present "anybody" anyway at present.

A Dangerous Compromise The Zionist organ in Berlin has long been criticized for its overtures to the Nazi regime. It has been suspected that these overtures are made merely in order to prevent the persecution of Zionism in Germany. Whether this suspicion is correct or not is actually not of importance. The important thing is for the German government takes the Zionist overtures quite seriously, especially since the barrier agreements were concluded between Palestine and Germany.

The American Jewish Congress and other Jewish organizations in general are fighting for the restoration of Jewish rights in Germany should therefore be interested in letting the Nazi government feel that the opinion of the "Juedische Rundschau" is far from coinciding with the sentiments of the Jews of the world. London Paper Scores Nazi Leaders

Sir John Foster Fraser, writing of Germany in the London Evening Chronicle, says:

When German directors of opinion—Hitler, Goering and Goebbels—proclaim their peace policy, it is not the world it would be discourteous not to believe them. At the same time there seems a constant endeavor to stir up animosity against the world of other countries, even when the hostility shows signs of dying down.

Another bitter campaign against the Jews on the part of the grosser insults are again being flung at them. So life is one long nightmare to these hounded people.

Even Herr Rosenberg, the chief of the culture department, with whom I had a long talk when last I was in Berlin, has made a statement in which he has said that the "Juedische Rundschau" is a Semite, Herr Julius Streicher, editor of Der Stuermer, whom I met in Nuremberg last year, has made a statement in which he has made similar allegations against the Jews.

I would add that a letter from Munich assured me that Julius Streicher's outrageous assertions are received with disgust by reputable German citizens.

Paris Doctors Back Students On Alien Bars

Parliamentary Body Acts on Bills Curbing New Citizens

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
PARIS, March 7.—The Association of Doctors in Paris today voted unreserved approval of the action of French students who demanded that foreigners should not be permitted to practice medicine in France even if they are graduates of a French university.

A parliamentary commission today examined the bills submitted to the French Parliament, urging the restriction of rights of foreign and recently naturalized doctors. The commission decided that the

restrictions, if adopted, shall not be incorporated into the general law on naturalization, and should be considered "an exceptional measure dictated by present economic conditions."

Foreigners who have been students in France more than four years shall be exempted from the restrictions prohibiting them from practicing medicine in France, the parliamentary commission recommended.

Nazi 'Friends' Attack LaGuardia, Einstein

Less than 250 persons attended a Friends of New Germany mass meeting in the Yorkville Casino Wednesday night, widely advertised as an anti-LaGuardia rally. At the same time, 1,000 persons

paid fifty cents admission to attend a Hauptmann defense rally at Schwaben Hall, Brooklyn.

In Yorkville, Louis Zahne, Nazi propagandist, blamed "Einstein and the other" elders of Zion" for political corruption in New York politics. He scored the Mayor for his stand favoring the boycott of German goods. Aldermanic President Bernard S. Deutsch, Samuel Untermeyer and Rabbi Stephen S. Wise also came in for bitter attacks. Other speakers were Raymond J. Healey, Carl Nicolai and Ralph Dunn.

Meanwhile, in Schwaben Hall, Mrs. Erica Richard Hauptmann reaffirmed her belief in her husband's innocence and Johannes Weiss, chairman of the defense fund, assailed newspapers for articles concerning the fund.
