## Jews to Seek Aid of Carol In Rumania

### Press Appeals to Public to Abstain From Drive of Vaida-Voevod

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)  
BUCHAREST, March 12.—An appeal to King Carol, asking him to safeguard the rights of the Jews in Rumania, will be made by the Union of Rumanian Jews in accordance with a resolution adopted by that organization today. The resolution is the result of the wave of anti-Jewish propaganda which is now spreading throughout the country.

At the same time a united appeal by all Jewish parties has been made to the people of Rumania, urging them to abstain from the anti-Semitic campaign which is being led by ex-Premier Vaida-Voevod. The Jewish appeal is published today in the entire Rumanian press.

#### Scores Quota Demand

The anti-Jewish propaganda conducted by Dr. Vaida-Voevod was openly ridiculed today by Professor Jorga, the late premier of Rumania. Professor Jorga termed Vaida-Voevod's campaign for a numerus clausus for Jews in commerce and in the professions as nothing more than "a parody of Vaida-Voevod's romanticism" which can never be realized.

The Rumanian Minister of Interior today sent out a circular letter to all Labor Offices throughout the country, instructing labor inspectors to enforce under all circumstances the so-called Law for National Labor, according to which eighty per cent of the employees of each firm must be Rumanians.

"The clause asking for the ethnic origin of each employee must be filled out in every application as a primary requirement," the Minister's instructions state.

The Law For National Labor, enforced on the principal of ethnic origin of each employee, is leading

Dr. Saul Tchernichowsky, the famous Hebrew poet and translator of the Kalevala into Hebrew, who has been invited from Palestine as the guest of the Finnish government, speaking at today's celebration, described literature as a meeting place for all people.

## Women Hear Coughlin Scored For Mixing Church and Politics

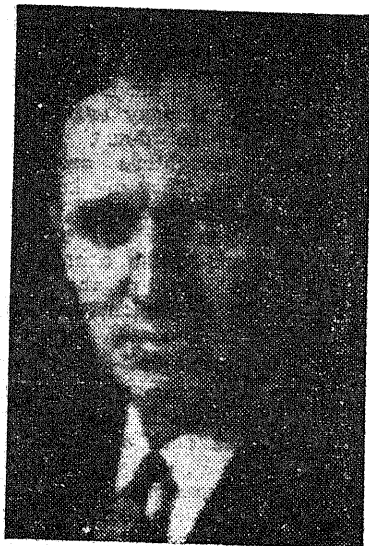
### Dr. Clinchy Speaks at 14th Triennial Parley in New Orleans

(Special to the J.D.B.)

NEW ORLEANS, March 12.—Decrying Father Coughlin's attempts to "tie the church to politics," Dr. Everett R. Clinchy, director of National Conference of Jews and Christians, leading a seminar on racial relations tonight at the fourteenth triennial convention of the National Council of Jewish Women, stated that the church has a more permanent function.

"Social equilibrium," he said, "has been disturbed by changing economic conditions which in turn have resulted in tension between economic classes and between cultural groups. The church has an opportunity to generate in people, particularly privileged ones, a generous and magnanimous spirit, which will permit social changes necessitated by new conditions to be brought about without violence."

"The job of the church and the synagogue," said Dr. Clinchy, "is to develop the religious spirit of

unselfish devotion and willingness for self-sacrifice. These qualities are as truly necessary now as they were during the World War and if democracy is to survive, organized religions must produce in its members these noble qualities."

## M. P.'s at Odds Over Palestine Jail Sentences

### Wedgwood, Cunliffe-Lister Figure in Sharp Word Duel

LONDON, March 12.—A duel of words took place today in the House of Commons between Colonel Josiah Wedgwood, non-Jewish member of the British Parliament, and Sir Phillip Cunliffe-Lister, the British Colonial Secretary, when the question of jailing illegal entrants into Palestine came up for discussion.

Colonel Wedgwood demanded to know why Jewish women in Bethlehem jail in Palestine declared a hunger strike. Sir Phillip replied that he had no information and promised to inquire of the Palestine government for details. Colonel Wedgwood thereupon suggested that the inquiry should also indicate that the continual imprisonment of innocent persons in Palestine is arousing considerable opposition in England.

"I have no reason to suppose that the Palestine courts are imprisoning innocent people," the

## Piazza, Poet, Dies In Trieste at 72

TRIESTE, March 12.—Giulio Piazza, a well-known Jewish poet and critic, died here today at the age of 72.

Piazza was the author of a number of patriotic songs. He was known as an irridentist and had been frequently imprisoned by the Austrian authorities for advocating that Trieste become a part of Italy, at a time when this city was still under the Austrian regime.

## Court Convicts 10 in Tel Aviv On Riot Charges

### Must Pay \$40 Fine or Serve 2-3 Months in Prison

JERUSALEM, March 12.—Ten orthodox Jews, all members of the Sabbath Observance Organization, were sentenced today by the British court in Tel Aviv to pay \$40 each or serve two to three months in prison, for their part in the religious disturbances Saturday before last on the streets of Tel Aviv, in which ten persons were injured.

The orthodox Jews sentenced were charged with using violence and disturbing public order. They attacked non-religious Jews in Tel Aviv, when the latter kept their stores open on the Sabbath.

The fight for observance of the Sabbath in the all-Jewish city of Tel Aviv has long been a matter of conflict between religious and non-religious Jews, since the Sabbath Observance Organization insists on the complete observance of the Sabbath in Tel Aviv by the entire population.

## Press Renews Drive On Jews in Germany

### Palestine Immigrants Brought \$25,000,000

JERUSALEM, March 12.—A minimum of more than \$25,000,000 was brought into Palestine by Jewish immigrants in 1934, according to an official report of the Palestine government to be published here shortly.

The report discloses that 42,350 Jews entered Palestine during 1934. They included 10,880 workers and 5,125 capitalists. The latter brought in not less than \$5,000 each. The remaining number of immigrants consisted of relatives, dependents, orphans, students and rabbis.

## Report Zionist Parley Is Slated For Switzerland

### Actions Body Releases Agenda for Palestine Meeting in April

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, March 12.—The nineteenth World Zionist Congress will be held in Switzerland this Summer, according to a report from Geneva today.

The agenda of the Actions Committee, the miniature Zionist Congress, which meets next month in Palestine, was made public here today. It includes reports on the political situation in Zionism, on the present fight for a larger immigration into Palestine, on colonization, and on budgetary problems. The agenda discloses that certain recommendations will be made by the Zionist Executive to the Actions Committee with regard to the internal discipline in the Zionist Organization.

The question of transferring the remains of Dr. Theodor Herzl from Vienna to Palestine is also included in the agenda.

### Manifesto Outlines Dangers to Zionism

## 30-Volume Talmud in English To Appear in London March 27

LONDON, March 12.—The first complete and unabridged edition of the Babylonian Talmud in the English language will be published here on March 27. Edited by Rabbi Dr. I. Epstein, assisted by twelve Talmudic authorities, the monumental new work will contain a foreword by Dr. J. H. Hertz, Chief Rabbi of the British Empire.

The work will appear in about thirty volumes, the first eight of

which will be published simultaneously this month. A second set is scheduled for publication next year, a third in 1937 and the final volumes in 1938. It is published by the Soncino Press, of London.

The first eight volumes will include in full the ten tractates comprising the Seder Nezikin. The edition is limited to 1,000 numbered sets. A de luxe edition of

## Loose New Barrage Flouting Schacht Trade Edict

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, March 12.—The critical situation of the Jews in Germany resulting from the renewed drive launched against them by the Nazis was pictured here today by a number of speakers at a council session of the Federation of Jewish Communities of Prussia.

The council opened its session under fire of a new campaign of anti-Jewish propaganda conducted by the entire Nazi press, following the mass arrests of Jewish emigres who have returned to Germany.

#### Cites Population Decline

Emphasizing that the Jewish institutions in Germany are in danger of being liquidated because of the decline of the Jewish population in many cities, Dr. Bruno Woyda, one of the leaders of the Berlin Jewish community, urged the merging of smaller Jewish communities and a complete reorganization of the activities of the larger Jewish organizations.

"The loss of government subsidies, coupled with the decrease of the Jewish population necessitate a systematic revision in our Jewish communal life," Dr. Woyda said. He was supported by Dr. Alfred Klee, one of the leading Zionists in Germany.

The session was devoted exclusively to the cultural and spiritual aspects of Jewish life in Germany. The anti-Semitic restrictions newly imposed by the authorities were not discussed by the assembled representatives, fearing reprisals if they give voice to criticism of any government act.

#### Flout Schacht Order

While Dr. Hjalmar Schacht, economic dictator, is assuring the world that he will allow no discrimination to be practiced against the Jews in commerce, Die Deutsche Wochenschau, one of the leading and influential Nazi weeklies, today published a demand that Jews be ousted from the automobile industry in Germany.

An order was also issued today prohibiting Jews from participating in next week's window display contest for German boys and girls. On the other hand, the order provides that Jewish storekeepers should permit their "Aryan" employees to participate in the contest by dressing-up the windows of the neighboring non-Jewish stores, but under no circumstances of the stores in which they are employed.

## Reveal Nazi Agents Operating in Danzig

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

DANZIG, March 12.—Nazi agitators from Germany are flooding the Free City with anti-Jewish propaganda, it was established here today after an investigation.

The investigation was made after the Nazi-controlled Danzig Senate had issued a statement that the Reich is not responsible for the anti-Jewish boycott conducted in Danzig.

The investigation revealed that the entire boycott propaganda is stimulated by agents coming from Berlin.

New Tasks for the Board of Deputies

LONDON. The Board of Deputies of British Jews, the Anglo-Jewish representative body which so effectively represents British Jewry in domestic and foreign concerns, is now weighing an extensive reorganization program to enable it to cope more fully with the many varied problems which it is being called upon to face. The program is, briefly, creation of effective apparatus to deal with the many situations which the board, as the representative body and voice of the Jewish community, must meet in constantly increasing numbers.

British Jewry probably has a more effective voice in the affairs of world Jewry than any other community. This, without doubt, is largely due to the existence of the board the authority of which is based democratically through its system of delegates, on the assent of a very large segment of the Jewish population. If British Jewry does not speak with one voice, there is at least not the babel of voices to which other countries are accustomed.

Germany, the growing tensivity of the situation in the Eastern European lands, the ever-present menace of an eruption in Rumania, have thrust heavy responsibilities upon the Board of Deputies. They have taxed its machinery for dealing with foreign affairs—the Joint Foreign Committee in which the Anglo-Jewish Association has an equal voice—to its limit. Because of the increasing pressure of these demands, the board has decided on the establishment of a foreign affairs department with a secretariat competent to treat with situations as they arise.

Under the plan of reorganization adopted in principle by the board, foreign and domestic affairs would be separated and handled by two district secretariats. In addition, a press department to combat publication of erroneous reports in the press, to refute attacks on the Jews and to furnish authentic information to those requiring it, is to be made an integral part of the board's machinery.

A reorganization project, complete in all details, has been worked out and approved in principle by the board. The sole obstacle to its going into effect is the cost of the proposed administration which amounts to \$12,500 annually more than the board's present income. The chief source of the board's revenue is the assessment on congregations electing deputies to the board.

One proposal before the board is that the per capita assessments be increased to provide the necessary funds to finance the board's large-scale activities. Some objection has been raised to this.

Another proposal which the

board is weighing is a modification of the reorganization scheme combining several of the functions segregated in the original plan, and reducing the additional cost of administration to some \$5,000. This deficit it is proposed to meet out of the board's reserves for a two-year period, after which time the whole question of financing would have to be considered again.

Neville Laski, president of the board, who recently visited the United States, and Gordon Liverman, treasurer, are unreservedly in favor of the original plan. A committee is now at work seeking a solution of the financial problems connected with it.

Meanwhile, the Board of Deputies has taken an action almost unprecedented in its recent history in according its approval and support to an appeal for funds for the relief of Polish Jewry. Largely through the activities of the board, four Anglo-Jewish organizations chiefly interested in Polish relief have combined their efforts into one drive which will open March 29. Mr. Laski is expected to accept the chairmanship of the allocations committee which will have final word in disposition of the funds raised in the course of the drive. Each of the four organizations will have a representative on the committee and the board will have four.

The board's participation is largely the result of Mr. Laski's trip to Poland for first-hand knowledge of the situation. He reported that the misery and distress of Polish Jewry had left him "heart-sick."

# Between the Lines

The Coughlin Poison Is Father Coughlin an anti-Semite?

On several occasions Father Coughlin has insisted that he is not. He has definitely denied charges against him that into his radio talks from his Detroit station he indirectly injects anti-Semitism. He has made it clear that he has nothing against the average Jew.

But those who had occasion to listen-in to his address over the radio Monday evening are beginning to doubt whether Father Coughlin's assurances are sincere. They are beginning to question whether Father Coughlin is not one of those clever anti-Jewish campaigners who are cloaking their anti-Semitism in diplomatic words and phrases.

## Dangerous Anti-Semitism

There are two kinds of anti-Semitism. One is the kind that comes out openly against the Jews. The Pelley type. The type of ex-Congressman McFadden. An open and an outspoken enemy about whom the Jews make no mistake.

This type of Jew-baiter, bad as he is, is still not as dangerous as the other kind, who says that he has nothing against the Jews but at the same time poisons the American air with anti-Jewish insinuations and with well-manipulated, hidden anti-Jewish propaganda.

Monday's radio address arouses the suspicion that Father Coughlin belongs to the last group; that he is more dangerous to the Jews of the United States than are the Pelleys and their like.

## Bankers and Financiers

The worst lie is a half-truth. This is exactly what Father Coughlin used in his speech on Monday evening. He attacked General Johnson as a tool of the bankers and financiers. But who are the financiers Father Coughlin enumerated? Are they the Rockefellers? Are they the Mellons? Are they the more than a 100 persons listed by the Nye investigation as the ones who made millions on armaments?

No. Father Coughlin carefully omits, with one exception, mentioning any non-Jewish name among the financiers who, he contends, are utilizing General Johnson for their private profit. On one occasion he mentions Morgan's name briefly, but his attack is concentrated on the "Manasses," on the Rothschilds, on the Warburgs, on the Kuhn-Loebs, on the Baruchs.

## The False Impression

An average American, listening-in to Father Coughlin's radio address, could easily have formed the opinion that the entire banking system in America is actually controlled by Jewish financiers alone, when Father Coughlin well knows that this is not so. By deliberately listing just the names of the few Jewish bankers in America and by carefully omitting mention of the names of the non-Jewish bankers, Father Coughlin is actually creating the false impression that the Jews are responsible for what he thinks is wrong with the present political machinery of America.

One cannot be so naive as to think that Father Coughlin, in just picking the names of a few Jewish financiers, did not realize that he was spreading anti-Semitism in his radio speech. Father Coughlin is a schooled politician. He knows what to emphasize and when. He, more than others, knows that by mentioning

## Goering's Fiancee Of Jewish Descent

The New York Post brings the following report from Berlin:

The realization that Frau Emmy Sonnemann, who will be married next month to Hermann Wilhelm Goering, is the descendant of an eminent German Jew, has come as a surprise to London.

"The new amendment has no affect whatsoever on the voting rights of any person in Palestine," the Colonial Secretary added.

Palestine Labor Bodies Call on Members to Help With Orange Harvest

JERUSALEM, March 12.—An appeal to all Jewish workers in Palestine temporarily to drop their jobs in the building trades and proceed to the fields, where there is a sharp shortage of farm hands, was issued here today by labor organizations.

The appeal points out that the entire crop is in danger if no work on the fields is done. It also emphasizes that the oranges on the orange plantations will go to waste if not picked at once.

"Resign temporarily from the high wages which you are getting in the cities and proceed to the fields," the appeal says, urging the concentration of all available hands for the picking of oranges in the orange belt.

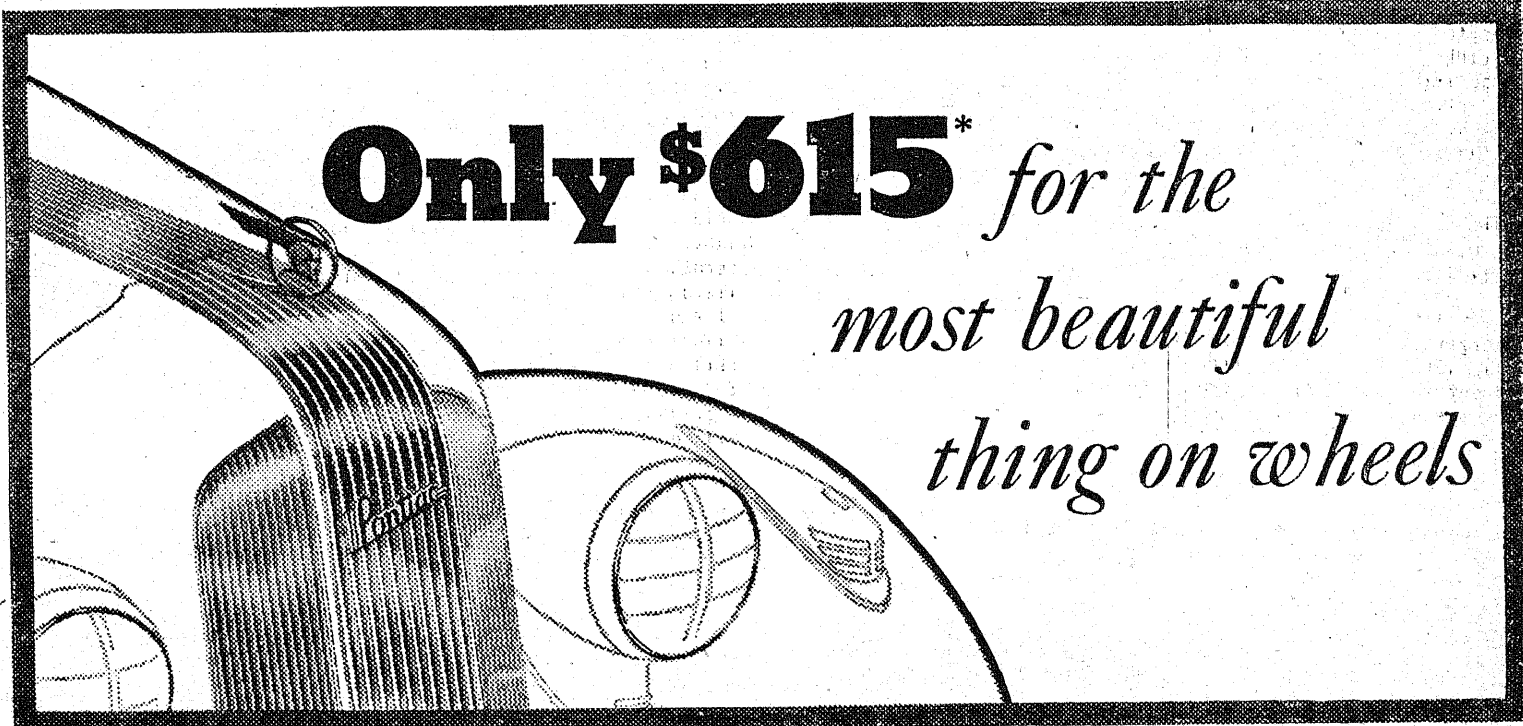

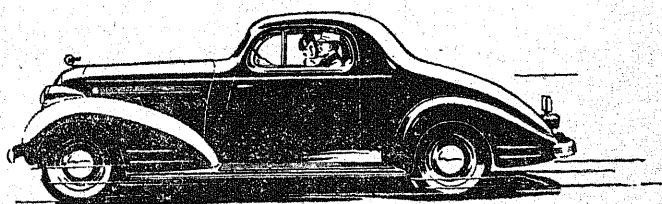

# Report World Zionist Parley Will Be Held in Switzerland

(Continued from Page One)

The full text of the manifesto follows:

"The nineteenth congress is approaching. In the period that has elapsed since the eighteenth congress in Praha, our movement has made further important steps on the road to the realization of our ideal.

## Immigration Grows

"Under the pressure of the ever-increasing tragedy of the Jewish situation in many countries, and attracted by the growing absorptive capacity of the country, the Jewish immigration into Palestine has, despite all artificial restrictions, attained hitherto unexpected dimensions, while the possibilities of its extension are still unlimited.

"Both in the consciousness of Jewry as well as in that of the entire civilized world the reconstruction of Palestine has become the central task of our present Jewish generation.

## Funds Income Higher

"The working period that is gradually coming to a close can also record considerable progress in all other decisive spheres of our reconstructive activity. The income of the national funds has, despite the aggravated economic crisis and the attempts at disturbance on the part of irresponsible elements within the movement, substantially increased in most countries.

"The financial obligations of the Jewish Agency and of the Keren Hayesod have, thanks to a rational policy of finance, appreciably diminished. The first large external loan of \$500,000 has been obtained, rendering possible the regulation of our debt service, the final consolidation of our agricultural settlements, and the resumption of national settlement work on the land of our people by settlers working themselves.

## The Huleh Purchase

"Through the purchase of the Huleh concession a new key position has been acquired, affording the Jewish people extensive prospects of agricultural activity.

"The Department for the Settlement of German Jews created by the eighteenth congress has, in full agreement with the Executive, contributed in an important degree towards the establishment of this new and valuable human material and especially of the German-Jewish youth in the general structure of Palestine.

"In patient and arduous labor, drawing its strength from the deep historic connection of the Jewish people with Palestine and from the growth of our economic and colonizing achievements, we have succeeded in bringing about a general improvement of the political position and at least in deferring constitutional innovations which, in our opinion, are calculated to imperil the political status of the Jewish people in Eretz Israel.

## Sees "Menacing Shadows"

"The Zionist movement has a period of fruitful and creative work behind it; but on the other hand we dare not close our eyes to the problems and dangers which are assuming particular acuteness just at present. The gratifying and historically invaluable increase of our numerical strength in Eretz Israel is accompanied by menacing shadows, the removal of which constitutes the highest national duty. Eretz Israel as the land of Jewish mass immigration is the beginning of the realization of the most glorious Zionist dream.

"But we must not allow anything to affect the usefulness of our human material, its technical preparation for the fundamentally new life in the country, its readiness to share the fate of this country unconditionally and for all times, and its ability to yield to the inevitable dictates of economic reorganization and especially to

the creation of a broad agricultural basis for a healthy Jewish life in Eretz Israel.

"It is more than ever necessary to intensify the idea of human and national pioneering—of Chaluizuth. The flight from the land, the curtailment of our agricultural basis, and the terrible visitation of unbridled land speculation—these are problems and dangers that can only be stemmed by a solidarity and idealism sustained by the loftiest national responsibility and by increased and systematic efforts of the entire people.

"To extend the national ownership of land, to strengthen the national Funds, the Keren Kayemeth and Keren Hayesod, to extend the work of settlement, to revive national enterprise anew, to further private enterprise and its systematic adjustment to the sphere of interest of national reconstruction, to safeguard Jewish labor and human conditions of work in town and country, to extend and to intensify pioneering idealism among the whole people, especially in the circles of our youth, those are the tasks of the hour.

## Demands Discipline

"The primary condition necessary for the fulfillment of these tasks of hitherto unprecedented scope and of truly state-building character is a strongly linked and disciplined Zionist Organization under a united leadership, which, whilst preserving the freedom of opinion, conscience and action of its individual members, must nevertheless be able to subordinate all its sections, by a free exercise of will, to the highest national interest and to represent in our own midst and to the outer world, within the framework of the Jewish Agency, the will of the Jewish people based upon democratic self-determination.

"Unfortunately, the consciousness of this interest has not yet seized all parts of our movement in the necessary degree.

## Unity Vital

"The attempts to unify the movement and to strengthen the organization against destructive tendencies are only in an initial stage. The fight for the consolidation of the Organization and its protection against separatism in external political matters and against the internal undermining of its foundations must be continued with the utmost energy.

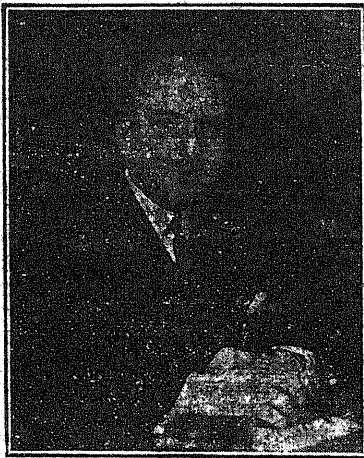
"The Zionist Organization, which was created by Herzl as the instrument of the new edifice and of the political self-determination of the Jewish people, must be protected with the utmost energy and determination by all responsible Zionists against every attack upon its existence, its sovereignty, the rights, and its democratic character.

## Appeals to Masses

"In this spirit the Zionists of all countries, without distinction of tendency or views, must prepare for the nineteenth congress. The masses must participate in the Congress to an extent surpassing all previous records. Zionism is the cause of the whole people. The Shekel must come into the hands of hundreds of thousands, nay, millions of Jewish men and women. But its distribution must not be reduced to a mere collection of small contributions or to a medium for the mere securing of votes.

The Shekel is a means whereby acknowledgment of the Zionist idea and acceptance of all the obligations entailed by adherence to the Zionist Organization are documented. The Shekel campaign must become a mobilization on a large scale of Jewish public opinion for Zionist action. The recruiting of new Shekel payers must be conducted under the watchword of increased responsibility for the education and permanent attachment of the new masses to the Zionist idea and the Zionist Or-

At the session the convention adopted resolutions against lynching and for State ratification of Child Labor Amendments and for legalization of dissemination of contraceptive information by physicians, hospitals and licensed clinics.

The Southern delegates were the most emphatic in voicing their affirmation of the strongly worded anti-lynching resolution which read:

## Hit Lynch Law

"Whereas the killing and burning alive of human beings by mobs in the United States is a reproach upon our nation throughout the civilized world; and whereas, since 1882, 5,068 human beings have been lynched in the United States, with less than a dozen convictions, only nominal prison terms being given to any of the lynchers, be it resolved that the Council endorses Federal enforcement of adequate laws against lynching."

Other speakers participating with Dr. Clinchy in the seminar on racial relations were Rabbi Louis Binstock and Monsignor Peter H. M. Wynhoven.

The convention, which opened on Sunday evening, will continue through Friday.

## 2nd Annual Meeting of Southern Group Opens Sunday

Miss Stella Loewenstein, of Memphis, Tenn., will speak on "Family Service and Child Care"; Miss Rose Brenner, of New Orleans, will discuss "Leisure Time and the Problem of Vocational Guidance"; Julius Goldman, of New Orleans, will speak on "Community Resources," and Rabbi Louis Feigan, of Galveston, Texas, will speak on "The Problem of the Jewish Transient."

The evening session will deal with the "Future of Jewish Welfare Work." The speaker will be Dr. Sidney E. Goldstein of New York City.
