Report Arabs Want Italy to Take Mandate

Planning Drive With That Goal in View, London Is Told

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
LONDON, March 13.—The startling revelation that the Arabs in Palestine are planning a campaign with the object of having the Palestine mandate turned over to Italy was made here today by Dr. J. Taylor, an Oxford dean, upon his return from Palestine.

Addressing the Oxford Rotary Club, the British educator disclosed that while in Palestine he learned that Arab leaders, being dissatisfied with the British administration in Palestine, are turning their eyes towards Italy and are seriously considering the possibility of the Italians taking over the mandate.

Would Welcome Italy

"Italy," he said, "is quite evidently doing all she can to make herself known and agreeable in the Near East. Many of the Arabs are becoming more and more eager to be under an Italian regime rather than under the British, which, they allege, is unduly favoring the Jews.

"The Arabs are ready for a Jewish massacre," Dr. Taylor continued. "Many of them are quite outspoken in saying that they are waiting for the next war in which Britain is involved to rise up and drive the Jews into the sea. The British High Commissioner in Palestine has to exercise a great deal of tact."

Speaking about the Jews, Dr. Taylor emphasized that most of the Jews in Palestine today are not religious. "It's a great mistake to think that the Jews are bringing back the religion of their fathers," he said. "A great many of them are purely materialistic."

Tel Aviv Seeks Foreign Loans

Asks Approval of Aim to Raise Total of \$5,000,000

TEL AVIV, March 13.—The Jewish city of Tel Aviv intends to obtain new loans abroad, in addition to the ones obtained several years ago in the United States and last year in London, it was announced today by Mr. Rokeach, vice-mayor of the city.

The city administration of Tel Aviv has applied to the Palestine government for approval of the project, asking that the additional loans total \$5,000,000.

The municipal budget of Tel Aviv was announced today as exceeding \$2,000,000 for 1935. This includes half a million dollars for Jewish education. The municipality is negotiating with the government to participate in the coverage of its budget along the same proportions as is being done by

Latvia Bars Temples As Sites for Rallies

RIGA, March 13.—The authorities today prohibited the holding of Jewish secular meetings in synagogues throughout Latvia, as a result of the clashes which occurred recently at such meetings between Zionist Laborites and Zionist Revisionists. The order was issued with the object of preventing any possible disturbances within Jewish ranks, since there are no other places for Jewish public meetings but synagogues.

Rural Palestine Will Benefit by 10 Million Loan

Sum to Be Repayable in 37 Years; Carries 4 1/2% Interest

JERUSALEM, March 13.—The new \$10,000,000 loan which the Palestine government has decided to raise will be spent for rural development, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learned here today.

The loan will be repayable within thirty-seven years as four and a half per cent. Sixty per cent of the sum will be floated in London and forty per cent in Palestine. Palestine's share will be subscribed by the Barclay Bank, the Anglo-Palestine Bank, the Labor Bank and the Kupath Ham.

The portion of the loan to be assigned for Jewish rural development has not been fixed as yet.

Commenting upon the recent interpellation made by Colonel Wedgwood in the House of Commons with regard to security in Palestine, Mr. Furness, the press officer of the Palestine government, today declared that "never did the Palestine government hold the security in Palestine safer than now." Every attempt at incitement will be immediately suppressed, Mr. Furness added.

Nazi Handbills Seized By Jerusalem Police

JERUSALEM, March 13.—The police today confiscated the anti-Jewish leaflets spread by Nazis in English and in Arabic calling for a boycott of Jewish firms.

No arrests were made by the authorities of persons in whose possession these leaflets were found. The distribution of the leaflets is subsidized directly from Berlin, it is asserted.

Spain Maps Gay 5-Day Festival To Honor Birthday of Rambam

MADRID, March 13.—Popular festivities, including bull fights, garden parties and society balls, spread over five full days, will mark the celebration here of the 800th birthday of Moses Maimonides, the Jewish philosopher and medical expert who was born in Cordoba, Spain, in March, 1135.

An official program for the celebration was announced today by the Spanish government. The program discloses that a special Maimonides museum will be opened at Madrid University.

Avers Reich Will Not Ease Lot of Jews

Dr. Goebbels Publicly Announces Resolve of Nazis

BERLIN, March 13.—"The Nazi attitude towards the Jewish question is firm and implacable," Dr. Joseph Goebbels, Minister of Propaganda, stated today, making it clear that no modifications are to be expected in the anti-Jewish legislation in Germany.

The statement by Dr. Goebbels was made at a public meeting. The Minister of Propaganda went out of his way to speak on the Jewish question in order to emphasize that the attempts by Dr. Schacht to gain a milder attitude towards the Jews will be without success.

Has Hitler Support

That Hitler is fully supporting Goebbels' views with regard to the Jewish question and that he opposes any revision with regard to the attitude towards the Jews was stated here today in highly authoritative circles. It is understood

Merchants Set For Rent Strike

To Close Shops in Jerusalem Today Unless Demands Are Met

JERUSALEM, March 13.—Preparations for a general strike of shopkeepers and artisans, called for tomorrow, were made here today at a mass meeting of tenants demanding that the government regulate rentals on stores which threaten to reach prohibition levels.

Speakers at the mass meeting included the president of the Jerusalem Chamber of Commerce, Mr. Shelby. A resolution was adopted upholding the demands for legal regulation of rent. A committee was elected to supervise strike operations.

The only action that can avert the strike is agreement by the High Commissioner of Palestine to the demands of the tenants as outlined in the resolution. A delegation will appear before the High Commissioner today demanding a reply. If the reply is unfavorable, the strike will be declared, beginning tomorrow.

Farley Probe Looms On McFadden Acts

Poland Rubs It In, Suggests Matzoh Tax

WARSAW, March 13.—Adding insult to injury, the Polish authorities, who have withdrawn their subsidies from Jewish institutions and have ruined the existence of at least a million Jews by overtaxation, today suggested to the Jewish community of Warsaw that the Jews institute a special tax on matzoh for Passover in order to help the Jewish unemployed.

The Executive of the Jewish community rejected the suggestion, stating that no new special taxes could be imposed upon the Jewish population at this time.

Denies Temple Was Chosen for Writer's Arrest

M'Cormack Holds Place of Strachey Seizure 'Purely Accidental'

WASHINGTON, March 13.—Concerned over the fact that the arrest of Evelyn John St. Loe Strachey, British writer and lecturer, was made in a synagogue and might be exploited by anti-Jewish elements for propaganda purposes, Daniel W. MacCormack, Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization, upon whose order the arrest was made, told the Jewish Telegraphic Agency today that the place of the arrest was "purely accidental."

"The local authorities in Glencoe, Ill., could have arrested Mr. Strachey just as well in his hotel," the Commissioner declared. "The warrant for his arrest was issued on Tuesday afternoon, after we had been informed that he would speak in Glencoe that night. No particular place was mentioned in the instructions to arrest Mr. Strachey."

"All possible discretion was used in making the arrest," Commissioner MacCormack continued. "Mr. Strachey was moving so rapidly that it was difficult to keep up with him. The local authorities of Glencoe who served Mr. Strachey with notice of his detention probably wanted not to lose sight of him. Thus they detained him in the synagogue immediately after he concluded his lecture."

Commissioner MacCormack explained that the warrant to arrest Mr. Strachey pending deportation proceedings was issued after the immigration department received numerous complaints against him. The Commissioner refused to reveal the identity of the complainants.

Mr. Strachey is accused of entering the United States "by means of false and misleading statements" and of having "declared himself to be a Communist" since his arrival here. He is a prominent British writer and

Use of Mails by Anti-Semite Subject of Federal Quiz

WASHINGTON, March 13.—An investigation into the anti-Semitic propaganda being distributed by ex-Congressman Louis T. McFadden through the United States mails from the Mayflower Hotel here will be started by Postmaster General James M. Farley, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learned here today on good authority.

Mr. McFadden, who has announced that he will run for President of the United States in the 1936 Presidential campaign, has been sending out thousands of circulars featuring Jew-baiting propaganda which he intends to utilize in his election campaign. He is the first person ever to announce his candidacy for President of the United States on an outspokenly anti-Semitic platform.

Hotel Denies Presence

The administration of the Mayflower Hotel here continues to deny that McFadden's office is located in the hotel. The propaganda which the national headquarters of McFadden's campaign office has sent out includes, however, an "honor roll pledge card" which persons who wish to support McFadden's candidacy are asked to sign and to mail to the Mayflower Hotel.

The propaganda from McFadden's headquarters sent out as first class mail in envelopes which do not bear a return address. The printed material in these envelopes, however, advises recipients to communicate for further instructions with the national offices in Washington and state definitely that these offices are located in the Mayflower.

The propaganda distributed by Mr. McFadden's committee, which calls itself "Republican National that Hitler has definitely made it

Scores Silence On Persecution

Wedgwood Takes Britain to Task at Dinner to Him by Jews

LONDON, March 13.—The British government was severely criticized last night by Colonel Josiah Wedgwood, a non-Jewish member of the British Parliament, for the silence which it maintains in the face of the anti-Jewish persecutions in certain European countries.

The criticism was voiced by Colonel Wedgwood at a dinner given in his honor by the United Jewry Fellowship, at which David Lloyd George, Winston Churchill, Nahum Sokolow, Prof. Selig Brodetsky and other prominent figures were present.

A prediction that Palestine will play an important role within the British Empire was made at the dinner by Lord Melchett. Lord Melchett stressed the need for opening the Transjordan to Jewish immigration.

The Tax Burden in Poland

WARSAW.

The Prime Minister, Dr. Koslowski, speaking before the plenary session of the Senate, set out the economic policy of the government, indicating that the government is resolved to continue its line of promoting the interests of the agricultural population and of doing nothing to alleviate the difficult economic plight of the trading and industrial population of the towns, to which the Jews of Poland mostly belong.

It is necessary, said the Premier, in order to increase the prices obtained for village produce, to enable the peasants to live, that we should reorganize rural trade by eliminating the middlemen.

The threat to eliminate the Jewish middlemen in Polish trade came first from Dr. Koslowski, when he outlined to the Sejm last summer the policy of his government on taking office.

The economic crisis, he said, has revealed certain glaring faults in the organization of trading, which is too costly. There is too great a difference in the internal market between the prices obtained by the peasant and the prices paid by the consumer in the towns.

The government and the economic organizations would therefore, the Premier said, use all efforts to alter this state of affairs, by eliminating the middlemen. The work would be best carried out, he said, by a system of cooperatives which would have its ramifications in every town and village.

The question was brought up in the budget debate a fortnight ago, when the Minister of Agriculture, M. Poniatowski, said that the agricultural crisis was due mainly to the fact that the village cannot sell its produce, because there are no markets for them. The towns are being impoverished and cannot buy, he went on. It is necessary, he said, to start a big investment work to absorb the unemployed in the towns, and that would increase consumption, and provide a big internal market for the village produce. Things have been growing from bad to worse for some years past, and the whole country is feeling the effects, he said. Two-thirds of the village population is starving, the Minister declared.

The Minister went on to say that the agrarian policy of the government is directed towards eliminating the middlemen between the peasant and the consumer in the towns.

Deputy Rybarski of the anti-Semitic Endek party, said that the Jews would then start shouting that there was a pogrom.

The Minister replied that if the operation was carried out objectively, that would not frighten him. The Jewish view was put by Dr.

Rosmarin, the vice-president of the Club of Jewish Deputies, who warned the government that the present taxation system is catastrophic to the entire country, and especially to the Jews, upon whom the greatest burden of taxation is imposed. Unless there is immediate tax reform to alleviate this crushing load, he said, hundreds of thousands of taxpayers will be utterly ruined.

The ruination of the towns and of the trading section of the population is definitely the result of the existing tax system, he said. The only effect on the revenue is that the taxpayer who would have been able to pay a more equitable amount is unable to pay anything, and the government loses. Then the authorities step in and seize his goods, and put him out of business altogether, and thus lose also his potential revenue.

The goods seized are sold by auction, bringing in next to nothing as compared with the amounts demanded, and the shopkeeper has no stock to continue trading and the artisan has his tools taken away and cannot go on with his work.

It is essential to alter the entire tax system, he urged, to remove the excessive burden that is crushing the shopkeepers, merchants and artisans, and to put a stop to the distraints and forced auctions which are a disgrace to the tax system of any civilized country.

Social Workers Unit Urges Action on Pay

Will Stage Demonstration for Wage Rises in Front of Federation Building

At an emergency meeting of the Association of Federation Workers, it was decided to protest against the refusal of the distribution committee of the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies to give Federation workers a definite answer on their demands for better working conditions and increased wages for the coming year.

Since Federation was more than successful in its drive for funds this year, the association announced yesterday, the workers feel that their demands are justified. The rapid rise in the cost of living, has affected particularly certain categories of Federation workers, among them maintenance workers, who in some cases earn less than \$35 a month.

The meeting voted to hold a demonstration in front of Federation Building, 71 West Forty-seventh street, on the night that the board of directors receives the report of the distribution committee and allocates funds for 1935 to its constituent agencies.

Dr. Wolf Arrives Monday

Dr. Friedrich Wolf, internationally known German Jewish dramatist, will arrive here next Monday on the S. S. Drottingholm. Before his escape from Germany following the Nazis seizure of power, Dr. Wolf was ranked as the greatest contemporary German playwright.

Between the Lines

Strachey and Rabbis

The arrest of Evelyn John St. Loe Strachey, the non-Jewish author and lecturer, in a synagogue in Glencoe, Illinois, will perhaps serve as a lesson to some of our rabbis who have the weakness of inviting into their temples non-Jewish speakers to lecture on subjects which have nothing to do with religion or with Jewish life.

Every liberal-minded person in the United States will strongly disapprove of the arrest and deportation of Mr. Strachey. As long as the principle of freedom of speech still exists in our country, Mr. Strachey or anybody else has a right to express his views. From the standpoint of Jewish interests however, it is highly doubtful whether the synagogue should be permitted to become a platform for Mr. Strachey, who is regarded as an advocate of Communism, or for anybody else who may even be regarded as a foe of Communism.

Poor Strategy

The incident with Mr. Strachey, the British lecturer, will, we hope, teach certain congregations that anything which does not deal directly with Jewish life has no place in the synagogue. Our synagogue is the place for the teaching of religion and Judaism only. It is not a tribune for extremists, whether Communists, Fascists or monarchists, since they have nothing to do with Jewry.

On the other hand, it must be emphasized that the strategy of the immigration authorities in choosing a synagogue in which to arrest Mr. Strachey, is also one of those things which can not be commented upon favorably. Mr. Strachey is a public figure. He delivers his lectures publicly. He has long been in the public eye. The immigration authorities could have arrested him in his hotel. They could have arrested him on the train. They could have arrested him in any other public place but a synagogue.

Helping the Pelleys

The fact that the immigration officers chose to seize Mr. Strachey in a Jewish temple will cause many rightly or wrongly to believe that this was a deliberate attempt to help anti-Jewish propaganda. The Pelleys and the McFaddens will certainly owe a vote of thanks to the immigration inspectors who have thus played into their hands.

At a time when nothing is being done by the authorities in the United States to suppress or discourage the propaganda of anti-Semitic elements here who deliberately confuse Jews with Communists, at such a time the immigration authorities ought to have used more discretion in choosing the place for the arrest of Mr. Strachey.

The immigration department has consciously or unconsciously played a role which is far from being in accordance with American traditions. Arresting Mr. Strachey, not in his hotel, but in a Jewish temple, pours oil on the anti-Jewish flames which certain elements are trying to fan in our country. This, however, does not diminish the blameworthiness of the rabbi of the Glencoe temple, who has displayed so little responsibility towards the interests of American Jewry as to invite a non-Jewish lecturer to speak in the synagogue on a subject which has nothing to do with Jews.

World Press Digest

Coughlin All Wrong On Baruch 'Facts'

Arthur Krock commenting in the *New York Times* on Father Coughlin's attack on Baruch shows that the priest is completely in error on his "facts" about Baruch:

To accept Baruch as Father Coughlin and Senator Long have painted him is to classify him as a foe of high taxes for the rich and an enemy of the depressed economic classes in their struggle for higher price-levels. Yet only a few months ago, before the Senate Finance Committee, "the acting President" urged the imposition of taxes sufficient to pay relief bills as they were contracted. Tax the people, he said, for taking hungry men off the street and putting smiles on their faces. Under such a plan a man as rich as he would have paid far more than he will pay the government on March 15.

Bought Relief Bonds

When North Dakota offered a farm-relief bond issue some years ago which Wall Street would not take Baruch took a great deal of it himself and sold the rest to other wealthy men. He provided in Secretary McAdoo's time the final underwriting for the cotton crop, and once offered the South Carolina cotton cooperatives two and a half millions as an underwriting for the total crop of his native State. Such sentimental antics as these have run through his career and sometimes made his rich friends fear he was losing that acquisitive sense so highly prized in Wall Street.

"The master of Hugh Johnson" is a charge with a foundation as slight as that of being "acting President." Baruch did not know of Johnson's appointment until it was announced. He was constantly admonishing his unmanageable protegee that American business could not be coerced or regimented. He has always been bearish about NRA.

Baruch has volunteered nothing of advice to any President since Wilson, and what he has given on request rates him a pitching average of about .075. When he heard of the five billions for work relief—without a compensating tax—he almost had a convulsion in the House gallery. Also his middle name is "Mannes," not "Manasses," and was the surname of a friend of his father.

Comments on Drive In Algeria

The *London Daily Herald*, writing on the anti-French Arab movement in Algeria, says:

The Arab movement is directed against Jews as well as against the French administra-

tion, and Hitler is a symbol of the fight against France as well as against Jewry.

But it is also alleged in French newspapers that Nazi propaganda is being spread throughout North Africa.

Austrian Films Under Nazi Heel

The *Cinema*, a London publication, comments as follows on the Austrian films which are forbidden to include Jewish actors:

So the Austrian producers are still under the Nazi heel. With the beginning of the new quota year it was hoped to get some amelioration of the "Aryan Paragraph," under which Austrian films imported into Germany must not include any non-Aryan personnel; but Berlin seems to have squashed these hopes effectively.

Not merely will Germany not lighten the paragraph in any respect, but during the next year she will accept fewer films from Austria. And when you consider that Germany is far and away Austria's biggest market and that the normally pretty big non-Aryan film contingent in Vienna has been greatly increased by the numbers of political emigres from Germany, you can realize in what an almost hopeless position the Austrian producers are.

The bitterness with which the Nazis are pursuing their fanatical "race politics" is shown by the fact that the Ufa cinema in the Vienna Taborstrasse, having rented "The Stage Is the World," in which the Jewish comic Szoke Szakall appears, has (on instructions from Berlin?) preferred to pay a penalty rather than screen the film.

Venizelos Thinks Highly of Hitler

The *New Republic*, commenting editorially on the rebellion in Greece, says:

The revolt is a struggle for supremacy between Fascist and constitutional forces. Eleutherios Venizelos, the outstanding figure in this uprising, was easily the most influential man in post-war Greece. He served several terms as Premier of the Greek Republic and went into voluntary exile on the island of Crete last October when he lost the election to President Zaimis. During the last few years Venizelos has become rabidly Fascist and anti-Semitic in his political views. In a letter to Hitler he called the German Chancellor the "greatest statesman of our times," the man whose "political, social and economic ideals will rule the world for centuries to come."

AJC Will Hear Rabbi's Report On Mexico Jews

Bernstein to Speak on Survey at Parley in Philadelphia

A report on the situation of the Jews in Mexico will be made by Rabbi Philip Bernstein of Rochester at the extraordinary session of the American Jewish Congress which will be held this week-end in Philadelphia, it was announced yesterday.

Rabbi Bernstein recently returned from a visit to Mexico, where he made a study of conditions among Jews at the behest of the American Jewish Congress.

"The Jews, who form one-tenth of one per cent of the population have had no difficulties with the government," Rabbi Bernstein said. "Nevertheless, the Jews of the United States should continue to protest against discriminatory anti-religious policies in Mexico and appeal to President Cardenas and his government to grant all sects such freedom as is consistent with the policy of modern enlightened nations."

There are few Jewish communities as well-circumstanced as the Mexican Jewish community, Rabbi Bernstein said, "and they have won an important and useful position in the economic life of a backward country."

Tel Aviv Prepares for Olympiad As Athletes of 23 Nations Train

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) TEL AVIV. — Twenty-three countries, including the United States, are making preparations to take part in the Maccabiad which opens here April 2 and which is considered a world Olympiad in miniature.

The program of the Maccabiad will consist of eighteen forms of sport, embracing practically the entire Olympic program. All events will be held in the Fair grounds. The largest halls, namely the England and Palestine Pavillions, will be used for the indoor events, while in the smaller halls will be concentrated the dwellings of the athletes according to their various nationalities, with the advantage that they will be near the scene of activities.

To Rebuild Stadium
The stadium, which was used in the first Maccabiad, has become almost useless and must be reconstructed. It is of the greatest importance that the track should be without fault. The inner space, which will be used for football, basket-ball and hockey, will be pulled down and a new stand of larger and more massive proportions will be constructed to hold 40,000.

Recently, a private company has succeeded in beginning the construction of a swimming bath in Bath Galim, at which ninety men are working in day and night shift. It will be fifty meters long and eighteen meters wide and stands will be erected at the sides to seat 5,000 spectators.

Good Track Weather
The climate of Palestine is very suitable for track events. In most other countries, the track is impossible from October until March. In Palestine, this is the most suitable period for training for track events.

The Palestinian competitors will have six months training behind them at the time of the Maccabiad. The number of fast runners in Palestine is extraordinarily large.

In Tel Aviv there are Maranz, Sussman, Feiwisewitch, Steinberg, Salvador. In Ness Siona there are Levy; in Haifa the two Chasans and Weil. Their average time is about 11.4. In the 400 meters Palestine has Peter Staffel, who has a good chance to place. Eli Katz, the Finnish long distance runner and winner of the 1924 Olympiad in Paris is staging a comeback after an interval of two years and victory is expected from him. Training is taken very seriously and a preliminary competition against a services team is being arranged to round off training.

Football Squads Fit
The Maccabi of Tel Aviv have made great progress in football, thanks to the efforts of their

trainer, Pollak of Vienna. Every two weeks practice games are being played between A and B teams. Shortly before the Maccabiad, matches will be played against representative teams from Egypt and Syria.

Regular practice basketball games are being played between the best twenty-two of the best players in the country.

Palestine has a very strong team, composed mainly of former Austrian and German players. The team has a very good chance of gaining a high place in the Maccabiad. In all probability, a team from India will compete, which is very interesting, as hockey in India is of very good quality. The Palestinian team is playing frequent matches against service teams.

Six boxers will represent Palestine, including the Polish champions, Birnbaum and Finn. During February, the Palestinian team will be matched with Syrian and Egyptian teams. Palestine is the only country to be represented at this sport.

Veterans Here Prepare For Ball on Saturday

Ninety metropolitan posts and sixty auxiliaries of the Jewish War Veterans of the United States will play host to veterans from other sections of the country at the National Military Ball Saturday evening at the Hotel Delano. The proceeds of the ball will be devoted to the relief of unemployed veterans and their families.

DIETARY LAWS OBSERVED

Sachar Outlines Tasks for Jewry At New Orleans

Tells Council Women Fight on Pessimism Is Vital Today

(Special to the J.D.B.)
NEW ORLEANS, March 13.—Combatting the spirit of pessimism and disillusionment, which he said is characteristic of present-day civilization, is one of four major tasks now confronting the Jewish people, according to Prof. Abram Leon Sachar, director of the Hillel Foundations, who spoke today at the fourteenth triennial convention here of the National Council of Jewish Women.

"The prophet of today is Spengler," he declared, "who asks men to build on the rock of despair and face doom with courage—that life is a brilliant interlude between two nothings. Hebraism has never yielded to this cosmic despair. It has stood ground in similar crises, in Egyptian days, in the Hellenist collapse, in the dark ages, and it throws its forces today on the side of those who feel that the rich values in civilization can be won by abdominal fortitude."

Sets Cultural Goals

As other objectives, Professor Sachar urged the Jewish people to transmit a magnificent cultural heritage and thereby build deeper the concept of "Cultural pluralism," to transmit this culture heritage dramatically and aesthetically so that it may survive, and to transmit it in terms of social values.

Professor Sachar likened Americanism to a symphony, with each separate racial culture contributing its own instrument and melody. He declared that the melting pot theory of American life is bankrupt and that cultures are not all thrown into a crucible coming out alike.

Strive for Peace

Concerning his fourth topic, he said, "Jews live best as Jews when they identify themselves with great social causes, when they strive for peace, when they seek to eradicate social injustices, when they battle for enlightenment and when they strike down prejudice and intolerance."

Another speaker of the day, Leo Schwarz, director of the New School of Jewish Education, said that the Jewish people had derived a great "social technique" from their social experiences of over 3,000 years, and they have an opportunity to contribute largely to the as yet unformed American culture.

Mr. Schwarz urged the Jewish communities to build on their tried and true social experience of the past, rather than to adhere to political groups which offer a panacea for social ills.

clear to Dr. Schachí that the Jews are not wanted in Germany, no matter what the effect abroad may be.

Supporting this attitude, the leader of the Economic Political Office of the National Socialist party, Bernard Koehler, addressing a meeting of merchants in Hagen, South Westphalia, bitterly attacked the Jews and called upon his audience to continue the fight against them even in commerce.

"For a century the Jews have swindled and exploited the German nation," the Nazi official said, urging them to avoid contact with Jews and to boycott Jewish firms.

Arrest 2 Who Barred Display of Stuermer Posters

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, March 13.—For refusing to permit the display of posters advertising the Jew-baiting paper, Der Stuermer, two managers of the Tietz Department Store were arrested here today by the secret political police.

The managers explained that they could not permit the posters to be displayed in the store because this would offend their Jewish customers and would affect the firm's trade.

More Jews Deprived Of Their Citizenship

The New York Times yesterday published a report from its Berlin correspondent that a new list of 139 persons, mostly Jews, has been published in the official gazette of the Reich, depriving the persons listed of their German citizenship, though most of them were born in Berlin or other Prussian cities.

A report by the Associated Press from Berlin yesterday disclosed that physicians admitted to practice under German sick insurance laws are listed as "Aryan" or Jewish by the punctuation following their names. The names of Jews are followed by commas, those of "Aryans" by periods. Those "Aryans" who are married to Jewish wives are marked by semi-colons.

Dr. Kohn Dies at 61; Was Friend of Masaryk

PRAHA, March 13.—Dr. Indrich Kohn, a personal friend and collaborator of President Masaryk, died here today at the age of 61. He was a leader of the non-Zionist elements of Czechoslovakian Jewry.

Arab Band Tortures, Murders Aged Jew

ALLEPPO, Syria, March 13.—A band of Arabs today tortured and murdered a sixty-five-year-old Jew, Jeshai Tuassi. The victim's corpse was thrown by the murderers into a river, where it was later found.

Several suspects were arrested, but they were later released for lack of sufficient evidence against them. The Jews of Aleppo are very much alarmed over the incident.

Education Budget Exceeds \$1,250,000

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

JERUSALEM.—The government education budget for the year beginning April, 1935, will amount to over \$1,250,000, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency has learned.

The government refuses to agree to the demand of the Vaad Leumi that the grant for the Jewish education system should be increased proportionately to the number of Jewish pupils. There is much dissatisfaction over this refusal, and fear that it may endanger the future of the Jewish education system.

In the school year 1927-8, the government grant-in-aid to the Hebrew school system amounted to about \$100,000 the Zionist Executive report to the last Congress said. Since then, the Jewish Yishub has grown considerably, and the government budget for general education in the country also has been increased. Hence the government grant-in-aid had no longer been in accord with the new conditions created, and the Jewish Agency therefore required that the government should increase its grant-in-aid to the Hebrew education budget. The Agency demanded an increase on the principle that the government is bound to care for the educational needs of the Jewish population to the same extent as for the Arab population.

Rabbi Landauer, 73, Is Dead in Poland

Was First Chassidic Rebbe to Support Zionism; Lived in Detroit

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

WARSAW, March 13.—Rabbi Mendel Landauer, a Chassidic rebbe, who returned to Poland from the United States last year, after holding a rabbinate in Detroit, died today at the age of 73.

Rabbi Landauer was known as the "Zawiercie rebbe." He was the first Chassidic rabbi to support the Zionist movement.

Rabbi Rabinowicz

WARSAW, March 13.—Rabbi Jehoshua Osher Rabinowicz, the "Borisower rebbe," died today at the age of 70. He was a member of the oldest dynasties in Poland.
