## See New Era Looming for Harbin Jews

### Manchukuo City Allows Reopening of Library Closed 2 Years

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)  
HARBIN, Manchukuo, March 14.—While anti-Jewish propaganda is still being conducted here on a wide scale by the emigres of Czarist Russia, the authorities today for the first time took a step which is interpreted by the Jewish community here as opening a new era in the relations between the Japanese-controlled officials of Manchukuo and the Jewish population.

This step consisted in reopening the Jewish community library which the authorities have kept closed for two years. The library, one of the outstanding cultural institutions in Harbin, was permitted to resume its normal functions.

#### Banks in Shanghai

A Jewish public bank will be opened in Shanghai this week by Jewish community leaders, in connection with the growth of the Jewish population there. Many Jews, terrorized by the anti-Semitic manifestations here, have been moving to Shanghai. Jewish merchants in Harbin, being practically compelled either to sell their stores to Japanese citizens, or to liquidate under threats, are moving to Shanghai and to Mukden in large numbers.

## Amnesty Petition For Rabbi Ignored

### Plea in Behalf of Rappaport Unanswered by Soviet Envoy in Latvia

RIGA, March 14.—A petition submitted to the Soviet Ambassador in Latvia by the Rabbinical Association, asking that Rabbi Rappaport of Minsk be given amnesty by the Soviet authorities and permitted to proceed abroad, has been unanswered by the ambassador, the association announced today.

Rabbi Rappaport was sentenced in Minsk last year by the Soviet authorities on a charge of immorality. This charge was considered a frame-up and has never been proved.

## Danzig Nazis Plaster Stores With Anti-Semitic Slogans

DANZIG, March 14.—Every Jewish shop in Danzig was plastered with anti-Semitic slogans today by unknown persons, presumably Nazis.

The vandalism was perpetrated during the night and the culprits succeeded in evading the police.

The Jewish population in Danzig is constantly terrorized by local Nazis, especially since the Saar became a part of Germany. Nazi agents from Berlin are lead-

## Sees Discipline Vital To Zionist Congress

LONDON, March 14.—"Unless the next Zionist Congress succeeds in bringing discipline into the Zionist organization, it will meet in vain," Professor Selig Brodetsky, member of the World Zionist Executive, said today before leaving for Palestine to participate in the sessions of the Actions Committee, which open in Jerusalem on March 27.

Professor Brodetsky pleaded against the narrow party view. "The next World Zionist Executive must include as many groups as possible," he said.

## Land Vital Need Warburg States On Return Here

### Banker Is Caustic in Answering Queries on Coughlin

Returning late yesterday afternoon on the Conte di Savoia from a month's Mediterranean cruise, during which he spent four days in Palestine, Felix M. Warburg, banker and philanthropist and a former chairman of the administrative committee of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, said that the greatest need of the Jews in Palestine today is more land.

"If the Jews in Palestine don't get more land," he declared, "they will be driven into the trades."

When apprised by reporters of the attack on himself and international bankers made this week by Father Coughlin, Mr. Warburg tersely replied:

"Let the Christians take up Father Coughlin," he said. "They are responsible for him."

Asked about the anti-Semitism of the radio priest, he was equally caustic:

"I can't read his mind." Discuss Palestine, Mr. Warburg was more talkative.

"Its development," said the man who has made five trips to the Jewish National Homeland and who has followed its developments carefully, "is remarkable. At present, progress is halted by a shortage of the right kind of labor."

Mr. Warburg stated that High Commissioner Sir Arthur Grenfell Waichope, with whom he had private conversations, was personally favorable to increased immigration. He refused, however, to make any predictions as to whether a greater number of labor immigration certificates would be issued for the next six months' period.

## Court Defers Unique Trial In Rumania

### 11,000 Czernowitz Jews Sue Ministry of Worship

BUCHAREST, March 14.—A unique court case in which 11,000 Jewish citizens of Rumania are suing the Ministry of Public Worship, opened in Czernowitz today before the Supreme Administrative Court and, after a brief session, was postponed to April 5. The suit is the first of its kind in the history of Rumania.

The case was brought against the Ministry for the liquidation of the legally elected Jewish Community of Czernowitz. While effecting liquidation of the Community, the Ministry of Public Worship has appointed a government commissioner to supervise its affairs.

#### Defend Unit's Legality

Dr. Karl Guthertz, the president of the dissolved Jewish Community, in appealing to the court in the name of 11,000 Jewish citizens for the annulment of the Ministry order, argued that the liquidation was illegal because the Jewish Community existed under statutes approved by the government.

Dr. Radelescu, the dean of the Czernowitz Chamber of Lawyers, appearing for the Jewish Community, pointed out that the statutes were drafted by an elected Jewish Community Council, and only an elected Jewish Council had the right to change them. The annulment of the statutes by the Ministry of Public Worship and its appointment of a government commissioner is therefore illegal, it is contended.

Dr. Menczer, the government commissioner, argued that he changed the statutes of the Jewish Community Council not on his own initiative but upon instructions from the ministry.

The change made in the statutes provides that only those Jews who pay religious taxes can (Continued on Page Three)

## Plan New Cuts In School Aid

### Subsidies for Jewish Institutions in Warsaw to Be Slashed Again

WARSAW, March 14.—The mayor of Warsaw, in a statement to the press today, announced that the municipal subsidies granted to the Jewish schools will be further reduced.

The educational committee of the Polish parliament today rejected the Jewish proposal to introduce the Hebrew and Yiddish languages into government schools attended by a large number of Jewish students.

The proposal was rejected by a majority of votes of deputies belonging to the pro-government party and to the anti-Semitic National Democratic party.

## New Discriminations Demanded in Reich

### Lodz Brings 'Aryan' Clause Into Practice

LODZ, March 14.—The "Aryan" paragraph as practiced in Germany was for the first time introduced in Poland today by the municipal council of the city of Lodz, one of the largest Polish industrial centers.

In voting to assign an annual prize for the best works in literature, the municipal council resolved that the prize should be limited "to 'Aryans' only."

## No New Loans For Palestine, Commons Told

### Cunliffe-Lister Says Last Year's \$10,000,000 Is Still to Be Issued

LONDON, March 14.—Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister, the Colonial Secretary, informed the House of Commons today that no further loans to the Palestine government are contemplated.

"The last year's loan of \$10,000,000 has been approved but has not as yet been issued," the Colonial Minister declared.

Colonel Josiah Wedgwood asked whether the intended issue of this loan is advisable in view of the surplus which the Palestine government enjoys. The Colonial Secretary replied that since the House of Commons has approved the loan, it will definitely be issued.

Replying to an inquiry made with regard to an amendment in the Citizenship Law in Palestine, the Colonial Secretary explained that the amendment does not deprive British citizens of their right to be tried before a British judge in Palestine.

## Warsaw Hospitals Bar Patients as Flu Hits City

WARSAW, March 14.—A severe wave of influenza has suddenly hit the crowded Jewish centers of the city.

No deaths are reported, but the Jewish hospital is crowded to such a capacity that it announced today that it would not accept any further patients.

## Hitler Paper Urges Separate Listings for Jews

BERLIN, March 14.—The separate registration of Jewish inhabitants in each town of Germany is urged today in the Voelkischer Beobachter, Hitler's official organ.

"Jews can never become Germans, and their admixture with Germans must be prevented. Therefore separate registration of Jews and those who are married to Jews would be highly in time," the official mouthpiece of the Nazi party declares.

#### Ghetto Impracticable

The Voelkischer Beobachter finds that "confining Jews again in ghettos is hardly practicable, but keeping a separate record of all the Jews and of all the non-'Aryans' is essential."

The easiest way to recognize a Jew is by his name, the paper suggests. It adds, however, that it is not always possible to tell by the name whether one is a Jew since many Jewish families have been baptized in Germany and have changed their names.

#### Resort Bids Jews Welcome

Simultaneously with the suggestion to register all Jews and "non-Aryans" in Germany, foreign correspondents here today received from the government of Hesse, where anti-Jewish propaganda is more highly developed than in any other State, a statement saying that Jewish guests from foreign countries will not be discriminated against in Bad Nauheim, a health resort operated by the State.

"Permit us, as Directorate of the Hessian State Bath of Nauheim to give you the categorical assurance that in the acceptance and treatment of invalids at Nauheim, no kind of distinction is made," the statement says. "We emphasize that Jewish invalids are treated exactly as all others. We had last season a number of Jewish visitors from various countries, among them some Jewish invalids from Palestine."

## Saar Press Angered At Election of Jews

## Observed Sabbath, Lost Job, Woman Sues Britain and Wins

LONDON, March 14.—A Jewish woman who sued the government won a verdict in her favor when the suit came up for trial today in a London court.

The woman had refused to work on Sabbath days. As a result, she had been dismissed by the firm for which she worked. Subsequently she had also been denied unemployment insurance, she charged.

The woman appealed to the court against the decision to deprive her of the insurance, to which she is entitled as an unemployed person. The court ruled that she has a right not to work on the Sabbath and ordered that unemployment insurance be paid her.

## Jews in Spain

MADRID. Difficulties in finding employment in Spain, the greatly differing mode of life of the country as compared to Germany and the complications ensuing from the unfamiliar language have checked, to a certain extent, the flow of Jewish immigration into Spain. But recent developments, such as the movement from the Saar and the increasing difficulties of finding employment in France, are again bringing immigrants here hopefully searching for the possibility of establishing and rehabilitating themselves.

The constitution of the Spanish republic guarantees liberty of conscience and the right to practice any religion. No one is called upon to state his religion officially and there are no laws prohibiting the entrance of persons into the country because they practice certain religions. There are, of course, requirements on the basis of nationality and reciprocal measures affecting citizens of some countries more than others.

Most of the Jews seeking to settle in Spain are, as to be expected, of German citizenship. They are obliged to obtain visas, a long and complicated process which includes the obtaining of a guarantee from a Spanish citizen.

Once admitted into the country, the immigrant, before being able to earn money must obtain a labor permit from the Ministry of Labor. These permits are issued for twelve-month periods and must be renewed on expiration. Should renewal of the permit be denied by the authorities for any of a number of valid reasons, the police may refuse to renew the necessary residential permit. These conditions can become most troublesome to foreigners, especially those engaged in fields of work in which Spanish citizens are also engaged.

The merchant who comes to Spain with capital finds life much easier and conditions far less involved. Many who came here as refugees have surmounted the initial obstacles and now are in possession of flourishing businesses.

The chief obstacle which they had to meet, and which newcomers seeking to engage in business have to overcome, is the question of payment of the guild fees. Most lines are recognized into guilds which fix membership taxes. The new entrant in the field may appeal from the guild's decision if the tax levy is too high, but the procedure takes time and effort.

The greatest difficulties are those which face the practitioner of a free profession. It is impossible for them to engage in their professions before they have acquired Spanish nationality and

have successfully undergone examinations in their profession. For the professional man, Spain is closed so far as a livelihood is concerned, unless he is fortunate enough to have another vocation over which the regulations are not so stringent.

## Coughlin Warned On Anti-Semitism

Radio Priest Is Challenged on Baruch Charges by Wise in Syracuse

(Special to the J.D.B.) SYRACUSE, March 14.—Challenging Father Coughlin to substantiate his charges against Bernard Baruch, Dr. Stephen S. Wise, addressing the Temple Society of Concord last night, warned the radio priest "not to fan the flames of anti-Jewish feelings."

"Do you want to evoke anti-Semitism?" Rabbi Wise asked, addressing his warning to Father Coughlin. "Do you think it fair, Christian and priestly to name six international banking firms and make it appear that five are Jewish, when you know that the house of Morgan is more powerful than the five and all the other Jewish bankers in the United States and Europe?"

Rabbi Wise concluded his challenge by asking Father Coughlin to point out a single action of Baruch not compatible with the highest standards of ethics, honor and patriotism.

# Between the Lines

## Neglecting the Farmer

The Jews in the United States are usually looked upon as a business element. Few, however, are aware of the fact that Jews in America are also fairly well represented in farming.

The Jewish farmer in America has had little in the way of publicity. Though there are more Jews on the soil in the United States than in other countries, including Palestine—Soviet Russia being the exception—little has been known of them and their activities.

Once a year the Jewish Agricultural Society publishes a report on Jewish farm settlement in America, and people then "discover" that there are actually large masses of Jewish farmers in this country. They make this discovery only to forget it the next day.

## Colonization in Jersey

It is therefore no wonder that the announcement made this week, that the State Department will begin to execute, at the end of this month, its plan of settling the families of 160 Jewish needle workers on farms in New Jersey has caused wide comment. The fact that 160 Jewish families are going to be settled on land is looked upon as an extraordinary event, just as if there were not thousands of other Jewish families tilling the soil in America, in not less than twenty states.

The novelty about the government plan may, perhaps, lie in the fact that the United States government has advanced \$850,000 for this project. But this sum is intended for industrial purposes only. It is on this sum that a garment factory and 200 homes will have to be established in order that some members of the families, who are not physically fit to work on the land, may be employed in the factory.

This is the first Federal Homestead experiment the government is making for Jews in the neighborhood of New York. It is an experiment to combine farming with factory work on a cooperative basis.

## Attention Needed

This experiment brings us back to the question of why no attention is being paid by our leading organizations in general to the entire problem of Jewish farming in America.

At no other time could a census to establish the exact number of Jewish farmers in the United States be of such importance as at present, when the wave of anti-Jewish propaganda is assuming serious proportions in our country. The anti-Semitic elements in the United States are always referring in their propaganda to Jews as "financiers" or "Communists." They never mention the fact that there are thousands of hard-working Jewish farmhands who are determined to retain their anchorage on the land despite the present distressing conditions in farming.

The duty of our central Jewish organizations is to make the facts about Jewish farming in America better known. Jewish farmers are one of the constructive sides of Jewish life in the United States. They must not be neglected. Our friends as well as our enemies should be better informed about the number of Jews in America who stick to the soil and who are far from being "financiers."

# World Press Digest

## Sees No Relaxation Of 'Aryan Clauses'

The *New Statesman and Nation*, well known English publication, speaking on Germany, says:

Dr. Schacht is in the ascendant, and he stands for nineteenth century capitalism, not for medieval distributism. The one aspect of National Socialism that certainly remains is its political terrorism. There is no relaxation of the "Aryan clauses" and, instead of the promised lull in persecutions after the Saar, there are signs in the renewed activities of the 'nauseating Streicher and his friends of a new drive against the Jews.

## Spoke Up for Jews, Hitler Gags Him

Ludwig Lore in his daily column in the *New York Post*, commenting on the growing anti-Jewish agitation in Germany, says:

The *Chicago Daily News* tells an incredible story. "Rumor has it," says its Berlin correspondent, "that Herman Roehling, the great steel producer of the Saar, was unceremoniously dismissed from an interview with Chancellor Hitler when he tried to put in a good word for the Jews in the territory." "The interview is at an end," the Chancellor is reported to have said brusquely when Roehling tried to discuss the subject. Herman Roehling, it should not be forgotten, was the leader of the

German front in the Saar. He not only directed the Saar campaign but spent several hundred thousand marks out of his own pocket. In unimportant matters of political and economic principle, Hitler will talk turkey with his industrialists. But he who doubts the virtues of Nazi anti-Semitism attacks the fundamentals of the Hitler regime.

## Baer-Schmeling Bout Intrigues Brisbane

Arthur Brisbane commenting in his column in the *Hearst newspapers* on Schmeling's victory over Hamas in Germany, writes:

Max Schmeling, German heavyweight prizefighter beat Mr. Hamas with ease, and says: "Now we get Baer." Baer, you know is the world heavyweight champion. The fact that he is a Jew, and not a blue-eyed Nordic, with the back of his head as straight up and down as a board fence, is said to annoy Mr. Hitler.

It will interest Hitler and others. A hard-hitting "Nordic" meets Max Baer, a tall young Jew who laughs while he fights. The meeting will settle nothing. Racial supremacy does not depend on the fist. But in New York City it ought to draw a crowd, gigantic, and a "gate" of about \$1,000,000.

Jews do well whatever is worth doing, and there is nothing new about Jewish prizefighting champions. Mendoza "The Jew," whom you may see fighting without gloves in old British prints, had a habit of knocking men out. Benny Leonard, in his prime, was the best man in the world in his class.

## Yeshiva to Hold Its Graduation Next Tuesday

**First in 3 Years, 27 Students Will Receive Diplomas**

Graduating exercises of the Yeshiva College will be held Tuesday afternoon, the anniversary day of Rabbi Isaac Elchanan, the sage whose name the Yeshiva bears.

The Yeshiva does not hold annual graduations. The last commencement exercises were held three years ago. Twenty-seven students, from various parts of the country, Canada and Palestine, will receive their Semicha (rabbinical diploma). Most of them have already been called to rabbinic positions in seven states.

In connection with the graduation exercises, a conference of the rabbinical alumni of the Yeshiva will be held at the Yeshiva. At the same time twelve graduates of the Teachers' Institute, the Yeshiva training school for Hebrew teachers, will receive their diplomas. Of the 134 graduates of this department of the Yeshiva, 65 are now teaching; seventeen are principals of schools; three are members of faculties of institutions of higher learning, and six continue their studies at the Yeshiva and Yeshiva College.

## Szolds Leave for Zion Tomorrow

Robert Szold, former president of the Zionist Organization of America and vice-chairman of the Council of the Jewish Agency, and Mrs. Szold, vice-president of Hadassah, will leave tomorrow on the Conte di Savoia for Palestine, where they will spend several months.

Mr. Szold, for whom this will be the third visit to Palestine, will make a survey of the economic development of the country. He is chairman of the board of directors of the American Economic Committee for Palestine, vice-president of the Palestine Economic Corporation, treasurer of the Palestine Endowment Funds, Inc. and a director of the Palestine Potash Ltd.

As national chairman of the Palestine Committee of Hadassah, Mrs. Szold will confer with the Palestine members of the Rothschild-Hadassah-University Hospital building committee and bring back to America full details of the progress of the project.

### To Drive Jews Out of Manual Labor

The New York Times in a cable from its Berlin correspondent yesterday reports that Dr. Schacht has issued a circular which will actually deprive the Jews in Germany of their right to manual labor, and which destroys one of the main hopes entertained by Jewish organizations of readjusting the German Jews to new vocations.

The circular reads:

"The Reich and Prussian Minister of the Interior informs me he does not consider it advisable to prevent or hamper instruction courses in the manual crafts for

Jews willing to emigrate, because the measure that promotes the emigration of Jews must be welcome.

"Illegal labor that might be feared from individual Jews thus trained in manual trades should adequately be met by police measures. The independent pursuit of a manual craft as a standing trade is opposed by the provisions of the third ordinance regarding the preliminary reconstruction of German manual trades, dated January 18, 1935."
