Party Ousts Vaida-Voevod As Leader

Agitation for Anti-Semitic Laws in Rumania **Brings Downfall**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BUCHAREST, March 17 .- Dr. Vaida Voevod, ex-Premier of Rumania, chief instigator of the anti-Jewish movement here, was relieved of his leadership of the National Peasant Party in Transylvania today as the result of his anti-Semitic propaganda which is not approved by the National Peasant Party.

It became clear today that the National Peasant Party seriously intends to expel the ex-Premier altogether from the party because of his insistence on anti-Jewish legislation limiting Jews in the professions and in education.

Denies Anti-Semitism

Fighting to retain his leadership, Dr. Vaida Voevod today addressed a letter to the executive of his party stating that he would combat all efforts to expel him from the party and that he considers his program a "salvation to Rumania."

"Nobody can expel me because I am the Party," the ex-Premier says in his letter. "I will proceed with my plan with all my power until I achieve a final victory."

The Rumanian press reports today that Dr. Vaida-Voevod conferred with a number of his followers in order to effect a plan which would give him full control of the National Peasant Party and enable him to start a successful revolt against the Executive. It is understood, however, that the majority of those who participated in the conference expressed the opinion that it would be more practical to form a new party rather than to revolt against the present leaders of the National Peasant Party.

A statement issued by Dr. Vaida-Voevod today denies that the ex-Premier is anti-Semitic in his proposals to introduce limitations in professions and in education for national minorities in Rumania. These proposals are directed not only against the Jews but against all national minorities, and aim to safeguard the Rumanians, the statement says.

Young Endeks Launch Attacks On Jews in Lodz

National Socialist Party Dissolved by Police in Wilno

WARSAW, March 17.— Anti-Jewish attacks occurred in the streets of Lodz today and resulted in the arrests of many young members of the anti-Semitic National Democratic party.

At the same time, the authorities today dissolved the National Socialist party in Wilno on a charge of engaging in criminal ac-

The anti-Jewish attacks in Lodz were concentrated chiefly in Andrzeja, Lipowa and Poralewska streets. The anti-Semitic youths assaulted Jewish passersby, causing a panic among the Jewish population.

The police, who arrived in time to check the attacks, surrounded the streets and arrested the hooligans in large numbers. The attacks were organized and planned in advance as part of the anti-Jewish drive which the anti-Semitic National Democratic party in Lodz has started, after failing to force the municipality to dismiss all Jews from municipal institu-

PHILADELPHIA, March 17.-Reaffirming the boycott of Nazi products in the United States and asking for a new investigation of Nazi activities here, the extraordinary session of the American Jewish Congress concluded its twoday meeting tonight, electing Dr. Stephen S. Wise, president. Bernard S. Deutsch, retiring president, announced that his duties as president of the board of aldermen of New York City keeps him from devoting sufficient time to the tasks of the Congress. At the same time, former Congressman Nathan D. Perlman was elected chairman of the newly formed executive committee.

A change in the constitution of the American Jewish Congress was voted at the afternoon session, abolishing the present set-up of the organization. The charge provides for dividing the United States into seven separate regions, instead of administering the entire work of the Congress from New

The proposal made by the administrative committee of the Congress to abolish the system of direct election of delegates met with strong opposition by representatives of the labor bloc. The laborites threatened to leave the ranks of the Congress if the rights of

Warns of Danger. Facing Memel Jews

Situation in Danzig, Rumania, Also Found Menacing by Board of Deputies

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) LONDON, March 17 .- The danger facing the Jews in Memel in connection with the Nazi propaganda there was emphasized today at a meeting of the Board of Deputies of British Jews.

The report also emphasized that the Jews in D anzig are exposed to Nazi danger in view of the probable change in the constitution of the Free City.

The meeting heard a report that the situation of the Jews in Rumania is growing worse since the new labor law there, with its paragraph requiring a statement of the religion of every employe held as serious for the Jews as the "Aryan" paragraph in Germany.

Dumping Plan Is Perfected by Reich Cabinet

Involves Taxes to Offset Losses in Export of **Goods Below Cost**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, March 17 .- A new, well-organized program for dumping goods in foreign countries at prices less than the cost of production has been completed by the German Cabinet and will be put into operation soon, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learned here today from a reliable source.'

The program consists of a variety of measures devised to cope with the dangerous situation which has arisen as a result of the decline in exports, which is attributed to the boycott of German goods abroad. One of the measures contem-

plated will be the introduction of a special tax on all goods sold within Germany. The income from this tax will serve as a fund to subsidize the export of German goods abroad at prices far below the cost of manufacture.

The export of German goods during the month of February has shown a further substantial decline, it was learned here today. The export figures for February will be made public this week.

Army Plans Hold Fate of Reich Jewry

May Decide Today if Jews Will Be Included in Conscription

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, March 17.—The Jews of Germany were anxiously awaiting today the publication of additional orders on the conscription of citizens in the German army, in order to establish whether the orders will also include Jews.

In view of the importance of this uegstion, since it will affect the status of ctiizenship for German Jewry, the executive of the Jewish War Veterans Association was considering today whether to approach the authorities with a direct inquiry. It was feared, however, that such an inquiry might prejudice their case.

Concern Over Decision

Other leading Jewish circles expressed great concern as to whether the conscription order will differentiate between "Arvans" and Jews. If Jews are not accepted into the enlarged German army, it will be tantamount to an expression of government distrust of the loyalty of German Jewry and to putting the German Jews into citizenship of a special class.

The detailed orders about the new conscription are expected to be issued on Monday. "The answer to the problem of whether or not the Jews are to be included in the conscription will be known only when these orders are made public," the Jewish Telegraphic Agency was informed here today.

Hint in Press

Indications that the "Aryan" paragraph may be applied against Jews in the new conscription were given today in an article syndicated by the press bureau of the Nazi party in a number of German newspapers. "The State of Adolph Hitler is a State of Tolerance," the article says. "The Jews can continue to follow their occupations in peace. So far as we Germans are concerned they simply are not there. We don't see them. But it does not suit us that these guests of our nation should encroach where they are not wanted."

Dutch Aid for the Refugees

AMSTERDAM.

More than 2,300 refugees from Germany remain in the Netherlands, according to the report of the Committee for Jewish Refugees for the past year. The report, drawn up by Mrs. G. van Tijn-Cohn and Prof. D. Cohen, reveals that 138 of these refugees are entirely dependent on the committee. It also points out that the present employment of the remainder of this group is

endangered by the new regulations announced by the government for labor-permits for foreigners.

Jews of the Netherlands raised -and expended-last year a considerable sum to aid the victims of the German situation. The American Joint Distribution Committee and the HICEM aided the work here and a total of 910,000 guilders was applied to the work. Despite this, the executive of the Askenazi Jewish community had to appeal to members of Jewish congregations in the Netherlands to add voluntarily an extra five percent to the clerical taxes for the refugee funds.

From March, 1933, to December 31, 1934, 5,263 refugees were registered here. Of this number, 3,-724 were aided in further migrating. A total of 969 went to France and Belgium: 921 went back to Germany; 240 departed for North and South America; 163, for Palestine and 96 to Spain and Portu-

Fifty refugees are at present in the working village established in the Zuyder Zee reclaimed area. The Committee now expends 1,000 guilders a month to maintain them.

A special school established here to prepare the German-Jewish children for the Dutch schools, closed down last January. The school, which had been opened with 105 pupils, had thirty left when it had to close.

Another agency which the Dutch - Jewish community maintained to help the refugees was an employment service. Five hundred German Jewish women and girls were placed in good positions as home-servants by this agency which suspended its activities last January because the need for it had disappeared.

The Committee's income report discloses that the sixty-odd thousand Jews of Amsterdam contributed 152,000 guilders last year. This total does not include the 48,000 guilder fund raised by the Academic Assistance Fund to which Jews and non-Jews donated to aid intellectuals ousted from their positions and forced to leave the Reich.

East and West Indies, another 2,-600 guilders.

To assist in the care of refugees and prepare for their settlement, the sum of 510,000 guilders was advanced by representative relief agencies from other countries. The American Joint Distribution Committee sent 110,000 guilders; the Central British Fund, 7,500 guilders, and HICEM expended 110,000 guilders towards the travel expenses of the refugees.

The Committee spent 788,000 guilders in Amsterdam and 108,-000 guilders in the provinces for administration expenses and for support of the refugees. The sum of 48,000 guilders went toward the fund to send German Jewish children to Palestine. Another 50,000 guilders was spent on the Zuyder Zee project.

The Jewish population of the Netherlands, in all is about 150,-000. Dutch Jewry, looking back at this record of activity in behalf of the German Jews, and recalling its contributions to Zionist activities during the past year, proudly feels that it did its utmost to aid in making the best of the German catastrophe.

Rambam Fete Set for April 14 At Emanu - El

Jews, Gentiles to Join in Honoring Spanish Philosopher

Jews of New York City will unite in celebration of the eight hundredth birthday of Moses Maimonides, Spanish-Jewish philosopher and commentator, on April 14, it was announced yesterday by the Maimonides Octocentennial Committee.

The celebration will take place in the Isaac M. Wise Auditorium of Temple Emanu-El, 1 East Sixtyfifth street, and will include addresses by eminent Jews and non-

Celebrations of the Maimonides anniversary will also be held in many American universities and medical schools, Professor Salo W. Baron of Columbia announced. Professor Baron heads an advisory council composed of leading Jewish scholars and educators. Columbia, Yale, Johns Hopkins, Upiversity of Chicago, Loyola and the Catholic University of America are among those scheduled to observe the birthday.

A series of semi-popular and scholarly pamphlets will be published in connection with the octocentennial, and will include reprints of previous standard works on the life and writings of Maimonides, together with new studies and essays. Maimonides was born in Cordoba, Spain, in 1135, and his religious and philosophical thought have had a great influence upon later Jewish and Christian thinkers.

Nazi Conscription and the Jews Will the Jews be taken into the German army during the proclaimed conscription?

This question is now intriguing not only the Jews of Germany but Jews all over the world. It is in the answer to this question that the key to the official status of the Jews in Germany lies. If they are taken into the army, then it means that, after all, they are still considered trustworthy citizens of the Reich. If the proclaimed conscription excepts Jews, this will mean that the Nazi government does not trust the Jewish population. In the long run, it may mean that if Germany goes into war the Jews will be segregated or perhaps even exiled from certain zones. Hindenburg, Schleicher, Hitler

The "Aryan" paragraph now in force against the Jews in Germany has so iar not been officially applied in the army. This is because President Hindenburg constantly insisted that the army must have nothing to do with politics. It is also because of the strong opposition which General Schleicher displayed against introducing Nazi theories into. the Reichswehr when he was head of the German army.

But President Hindenburg is dead now, and General Schleicher was executed by the Nazis during the purge of June 30. The master of the German army today is Herr Hitler, and Hitler's views on the "Aryan" paragraph are quite well known.

13,000 War-Fallen Jews

During the last world war the Jews of Germany, being one per cent of the entire population, participated in the army to an extent much greater than their proportion warranted. Not less than 13,000 Jews fell on the German front as war heroes. This fact has been appreciated even by the Nazis, who, in introducing the "Aryan" paragraph against Jews, have made exceptions for those who fought in the world war.

This gives German Jewry the hope that when the conscription takes place no discriminations will be practiced against Jews and that young Jewish citizens will also be among those conscripted. This hope is nurtured not because the Jews are so militaristically inclined, but simply because their entire citizenship rights will now depend upon the question of whether or not they are to be conscripted as equal citizens of the country.

A Vague Hope

One need not be very pessimistic to predict that this hope will hardly materialize. Though there is no "Aryan" paragraph for the army, German soldiers are prohibited by an official decree from marrying girls of Jewish descent, which is the best indication as to the sentiments of the Nazi rulers with regard to Jewish participation in the German army.

There are now a number of semi-military organizations in Germany to which Jews are definitely not admitted. The Jews in Germany are even barred from the citizens' groups which are being trained to protect themselves in case of air raids. General Goering, the Air Minister, when asked why Jewish citizens are not invited to participate in these drills, made it quite clear that he does not care what happens to the Jews during the gas attacks from the air. He also made it clear that Jews cannot be members of

World Press Digest

New Nazi Drive on Jews Seen Significant

The New York Post commenting editorially on the new drive against the Jews in Germany says:

The surest sign that Nazi economic policies are going badly in Germany is the renewal of the anti-Semitic drive. The attention of the citizens of the Third Reich must again be distracted from the constant fall in the standard of living by the sure-fire technique of whipping up race hysteria.

All Jewish publishers are or-dered to sell their businesses. Mass arrests of Jews are begun and prisoners are herded into "schooling camps," euphemism for concentration camps. Meetings of Jews for discussion of their problems are banned and broken up. Education of Jews is so sharply restricted it nears the vanishing point.

Nazi leaders are caught in a dilemma of their own making. They have been trying to break the world boycott against Germany by pretending that repression is at an end. But while they have peddled this transparent lie over their borders, within their

country they have been compelled to renew the persecutions to drag out the old racial scapegoat again to explain their failure.

Almost every development in the new Germany adds fire and strength to the spontaneous world boycott.

Sees Danger in Arab-Jewish Relations

The Irish Times, in an editorial on Palestine, says:

Political trouble is more likely than economic. Although there is better feeling in and around Jaffa-thanks to the employment of Arab labor by Jewish settlers-yet the relations of the two races throughout the country at large shows no sign of improvement. At present the Jews are reasonably contented, but the Arabs are full of grievances. Last December an Arab deputation waited upon the British High Commissioner, and urged that the Jewish invasion was endangering the Arabs' civil

Holds Jews Play Small Part in EWS Boycott of Nazis

Less Than 10% of Active Supporters. Untermyer Says on Coast

(Special to the J.D.B.)

LOS ANGELES, March 17. Jews constitute less than ten per cent of the elements in the United States who are engaged in boycotting German goods in America, Samuel Untermyer, president of the Non - Sectarian Anti - Nazi League, declared here today at a mass meeting of the Los Angeles Americanization League in the Philharmonic Auditorium.

Mr. Untermyer took issue with the assertion made recently by Dr. Julius Lippert, the Nazi Commissar for Berlin, that the world-wide boycott of German goods is a "Jewish boycott." Terming this assertion as "baseless mendacity," Mr. Untermyer, in a comprehensive reply, pointed out that not less than 17,000,000 members of great labor organizations are actively engaged in the boycott and that the boycott movement is also being sponsored and supported by Catholics, Protestants, and especially by women throughout the

Will Be Intensified

"A glance at the various elements that are engaged in the struggle to vindicate civilization by the boycott will show that the Jews are less than ten per cent in the great armies of the people who are boycotting Nazi goods,' Mr. Untermyer said.

"The boycott," Mr. Untermyer continued, "is our only weapon. Effective as it has already proven, it has just begun to function. It will be intensified and strengthened throughout the world until it results in the collapse of the savage, medieval Nazi regime and the restoration in Germany of the racial, religious, and industrial freedom and democracy with which the people of that nation were blessed before this curse overtook them."

Reviews Persecution

Replying to the Nazi assertions from Berlin that "the Jews in Germany are not being persecuted," Mr. Untermyer gave a bird's eye review of what has happened to the Jews since Hitler came to pow-

"The first act that visualized his accession," Mr. Untermyer said, "was the indiscriminate slaughter of its innocent law-abiding minority of Jewish citizens of German birth and ancestry; the brutal beatings and imprisonment of thousands of others, driven by starvation and insanity to suicide: the boycotting and intimidation of the owners of Jewish shops and businesses; the destruction of their shops, and punishment of those who patronized them; the enforced discharge of Jewish employes, and their expulsion from the ranks of organized workers, from the army and no from all posts in the Civil Government; the outlawing without exception of all of Germany's great scientists, artists, authors, lawyers and physicians of Jewish blood or ancestry, or who were married to women with the 'taint' of Jewish blood, who had shed lustre upon their country and had been honored in foreign lands, and the destruction of their books including the dead with the living, all solely because of their 'taint' of Jewish blood; the confiscation of their property; the prohibition of all Jewish contact and the enactment, without rhyme, reason or excuse, of cruel medieval laws that are obviously confessedly intended to bring about the ultimate extermination of the Jewish population in Germany.

Foreign Policy Ass'n Enthused Over Talk on Palestine

(Special to the J.D.B.)

BOSTON, March 17.—After being received here by Governor Curley of Massachusetts and by Mayor Mansfield, Vladimir Jabotinsky, Zionist Revisionist leader, delivered a stirring address on Palestine yesterday before the Foreign Policy Association at a luncheon in his honor at the Copley Plaza Hotel.

An audience of more than 400 noted persons listened to Jabotinsky speak on "Palestine, More Than a Refuge From Anti-Semitism." Jabotinsky declared that Palestine is not only a sufficient safeguard for Jewish national existence. The anti-Semitic pressure increases the need of Jewish immigration and five million Jews clamor at Palestine's gates. Colonized at the density of Wales, Palestine will contain eight million people, Mr. Jabotinsky said.

"After the World War, the justice of the Jewish case for Palestine was recognized by the entire world opinion, acting through the League of Nations and the Congress of the United States," Mr. Jabotinsky emphasized.

Jabotinsky's address created a tramendous impression and was concluded with a statement by Professor Hocking, who said that the area of agreement with Jabotinsky has considerably enlarged after hearing him."

Mr. Jabotinsky also addressed the Jewish War Veterans here and had luncheon with Prof. Felix Frankfurter of Harvard.



Completes Preparations for Celebration in Jerusalem Apr. 1

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) JERUSALEM, March 17.-The Hebrew University in Jerusalem today completed preparations for the celebration on April 1 of the tenth anniversary of its dedication by the late Lord Balfour.

Friends of the Hebrew University in the United States and in many other countries will hold nation-wide celebrations in their respective countries, according to word received here by Dr. J. L. Magnes, Chancellor of the Univer-

In Jerusalem, an elaborate ceremony will take place on April 10, at which Dr. Magnes will be the principal speaker. An international broadcast from Jerusalem of Dr. Magnes's speech will be arranged for audiences in the United States.

There are now eighty professors and lecturers in the academic staff of the university. Ten of them are supported out of the German Emergency Fund.

The Hebrew University Library now has on its shelves more than three hundred thousand valuable volumes. Many books were received this year, as a result of events in Europe, particularly in Germany and in Poland.

Warburg Chairman Of Celebrations Here

Elaborate preparations for the celebration of the tenth anniversary of the dedication of the Hebrew University in Palestine, under the chairmanship of Felix M. Warburg, were announced yesterday by Dr. A. S. W. Rosenbach, president of the American Friends of the Hebrew University.

A chain of dinners and meetings will be held from coast to coast and the voices of Sir Herbert Samuel, James de Rothschild and Dr. Judah L. Magnes, chancellor of the Hebrew University, will be heard in an international broadeast from London and Jerusalem, to be carried over the blue network of the National Broadcasting Company on Tuesday night, April 2, from 9:30 to 10:30 o'clock.

Among the projects planned for the next ten years, according to Dr. Rosenbach, are the development of an gricultural college that is expected to do much towards making secure the economic future of Palestine; the establishment of a meteorological station; extensive researches in tropical medicine, and the building of a great medical center. A threeyear program for the acquisition of renowned scholars formerly attached to German universities is also under way, as many as seventeen having already been placed on the staff of the University

Sees 'Roman Holiday'

"It is altogether possible," Prince Loewenstein predicted,-"that the Hitler regime will make a Roman holiday of the Jews in order to divert the population from its own gangsterism.

"The recent statements made by Dr. Schacht and Herr Lippert with regard to the Jews are nothing but a continuation of gangster tactics, of professing to take one half a step backward after having taken three steps forward," Prince Loewenstein continued. In actuality the Jewish situation in Germany has gone from bad to worse and will continue to grow worse."

The necessity of convoking a world Jewish congress was affrmed in principle in the report submitted by the administrative commit-

Summary of Report

The report, read by Louis Lipsky, recommended:

- 1. The abolition of direct election of delegates to the American Jewish Congress.
- 2. To construct an all-inclusive body of Jewry, through which existing national and local organizations might achieve representation in the Congress, instead of the abolished electoral system.
- 3. That the activities of the American Jewish Congress should be financed by a method of self taxation and assessment rather than by donation.

After the opposition expressed by a number of delegates from the floor against the recommendations, a compromise was reached by which they were referred to a special committee. The modified report, however, was to be read again later, before the entire as-

Leading the opposition was Louis Segal. Dr. Chaim Zhitlowsky, presenting the ideology of the labor bloc, was one of the principal speakers at the opening session. Other speakers included Prof. Ettlinger of the University of Texas, and Dr. Harry Friedenwald.

Rabbi Wise, in his opening speech, paid tribute to Baron Edmund de Rothschild, Victor Jacobson, Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, Dr. Leo Motzkin, Chief Rabbi Angelo Saccerdoti, Chaim Nachman Bialik and other Jewish leaders who have died since the last meeting of the Congress, in April, 1933.

Reviews 2 Years of Hitler

Bernard S. Deutsch, president, who presided at the morning session today, gave a review of the first two years of Hitlerism which has effected "a return to the barbarism of the Middle Ages and seeks the conquest of the universe.'

The report submitted to the assembly by the Administrative Committee covers conditions of Jewish life in Germany, Austria, Poland, Rumania, Lithuania, Latvia and the United States.

"In all these countries, there is a Jewish problem. In the United States this problem is just beginning to emerge," it says. "In the lands of Eastern Europe, fifty percent of the Jews are on the verge of economic collapse. A process of economic strangulation is going on in Eastern Europe, which has brought about the withdrawal of virtually all those rights which were recognized as just only after the World War. For the Jew the

are being rebuilt around them in vitrually all the lands of the Eastern world."

Cites Nazi Import Drop

Dr. Joseph Tannenbaum, reporting on the boycott of Nazi goods in the United States, declared that imports from Germany have decreased, from 1932 to 1934, fully twenty-five per cent. While in 1932 the import of German goods to America constituted twenty-one per cent of the total imports, it reached only sixteen per cent in 1934, he stated.

An interesting report on Jewish immigration possibilities was read at the morning session by Harold Fields. Mr. Fields told the Congress that the only possible hope for Jewish immigration lies in Biro-Bidjan, in New Zealand and in the northwestern part of Canada, if the authorities there will agree to admit Jews. Mass immigration elsewhere is impossible, Mr. Fields pointed out.

Reports on Bias Here

Rabbi J. Cohen, in reporting at the session on economic discrimination in the United States, emphasized that many firms are refusing to employ Jews.

"If the Jew is not to remain within the pale of marginal workers, the last to be hired and the first to be fired, then we must revive our campaign of educating the big employing executives to the realization that workers should be selected without regard to any other factors than those of the technical qualifications required by the job," Rabbi Cohen declared.

Speakers at the afternoon session included Abraham Goldberg, Dr. A. Coralnik and Leo Herman.

Morris Rothenberg, president of the Zionist Organization of America, speaking "for Zionists who helped to found the American Jewish Congress," praised the work of the Congress and declared that Palestine today is "the most promising hope for the future of

Moslem Daily **Deplores Riots** Against Jews

Syrian Newspaper Also Hits Persecution in Germany

DAMASCUS, Syria. — Condemnation of the Arab population in Algeria for provoking anti-Jewish riots and of the German government in driving the Jews out of Germany without reason is contained in a leading article published in Alif Ba, a Moslem daily here.

"The Jewish religion is one of the most honored in the world, and it is the duty of members of all other religions to treat it with esteem," the article says. "It is true that we are fighting Zionism, but combatting Zionist aspirations has nothing to do with respecting the Jewish religion and those Jews who are not supporting the Zionist aims," the paper declares.

Paris Daily Sees Danger For Algiers Jewry

PARIS. - The Jews of Algiers are still in danger, it is asserted in a long article published in L'Intransigeant, a Paris daily.

"The Jewish population living in Algiers is in constant danger," the paper writes. "We urge for the sake of our sanctity that European military forces be sent there. We urge that propaganda be carried on to remind the Arabs of the

Karlinski Is Dead, **Was Warsaw Editor**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) WARSAW, March 17.—Ber Karlinski, one of the editors of the Moment, the Yiddish daily which celebrated its twenty-fifth anniversary this week, died here today at the age of 49 after an illness lasting two years. Despite the illness, however, Karlinski continued his literary activities and his latest article appeared in the jubilee edition of the Moment, the paper with which he was connected from its inception.

Karlinski was the author of a number of novels in Yiddish. He also translated Knut Hamsun and Arthur Schnitzler into the Yiddish

The joyous Jewish holiday of Purim, commemorating the downfall of anti-Jewish persecution in ancient Persia 2,500 years ago, will be ushered in at sundown tonight in all Jewish communities. The Book of Esther, which tells the story of the attempt at mass destruction of the Jews in ancient Persia, will be read tonight and tomorow morning in synagogues and temples, in observance of the festival. As recorded in the Biblical narratives, the machinations of Haman, minister of the Persian emperor Ahasuerus, who plotted the wholesale massacre of the Jews, were foiled by the courage of Esther, the queen, and her kinsman. Mordecai.

Plays Provided

The Jewish Education Association has arranged a number of entertainments and dramatic performances based on the story of Esther to be given in hundreds of Jewish Sunday schools and Talmud Torahs.

Numerous Jewish organizations, including lodges of Masonic order, Odd Fellows, Brith Abraham, and others will celebrate Purim at regular or special meetings.

The 300 chapters of the Hadassah organization will commemorate the historic deed of Queen Esther—the Hadasah of the Bible by special programs.

Appeals will be made in synagogues and Jewish centers for collections for the Jewish National Fund during the Purim festival.

A number of radio stations in the United States have arranged music programs for Purim. Dr. Cyrus Adler, president of the American Jewish Committee, will be the principal speaker on a program arranged for Tuesday over a National Broadcasting Company radio network.

Tel Aviv Celebration To Last 3 Days

TEL AVIV, March 17.—Everything is set for the big traditional Purim carnival which will last three days this year instead of the usual one, according to a program announced today.

Old Hospital Site Sold for \$200,000

The site of the Rothschild-Hadassah Hospital in Jerusalem has been sold for approximately \$200,~ 000, it was announced here yesterday by Hadassah.

The hospital, established by Hadassah in 1918, will be replaced by the proposed Rothschild-Hadassah-University Medical Center to be built on Mt. Scopus, near the Hebrew University. The land and building of the present hospital, located near the business section of Jerusalem, were given to Hadassah in 1918 by the late Baron Edmond de Rothschild, whose family has authorized the sale of the property, the proceeds to be applied to the construction of the new medical center.

The building cost of the new medical center is estimated at between \$500,000 and \$600,000.
