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Decision on Peace Pact

Hedera Parley Votes No. **but Leaves Last Word** to Histadruth

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) JERUSALEM, March 19. - The conference of the Palestine Labor party was concluded at Hedera today with ninety-four voting against ratification of the peace agreement signed by Ben-Gurion and Jabotinsky in London and ninety voting for ratification.

The final decision on ratification was left entirely to a conference of the Histadruth, the Federation of Labor. After the Histadruth decides whether or not to approve of the peace agreement with Jabotinsky, the Palestine Labor party will again assemble to take a final stand on the question.

Appeals for Approval

David Ben-Gurion, who signed the agreement with Jabotinsky, urged the conference to ratify it. Ratification, he said, may compel Jabotinsky to recognize the discipline within the ranks of the Zionist party and to submit to this discipline.

"Our present conference," Mr. Ben-Gurion declared, "is one of the most important gatherings concerned with the fate of the Jewish people. The peaceful upbuilding of Palestine depends upon our decision. Should the agreement with Jabotinsky not be ratified, it will mean the resumption of disturbances which will spell harm for our upbuilding work, internally as well as externally.

Agrees on Changes

"I agree that certain alterations in the texts of the agreement should be introduced by the conference, but the spirit of the agreement must remain, because it is the only way to save our Palestine work from hopeless confusion," Mr. Ben-Gurion pleaded.

David Remez, another Labor leader, suggested that a standing committee of twenty delegates be formed to effect a compromise in the text of the agreement upon which both wings could agree. After repeated rejections and heated debates which lasted the entire day, the conference elected a committee of twenty-four, equally representing both wings. The committee also included Ben-Gurion, Remez and Joseph Sprinzak.

A night session was held by the representatives of committee, which lasted until early this morning and which resulted in the vote referring the final decision to the Histadruth.

War, Navy Departments 1934 Import Figures Grant Furloughs to Jews in Service

(Special to the J.D.B.) WASHINGTON, March 19.—The

United States War and Navy Departments issued an official order today granting furloughs to Jewish soldiers and sailors enabling them to observe the Passover holidays at their homes.

At the same time, the Jewish Welfare Board announced that it will supply Jewish service men with matzoh and will arrange for religious observances for those residing at a distance from their homes. The board will also arrange Passover observances at outlying points, including China, Manilla, Hawaii, Panama and and Haiti.

The order issued by the War Department reads:

"The Secretary of War desires, in order to permit soldiers of the Jewish faith to participate in the observance of Passover, that furloughs be granted to members of that faith for such time as is necessary to permit them to be at their homes, when practicable, or at places where Seder celebrations are held, from noon of Wednesday, April 17, 1935, until midnight of Saturday, April 20, 1935, provided no interference with the public service is occasioned there-

Reveal Sales Were \$6,500,000

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) JERUSALEM, March 19. - The United States now occupies third place in Palestine imports, it was disclosed today when figures on imports for 1934 were made public.

The figures disclose that Palestine imported goods valued at \$75,-000,000 during 1934. Of these products totalling \$71,000,000 were imported from England. The United States came third with a total import value of \$6,500,000.

Germany occupied second place among nations exporting to Palestine during 1934. Machinery and merchandise which Palestine imported from Germany during the year, amounted to \$8,500,000.

Nimzowitsch Dies In Copenhagen

Famed Chess Player Was 48; Won World Title at Dresden in 1926

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) COPENHAGEN, March 19.— Aron Nimzowitsch, one of the world's most famous chess players, died here today at the age of 48.

Nimzowitsch won the world's championship in 1926 at an international chess tournament in Dresden. In 1925 he shared the world title with Akiba Rubinstein, both winning first prize in the international chess competition in Marien-

Nimzowitsch was born in Riga in 1887, when the city was part of Russia, but resided in Copen-hagen for many years. He is the author of a handbook on chess, which was published in Berlin several years ago.

Artisans in Poland Warned to Register

All-Jewish City Packed for Annual Carnival; Arabs Participate

TEL AVIV, March 19.—All roads to Tel Aviv were crowded today with public and private vehicles in which tens of thousands of persons from all over the country rode to

participate in today's Purim carnival, celebrated annually in the streets of Tel Aviv, commemorating the deliverance of the Jews from Haman, the Persian minister, who plotted to exterminate the Jewish population of Persia, 2,300 years ago.

Thousands of Arabs were among the crowds who came to this all-Jewish city today to take part in the Purim festivities. It is estimated that more than 100,000 persons jammed the streets for the parade, street dancing and masquerades which took place in the central portions of the city.

The festivities were opened by Aviv, with a message of greeting and officers on the battlefield. illuminated and gay songs were 84 More Reich Jews heard from early evening till late in the morning. Dancing continued all night long in the streets, with young and old participating.

The admission of Jews into the German army on the principle of equal citizenship is totally excluded, the correspondent was given to understand. General von Blomberg, head of the Reichswehr, is personally not opposed to admitting Jews into the army ranks as full-fledged citizens, but such proposals, it was stated, would meet the strongest opposition by those extremists in the Nazi party who lately have gained ground even in matters concerning the

Jews Prepared

Jewish circles here are prepared for the possibility of discrimination against Jews in the conscription. Non-acceptance of Jews into the regular army will reduce them even to a lower civic status and will undermine their last economic and social positions, it was explained today by Jewish leaders.

The Association of Jewish War Veterans will definitely decline to cooperate in the eventual formation of special Jewish brigades, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency correspondent was reliably informed. Similarly, the Jews will not be ready to cooperate in any other plans which would admit them to auxiliary service only.

A strong feeling of embitterment prevails among German Jewry as a result of this new humiliation to which they are to be subjected. The authorities today also decorated members of the family of the Jewish composer Gniessin in recognition of his contributions to Russian Jewish music.

The native Algerian troops are no longer reliable. Three weeks ago, at Setif, native troops actually joined the population in a wild orgy of rebellion, in which police garrisons were stormed, policemen killed, and the Jewish quarter of the city sacked.

The French Government is naturally alarmed at this situation. For trouble in North Africa weakens France in Europe, where she cannot afford to be weak with a new, bellicose Germany waiting for the day of revenge.

One of the first steps likely to be taken is the withdrawal of the native Algerian troops from Algeria, their transport to France and other parts of the French empire, their replacement in Algeria by French and Senegalese troops.

A special high commission has been appointed to watch over the affairs of Algeria, Tunisia, and Morocco, and report on the necessary measures to the Cabinet.

The inter-Ministerial commismion of Mussulman affairs has been placed under the direct control of Premier Flandin himself.

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Lines By B. SMOLAR . Rabbis and Synagogues

The synagogue in America today is no longer a place of Jewish teachings only. It is a platform for general education. It is a place where everything can be preached, whether it deals with Jewish life or not.

This is the attitude taken by Rabbi Louis I. Newman in his reply to my comment on the Strachey case. This is the attitude which may also be taken by other rabbis, although I doubt that their number is great.

Jewishness a By-Product

Certain rabbis in America today no longer look at themselves as spiritual leaders of their communities. They seem to forget that the purpose of a synagogue is to guide the members of the community in a Jewish spirit. To them, Jewishness has become a by-product. A lecture by a non-Jewish writer substitutes for their Friday sermon. A speech by a non-Jewish lecturer takes the place of their Saturday sermon.

This misinterpretation of the function of a synagogue is made by some rabbis chiefly for the purpose of keeping the members of the community in closer touch with the synagogue. Anxious to keep the interest of their community members, these rabbis try to replace religion by lectures on modern sociology, Judaism by international politics, Jewish life by contemporary literature.

Poverty Displayed

But these rabbis, it seems, do not realize that the very fact that they replace their sermons by non-Jewish speakers on non- Jewish subjects displays their own intellectual poverty. A rabbi who, unaided, is capable of retaining the interest of his community will not invite others to do this job for him. A rabbi who considers himself a Jewish spiritual leader, and nothing else, would not consider the introduction of non-Jewish subjects into the synagogue.

With the conversion of the synagogue into a lecture hall for general subjects, many rabbis do not realize that they are commercializing the temple's pulpit. Similarly, very few rabbis seem to realize that the publicity which they are anxious to get in the press on their own sermons is far from the traditional Jewish principles of modesty and does not add to the prestige of the Jewish religion.

On many occasions I am embarrassed when I am told by colleagues in the general press how rabbis are flooding their editorial offices with advance texts of their sermons in the hope of obtaining publicity. This unseemly scramble for publicity has become almost a competitive institution among a number of rabbis and is far from provoking respect.

The late Louis Marshall, one of the foremost Jewish leaders of American Jewry, long advocated that rabbis should be rabbis and nothing else; that they should not be book reviewers; that they should not be involved in politics; that they should not talk about everything and everybody; that they should be spiritual leaders only.

This view by Mr. Marshall will always be looked upon as the most logical by everybody who wishes to see Jewish religious leaders respected. Only when rabbis cease to pretend to be more than rabbis - only then will they be in their proper place. The Jewish synagogue in America needs a rabbi and not

World Press Digest

Finds Austria Clerics Subtler Than Nazis

Commenting on the situation in Austria, Johannes Steel writes in the New York Post:

The clerical Fascism that is holding Austria in a firm grip is not much better than the Nazi Pascism rampant in Germany.

The only difference is that in Austria Fascism has taken on a somewhat subtler form.

There may be no persecution of Jews, but there are no Jews left in official positions — they have lost their jobs in the civil service, in the hospitals, and in the courts.

It all has been done very quietly without even bothering to establish the principle of "Aryan" superiority, but it has been done effectively.

Scientist Sees Jews More Normal in Sex

The fact that Jews live a more normal sexual life than other peoples is brought out in the scientific works of Dr. William Stekel, just published in London. The New English Weekly, commenting, says:

Among other fascinating problems, Stekel probes that of the lower incidence of fetishism among women and Jews. And he suggests that while both have a specific obstacle in the "Christ neurosis" in these cases — the self-identification of the fetishist with Christ-in women there is the further difficulty of the construction of a fetishism: i.e., lacking the creative capacity of men, they are unable to display the symbolistic genius which the fetishist has, by virtue of his neurosis, to display. In all his material Stekel has not come across one female fetishist, and the only Jew fetishist was an uncircumcized Jew with Christian leanings.

Nazi Outbreak in Australia Surprises

ments that have effected Jewish life in recent times, the National Jewish Welfare Board, and the chain of Jewish centers which it serves, has achieved increasing significance. Created when the United States entered the World War as the agency of the Jewish community for welfare work among the men of Jewish faith who responded to the call of service in the cause of their country, the board conducted an emergency program of vast proportions in this country and overseas. Its record revealed its potentialities for more permanent work in the field of Jewish community organization and its special understanding of the problem of Jewish youth.

It was perhaps natural, therefore, that the group of Y. M. H. A.'s, Y. W. H. A.'s and other types of Jewish centers in existence, when the war emergency terminated, should turn to the Jewish Welfare Board to function as their national body.

Other means by which the memory of the Rambam is to be honored will include the following:

The new teachers' seminary will be named the Maimonides Semi-A path in the municipal Kings'

Park, running near the walls of the synagogue, will hereafter be known as the Maimonides path.

In this park admirers of the Jewish medical scientist and sage will plant in his honor the four trees of the Bible: the vine, the olive, the fig and the pomegranate. A society of Friends of the

Sephardim is to be established for the propagation of Sephardic cul-

At a meeting of the organizing committee it was decided that it would act separately from the socalled central committee for the festivals which is functioning in Madrid. The central committee has been asked to refrain from organizing any festival acts in Madrid or Cordoba during the last week of March, since this week is to be reserved for the official committee. To round out the program, Dr.

Maranon, a leading member of the medical profession in Spain, has been invited to lecture on Maimonides as a doctor. Other lecturers will include Jose Ortega y Gasset, director of the School for Arabian Studies at Granada, and Emilio Garcia Gomez, a specialist in Maimonides lore.

It is planned to form a commission, comprising the governor, the mayor and a representative of the tourist bureau, to deal with the lodging of visitors during the festivals. The same commission will also develop a program for the popular festivals.

Dr. Zeitlin Completes Rambam Biography

PHILADELPHIA, March 19.-Dr. Solomon Zeitlin, professor of rabbinics at the Dropsie College for Hebrew and Cognate Learning, has completed a biography of Maimonides, it was announced here today by Dr. Cyrus Adler, president. The book is expected to be ready for release on April 2.

In this work, Dr. Zeitlin makes a new approach to the great philjurist. physician and leader and shows the development of his mind and his influence by summarizing in their chronological order his various great works.

The book, written in popular vein, also analyzes the political and economic reasons that motivated the movement against Maimonides and gives an account of his influence in history and the message which he has for Jews

Cordoba Plans Take Tip From Book of Esther, Current Events Dr. Adler Cautions Nazi Ruler StudyHeldVital

Says Modern Tyrants Could Learn From Fate of Haman

Hitler and other modern tyrants who undertake the annihilation of the Jewish people could take their cue from the Book of Esther, and see how the Persian Minister failed in his efforts to exterminate the Jews 2,300 years ago.

This was urged yesterday by Dr. Cyrus Adler, president of the American Jewish Committee and of the Jewish Theological Seminary of America, in a special Purim address broadcast over the NBC network.

Recalls Glory of Prophets

"The history of Israel, like that of most peoples, is a combination of sunshine and shadow," Dr. Adler said. "It may be that at the present time of darkness we are more inclined to look upon the gloomy side, taking our reflection from the rest of the world, but we have a right to remember the glorious epochs in Palestine when great prophets and poets and wise men and historians have over a long period been producing that matchless and inspired literature which is called the Bible that has been one of the civilizing influences of the world.

"Yesterday a portion of the faithful will have observed the Fast of Esther. Today, a much larger number are observing the reast of Esther. This festival, although one of the minor festivals and not having the rank of the holy days ordained in the Scriptures, has beside its synagogue observe an element of joyousness, for young and old, in which a sort of carnival spirit was introduced quite different from the regular holy days of the Jewish people.

Urges Study of History

"People get a perspective position for their future by drawing a line to their past and so today, one dares, without being pedantic, emphasize the need of the study of Jewish history, for Jewish history and all history is a useful discipline. Indeed, I invite all people to study the history of this day. Such a study of the history of an occasion has a value quite beyond the acquiring of knowledge although this acquisition of knowledge is an end in itself which has always been prized by civilized people. History is, as it were, the review of the experience of man-

"Few things are happening today that have not happened before and just as in a great profession like that of medicine in which every wise physician keeps a record of a patient and of all his previous patients and how they reacted to certain treatment, so too mankind must study the record of its experiences to prfit both by the successes and the failures which attended the remedies that previous ages applied.

world that has a right, if any country has a right, to call itself 'Aryan,' though as all scholars know that word can only be properly applied to a language and not to a people.

"It is the study of an incident like this which happened more than 2,300 years ago that can serve both as an encouragement and as a warning. And so, it is good exercise today to have read the Book of Esther, a book of the Bible which strangely enough has no expressed religious element in it. With the tendency some years back to be skeptical about everything, including many books of the Bible, the Book of Esther was held by some critics to be a pure piece of fiction-a novel. But since then scholars have, both from the historical and archaeological point of view, demonstrated that it is an account of an historical occurrence.

It is worthwhile to reflect that no one who followed in his malevolent footsteps has ever succeeded in such an effort. If the Book of Esther does not suffice to teach them the lesson they should read another book of the Bible, the Book of Daniel, so they may, before it is too late, learn its lesson of the handwriting on the wall."

Smith to Be Guest Speaker at Dinner for Federation \$543,000 Campaign

The Brooklyn Federation of Jewish Charities will formally begin its campaign to raise \$543,-500, marking its second quartercentury of welfare service, with a dinner at 6:30 o'clock tomorrow "Back in the Persian Empire evening at the Hotel St. George. The address of former Governor Alfred E. Smith, who is the guest speaker, will be broadcast from the dinner hall over station WMCA from 10:00 to 10:30 o'clock.

The Brooklyn Federation was chartered in 1910 with nine affiliated agencies. In its first quartercentury of activity it has grown to an organization of twenty-five constituent agencies providing a rounded program of social service annually to 250,000 Brooklyn needy.

Walter N. Rothschild, vice-president and general manager of Abraham & Straus, and a vicepresident of the Federation, is chairman of the 1935 Spring campaign. Mr. Rothschild will outline plans for the campaign at the dinner at which more than 1,200 persons are expected.

Educator Urges Schools to Provide Course as Regular Subject

The necessity of keeping Jewish children informed on Jewish current life was stressed yesterday by David Rudavsky, a member of the executive staff of the Bureau of Jewish Education in a list of official suggestions sent to Jewish schools throughout the country.

These suggestions were sent out as a bulletin of the Associated Talmud Torahs of Philadelphia of which Ben Rosen is the director. They recommend that the teaching of Jewish current events should be included as a regular subject in the curriculum of every Jewish school in the country.

The Jewish Daily Bulletin and the Jewish Current News, a special publication for children, were recommended by Mr. Rudavsky as adequate material for school children in their study of current events and Jewish life.

Aids Understanding

"An intelligible description of Jewish events in America and throughout the world introduces the child to a better understanding of world Jewry of today," Mr. Rosen writes in a preface to the bulletin.

Mr. Rudavsky, in his recommendations, especially emphasizes the fact that the Jewish Current News was originally established by the Associated Talmud Torahs of Philadelphia to meet the needs for text material in Jewish current events.

Uses J.T.A. Service

"Two years ago," Mr. Rudavsky "the Jewish Telegraphic Agency took over this publication with the advantage that the periodical enjoys the full news service of the J.T.A. It is still published with the cooperation and under the editorial direction of the Associated Talmud Torahs, which insures to the paper expert pedagogical supervision. Jewish Current News is a weekly, appearing throughout the school year approximately from October to June. The paper is written in a proper style for children; it gives an objective, unbiased report of Jewish news, the world over; and in general meets the requirements of a news bulletin for young people."

"The current events bulletin is usually sent to schools in bulk. In order to develop in their pupils the habit of receiving and reading a Jewish periodical, schools frequently prefer to have an individual copy of Jewish Current News mailed to the home of the pupil, though this arrangement involves a higher cost. Most of the schools providing systematic instruction in current events employ the Jewish Current News as the basis of the course," Mr. Rudavsky emphasizes.

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
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For Parshelsky Bishop Freeman, Judge

Post Office Probes 'Protocols' Here

Scott Gulden, leader of the anti-Semitic Order of '76, has his offices, postoffice officials have inquired as to the possible connection which may exist between Mr. Gulden and the organization which is spreading the newly composed anti-Jewish document.

Mr. Gulden yesterday denied having any connection with the Pan-Aryan Alliance and declared that he has no knowledge of its officers.

The "Protocols of 1935" which are being spread by the Pan-Aryan Alliance, contain the same anti-Jewish allegations as the "Protocols of the Elders of Zion," the only difference being that the former carries a preface stating that the facts contained in the booklet are imaginary. The admission, couched in such language as to convey the impression that quite the opposite is true. The cover of the pamphlet is decorated by a large Nazi swastika.

A new anti-Semitic publication The Storm, made its first appearance yesterday as a weekly re-placing the anti-Semitic "Healey's Irish Weekly."

Announcing that the purpose of the new publication, nothing more than a one-page circular, is to combat the Jews, The Storm, attacks President Roosevelt as "Red Judas Revolutionary Leader."

Find in Jericho Sheds Light on Palestine Art

Clay Image Found by Prof. Garstang Dates to Bronze Age

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) LONDON.—The earliest example of plastic art known in Palestine has been unearthed at Jericho by the archaelogical expedition working there under Prof. Garstang.

The new find, a cult image in clay, was discovered underneath twenty feet of early Bronze Age deposits, and Professor Garstang has stated that it must date back to about 3000 B. C.

It was found immediately above the flint layers representing prehistoric man. The find is to be taken to the museum of Jerusalem.

Prof. Garstang regards the discovery as of the first importance.

The scientists under Prof. Garstang hope to uncover data which will throw light on the cultural development of the Jordan Valley in the early Bronze Age and before.
