Mr. Straus is national treasurer of the United Jewish Appeal.

Speaking at the dinner with Mr. Straus was William Rosenwald, younger son of the late Julius Rosenwald, who was recently named a national co-chairman of the United Jewish Appeal. Harry K. Hecht was chairman of the din-

The fee for the certificates is 42 zloty (\$8.50) each. As a result of this decree 20,000 Jewish artisans were threatened with the loss of the right to continue at their trades.

Prior to the verdict, the Jabne organization had hesitated to send such a message to Spain.

Spain more than 400 years ago,
was a repercussion of the expulsion of the entire Jewish population of Spain by an order issued
on March 31, 1492 by King Ferdinand and Queen Isabella. This order followed the information. der followed the infamous Spanish Inquisition in which Jews were tortured and killed because of their

The order provided that all Jews and Jewesses of whatever age they might be, should leave the kingdom by the last day of July, but permitted them to remove their property provided it was not in gold, silver or money. The reason ascribed for this action in the preamble of the edict was the relapse of many "conversos" owing to the proximity of unconverted Jews who lured them from Christianity and kept alive in them the practices of Judaism. No other motive than religion was assigned for the edict

The number of Jews driven from Spain under the edict is estimated at 800,000. The edict was finally repealed nearly 400 years later, in 1858, when Spain became a re-

### Kosher Butchers Urged To Register Under Code

All kosher butchers and poultry dealers in Greater New York who have not yet registered under the Retail Kosher Meat Trade Code must register and pay their as-sessments by next Tuesday night, Charles Cohen, executive chair-man of the Code Authority, announced yesterday at the Authority's office, 1501 Broadway.

Mr. Cohen declared that the Code Authority will institute immediate proceedings against mem-bers of the trade who have not registered by that time.

"What the Chancellor said must be taken up openly and conscien-tiously. There are three points in particular which have to be gone into thoroughly: the position of the Jew in general economic life, in public service, and in the schools. Conditions in these matters are at present untenable. The statement in which they previous earned their living, needs amplification to explain how they are to be placed in other professions which have been closed to them. like public service, State and mu nicipal, from which they hav nicipal, from which been shut out hitherto.

"The statement, which is clearly meant earnestly, that there is no intention of creating a 'schools ghetto' must be followed up by action. The purely mechanical segregation of Jewish children in their own classes, where they will be taught in a non-Jewish spirit by non-Jewish teachers, does mean anything else than a school ghetto. If the Chancellor finds the proposal made by the Jewish Peo-ple's League of value, then the proper educational authorities must at last take this project seri-

The Stimme, the official organ the Austrian Zionist Federation, says that the Chancellor's statement emphasizes that the government denies the influence of anti-Jewish tendencies upon the measures it is taking.

"So far as the anti-Semitic agitation is concerned, the government, unfortunately, overlooks its connection with anti-State Na-tional Socialism," Stimme declares. "It is not partisan to take meas-Naures against treason, in whatever form it manifests itself. it partisan to intervene, because the State, the Christian religion or the Settle, the Carristian religion of the German nation have never been attacked by the Jewish side. The agitation against the Jews preaches murder and boycott, it is a violation of the penal code, and protection of law and order the described on partial states. can never be described as parti-

sanship.
"The Chancellor admits," Stimme continues, "that the large proportion of Jews in the liberal profession is due to historic de-velopments. It should be added that the vast field of agriculture has been closed to Jews and con-tinues to be closed to them. The pressure of the non-Jewish population upon the liberal professions is therefore an injustice, since it seeks to take the bread out of the mouths of the Jewish intellectuals, not on social but on racial grounds."
