WASHINGTON.

When is Germany going to start the next war? This is the question now on the lips of many American officials as well as foreign diplomats here.

Despite the fact that Germany's economic situation is such that she cannot meet the cost of a war, the general opinion here is that Hitler is definitely preparing for conflict.

Some are puzzled as to how Germany can start a war without being well stocked with cotton and essential in the manufacture of munitions. Germany has been unable to buy cotton. As a matter of fact, her cotton imports during the last year were less than half of what they were a year ago. The United States sold Germany less than a third of the cotton usually sold that country.

Under such conditions, isn't the Hitler threat a big bluff, many are asking.

The reply is generally in the negative. With the internal conditions as they have developed today, there is ample evidence that Hitler's march towards a full rearmament means nothing but eventual war.

Tired of the anti-Jewish propaganda, the German nation is beginning to realize that all the promises which Hitler has made, nothing has been carried out and automatically makes Germany the equal of other nations at least in a militaristic sense. It gives Hitler the best chance to prove to his followers that he want to fulfill his promises. It opens wide possibilities for regaining Danzig, Memel and all the other territories required for the establishment of a real Third Reich.

Does all this spell eventual war? The opinion in Washington is that it does. A watchful eye is now being kept here on the developments in Germany as well as on the reaction in Paris and in London. Germany this week was the center of Washington's interest and will remain so for the next few weeks until it is definitely established what is what in the speculations on a new war.

With interest concentrated in diplomatic circles here this week on Germany, there was an increased interest in the Jewish situation in Germany.

The fact that Jews may not be conscripted into the German army was seriously discussed. This fact was linked up with the recent reports that Germany may soften its attitude towards the Jews. Certain circles in Washington believe that such reports, even though not entirely true, may contain a grain of truth.

It was pointed out in circles who are usually well informed, that only recently a leading German-Jewish financier visited the United States as a member of a German delegation, in an effort to obtain a loan for Germany in America. This was taken as a sign

Warn Arab Owners Not to Sell to Jews

Death Threats Being Probed by Police of Jaffa; Arab Story Is Denied

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) JAFFA.—Warning letters have been received here by a number of Arab land workers, threatening them with death if they continue to sell land to Jews. The police authorities are investigating.

An official police communique issued to newspaper editors a story which appears in an Arab newspaper saying that 15,000 rounds of ammunition and thirty-six bombs have been discovered in a Jewish house in Jaffa.

The communique says that the report in the Arab newspaper is grossly exaggerated. It discloses

that the police confiscated in the house of a Jewish resident in Jerusalem one short-gun and 344 rounds of ammunition. Charges of illegal possession of arms are being preferred against the owner the communique states.

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Zeta Beta Tau Gives Hebrew U. \$100 More

A new gift of \$100 to the Hebrew University in Palestine by Zeta Beta Tau, intercollegiate Jewish fraternity, was announced Friday. The sum is to be used as a scholarship.

BLACK on WHITE

These are days when an ex-correspondent yearns for the European end of a cable line. If only for the joy of debunking the official statements and counter-statements behind which nations are mobilizing, physically and morally, for another grand slaughter. And for the prospect, macabre but alluring, of being a war correspondent.

Breathes there a reporter with soul so pacifist that he does not dream of covering a real war? Someone has to cover it, so why not he?

The total number of hours during which I have listened to war correspondents at the late squabble (the one that was called off temporarily in November, 1918) would run into many weeks. Though most of them strive mightily to purge their memories with bold adventure, their story is on the whole pretty tame. Censorship and martial romance don't rhyme.

War correspondence, I can testify on the basis of repetitious boasts, is not all it's cracked up to be. The exploits of Richard Harding Davis in Cuba and John Reed in Mexico do not fit into industrialized butchery as practiced in these times. War reporters in our degenerate days are about as exposed as generals. Their principal hazard, as nearly as I have been able to determine by cross-examining practitioners, is excessive drinking. The news we are apt to get in the war now hovering, and it has been, will be limited to official communiques padded with press-agent atrocity stories.

Now the Nazis, after a lot of preliminary pinching and baiting, have kicked the Versailles Treaty right in the face. It has had profound results. For one, some of them from its own fathers and guardians. But the Nazi blow against the finishing pressure on the creature and it will never recover. Even the classic success of diplomacy can do little to reassemble the scattered features.

The only remaining question is what war will get going. The general line-up seems pretty clear. Germany again alone or nearly alone against the rest of Europe.

An essential difference, however, is likely to be the fact that the chief target of German attack will be therefore the spearhead of the anti-German forces, will be Russia instead of France. The social and ideological differences between Germany and the Soviet Union are sharper even than the traditional national differences between Germany and France. Nazi territorial ambitions, moreover, have much more tempting possibilities in Western Russia and the Ukraine than in France. Herr Rosenberg has been disingenuously frank on that subject. His mouth waters and his eyes shine at the very mention of Ukraine.

No matter where Poland throws its weight, a Russo-German conflict is certain to be fought out in the sector of the continent most thickly populated by Jews in Eastern Europe. The Soviet, Polish, Baltic and Rumanian areas formerly included in the Tsarist empire provide a natural and inevitable war arena. The vast Jewish cities and the hundreds of Jewish towns which are still deeply rooted from the last war and the civil strife that followed it are marked off by elementary geography as a vast battleground.

The loyalties of the millions of Jews in this sector will therefore play a considerable role in the threatened conflict. Their loyalties, in addition, will be echoed in the minds and hearts of additional millions of Jews outside that region, including ourselves in America.

That they will favor Russia as against Hitler's Germany can be taken for granted. For the Jews there is scarcely room for a choice. Whatever one may believe about Bolshevism in practice, or the future of the Jews as a race under Bolshevism, opposition to Nazi medievalism and barbarism must

No Jew Entered Universities in Reich in 1934

Berlin Report Reveals Only 590 Registered in All Schools

BERLIN, March 22.—Not a single Jewish student was admitted to German universities during the academic year 1933-1934, an official report of the Reich's Ministry of Education shows.
The report, made public today, says that among the 87,000 students now attending the universities in Germany there are only 590 Jews, of whom no more than 13 are actually attending classes. Among the 15,000 women students there are 233 Jewesses registered, but none is attending classes.

Listed Below Hitler
Most of the Jewish students figuring in the lists were registered before Hitler came to power. The state of the Ministry of Education discloses that in 1930, before Hitler came to power, there were 3,900 non-"Aryan" students in the German universities. In 1933 their number was reduced to 1,800. This year not a single non-"Aryan" student has been admitted.

The Westdeutsche Beobachter, the leading Nazi newspaper in Germany, declares today that the reason why the Nazi government is still permitting certain categories of Jewish lawyers to practice is merely to give the Jews a chance

to be represented in court by their own Jewish lawyers. "But," the paper adds, "if Germans go to Jewish lawyers for advice, they are committing a crime against the nation."

An official report published today discloses that among the 18,780 lawyers registered on January 1, 1935, in the Reich, there were 2,756 non-"Aryans." A total of

1,092 non-"Aryan" lawyers are still members of the Berlin chamber of law, the report says.

The names of a number of peasants in Neuenheim were posted today on a public pulley "for continuing to deal with Jews."

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

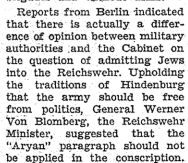

What One Should Learn On the Road of Ages

What compelling idea motivated Mr. Robert Nathan in writing his "Road of Ages"? Why did he seize upon such a colossal theme as that of a world-wide collision of Jewry—a theme far more portentous than fantastic—and so tragic in its implications—and, having chosen this theme which to a sensitive Jew is what the Crucifixion and Passion is to a non-Jew, why did he proceed to treat it in the manner of a care-free boulevardier with a studied insouciance not a little suggestive of intellectual priggishness and condescension?

Is Mr. Robert Nathan perhaps another victim of the machoism tendencies so marked among certain Jewish intellectuals hovering on the periphery of Jewish life, who love to stick burrs into their own Jewish skins so as to sample the exquisite pain of self-humiliation?

Out of his tremendous and awesome theme Mr. Nathan could squeeze only two ideas—neither of which is now or particularly significant. First, that the Jews and their long trek to the Gold Desert whether they had been exiled present a very motley and polygot spectacle; and secondly, that the Jews, in spite of their common misfortune, continue to quarrel among themselves. The author cannot get over the fact that these Jews still persist in keeping alive their religious, social and economic differences in spite of the sad fate which overtook them. The climax of the book is reached in a bloody riot in which heads are smashed, men and women are trampled upon, and Jews kill Jews. The stupendous tragedy of a universal expulsion of his people which the author had evoked, wrings from his elegant pen nothing more profound than this trite satire.

But why should not Jews quarrel among themselves quite as much as any other people? Why should their reactions be different? Surely the fact that Jews have lived in exile for long centuries in the midst of insecurity and hostility and under continuous emotional strain and tension does not justify anyone in expecting to find among them a calmer outlook and greater poise and self-possession than among other peoples whose lives have moved in much quieter channels—peoples who never knew wandering, persecution and humiliation!

Is the American people a more united people than ours? Is not the American people—or for that matter, any modern people—divided and torn by conflicting social, political and economic interests? Has not the American people its full quota of reactionaries, conservatives, liberals and radicals in every department of its national life? Is the American people free from recurrent bloody economic s and riots? Was it not once rent by four bloody years of civil war? Do the 200 and more religious sects in Protestant Christianity bespeak a greater capacity

for unity among non-Jews than among Jews—and unity in a religious communion, be it remembered, is far more likely than in a people—unless an artificial unity is forcibly imposed upon it by a powerful totalitarian dictatorship.

We Jews are a people. As soon as Mr. Nathan and his friends will digest this simple fact they will get over their surprised indignation when and if in the course of their literary meanderings they come upon evidences of disunity in our midst. When one bears in mind the variety of our backgrounds, cultures and languages, the different worlds we come from and belong to, the marvel is that we possess even that modicum of unity which we do somehow succeed in bringing into play when we are faced with problems of self-defense, of international relief or of local philanthropic activities in our respective communities.

Is it really desirable that we should have one organization to speak for the whole of Israel—living as we do in all parts of the world, among all sorts of peoples under differing political, social and economic conditions, where many Jewish communities are faced with problems quite unique to their own situation? A calm survey of our status will convince one that it is far better that we do not have one organization or one man to plan or to speak for us on all things.

The naive Jew as well as the naive non-Jew has always sought to give us the status of a unified religious deomination or of a fraternal lodge whose slogan is brotherly love—a status which is quite foreign to our real nature. The non-Jew will of course frequently judge us as a unit and hold every Jew responsible for the acts of every other Jew. That is one of the grave disabilities of belonging to a minority people living in the midst of other peoples. But this should not lead us into inventing and accepting such a

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Protest to Nazis in Kidnaping Urged on Swiss

Basle Irate at Seizure of Journalist by Nazi Agents

BASLE, March 22.—(The Swiss government was asked today by the municipality of Basle to make urgent representations to the Nazi government in Berlin for the release of the German-Jewish journalist, Berthold Jacob, who was kidnaped here last Saturday by Nazi agents and taken to Germany in a car driven by Nazi agents.

The entire press of Switzerland indignantly over the kidnaping of Herr Jacob, who was a German-Jewish refugee and a contributor to the Weltbuehne, an anti-Nazi weekly with an international reputation.

It was established today that Herr Jacob was lured by a young woman to a small restaurant on the Zurich-Yverdon highway where he was drugged and rushed across the border into Germany in a car which refused to stop at the frontier despite the order of Swiss customs officials.

Dr. Hans Wassermann, a friend of the kidnaped journalist, who was yesterday in Zurich, made the charge that he betrayed Herr Jacob and helped in his kidnaping, was questioned today by the Swiss Secret Service agents. The results of the examination of Wassermann were kept secret, since the authorities are convinced that they will succeed in arresting the persons involved in the kidnaping plot.

The kidnaped German-Jewish journalist was well-posted on German matters and had furnished a mass of many documents, the publication of which the Nazis feared.

The police official promised that he would examine the case of the Jewish case, in view of the fact that many Jews are stateless and cannot be deported anyway.

A. F. of L. Joins Anti-Nazi Body in Reich Protest

To Hold Rally April 10 Scoring Hitler Action on Army

The American Federation of Labor and the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League have issued a call for mass meetings to be held at the Hippodrome on April 10 to protest Chancellor Hitler's new military policy as a threat to world peace. Both organizations and prominent national figures will speak. Spokesmen for the Anti-Nazi League will assert that the way to cope with the German war menace is the economic boycott.

The World Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League, which is headed by Untermyer is president, is calling on all affiliated boycott organizations in twelve countries to hold mass meetings of the same character, with the aim of achieving a united international effort. Mr. Untermyer is also president of the Anti-Nazi League.

Admission to the Hippodrome will be free, it was announced Friday.

Arrest Nazi Leaders For Pogrom Fests

NUREMBERG, March 22.—A number of Nazi leaders were arrested here today for calling upon the people of Franconia to observe the Jews and for spreading posters bearing the slogans "Death to the Jews!"

A program of Jews in Nuremberg was averted due to the quick action of the police, who removed the posters after Julius Streicher, the editor of the "Sturm und Drang," declared that they had not been spread upon his order. Streicher himself, though the most notorious Jew-hater in Germany, was not arrested, although an order to remove the dangerous posters and to arrest all those who are involved in the pogrom plot.

Those who were arrested are being questioned today to establish the originators of the plot. All those arrested are members of the "Sturm und Drang" and are accused of spreading a rumor that the Jews are seeking to assassinate Hitler, by this means hoping to incite the population to attack the Jews.

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Harvard Offers Research Post To Adler Kin

Daughter of Vienna's Noted Psychologist Accepts

VIENNA, March 22.—Dr. Alexandra Adler, the daughter of Dr. Alfred Adler, internationally famous psychologist, today accepted an invitation from Harvard University to come to Boston to continue her neurological work.

Prof. Wilhelm Schlesinger, world reknown as a leader in the hygiene left here today for Tirana, Albania, to reorganize the public hygiene system in Albania.

Many prominent Jewish doctors and scientists are being invited to leave Vienna in view of the mass dismissals of doctors from municipal and state institutions which are taking place in Austria along the same lines as in Nazi Germany. While the "Aryan" paragraph has not been officially issued in Austria, it is nevertheless being carried out with no less zeal than in Germany.

Chicago Patriarch Still Active at 101

Israel Shaffer Given Birthday Banquet by 300 Friends and Relatives

CHICAGO, March 22.—Being more than 100 years old does not mean that a man is useless to society is over is the belief of Israel Shaffer, who has just celebrated his 101st birthday here.

More than 300 relatives and 300 friends gathered at the centenarian in his work as an officer of the Ezra Israel Synagogue for the last thirty-five years, gathered at the Chicago home to honor him. Each one paid for the banquet and the proceeds will be used by Mr. Shaffer to distribute to charity as he sees fit.

Mr. Shaffer, who was born in Latvia, has spent most of his time since arriving here fifty years ago in religious and charitable work at the Associated Synagogue. Of his fourteen children, five sons and nine daughters, all are living. The oldest being 75 years old and the youngest 58 years old. There are twenty-nine grandchildren, twenty-one great-grandchildren and two great-great-grandchildren.

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
