Will Demand **Colony Status** For Palestine

Wedgwood Also Seeks Reforms in Treatment of Immigrants

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) LONDON, March 31.-A resolution demanding that Palestine be declared a Crown colony instead of a mandated territory under British administration, will be introduced in the House of Commons Col. Josiah Wedgwood, Laborite member announced today.

Col. Wedgwood will also introduce a resolution demanding that any Jew who has succeeded in entering Palestine legally or illegally, be permitted to remain, to purchase land and to settle in Transjordan.

Jews Behind Move

The suggestion to change the status of Palestine from a mandated territory into a British Crown colony, will receive support from certain Jewish leaders and from many British statesmen, it was believed here today.

Col. Wedgwood, who is known as "the father of the Seventh Dominion League," has long advocated that Palestine be proclaimed a British Crown colony, eventually to eb converted into a dominion.

It was pointed out here today that Col. Wedgwood's proposed resolution is a direct result of the movement recently launched in Palestine by Jewish farmers headed by M. Smiliansky, and industrialists, who believe that Palestine's commercial interests will benefit greatly if the country becomes a British colony instead of remaining a mandated territory. As a Crown colony, Palestine products would be exempt from customs duties throughout the British Empire and its exports, especially of citrus products, would greatly increase.

The procedure of converting Palestine from a mandated territory into a Crown colony involves international formalities, since Palestine is now under the control of the League of Nations and Great Britain must report to the Mandates Commission of the League of Nations on any proposed changes for Palestine.

Predict August 20 As Congress Date

JERUSALEM, March 31. — The next World Zionist Congress will be held in the middle of August, it was predicted here today by leading Zionist figures. The Congress will probably open on August 20, it was stated.

The Zionist Actions Committee which has been in session here since March 27, will not conclude its sessions before the end of this week, it was stated here today. The session will take up, among others, the question of completely liquidating the Jewish Colonial Trust, the bank established by Dr. Theodor

Crowds Throng Tel Aviv to See 2nd Maccabiad

3,000 Jewish Athletes From 40 Lands Set to Compete Tuesday

TEL AVIV, March 31.—Hundreds of pigeons released by Lord Melchett from an airplane, will mark the opening here of the second Maccabiad on Tuesday morning, in which 3,000 Jewish athletes from forty different countries, including the United States, will participate.

Other preparations were 1aces to accommodate the thouands of foreign tourists and outtown guests who are expected at the opening of the Jewich olym-

Every hotel here is filled to capacity with arrivals from foreign countries who came to witness the Maccabiad games. Accommodations are being arranged in private homes, since the hotels are unable to accept any more guests.

A special arrangement was made with the Palestine railways for the speedy transportation of thousands of visitors from many points in Palestine and Egypt to the games. Similar arrangements have also been made to bring thousands of foreign travelers from the Haifa harbor to this city.

Warns of Rift Over Shekel **Speakers at Actions Unit** Parley Declare Text Change Is Futile

JERUSALEM, March 31.—The problem of how to save the Zionist Organization from a serious split was widely discussed today at the sessions of the Zionist Actions Committee.

Led by M. M. Ussishkin, head of the Jewish National Fund, the General Zionists warned the Zionist Executive against the introduction of a change in the Shekel, which would exclude the Revisionists from participation in the next Zionist Congress. The General Zionists were supported by the Mizrachi and by delegates of the Judenstaat Party.

Urgers Wider Coalition

Speaking in behalf of the General Zionists, Mr. B. Mossinson urged that the next Zionist Executive be built on a wider coalition. The change in the text of the Shekel, which aims to enforce discipline in the Zionist ranks, is not securing the desired effect, he said.

Rabbi Meier Berlin, the leader of the Mizrachi, supporting Mr. Mossinson, proposed an inter-party commission of seven, to be formed for the purpose of reaching an understanding with regard to a vote on the change which the Executive has made in the text of the Shekel.

Meier Grossman, speaking for the Judenstaat Party, expressed himself against the agreement (Continued on Page Four)

WARSAW, March 31.—The municipality of Lodz will be dissolved by the government, the Polish press reports today, disclosing the fact that the government commissioner who objected to the anti-Jewish resolutions which the municipality adopted last week has re-

A movement to defend Jewish ritual slaughtering in Poland was started today by all Jewish orthodox groups, in view of the danger that the government may prohibit schechitah. Deputy Levin, a member of the Agudath Israel, intervened with the Minister of Interior to convince him that the Jewish ritual of slaughtering is human and should not be prohibited.

An appeal was isued today by a united committee of Jewish orthodox groups to a number of professors abroad asking them to testify that the Jewish method of slaughtering is not inhumane as the opponents of schechitah assert. Among those to whom the appeal was sent are Prof. Lieben of Praha, terfering with the reopening of the Dr. Munk of Berlin, and Dr. Loewenstein of Zurich.

Cafes Shut, Tel Aviv Hikes to Jaffa to Dine

JAFFA, March 31.—Thousands of Jews walked here from Tel-Aviv today in search of meals as a result of the strike in the restaurants and cafes of the all-Jewish city.

The strike, which was called on Friday, continued until late in the evening today, when striking waiters agreed, under pressure of the municipality, to resume their work. Their demands for an increase in wages and for fixed hours of work will be settled by arbitration.

Maniu in Move To Halt Acts of Vaida - Voevod

Riots Flare as Peasant Leader Invades Anti-Semite's Stronghold

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BUCHAREST, March 31.-Julus Maniu, president of the National Peasant Party and former premier of Rumania, arrived to-day at Klausenburg, Transylvania, personally to counteract the anti-Jewish propaganda which is being spread from that city by Dr. Vaida-Voevod, the ex-premier who has been removed from leadership in the National Peasant Party for his campaign to introduce anti-Jewish restrictions here.

In expectation of Maniu's arrival, followers of Vaida-Voevod captured the headquarters of the National Peasant Party in Klausenburg in order to prevent their opponents in the party from seizing control of the offices of the party in Transylvania.

M. Molodovanu, editor of a paper siding with Dr. Vaida-Voevod, was severly injured during riots which took place Friday evening in connection with the expected arrival of Maniu. The riots were organized by the followers of Dr. Vaida-Voevod, who has made Klausenburg his stronghold. More than twenty persons were arrested.

Dr. Alfred Landau Dies

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) VIENNA, March 31.—Dr. Alfred Landau, one of the most prominent Jewish philologists, died here today at the age of 85.

Streicher Set To Aid Nazis **Grab Danzig**

Speakers at Pre-election Rallies Refer to "Protocols"

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) DANZIG, March 31. - Julius Streicher, Germany's anti-Semite No. 1, is expected here today for a special anti-Jewish campaign in connection with the general election for which the Nazi forces in the Free City are being mobilized.

The election campaign here is assuming the same character as the Nazi plebiscite drive in the Saar, causing great anxiety among the Jewish population. Nazi speakers are utilizing the forged "Protocols of the Elders of Zion" in addressing their election meetings, in order to stimulate anti-Jewish propaganda in the Free City.

Address Huge Rallies

Those who will not vote for us in the elections are nothing but Jewish agents acting in accordance with the Protocols of the Elders of Zion," Nazi orators asserted today, addressing huge gatherings.

Dr. Bernhard Rust, the Nazi Minister of Education was among the speakers in Danzig today. His trip here from Berlin indicates that the Hitler government has mapped definite plans to capture Danzig during the forthcoming election.

Violence Flares

Acts of wholesale violence occurred today in this city as a result of the excited atmosphere created by the Nazi speakers. The police department in Danzig is now practically under Nazi control since the administration of the city is controlled by a Nazi majority.

Polish papers were confiscated here yesterday for reporting the impertinent answer which Arthur Greiser, Nazi head of the Danzig Senate, made to the League of Nations High Commissioner for Danzig, Sean Lester, when Mr. Lester complained to him about the Nazi activities in Danzig. The Nazi president of the Danzig Senate told the High Commissioner that he would soon be kicked out of Danzig "just as High Commissioner Knox was kicked out of the Saar."

450-Year Ban on Spain Lifted As Rambam Fete Is Concluded

CORDOBA, Spain, March 31.—A ban proclaimed by the Jews of the world against Spain about 450 years ago, was officially lifted today at an impressive ceremony concluding the five-day celebration arranged by the Spanish government to honor the 800th birthday of Moses Maimonides, Jewish philosopher and physician of the Middle Ages.

The festivities closed with a banquet at which high civil and military Spanish authorities were present. President Zamora and Premier Lerroux sent messages to the banquet.

A moving scene was the reopening of the old Cordoba synagogue and with Jewish religious services for the first time since 1492, when the entire Jewish population was expelled from Spain. Chief Rabbi Julian Weil of France recited a special prayer for the President of the Spanish Republic and for Spain, for "restoring the Hebrew language and Judaism for the first time since 1492."

The last vestige of sorrow and embitterment which the Jews felt for generations towards Spain, disappeared with the great en lion

Review of the Reich Situation

One of the most damaging aspects of the Jewish situation in Germany today is the uncertainty in which the Jews have been left as to their relations to the German world which they are in but of which they are not a part. In all the long, breathtaking days, weeks and months in which the Nazis have been in power, there has never been a full discussion of the situation between leaders of German Jewry and spokesmen for the regime.

This has not been the fault of the Jewish leaders. They are anxious to have the ground under their feet mapped out. The Jews want to know where they are. This the rulers of Germany appar-

ently are not yet ready to state. The result is, as a German-Jewish leader has pointed out: "We cannot built for the future. We can only work from day to day."

The Jewish community knows with certainty only that the authorities can be counted on solely for approval of measures speeding the emigration of the Jews.

The Jüdische Rundschau, organ of the German Zionist Federation, in a lengthy editorial this week warns against the tide of hopeless resignation which it fears is taking hold of German Jewry. In a penetrating analysis of the Quarantine in which the Jews find themselves, it refers to the absence of any understanding on the regulation of Jewish affairs and points out:

"Even what is said about the Jews in Germany is mainly not addressed to the Jews, but inside the German world, and we Jews stand on the sidelines, as observors—very attentive and interested observers since we know that the words spoken there and which we are unable to contradict sink gradually deeper and deeper into the souls of the people, especially German youth.

"As that discussion proceeds within the German world, we Jews feel the need to react to it, but mostly we can do so only in our own ranks, from the Jewish tribune which does not reach the other party.

Very often the argument is made that the German Jewry is in a state of liquidation. If the new Germany, it is said, considers a reduction in the German Jews desirable, it must be pointed out that this state is being brought about by itself in the course of natural development. The German Jews are mostly older people. There is a fall in birth rate, a decrease in the number of marriages and there is emigration, as a result of which the Jewish population in Germany will fall in a decade to half its present number.

"This argument is undoubtedly correct. German Jewry is in a process of liquidation. The phrase is not a new one; it goes back for

twenty-five years, when Dr. Felix Theilhaber used it for the first time. There has been a great deal of controversy over it, but it should be remembered that Dr. Theilhaber's purpose was to rouse German Jewry, to realize the situation and counteract it."

What the official attitude is toward the Jewish question, however, is no secret. The Nazis never sought to "coordinate" the Jews. Their aim was, is today, not "gleichschaltung," but liquidation.

Despite the desire, from motives of economics, of Dr. Schacht, that the Jews be left alone, and his statements that the discriminations are just a passing phase of the revolution, the aim of the Nazis is a land free of Jews and they are determined to have it. The Streichers have their way in this matter. The Nazis will never be satisfied with less than an almost total emigration of the Jews at whatever cost—with the extermination of German Jewry as such.

This ambition was the underlying motive behind the recent arrests of Jews returning here from abroad. Those responsible for the nation's economy may feel it good business to get the Jews back and to benefit by Jewish capital and commerce, but the Nazis want none of it. The Jews who left Germany during the first flush of the Hitler ascendancy may be told in speeches by Germany's statesmen that they are free to come back. Once returned, they are taught differently. Germany is seeking to accelerate the emigration of Jews. She does not want them return-

Vulgarity in Synagogue

Whither our Jewish temples? This question has recently been asked more and more often by serious observers. Insistent complaints are being heard that the synagogue in America is drifting away from religion into vulgarity.

These charges seem, however, not to affect some of our rabbis who, as the spiritual leaders of their synagogues, should be interested in keeping their religious institutions on a higher and a cleaner standard. In a number of cities in America the temple is being converted openly into a dance hall, where all kinds of "nights" are given as attractions.

"Ladies Nights"

The manner in which these "nights" are advertised in the bulletins of the synagogues competes in vulgarity only with the yellow tabloid papers. It is far from adding prestige to the synagogue. It is certainly far from adding prestige to the rabbi.

Without giving the name of the temple concerned, I am reproducing here the exact text and display of an announcement which appeared this week in the publication of one of the largest temples in Chicago, offering to the "members, ladies and their guests," entertainment. The announcement reads as follows:

It may be true that "ladies' nights" are essential for certain temples in order to retain the interest of their members, but it is hard to believe that a real Jewish spiritual leader would permit such entertainment in his temple. No rabbi with dignity would permit the existence of his temple to depend upon "ladies' nights" or any similar at-

tractions.

A Definition Wanted

The functions of the synagogue in America, just as the functions of the rabbi in America, must once and for ever be defined. Any synagogue that cannot exist without "ladies' nights," advertised in the above vulgar fashion, is not worth existing. Any rabbi that does not protest against such vulgarities in his synagogue is not a spiritual leader.

In the same bulletin of the same temple we find an announcement that the sermon which the rabbi of this temple will deliver is to be devoted to the theme, "Can There be a Red Revolution in the United States?" The Friday evening sermon is announced as on the subject, "Yellow Journalism."

Strange Subjects

One wonders: what these subjects have to do with Jewish religion? Why must they be chosen as topics for religious sermons? Is Jewish religion so limited that a rabbi must seek general subjects for his sermons? Are the problems affect-

Tributes Are Read

The banquet which closed the celebration was marked by a number of tributes which Jewish delegates representing Jewish communities all over the world paid to the Spanish government. Dr. Ignacio Bauer, a Jewish leader of Spain, was especially praised by the speakers for the years of effort which he put into bringing Spain and the Jews to a mutual understanding.

The mayor of Cordoba and the civil governor, replying to the speeches of the Jewish delegates, emphasized that the hospitality is an expression of the sincere sympathy and veneration which the Spanish government and people feel towards Israel.

The entire menu of the banquet was kosher. More than 200 messages of greeting from leading statesmen all over the world, were received at the banquet. Among them were mesages from Lloyd George and Sven Hedin, whom Hitler recently congratulated on his seventieth birthday.

The majority of guests and delegates today started back to their native countries after the official conclusion of the Maimonides celebrations.

Moslem, Christian Join In Tribute to Rambam

In honor of the 800th birthday of Moses Maimonides, the great Jewish rabbi, philosopher and physician, a special octocentennial service was held yesterday morning by Congregation B'nai Jeshurun, 257 West Eighty-eighth street, during which tributes were paid by Christian, Moslem and Jew.

Dr. Israel Goldstein, Rabbi of the Congregation, gave the Jewish tribute, declaring:

"It is one of the ironies of history that the land where Jews were the victims of the Inquisition and from which they suffered expulsion in the same year that America was discovered, should now be hailing the memory of a Jew.

The Christian tribute was deliv-

"It is especially appropriate that we should pay this tribute today because the conditions under which Maimonides' life was lived were in many respects like our own. He was born in a time of acute social unrest. He knew what it was to live as a member of a minority in a community where the spirit of race and of religion was active and intolerant.

The Moslem tribute was delivered by Dr. G. T. Kheiralla, president of the Moslem Brotherhood, who said:

"It is meet that men of all faiths and races should pay homage to the memory of the second Moses. Men who rise above race and creed by their services to humanity, belong to humanity at large. Yet I cannot refrain as an Arab and a Moslem from claiming that we the Arabs and Moslems have a particular right to do a special honor to Ibn Maimon, for this was his correct Arabic name by which he lived and died.

Will Continue Nazi Boycott, Green Pledges

Survey of Labor Under Hitler Published by Workers' 'Chest'

That organized labor in the United States will continue the boycott of German-made goods until the Nazi government ceases its policy of persecution of the Jews was reiterated by William Green, president of the American Federation of Labor, in a statement made public yesterday in New York.

The statement was made by Mr. Green in connection with a survey on "Labor Conditions Under Hitler" issued by the research department of the Chest for the Liberation of Workers of Europe.

Explains Boycott's Aim

This statement, which will appear as a preface to the survey, declares that the boycott "is in no way a reflection upon the German people as such, but was rather an effort to assist them to regain their rights as free men and wo-

"The feeling which has been aroused in the minds of the working people throughout the world against the treatment accorded the Jewish citizens of Germany and the bona fide trade unionists of all creeds was reflected in the action taken by the British Trades Union Congress, the trade union organizations of Holland, Belgium, Czechoslovakia, Switzerland, Spain and France, as well as the American Federation of Labor representing the working people of Canada as well as the United States," the statement says.

"The hope of an oppressed people lies in the development of an aroused, keen, sensitive, international conscience. When public opinion of mankind is aroused in opposition to intolerance and injustice, the victims of misrule become encouraged to fight for the enjoyment of their individual rights, and the recognition of the broad principles of human brotherhood," Mr. Green concludes.

Will Explain Value Of Biblical Finds

Briton to Give Eyewitness Account of Discoveries at Tel Ad-Duweir

An eyewitness description of the finding of the most important corroboration of the Bible story of the period of the Kingdom of Judah, will be given by Sir Charles Marston, British writer, over an NBC-WEAF network at 6:15 o'clock Wednesday evening, it was announced yesterday.

The discovery of the Hebrew tablets, confirming the modern version of Biblical history for that period, has been described as the most important archaeological contribution since the finding of the Amarna records in the 1880's.

Anti-Semitism Is Major Issue In Chicago Mayoralty Contest Opens Canada

CHICAGO, March 31.-Amerian Jewry had its eyes on Chicago today as one of the bitterest political campaigns since the days of Mayor Thompson came to a close, with anti-Semitism superseding all other factors as the chief issue of the contest for the mayoralty which will be decided at the polls on Tuesday.

Running on a platform that has been weighted down with features described by opponents and disinterested observers as kin to Hitlerism, Newton Jenkins, mayoralty candidate on a third-party ticket, tonight reiterated his frequently made denials that he is waging an anti-Semitic campaign. In his denials he charged that Paul H. Douglas, professor of economics at the University of Chicago, had 'engineered" the charges that he was anti-Semitic in behalf of Mayor Edward J. Kelly.

Accuses Jewish Charities

Political observers predicted today that Jenkins will not receive more than 75,000 votes in the elec-

Mr. Jenkins issued a statement here in which he accuses the Jewish Charities of Chicago of being the first to link his name with Hitler, at a banquet on March 18.

"It was a singular thing," Mr. Jenkins said, "with race hatreds flaming high the world over, that the Jews themselves, in a great charity banquet, would project an attack of this kind into a political campaign. It is even more singular that the attack should be directed against one who has over a lifetime been outstanding in championing the rights of minorities including Jews."

The reason for this attack, Mr. Jenkins explains, is "that in our city a small band of crooked Jews who have been caught red-handed in their villainy are trying to hide their own misconduct by yelling 'Hitler' at those who dare to expose their perfidy and to stand out against their own civic miscon-

Wants Showdown

Jenkins also denied to a representative of the Jewish Daily Bulletin that if he polls 100,000 votes in Tuesday's election the Nazis in this country will move their national headquarters from New York to Chicago and center their activities here.

Mr. Jenkins then appeals to the Jews of Chicago to "own or disown this pack of crooked Jews who have disgraced our city. You have permitted in silence this attack to be made upon me. Now I call upon you to let the people know wether you are on the side of decency or on the side of crooks who happen to be Jews."

In his statement, Mr. Jenkins charges that "a ring of Jewish masters (in chancery), receivers and lawyers prey upon Jew and Gentile alike.'

Douglas Answers

Answering these charges, Prof. Douglas declared that "if Mr. Jenkins should poll a big vote in the municipal election he would use it as a springboard to carry out his Hitler policies on a State and na-

Enumerating the many planks in the Jenkins platform which he charges are blatantly of Hitler derivation, Prof. Douglas goes on to

"Along with Hitlerism goes anti-Semitism and this is not absent from the Jenkins movement. Thus Mr. Jenkins is taking great pains to point out that certain corrupt officials in Chicago are Jews and he is, therefore, throwing the blame upon that race.

Opposes Corruption

"I am as bitterly opposed to these corrupt officials as is Mr. Jenkins, but I also recognize that the communities are not con-

ize all races. There are, as a matter of fact, about as many Jews who are fighting the grafters as people of other races. Although I am of Anglo-Saxon stock, I resent any attempt to single out any one race for opprobrium and at-


