Transjordan Repeals Ban On Land Sale

Tantamount to Opening Country to Settlement by Jews

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) AMMAN, Transjordan, April 1. -The Governing Council of Transjordan, at a session presided over by Emir Abdullah, ruler of the country, decided today to annul existing restrictions against the sale of land in Transjordan to citizens of foreign nations.

This puts an end to the regulations prohibiting Jews from acquiring land in Transjordan. The regulations restricting the sale of land to foreigners were designed chiefly to prevent Arab land from falling into Jewish hands.

A law will shortly be promulgated in Transjordan which will permit Arab land owners to sell part of their land to Jews or any other non-residents of Transjordan, it was announced here today. Each ele of land will, however, be subject to ratification by Emir Abdullah and by the premier of the

Public Land to Be Sold

Government land may also be d to foreigners under the new law, it was explained today. The sales of government land will, however, be provisional, until the establishment of a legislative coun-

The decision adopted today by the Governing Council is tantamount to an open invitation to the Jews to enter Transjordan and to develop the country along the same lines as Palestine. It now remains for the British administration to permit Jews to enter Transjordan in order to make it possible for them to acquire the land which the government of Transjordan is ready to offer for

By the new policy only such Arabs as possess at least 200 dunams of land will be permitted

Committee of 9 Named to Weld Zionist Peace

4 Factions Represented in Group Appointed by Actions Body

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) JERUSALEM, April 1. — In an effort to gain peace within the

Zionist Organization and to solve the problem of whether or not to expel the Revisionist or breaking party discipline, the Zionist Actions Committee at its session to-day appointed a Committee of Understanding consisting of nine members representing all groups in the Zionist movement.

The committee will make its recommendations before the session of the Actions Committee closes at the end of this week. It is composed of three Laborites, two Revisionists, two General Zionists and two Mizrachists. In addition, Dr. Nahum Goldmann will participate in the deliberations of the committee as representative of the Radical Zionists and Meyer Grossman as representative of the Judenstaat party.

Demand Expulsion

At today's session of the Actions Committee the Hashomer Hazair, extremist wing of the Palestine Laborites, demanded that the Revisionists be expelled from the World Zionist Organization. Berl Katznelson, representing the moderate Laborites, opposed expulsion but demanded that the Zionist Organization fight against the Re-Zionist discipline.

Tourists Jam City to See Jewish Athletes in 2nd World Tourney

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
TEL AVIV, April 1.—Never before has this city been so crowded with foreign tourists as it is today, on the eve of the opening of the second Maccabiad in which 1,200 Jewish athletes from twenty-seven different countries are competing for world championship titles in boxing, fencing, tennis, wrestling and other sports.

More than 3,000 members of the World Maccabi Sports Organization landed in Jaffa today on steamers from Italy, Greece, Rumania and France. They were greeted at the pier with bands and formed a striking spectacle as they marched in uniform from the Jaffa pier into the heart of Tel

Hunt for Lodgings

A mad hunt for lodgings started here today by thousands of visitors since there are no rooms for guests left in the hotels. The number of tourists arriving at Tel Aviv to witness the Maccabiad games was estimated today at close to 40,000.

The city was thronged today with visitors in the colorful uniforms of the teams which added gayety to the decorated streets. Among the foreign guests are also many non-Jews who have come to witness the world Jewish olympics.

The Betar, the Revisionist youth organization, was excluded today from participation in the Maccabiad. The Hapoel, the Jewish Laborite sports organization of Palestine, announced today that it will definitely not participate in the Maccabiad "under the present circumstances." It consented, however, to participate in the opening ceremony on Tuesday.

Project Is Pondered as Nazis Resume **Old Methods**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, April 1 .- No reference to Jews is made in the conscription regulations for the German army, published here today, leaving the question of whether or not Jews will be admitted into the army unanswered.

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
BERLIN, April 1.—The anti-Jewish campaign in Germany today assumed the same character as in the early days of the Nazis' coming into power. Jews were again forced to parade on the streets with degrading placards and inflammatory anti-Jewish speeches were made in different parts of the country by members of the Nazi cabinet and by Nazi district leaders.

In the city of Luebeck a Jew was forced to parade through the streets bearing a placard, "I criticized the labor laws." A large procession followed the Jew, who was later taken away by the police under "protective arrest."

Order Hits Druggists

A secret order was issued by the Ministry of Propaganda to eliminate Jews from the pharmacy trade. All drug stores owned by Jews must be "dejudaised" within two years, according to the edict. No new permits for operating pharmacies are to be issued to Jews, the order further provides.

In view of the fact that German Jewish leaders now realize that the government is definitely determined to eliminate Jews from all phases of life in the Reich and that there is no hope for any improvement in the government's attitude towards the Jews, a twenty-five year emigration plan by which the entire Jewish population will quit Germany was under consideration today by Jewish leaders in Berlin. New Colonization Methods

PARIS.

A new departure in Jewish colonization methods—close settlement in Jewish towns and villages—is advocated by the Emcol, the new Jewish organization for emigrations colonizations work with which the Emigdirekt recently merged.

The plans and program of the new organization were revealed here recently at a conference of people interested in colonization activities. Dr. J. Brutzkus, chairman of Emcol, who presided at the conference, outlined the present conditions under which the work must be undertaken and the procedure which the new or-

ganization intends to follow.

Pointing out that the situation
in Germany and Eastern Europe

in Germany and Eastern Europe has resulted in the need to transport hundreds of thousands of Jews to new homes, at a time when the old countries of immigration—the United States, Canada, the Argentine, Brazil, South Africa and Australia-are almost completely closed to immigrants, and other countries, such as Mexico and Cuba, are unwilling to absorb more Jews, Dr. Brutzkus explained that one of the organization's primary activities would have to be exploratory, to find new countries to which Jews may emigrate and to study new methods of settling Jewish immigrants to the greatest advantage within the limited possibilities.

"In order to create for Jews a new home, and place for work, we must either find new countries where there are still possibilities for the immigration of traders and artisans or to change entirely the methods of emigration and to begin to settle whole Jewish villages and towns," Dr. Brutzkus explained.

"The forms of emigration which have been employed in the past have now become impossible in the old countries and can be carried on only to a limited extent in a few of the new countries.

"These places, like Colombia, Venezuela, Equador, Peru, Bolivia and a few colonies in South Africa, must now be explored. Prospects in this connection, however, are not very large.

"Much more can be achieved by changing the methods of emigration—by settling Jews in agriculture, in special villages and in industry in specific towns and townships.

"Only by this new method can the arousing of resistance among the local population be avoided. And it will enable us to transplant large masses into the sparsely populated countries.

"Proceeding from this point of view, the Emcol has imposed upon itself the following tasks: "(1). To investigate system-

If Jews today invite Aryan women to dance in public places, it is nothing less than a challenge to National Germany. And to an open challenge there is only one answer. Any women who have close relations with Jews will be pilloried. We shall publish the names of all women who go about with Jews, and also the names of the Jews.'

Between the Lines

10 Years of the Hebrew U.

The Hebrew University, whose tenth anniversary is being celebrated today throughout the world, is an example of the val-

world, is an example of the valuable contributions which American Jewry has made toward the upbuilding of Palestine.

Established chiefly with American funds, the Hebrew University has been maintained during the ten years of its existence mostly by contributions from the United States. It is the group centered around the American Friends of the Hebrew University that has made the existence of the university possible.

It can be safely said that were it not for Dr. Judah L. Magnes, with his energetic personal efforts in America, the Hebrew University would have faced many a crisis in the ten years since its founding. Devoted to the university, Dr. Magnes has spared neither time nor effort in seeing that this institution develops and justifies the pride which world Jewry is taking in

Gaining a Fine Reputation

The youngest university in the world, the Hebrew University today ranks among the most popular institutions of higher learning. Its students comprise Jewish youth from all parts of the world. Its faculty is composed of scientists of high repute.

The so-called "Aryan" paragraph in Germany which resulted in the ousting of many Jewish professors from German universities, has contributed towards the enrichment of the university's faculty. Deprived of the right to teach in Germany, many Jewish professors of world renown have joined the staff of the Hebrew University and have made their home on Mount Scopus.

With the campaign now being conducted by the Hadassah in America, to raise funds for the establishment of a medical center at the university, the Hebrew University is making another step forward in its development. At present only an institution for research, it is well on its way to ranking with the other great universities of the world by increasing it: program and the tope of its work.

Why a Jewish University?

Never before was a Hebrew university so necessary to the Jews of the world as now, when the doors of many institutions of learning are gradually being closed to them in different countries. The restrictions against Jewish students in the universities of Poland, the movement to introduce restrictions against Jewish students in the universities of Rumania, the elimination of Jewish students from the universities of Austria, the recent campaign against : lien students in France, the silent discrimination practised against Jewish students in certain universities in America—all this only emphasizes the necessity for a Hebrew university fully equipped and developed to accommodate Jewish students from all parts of the world.

Dr. Magnes' Achievements
Ten years in the existence of a university is a very short period, but the Hebrew University in Jerusalem has shown that with proper assistance from the Jews of all over the world, and especially from the Jews of America, it was able to perform a fine piece of work even in such a short span of time. This is no doubt due to the efforts of Dr. L. Magnes, the chancellor of the university. It is also ascribable to the great interest which

Praise Service Record Of Lyon Cohen

The Canadian Jewish Chronicle commenting on the fifty years of service to the Jewish community which Mr. Lyon Cohen, leader of Canadian Jewry, has attained this week, says:

Mr. Cohen is one of those rare Jews who belongs to his people and not to his community. His perspective is so sweeping and his range of Jewish interests so wide that it is small wonder that his name has become almost a household name wherever there is Jewish life in the Dominion. Unlike many of our modern leaders, Mr. Cohen has made no hobby of any specific branch of endeavor. Everything that is Jewish is sure to gain his sympathetic ear.

His philosophy of Jewish life is something of a challenge to those who feel that traditionalism cannot be compatible with modern Jewish life, and he is a striking exemplar of a Jew in whom the two forces have become synchronized.

Hamburg Police Make Novel Change

The London Times prints the following report from its Berlin correspondent:

An astounding and almost untranslatable announcement was made by the Hamburg police about the dissolution of a Protestant community. The community is the Evangelisch-Kirchliche Gemeinschaft of Hamburg, and the reason given for the action is that it has been "carrying on Jewish intrigues under the cloak of Christianity."

The community has been proscribed and dissolved in the whole area of the Free City because the preacher, who had changed from the Jewish to the Evangelical Faith, had exercised under the cloak of Christianity, a calamitous, Talmudic-Jewish, indeed, even unwholesome (gesundheitsgefachrdend, endangering to health) influence upon German fellow-citizens.

Comments on Arrest Of Returned Exiles

The London Daily Herald, writing on the German Jewish refugees who were arrested upon their return to Germany, says:

Depressed economic conditions in other countries and the difficulty in getting money from relatives within Germany, have forced the return of these Jews.

The number at present in custody throughout Germany is impossible to estimate, but a reliable source indicated that it would probably "run into hundreds."

Government quarters refuse any information, but one quarter said that shortly there would be an official statement concerning the instruction course for "political opponents—naturally chiefly Communists"—who return to Germany desiring to resume their former life.

Veterans Here Protest Reich **Draft Exclusion**

Ask Dr. Luther to Submit Views to Authorities in Berlin

A protest against the intention of the Nazi government not to admit German Jews to military service has been lodged with Dr. Hans Luther, German Ambassador in Washington, by the German-Jewish Men's League, formed here in 1911 by German-Jewish war veterans, it was learned yesterday.

The German Ambassador was asked to submit this protest to "competent government author-The protest reads:

"We learned from reports which reached us that the Reich government does not intend to admit the German Jews to military service, after the general conscription is This information introduced. caused the greatest indignation in our circle.

"The German - Jewish Men's League, Inc.," which was founded in 1911 by former German soldiers, still contains over ninety per cent of former members of the German army and navy, of participants in the world war, in the war of 1870-71, and even veterans of the campaigns of 1866 and 1864. In the almost twenty-five years of our existence, we have fulfilled our self-evident task and have actively cooperated in the promotion of German culture in America. We have supported all efforts in behalf of Germany, material and idealistic, decisively.

"You yourself, dear Mr. Ambassador, about a year and a half ago, expressed your recognition to three representatives of our group in New York, of the fact that we German Jews are bearers of German culture through our natural disposition, and that we cannot be otherwise. Therefore we are shocked to learn that the German Jews are to be deprived, through legislative measures of their most elementary civic rights at home.

"As former members of the army, we consider it our duty to protest most sharply against the execution of a planned degradation of our co-religionists in Germany, which the exclusion from military service would entail."

To Air Alien Bills at **Capital Tomorrow**

Public Hearings Slated on Measures to Exclude Fascists, Reds

(Special to the J.D.B.) WASHINGTON, April 1 .- Public hearings on a bill providing exclusion of "alien Fascists and Communists" will open here Wednesday morning, it was announced today by the House Committee on Immigration and Naturalization. The sessions will be held in the no roome of the Old House Office Building.

Considerable interest is being displayed here in a bill that will receive a public hearing on April 9. Interest is particularly centered in a portion of the bill which provides for legalization of residences in the United States of certain classes of aliens who have lived here at least ten years. The bill also would guard against separation from their families of aliens of the non-criminal classes.

Through these public hearings, Representative Samuel Dickstein of New York, chairman of the immigration committee, hopes to obtain testimony in support of his drive to humanize immigration laws and to bar subversive and criminal elements from the coun-

Newark Synagogue Marks80thBirthday

400 Hear Deutsch Warn of Reality of Anti-Semitism in This Country

NEWARK, N. J., April 1.—With nearly 400 persons in attendance, Congregation B'nai Abraham, New Jersey's largest Jewish temple, last night concluded the joint observance of its eightieth anniversary and the tenth year of its new building with a community dinner in the Gertrude O. Aronson Memorial Hall.

Bernard S. Deutsch, Aldermanic President of New York City and former president of the American Jewish Congress, delivering the principal address, charged that anti-Semitism is real in the United States. So real indeed that among the rank and file there is no Jewish family which does not face with dread the economic future of its youth."

"Imported anti-Semitism after the Nazi model," he said, "has set up a prototype for a specifically native product. And whether or not one believes in the nationhood of the Jewish people, one is forced to accept the nationhood of their suffering on both sides of the ocean." Michael A. Stavitsky, who headed

the joint jubilee committee, acted as toastmaster. Guests of honor at the fete were Louis V. Aronson, who headed the building committee when the present temple was erected a decade ago; Mayor Ellenstein, who is a member of the board of trustees; Albert Hollander, president of the congregation, and Philip J. Pelley Appeals **ForMoreFunds** In War on Jews

Plea From Asheville Is Dated 'Somewhere in the U.S.'

Continuing his anti-Jewish propaganda from Asheville, N. C., but dating his anti-Semitic leaflets from "Somewhere - in - the - United States" to avoid a possible investigation by the Post Office authorities into his use of the mails to spread anti-Semitism, William Dudley Pelley, leader of the Silver Shirt organization, yesterday sent out a new blast of anti-Jewish allegations in what he terms "a message of the utmost importance."

The "message," which consists of five long mimeographed sheets, is accompanied by a commentary proclamation by Robert Summerville, dated from Asheville, and asking that funds be sent to Pelley's Weekly, Box 1,776, Asheville, N. C.

"The Jews think that they are fooling the Gentile public and getting away with their racial strategy," Mr. Pelley writes in his message. "As a matter of fact, they are succeeding in doing little else than actually setting in motion a national tide of anti-Semitism that is beginning to evince itself as tangible and real."

Reporting his impressions during a visit which he made in Cleveland, Mr. Pelley states that "anti-Semitism is growing faster in Cleveland than in any other city of its size and character in the

Zionist Parley Could Turn Hitler Out in

Include Revision of Immigration System for Palestine

A program to guide the American Zionists in the deliberations of the forthcoming World Zionist Congress was adopted late Sunday night by the administrative committee of the Zionist organization of America at the closing session of a two-day meeting held in the Hotel Pennsylvania, Morris Rothenberg, president, announced

Framed in the form of a platform containing some fifteen points, the program adopted by the administrative committee dealt with the questions of the revision of methods of immigration into Palestine in order to make possible the admission of larger numbers of Jews who are at present excluded to a large degree from the economic life of a number of European countries; agricultural colonization in Palestine as the foundation of a sound and enduring economic system; the importance of Jewish labor in the work of rebuilding the Jewish National Home; the immediate opening of Transjordan to Jewish colonization in order to provide greater opportunities for increased immigration, and the strengthening of the national funds of the Keren Hayesod and Keren Kayemeth.

Urge Economic Body

The administrative committee also proposed that an economic commission be organized under the auspices of the Jewish Agency for Palestine for the purpose of economic planning over an extended period of years in order to establish cooperation and harmony between all classes and forms of economic enterprise in Palestine.

Vigorous opposition to the methods and policies of the Revisionist party was contained in the platform. Dr. Wise attacked the Revisionist party for its support of what he termed a "Fascist" policy in Palestine. The program dealt with various demands upon the British government as the mandatory power, concerning increased immigration, the support of edu-cational and health institutions and the proposed legislative coun-

A conference of members of the Zionist Organization of America was held following the meeting of the administrative committee to consider the vital issues with regard to the upbuilding of Palestine that were dealt with in the newly promulgated platform.

Decries Partisanship

Morris Rothenberg, who presided at the conference, deplored the development of partisan interests in the Zionist movement. Mr. Rothenberg added that he believed it was the duty of the Zionist Organization of America to assume a position of leadership in aligning forces of Zionist senti-ment to "subordinate party objectives to the larger interests of the beople."

Dr. Stephen S. Wise, Dr. S. Margoshes, Morris Margulies, Elihu D. Stone and Charles A. Cowen were among the other speakers at last night's conference.

Delegates Get Untermyer, Back From West, Instructions for Says League Can End Nazi Rule

60 Days by Invoking Economic Sanctions

The League of Nations could overthrow the Hitler government within sixty days by merely invoking economic sanctions against Germany, Samuel Untermyer, leader of the world boycott against Germany, declared vesterday on his return from California to New

Untermyer expressed the belief that an organized economic boycott against Germany will eventually end the Hitler regime. The end of the Nazi regime is already in sight, he stated.

"The report that the European nations are at last adopting the obvious protection of mutual security-pacts against the thinly veiled, bullying threats of Germany is too sane and good to be true," Mr. Untermyer said.

Only Road to Peace

"It is the only road to world peace against this Mad Dog of Europe to whom treaties and agreements are meaningless, onesided pacts, made only to be broken and scrapped at Germany's will.

"So long as this medieval reign of terror continues the preservation of peace must depend upon the fear of superior force and the determination to use it.

"Our non-sectarian boycott is constantly gathering momentum all over the world. It is proving an effective, peaceful substitute for

Penalty Provided

"It is not, but should be, generally realized that specific provision is made for the boycott under present conditions by the express terms of the Covenant of the League of Nations, under the title of 'Economical Sanctions.'

"Why does not the League invoke those provisions? For what were they intended if not for such a flagrant, self-confessed case of wanton defiance of solemn contract obligations?

"At last, before it is too late, the League has the opportunity to demonstrate its power and vindicate its usefulness as an instrument to avert war. If it now fails to act, it is doomed.

Sees Regime's End

"At the present rate of progress of our world boycott, I believe that the economic collapse of the benighted Hitler regime and the restoration of democratic government in Germany are well in sight, but the exercise by the League of the power reserved for it for just such a case as this would settle this within sixty days, and we shall have peace.

"Why was this power reserved to the League if it was never to be exercised? Isolate this pariah among the nations to whom solemn obligations are mere meaningless scraps of paper.'

April 15 Is Deadline

"Of what use are new agreements when existing ones are kicked to pieces at will? Why should self-respecting nations want tent body? The meeting of April 15 should be a red-letter event in the history of civilization, for then the League will be galvanized into new life-or die.

"Our organization is holding a mass meeting at the Hippodrome on the evening of April 10 to protest German rearmament and suggest the 'economic boycott' as the answer to the Nazi war threat.

"Like meetings are being held by our organizations in London, Paris and possibly Brussels, prior to the meeting of the League of Nations on the 15th.

"The American Federation of Labor is joining in our meeting of protest."

(Continued from Page One) The plan was introduced by George Kareski, a leader of the Berlin Jewish community.

According to Mr. Kareski's plan, all Jews can be taken out of Germany within twenty-five years in a systematic manner if the German government will lend its assistance in carrying out the project. It is believed that since the government is definitely interested in ousting the Jews, it will help in the orderly liquidation of the Reich's Jewish communities.

Addressing a mass meeting in Nuremberg today, Dr. Wilhelm Frick, Minister of the Interior, openly praised Julius Streicher, the Nazi ruler of Nuremberg, for his anti-Semitic activities. "Our government has gone very far toward the goal advocated by Herr Streicher with regard to the Jews," the Nazi Minister of the Interior said.

An attack on the Jews was made today by Dr. Paul Goebbels, Minister of Propaganda, addressing a meeting at Karlsruhe. "The Jews of the world," Goebbels said, "would like to see Germany defenseless in order that they should be able to invade Berlin." Dr. Goebbels emphasized that Nazi Germany will not give up its plans for rearmament.

Echoing Dr. Goebbels and Minister Frick, Herr Joseph Grohe, Nazi leader of Western Germany, addressing a meeting in Cologne today, declared that the Nazi government will continue its anti-Jewish policy unabated. "Anti-Semitism is an indestructible principle of our party," Herr Grobe said.

OrganizedRiots **Flare Against** Rumania Jews

Follow After Inciting Propaganda by Vaida-Voevod

BUCHAREST, April 1.—Organized anti-Jewish outbreaks took place in Rumania today as a result of the violent anti-Semitic propaganda conducted by ex-Premier Vaida-Voevod in an effort to force the government to emulate Germany in its anti-Jewish legis-

Following an open break yesterday between Dr. Vaida-Voevod and Julius Maniu, leader of the National Peasant party, who is opposed to the anti-Semitic restrictions which Vaida-Voevod advocates, anti-Jewish disturbances were reported today from Transylvania and other parts of Ru-

The supporters of Vaida-Voevod are firmly convinced that their anti-Jewish demands will sooner or later be carried into effect by the government. They suggest that restrictions against Jews be introduced not only in professions but also in commerce. A manifesto to this effect was issued yesterday by eleven former cabinet members, headed by Vaida-Voevod.

Jewish leaders here are watching the movement started by Vaida-Voevod with great anxiety. Serious events are predicted for the Jewish population despite the fact that the National Peasant party of which Vaida-Voevod is a leader, is opposed to his anti-Semitic

Davar, the official organ of the Histadruth, severely criticized Dr. Chaim Weizmann for the address which the noted Zionist leader delivered at an earlier session of the Actions Committee. Dr. Weizmann was also criticized by Joshua Suprasky, leader of the General Zionists in Palestine, who accused him of neglecting the interests of the Jewish industrialists in his plan for the future work in Palestine. Mr. Suprasky demanded that a larger immigration of Jews to Palestine be requested of the gov-ernment by the Zionist Executive.
