# Crown Colony Plan Jail Terms As Danzig Waits Vote

### Backs Nazi Barter; Forbids Personal **Bank Loans**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
JERUSALEM, April 5.—The
barter agreement between certain Jewish groups in Palestine and Nazi Germany will remain in ef-Nazi Germany will remain in er-fect, according to a decision adopt-ed today after a stormy all night session of the Zionist Actions Committee, rejecting the proposal of the Zionist Revisionists to void the compact.

The majority of the political committee today rejected a pro-posal that Palestine be withdrawn posal that Falestine be withdrawn from supervision of the League of Nations and proclaimed a British Ervim colony. The political com-mittee also discussed various problems concerning Arab-Jewish re-lations in Palestine,

Personal Loans Barred A resolution forbidding a director of a Zionist bank to take per-sonal loans from the bank, was sonal loans from the bank, was adopted today by the banking committee and reported to the general session of the Actions Committee. This resolution was adopted as a result of the liquidation of the Jewish Colonial Trust, the Zionist bank established by Dr. Theader Header Theodor Herzl.

Meer Grossman, reporting to the

Actions Committee in behalf of the Banking Committee, explained that the Jewish Colonial Trust was liquidated because of financial difficulties faced by three large debtors of the bank. He stated insufficient care was taken by the directors of the bank in granting large credits to a num-ber of individuals. The banking committee voiced the hope, how ever, that the losses would be made good.
"While the position of the Anglo-

Palestine Bank, the second Zion-ist bank, is very firm and its business is being conducted in the best order, our banking commission nevertheless decided to forbid the members of the board of directors to take any personal loans from this or any other Zionist bank," Mr. Grossman reported. # Adopt Budget Of \$1.650.000 For Palestine

# \$300,000 to Be Spent by Zionists to Spur

JERUSALEM, April 5. — The
Zionist Actions Committee today

adopted a budget for Zionist ac-tivities for the coming year amounting to \$1,650,000. This sum includes \$300,000 for organizing increased immigration of Jewish labor into Palestine.

The organization committee adopted a resolution to enforce discipline within the Zionist Organization and approved a change in the text of the Shekel which provides for such discipline for every voter to the next Zionist Congress. The General Zionists composed the minority which voted against this resolution.

# For Agitators Decrees 2-Year Penalty

# to Check Propaganda in Algeria

PARIS, April 5.—The determin-

ation of the French government to prevent anti-Jewish and other disturbances in Algeria was evidenced today in a decree issued by the Home Office imposing two years' imprisonment for any person convicted of spreading subversive propaganda. The decree aims chiefly to ham-

per the activities of the Nazi propagandists among the Arabs in Algeria. It is to this propaganda that the anti-Jewish riots in Setif and Constantine are attributed. The decree issued today also

provides a double penalty for state employes found guilty of conduct ing subversive propaganda.

Anti-Jewish posters appeared today in Paris for the first time, mounted on walls in various parts of the city. The posters attacking "international Jewish bankers."

### Believe 2 Jewish Women Exiles Poisoned by Nazi Kidnap Ring

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
LONDON, April 5.—Public opinion here continued to be aroused by the mysterious death of the two by the mysterious dearn of the two-women, German Jewish refugees, who are believed to have been poisoned by Nazi agents because they knew too much about the Nazi spying activities among Ger-

man refugees abroad.
Scotland Yard officials were busy today investigating the case in the belief that it may lead to the dis-covery of a ring of Nazi agents operating from London through-out the whole of Europe and engaged chiefly in kidnaping or mur-dering refugees from Germany who happen to be well posted on German military secrets. One of the victims of this ring was Berthold Jacob, German Jewish jour-nalist who was kidnaped by the Nazis from Basle on March 9 and taken into Germany.

### Linked to Jacob Cas

The mysterious death of the two German Jewish women here is be-ing linked with the kidnaping of Herr Jacob. Both women, Dora Fabian and Mathilde Wurm-Adler, are known to have been personal friends of the journalist. Miss Fa-bian, who was 35 years old, as-sisted the Swiss authorities in their investigations with regard to the Jacob kidnaping. She was de-scribed yesterday by Anton Ganz, Swiss public prosecutor who is in vestigating the Jacob case, as "one of the most brilliant brains exiled from Germany by the Nazi revo-

Jewish Stores Close

Many Jewish stores were closed today and will remain closed untoday and win remain closed un-til several days after the elections in view of the dangerous anti-Jewish propaganda which has de-veloped in connection with the election campaign. The presence in Danzig of Julius Streicher, Fran-conia's notorious anti-Semite, has made it impossible during the last two days for Jews to conduct their business on a normal basis, since Streicher is openly advocating the emulation of Nazi terror against Jews here along the same lines as in Nuremberg, the German city of which he is the ruler.

The Polish representative in Danzig today lodged a second complaint with the Danzig Senate protesting against the anti-Jewish boycott which affects Polish Jews and demanded that strong meas-ures be taken to stop the Nazi picketing of Jewish stores.

Two American millionaires, man and wife, are so convinced "the revolution" is around the corner that they have taken out double insurance, as it were:



GENE LYONS Polynesian paradise

First: they have placed themselves on record as friends of the Bolsheviks—not actually members of the Communist Party but on its periphery. The kind of Communists who receive invitations to Soviet diplomatic functions, attend dinners of the Friends of the Soviet Union and are ready to carry on the great experiment bravely, ruthlessly, to the last Russian.

Second: they have bought an interest in a safe and sunny retreat in the South Seas. When the barricades are thrown up, and the liquidations begin, these two will simply retire to a

The South Seas project interests me particularly. The wealthy couple are not the only "Bolshe-viks" in it. Associated with them are a number of people whom I know through their activities in Moscow, self-styled liberals and public friends of the downtrodden

Their plans look to the establishment of a cozy retreat for su-perior Americans, desirous of esthe sorrows and annoyances of the world. The island has already been acquired and a sort of cooperative "club" is being organized to finance, maintain and sise it.

For a portion of the year, at least, the members will be able to abandon the madding crowd and the crowded madness of civilizathe crowded madness of civiliza-tion. Their promotional literature on the subject says nothing about this—but one of the major an-noyances they intend to escape is Jews. When they expose their "Aryan" tumnies to the Polyne-sian sun, there will be no Semitic didness, over the nickless. skins to mar the picture.

That another club from which Tews are barred is in existence is not in itself news; it is too commonplace to deserve notice. wirgin beauty of an uninhabited South Sea island can be smudged with anti-Semitism as easily as a Florida beach or a Long Island rolf course

What makes it remarkable is membership includes Rolsheviks. One of near-Bolsheviks in fact, is always held up as an example of a foreign writer who (unlike myself and other backsliders) is doing right by the Soviet experiment.

How thin and meaningless is How thin and meaningless is the "Bolshevism" that has become the fashion among comfortable 'American intellectuals! It is no more than a transparent veneer of their essential Fascist natures

have seen roomfuls of th Stripped of their oh-and-ah enthusiasm for everything Russian, they are the garden variety reactionaries. What attracts them, really, is the hard-boiled, dehuman technique of the Bolsheviks. makes them feel a part of a tre-mendous machine of power that moves forward relentlessly, that plows down lives with a ws down lives with a superman

firmness," that treats human creatures as so many guinea pigs. The thrill-hunters are lionized by the genuine radicals. The fact by the genuine radicals. The fact that the "best people," intellectu-ally and financially speaking, are going Bolshevik warms the cockles of their meek hearts.

Before the war the radical move-nent had its "millionaire social-sts," its Stokeses and Wallings and Bullards and Bross Lloyds, as decorative fronts. Now that fash-ionable embellishment has been acquired by the Communists. The first breath of reality, the war, tore down the decoration two decades ago. The first breath of revolution will send the new group running where their natural inrunning where stinct leads them.

He wreaks a subtle and satirical revenge by using the col-umns of the Moneybags publica-tions to undermine the whole capitalist system. Not love of the proitalist system. graph" in Danzig, a severe anti-Jewish boycott propaganda de-veloped, reminiscent of the first days of the boycott conducted in Germany immediately after the Nazis care into power there. This boycott in Danzig, under the very eyes of the High Com-missioner of the League of Nations, has ruined many of the Jewish traders in the Free City and has affected even Jewish artisans, not to mention Jewish employes who were dismissed from many non-Jewish enter-prises under pressure of the local Nazis.

The terrorism against the Jews in Danzig has assumed such proportions that only two months ago Mr. Lester found it necessary to submit a special report on the situation to the League of Nations. The report has not, however, led to any alleviation of the Jewish position.

Fate Will Be Similar

To Reich Jewry's With today's elections, turning the control of Danzig over to the Nazis legitimately, the fate of the Jews in Danzig will not be very different from that in Germany. The fact that the in Germany. The fact that the Polish government and the League of Nations are still offi-cially considered partners in Danzig is of little consolation since both Poland and Geneva will not be in a position to do much now that Danzig is practically, though not officially, be-coming a part of Germany.

Many Jews in Danzig who are Polish citizens will of course leave the Free City after today's elections and will return to Poland. The rest of the Jewish pop-ulation there will have to emigrate to other countries, there to suffer the same fate as the to suffer the same fate as the Jewish refugees from Germany. Reich Emigration

Given New Impetus
The wave of Jewish emigration from Germany which sub-sided a few months ago was given impetus this week, when it became clear that the Nazi gov-ernment is resuming its anti-Jewish campaign with the sole aim of forcing more Jews out of the country. A plan for a systhe country. A plan for a sys-tematic emigration of at least 20,000 Jews a year was discussed this week by Jewish leaders in Germany, in order to evacuate the entire Jewish population from Germany within the next twenty-five years.

The tragic position of German Jewry was established this week by Anthony Eden, the traveling British diplomat who was trying British diplomat who was trying to sell peace to Europe. Captain Eden succeeded very well in sell-ing his peace ideas to Moscow. He did not, however, meet with success in Warsaw. He succeeded even less in Berlin where war talk is carried on openly. British Ponder

British Ponder
Opening Transjordan
In connection with the war
fear now prevailing in Europe,
the British Colonial Office began
to consider this week the advisability of opening Transjordan to Jewish immigration. The
British covernment with its ex-British government, with its experience of the last World War, knows that it can very well depend upon the Jews in the Near East in case any future war should affect British interests there. On the other hand, she is also ware of the fact that Germany, being ambitious to obtain more colonies, may stir up the Arabs in Palestine and ransjordan against the British administration, and even help them with aeroplanes and tanks,

them with aeroplanes and tanks, just as she is now helping Ethio-pla against Italy. It is for this reason that British statesmen have now turned their eyes toward Transjordan with a view of permitting Jewish immigration there, in or-der to create a basis for Jewish support in case of war. It is for this reason that the immigration laws for Palestine may also be relaxed.

The opening of Transjordan to

Jews will be officially demanded by Colonel Wedgwood at one of the next sessions of the British Parliament, according to a statement made by him this week. In his statement, Colonel his statement, coloner wears-wood said he is also going to insist on his old idea that Pal-estine should be converted from a mandated territory into 8 British crown colony.

Should Jewish immigration in-to Transjordan be permitted, one to Transforman be permitted, one of the major issues in the fight between the Revisionists and other Zionist groups, will auto-matically be settled. There will be no reason for Mr. Jabotinsky and his followers not to submit to Zionist discipline, if his ambi-tion of settling Jews in Transjordan is finally realized.

In the meantime, the question of how to force the Revisionists to submit to Zionist discipline was the major problem discussed during the entire week at the sessions of the Actions Committee now taking place in Jerusa-lem. A committee of nine, representing all Zionist groups, has been appointed by the Actions Committee, to negotiate a com-promise with the Revisionists. So far, however, the committee has not succeeded in obtaining any results.

Maccabiad Attracts Wide Interest

The center of interest in Palestine this week was the Maccaestine this week was the Macca-biad, in which 1,200 Jewish ath-letes from all over the world, representing twenty-seven countries, are participating. The

opening of the Maccabiad was a grand and glorious affair which found an echo all over the world. The tenth anniversary of the founding of the Hebrew Univer-sity in Jerusalem was also one of the events which attracted world-wide attention this week. The anniversary was celebrated simultaneously in fifty cities in America, and speeches were broadcast to the United States from London by Sir Herbert Samuel and James de Rothschild, and from Jerusalem by Dr. Ju-dah L. Magnes, the chancellor of the university. In Palestine the celebration of the Hebrew Uni-versity anniversary will star-tary anniversary will star-

Hebrew calendar. A Towish event of world-wide A Jewish event of world-wide importance was also the cele-bration this week in Spain of the 800th birthday of Moses Maimonides, the Jewish philosopher and physician, who was born in Cordoba, Spain. It was at this celebration, arranged by the Spanish government, that the ban which the Jews proclaimed against Spain 450 years claimed against Spain 450 years ago, was revoked, and that ever-lasting peace was again reached between the Spanish and the Jewish peoples.



Because Moses Maimonides was a man of genius, belonging to the breed of the world's supermen, he is, in a sense, above race. Nevertheless, there are visible in his way of life, as well as in the

pattern of his thought certain broad distinctive contours which we like to associate with classic Jewish quality. Maimonides is for us the consummate Jew, the comprehensive epic product of Jewish life at its best. His thought-world is a unique blending of reason, faith and moral passion. Clear, incisive, methodical thinking, a high and exalted faith, and a prophetic earnestness find in him that unity after which Jewish thought has consistently aspired. Mainonides is not a ration-alist exclusively, or a pietist, or a legalist, or a moralist, He is a synthesis of all of these. He is not an obscurrantist who sacrifices reason to blind he a rationalist who rejects everevitive rhat reason. ish life at its best. His thought-world is a unique



on the three last terminents are the post of the towering battlements of faith. He uses both Jewish faith in secret, he held out reason and faith for the founda-tions of his ethical system. All of which is the sovereign way of Jewish thought.

One also finds in the man himself, in his personal character and temperament qualities which we are inclined to consider essentially though not exclusively Jewish-calm, patient wisdom, a reverence for all life, a pragmatic idealism, firmness plus forbearance, justice and charity—that golden mean which is quite as much Hebraic as it is Hellenic.

The Jews of his day sensed all The Jews of his day sensed an this in Moses Maimonides. They saw in him the "Light of the Ex-ile." Jews from all parts of the world turned to him in their per-plexities for counsel and guidance. Their sound instinct led them to recognize in him the leader who could be trusted because of his knowledge, sagacity and integrity to guide them aright in all their difficulties.

Those were trying times for Is-rael, both in the West and in the East, in Christian as well as in Mohammedan lands. It was the century of the Crusaders who paved for themselves a bloody corridor of Jewish martyrs on their way to the Holy Land, and of the Almohades, the fanatical Moham-medan Puritan sect which gave men the choice of the Koran, exile or death.

In those dark days of fear, per-secution, forced conversions and exile, Tewish communities turned to Maimonides. He proffered them the mellowed wisdom of a sage and the strong faith of a man of God. With calm, considerate judg-ment, at times with fatherly admonition he instructed, forewarned, comforted and cheered them in their tribulations.

To the Jews who had been com-pelled to profess Mohammedanism in public while practicing their

the promise of God's forgiveness, and, unlike some intolerant rabbis of his day, he refused to read them out of the fold and to brand them as apostates to their people and their God. He warned his coreligionists against the menace of false messiahs who were arising in those turbulent years and against all forms of superstition into which an harassed people so readily sinks. He preached tolerance toward Jew-ish sectaries and dissenters and urged upon his people not to thrust from Jewish fellowship their Karaite brethren. Although he zeal-ously championed the doctrines of Judaism as against the doctrines of Christianity and Mohammedar ism, he nevertheless had the cour and Mohammedanage and the broad tolerance to proclaim that both Christianity and Mohammedanism are but different paths which led ultimately to the same goal of true faith.

Moses Maimonides was the crest Moses Mamonices was the creat of the wave of fine philosophic speculation which set in among our people nearly three centuries before his time. It is true that his great "Moreh" solved no philosophic problem. No basic philosophic problem is ever solved. But neither can it ever be ignored. . . . Think-ing men will forever try to bridge the gulf between reason and faith. Maimonides taught his generation and many succeeding generations to look upon the reasoning and questing mind of man not as an obstacle to faith and piety but as

the royal road which leads to both. We are no less perplexed in our day than were our forefathers in Maimonides' day, and we can still draw from the intellectual integrity, the indefeasible faith and the moral courage of the son of Mai-mon much guidance and inspira-


