Soviet Jews Start Survey On Passover

House-to-House Quiz on Observance Part of Anti-Faith Drive

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) MOSCOW, April 9 .- A houseto-house survey will be conducted by Jewish Communists in a number of Soviet cities to establish whether Jews observe Passover, it was announced here today in the Moscow Emes, a Communist daily.

This measure is a part of the anti-religious campaign which has been started among the Jewish population in connection with the approaching Passover next week.

"It would be a grave mistake to think that religion and nationalism have already been liquidated everywhere in the Soviet Union," the paper writes. "There are still workers who are backward and who observe religion."

The services in New York are announced for 10:30 o'clock Friday morning. They will be held in Temple Emanu-El, of which Mr. Ochs was a trustee. Burial will be at Mount Hope, N. Y.

Masons Win Libel Suit on Swiss Nazi

Publisher Must Pay Fine for Attack on Order as Tool of Jews

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BASLE, April 9. — Major Leon Hardt was found guilty by the Swiss court here today in a libel suit brought against him by a number of prominent Freemasons for alleging that "the Freemasons are tools of a Jewish conspiracy."

The allegation was made by Major Hardt in an article printed in Volksbund, a paper of which he is the publisher. The verdict provides that Major Hardt is to pay a fine and damages to the plaintiff and that he must publish the verdict in the press.

"Protocols" Trial April 29

Preparations were made today in Berne for the resumption of the trial against Swiss Nazi leaders for publishing the so-called "Protocols of the Elders of Zion," an anti-Jewish forgery. The trial is expected to be resumed on April

Manufacturers JoinWith Workers in Picketing **Boot Shop**

TEL AVIV, April 9. — Jewish manufacturers today joined Jewish workers in picketing a store here which is selling foreign-made

Several persons were arrested today in addition to the two Jewish youths arrested on Monday as a result of the picketing which is prohibited in Palestine.

The owner of the shoe store, against whom objection is made for selling foreign-made goods, agreed today to arbitration.

The shoe industry in Palestine is sufficiently developed to supply all the shoes which Palestine needs without importing from abroad. Nevertheless, a number of Jewish stores are making a practice of importing shoes, undermining local production. The Czechoslovakian shoe firm Bata also maintains branches throughout Palestine, competing with Palestine-made shoes and provoking protest on the part of the Jewish industrialists and workers who are interested in stimulating local industry.

Rabbi Wise's Daughter Is ERB Head's Aide

Mrs. Justine Wise Tulin, an Assistant Corporation Counsel and the daughter of Rabbi Stephen S. Wise, has been assigned to Oswald W. Knauth, new head of the ERB, as legal adviser. Mrs. Tulin was with Mr. Knauth when newspaper men saw him yesterday. He said Mayor LaGuardia had appointed Mrs. Tulin "to advise and steer"

Student Riots Are Checked In Rumania

Government Acts Swiftly to Restore Order; 30 Jailed

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BUCHAREST, April 9.—Strong measures were taken by the government today to restore order in the city after widespread anti-Semitic riots.

The riots were started by anti-Semitic students after an order issued by the chancellor of the Bucharest University last Saturday closing down the university for six days. This order was made necessary after a number of Jewish students had been attacked in the classrooms and laboratories.

Lifts Congress Ban

The government today announced that it will permit the originally prohibited student congress to take place next Sunday, provided the leaders of the congress will guarantee peaceful behavior. The congress is to take place in Crajova.

The Jewish population of Crajova, which numbers about 13,000, is greatly worried about the forthcoming gathering of the anti-Semitic students. Measures are being taken by central authorities to prevent disorders in Crajova during the congress.

Jewish circles in Bucharest today denied a report which appeared abroad that three Jews were thrown into the river yesterday during the anti-Jewish riots in the city. The authorities have confirmed that thirty students are now, under arrest as a result of yesterday's clashes.

Bedouins Given Land; Must Hold It 30 Years

THE BAND WAGON

This is the first of a series of three articles by Vladimir Jabotinsky, the Revisionist leader, written specially for the Jewish Daily Bulletin. The second of the series will appear in tomorrow's Bulletin.

It is not only difficult but probably impossible to bring home to American Jews the intensity of Zionist feeling in the Zone of Jewish Distress—Eastern and Central Europe. That is a terrible and cruel intensity; it looks irrational, for there is the impression that Palestine (they now call Palestine simply "certificate," for short) is wanted at once and for every single individual out of a crowd of several millions, and yet it is realistically wise because there actually is no other way out for all those millions but Palestine. my present tour I have many a time thought of trying somehow to convey to the American audiences mass hunger-but had to renounce the attempt for fear of dropping into sob-stuff.

So it probably will have to be accepted as inevitable—that the largest and most powerful of Jewish communities should remain in a state of just sympathetic aloofness while the zone of distress across the ocean is traversing a period of acutest mass agony.

Some readers may here feel shocked by the term "sympathetic aloofness," they may find it unjust, may claim that theirs is much more than mere "sympathy," and the claim may be true: but I cannot help it-compared with the tremendous immediacy of that painful "certificatehunger" out there the American attitude strikes me as condolence by remote well-wishers, rather skeptical as to all those stories about a "frozen stampede" to Pal-

is probably also why This American Jews can play with pink leftism just at a moment when all the Jewish "middle class" in the zone of distress is up in revolt against the present left wing hegemony in Zionism. What is fanning that revolt into real white heat is, naturally, the monopoly over "certificates." The "mittelstand" (eighty per cent of the whole ghetto) can no longer afford to renounce them for the benefit of "halutzim;" it needs them for itself, too.

No Jew of the "mittelstand" imagines that Palestine can absorb shopkeepers or luftmenschen: he knows that, apart from people with money, only laborers are wanted; but he is himself, in many cases, an artisan, and in any case believes himself fully capable of becoming a laborer, and quite rightly so in most cases. Yet he is debarred from even asking for a "certificate" because he does not belong to the monopolist party and (being a man above 25, probably already married) cannot go to a "hachsharah" place (where, as everybody by now admits, they learn nothing of any use). There is, of course, also the ideological controversy about "class war;" even without the "certificates" complication it has ever been an irritant. The ordinary poor shul-goer who, as long as he could spare a cent, has been feeding the funds that fed the Halutzim and has made the Histadruth what it now financially is, profoundly insulted being treated as white trash by those very Halutzim. The small and medium capitalist whose initiative. since 1925, has endowed Palestine with hundreds of factories providing work for 20,000 Jewish workers, stands bewildered in discovering that even in Zion he is nothing else but a class enemy, an exploiter, and altogether a social nuisance. All that has long been causing a great deal of resentment; but now, added to the nonadmission of the "mittelstand" to that "lottery," it makes people see

American Jewry is also mittelstand, but their life is paradise in comparison, they do not feel that searing pain, and sears can never be "explained." So they have chosen just this moment for getting infatuated with the party whose domination is gall and wormwood to four-fifths of distressed European Jewry, chosen this moment for no other reason, I fear, than a purely local coincidence—the fact that just now "Labor" catchwords happen to be popular in America.

American Zionists are under the impression that this is a very noble and very liberal spiritual departure. I see in it something quite different. There was no trace of such infatuation when Palestinian labor was poor and helpless, in those days of the "stone breakers" when Halutzim were really "pioneers" in the heroic sense of the term, suffering untold material privations and ready to stand even more the glory of Zion. Yet in those days American Zionism, though generous with its money for the improvement of their position, never dreamed of accepting their ideological leader-Today Palestinian left wing hip. labor gets wages that would make English working men envious; they have abandoned en masse the agricultural colonies, partly even the Dead Sea, because they are better paid in towns; a quarter of the membership of the left wing- Histadruth either live in neat little houses of their own, or else are already listed to get such houses as soon as donations from

The Histadruth cooperatives employ hired Jewish labor just like capitalist enterprises do: at last year's Histadruth convention a special report on this painful subject was read by a Mr. Garfinkel from which we learned some really piquant facts-e. g., that more than 50 per cent of those Histadruth members working for His-(Continued on Page Three)

Adelph S. Ochs

The sudden death of Adolph S. Ochs, the publisher of the New York Times, is a loss not only to the newspaper world, but also to world Jewry.

The New York Times has often been called by anti-Semites "a Jewish newspaper," not only because its publisher, Mr. Ochs, was a Jew, but also because it paid more attention to news concerning Jewish life than any other newspaper in the United States.

This policy of paying proper attention to Jewish activities in the United States and to events concerning Jews in Europe, has been pursued by the Times due to the direct influence of Mr. Ochs and of the late Louis Wiley.

Watching Jewish News With the death of these two pillars of the New York Times, the Jews of the world have lost two of its most influential friends. Though not very active in Jewish affairs, Mr. Ochs, and with him Mr. Wiley, watched with interest the developments of Jewish life, especially recently since the Nazis came into power in Germany.

In taking the lead in reporting news concerning Jewish life, the New York Times was also instrumental in the fact that other papers and news agencies in America followed his lead. It was the New York Times, under the ownership of Adolph Ochs, that actually created a demand for Jewish news in the American newspaper field.

Eye on Germany

As one of the very few who had a chance to watch closely the work of the New York Times from Berlin during the first year of the Nazi regime, I can only say that it was the ambition of the New York Times not to miss a single item on the mistreatment of the Jews in Germany.

Very often the New York office of the Times cabled its office in Berlin a summary of the day's news from Germany as reported by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, in order to have these reports supplemented by extensive cables from its own correspondent.

In America, Mr. Ochs was especially interested in the Hebrew Union College of Cincinnati. He was the chairman of a committee for a \$5,000,000 endowment for the college, and several years ago donated \$200,-000 to the college. Mr. Ochs was also a member of the Executive of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations.

Ochs and Palestine

Although he visited Palestine, Mr. Ochs had no interest in Zionism. From time to time certain Zionist circles complained to him about ent of the New York Times in Palestine, Joseph Levy, whose reports were not liked by Zionists in America. Mr. Ochs, however, never paid attention to these complaints. His policy was always to place complete confidence in his correspondents and to ignore the complaints of politicians.

Press Here Welcomes Danzig Vote Result

The entire metropolitan press greets editorially the failure of the Nazis in the Danzig elections.

The New York Times says: In Germany and in the Saar the tactics of suppressing opposition and spreading terrorism in order to assure a popular mandate for Herr Hitler and the Nazis were completely successful. But the Reichsfuehrer has been stopped at the Baltic in his effort to spread the area of the National Socialist dictatorship among all peoples speaking the German tongue and responsive to German influence. The Free City of Danzig has taken its stand with Austria against Hitler's Germany, and the result of its election yesterday may have a powerful stabilizing effect upon the peace of Europe.

The Herald Tribune writes:

Among the first constitutional changes would have been amendments disenfranchising Jews, dissolving the German opposition parties - if not those of the microscopic Polish minority and possibly providing for the return of Danzig to the Reich through a plebiscite. They could only make such changes, however, in the full knowledge that they have no legal value until they were approved and ratified

". . . I found pleasure in work that came to my hand and in doing it conscientiously; I found joy and satisfaction in being helpful to my parents and others, and in thus making my life worth while found happiness and consolation. My Jewish home life and religion gave me a sense of responsibility to my subconscious better self-which I think is the God within me, the Unknowable, the Inexplicable. This makes me believe I am more than an animal, and that this life cannot be the end of our spiritual nature.'

The voting demonstrated that Germans of Nazi inclinations number approximately three out of every five of the city's population. Adler, Rosenwald Speak Over International Radio Network

The eight hundredth anniversary of the birth of Moses Maimonides, one of the greatest philosophers of the Middle Ages, was celebrated by an international broadcast last night over an N. B. C.-WEAF network. The speakers were Dr. Cyrus Adler, president of the Jewish Theological Seminary and chairman of the cultural committee of the Joint Distribution Committee, and William Rosenwald, co-chairman of the United Jewish Appeal and son of the late Julius Rosenwald. Rabbi Herbert S. Goldstein, forher president of the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregation, delivered an invocation.

A group of cantors led by Cantor Vigoda chanted the thirteen Articles of Faith and Belief, known as "The Yigdal," which Maimonides wrote. The broadcast was under the auspices of the Cultural Committee of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Com-

Dr. Adler stressed the contribution of Maimonides to world Jewry and civilization in general, the significance of his contribution, and its inspirational value eight hundred years later.

"Some of his writings," Dr. Adler said, "have so modern a ring that they would be applicable to our times and to the widest circles. One of his famous epistles was called the Iggeret Teman, the leter to the South, which was written about 1172. The people of this far off country were in great trouble and they addressed to him various inquiries. One of these was with regard to a Jew who was claiming to be the Messiah. In his reply he points out that various pseudo-Messiahs had arisen in Spain and Morocco and in other places. He says in effect that the man in South Arabia is no doubt demented. He asserts as a sign of the man's poverty of intellect, that he ordered all money to be distributed for charity. Such an order, the letter says, contradicts the Bible. The law commands that we bestow a portion of our substance on the needy and our ancient teachers have made the rule that one-fifth of a man's property is what he should thus bestow. He points out as an evidence of the man's folly that if the wealthy should give away their property to the poor and thus impoverish themselves, then the poor who had become enriched in turn, would have to return the money to the donors, and in effect he says the whole plan is a summary of non-

"Without drawing any immediate lesson I submit to my hearers of the radio audience whether this letter written more than seven hundred and fifty years ago has not a lesson for some strange economic theories of our day."

William Rosenwald's address was devoted to the "Eight Degrees of Charity" of which Maimonides was the author. These, he said, reflect as forcefully and truly today, what should be our approach to the problem of relief and social welfare as it did almost 800 years ago.

Rabbi Goldstein, in his invocaion, also dwelt upon the charityprecepts of Maimonides, saying that if we were to abide by them our public institutions, as well as individuals in need, would be sufciently endowed and rehabilitated.

'from one to six pounds" a month (the Trade Union minimum in Palestine is seven pounds month); or that some of those cooperatives, whose shares originally cost 100 to 200 dollars, now refuse to sell them, owing to the boom, for less than "two to three thousand dollars."

Individual members of the left wing Histadruth also employ hired labor — the proletarian "boss" working for high wages in town, but letting his vegetable plot in a nearby colony to be tended by another proletarian for a lower wage; after which, of course, he will sell those vegetables to the bourgeoisie and pocket the profit. In short, belonging to the left wing Histadruth is nowadays rather a comfortable social position.

The Histadruth itself, and the "Mapai" (the Socialist Party) which dominates it, are also very 'comfortable:" in proportion to membership, probably one of the richest trade unions throughout the world. Beside the ordinary Keren Hayesod sources, and the 'Gewerkschaft" campaigns, the Histadruth now also enjoys a nice steady clean income from the Transfer Agreement between some of its organs and Hitler's government, helping Germany to import her wares into our Holy Land. This is why left wing labor has at its disposal such a mighty war chest for sending delegations across all the oceans, and for election campaigns to Zionist Con-

Brodie Paints 136 to Take City Test **Bright Picture** Of Holy Land

Economic Body Leader Back After Month's Survey There

Palestine is continuing as one of the world's rare examples of a prosperous country, it was revealed yesterday afternoon by Israel B. Brodie, president of the American Economic Committee for Palestine, on his return aboard the liner Ile de France.

While most lands have unemployment problems these days, Palestine has more work than workers, Mr. Brodie pointed out in a prepared statement telling his observations during a month's survey. He met leaders in every branch of the country's economic

Warns on Labor Shortage

The labor shortage menaces further development, he said, adding that, if an economic recession sets in, it will be caused chiefly if not wholly by the inadequate supply of workers. But for the present, "the prospects for continued industrial expansion in Palestine are very bright indeed."

Mr. Brodie told of a considerable movement of factories into the rural sections of the Holy Land. Tel Aviv and Haifa continue as the industrial centers, however, he

The economic absorptive capacity of the country will be hugely increased if efforts to discover and develop underground water reserves, the existence of which was not even suspected a few years ago, prove successful. Preliminary exertions along this line have met with success, he said.

Forward on All Fronts'

"Palestine is going forward on all fronts," Mr. Brodie asserted. The expected deflation has not come off, and in official and authoritative circles it is regarded as having been indefinitely post-

About 70,000 acres of citrus lands are under cultivation, he declared, and when this acreage is brought to the full fruit-bearing stage the country will be producing more than 20,000,000 cases of oranges annually. Steps are being taken by leaders in the industry to guard against overproduction.

Construction work is going on as an accelerated pace and will not slacken for some time, even if immigration should slow down, an eventuality which Mr. Brodie said is not expected.

From labor to industrialist, he declared, the Jews of Palestine are animated by "the dogged spirit of the pioneer who knows no faltering and no turning back." They recognize that High Commissioner Wauchope "has approached his heavy task with high qualities of statesmanship and understanding."

Mr. Ochs died Monday in Chattanooga of a cerebral hemorrhage. He was stricken while lunching with relatives and friends in a restaurant. Four hours later he died in a sanitarium.

Mr. Ochs is survived by his wife, Mrs. Effie Wise Ochs, and one daughter, Mrs. Arthur Hays Sulzberger, both of New York. Mrs. Ochs was in Atlantic City when she learned of her husband's death.

Mr. Ochs was born in Cincinnati 77 years ago. His parents were German-Jewish liberals who came to this country to escape from the bitter repressions that followed the attempt to set up a republic in 1848. His father fought in the Mexican and the Civil wars. was a captain in the 52nd Ohio Volunteer Infantry during the Civil War.

Urged Return to Religion

The need for a return to religious teaching as a basis for good citizenship was emphasized by Mr. Ochs at the dedication of the Jacob Schiff Center in the Bronx on January 12, 1925.

In his address Mr. Ochs said he was thrilled to think that people who have come here, strangers in a strange land, had reared such an institution as a good example to the metropolis. He appealed to the Jewish community of New York to help the center and paid a tribute to Mr. Schiff as a great citizen and a great Jew.

Sees Spiritual Awakening

"There is a spiritual awakening throughout the world," he said, "and it becomes us Jews to be foremost in that awakening, because all religions of enightened people rest on the Jewish faiththe Old Testament."

Although not a Zionist, Mr. Ochs was interested in Palestine from a religious angle only. At a dinner given by the executive councils of the United Synagogue of America, in November, 1925, launching a campaign for funds to build a synagogue center in Jerusalem, Mr. Ochs said:

"I rejoiced, and I was particularly pleased when I heard that there was a move to do something religious in Palestine. I am here this evening to tell you that I am very much interested in the moveent to establish a Jewish house of worship worthy of the Jew in Palestine. I am only too glad to willingly give you my aid to make such a thing possible. I want to encourage you-I want to help you—and I think it a very worthy movement and worthy of the support of every self-respecting Jew in the world, regardless of the manner in which he worships.

Counsels Courage

"We should stand up unafraid and assert ourselves-and particularly impress upon our young people that they have reason to stand up and be proud of their heritage," Mr. Ochs concluded.

Women Hold First Conference To Unify Efforts of the JNF

Urge Tax to Swell Fund; Dr. Rosenfeld Traces Rise of Nazis

Delegates from forty national and local Jewish women's organizations assembled yesterday at the Temple Emanu-El to hear Dr. Kurt Rosenfeld address the initial meeting of the Women's Conference for Palestine Land Redemp-

Dr. Rosenfeld, former Prussian Minister of Justice and now refugee in America, traced the evolution of the Nazi rise to power in Germany from its beginning before the World War to the present day. He urged a united front of anti-Nazi organizations as the logical method of alleviating the condition of the Jews in Germany.

The conference was held under the auspices of the Jewish National Fund which redeems the land in Palestine for refugees and pioneers. Mrs. Israel Goldstein presided in the absence of Judge Anna Moscowitz Kross who was called to Florida.

In her opening remarks Mrs. Goldstein expressed the hope that the conference would result in closer cooperation of the organizations represented in the redeeming of land so necessary to the placing of refugees. The JNF organization set-up was explained in detail by Mrs. Goldstein.

The resolutions adopted by the conference voiced a plea to every Jewish woman-regardless of her status-to share in the upbuilding of Palestine. Since the Jewish National Fund recognizes no party lines, although it is an integral

part of the Zionists ideology, it was resolved that non-Zionists, as well as those of Zionist persuasion, participate in its program.

A women's committee was created to contact all Jewish women's organizations, the task being facilitated by the appointment of a National Fund chairman in each organization. It is to be the function of these chairmen to bring to the attention of her members the aims and ideals of the JNF and to further the work of this fund through the distribution of boxes to the individual members of the organization.
