British Jews Pay Tribute To Royal Pair

Pledge Loyalty on Eve of Jubilee; Special Prayers Recited

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
LONDON, May 5.—A resolution of loyalty to the British King in behalf of the Jews of England was adopted today at the annual convention of the British Zionist Federation in connection with the celebrations of the twenty-fifth anniversary of the King's accession to the throne which begins tomorrow.

Special prayers for the King and Queen of England were delivered today and yesterday in all synagogues throughout the country in observance of the anniversary. Chief Rabbi Dr. Hertz has composed a special text of a Jewish prayer devoted to the occasion.

The convention at which the resolution of loyalty was adopted represents more than 30,000 members of the Zionist Organization in England and sympathizers of the Zionist movement. About 400 delegates are participating in the convention.

Approve Forest Project
The convention also endorsed the decision to plant in Palestine a forest named after King George. In appreciation of Britain's sympathetic attitude towards the upbuilding of Palestine as a Jewish National Home.

Messages of greeting were received at the convention from Felix M. Warburg of the United States and other leaders of Jewish life in various countries. The convention was addressed by N. H. Sokolow, president of the World Zionist Organization.

Mr. Sokolow in his address pointed out that Palestine today is the only real land of refuge for German Jews. He spoke of the Jewish situation in various countries and emphasized that hundreds of thousands of Jews from East European countries would proceed to Palestine today.

21,000 Jam Garden at Opening Of 35th 'Circle' Convention

With a flutter of red pennants and a blare of bands the Workmen's Circle, Jewish fraternal organization numbering 80,000 members, opened its thirty-fifth annual convention before more than 21,000 spectators who jammed Madison Square Garden yesterday afternoon.

Rabbi's Group Plans 'Enoch Arden' Law

The enactment of a Jewish "Enoch Arden" law, a measure whereby the traditional divorce laws of Judaism will be adjusted to meet the problem of the "aguna," the deserted wife, will be one of the main themes of discussion at the thirty-fifth annual convention of the Rabbinical Assembly of America.

The convention will be held May 13 to 15 at Rockaway Park, L. I., sessions being divided between the buildings of Temple Beth El and the Belmont Inn Hotel. One hundred and fifty rabbis, from all over the United States and Canada have already certified their intention of attending the convention.

2 Arabs Held As Suspects in Slaying of Jew Rabbi's Son Murdered Trying to Save Aunt From Attack

JERUSALEM, May 5.—The Palestine police today continued its investigations into the murder of the 30-year-old Kalman Shapiro, son of a rabbi, who was slain in Jerusalem Friday night under the same circumstances as Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, the Zionist leader, and a member of the Executive of the Jewish Agency who was killed two years ago.

Shapiro was assassinated by two Arabs while walking with his aunt, who is 40 years old, in the all-Jewish quarter, Kerem Avraam, about midnight. He was escorting his aunt home. On the way two Arabs suddenly appeared in the dark and made an effort to attack the woman. When Shapiro turned to defend her the Arabs turned on him and knifed him to death. The murderers disappeared before he was arrested.

Police authorities, arriving later at the scene of the murder, and the police dogs, trailed the suspects to Lifta, a neighboring Arab settlement. Two Arabs were arrested under suspicion, but it has not been established whether they are the actual murderers.

The victim was an instructor of the National Labor Organization, through the organization the Zionist Revisionists in Palestine.

The murder has attracted wide attention throughout the country. This is the fourth case of Arabs attacking Jews in different parts of Palestine during the last week.

Carrying placards bearing the names of their respective states, the delegates, who ranged from toddling children to full-grown men and women, marched behind the oldest to the cheers of the spectators.

Reich to Hold Jews Apart In War Time

They Try to Stir World Conflict, Streicher Declares

BERLIN, May 5.—The German government will isolate the entire Jewish population into separate districts in case of war, it was announced yesterday by Julius Streicher, the notorious Nazi leader addressing a mass meeting in Nuremberg.

Herr Streicher accused the Jews of attempting to foment a war between Germany and other European powers.

"The Jews are attempting to incite the world to fight Germany," he said. "In the event of war we shall, however, find a fitting place for all the Jews in Germany as well as for those whom we consider servants of the Jews," he added.

Spurns Jewish Aid
The Nazi Commissioner for the Saar, Herr Buereckel, yesterday advised against accepting contributions from Jews for social relief. The Commissioner ordered that all contributions made by Jews toward slum clearance in the Saar be returned to them. It is indeed to accept money from Jews if one objects to Jews on racial grounds," the order of Commissioner Buereckel explains.

Forbids Licensing Jewish Pharmacists

BERLIN, May 5.—A decree issued yesterday by the Minister of Interior prohibits the issuance of licenses for Jewish pharmacists and also to "Aryans" who are married to non-"Aryans." No exemptions may be made for Jewish War Veterans except under special consideration which is to be decided directly by the Minister of the Interior, the decree says.

Nara Bomb Kills Girl on Farm

Man Wounded in Attack on Pioneer Group in Poland

WARSAW, May 5.—Folowkowsky, a Jewish girl, was fatally wounded yesterday and Abraham Rapoport received minor injuries when a bomb was thrown at a Jewish farm in the suburb of Grochow, where young Chaitzlim (pioneers) are being trained as farm hands.

The bomb was thrown by members of a non-Jewish organized group, four of whom were arrested by the police. Prior to the bombing the group attacked the farm with revolvers.

Police authorities are under the impression that those arrested are all members of the anti-Semitic Nara Youth Organization which has been suppressed by the government but which is continuing its activities illegally.

Heat Wave Signs Off, Palestine Signs Relief

The heat wave, which lasted about two weeks, forced the closing down of schools and the cessation of building operations throughout the country.

Nazi Winds Up For Sixth Day On Berne Stand

'Expert' Pauses Briefly to Permit Rebuttal by Baumgartner

BERNE, May 5.—Col. Ulrich Fleischauer, the Nazi expert in the "Protocol" trial, tomorrow will start his sixth consecutive day of testimony in an attempt to prove that the notorious anti-Semitic "Protocols," upon which anti-Semites all over the world build their anti-Jewish propaganda, is not a forgery.

It is expected that Fleischauer will conclude his testimony tomorrow and that the expert for the court, Dr. C. A. Loosli, will then take the stand. The verdict is expected either on Tuesday or Wednesday.

Nazi Interrupted
An interruption in Fleischauer's testimony occurred on Saturday when Dr. Arthur Baumgartner, the pro-Jewish expert at the trial, gave his rebuttal. Dr. Baumgartner summed up the "expert" analysis given by Fleischauer and declared that the Nazi "expert" failed to prove that the "Protocols" are not a forgery.

"It has been proven beyond doubt that the 'Protocols' are nothing but a forgery." (Continued on Page Four)

Pro-Nazi Reich Jew Asks Hitler To Rescind Ban on Flag Flying

BERLIN, May 5.—An appeal against the order prohibiting Jews in Germany from displaying the German flag has been wired directly to Chancellor Hitler by Dr. Max Naumann, leader of the Nazi Jewish group in Germany, it was learned here today.

"The order spells undesired humiliation for thousands of Jews who distinguished themselves during the last World War on the German front and are recipients of the German Cross of Honor," the appeal says.

Cohen Opens 14th Parley With Call to Greater Unity

WASHINGTON, May 5.—Greater Jewish unity in America and stronger action in combating anti-Jewish discrimination in employment in the United States were urged today by Alfred M. Cohen, international president of B'nai B'rith, addressing the opening session of the fourteenth quinquennial B'nai B'rith convention.

The convention opened at the Willard Hotel and will continue through May 8.

In his presidential message today, Mr. Cohen emphasized that he is opposed to the convocation of a World Jewish Congress.

Seeks Union of Agencies
Praising the activities of the Anti-Defamation League which is combating anti-Semitism in America, Mr. Cohen announced that he will continue efforts to unite the American Jewish Committee and the American Jewish Congress in their activities for the benefit of American Jewry.


Mr. Cohen emphasized that many Jewish employers in America are among those who refuse to employ Jewish help. He urged that the B'nai B'rith members undertake it originated to bring together all Jewish bodies interested in combating anti-Semitism in employment "in order to stem a tide which threatens to overwhelm the Jew economically."

Reviews Reich Situation
Reviewing the Jewish situation in Germany and in other European countries, Mr. Cohen emphasized that the B'nai B'rith has done much to help European Jewry. He explained Hitler's coming to power as "the outgrowth of a long continued world depression." He especially recommended support of the good will movement sponsored by the Federal Council of Churches of Christ in America and by the National Conference of Jews and Christians.

"The politician and the policeman will not solve the Jewish problem," he said, "but the preacher and the teacher may. It is from recognition of these basic conditions (Continued on Page Four)

Jews sent copies of the appeal to every member of his organization, emphasizing that he is circulating the text of the appeal direct to the members of his organization so that the German press will publish it.

This appeal should, however, not be given out for foreign distribution," Dr. Naumann warns in his instructions to the members. "The nationally minded German Jews must not increase the painful impression which the order created abroad and must also not arouse any hostile feelings against our kith and kin, the instructions explain."

46 Schools Got Building Loans, JE Reports

\$371,000 Advanced; 30% of Pupils on Free Tuition

A mortgage corporation established by the Jewish Education Association to assist religious schools in building modern structures has issued loans of \$371,000 to 46 institutions, it was disclosed yesterday at the annual meeting of the association at the Jewish Club, 23 West Seventy-third street.

The meeting, attended by several hundred men and women prominent in Jewish communal and educational work, was addressed by Dr. Abraham A. Neumann, professor at Dropsie College of Philadelphia and president of the Congregation Mikveh Israel of that city. Dr. Neumann, discussing the economic and international crisis which the world is passing and its effect on the position of the Jew, declared that the moral and physical survival of the Jew depends on his return "to his own storehouse of faith."

"His must depend the base of his ethical and religious ideals and plant seed the seeds of prophetic vision, which the world is the generation," Dr. Neumann said.

Few Depression Losses

In announcing the amount of loans made by the mortgage corporation, Jacob H. Cohen, president, pointed out that the corporation's losses during the depression have been quite low. Most of the losses, he announced, have turned over by their holdings in the corporation as gifts to the Jewish Education Association.

Forty per cent of the pupils in Jewish religious schools are unable to pay any tuition fees and forty per cent can pay only in part, it was disclosed by Jacob Wiener, secretary of the corporation, on scholarship grants. Children unable to pay are aided largely by the association's scholarship fund which provides tuition for twenty-five per cent of the pupils on the free lists.

Mr. Wiener reported further that for the first time since the beginning of the depression, the present school year has witnessed a cessation in the decrease of school registers. In some schools, he announced, there has even been an increase in the registration.

Other speakers scheduled to address the meeting included Bernard S. Melchior, national secretary of the organization, who was to report on educational activities among Jewish parents; Harry H. Liebowitz, Benjamin Leibell, president of the Y. M. K. A., president of the Y. M. K. A., vice-president, Judge Chan Sweedler and Judge Otto Rosalsky, acting president of the association.

Bronx Temple Group To Honor Schneider

In tribute to Max J. Schneider for his many years of activity as a philanthropist and civic leader, the Bronx division of the Young People's League of the United Jewish People's Order has designated next Tuesday as "Max J. Schneider Day," according to an announcement Friday by Maxwell J. Langford, president of the group.

Max Schneider, president of the National Safety Fund and Trust Company, has been prominently identified with charitable and fraternal organizations and conspicuous in the programs advocated to improve civic conditions in the city. For many years he has been active in non-sectarian philanthropic agencies and was one of the leaders in the movement that resulted in the construction of the \$2,000,000 Bronx Hospital.

"Throughout the year the process of immigration which affected the smaller provincial communities in 1933 was continued. The country towns and villages have been visited by the younger generations, who have either emigrated or sought to find new means of existence in the larger towns. The smaller Jewish communities several instances have been reported where there were no children of school age, and many of the younger were wholly disproportionate number of people of middle age or of advanced years. The Central Committee of Welfare and Reconstruction has continued to make strenuous efforts to grapple with immense difficulties. Further employment for the Jewish youth which remains in Germany depends largely on the continued existence of small Jewish shopkeepers and tradesmen. Accordingly, a system of loan banks has been organized in order to lend support to the small employers of labor whose economic existence is imperiled."

"Efforts have also been made to provide fresh Jewish schools both for the sale of the pupils and for the return to a certain number of Jewish teachers who have been dismissed from their employment in the 'Palestine schools,'" the report continues.

The Kulturbund

"By the creation of the Kulturbund some attempt has been made to provide the Jewish community with cultural performances, lectures and concerts, of which they have been deprived. The Kulturbund's activities also provide some opportunity for employment to Jewish performers who are prevented from appearing at any German theatre or concert hall. All these efforts must continually with hindrances created by local party of government officials."

"Discussing the problem of settling the displaced persons and refugees from Nazi Germany, the report points out that 'world-wide economic depression and unemployment have been responsible for the reluctance of most countries to admit refugees for permanent settlement, and for the poor financial support from all but the Jewish communities to the work of the High Commission. Though much has been done,' it declares. 'The High Commission, however, not yet come to despair from further endeavors. Indeed, the reunion of the Saar with Germany raises a new problem of refugees that may add to the already heavy obligations which the Jews in this and other countries have been called upon to bear.'"

The New Polish Laws

No improvement in the economic situation of Polish Jewry was reported and legislative action had been taken to aggravate the plight of Polish Jewry. The committee reports, especially in regard to Jewish traders and artisans.

"It is stated, 'the rise of a new anti-Semitic National Radical Party, with aims modeled on the Nazi program, created a danger to the community. Its violent methods, which did not stop short of physical attack, led after a time to its suppression by the government. The powerful Democratic Party, which had its anti-Semitic policy unchecked to any material extent by the government; restrictive action by the government is, however, hoped for in spite of the growing accord between Germany and Poland.'"

The Daning Situation

"The Daning Jews are subjected to conditions only slightly better than those in Germany. Although they have due equality of rights, the influence of the influence of the Nazi party and a predominantly Nazi Senate has made the lot of the 8,000 Jewish inhabi-

tants very difficult to bear, harassed as they are by the unscrupulous propaganda of the press and secret boycott methods."

The Board's Palestine committee report describes the need during 1934 for adequate immigration subsidies to assist the further balanced development of the country and expectations raised that the government would relax its restricted estimates of absorptive capacity. Schedules granted, however, it declares, were "disappointing." A supplementary grant of £1,200 certifies that the latter part of the year did not materially improve the situation.

"There were, however, indications that the government was showing increasing understanding of the real importance underlying Jewish effort in Palestine," the report declares.

Missionaries Active

It also reports conferences on the subject of missionary activities in Palestine and the possibility of constructive measures for minimizing their effects on Jewish children.

"The Board's administration report reveals an increase in the number of organizations represented on the Board. On March 1, 1935, there were 347 Deputies representing eighty-nine London synagogues, 126 provincial congregations, nine colonial congregations and fifteen institutions."

Other reports of committees included in the annual report describe many activities of the Board in the regulation and direction of Jewish communal life in general in England.

Prof. Norman Bentwich, associate in the League of Nations High Commission for Refugees will speak at a Big Club Dinner to be held at the Locust Club on the same day Mrs. Lessing J. Rosenwald and Mrs. Morris Wolf, co-chairmen of the women's division of the Philadelphia campaign, will address the evening fund-raising meeting at which the speaker will be Mrs. Norman Bentwich.

Elihu Stone to Address Fitchburg Drive Today

Cohen Calls for New War on Jobs Bias

Order's 14th Parley Opens With Plea for Greater Unity

Hons. for many years cooperated closely with the good will movement in America.

Professions Overcrowded

Mr. Cohen spoke of the protective program of the B'nai B'rith within the United States, and of the necessity for adjusting Jewish youth in America to work other than the professions. He emphasized that distinguished leaders are directing attention to the fact that many of the professions are overcrowded by Jews.

"While these leaders say that discrimination against Jews in professional schools is unfair and un-American, nevertheless for the sake of their own future Jewish youth should seek other means than professions for their later life," Mr. Cohen said. "This advice would be easier to follow if those who give it would direct attention to the callings which men follow for a livelihood in which discrimination against the Jew does not exist."

Jobs Bias Growing

Disclosing that discrimination against Jews in employment is increasing in the United States, the president of the B'nai B'rith stated that "very many employment agencies refuse to take Jewish applicants because, as they say, if they are candid, accepting the application means a loss of time for themselves and the applicant."

"Similar discriminations exist in the engagement of teachers," he said. "In many instances, they will have none of them. The situation has become extremely grave and needs attention before it grows into an irreparable proportion," he warned.

Mr. Cohen then discussed the split in Jewish leadership now existing in American Jewish life. He referred particularly to the differences existing between the American Jewish Committee and the 'American Jewish Congress.

Supports Joint Council

"The American Jewish Committee, the American Jewish Congress and the B'nai B'rith differ in method of organization," he said. "It is idle to expect that either will yield its existence in favor of another, but it is possible for them to reach an understanding from their membership to constitute a jointure that shall speak and act for and in behalf of all Jewish people. The existence of such general concern to the Jew as may interest all Jews, regardless of distinctions which ordinarily divide them."

Mr. Cohen demanded that the Joint Council consisting of representatives of the American Jewish Committee, the American Jewish Congress and the B'nai B'rith be enlarged in its powers and in its jurisdiction."

Staff Enlarged

Speaking of the 'growth and spread of anti-Jewish propaganda," Mr. Cohen reported that this has presented a very great enlargement of the staff and the activities of the Anti-Defamation League. "One cannot help express the wish that in this country of ours there was less need for an Anti-Defamation League," he said, emphasizing however, that today the protective activity of the Anti-Defamation League is of very great importance.

Dinner Marks Young Judaea Silver Jubilee

Move Launched to Stir Jewish Youth to Aid in World Problems

A nation-wide effort to arouse American Jewish youth to the problems confronting the Jewish people in the United States and elsewhere, and to stimulate it to an understanding and appreciation of the historic movement to rebuild Palestine was launched last night at the celebration of the twenty-fifth anniversary of Young Judaea, held at the Grand Street Boys' Club House, West Fifty-fifth street. More than 250 prominent communal leaders were present to observe the Silver Jubilee of this organization.

Among the listed speakers were: Judge Julian W. Mack, honorary chairman of the dinner committee; Dr. David De Sola Pool, Dr. Israel Goldstein, president of the Jewish National Fund; Dr. Louis I. Newman, Mrs. Edward Jacobs, national president of Hadassah; David Levine, national president of Young Judaea; Mrs. A. H. Vixman, executive director; Samuel J. Borowsky, Rabbi Leon S. Lang, and M. Malvwin Fertig, chairman of the dinner committee, who presided.

Inspiration to Youth

Asserting that too many young men and women grow up to fall prey to demagoguery, Dr. Israel Goldstein urged American Jews to support Young Judaea as an organization dedicated to the enlightenment of Jewish youth in its preparation for intelligent and creative effort in public life. "Young Judaea renders a service to the community because it inspires the youth with a purpose,"

Dr. Goldstein said.

Surveying the achievements of Young Judaea, Dr. De Sola Pool, a former president of the organization declared that it was Young Judaea which brought to American Jewry the realization that Jewish education must take precedence over philanthropy.

"Twenty-five years ago Young Judaea was a pioneer in the perception that Jewish education, and not philanthropy was the paramount concern of the Jewish community," Dr. De Sola Pool said. "Today, twenty-five years later, the community has generally accepted the ideology of Young Judaea."

The history of the organization, which was founded in 1910 by the late Dr. Israel Friedlander and Dr. Judah L. Magnes, now chancellor of the Hebrew University in Jerusalem, was related by M. Malvwin Fertig, who declared that Young Judaea has become one of the most vital factors in Jewish life today.

Declaring that "without vision a people perisheth," Mrs. A. H. Vixman urged Jewish communities throughout the United States to support Young Judaea, in order that it may prepare Jewish youth to meet the problems of the future.

ing the plagiarist, the book written by the Frenchman Joly. No serious historian could accept them as a genuine document," Dr. Baumgartner declared, adding that "the history of the preparation of these forgeries is sufficiently well established."

Assures Court

The court need not hesitate in accepting the contention that the "Protocols" are a document forged by the Czarist government to have basis for anti-Jewish discrimination, the Pro-Jewish expert said.

Ridiculing Fleischer's testimony, Dr. Baumgartner pointed out that Fleischer was dominated by passion instead of logic, unfair and indecent tactics. "The people who have given the Bible to the world cannot be as Satanic as pictured by Fleischer," Dr. Baumgartner stated. "With the means used by Fleischer it is possible to slander every people."

Replying to Col. Fleischer's allegations about the existence of a so-called Jewish government, Dr. Baumgartner stated that "if Jews had so much to hide, they would not have retained a non-Jew as an expert who is to make a study of every detail of their activities in order to be prepared for the case."


Dr. Baumgartner attacked Fleischer's citations from the Talmud as being "unscientific and indecent." He accused Fleischer of quoting isolated passages from the Talmud which give a false impression if not given in their full context. Such a method, he said, is not only valueless but is also dishonorable.

Dr. Baumgartner concluded with a satiric reference to Col. Fleischer's objects to the Jewish calling themselves "Chosen People."
