Arabs Warn Palestine on Migration

Youth Body Threatens **Demonstration If** Not Curbed

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) HAIFA, May 12—The Palestine government was threatened today with Arab demonstrations if it does not cease to facilitate Jewish im-

The threat was sounded in the form of a resolution adopted today at a conference here of Arab youth.

The Federation of Arab Youth in Palestine intends also to send a delegation to High Commissioner Wauchope in connection with the immigration problem. The Federation insists that the Palestine government is adopting too liberal a policy towards Jewish immigra-

Plan Curb

In the meantime it became known today that the Palestine governis considering ways and means of checking Jewish immigration, independent of the Arab on a labor certificate.

An investigation is now being considered by the Palestine government as to the actual number of Jewish immigrants who entered on labor certificates with their wives. It is on the basis of this investigation that the government will decide whether the number of immigration visas for Jews under the labor schedule should be increased or decreased in the future.

Author of "In Dorf" Dies in Warsaw at 54

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) WARSAW, May 12—David Kassell, the well known Jewish writer, died here today at the age of 54.

Mr. Kassell was the author of the famous Yiddish novel, "In Dorf." He was also the author of other works which were translated from Yiddish into Russian, German and Danish. In addition to belles-lettres, Kassell wrote many textbooks on Yiddish grammar. He also translated works by English and German writers into Yiddish.

50 Exiles Rap Vainly At Portals of Belgium

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BRUSSELS, May 12.— Fifty German-Jewish refugees returned today to the shores of Belgium from Brazil, unable to find a livelihood there. They were not permitted to land by the Belgian authorities.

The majority of the refugees proceeded to Brazil from countries other than Belgium. Their fate will be decided within a few days. It is believed that those who had migrated from Belgium will be permitted to land while the others will have to return to Brazil on the same steamer without touching Belgian soil.

TelAvi Given Land To Expand

Government Grants City 700 Dunams; 25 New Colonies in Year

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
TEL AVIV, May 12.—The Palestine government has granted to the municipality of Tel Aviv 700 dunams of land to extend the boundaries of this rapidly growing city, it will be announced in the press

Twenty-five new Jewish settlements were established in Pales tine the past year by private and national Jewish capital, it was announced today. Four of these colonies were settled with German-Jewish colonists and are now accommodating 800 Jewish families from Germany

180 Jewish Colonies

Commenting on the expansion of Jewish colonization in Palestine, the Hebrew press today points out that prior to the establishment of these new twenty-five colonies there were 180 Jewish settlements in the Holy Land occupying a territory of 1,300,000 dunams of land.

The land which the Palestine government has granted this city for expansion purposes is located beyond the Yarkon River.

Tel Aviv today is the largest city in Palestine, with a population of approximately 150,000.

The Palestine government is now considering measures to restrict rentals on shops and offices here since growth of the city is resulting in exorbitant rentals. Rentals for dwellings were restricted last year by the government to a maximum of \$12 per room.

'Jew' Libelous To Reich Court

Nazi Leader Fined for So Labelling Writer Who is 'Aryan'

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, May 12.—It is an insult to call a person "Jew" even if it is proven that he is of Jewish origin, a court in Koenigsberg ruled yes terday.

The ruling was issued against the Nazi district leader Otto Raatz, who expressed doubt as to the "Aryan" origin of Dr. Seraphim, a journalist. He called the German journalist "Jew" and was forthwith sued for libel by Dr. Seraphim.

The court yesterday imposed a fine of sixty marks on the Nazi district leader, explaining that he had no right to call anyone "Jew' without having first investigated his origin. Dr. Seraphim submitted evidence that he is a pure "Aryan."

Dr. Grimm, Nazi attorney, sent to Cairo to defend Nazis there in a trial brought by local Jewish leaders for disseminating anti-Jewish propaganda, was received today by Hitler. The German Chancellor thanked the Nazi lawyer for handling the case "in the interests getting it thrown out of court.

Militant Group Is Outlawed

Brith Trumpeldor Put Under Ban; Bucha-· rest U. Reopens

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BUCHAREST, May 12-The gov ernment today prohibited the existence of Brith Trumpeldor, a Zionist youth organization.

The order was issued by the government on the pretext that the group is allegedly engaged in militaristic activities.

Berne Trial Enters 3rd Week Today

Swiss President Rebuffs Nazi 'Expert'; Masons Plan Libel Suit

BERNE, May 12.—With the "Protocols" trial entering its third week tomorrow, and with the verdict expected Monday or Tuesday, it became known today that Col. Fleischauer, the Nazi expert, made a special visit to M. Marcel Pilet, Golaz, President of the Swiss Federal Government, and lodged a complaint with him against the Berne court "for permitting Dr. Loosli, the court's expert, to use libelous By Rumania language against Germany during his testimony at the trial."

The President retorted to Col. Fleischauer that "Switzerland is not yet Gleichgeschaltet." M. Pilet-Golaz then pointed out to the Nazi 'expert" from Germany that the courts in Switzerland are independent, and that he would be better advised to make his complaints directly to the court.

Masons to Sue "Expert"

The Jewish Telegraphic Agency learns that the Masonic lodge here intends to bring action against Col. Fleischauer, charging him with libel and with deliberate falsification of facts during his "expert" testimony at the "Protocols" trial.

Summing up the legal aspects of the charges, which Jewish leaders in Switzerland brought against the Swiss Nazis for spreading the notorious anti-Semitic "Protocols," Prof. Matti, one of the lawyers at the trial, in his address before the court on Saturday declared that not only are the forged "Protocols" spread by the Nazis, but that "all anti-Semitic literature in Switzerland bears a Berlin stamp."

Child Mortality Rate Falls in Jerusalem

(Tewish Telegraphic A JERUSALEM, May 12-A marked decrease in the mortality rate of infants and children up to the age of four is reported here by the Hadassah Medical Organization after a survey made in five Infant Welfare Stations in Jerusalem.

The survey shows that among 4,513 children registered in 1934 in these stations, there were 133 deaths, which is approximately three per cent, as compared with five per cent in 1931.

Selecting Jewish Farmers

It is difficult to understand why the Palestine Jewish delegation which is now on a mission in Poland to select Jewish farm hands for Palestine, has chosen as candidates such Jewish peasants as possess their own land in Poland.

When moving Jews from Poland to Palestine or any other country, the logical principle to follow would be to give the poorer portion of the Jewish population the opportunity of emigration and not those who still have something to exist on.

In the case of the first group of Jewish farmers who were selected by the Palestine delegation from the Jewish colonists in Volhynia, this principle seems not to have been observed. Mr. Zitkov, the delegate from Palestine, preferred to choose Jewish peasants in Volhynia who own land, rather than farmhands who are only laborers.

A False Path

The path which Mr. Zitkov has followed is especially surprising considering that he is a delegate from the Palestine Laborites. True as it may be that certain elements in Palestine would like to have workers on their plantations, people who are not real proletarians, the Laborites in Palestine do not by any means belong to those elements.

It is possible that Mr. Zitkov was motivated in his selection more by the interests of Palestine than by the interests of Polish Jewry. In this case, injustice is done to the really poor Jewish population of Poland. If the principle of giving preference in emigration to those who have no prospects of earning a livelihood in Poland is not observed, then the Jewish community of Poland will grow poorer and poorer while the richer elements of the Jewish population there will gradually leave the country,

Planned Emigration Required

The Jewish situation in Poland today requires planned emigration. If anyone is to be given assistance to leave the country, whether for Palestine or any other land, it is first of all the youth, that has no future and no prospects of work-the youth that is being trained and adjusted by the ORT, by the Hehalutz and by ether organizations, to farm work and artisanship.

The removal of Jews from Poland should be considered a Jewish national duty, from which the impoverished elements are to benefit before those who still have means to remain at home. Jewish farmers in Volhynia, or any other part of Poland; who still pessess land sufficient to provide bread for them, should not be touched, no matter how valuable their experience in farm work may be to Palestine. Instead of them, the poorer elements among the Jewish landworkers in Poland-those who have nothing to leave behind them—should be considered.

Social Justice Essential

It is difficult to judge from a distance why the first group of Jewish farmers to be taken from Poland to Palestine happens to consist of landowners. We hope that social justice will be practiced in the future when selecting other groups of Jewish farmhands for Palestine. Let the poor Jews be helped to find ther way from Poland to other lands. The richer elements will find their way themselves.

World Press Digest

Streicher Has An Apt Pupil

The "New York Post," commenting on the renewed anti-Jewish drive in Germany, says:

Bavaria is indulging in new orgies of anti-Semitism. Dr. Springer, newly appointed Nazi propaganda chief in that district, received his political training in Nuremberg, where Julius Streicher holds sway. In his hatred for the Jew he excels his master. On April 30 he delivered himself of an address in which he charged the members of that race with responsibility for those who lost their lives in the Bavarian Soviet revolution.

"These Germans were killed," he cried, "by order of world Jewry. No one should be astonished if we want to drive men of this race from Germany. . . . On the following morning all Jewish shops in Nuremberg were pla-carded with stickers: "Jews are our misfortune, Perish the Jews!"

In some cases Nazis etched anti-Semitic slogans into large window panes of such stores with corrosive acid. When business men complained they were asked to prefer specific charges against the guilty parties. That ended the investigation. . . .

Planning Social Welfare Program

Notes and News, the publication issued by the National Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds and the Bureau of Jewish Social Research, commenting on Jewish community planning, says:

This emergence of lay leadership and the purposefulness of its direction, offers most heartening proof of the vitality of Jewish social wel-

Particularly encouraging has been the caliber of discussions of the lay and professional leadership at regional meetings and other conferences. Discussion has become more progressive and realistic. In nearly every community there are to be found evidences of a lieightened interest, evidenced in more energetic fund-raising efforts for lo-Jewish Federations,

Thousands of orders have been received from all parts of the country by the national office of Hadassah for trees to be planted in Palestine as a Mother's Day observance, it was announced yesterday by Mrs. Eudice Elkind Bernstein, chairman of the Jewish National Fund Council of Hadassah.

"The idea of planting a tree as a tribute to a mother is most appealing to American Jewish women", Mrs. Bernstein said. "Rather than present a mother with an ephemeral gift the donor plants a tree in Palestine that becomes a permanent gift to the Jewish homeland and a permanent tribute to the person honored."



9th Annual Perley to Discuss League's Reorganization

A plan for the reorganization of the Metropolitan League of Jewish Community Associations will be the main order of business at the League's ninth annual convention, to be held Thursday at the Y.M. H.A., West 110th Street. The League is the central agency for forty-three Y.M. and Y.W.H.A.'s and other Jewish Centers in Greater New York, Westchester and Long and, with a combined member hip of more than 100,000.

The proposed plan, according to M. Maldwin Fertig, president of the League, is the result of a year's study made by joint committees representing the Jewish Welfare Board, the League, and the Metropolitan Association of Jewish Center Workers. It will be submitted to lay and professional delegates of the constituent societies attending the convention.

Approved by J. W. B.

The plan was recently approved in principle by the executive committee of the Jewish Welfare Board, the national organization of Jewish Centers, of which Judge Irving Lehman is president. Under the plan, the Metropolitan League will be known as the Metropolitan Divion of the Jewish Welfare Board. rhe new governing board will be composed of delegates of the Jewish Welfare Board, representatives of the constituent societies and delegates of the Metropolitan Assoation of Jewish Center Workers. The convention will be opened by

a public dinner attended by the delegates and alternates, members of the League's administrative council, and interested laymen and cen ter workers.

A panel discussion on "Jewish Centers and Public Issues" is included in the educational program of the convention. The discussion will be led by Samuel Kaufman of Mt. Vernon. 

Chanin Named President of Workmen's Circle: Baskin Reelected

Unification of all campaigns conducted among Jewish labor organizations in America for Jewish activity in Palestine, Soviet Russia, Poland and other foreign lands, is demanded in a resolution adopted at the thirty-fourth annual convention of the Workmen's Circle, which concluded its sessions Saturday after electing N. Chanin as president. J. Baskin was reelected general secretary and B. Levitan, national treasurer.

The convention, which represented more than 70,000 organized members of the Workmen's Circle throughout the country, voted to contribute \$61,000 to various social and labor organizations and campaigns. Four hundred delegates signed a petition demanding freedom for the Yiddish language in Palestine.

Dubious on Zionism

Expressing satisfaction at the fact that Palestine has in the past few years become a place where many oppressed Jews from European countries can find refuge, the convention emphasized in its resolution that it does not believe that Zionism can solve the Jewish question. "The Jewish working masses in Palestine deserve our attention, but not to any larger extent than the needy Jewish masses in other countries," the resolution states.

Urging that the Geverkschaften campaigns for Palestine be united with the campaign conducted here by the ORT to help the Jews in Poland and Soviet Russia, the convention instructed its new Executive to call a conference of all organizations engaged in soliciting relief funds in America for needy working masses in Europe, and to insist that all these organizations unite into one large body.


The Nazi lawyer Ursprung, in his address before the court, appealed for acquittal of the Swiss Nazis who are being sued for spreading the forged "Protocols."


