Gag in Death
Of UllsteinForbid His Own Papers
To Print Obituary
Of Publisher

BERLIN, May 16—An example of the tragic situation of the Jews in Germany was given to the world by the Nazis today when newspapers published by the so-called Ullstein Haus, one of the largest newspaper publishing concerns in the world, were forbidden to carry an obituary on the death of Hans Ullstein, Jewish founder of the firm.

Herr Ullstein, who died last night, was 76 years old. Although officially he was still one of the leading directors of the concern, the Nazis long since had seized control of the many newspapers and magazines published by the "Ullstein Haus," one of the largest newspapers, the Vossische Zeitung and the Tempo, were liquidated by the Nazis last year.

Oldest of 5 Brothers

Herr Ullstein was the oldest of the five Ullstein brothers who in the course of generations developed a string of newspapers in Germany which were considered among the best in Europe. The Morgenzeitung, one of the Ullstein papers still in existence, enjoys even today, under the Nazis, the largest circulation in the country.

The Ullstein Haus also maintained a world-wide news service with a network of correspondents in the principal cities of the world. This service, however, was liquidated by the Nazis when they came into power. It is estimated that the Ullstein business at one time was worth approximately \$25,000,000. The Nazis, however, ruined it within the first year of their coming to power.

No Bar on Jews
In Budapest U.,
Officials AverDeny Medical School
Has Introduced 'Aryan
Paragraph'

BUDAPEST, May 15—The Budapest University today issued a denial that the "Aryan Paragraph" has been introduced in the Medical College along the same lines as in Germany, in order to prevent Jews from studying medicine.

The denial was made after a report appeared in a Hungarian newspaper that at a session of the medical faculty of the university, it was decided to follow the example of the Nazis in Germany and accept as students only such applicants as can trace their "Aryan" origin back to three generations.

Report Baseless

"This report is absolutely baseless," the denial states, emphasizing that no limitations have been considered for non-Aryan students and that the medical faculty of the university includes a large proportion of Jewish professors.

The new Hungarian Parliament now has seven Jewish deputies, as compared with nine in the previous parliament, it was revealed here this week when the list of the new parliamentarians was made public.

The seven are: Dr. Gyorki, Dr. Weltner and Dr. Buchinger, Social Democrats; Paul Sandor, who is the Dean of the House, Dr. Ernst Brody, Dr. Bela Fabian and Dr. Johann Vazsonyi, the son of the first Jewish Hungarian Minister of Justice, Dr. Wilhelm Vazsonyi, who was also the founder of the Democratic Party in Hungary.

Ask Britain
To Push Aid
For ExilesPermanent Office at
Geneva Urged on
Sir John Simon

LONDON, May 16—An imposing deputation consisting of British statesmen and representatives of all faiths, including Chief Rabbi Dr. Hertz, appeared today before Sir John Simon, the British Foreign Minister, and asked him to urge the League of Nations to include the problem of German-Jewish refugees within the scope of its work.

The delegation proposed that Great Britain support a proposal that the League create a permanent organization in Geneva to handle the problem of thousands of refugees spread over Europe and Asia. The delegation pointed out that the plight of these refugees is constantly increasing.

Want League Office

Apprehension was expressed by the deputation with regard to the contemplated liquidation of the Nansen office. The group explained that the maintenance costs which the governments will incur in a permanent League organization at Geneva for handling the refugee problems will be the only contribution necessary.

The delegation was headed by Prof. Gilbert Murray. It included Lord Cecil, Lady Simon, Chief Rabbi Hertz, representatives of the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Quakers' organization, the League of National Union and other organizations.

Lord Cecil, speaking for the delegation, emphasized that the problem of the refugees must be dealt with by the League in a more effective manner than now. It is impossible to allow the present situation of the refugees to continue without danger of great disturbances, he pointed out.

Sir John Simon, replying, stated that the creation of a special organ-

Reich Expels
Times EmployeeHead of Photo Service in
Berlin is Accused of
Criticizing Nazis

BERLIN, May 16—Julius Bolgar, business manager of the New York Times Photo Service in Berlin, was today ordered to leave Germany within five days.

"Bolgar, who is a Hungarian Jew, has repeatedly given expression to his criticism and unfriendly attitude towards the leaders of our government. His remaining in Germany is therefore undesirable," an official explanation of the government office states.

Mr. Bolgar, together with his family, will leave Germany tonight. The order for his deportation came as a surprise.

Jean Arent Named
Soviet Consul Here

MOSCOW, May 16—Jean Arent, formerly First Secretary in the Soviet Embassy in Paris, was appointed today by the Soviet government as Consul-General for the United States.

Mr. Arent, a Jew, is one of the ablest of the Soviet diplomats. He has been in the diplomatic service for many years. Recently he was the editor of the Journal de Moscow, a Soviet publication in the French language.

Palestine Acts
To Curb Entry
From SyriaDemands Special Visas
For Jews Going to
Transjordan

JERUSALEM, May 16—While thousands of Arabs from Syria are pouring into Palestine every day illegally and on seasonal permits, the Palestine government today demanded that the government of Syria see to it that Syrian Jews proceeding to Transjordan be supplied with special passports to prevent their entry from Transjordan to Palestine.

In putting forward this demand, the Palestine government stated that Syrian Jews going to Transjordan are proceeding chiefly to the Transjordan resort of Hamager, which is in the vicinity of the Jordan River, right on the Palestine border. It is for the purpose of Palestine immigration control that such passports are essential for Syrian Jews, the Palestine government points out in its memorandum to the Syrian government.

It has been estimated that approximately 60,000 Arabs from Syria entered Palestine within the past year. The Governor of the Syrian province of Hauran, in a press interview, admitted that from his district about 35,000 Arabs had left for Palestine as a result of bad crops. Many Arabs also entered Palestine from Damascus and other parts of Syria.

Probe at
Rutgers May
Start OthersOther Colleges Charged
With Permitting
Propaganda

Nation-wide interest was shown yesterday in the charges that anti-Semitic literature is being distributed in the German department of the Women's College branch of Rutgers University by members of the faculty of this department.

The American Civil Liberties Union has been invited to participate in the inquiry launched by the board of trustees into the charges made by Prof. Leinard Bergel who was dismissed from the German department because, as he claims, he tried to combat the Nazi propaganda there.

Students Defend Bergel

Dr. F. J. Hauptman, head of the department, continued to insist yesterday that Prof. Bergel was dropped for reasons of economy and efficiency. Students of the university, however, substantiated Prof. Bergel's charges that the members of the German faculty used the classrooms for propaganda for Hitler and for spreading anti-Jewish literature among the students.

The State of New Jersey is also expected to take part in the investigation of the charges since a new law was recently passed making it a misdemeanor to spread Nazi propaganda in New Jersey.

The Rutgers case, it is being predicted, may lead to a wide investigation affecting other colleges where it is alleged anti-Jewish propaganda is being conducted by professors as Nazi agents, as reported by Dr. A. L. Sachar, head of the Hillel Foundations, at the recent convention of the B'nai B'rith in Washington.

A petition signed by more than 400 of the 900 students in the Women's College has been submitted to the Rutgers University administration, urging the reappointment of Dr. Bergel, emphasizing that he is one of the best teachers in the college and that his efficiency could not be questioned.

The Campus News, Rutgers student organ, publishes today a num-

Train Wedding Proves Futile,
Palestine Deports Two Sisters

JERUSALEM, May 16—The two sisters, Guella and Helena Greenberg, who were married yesterday on a train speeding between Jerusalem and Haifa, by Jewish young men who are Palestine citizens, were nevertheless deported today from Palestine as illegal entrants, despite the fact their marriage to Palestine citizens entitles them automatically to permanent legal residence.

"The marriage ceremony on the train is in complete accordance

with the Jewish religion and with the laws of Palestine," the Chief Rabbinate of Palestine stated today to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, in commenting on the deportation of the two newly married Jewish girls.

Legal steps will be taken by interested parties to contest the deportation order of the Immigration Department. The double train ceremony was performed in the presence of witnesses, in full compliance with the laws of the country.

Polish Jews Set Four Weeks
Of Mourning for Pilsudski

WARSAW, May 16—A four-week period of mourning in memory of Marshal Josef Pilsudski was proclaimed today by the Warsaw Rabbinate for all the Jews of Poland.

No Jewish marriages are to take place during these four weeks.

All Jewish stores and factories received orders today from the Jewish Community of Warsaw to be closed all day tomorrow during the transfer of Pilsudski's remains to Cracow. All synagogues will keep candles lighted the entire day.

During the Jewish month of mourning for Pilsudski special prayers will be held in all syna-

gogues of Poland three times a week, on the Sabbath, Monday and Thursday.

A telegram of condolence on the death of Marshal Josef Pilsudski was sent to the Polish Embassy in Washington by the American Jewish Committee. The message praised the Marshal's "opposition to all chauvinistic movements seeking to sow discord among the varied elements composing the population of Poland" and expressed the hope that "his exalted principles will continue to guide the people and their leaders."

Schochtim Trouble in Chicago

CHICAGO.

At a meeting of the Chicago Schochtim Union, the chicken slaughterers, President Gorman of the Amalgamated Meat Cutters Union, of which the Schochtim Union is a member, announced that all officials of the local union, with the exception of the financial secretary, were deposed from office. Two officials of the Federation of Jewish Unions, M. Siskind of the Writers Union and N. Lerner of the Typographical Union, took over the business affairs of the Schochtim Union.

Mr. Gorman stated that the affairs of the union were in a chaotic state, with the old officers permitting members who already had positions to take on additional stores, while many schochtim were jobless. He said that the Amalgamated previously had warned the officers of the union to clean up conditions, but that nothing had been done to redeem promises that were made.

Orthodox Perturbed

As may be expected, President Gorman's action has provoked a storm in Orthodox circles. The Mercaz Ha'Rabbonim, the organ of the Orthodox rabbinate, points out that the leaders of the Schochtim Union had been warned before the Passover holidays about unsatisfactory conditions in the union, and had been called to a "Beth Din" to settle the outstanding trouble. Instead of this, the affairs of the Schochtim Union, an organization which is closely bound with the Orthodox religious practices, is now in all intents and purposes in non-Jewish hands.

At a meeting called by the Mercaz Ha'Rabbonim and attended by 135 of the 150 members of the Schochtim Union, Rabbi Ezriel Epstein, dean of the Chicago Orthodox rabbinate and president of the Mercaz Ha'Rabbonim, denounced as unmitigated falsehoods reports that the rabbis sought to institute a "Korobka," a tax on meat, through seizing control of the Schochtim Union. At a meeting of the union, held later, an attempt was made by leaders of the Jewish Federation of Unions to paint the rabbis' efforts as an attempt to seize control of the union.

Schochtim Warned

Commenting on the situation, a well known Jewish leader, who asked that his name be withheld, declared that time and again warnings have been given the Orthodox rabbis of Chicago and those interested in Kashruth not to permit the schochtim to become a labor organization.

"No matter how one may look at it," he says, "the slaughtering of chickens, according to Jewish law and tradition, has from time immemorial been considered a religious endeavor, a sacred profession. Nowhere in Jewish history can be found a record of schochtim organizing themselves on the same plane as cloak operators, cigar makers, pressers and bricklayers. No one would deny the schochtim the privileges of organization to protect themselves against abuses, but a labor union; that is something different."

Attacks High Rates

At present, he charges, these schochtim constitute nothing less than a "Korobke"—charging an exorbitant rate for killing chickens. He points out that to charge twelve cents for the killing of a chicken, the highest price in the entire country, is unreasonable as well as unwarranted. If the Orthodox rabbis of Chicago would apply some business methods to this Kosher chicken killing business, he states, organize it on a proper scale, see that it is managed honestly and efficiently, the schochtim would be satisfied; the Chicago community would have a direct income which would enable the Talmud Torahs to function, Hebrew teachers would be paid a living wage, and there would be sufficient money left for many communal needs.

Chicago slaughters an average of 80,000 kosher chickens every week, our informant estimates, the income on which is \$9,600, or in round figures \$500,000 per year. There are about 150 schochtim in the union, some earning \$75 and \$100 a week and other members only \$10 to \$20 a week. This is unfair, he states, and suggests that every one of the chicken slaughterers be employed at the rate of \$45 a week. Since the work usually is done in three days of the week, the salary seems sufficient. A commission should be set up to collect the twelve-cent fees, pay the salaries of the slaughterers, and have a fund of \$150,000 left over annually to provide adequately for the religious needs of the community.

Judge William M. Lewis, chairman of the arrangements committee, will be toastmaster.

Revised Jewish Divorce Law

The change in the divorce law adopted by the Rabbinical Assembly of America deserves nothing but praise. It is sure to be followed in Poland where there are thousands of deserted Jewish women, as well as in other parts of Europe.

This change, which makes it possible for a woman who has been deserted for a period of three years or who has not been supported by her husband for that period, to obtain a divorce without any further difficulties, will be studied, we are certain, by American social workers and in American courts as one means of solving divorce complications.

Divorce Under Contract

According to the decision of the Rabbinical Assembly, Jewish young men in America, when they marry, must sign a contract giving the wife the right to obtain a divorce should the husband absent himself for three years or fail to support his family for at least that period.

Such an innovation in the traditional procedure of Jewish religious divorces will be welcomed by the most orthodox Jewish leaders all over the world. The problem of the deserted wife who has not heard from her husband for years and is thus prevented from divorcing him, has been a source of concern to rabbis and spiritual leaders for many years. There are today thousands of Jewish women in Poland, in Rumania and in other countries of Europe who have not heard from their husbands since the war.

Restoring Life to Many

Unaware of the fate of their husbands, these unfortunate women, called Agunoth, were destined, under the traditional Jewish laws of marriage and divorce, to spend their entire lives alone. They could never remarry as long as it had not been established that their husbands were dead. Furthermore, even if their husbands were alive they could not obtain a divorce without the husband's consent, no matter how many years he had been away from home.

A Blessing to Women

This cruel procedure which made the wife dependent on the good will of the husband who had deserted her, has for years been a matter of international correspondence between rabbis of different countries. Every rabbi in the world felt that something should be done to modify the law since the welfare of thousands of Jewish women was involved.

The Rabbinical Assembly deserves credit for being the first to take a practical step in this direction. The modification now introduced into the Jewish religious divorce law by the Rabbinical Assembly will be a blessing to many Jewish women. It will restore life in many Jewish homes by enabling deserted women to remarry without fear of committing bigamy.

A Model for Court

The Jewish divorce law has always been considered a model one even in the courts. Only recently a special parliamentary committee in England, assigned to investigate the existing methods of divorce, came to the conclusion that the Jewish divorce law was the best.

The only defect in the Jewish divorce law was the provision that a wife could never be divorced if she did not know the whereabouts of her husband in order to obtain his consent to the action. This defect has now been remedied by the decision of the Rabbinical Assembly of America.

World Press Digest

Says Nazis Will Ignore 'Protocols' Verdict

The New York Times, in an editorial comment on the outcome of the "Protocols" trial in Berne, says:

The notorious "Protocols of the Elders of Zion" are now declared by a Swiss tribunal to be what honest and enlightened men have long known them to be, an impudent forgery and a libel. . . .

It is a gain to have the "Protocols" stamped for the vicious lie they are by a court of law after exhaustive hearings. But it is not to be expected that the Swiss verdict will silence the criminal agitators who resort to such weapons. In this year 1935 and in the land of Kant and Goethe it is possible for a lunatic named Streicher to stand up, with government approval, and declare that the Wassermann test was invented by Jews who need Christian blood for their ritual. It will be mere child's play for Streicher to "prove" that the Swiss judge was hired to brand the "Protocols" a forgery by the same Jews who wrote the Treaty of Versailles and dominated the Stresa conference.

Mourns Passing Of Oldest 'Sofer'

The London Daily Express, commenting on the death of Jacob Michael Berg, the oldest Jewish "sofer" in England, says:

Michael the Sofer is dead, aged 100 years.

Another gap appears in the thinning ranks of one of Jewry's rarest and most famous professions.

Jacob Michael Berg, of Manchester, was known all over the world as an expert scribe. There are believed to be less than a dozen left in England.

He was carrying on a profession dating back to the time of Ezra the Scribe more than 2,000 years ago.

Manchester Jewry knew him as Michael the Sofer—"Sofer" being the Hebrew for scribe. His long, grey beard and venerable appearance were famous. His work was the writing of the Scrolls of the Law. These consist of the five Books of Moses—the Pentateuch.

Wine and Toppers Of Bible Days

Under the headline, "Wet and Dry in Ancient Jewry," The Free-thinker, a British publication, philosophizes as follows:

In those robust ages, when an hundred years was little more than infancy, tope appears to have done no harm whatever to the human frame. Centuries later, however, it was otherwise; and hence we find the gay King Solomon describing from personal experience the melancholy effects of excessive vinosity. (Prov. xxiii. 29-35.) Isaiah pronounces woe upon those who, to drink strong wine and to enjoy festive music, rise up early and sit up late; but his reason for condemning their habits is that they allow no time for regarding "the work of the Lord," and for considering "the operation of his hands." Subsequently in the same chapter, he pronounces woe upon the strong, whose strength takes the form of a capacity to drink wine in profusion without the ordinary disadvantages. Here again his reason is one not likely to be alleged by modern advocates of bibulous restraint. It is that these strong drinkers of strong drink take bribes to the advantage of the guilty and to the prejudice of the innocent.

Hirschfeld Dies In Nice at 67; Sex Authority Institute He Founded In Berlin Wrecked By Nazis

PARIS, May 16—Dr. Magnus Hirschfeld, the eminent German Jewish authority on sexual problems and pioneer advocate of sexual reform, died late last night in Nice, France, at the age of 67.

Dr. Hirschfeld had been living in France as an exile since the Nazis came into power in Germany. He was compelled to flee from Germany after the Institute of Sexual Reform in Berlin, which he organized in 1918 and which was later taken over by the Prussian government and renamed the Magnus Hirschfeld Institute, was raided and destroyed by the Nazis. The Nazis also banned Hirschfeld's scientific books and burned them in a public bonfire.

Devoted Life to Specialty
Dr. Hirschfeld was born May 14, 1868, in Kolberg an der Ostsee. He studied in the Universities of Strassburg, Munich, Berlin, Heidelberg, and Wuerzburg and devoted his life to study of sexual problems. He was often called in Germany as an expert witness in famous trials, including one which involved personages in the immediate entourage of the ex-Kaiser. To the Nazis his name was poison.

Himself a Jew, Dr. Hirschfeld maintained that the Jewish idea of the family has been a tremendous influence for good in modern life, since it emphasizes the creation of normal family relations. Father, mother and child—that is the most important entity in the world, was the basis of his theory. He maintained that this brings human satisfaction, ethically, biologically and physically.

Dr. Hirschfeld visited America several years ago. During his visit he urged that Jewish religious leaders should make "some compromise" in relation to the question of birth control. He is the author of many works which are considered standard books on sex analysis and sex psychology.

nization by the League of Nations involves the decision of the League in principle, since the League is now not treating the refugee question as a permanent problem.

"The British government will do nothing to obstruct the creation of a permanent organization in Geneva by the League for handling the refugees. I am, however, not able to state at present what attitude the government may adopt," Sir John informed the delegation. "Any well founded proposal will certainly have sympathetic consideration," he added.


