

Nazis Win 70 Seats in Czech Vote

Will Have Largest Bloc In House; 2 Jews Are Victors

PRAHA, May 20—The Nazis will comprise the largest faction in the new Czechoslovakian Parliament, but the inclusion of their representatives in a coalition government is entirely out of the question, it was authoritatively stated today by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency.

PRAHA, May 20—Two Jews were elected to the Czechoslovakian Parliament in the general election yesterday, according to the complete returns today.

Those elected are: Dr. Angelo Goldstein of Praha, former member of the Parliament, and Chaim Kugel of Munkacsvo, a director of the Hebrew High School there. The election on a joint ticket of the Czechoslovakian Socialist Party and the Jewish Party.

While the returns show that the Czech parties have obtained in this election practically the same results as in the previous election, the German Democratic parties have suffered heavy losses.

Nazis Gain Votes
Nearly one-half of the votes which the Democratic tickets of the German population in Czechoslovakia received in the last election, this time went to the anti-Semitic Nazi party led by Konrad Henlein. It is estimated that Henlein's party may now have 70 seats in the new Parliament.

The sweeping victory which Herr Henlein achieved came as a surprise even to the most competent political observers. In some districts of Czechoslovakia, especially those located near Silesia, Henlein's party took about eighty per cent of the entire German vote. Henlein is known in Czechoslovakia as "Goetz and Hitler" and his party is called the Sudeten German party.

The Czechoslovakian Parliament consists of 400 seats in the lower house and 150 in the senate. It was predicted here today that no Germans will be represented in the government despite the large vote obtained by the Henlein party.

Polish Jews Cancel Lag B'Omer Fetes

WARSAW, May 20—For the first time in the history of the Jews in Poland, Lag B'Omer will not be celebrated tomorrow, as an expression of mourning for Marshal Josef Pilsudski.

Celebration of the holiday was scheduled in all Jewish schools throughout the country. Plans for outings and special gatherings were completed several days before Marshal Pilsudski died. The celebrations were cancelled in connection with the decision of the Rabbinate to observe a four-week period of mourning for Pilsudski.

Lawrence View On Arab Riots Is Disclosed

Told Agency Aide 400 Police Could Protect Palestine Jews

LONDON, May 20—"With 400 decent British policemen in Palestine the Jews need not fear any Arab riots," was the opinion once voiced by Col. T. B. Lawrence, the "Lawrence of Arabia," whose funeral services will be held tomorrow at Moreton, near the cottage where he lived.

This opinion of Lawrence's is disclosed today in the Manchester Guardian in an article by L. B. Namier, former political secretary of the Jewish Agency.

Mr. Namier states that Lawrence supported Zionist aims and was a friend of the Jews. He was ready to testify in favor of the Zionists before the British Cabinet in 1930, following the anti-Jewish riots of 1929 in Palestine but was not called.

Mr. Namier also discloses that Lawrence told him that the Cairo conference of 1921 decided to merge Transjordan with Palestine and open Transjordan to Jewish immigration. Circumstances, however, forced the continuance of Transjordan as a native State under British protection, in order to prevent the French from obtaining control over it.

"If you had 400 decent British policemen in Palestine there would have been no trouble for the Jews there," Col. Lawrence said to Namier after the anti-Jewish massacre of 1929, according to Namier's article in the Manchester Guardian today.

Greece Bars Race Attack In the Press

Decree Is Prompted by Approach of National Elections

SALONICA, May 20—A decree prohibiting the press from making references against any religion was issued here today by the government.

The decree aims to prevent anti-Jewish propaganda throughout the country, in connection with the forthcoming parliamentary elections in June.

It is announced in the press today that the Jews of Janina will vote separately from the rest of the population during the elections.

The election campaign is now beginning to assume a lively character.

The government party is counting on winning all the Jewish votes since it has exhibited its pro-Jewish attitude on numerous occasions. It was with the help of the Jewish votes that the government party won a majority in the last elections, which infuriated the anti-Semitic elements in the country.

Charities Get Record Bequest

2 British Groups Given \$1,250,000 by Will of Henry David

LONDON, May 20—The largest bequest ever made to Jewish charities was announced today when the will of Henry Skellid David was made public.

The David will bequeaths \$1,250,000 to various Jewish institutions. The bulk of this sum is to be shared equally by the Anglo-Jewish Association and the Jewish Board of Guardians.

The will stipulates that the Anglo-Jewish Association spend the money to send promising students from Iraq to study in European countries. The Jewish Board of Guardians is to use its share for general charitable work.

1,000 to Honor Moritz Neuman, 80

About 1,000 persons are expected to gather tonight at the Ohav Zion, 520 West 115th Street, to honor Moritz Neuman, honorary president of the congregation and actively connected with the synagogue for sixty years, on the occasion of his eightieth birthday.

Speakers who are listed to appear will include Alderman Judge Bernard S. Deutsch, Judge Gustav Hartman, Rabbi William Margolis, William Weiss, Morton Baum and Max S. Rosenfeld, president of the congregation.

Students to Police Rumanian Colleges

BUCHAREST, May 20—An ingenious plan to maintain order in Rumanian universities was evolved today by the authorities, who organized a special police force of students.

The force will be chosen by the student body, thus making all students of the universities responsible for any outbreaks such as the recent anti-Jewish clashes. The student policemen, who will enter upon their duties next semester, will be entrusted with maintaining order within the university grounds.

Reich Imposes 'Aryan' Clause On Veterans

Dentists Must Prove Non-Jewish Origin To Retain Posts

BERLIN, May 20—New restrictions for Jewish dentists in Germany, from which the war veterans were exempt, will now be applied even to Jews who fought in the world war, it is announced today in the official Reichsgazette.

The announcement states that every dentist who wishes to work in the panel system will henceforth have to prove his "Aryan" origin and also that his wife is an "Aryan." No exceptions will be made even of war veterans.

The announcement adds that Jewish war veterans who were permitted to practice dentistry in the panel system prior to February, will still be able to continue their practice there.

56 More Lose Vote
The feelings of German Jewry after two-and-a-half years of Nazi rule are described in an article in the Central-Veren Zeitung, the organ of the non-Zionists in Germany.

"We see flowers and processions and the banners which we are not allowed to fly, and we have to stand aside," the article written by the editor of the paper says. "We cannot join in the rejoicing of the German people. We who have borne the grief of this people as our own grief. But we feel all the closer together in that room that is allowed to us. This is our world now, this small German Jewry, these few people oppressed by a load of anxieties; and yet we shall not let this load crush us to the ground, or double rob us of our courage."

Visa Pact Sought With Revisionists

Agency Executive Aims To Foretell Separate Action by Rebels

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
JERUSALEM, May 20—Negotiations were started today between the Executive of the Jewish Agency and the Revisionist Executive in the hope of reaching an understanding with regard to immigration certificates for members of the Zionist Revisionist Party, in order to prevent the rebel party from undertaking direct negotiations with the Palestine government.

The Executive is represented at the negotiations by Isaac Gruenbaum, head of the immigration department. The Revisionists are represented by Dr. Hoffman, member of the World Revisionist Executive.

Pact to Bind All Units

It was understood at the very beginning of the negotiations that whatever agreement reached will go into immediate effect and will be valid for all groups affiliated with the Revisionist movement, including the Brith Trumpeldor, the Brith Hachail and the Revisionist Arians Organization.

The Executive came to the negotiations with a concrete proposal. The Revisionists, after hearing the Executive's proposal, presented by Mr. Gruenbaum today, are now preparing counter proposals.

In the meantime, the Executive conceded the allocation of immigration certificates from the current labor schedule to members of the Revisionist Organization and to members of the Brith Trumpeldor, in accordance with the proportion of Revisionists in the Hachakara training farms of agricultural workers for Palestine. The Zionist Executive has also conceded a point in recognizing the right of the Brith Trumpeldor to receive collective immigration certificates. The negotiations are being continued.

Agency Confirms Report Of Curb on Families

Party Politics in the Gemeinde

BERLIN.

The Liberal faction which has been administering the affairs of the Berlin Jewish Community organization with a remarkable degree of success, has replied to the German Zionist Federation which, supported has demanded reorganization of the Jewish community in order to give the Zionist elements full control of the gemeinde's board is only one part of the Zionist objectives proclaimed at the recent conference of the organization as complete direction of all gemeinde Jewish life. But it is evident that the battle will be fought out first in the Berlin Jewish community.

Deny Zionist Contention

The Liberals deny the Zionist assertion that reconstitution of the community is in accordance with the sentiment of the Jewish population and accuse the Zionists of bringing internal Jewish party politics into the community arena from which they had been happily banished.

"Regardless of the growing want which has penetrated into every Jewish family, the Zionist faction considers it again timely to start internal Jewish political conflicts within the communal life," the statement of the Liberal leaders declares. "The faction of the Jewish People's League and the Zionist Federation consider it intolerable that the board of the community should remain constituted in a way which to their idea no longer corresponds with the real desires of the Jewish population, and they call for a complete reconstruction of the central and local bodies of German Jewry, which will guarantee the Zionists their proper influence in the shaping of Jewish work in Germany."

Liberals Point to Progress

"To this we reply," the statement continues, "we shall not allow the want which is at the present time so hard enough, to be impaired by such conflicts. We shall continue heedless of Party dogmas to carry out the tasks which the Jewish situation requires. We declare that the school system of the Berlin Jewish Community has, under Liberal leadership, been expanded since 1925 by 2,400, by opening fifty-nine new classes and by appointing 135 new teachers."

"The Welfare Office of the Jewish Community, under Liberal leadership, provided 1,000 beds in 1933 and 1934 month after month

for an average of 15,000 people. "The economic aid department of the Jewish Community was created under Liberal leadership, and during its existence it has maintained or created by credit aids more than 2,000 livelihoods. It has given vocational training to 4,000 young people, and has now on the completion of the school year placed about 1,800 children in occupations. The vocational continuation training, the sport and cultural training of the youth, equally whether they seek their education here, or desire to emigrate to Palestine, or other countries, has been fully supported by the Community. The homes for the aged and the hospital of the Jewish Community have under Liberal leadership been extended, and in spite of the economies necessary, all the institutions of the Community have been maintained, and many of them have been expanded."

Have Avoided Party Strife

"The Board of the Jewish Community only recently declared its attitude towards Palestine and has dealt with the relations of the Jews in Germany to Palestine in a definitely positive sense. All that has been done in the Community at present, and under constant collaboration with the Zionist members of the Board and the Representative Council. Internal Jewish Party political differences have been deliberately avoided."

"Since 1933 there have been no questions in the board, or representative council of the Community decided by majority vote and Party political considerations. That fact was recognized in the decision to prolong the term of office of the Community bodies by a unanimous vote of the board and a majority of thirty-eight against three votes in the representative council only a few months ago, valid until 1936."

"It is our wish to continue to do real work. We know that the majority does not stand behind those who have Jewish party politics, but the side of those who want to do real constructive Jewish work unconcerned by Jewish party political differences. It is our task to lead the Community and all its members in peaceful common work through the perils of the time."

Force vs. Persuasion

The present summs up the issue involved from the practical point of view. On the one side, the Zionists demand that they be given full control of German-Jewish life in order to guarantee that the work for Palestine is given its proper place in the scheme of things. On the other side, the present administration replies that it has dealt with the existing work in a definitely positive sense and wishes that the present situation in Germany for the Jews requires certain other phases of work of paramount importance to the welfare of German Jewry. This work, the above statement justly claims, is being competently and capably handled.

Neither this statement nor recent declarations by non-Zionist leaders take up the fundamental question at issue—whether willingly or a whole Jewish community is to be forced to accept Zionism because the rulers of the country want the Jews to leave, without the normal and more satisfactory procedure of education and conversion to Zionism. It would seem to me that the Zionists themselves should prefer new Zionists brought into the fold

Danzig Before the League

The question of the Jews in Danzig will come up this week for discussion before the Council of the League of Nations, which opened its session in Geneva yesterday.

The petition by the Danzig Jews which the Council will take up is one of seven submitted by various groups of the Free City to the League of Nations, demanding a curb on Nazi activities there. The Jewish petition, however, will no doubt attract more attention than the others since the anti-Jewish propaganda now being conducted by the Nazi administration in Danzig is a direct violation of the provisions set by the League for the administration of the Free City.

Jewish Sufferings Grow

The 8,000 Jews of Danzig have been suffering from the Nazi program in the Free City, and under the anti-Jewish regulations. Their suffering has, however, become more intense during the last year, because of the devaluation of the Danzig currency.

Although the devaluation was carried out by the Danzig Senate, which is controlled entirely by the Nazis, the League of Nations Nazi press started a campaign that the Jews are the ones to be blamed. The campaign, encouraged by the Nazi administration of the Free City, is leading many to believe that the Jews are in direct responsible for the devaluation from which they are suffering. One of the groups affected are the middle class Jewish real estate deposits in the Danzig banks are estimated at 70,000,000 guilder, the incitement against the Jews by the Nazi press is leading many among those who are not Nazis.

Truth About Inflation

The truth of the matter is that the Danzig Senate before devaluing the currency of the Free City, was already in a position in time to permit them to exchange their capital. It is also a fact that to devalue the currency was almost a desperate measure that part of the population which voted against the Nazis in the parliamentary elections of April 7.

Now, the League of Nations, the leaders of the Nazis in Danzig have seen in the devaluation of the currency a good excuse for strengthening their anti-Jewish propaganda by blaming the Jews for it. The anti-Jewish propaganda in Danzig has thus, after the inflation, assumed an unprecedented, dangerous character.

The Jewish Petition

The petition which the Jews of Danzig has submitted to the Council of the League of Nations is a result of this situation. A similar petition was submitted to the League by the Catholic population of Danzig, which is also persecuted by the Nazis though to a lesser degree than the Jews. Among the petitions which the League Council will take up at its present session, is also one submitted by Sean Lester, the League's High Commissioner of Danzig. Mr. Lester has opened the door for the Nazi administration in Danzig. He has therefore requested that the League once and for all define his powers in Danzig.

Contrasts Art of Synagogue, Church

Penina Nimitzowitz, the young American artist whose murals were unveiled Sunday in the Synagogue of the Society for the Advancement of Judaism writes in *The Reconstructionist*, as follows:

Synagogues have been conspicuously deficient in their decorations in the use of pictorial representations of the human figure. The same is true of the decorations in Moslem places of worship. The case of the church, however, has been very different. Ecclesiastical art has always been favored with a warm reception on the part of church and laity. Many of the world's most meritorious art treasures have been cherished for centuries under the roof of a church, monastery or convent. The tremendous art activity during the Renaissance was created, in a large degree, by the encouragement offered artists by church and state. Artists were given every opportunity to beautify nave and cloister. The life of Jesus and the saints was depicted in innumerable media, foremost among which were mosaics, frescos and marble. To this day visitors flock to the churches of Italy to gaze reverently upon the mural paintings by some of the most gifted artists of all periods—Giotto, Fra Angelico, Masaccio. These and other masters did their work unhampered by church restriction.

Brissane Reminds Nazis Of Spain's Fate

Arthur Brissane, in his column, "Today," in the *Hebrew Press*, commented on the anti-Jewish propaganda in Berlin last week which were led by brass bands: Marchers carried placards reading:

"Jews are our misfortune." "Those Nazis will change their minds about that placard if they succeed in driving out all Jews, including many of the world's greatest scientists."

Long ago, Portugal and Spain also decided that "Jews are our misfortune" and drove out the Jews. *Now look at them.*

They follow great nations, leading the world in enterprise and commerce. All that has vanished.

Says 'Protocols' Lie Can't Be Killed

The *Church Times*, of London, commenting on the trial of the "Protocols of the Elders of Zion," writes:

A lie can never be killed—that is, if it is sufficiently picturesque. Many years ago, anti-Semites in a world-wide publication called *The Protocols of the Elders of Zion*, which suggested that the Jews of the world were engaged in an organized conspiracy to destroy Christianity and Christendom. In 1923 the *Times* newspaper published a pamphlet,

showing that the whole thing was a fabrication and a forgery. But that does not matter in the least. The Protocols have been reissued by the Nazis in Germany and again recently in Switzerland; and despite the fact that the *Times* pamphlet can be bought for sixpence in Printing House Square, quite a number of people in this country still believe that a fantastic grotesquerie is a genuine document.

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Pittsburgh Nets Half of Quota As Drive Opens

**\$58,000 Pledged for
Appeal at Dinner;
600 Comb City**

PITTSBURGH, Pa., May 20—Leaders of Pittsburgh Jewry pledged more than fifty percent of the \$116,000 quota sought here for the United Jewish Appeal and other agencies when they met in the Concordia Club last night to launch this city's drive on behalf of the nationwide effort to obtain \$2,500,000 for the relief and rehabilitation of the Jews of Germany and other lands from the resettlement of Jews in Palestine.

Contributions exceeding \$58,000 followed talks made by Prof. Norman Bentwich, William Rosenwald, James N. Rosenberg, Dr. Rabbi Solomon B. Freehof of Rodef Shalom Congregation here, Louis Caplan presided. Leo Lehman is chairman of the Pittsburgh campaign. Other speakers were Dr. Rabbi Frank and Alfred Oppenheimer, associate chairmen; Marcus Aaron, Mrs. Josiah Cohen, Mrs. Morris Kohnman, Mrs. Rosenblum, honorary chairmen.

600 to Comb City

About 600 volunteer workers will take the field this morning to solicit additional contributions for the appeal which will continue here until May 29.

Prof. Bentwich declared that the Jews in Germany is being put back into the position in which the Jews of the Middle Ages. He is deprived of his part in the civil and political life in that country; he is deprived of any opportunity in public activities, in science, in art, in journalism and literature. There is a complete and absolute denial to the younger generation of the German Jewish community of a free, untrammelled life.

Rabbi Freehof declared: "The profoundest tragedy of the Jews in Germany is not their political disability or the racial prejudice or the economic oppression; it is the position of enforced loneliness into which they are driven. Their children, who once went to school and had friends, stand by them in the classrooms, played with them on the playgrounds, are now isolated."

Earlier in the day, 300 delegates from Jewish communities throughout the Tri-State Area, which includes western Pennsylvania, northern Ohio and west Virginia, met in the Y. M. and Y. W. H. to discuss the appeal for similar appeals which they will conduct in their own communities.

Orthodox Groups Map Plan To strengthen Lines in South

(Special to the J.D.B.)
WASHINGTON, May 20—The Jewish community is planning a vigorous program to strengthen the work of orthodox synagogues in the southeastern regional unit of the United Jewish Appeal.

Delegates from Jewish Congregations of America met here last night at the conclusion of the regional convention which was attended by approximately 50 delegates from a half dozen States and the District of Columbia.

Formal organization of the Southeastern Region took place as a resolution supporting the election of Mizrahi delegates to the World Jewish Congress. This rump resolution was defeated and in its stead a resolution supporting the effort to upbuild Palestine as a Jewish homeland was adopted.

See Kring-U.S. Split Justified Speaking earlier in the day, Senator William H. Kring of Utah justified that severance of diplomatic relations with Germany "might be justified" in view of the treatment which the Hitler government has accorded Jews.

In his address Senator Kring praised Orthodox Jewry for its adherence to the Jewish religious times of religious and racial persecution and condemned Germany for its persecution of Jews. Asserting that "Hitler policies are a direct threat to Jewish civilization," Senator Kring said, "when nations with which we have international relations adopt policies of persecution, bigoted and inconsistent with civilization, I am not sure but what the severance of diplomatic relations might be justified."

Another resolution urged the Union and the regional unit to devise ways and means whereby a field director may be employed to carry on intensive work in the smaller western and southern communities where Judaism is losing its hold because of a lack of organization and proper facilities. In the event that a director can not be financed, it was suggested that orthodox rabbis in the larger communities nearby be provided with adequate funds and directed to make periodic visits for the purpose of reviving, inculcating and strengthening traditional Judaism among Jews in the small western and southern communities.

Back 5 Day Week

The regional convention adopted a resolution which petitions Congress to enact a law to observe a five-day work week in all government departments.

Another resolution adopted condemned Fascism, Nazism, and Com-
