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Carol Acts To Halt Drive Against Jews

Vaida-Voevod Is King's Guest; Anti-Semitic Union Fails

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BUCHAREST, May 24—Dr. Vaida-Voevod, former premier and leader of the anti-Semitic forces in Rumania, was received today by King Carol and had dinner with him.

It is understood that the King invited the ex-premier in order to influence him to discontinue his propaganda against the national minorities in the country and especially against the Jews.

The Rumanian press reports today that Dr. Vaida-Voevod's plan to create a united front of all anti-Semitic grounds in the country has not been realized.

Cuza Balks at Union

Prof. Cuza, the "Streicher of Rumania," refused to join hands with ex-premier, declaring that he is not satisfied with receiving merely the post of honorary president in the united organization. He made it clear that he wishes to have active leadership and will not consider Dr. Vaida-Voevod's proposal until such leadership is guaranteed to him.

A smiliar attitude was taken by Prof. Goga, the leader of another anti-Semitic group in Rumania. The followers of Prof. Goga announced that they oppose any co-operation with Dr. Vaida-Voevod and threatened to leave the ranks of their party if any agreement is reached between their leader and the ex-premier.

The newspaper Miscarea, official organ of the Liberal Party strongly assails Dr. Vaida-Voevod for his propaganda to introduce a numerous clausus against Jews in education and in professions. The paper warns of "fatal consequences."

Judge Harawitz Dies; Elected Over Panken

Municipal Court Justice Abraham Harawitz died Friday at his home in the Broadway Central Hotel after a brief illness. He was 56.

Brought to the United States from Russia at the age of 7, he was a member of the State Assembly in 1906 and 1907 and in 1927 he was elected to the Municipal Court bench, defeating Justice Jacob Panken.

Forbids Jews to Use 'German' in Signs

BERLIN, May 24—Jewish firms in Prussia are not to be permitted to use the word "German" in their signs, the Prussian Supreme Court ruled today.

"The word German is increasingly synonymous with 'Aryan,'" the court explained.

In its decision the court also advised the introduction of stricter limitations in using the word "German" in the names of non-Aryan firms.

McDonald Trip To Argentine Proves Vain

Nation Refuses to Make Special Provisions For Refugees

BUENOS AIRES, May 24—The trip that James G. McDonald, League of Nations High Commissioner for Jewish and other refugees from Germany, made to the Argentine to obtain better immigration conditions for refugees, has proved unsuccessful, it was stated in government circles.

Dr. Llamas, Argentina's Secretary for Foreign Affairs and Dr. Melo, Minister of Interior, in their conversations with Mr. McDonald, definitely informed him that the government does not intend to make any special provisions for the immigration of German-Jewish refugees.

Fear Propaganda

The government spokesmen, it was learned, emphasized that such an immigration will only play into the hands of the Fascist elements in the country who would utilize it for anti-Semitic propaganda.

Failing to place a number of Jewish professionals from Germany in the Argentine, Commissioner McDonald has sent his special secretary, Samuel Guy Inman, from here to Chile, Peru, Colombia, Ecuador, Panama and other countries of Central America, to negotiate for possibilities of placing Jewish doctors, professors and engineers in those territories.

Mr. Inman expects to complete his trip in those countries by June

Poles Move To Restrict Exile Entry

Order German Border Closely Guarded for Illegal Attempts

WARSAW, May 24.—The Polish Minister of Interior today instructed frontier officials on the German-Polish border to see to it that no Jewish refugees from Germany cross the border into Poland illegally.

Simultaneously an order was issued to expel from Poland any German citizen who has illegally entered the country and return him to Germany.

These orders came as a result of the Polish-German treaty signed recently providing for the surrender of illegals.

Hold to Pro-German Course

While a large proportion of the Polish population objects to the political flirtation being carried on between Poland and Germany, it appears that the pro-German course which the Polish government is now pursuing will not change.

Great interest is displayed here in the petition which the Jews of Danzig have submitted to the League of Nations complaining against the Nazi administration in the Free City. Almost half of the Jewish population in Danzig are citizens of Poland and the Polish government is greatly interested in the outcome of the petition, not only because the Jews are affected but also because the Polish population in Danzig will be better protected if the League decides in favor of the Jewish petition.

Money Tactics Hit

A number of Polish papers are accusing the Danzig Senate, which

Hebrew Daily Is Suspended

'Hayarden' Hit Police For Failure to Solve Jerusalem Murder

JERUSALEM, May 24.—The Palestine government today suspended the Hebrew daily Hayarden for one month, giving no explanation for its action.

Hayarden, a Revisionist newspaper, has been persistently criticizing the Palestine police for not apprehending the murderers of Kalman Shapiro, a young Jewish resident here who was killed by two Arabs while defending his aunt from an attack by the Arabs on the street. It is believed that this criticism is responsible for the suspension of the paper.

The murder of Kalman Shapiro occurred under similar circumstances as that of Dr. Chaim Arlosorof, who was assassinated by two unknowns while taking a walk with his wife. The murderers of Arlosorof have not yet been discovered by the police.

\$500,000 Film Offer Spurned by Menuhin

MELBOURNE, May 24.—Yehudi Menuhin, the American-Jewish violin prodigy, who is now in Australia, today refused an offer of \$500,000 to appear in an American film for Paramount.

"The art of my son is not for sale," the father of the young violinist replied to the Paramount.

Teacher Active In Spreading Nazi Beliefs

Rutgers Students Testify Hauptmann Made 17 Pro-Hitler

NEW BRUNSWICK, N. J., May 24—More witnesses to testify concerning the anti-Semitic attitude of Dr. Frederick J. Hauptmann, head of the German Department of the New Jersey College for Women, appeared today before the investigating committee set up by the board of trustees of Rutgers University.

While a number of witnesses testified that Dr. Hauptmann was outspokenly anti-Jewish, others maintained that he was only pro-Nazi but did not agree with Hitler's persecution of the Jews.

Miss Mary Atwood, a student, stated that Dr. Hauptmann was extremely active in spreading Hitlerism among the students. Of the eighteen students living in the German House of the college, seventeen have been converted by Dr. Hauptmann to Nazi ideals. The eighteenth is a Jewess.

Shifts Stand

The witness testified that she herself was opposed to Hitler but Dr. Hauptmann succeeded in convincing her that Hitler was right. Now that the investigation has been started, and the facts have come out more clearly, she is again anti-Nazi, she declared.

A Jewish student, Miss Dorothy Venook, who appeared as witness today, testified that no discrimination was practiced against her in the German department, although everyone knew she was Jewish. She declared that while Dr. Hauptmann is undoubtedly pro-Nazi, he does not sympathize with the anti-Jewish persecutions in Germany.

Sees Exodus From Reich At Standstill

Hitler Organ Attributes Cessation to Bar on Removal of Money

BERLIN, May 24—Legal Jewish emigration from Germany into European countries and overseas has practically ceased, the Voelkischer Beobachter, Hitler's chief organ, reports today.

"This is due to the fact that Jews are not permitted to take any money out of Germany," the paper explains. "Emigration to Palestine is still continuing, but only under exceptional circumstances."

Explaining that the Jews will be permitted to take \$5,000 out with them if they go to Palestine, the Voelkischer Beobachter states openly that the Nazi government is highly interested in liquidating the Jewish question through emigration.

"The economic and political future of Palestine is not without importance for Germany," the paper writes. "The solution of the Jewish problem in Germany depends partly on this factor. If the mandated territory develops in the next ten years as the Zionists hope, we may expect that within this period the decline of the Jews in Germany will become a fact."

The Voelkischer Beobachter expresses the opinion that "Palestine is able to absorb at least a million Jews." The paper asserts that in Samaria and in Galilee there is so much fertile land that if industry is applied to it, a considerable peasant population will be able to make its livelihood there.

Emphasizing that the Arabs are violently opposed to an increased Jewish immigration into Palestine, the Nazi paper believes that the British government, which holds the mandate over Palestine, "cannot challenge the Arabs too much," because they constitute the largest Moslem power in the world.

Career of Jane Addams Called Humane, Noble

CHICAGO, May 24—The board of directors of the Jewish People's Institute unanimously adopted a resolution of appreciation of the humaneness, simplicity and nobility of the late Jane Addams, world-famous social worker of Hull House, who died this week.

Put Boycott on World Basis Copenhagen Parley is Urged

COPENHAGEN, May 24—The question of a world-wide intensification of the boycott of German goods was discussed today at a closed session of the executive council of the International Federation of Trade Unions.

The idea that the anti-German boycott is conducted only by Jews should be dispelled, since all groups are actively participating in the campaign for the boycott of

German-made products, it was pointed out by speakers at the session.

Delegates from England, Holland and France were especially insistent in their demands that the boycott movement be strengthened. The delegate from Holland, Mr. Fimmen, urged the revival of a strong anti-German propaganda which, he complained, has slackened during recent months.

Jabotinsky Scotts at Report of Attempt on His Life in Kaunas

LONDON, May 24—Vladimir Jabotinsky, leader of the World Union of Zionist Revisionists, today in a long-distance telephone conversation from Wilno, Poland, denied to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that there was any attempt to assassinate him in Kaunas, Lithuania, when he lectured there this week.

Mr. Jabotinsky stated that one

stone was thrown at his automobile when he left the theatre after the lecture. The driver of the car was slightly injured.

"I was absolutely untouched and I am unaware who threw the stone," Mr. Jabotinsky declared. According to a report in the Kaunas press today, three were arrested as a result of the incident.

Capital Comment

WASHINGTON.

Why is it that religious groups are becoming more and more articulate in expressing their views on intangibles or matters of secondary importance when their efforts might be directed to far greater advantage by focusing attention on the need for alleviating human suffering and distress and solving the more fundamental problems with which all creeds are confronted, remains a mystery to many an observer.

Recently, the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations held a southeastern regional meeting in this city. Among the resolutions adopted by this meeting was one which petitioned Congress "to enact a law establishing the five-day work week in all government departments." The resolution further stated that "the adoption of a general five-day work week policy will enable the government employees of the Jewish faith to observe the holy Sabbath."

No one will deny the spirit in which this resolution was considered by the meeting. But, knowing that the number of Jews in the employ of the federal government is so small, it appears as if the tail were trying to wag the dog.

It is understood that a committee has undertaken to draft a bill which will be submitted to Congress along with the petition. Such a bill has little if any chance of passing. The energies required to draft this measure might well be directed in other channels of endeavor with far greater benefit to Jewry.

To "view with alarm" has become a favorite pastime for more than one group in this country. Even the clergy has joined in this game. The other day a petition signed by 272 clergymen representing three faiths — Protestant, Catholic, and Jewish — was submitted to Congress requesting that the Senate Committee on the Judiciary make an investigation as to how far, if at all, the constitutional liberties of free speech, free assembly, and free press are being encroached upon from any source.

In requesting the investigation, the petition said, "We feel impelled solemnly to warn the nation against imminent dangers which threaten our constitutional liberties of free speech, free assembly, and a free press." The petition recited efforts of organizations to induce both Congress and the legislatures of the various states to pass restrictive legislation.

"While the proposed measures are at present ostensibly aimed at extremists, the recent experience of other countries shows that once the civil liberty of the most extreme group has been removed, the rights of organized labor, of liberals, and of the churches have also gone down in rapid succession," the petition says.

Whether or not such an investigation will be ordered, remains to be seen. Much of the howl against the actual loss or threatened loss of liberties has come from reactionary quarters. The big question, however, is: What liberties do we not have now that we had before?

The United States is being "sold short" in Central America, accord-

ing to Leo R. Sack, former Washington newspaper man, who is American Minister to Costa Rica and now home on leave. Minister Sack tells his one-time Capital press colleagues that the type of news which is being published by the Central American newspapers does not depict this country's constructive accomplishments. Dispatches filling the Latin-American newspapers specialize in stories of crime, sex and industrial strife. Thus the people in those countries get a distorted picture of what is going on in the United States.

Minister Sack points out that press emphasis on stories of crime, sex and industrial strife, is of distinct disadvantage to the interests of the United States. The people in the Latin-American countries are eager to cement both commercial and cultural ties with Uncle Sam. But, because of the systematically distorted picture of American life and times, it is hard for them to get at the truth.

Washington officialdom is in continued silence concerning Hitler's militaristic efforts. The Fuehrer's long speech before the Reichstag was eagerly awaited here. But, after its delivery, Washington comment could not be obtained.

Every indication points to the fact that Hitler wants peace—but on his own terms—just as the Kaiser did in 1914. Hitler wants more power and no doubt will do all that he can to get it. The Fuehrer is willing to negotiate, but not on the basis of the Versailles Treaty. He wants to be in position to make the final decisions. This is something which the allies will not permit him to do. In the meantime, Washington is on the sidelines and will continue to remain there for some time to come.

Ramapo Lodge Is Put In Shape for Season

Eastwood Lodge on Greenwood Lake, Orange County, N. Y., was being made ready Friday for the opening of the summer vacation season. It is located in the Ramapo Mountains, forty-two miles from New York City, and nearly 1,000 feet above sea level. Visitors to the district acclaim it as a place of unusual scenic beauties.

Eastwood Lodge was formerly known as Inkowa Camp. Buses for persons who want to inspect the lodge leave Saturday morning from 130 West Forty-second Street.

Teachers Join In Relief Drive Of Appeal Here

Plan of Solicitation to Be Announced Tuesday At Hotel Meeting

More than 7700 educators in all parts of Greater New York have joined in the Educators' Division of the United Jewish Appeal, which is seeking \$1,250,000 in the metropolis, it was announced Friday.

The campaign proceeds will go for the relief and rehabilitation of Jews of Germany and Eastern Europe and for the settlement of Jews in Palestine.

According to the announcement, which was made by Jacob Greenberg, Edward Mandel and Benjamin Veit, chairmen of the Educators' Division, a comprehensive plan of solicitation will be adopted Tuesday afternoon at a meeting at the Hotel Commodore.

Speakers at this gathering will include Joseph C. Hyman, honorary secretary of the United Jewish Appeal and secretary of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee; and Charles Ress, secretary of the board of directors of the American Palestine Campaign.

Pennsylvania's Capital Fills Its Drive Quota

Schaap Tells of Many 'Christian Jews' in Reich

There are more than 2,000,000 "Christian Jews" in Germany in addition to the 500,000 Jews of the Jewish faith there, Michael Schaap, president of Bloomingdale's declared Thursday in an address before the Cloak and Suit Division of the United Jewish Appeal at the Hotel Pennsylvania.

He said he was at a loss to understand the attitude of indifference on the part of Christians toward the victims of Nazism.

Other speakers included I. Edwin Goldwasser, who with Schaap and Nathan Straus are the co-chairmen of the city-wide campaign; Milton Grossman, Louis Schneider, I. Grossman and Harry Katz.

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Greatest of Miracles

SINCE time immemorial the Jews have been trying to tear themselves loose from their racial origin but they have never brought this divorce to its logical conclusion. I do not know whether it is possible to call this one of the divine miracles. At any rate, the phenomenon of Jewish survival remains completely incomprehensible and no historian has yet arisen who can adequately explain why under the hammerblows of its long and extraordinary history, the Jewish people has not been shattered.

Every page in Jewish history offers as evidence the tendency of the Jew to wrench himself loose from his past. At all times the individual Jew as well as entire groups of Jews were anxious to become assimilated into their environment.

WE DO not have to go for proof of this as far back as the time of the First Temple, when the Jewish national idea had not yet become crystallized, when the amalgam which held the people together was the coercive force of a strong ruling dynasty such as King David's.

Shortly after the death of King Solomon, the Jewish nation split in two. To frighten them against worshipping alien gods, the Prophet was obliged to fling his curses and his threats alike at both of these groups. And not always were his efforts successful. Already at the time of the Second Temple, when the Jews were passing through the fiery ordeal of exile, when they were being made ripe for union by means of a sanctified tradition, a strictly monotheistic worship and a purified personal life—even then, when the genius of the Jew was beginning to crystallize into its unique character, the upper classes of the nation were corrupt and degenerated. In their hearts they practiced deceit. Like the assimilationists of our own time, they were possessed but by one desire: to cast off as soon as possible the burden of their Jewishness and to immerse themselves in the dazzling illumination of Greek culture.

TO THIS section of Jewish society belonged not only the kings, the petty tyrants of the Hasmonean dynasty and of the House of Herod, who had been educated in Rome and were retainers of Caesar, but also the highest Jewish ecclesiastical authorities. With but rare exceptions, the High Priest was little more than a Roman official who had bought his office from the Roman governor of Judea. The office of the High Priesthood thus became an object for barter and trade. The one who made the highest bid procured it. It continued to pass incessantly from hand to hand. Many of its incumbents were wholly uneducated men.

And it is this people, that had erected idols upon all the high places, that had offered sacrifices upon every altar, that had been unfaithful a thousand times a day to their own God and Law, when they were finally led into captivity by a mighty, victorious enemy, sat "by the waters of Babylon" and refused to sing the song of God on foreign soil.

This people swore by its soul never to forget Jerusalem, wrote the most moving words of consolation, the most beautiful psalms which have brought comfort and peace to mankind everlastingly. It is this people that gave rise to Messianism, which has played such an important part in the world's history and which simultaneously laid the foundation for our present-day morality. It is this people which nurtured in its soul the mightiest hope that the human soul is capable of conceiving: faith in a better and more beautiful future.

AND the time soon came when this people accomplished the miracle of emerging purified from

its bondage, united by an inextinguishable faith that has proven itself completely vindicated to this very day.

This is the same people, the same priests, the same kings, the same aristocracy that had shown so many symptoms of national decay; also the same people of zealots, of passionate partisans who had fought against the enemy until the hour when the flames began to burst from the Temple. There was no danger from without great enough to weld them together, to consiliate them, and at times it appears that all that would have been necessary for Titus to do in order to capture Jerusalem was to wait patiently outside the walls of the city until the Jews had exterminated one another by their mutual hatred.

AND furthermore, not only did this people achieve the miracle of being able to resist for years the greatest power in the world, but it succeeded in creating a unified national life notwithstanding that it consisted of disparate elements which by all tokens were altogether incapable of achieving such an end. It succeeded in doing this although driven into exile, although dispersed throughout the world, and inhumanly tormented and persecuted everywhere.

And all this was achieved by the means of a religious law which determines Jewish life down to the most minute detail, which penetrates into the depths of all character into the life of all times, and of all countries wherever the Jews is to be found. It operates within any physical force or external necessity.

This people has no means of force at its command, yet it exercises supreme authority and this authority alone has proven effective down to our own times and in the very midst of European civilization. By these very means a dispersed and dismembered nation has preserved itself although remaining without any of the distinguishing marks that characterize other peoples, without the advantage of a land of its own, without a common language and common economic interests, and without any natural tie to bind its various members. And all this despite the vengeance that encircles it, that threatens to devour it despite all humiliation and goading.

IT IS also wrong to suppose that the Jews led a completely isolated existence while in the ghettos, or that no ray of light from the outside world ever penetrated their dark ghetto-wallse. The Jew was at all times a highly volatile and nervous creature who sucked sustenance from the breasts of his environment with a hundred hungry mouths, who was full of the joy of life, and who was always ready to adopt the customs of the people in whose midst he lived.

In the days of the Goths the Jew was as mercilessly harsh in his attitude towards himself and his surroundings as was his Christian neighbor. At the time of the Crusades the Jews committed upon themselves the incredible self-flagellation of massacring their own women and children out of fear that they might submit to Christian conversion.

JEWISH life flowed with the stream in every country and in

every age, from the very first day of its inception. It is indeed true that the Torah, the Law and its commentaries, the countless commandments and prohibitions, the religious traditions which were sanctified through an incomparable martyrdom, gave added support to the Ghetto walls.

But there were no external or internal Ghetto walls strong enough to cut the Jews off completely from the life of the world surrounding them. Without any let-up, the Jew, like any wild animal which longs for the forest after it is confined in a cage, strained to merge himself with his environment. One may well say, that assimilation is as old as the Jewish people and that it has found an outlet in every age. But notwithstanding the tendencies in the Jewish organism working for national dissolution and despite the temptations of a better existence held out as bait to the Jews by the nations of the world as reward for their abandonment of Judaism, they not only have not fallen apart as a people, but by an unprecedented spirit of self-sacrifice never equalled in the annals of history, have succeeded in remaining united although solitary and dispersed throughout the world.

The causes of this still remain a mystery. Every rational explanation offered on the basis of historical events proves contradictory. But the believers among us fervently wish to regard this as the greatest of miracles.

"There are other such institutions in the country," he said "but they did not come into existence until after the Ex-Patients' Tubercular Home proved the wisdom of its policy.

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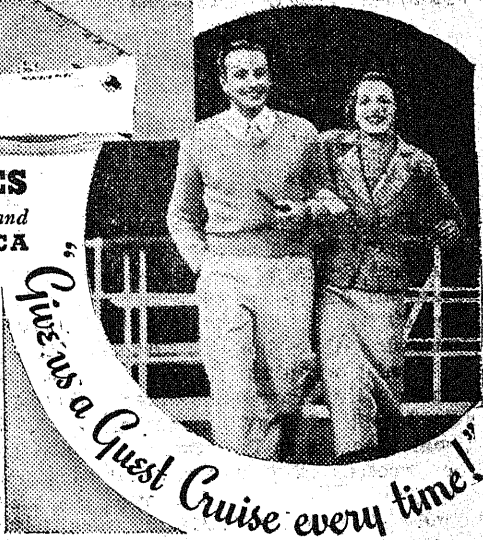

Goebbels Defines an "Aryan"



"And don't forget that the true 'Aryan' must be blond, athletic and square of head and shoulder."

A DUEL between the Jewish community of Danzig and the Nazi-controlled Danzig Senate will take place this week in Geneva before the Council of the League of Nations.

The Jewish community of Danzig submitted a petition to the League of Nations charging the Senate with violating the constitution of the Free City by indulging in anti-Jewish legislation. It demands that the League of Nations force the Danzig Senate to revoke its anti-Jewish laws and to secure the safety of the Jews against the anti-Jewish propaganda.

Admitting that a severe anti-Jewish boycott is taking place in Danzig under the very nose of the administration, the Danzig Senate, in stating its case before the League of Nations maintains that the laws against the Jewish population which were adopted by the Senate do not violate the Danzig constitution but are an expression of the will of the people.

Council Must Decide Who Is Right

The Council of the League of Nations has therefore to decide this week whether the Jews or the Nazi-controlled Senate is right in the interpretation of the constitution of the Free City for the observance of which the Senate is responsible to the League of Nations.

The Jewish petition against the Danzig Senate is one of seven petitions submitted to the League of Nations last week. Not only have the Jews something to say against the Senate, but also the Catholics, the Poles and other minorities in Danzig.

There is no doubt that the Danzig Senate has little chance of winning its case before the League. The recent parliamentary elections in Danzig which Goering and Goebbels were invited to witness by the local Nazis, have made it clear to the world that the Nazis consider Danzig a part of Nazi Germany, even though the Free City is still under the jurisdiction of the League of Nations.

League Can Help Danzig Jews

While the League of Nations is helpless in the case of Jews in Nazi Germany, it is in a position to do much for the Jews of Danzig as long as Danzig is still under the League's supervision.

The Senate of Danzig may have a Nazi majority but once the League decides to vest more authority in Sean Lester, its present High Commissioner for Danzig, the Nazi activities against the Jews will be easily checked by Mr. Lester.

In order to obtain such increased power, High Commissioner Lester also submitted a memorandum to the Council of the League. In his memorandum Mr. Lester urges the League once and for all to define his status so that he may be able to act more effectively, not only with regard to protecting the Jews but also with regard to other matters concerning the welfare of the Danzig population.

The Danzig issue will thus become the center of the session of the League Council, especially since the rapporteur on Danzig is none other than Capt. Anthony Eden, Britain's outstanding diplomat. It is certain that the League will not forego the opportunity to demonstrate to Nazi Germany that Danzig is not yet a part of the Reich, and that the Jews in Danzig cannot be eliminated as they are in Germany.

Reich Draft Edict Bars Jews in Army

While the Danzig issue was coming to the forefront this week, the elimination of Jews from the German army attracted the major share of interest.

The long awaited conscription law makes it clear that Jews will not be admitted into the German army, and that any German soldier who marries a Jewess will not be promoted from the ranks of a private.

A surprise in the conscription law was the provision that in time of war the Ministry of War can mobilize Jews "just as inhabitants and not as citizens," and utilize them for any purpose it may see fit. This was interpreted as meaning the Jews will be used during the next war for digging trenches and for other services which do not involve the use of arms. As far as trusting the Jews with arms is concerned, it was made clear that this will be out of the question.

Jewish leaders in Germany, while expecting that the conscription law would contain such humiliating provisions, nevertheless felt greatly depressed when the conscription law with all its details were promulgated. This law for the first time states officially that the Jews are not considered citizens of the country. It defines the status of the Jews as merely "inhabitants."

Citizens Club Closed in Hamburg

To emphasize that the Jews are no longer to consider themselves citizens of Germany, the so-called Citizens Club in Hamburg, which had many Jewish members, was closed down last week with the explanation that a Jew in Germany is today no longer a citizen and thus cannot belong to a Citizens Club.

Deprived of citizenship and barred from military ranks, the Jews in Germany last week faced a renewed campaign to drive them out of commerce as well. The signal for this campaign came from Berlin in the form of two anti-Jewish parades led by brass bands with Nazis carrying placards urging the boycott of Jewish firms.

Following this signal, Jewish stores were wrecked in Dusseldorf and in other German cities. The attacks on the Jews were especially severe in different parts of Bavaria where the spirit of Julius Streicher has been demonstrating itself to no less degree than in Franconia, the province ruled by Streicher.

Nazis Checked in Austria

Nazi activities were openly checked for the first time last week in Austria when the authorities suppressed the "Aryan" Press Club in Vienna and prohibited the holding of meetings by the Austrian anti-Semitic union. These measures on the part of the Austrian government were taken as an indication that the Schuschnigg Cabinet has finally decided to defy openly the Nazi influence in Austria with respect to anti-Jewish propaganda.

In Czechoslovakia the Nazis won a sweeping victory last week in the parliamentary elections. Almost eighty per cent of the entire German population in those parts of Czechoslovakia neighboring Silesia voted for the Nazi ticket. The Nazi faction in the Czech parliament will now be the strongest.

There is little fear, however, that the Nazis will have any influence on the government machinery in Czechoslovakia as the cabinet is determined strictly to isolate the Nazis in Czechoslovakia from any contact with the Nazis in Germany. Unfriendly towards Germany because of Hitler's ambition to regain a part of Czechoslovakia, the Czech government will never permit the Nazis in the country to gain a foothold which would endanger the borders of Czechoslovakia.

Nevertheless, the Jews of Czechoslovakia have good grounds for concern over the possibilities that the Nazi faction in the Czech parliament will make use of its parliamentary right to spread anti-Jewish propaganda from the parliamentary tribune. It is in this connection that political observers believe that the parliament in Czechoslovakia may eventually be dissolved if the Nazi members should try to convert it into a platform for propagating Nazi doctrines.

White Book Sums Up Nazi Repressive Acts

A White Book summarizing the Nazi activities in Germany against the Jews and including all the anti-Jewish laws enacted by the German government, was published last week by the American Jewish Committee in New York. This book gives a concrete idea of what the Hitler government has done to the Jews during the two and a half years of its existence.

The White Book issued by the American Jewish Committee is well compiled and well edited.

It is the best accusation which the Jews could present against the Nazis. It is a fine piece of work, and will be appreciated by many editors, historians and students of the Jewish problem in Nazi Germany.

Nazi Propaganda Revealed at Rutgers

The spirit of Nazi Germany was revealed last week in the German department of the Women's College of Rutgers University in New Brunswick, N. J., when Prof. Leinard Bergel was dismissed for opposing anti-Jewish and pro-Hitler propaganda in the classrooms. The trustees of the university immediately set up an investigating committee to establish to what extent the head of the department, Dr. Frederick J. Hauptmann, is responsible for the anti-Jewish propaganda in his department.

The hearings of the investigating committee will probably not be concluded before Monday or Tuesday. The witnesses who have appeared until now, however, have all testified to the fact that the charges of anti-Semitism against Dr. Hauptmann are well based. Incidents were brought out before the investigating committee by students and recent graduates, as well as by other faculty members, disclosing that a definite anti-Jewish spirit prevails among the faculty of the German department in the Women's College.

Zionist Congress Opens in Lucerne Aug. 27

An official announcement was made this week by the Zionist Executive that the next Zionist Congress will be held in Lucerne, Switzerland, and will open on August 27.

Although the next Congress does not promise to be of great importance, it is expected that American Zionists will be represented this time by more delegates than ever before. A campaign to obtain a larger American representation in the Actions Committee and the forthcoming World Zionist Executive, has now been started in New York in connection with the elections to the Congress. The success of this campaign depends upon the actual role which the American delegates play in Lucerne.

Despite the fact that the Revisionists seceded from the Zionist Organization, friendly negotiations between them and the Zionist Executive this week resulted from the Zionist Executive. Anxious to prevent the Revisionists from applying for immigration visas directly to the Palestine government, the Zionist Executive has reached a compromise with them for the number of visas to be granted them under the present labor schedule. Further negotiations about a general agreement with regard to the distribution of visas are now going on in Jerusalem and may culminate in a friendly understanding.

Chicago U. Gets \$10,000 As Gift from Rosenwalds

CHICAGO, May 24—A check for \$10,000 from the Rosenwald Family Association was acknowledged today by the University of Chicago. Accompanying the check was a letter to Robert M. Hutchins, president, endorsing him and the university's stand on "academic freedom." A State committee is to investigate charges of radicalism.

Legal View of the "Get"

To the Editor, Jewish Daily Bulletin:

I have before me your issue containing a report of the proceedings of the Rabbinical Assembly of the Jewish Theological Seminary of America, and the action of the Assembly with respect to the "get" question.

Personally my sympathies are strictly traditional, but at the same time I feel that the law could be amended or modified to the solution of this most bitter and vexed problem, without infringing upon the spirit of the Torah, both written and oral.

One of our courts in the State of Maryland was confronted with a rather unique question during the early part of last Winter. This touched upon the power and duty of the State tribunals to enforce specifically a written or oral agreement, voluntarily entered into by a husband with his wife, wherein the husband agreed that if the parties would be divorced by the civil law, that he would authorize the writing of a "get" at any time that the wife would demand it. In that case, the court refused to interfere upon the grounds that the Jewish Law presented such obstacles towards the performance of the act, which the court could not overcome.

This decision elicited considerable comment and as a result there

of I have written a paper which was published in the Baltimore Daily Record, a legal publication, in its issue of February 25 last, wherein I have endeavored to demonstrate, that in so far as the Jewish law is concerned, there are no obstacles such as the court objected to. At the same time, I have endeavored to show, that from the constitutional standpoint of the law, the decree of divorce granted by a State court is not an adequate and complete remedy, where, as in the case of Jewish marriages, the parties are left, in so far as their religious convictions are concerned, neither married nor divorced; and that therefore, the court has both the power and the duty to perfect the same, particularly where the husband has formally agreed thereto.

Untermeyer Scores Penal Parley Site

To Hold Sessions in Berlin Is 'Travesty,' He Warns In Letter to Bates

Samuel Untermeyer has written a letter to Sanford Bates, director of the United States Bureau of Prisons, protesting against the appointment of an American delegation to the eleventh annual International Penal and Penitentiary Congress because the assembly is scheduled to be held in Berlin.

Bates has been reported in press dispatches from Washington to have been named chairman of the American delegation. The letter of Mr. Untermeyer, who is president of the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League to Champion Human Rights, was made public Friday.

"It seems nothing short of a travesty," he wrote, "that a congress dealing with penal and penitentiary systems should be held in Berlin under the present administration, where men and women are shot or imprisoned by secret process and where they are placed in torture chambers called concentration camps."

Mix Book Learning With Tools, Manufacturer Tells Educators

Morris Simons Offers J.E.A. Plan to Create a New Style of Mechanical Trades School For Jewish Boys

Morris Simons is a wholly practical man. Since 1922 he has been manufacturing diamond and metal dies—exceedingly hard and concrete products. His seven factories in the United States, Canada and France, which began with one employee, are filled with grinding instruments, rotating lathes and machinery—things you can put your finger on.

Mr. Simons likes to think in terms of things you can put your finger on, even in the subject in which he has become intensely interested—Jewish education. He feels that the system of Jewish education in New York can stand a great deal of improvement on the side of practicality.

A Talmud Torah education leaves a Jewish boy or girl with little of value, he told a reporter who called on him the other day. The pupil gets his Hebrew school certificate and soon forgets what he has learned.

Studies Unemployment

At the same time, Mr. Simons has given his attention to the problem of Jewish unemployment. College graduates, highly trained attorneys, have come to him asking for menial jobs. Meanwhile, the mechanical trades, Mr. Simons has found, contain less than one per cent Jews.

It is not that Jews do not make good mechanical workers. Mr. Simons took the reporter around his plant and showed him about fifty Jewish employees, working side by side with employees of other nationalities. "They're all fine, hard-working people," he shouted above the din of machines and power-belts.

Outlines His Plan

Upon returning to his office, Mr. Simons outlined the plan he intends to present to a group of executives of the Jewish Education Association whom he is inviting to his home in the near future. The plan involves creation of a mechanical trades school for Jewish boys. The school would be run by the J. E. A. and could become self-supporting in the following manner:

The students would spend about half the day in general theoretical and Jewish studies. The latter part of the day would be devoted to learning mechanical trades, at the same time actually working. A regular machine shop could be erected and the products sold for a profit. Mr. Simons estimated that while attending school, a boy could make from six to twelve dollars a week, in addition to his tuition fee.

A 3-Year Course

The course, Mr. Simons said, would last from three to four years. Upon graduation, the student would be competent to fill a mechanical position in a machine shop. "In this way," he said, "instead of having a theoretical education and being obliged to look for any sort of job, the boy could be an expert in a definite line with a future ahead of him."

Mr. Simon, who is a member of the J. E. A.'s Committee of One Hundred, declared that the association must adopt some plan as this. "Otherwise," he asserted, "it can exist only as long as donations pour in. At present, it has no future or potential value."

The Baron de Hirsch school, which at present gives preliminary

training in mechanics, cannot supply the needs of industry, Mr. Simons pointed out.

Engineers Offer Aid

A number of Jewish mechanical engineers, Mr. Simon said, have expressed their willingness to teach in the proposed school without charge.

"This, I believe, is a practical plan," Mr. Simons said. "I know that there is a field for Jewish boys in mechanical trades. At present they are crowding the needle trades. Here there is an opportunity for Jewish boys without financial resources to fit themselves for the mechanical trades where there are very few Jews and where there is a great future for them."

This plan would not only, in Mr. Simons' estimation, aid the individual Jews, but would aid the Jewish people as a whole. At present, he said, there is a great deal of propaganda being spread to the effect that the Jew cannot do manual work. This would serve as an effective answer.

Mr. Simons told of recently finding a Nazi cell in his shop. A German worker was distributing Nazi literature and telling the other employees that Jews are poor and unwilling workers. There is a widespread attitude, Mr. Simons declared, that Jews are not good workers or that they are disturbers and Communists. Highly trained Jewish mechanical workers could serve as an example of Jewish industry and the willingness of the Jews to work when he is given the chance.

Is Elisabeth Bergner better in "Escape Me Never" on the stage or in the movies?

This question was asked by many at the opening of "Escape Me Never" in the film version at the Radio City Music Hall.

The majority of those who came to see the film, witnessed the same performance on the stage, and the majority seemed to agree that the film version provides a better opportunity for Miss Bergner to show her talents than in the stage version.

Under the direction of Dr. Paul Czinner, Miss Bergner's husband, the film production of "Escape Me Never" is much more appealing than any of the other films in which Miss Bergner has starred. I have seen Miss Bergner as "Catherine the Great." I have seen her in her German films. She is at her best in "Escape Me Never" because here she has a better chance to display her emotions.

The criticism voiced against the play as being of minor literary value when Miss Bergner appeared in it on the stage, will doubtless not be applied to the film version. The screen effects cover up a good many of the defects which the play suffers from a literary viewpoint. Some of the scenes poorly produced on the stage because of technical limitations, are spectacular on the screen where these limitations are readily overcome.

Hubb Sinclair and Griffith Jones, who played with Miss Bergner in "Escape Me Never" on that stage are exceptionally good also in the film. Mr. Sinclair in the role of Sebastian displays brilliant talent. "Escape Me Never" is made up of an all-British cast with the exception of Miss Bergner.

The most fitting way in which it can be observed in this column is by providing a list, necessarily incomplete, of books by, for and about Jews published in the last year. Many of these books have been reviewed or mentioned in the Bulletin, so that the only comment we need make is to point out a few of the particularly high spots.

Honors in the novel must be shared by Franz Werfel's "Forty Days of Musa Dagh" and Sholom Asch's "Salvation"; Alfred Neumann's "Another Caesar" is no inconsiderable achievement, and among first novels, Henry Roths "Call It Sleep" certainly merits a high position.

Among the books on general cultural subjects, such as biography, arts and letters, special mention must be made of Albert Einstein's "The World As I See It," which sheds the light of the great scientist's genial wisdom on many every-day problems; also of Stefan Zweig's "Erasmus of Rotterdam," which is a monument to international understanding as well as a fine biography.

The following books on Jewish subjects are of importance: "The Jews in Germany," by Josef Kastel; "The Trust About 'The Protocols of Zion,'" by Herman Bernstein; "We Jews," by George Sokolsky, and "The Jews in Palestine," by Abraham Revusky.

It is noteworthy that three playwrights have achieved the recognition of book publication, chief among them Clifford Odets, the young dramatist whose star has risen high this year. The list on the whole though surprisingly short, is also surprisingly high in quality. Here it is:

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Two Leftist Dramatists

TWO PLAYS—Not for Children and Between Two Worlds. By ELMER RICE. 301 pp. New York: Coward McCann. \$2.50.

THE SAILORS OF CATTARO. A play by DR. FRIEDRICH WOLF. 110 pp. New York: Samuel French. \$1.50.

Elmer Rice and Dr. Friedrich Wolf are both among the left wing contingent of contemporary dramatists. But that is their only point of similarity. Their technique, their ideas of the proletarian drama, are completely divergent. And to this reviewer, at least, one is a successful left-winger; the other isn't.

Mr. Rice is one of the best of our American dramatists. His "Street Scene" won the Pulitzer Prize some few years back, won it rightly and with the unanimous endorsement of the critics. Since then he has written two other successful plays, "Counselor-at-Law" and "Left Bank." Then, Mr. Rice turned left. And the results since haven't been particularly happy. He has given us "We, the People," "Judgment Day" and "Between Two Worlds." The latter, plus an unproduced manuscript, "Not for Children," are the plays now in point. And of the latter, it is best to dismiss it before we get into a discussion of radical plays.

"Not for Children" is a play of release, of the release of all the pent-up venom for critics that Rice has acquired since they indicated thumbs down on his radical plays. It is a strange sort of play, one that probably never will be produced. It is Pirandelloesque in its movements from stage illusion to reality. It is verbose, the speeches are overlong but many of them are amusing, pointed. Pointed always at the dramatic critics. With a male and female commentator at the wings of the stage discussing the action as it unfolds, it is a particular technique created by Mr. Rice to thumb his nose at the metropolitan critics. It is a freak play, amusing to note, and quite often amusing. Whether it is stageworthy, I wouldn't dare say. Mr. Rice, himself, doesn't know. But it doesn't belong to Mr. Rice's leftist compositions.

"Between Two Worlds," on the other hand, does. The story of an ocean voyage in which a Commu-

nist motion picture director seduces the modern daughter of a millionaire, before and after which they discuss life and Communism, this play is an exposition of Mr. Rice's point of view. The revolution, he says, is coming. And he proceeds to debate with a disbeliever. It is strictly parlor Communism. To my mind it is a failure as radical drama; radical propaganda yes, but not radical drama.

Dr. Wolf's "The Sailors of Cattaro" is truly proletarian drama. It is thus successful where "Between Two Worlds" isn't. Wolf's play tells the story of an abortive revolt of a group of Austrian sailors during the later stages of the World War. It is a powerful anti-war play, an indictment of capitalist war. It is a play of the people, a dramatization of a slice of the struggle against capitalism. It is not a discussion of Communism as is Mr. Rice's play.

Deter Deadline On Naming List To Congress

Shekolim Settlements Also Advanced 10 Days by Zionists

An extension of ten days for submission of nomination lists of delegates to the nineteenth World Zionist Convention at Lucerne was announced yesterday by Leo Wolfson, chairman of the Election Board. The same extension was also granted for the final settlement of Shekolim, which entitle the purchasers to vote in the election of delegates. Closing date was originally May 25, with elections on June 22.

In accordance with the instructions from the World Zionist Executive in London, every candidate as a delegate to the Zionist Congress will have to show evidence of having contributed to the Keren Hayesod during the current year, it was made known yesterday.

Thus far, four lists have already been submitted to the Election Board in America. The first list combines the Zionist Organization and the Hadassah. The second combines the Poale Zion—Zeire Zion Party with the National Workers Alliance and the Pioneer Women for Palestine. List three represents the Mizrahi Organization of America, and list four represents the Community Party, headed by Rabbi S. Joshua Kohn of Utica, N. Y.

Institute at Williamstown Convenes in August; Leaders to Attend

Announcement of the convening of a Williamstown Institute of Human Relations, to be held at Williams College, Williamstown, Mass., from August 24 to 30, was made yesterday by Dr. Everett R. Clinchy, director of the National Conference of Jews and Christians, under whose auspices the institute will be held.

The institute will be headed by Newton D. Baker, Prof. Carlton J. H. Hayes of Columbia University and Roger W. Straus, co-chairman of the National Conference. Several hundred lay and clerical leaders of the Protestant, Catholic and Jewish faiths from all parts of the country will attend.

The purpose of the institute, Dr. Clinchy announced, is to give an opportunity to leaders of the Protestant, Catholic and Jewish faiths, to consider thoroughly and systematically some of their common interests and concerns as citizens in American communities, and to consider the improvement of inter-group relationships in the United States.

The institute is planned, Dr. Clinchy said, as an occasion of study and exchange of experience and not for debate or for securing commitments to specific proposals or recommendations. The chief purpose, he said, is to arrive at a common understanding of the

With the devaluation of the Danzig gulden, many Jewish firms in Poland suffered great losses since they dealt with Danzig firms on the basis of Danzig currency. The credits given to these firms, if repaid now in inflated Danzig money, will cause losses to the creditors in Poland to the extent of at least thirty per cent.

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
