Price Strike Hits 4,500 Meat Stores

Kosher Shops Expected To Close Today in Move Against the Packers

Spurred on by the kosher meat boycott of an aroused Jewish public protesting prohibitive wholesale prices, the kosher butchers and poultry dealers of Greater New York met last night at Webster Hall, Eleventh Street and Third Avenue, in a move to join the consumers in a strike to force meat prices lower.

With at least 4,500 of the 5,000 kosher meat stores throughout the city expected to be closed today, a delegation of consumers and housewives organized under the City Action Committee against the High Cost of Living will visit the three meat packing houses in New York City, all located in the vicinity of First Avenue and Forty-second Street, this morning, to present the committee's demands for a ten cents per pound reduction in the price of kosher meat.

Import Canadian Meat

Meanwhile, it was learned yesterday that high prices have made possible the invasion of the local market by kosher meat shipped across the border from Toronto. Despite a six-and-a-half-cent per pound duty, the meat sells for about five cents per pound below the New York price, it was discovered.

Complaints that kosher butchers, caught with meat on their hands, have stored it for more than the ritual limit of seventy-two hours so that they now possess non-kosher meat, will be investigated today by George Ringler of the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets in charge of kosher meat in New York City, he told the Jewish Daily Bulletin yesterday.

A survey over the weekend showed that the consumer boycott has practically paralyzed the retailing of kosher meat. Many kosher butchers have expressed their sympathy with the boycott, declaring that they were losing nothing by closing their shops since high wholesale prices have wiped out their profits anyway.

Packers Target of Action

Sponsors of the boycott emphasized that the action is in no way directed against the kosher packers.

Nazi Envoy Embarks on Tour Of Propaganda in Near East

JERUSALEM, May 26—A huge Nazi propaganda campaign to blanket the Near East, with large subsidies to Arab newspapers, was launched today by Eberhard von Stohrer, German Ambassador in Egypt.

The Ambassador started today on an automobile tour of the Orient, during which he will visit Palestine, Transjordan, Syria, Iraq and Persia for the purpose of organizing Nazi propaganda in these countries.

Palestine Currency Totals £5,500,00

JERUSALEM, May 26—Although the amount of Palestine currency in circulation is now over £5,500,000, the number of £100 notes is as low as 118, the Official Gazette reports.

The total amount of money circulated in notes is £5,010,536. Half-a-million pounds are circulated in coins. The £1 note is the most popular bill in the country, two million of them being in circulation.

Office for Visas Shut by Police In Greek City

Palestine Bureau in Salonica Besieged by Jewish Crowd

SALONICA, May 26—Police today closed the Palestine Office here when thousands of Jews stormed it in the hope of obtaining visas to enable them to proceed to Palestine.

Scenes of violence took place in front of the office when the large crowd of applicants were told that the Palestine Office had a few hundred visas for its disposition. The office is composed of representatives of various Zionist groups and is working under instructions from the Executive of the Jewish Agency in Palestine.

Police Sets Visa Limit

In order to avoid further disturbances the police authorities ordered the Palestine Office not to accept more than fifty applications for visas daily. This the authorities believe, will prevent the congregation of large crowds, similar to today's, at the premises of the office.

Closing of the office, was only a temporary measure, the police explained. The office will be reopened next week.

Yesterday's outbreak was one of a series which have occurred in several cities in Greece during the last few weeks.

Anxious to proceed to Palestine because of their impoverished condition, Jews are besieging the Palestine offices in every city begging for immigration certificates.

Jews Debate Getting Out Of Munich

Violent Boycott Methods May Force Shops to Liquidate

MUNICH, May 26—Jewish merchants in Munich were considering today the advisability of liquidating their enterprises as a result of anti-Jewish outbreaks during the last few days which assumed a serious character yesterday when Jewish stores were attacked by Nazi groups.

Although the majority of the non-Jewish population in the city is anxious to patronize Jewish business firms, the proprietors were forced yesterday to close their stores because of Nazi violence. Nazi pickets, stationed in front of every Jewish store, prevented customers from entering and threatened them with violence.

Fist Fight Breaks Out

Fist fights between non-Jewish customers and uniformed Nazis broke out in front of Jewish stores when the Nazis molested the customers. Defying the pickets, many non-Jewish women demonstratively entered the Jewish stores to do their shopping.

Police patrols were called out to prevent more serious disturbances. The police, however, was helpless against the Nazi pickets, since the picketing was organized under instructions from the Nazi leaders in the Brown House.

Fearing invasion of their stores, Jews closed their shops early in the afternoon immediately after it became clear that the Nazi pickets were determined to wreck some of the Jewish establishments in the center of the city. The glass doors

Mandates Body Meets June 3

Doubt Arab Petitions Will Be Considered At Geneva Session

GENEVA, May 26—The Mandates Commission of the League of Nations will open its session here June 3, it was officially announced today.

A number of Arab petitions have been received by the Commission. It is, however, doubtful whether they will be considered at the forthcoming session.

Dr. A. C. Loosli, expert for the Berne court in the trial of the "Protocols of the Elders of Zion," publishes today an appeal in the Swiss press warning against the Nazi menace.

"We are standing on the brink of an abyss which threatens to swallow the highest hopes of humanity," the appeal says. "The highest possessions of humanity are in danger. Save yourselves while there is still time. Don't let truth, goodwill, beauty and justice be vanquished."

Pro-Zionist Slated For Colonial Post

LONDON, May 26—Malcolm MacDonald, son of the British Premier, who is known for his pro-Zionist tendencies, will become the Colonial Secretary in the new Cabinet to be formed in June, it is predicted today in the Sunday Express.

The Sunday Dispatch reports that Sir Cunliffe-Lister, the present Colonial Secretary, will definitely leave office. According to the Dispatch, however, his successor is likely to be Sir E. Hilton Young.

Race Prejudice Laid to Jersey Dental Society

State Body Is Probing Charges Against Plainfield Unit

(Special to the J.D.B.)

NEWARK, N. J., May 26.—The Dental Society of New Jersey is today investigating charges of racial discrimination made against the Plainfield Dental Society by Dr. Herbert Shiff of that city.

In an affidavit signed by Dr. Shiff and presented at a meeting of the State society here by Dr. Mathew Rouse of this city, the Plainfield unit is accused of returning his check and application of membership in April. The charges, which created a sensation at the meeting, also stated that five other Jewish dentists who applied for admittance to the Plainfield unit had similar experiences. The five were named as Doctors William Marcus, Samuel Mintz, Aaron Hirsch and David and Victor Levitz.

Dr. Guy Hillman of Plainfield, a trustee of the State body, defended the Plainfield action, asserting the unit could do as it pleased in its own ranks.

The State Society, which registers the charges of Dr. Shiff as secretary, has named a committee of six to investigate.

Dr. Shiff is a graduate of the University of Iowa and is now an interne in the Muhlenberg Hospital of Plainfield.

Throngs in London's East End Thrilled by Royal Pair's Visit

LONDON, MAY 26—Young and old in the East End of London turned out yesterday en masse to greet the King and the Queen upon their visit to the Jewish quarter of the city.

Eight thousand extra policemen were required to control the throngs which cheered the royal pair. Thousands of children, dressed in Sabbath finery lined the streets from the early hours of morning to be sure of a glimpse of their Majesties. Excited mothers kept babies on shoulders for hours to give them a view of the royal procession.

Danzig in Retreat on Jewish Issue

To Repeal Anti-Semitic Acts If League Probe Upholds Protest

GENEVA, May 26—The Danzig government is ready to repeal its anti-Jewish legislation if a committee of jurists appointed by the League of Nations establishes that they are in violation of the Danzig constitution.

This declaration was made here by Dr. Greiser, president of the Danzig Senate, before the Council of the League of Nations, at its afternoon session yesterday, when the petition of the Danzig Jewish Community against the Senate came up for discussion.

Eden Satisfied

"This declaration is satisfactory," Capt. Anthony Eden, the British diplomat who is the rapporteur on the Danzig question, commented today. The committee of jurists must report its findings to Capt. Eden before the next session of the Council of the League in September.

Losing no time, the Council appointed yesterday the proposed committee of jurists to whom the Jewish petition will be handed over for investigation. The committee will also examine petitions against the Danzig administration submitted by Catholic and other organizations.

Cites Constitution

Capt. Eden, reporting to the Council on the complaints against the Danzig administration, emphasized that the anti-Jewish discrimination in Danzig, and the laws against non-Aryans issued by the authorities there, constitute a direct violation of paragraph 73 of the Danzig constitution.

The British diplomat analyzed the Jewish petition which not only the revocation of Jewish laws in Danzig but also the stronger efforts to prevent Jewish propaganda. He expressed the opinion that Sean Lester, the League's High Commissioner,

Palestine As Berlin Views It

BERLIN.

Special agreements for commerce between Palestine and Germany are good business and are valuable for both parties to the deal, declares Freiherr von Rheinbaben, former State Secretary and aide to Chancellor Stresemann, in an article in the Berliner Boersenzeitung from Palestine.

Pointing out that Germany is acting out of "real considerations" in facilitating exports to Palestine, he declares that "if, on the other hand, the Jewish leaders of the Jewish settlement organizations systematically bring in German immigrants, if they have deliberately themselves broken the international Jewish boycott against the New Germany, especially in Palestine, this is due equally not to sentiments and slogans but to sober interests. We perceive in the problems of present-day Palestine not only a highly interesting experiment, but we realize a good, practical and useful policy if we continue along this road of an exchange of goods and expand it."

Analyzes Population

He writes: "Palestine is only a third of the size of Bavaria and has no more than 1,200,000 inhabitants, the Jews numbering at most only 350,000 with more than 800,000 Arabs and only a few thousand Christians. The Jewish immigration comes into the country about half legally and about half illegally. The legal immigration during the last few years has been on an average of about 40,000, and in 1934 it went as high as 45,000.

"In the last two years 13,000 Jews came legally into Palestine from Germany. The majority of the Jewish immigrants are poor. Only twelve to thirteen percent bring with them the sum of £1,000 which entitles them to admission under the capitalist category. Nevertheless, during the last three years, the very considerable sum of thirty to thirty-five million pounds has in this way been brought into Palestine mainly through Zionist Jews all over the world. Germany's industrial export to Palestine in 1934 was valued at about twenty-five million marks, and Germany, with twenty-two per cent of the total imports of Palestine, took second place after Great Britain."

Sees Foundation Firm

Freiherr von Rheinbaben asks in the article whether the present economic prosperity in Palestine is genuine. There are many people, he says, who ask themselves whether this favorable development is not too rapid and therefore unsound. It is impossible under pres-

ent conditions in the world to prophesy any economic matters, he says. But even a decline of the prosperity in Palestine, or a real crisis could not again destroy certain foundations and real factors that have been created.

"The Near East after the Great War is a new economic territory that has been opened up that is not without its own raw material, and is inhabited by a large well-governed population that is growing accustomed to modern methods and needs," he points out. This makes continued progress appear certain.

The Arab-Jewish Problem

With regard to the differences between Arabs and Jews, he believes that there is a real political problem there. "Many thousands of poor Arabs naturally view with astonishment and with enmity that which is being created by the immigrant Jews in front of their eyes. But it is a long way from nursing such feelings to the possibility of again expelling this section of the Jewish population or otherwise destroying them. Large sections of the Arab population are profiting by the general progress of the country. In addition, the systematic direction of Jewish immigration to Palestine does not pursue the aim of converting Palestine into a Jewish State, but only according to the Balfour Declaration, assuring the Jews a National Home in Palestine. Even if there are efforts made on the Jewish side to create a total Jewish State, as there are on the other hand also adherents of a pan-Arab confederation including Palestine, the fact is that the land is in the firm grip of the British Empire. So far as any human being can be sure of anything, Palestine will become neither the one nor the other."

The writer pays tribute to the far-seeing British art of government. "Higher than the humanitarian aim of the Jewish homeland, there is the security and expansion of the British Empire," he declares.

"If we in Germany," he concludes, "promote Jewish emigration to Palestine by means of a special agreement, if we import Jaffa oranges and export to an increasing extent industrial articles to Palestine, if we ourselves contribute by providing machinery to create a native industry in Palestine which can cater to the needs of the population of the Near East, we are doing this out of very real considerations.

"If, on the other hand, the Jewish leaders of the Jewish settlement organizations systematically bring in German immigrants, if they have deliberately themselves broken the international Jewish boycott against the New Germany, especially in Palestine, this is due equally not to sentiments and slogans, but to sober interests. Between the Lines

A King's Visit to Jews

I am not an admirer of kings, but I admit I was somewhat touched by the fact that the King and Queen of England took it upon themselves to pay a special visit last Saturday to the Jewish district of London.

Under the present circumstances, when Mosley in England joins hands with Streicher in Germany against Jews, the special visit of the royal pair to the East Side of London is of significance. It shows that the rulers of England totally disapprove of anti-Semitism. It emphasizes that King George considers the English Jews equal members of the British family of nations.

Special Efforts Made

Few probably are aware that the King of England is not permitted to enter the city of London without special permission from the Lord Mayor. Thus his visit to the Jewish East Side of London meant that the King had to make a special effort and go through certain formalities. The royal visit to the Jews on a Sabbath was therefore not incidental. It was a demonstration of the King's direct interest in his Jewish subjects.

The Jews of England do not play a very important role in politics. Certainly not the Jews of Whitechapel. Nor do they play a role in finance. The few Jews like Sir Herbert Samuel or the Marquis of Reading who are active in British politics are as far removed from the Jewish masses as Secretary Morgenthau is from Jewish interests in America.

A Pro-Jewish Demonstration

The visit of the King to Whitechapel—the heart of the Jewish slums in London—cannot therefore be regarded a visit by a "politician" anxious to win more political support or popularity. It must be taken purely as a demonstration of pro-Jewish sentiment. It is from this angle that the attention bestowed by the King on the London East Side on Saturday will not only be appreciated by the Jews of England, but will be remembered by Jews of other countries. It will influence many Englishmen against Mosley's anti-Jewish propaganda. It will no doubt be cited as an illustration of British good-will towards the Jews as compared with the ill-will prevailing in many European countries.

Royal Wish for Jews

At a time when the anti-Jewish spirit is spreading rapidly throughout the world, the King's visit to the Jews is the best indication that Great Britain is immune to anti-Semitism, at least for the time being. The people of England respect their King. The special trip which he made to the East Side of London will be taken by them as a sign that the King disapproves of anti-Jewish agitation and that it is his wish to have the Jews considered as equals.

World Press Digest

Reviews Plight of Polish Jews in France

The Manchester Guardian, commenting on the plight of Polish Jews in France in connection with the anti-alien legislation, says:

Bitter cases of injustice are being heard of more and more often. There is, for instance, a Jewish hatmaker who has lived in France for twelve years and has two children; there is a young girl, a dressmaker, who has been fifteen years in the country—the authorities have withdrawn the right to work from both of them. There is a hairdresser with a child born in France. His French employer has been ordered to send the "foreigner" away. As for contracts of employment and "patentes," it is unreasonable to expect the hunted, struggling, small Jewish employers to manage their businesses as efficiently as the respectable "good citizens" and regular "taxpayers" do. And even these "patentes" are of no use in such a case as that of about forty Jewish small traders in Lille who have just been forbidden to do business in the "marchés," although they have paid their taxes regularly, have been living more than ten years in the country, and have children born in France.

Quotes Marx Solution Of Well Known Problem

The Sunday Referee of London, writing of Semitism and anti-Semitism, says:

Of one thing we may be certain: the bad qualities which are attributed to the Semites are always resident in the anti-Semites themselves and in the system of society from which they spring.

Only an illiterate demagogue like Hitler would maintain that the so-called bad qualities of the Jews—their love of money and power—are to be found only in people of Jewish blood. These particular qualities are shared by ninety per cent of people, Jewish and non-Jewish alike.

In a brilliant essay on "The Jewish Question," Karl Marx wrote: "What is the secular cult of the Jew? Huckstering. What is his secular God? Money. Very well. Emancipation from huckstering and money would be the self-emancipation of our epoch.

"An organization of society which would abolish the fundamental conditions of huckstering, and, therefore, the possibility of huckstering, would render the Jew impossible."

It would also render the anti-Semite impossible.

Conflicting Figures On Reich Emigration

The Irish News of Belfast reports the following facts from Germany:

The Reich Statistical Office announces that according to its count, there were 500,000 Jews in Germany in 1933. This represents a reduction of 65,000 since the previous count in 1925, and is the first actual reduction since the Jewish emancipation 120 years ago, says a Berlin message.

Half of the Jews lived in the six cities of Berlin, Frankfurt-am-Main, Breslau, Hamburg, Cologne, and Leipzig, with Frankfurt showing the highest proportion to the total population, namely 4.7 per cent.

The Racial Policy Office of the National Socialist party states that according to its figures only 40,000 Jews have left Germany since the introduction of the anti-Jewish legislation and it cites this as proof that all stories of "brutal persecution of Jews in Germany are purposeful lies."

An Admirer of Semitic Languages

The New York Times carries the following in its editorial section, "Topics of the Times":

In the Eighties of the last century there was a young instructor of dead languages at Yale who actually succeeded in creating an enthusiasm for Hebrew among the members of the large junior class; this aside from his theological and graduate students. He taught Hebrew, Assyrian, Arabic, Aramaic and Syriac. His name was William Rainey Harper, and he was so completely spoiled for active life by his liking for dusty Semitic languages that in later years the best he could extract from John D. Rockefeller was a mere \$70,000,000 for building up Chicago University, of which he was the first president.

Edwin R. Embree in the June Atlantic calls W. R. Harper "perhaps the most picturesque figure in the whole history of American universities," and "the dynamic figure of American scholarship." He was a teacher of Hebrew, but when in the Nineties at Chicago he started in to pay \$7,000 salaries to professors he "rocked the academic world," says Mr. Embree, and laid the foundations of one of the world's greatest universities.

Aid Is Offered By Restaurants To Appeal Drive

Thousands to Contribute 5% of Income on June 19

Thousands of restaurants and cafeterias in New York will contribute five per cent of their income Wednesday, June 19, to the support of German-Jewish refugees, it was announced yesterday by the United Appeal.

The largest restaurant associations in New York have designated June 19 as "Restaurant Day", the announcement says.

Among those participating are The Metropolitan Restaurant and Cafeteria Owners Association, the Christian Germans' Restaurant Association, the Quality Restaurant Association of Christian Greeks, the Brooklyn Restaurant Association, the Greater New York Restaurant Association, and the United Restaurant Owners Association.

Lack of Funds May Close Lithuanian Schools

Thousands of Jewish school children in Lithuania are faced with the imminent likelihood of the closing of their schools because of lack of funds, it was stated yesterday by Joseph C. Hyman, secretary of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, who made public a report which he had just received from the Board for Hebrew Education in Lithuania.

The closing of these schools, the report points out, will not only deprive large numbers of the 16,000 boys and girls in the Lithuanian schools of all cultural opportunities, but will also add to the economic burden of the Jews of that land by increasing unemployment. The educational institutions of Lithuania have for many years, Mr. Hyman stated, been receiving assistance in maintaining themselves, from the Joint Distribution Committee.

Farewell Reception For Bentwich Tonight

Samuel J. Bloomingdale and William Fosenwald will be hosts at a farewell reception to be tendered to Prof. Norman Bentwich tonight at Mr. Rosenwald's residence. Leaders of New York Jewry, with whom Prof. Bentwich has been cooperating through the United Jewish Appeal, in stimulating interest in welfare activity on behalf of the German-Jewish refugees, will attend the reception.

Prof. Bentwich will sail for Europe on the Berengaria May 30, after nearly two months of intensive relief activity in this country.

Would Establish 3 Palestine Museums

Ussishkin Suggests Tributes To Herzl, Bialik and Baron de Rothschild

TEL AVIV, May 26—The establishment of three Jewish national museums in Palestine was urged today by M. M. Ussishkin, the veteran Zionist leader, at the closing ceremonies of the "Bialik Days."

Mr. Ussishkin suggested that one museum be established in Jerusalem on Mt. Scopus and carry the name of Dr. Herzl, signifying the political renaissance of the Jews. A second would be established in Tel Aviv and named after Chaim Nachman Bialik, the Hebrew poet, signifying the Jewish cultural achievements. The third would carry the name of Baron de Rothschild, in Rishon L'Zion, the first Jewish colony in Palestine, established by the late Baron.

Sweeping revision of high school text books of Texas was demanded by Rabbi Ephraim of Temple Beth-El, San Antonio, protesting derogatory references to the Jews in school books, before the State Board of Education here. Zhitlovsky Fete Ends in Melee In Jerusalem

Celebration Is Disrupted By Clashes Between Language Factions

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
JERUSALEM, May 26—The celebration of the seventieth birthday of Dr. Chaim Zhitlovsky, noted American-Jewish writer and philosopher, was marred here today by clashes between Jews who insist that Hebrew is the only language to be used in Palestine and others who favor the use of Yiddish.

The Hebraists invaded the meeting at which the Zhitlovsky jubilee was celebrated and turned off the lights, turning the audience into a panic. Stone volleys then forced the public hurriedly to quit the hall.

Four policemen were wounded in the clash. The meeting was disbanded by the authorities in order to avoid more serious fights.

Dr. Zhitlovsky is known as a Yiddishist, who advocates the use of Yiddish as well as Hebrew in Palestine. The rumor spread that the attack on the Zhitlovsky celebration was made by Revisionists. Leaders of the Revisionist movement in Jerusalem promptly denied the rumor.

A celebration in honor of Zhitlovsky was held last week in Tel Aviv. The celebration went off quietly.

Training Farm For Reich Jews Closed by Nazis

24 Families Preparing For Palestine Life Told to Get Out

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, May 26—The Nazi authorities today liquidated the country's largest Jewish agricultural settlement in Gross-Gaglow near Kottbus, where Jewish youths were being trained for work on farms in Palestine and other countries.

The sum of 300,000 marks, approximately \$120,000, had been spent by the Jewish Community on this settlement, which has been in existence for four years. The twenty-four Jewish families now practicing colonization work at the settlement were ordered by the authorities to vacate the land by June 1.

The Gross-Gaglow Jewish Settlement was progressing nicely before Hitler came to power. Difficulties made for the colony by the Nazis after Herr Kube, the Nazi leader, was appointed District Commissioner of Brandenburg, where the colony is situated. The colony had been supported recently by American funds coming from the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee.

The welfare authorities in Hamburg today issued an order forbidding students of trade schools who receive public support to take lessons from Jewish teachers. The order aims to force out of existence the few remaining Jewish music teachers.

Price Strike Hits 4,500 Meat Shops

meat retailers, but against the "big four" packers who, they charge, are doing their best to "jack up" prices. The three wholesale distributors in New York are the United Beef Company, the Wilson Packing House and the Swift Company.

At last night's meeting of the meat retailers sentiment was expressed that the consumers had compelled them to do what they should have done themselves, namely, to force wholesale prices down by a general strike. It was indicated that after the consumers' boycott is ended, the kosher butchers may continue an independent strike.

Indications that the strike is spreading to the poultry industry were given yesterday by Abraham Belsky, president, and Sol Obrentz, secretary, of the Retail Poultry Dealers Association of the Bronx. Both said that the strike was affecting kosher poultry sales in the Bronx.

Belsky criticized Mayor LaGuardia for permitting women to picket retail establishments which remained open in the face of the strike. He charged that pickets were going into kosher meat shops and dragging out prospective customers.

Taking cognizance of the shipments of kosher meat into the New York market from Canada, the Agudath Harabonim, a local organization of rabbis, declared an issuer (rabbinical ban) on Canadian meat in a conference at the Broadway Central Hotel.

2,000 March in J.N.F. Parade for Palestine

More than 2,000 persons participated in a torchlight parade through East Side streets last night as a preliminary to the Jewish National Fund Flower Day next Sunday. Charles Cohen addressed an open air meeting of the paraders.

sioner for Danzig, be given greater powers.

In League circles the belief was expressed today that the decision of the Council will bring immediate relief to the Jews of Danzig and that the Danzig Senate will now modify its anti-Jewish laws before the investigation committee starts its inquiry.

Paragraph 73 of the Danzig constitution, which the Jewish petition claims has been violated, provides that "all nationals of Danzig are equal before the law."

"Exceptional laws," the paragraph reads, "shall be inadmissible. All men and women in Danzig shall have the same civil rights and duties. No legal privileges or disqualifications shall be practiced due to religion, birth or position."

The plan is being carried out by the Nazis under the influence of Julius Streicher, the notorious enemy of the Jews who, as the ruler of Franconia, is gaining adherents in Bavaria.

While undecided whether or not to reopen their stores tomorrow, a number of Jewish merchants here communicated with their friends in Berlin with a view to transferring their business to Berlin. Many were also considering emigrating abroad, since it is clear that Jews will be ousted from commerce in Munich by the terroristic methods

Asked Goebbels for Pamphlets, Rutgers Professor Confesses

NEW BRUNSWICK, N. J., May 26—Dr. Frederick J. Hauptmann, head of the German department at the New Jersey College for Women, charged with spreading anti-Semitism and pro-Nazi propaganda

among his students, will continue his testimony tomorrow before the investigating committee of Rutgers University, of which the women's college is a part.

Testifying yesterday, Dr. Hauptmann admitted his contact with Goebbels, the Nazi Minister of Propaganda, and with Dr. Ernst F. Hanfstaengl, the Nazi Chief of the Foreign Press Bureau in Germany. He also admitted that he supplied students with Nazi books and pamphlets "in order to educate them to an impartial view of the German situation."

Dr. Hauptmann explained that his connections with Goebbels consisted of writing to him for "material for cultural propaganda" which he intended to distribute throughout the United States. Dr. Hauptmann admitted that this letter to Goebbels was sent by him only recently.

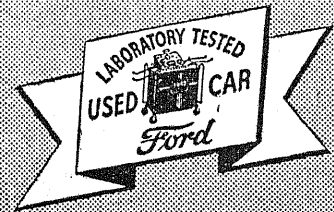
