Poultry Co. Upsets NRA Code System

Supreme Court Holds Schechter Conviction Unconstitutional

(Special to the J.D.B.)

WASHINGTON, May 27—A decision of far-reaching importance demolishing the code system set up under the National Industrial Recovery Act was handed down by the Supreme Court today on the basis of the appeal of the Schechter Brothers—Joseph, Martin, Alex and Aaron—Brooklyn wholesalers of kosher poultry, from a conviction under the Live Poultry Code for the metropolitan area.

In a long-awaited decision which affects a large part of the New Deal legislation, the Supreme Court declared that under the Constitution, Congress has no right to delegate to the President the legislative powers of creating codes and that, further, the Schechter brothers' poultry business was not interstate commerce and not therefore subject to the control of the federal government.

Two Appeals Covered

The case involved appeals by both the government and the Schechter brothers. The administration was seeking reversal of the decision of the Circuit Court of Appeals overruling the conviction of the four brothers on minimum wage and hour provisions, and the Schechters were seeking a Supreme Court ruling annulling the original convictions on seventeen other counts in the live poultry code.

The decision served to set aside fines and convictions against the Schechter brothers. The four Jewish brothers and two corporations, the A.L.A. Schechter Live Poultry Corporation and the Schechter Live Poultry Market, Inc., were first drawn into the case which was later to test the whole NRA set-up, when they allegedly disregarded provisions of the live poultry code in regard to rules for fair competition, minimum wages and maximum hours.

Indicted on 60 Counts

As a result they were haled into Brooklyn Federal Court on indictments containing sixty counts. The four brothers were charged with selling diseased poultry, slaughtering fowl by illegal methods, coercing and intimidating NRA inspectors and failing to post prices. The

DRESDEN, May 27—An intensified campaign against Jews was launched in Dresden today by Nazi headquarters here.

The Freiheitskampf, a local Nazi paper, issued a special anti-Jewish supplement with articles on the Jews in Saxony. The paper also reprints a series of articles on the "Elders of the Protocols of Zion," which were published recently in the Voelkischer Beobachter in Berlin.

Congress Body Has Observer At Rutgers Quiz

Will Report Findings to Washington; State Probe Debated

(Special to the J.D.B.)

NEW BRUNSWICK, N. J., May 27—Stephen Birmingham, chief investigator of the Congressional Committee on Un-American Activities, was present today as an observer of the Federal government at the investigation by the trustees of Rutgers University into the charges against Dr. Frederick J. Hauptmann, the head of the German department of its women's college, accused of spreading anti-Semitism and pro-Nazi propaganda among the students.

Mr. Birmingham declared that he will submit a report to the Congressional committee and that he is watching the proceedings of the investigation with great interest.

State Probe Looms

A State investigation into the pro-Nazi activities at the women's college will be asked tonight at Trenton where the State Assembly will consider the annual appropriation of \$840,000 to Rutgers University.

J. Edward Ashmead, chairman of the Rutgers committee, declared today that the investigation may be converted into an inquiry on a national scope, in order to establish to what extent German educators are responsible for spreading Nazi propaganda in American universities.

Dr. Hauptmann, continuing his testimony, admitted that he could not tolerate the dismissed Prof. Bergel because of the latter's anti-Nazi attitude, and especially because of his physical attack by two unidentified assailants.

Nazi Citizen Law Asked In Austria

Demand Is Voiced in Press to Test Public Opinion

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

VIENNA, May 27—A demand that the Austrian government re-examine the naturalizations issued since 1918 is voiced today in one of the Viennese newspapers closely connected with the government.

This demand, if carried out, will affect tens of thousands of Jews in Austria, formerly citizens of Poland, Rumania and Czechoslovakia, who obtained their naturalization papers after 1918.

Jewish leaders here regard the article in the government paper as a "ballon d'essai." It is believed that the government wishes to test the reaction to this demand abroad as well as within Austria.

The article in the government paper suggests that the reexamination be conducted along the same lines as in Nazi Germany. Thousands of Jewish families in Germany have had their citizenship revoked in the last two years merely on the ground that the naturalization took place after 1918.

The denaturalized citizens of Austria would remain "persons without a country," since they would not be given citizenship by their native lands, whose citizenship they gave up when they became naturalized Austrians.

Police Release Arab Suspect

Another in Jerusalem Murder Mystery Is Detained

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

JERUSALEM, May 27—The Palestine police today released one of the two Arabs arrested in connection with the murder of Kalman Shapiro, son of a rabbi, who was assassinated in the streets of Jerusalem while protecting his aunt from a physical attack by two unidentified assailants.

The police detained the second Arab for further investigation.

The failure of the Palestine police to find the murderers of the Jewish youth has provoked a good deal of criticism among the Jews here. In this connection, it is pointed out that two years ago Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, leading member of the Zionist Executive, was assassinated under similar circumstances, and as yet the police have not succeeded in finding the murderers.

The Zionist Revisionist daily newspaper, Hayarden, has been suspended by the authorities for a month, for criticizing the inactivity of the police in the Shapiro murder case.

Dorothea Bloch Opera Is Hailed in Rome

ROME, May 27—The opera "Asfodela," composed by Dorothea Bloch, a New York Jewish girl, was performed here last night with great success.

Leading musicians and critics were present at the performance. This is believed to be the first time that an opera written by an American was performed in Rome.

Jews Reopen Stores After Munich Riots

Fears Quieted by Official Action Against Nazi Rioters by Bavaria

MUNICH, May 27—The Jewish population of Munich read today with great relief an official statement issued by the Bavarian Minister of Interior Wagner, promising prosecution of all those involved in the anti-Jewish riots last Saturday.

The Minister's statement came as a surprise to many residents of this city, since the local press carefully avoided reporting Saturday's anti-Jewish outbreak. It encouraged the Jewish shopkeepers to reopen their stores today after having been forced by Nazi pickets to close them down on Saturday.

The statement issued by Minister Wagner blames expelled members of the Nazi Party for the anti-Jewish terror which has been going on in Munich for the last two weeks.

To Be Tried

Herr Wagner announced that the ringleaders in Saturday's events have been arrested and will be put on trial. Their names are given in his statement as Schmidt and Kopf, expelled from the Nazi ranks for embezzlement.

Failing to explain why the Nazi pickets started their operations from the City Hall, Herr Wagner, who is a staunch supporter of Julius Streicher, says in his official communique:

"A group of irresponsible elements, acting under the leadership of a person named Schmidt, formerly a member of the Steel Helmets, and another named Kopf, who was expelled last year from the Nazi Party for embezzlement,

Election Law Is Modified By Poland

Jews to Be Represented in Sejm as Result Of Changes

WARSAW, May 27—The election regulations in Poland were modified by the government today in such a way as to give the Jewish population a better chance to elect Jewish deputies to the Polish Parliament from the cities of Cracow, Wilno, Posen and Kattowice, where there is a large proportion of Jewish inhabitants.

Instead of one seat in the Sejm for each of these four cities, the government today amended the election rules to provide two seats for each city. This increases the possibilities for Jewish candidates.

May Name Candidate

A second change will give Jews the right to put up their own candidates in the next parliamentary elections. The reform consists of permitting every group of 500 citizens to nominate their own candidate for elections.

Today's modification of the election law is viewed with great relief by Jewish leaders. Without the changes, the Jews would have been deprived of representatives in the Polish Parliament.

Bars Jewish Ads

The Gazeta Warszawska, official organ of the anti-Semitic National Democratic Party of Poland, reappeared today under a new name—Dziennik Narodowy. The paper announces in its first issue that it will not accept any advertisements from Jews.

The anti-Semitic Gazeta Warszawska, which had been in existence since 1774, suspended publication last week as a result of the disrespectful attitude which it had adopted toward the late Marshal Pilsudski at the time of his funeral. As a result, the paper was expelled from the All-Polish Newspaper Association; the members of its staff were expelled from the Polish Press Club; advertising agencies withdrew their advertisements and dozens of national organizations instructed their members to boycott the paper. This resulted in the closing down of the publication, which opposed the Pilsudski regime as well as the Jews.

British Deputies Vote to Push Work of Joint Foreign Group

LONDON, May 27—The importance of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency in Jewish life was emphasized yesterday by Neville Laski, president of the Board of Deputies of British Jews, in an address before the Board.

Mr. Laski referred to the value of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency news service in connection with a report on the Jewish situation in Germany presented to the Board of Deputies by Leonard Montefiore, British Jewish elder and head of

the Joint Foreign Committee. As a result of Mr. Montefiore's report, a number of proposals to strengthen the activities of the Joint Foreign Committee and the Board of Deputies were adopted.

In his report, Mr. Montefiore sharply denounces the elimination of Jews from military service in Germany under the new conscription law, and protests in the name of German and British Jewry against the creation of a Pariah class by the Nazis.

Asks Mandates Body to Extend Hebrew Telegraph in Palestine

HAIFA, May 27—The expansion of Hebrew telegraphy in the Palestine Telegraph System is demanded today in a memorandum submitted to the Mandates Commission of the League of Nations by Israel Amikah, a private citizen of Palestine who is a telegraph expert.

This is the third memorandum submitted by Mr. Amikah to the Mandates Commission.

Acting upon his previous memorandums, the commission decided that the Palestine government should install a telegraphic system in Palestine enabling transmission of messages in Hebrew. Following this decision, the government introduced Hebrew telegraphy in only a few Palestine cities. Mr. Amikah, in his memorandum today, demands that the system be extended throughout the entire country.

Peace Negotiations in Palestine

JERUSALEM.

Negotiations between the Vaad Leumi, the National Council of Palestinian Jewry, and the Central Committee of the Agudath Israel, are now taking place. Representatives of the Palestine government are deeply interested in these negotiations, whose purpose is to establish peace in the ranks of Palestinian Jewry and to widen the basis on which the National Council of Palestinian Jewry is built.

As a matter of fact, the Council does not represent the whole Jewish population of Palestine. Only part of Palestine Jewry is organized in and subject to the Knesseth Israel. The Knesseth Israel is a freely organized body to which one may or may not belong.

The Farmers' Association, for instance, or the Agudath Israel, do not belong to the Knesseth Israel. The latter for political reasons, the former for political and religious reasons. Since there is no law forcing anybody to be a member of the Knesseth Israel and to fulfill his obligation toward the organized Jewry of Palestine, certain groups feel more obligations outside of this representative body.

Guards Religious Interests

The motives which inspired the Agudath Israel not to participate are clear: The Agudah doesn't want to be subject to a secular representation. The Agudah is afraid that its religious interests will suffer by a compulsory association. No reasons whatsoever and no promises given by the Vaad Leumi to the Agudah were able to persuade it that the religious rights of Orthodox Jewry would be respected and protected. The guarantees required by the Agudah were too much for the Vaad Leumi. So the Agudah was left outside.

But it is most inconvenient for Orthodox Jewry to establish a separate kehillah in order to continue a separate political and social line of action. The lack of prestige, the lack of means, the lack of power dictates sometimes steps which a strong and rich body would not take. The Agudath Israel feels now that to have influence on the political and economic life of the Palestine Jewry it has to be organized in a bigger association and beside of this association to exercise the required influence. Organization, however, means discipline, means fulfilling of certain obligations towards the body in which it is included. Is the Agudah now ready to accept the conditions of the Vaad Leumi? In spite of all, it seems that this is to be answered in the negative.

The Vaad Leumi, on the other side, feels that in order to have the right to represent the Jewry of Palestine and to exercise real power, in order to be able to speak on behalf of Jewry with the full conscience that it is truly representative, has to agree to certain compromises and to give the newcomers the same right as the others have. Is the Vaad Leumi, now, ready to make concessions to the Agudah? In spite of all, it would appear that this too is to be answered.

But the most important "pushing power" is the Palestine government itself. Strange as it may be, the Palestine government is the most interested party in this triangle. The government has twice been asked during the sessions of the Mandates Commission of the League of Nations about the reasons for two separate kehilloth in Palestine. The government was able to give a satisfactory answer and was advised to establish peace in the ranks of Palestinian Jewry, and also to establish one united representative body.

Find Agreement Hard

The government promised the Mandates Commission to carry out this "peace-mission," but has not yet succeeded. Previously, the Agudath Israel went too far in its requirements and the Vaad Leumi was too conservative in its concessions.

The conditions posed by the Agudah were that a separate religious court, with power to judge in all religious questions, and also members belonging to the Agudah, be established; that a special budget be granted to the Agudah in order to carry out its work and that this budget be not discussable in the Vaad Leumi. All this would mean that the Agudah intends to get, on a formal basis and under legal veil, an altogether separate kehillah.

It is obvious that the Vaad Leumi, in order to maintain its prestige, and in order to have full control, could not agree to these conditions. Therefore previous negotiations, even under the government's supervision, did not succeed.

Prospects of Success Dim

Are there any prospects for more successful results this year? It seems not. It seems that the prospects for a satisfactory agreement are even less this year than before.

Prevailing opinion in leading circles of the Vaad Leumi is, that under the present circumstances, in view of the exaggerated demands of the Agudath Israel, no concessions whatsoever will be given it. On the other side, we gather that the Agudath Israel is firm in its demands and will not make any concessions to the Vaad Leumi—especially now, when the Agudah has started its own Agency, with a separate political and economic program.

Defer Einstein Dinner

A dinner in honor of Prof. Albert Einstein by the Greater New York division of the United Jewish Appeal campaign, originally scheduled for Mecca Temple tonight, has been postponed to June 20. Prof. Einstein is spending two weeks in Bermuda.

Between the Lines

An Editor's Jubilee

Certain Jewish elements suffering from an inferiority complex are inclined to believe that the general press is superior to the Jewish press and that the average American editor is more intelligent than the average editor of a Jewish publication.

This is not so. To be a Jewish editor is much more difficult than to be an editor of an English paper. To write on Jewish subjects in connection with world politics one must know more than the politics of this or that country.

While the work of a non-Jewish journalist is usually limited to one particular field, the work of the Jewish journalist is many-sided. The editor of a Jewish newspaper in America must be thoroughly versed not only in Jewish affairs but also in general life. He must know not only Jewish history but the histories of all nations and all times. He must know the geography of all European countries and of the countries in the Near East. He must know languages. He must be able to watch political events in many countries abroad. He must have a good background in international affairs.

A Many-sided Personality

Peter Wiernick, the editor-in-chief of the Jewish Morning Journal whose seventieth birthday will be celebrated in New York tomorrow, is such an editor. There are few subjects of which Mr. Wiernick has not a fundamental knowledge. There is hardly an event of significance upon which Mr. Wiernick could not comment with profound authority.

To the small circle of people who happen to know Mr. Wiernick intimately, he is a living encyclopedia. Shy, modest, and studious, he enjoys the deep respect of his collaborators and of all those who happen to come in contact with him.

An historian, Mr. Wiernick is a member of the American Academy of Political Science. He is a member of the American Geographical Society; he is a member of the American Oriental Society; he takes an interest in everything dealing with history, geography, politics and science, not to speak of Jewish life.

An Enemy of Publicity

Few people know about Mr. Wiernick's studious activities. This is explained by another of his virtues—a desire to avoid publicity. In all his years as an editor Mr. Wiernick took pains that his name should be mentioned as rarely as possible. He made it his policy to shun the limelight. Publicity to him is an expression of vulgarity.

Busy with his daily editorial work and his researches, Mr. Wiernick finds time also for activity in Jewish institutions. He is the founder and the leader of the Jewish Literary Club, "Hav-rutha"; he is a member of the executive of the Joint Distribution Committee; he is a trustee of cultural foundations; he is a member of the board of directors of Yeshivah College.

Mr. Wiernick is a Jewish scholar who fully deserves the title "Talmud Hacham." Had he been the editor of an English newspaper his birthday tomorrow would have been an event of national-wide importance. As the editor-in-chief of a Jewish paper, his seventieth anniversary will be celebrated tomorrow by all leaders in Jewish life and by all those who know what Mr. Wiernick means to Jewish journalism.

World Press Digest

Details of Reich Press Law

The London Times, reporting on the new German press law forbidding Jews to publish newspapers, gives the following details:

The following are disqualified from publishing newspapers:— Public corporations and their subsidiary organs; companies, co-operatives, and endowments; legal persons and associations whose aims, activities, or composition show their structure to be professional, class or confessional; persons and associations of persons in the service of public corporations, or of professional, class and confessional institutions, except those performing honorary service in local self-government, the Reich Press Chamber or a similar body; those exercising their rights on behalf of a third party, except in the capacity of a trustee; those unable to prove Aryan descent from the year 1800 for themselves and their spouses; undertakings in which other newspaper concerns, have rights; concerns and persons enjoying rights in a concern which serve for the joint publication of newspapers; concerns which publish daily newspapers in several places or for several places, except for sub-editions circulating in areas not served by the main edition or another sub-edition; and, lastly, concerns which themselves are members, or whose owners, privileged beneficiaries, or leading employees, are members without the permission of the president of the Reich Press Chamber of any newspaper publishers' association not affiliated to the Reich Press Chamber.

Non-Aryans and persons in the service of public corporations or professional class, or confessional institutions are therefore forbidden any sort of activity in a newspaper concern.

AJC Women Ask Britain to Speed Entry

Stronger Boycott Voted At First National Parley Here

Resolutions calling on Great Britain to facilitate Jewish immigration to Palestine and urging intensification of the anti-Nazi boycott were adopted by about 250 delegates attending the first national conference of the women's division of the American Jewish Congress at the Hotel Barbizon-Plaza yesterday.

In an address at the afternoon session, Miriam Beard, daughter of Prof. Charles A. Beard, warned that Germany is being transformed into a "soldier state" which, she declared, is a grave challenge to democracy. Dr. Gerhart Segar, exiled former member of the German Reichstag, declared that the majority of Germans are not in favor of Hitler but are prevented by Nazi coercion from making their wishes known.

The Nazis, he asserted, have two war aims: the erection of a "greater Germany" and the domination of the world by the "Aryans." He warned that Nazi propaganda is being spread in the United States.

At a luncheon earlier in the day in honor of Mrs. Stephen S. Wise, Bernard S. Deutsch greeted the delegates in his capacity of acting mayor. He said their movement "bids fair to become one of the most potent forces in American Jewish life."

Rabbi Stephen S. Wise was presented with a portrait of his wife, who was later reelected president of the women's division.

Periman, Mrs. Jacob M. Ross, vice-presidents; Mrs. Bernard S. Deutsch, treasurer; Miss Beth Levin Siegel, financial secretary, and Mrs. Benjamin Lazaron, recording secretary.

A resolution was adopted deploring the attempt in European countries to deprive Jews and other minorities of equality rights. "An unremitting battle to establish equality rights to Jews and to create positive values in Jewish life" was pledged.

Other resolutions were passed greeting Mrs. Wise and expressing sorrow at the death of Jane Addams.

Far Rockaway Launches Jewish Appeal Drive

The struggle against Nazism is not only the concern of Jews, organized labor or Catholics, but of every man, woman and child, declared Nathan Straus, co-chairman of the Appeal's Greater New York campaign, in an address at the Jewish Center of Far Rockaway Sunday night. Rumania Urged To Take Action On Anti-Semites

Jewish Party Charges Government Laxity In Curbing Bias

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BUCHAREST, May 27—A series of resolutions expressing complaint to the government against the present treatment of the Jews in Rumania were adopted today at a mass meeting of the Rumanian Jewish Party here, which was addressed by numerous Jewish leaders.

The resolutions charge that:

1. The government permits the anti-Semitic press in Rumania the fullest freedom in inciting anti-Jewish hatred, despite the prevailing martial law in the country, which prohibits anti-racial propaganda.

2. The government is not enforcing the martial law properly when matters of Jewish interest are involved.

3. The government is helping Rumanians to advance in their business and does not grant similar opportunities to Jewish business men, thus violating the rights and vital interests of Jews in commerce.

4. The government does not provide sufficient protection for Jewish students in the Rumanian universities.

Protesting against the government's failure to act, and warning that present conditions are a menace not only to the Jews but the entire political and economic welfare of the country, the Rumanian Jewish Party in its resolutions urges public opinion "to influence the government to take rigorous measures against the growing anti-Jewish feeling in the country."

(Continued from Page One) have been terrorizing the population in Munich. They have tried to hide their real activities by asserting that they are furthering an anti-Semitic movement. They have induced Munich merchants to contribute huge sums of money.

"This group is responsible for all the disturbances of the last two weeks and especially for those which took place on Saturday. They defaced the show windows of Jewish stores and compelled the proprietors to close their establishments. They also attacked Roman Catholics and broke up street collections in aid of Catholic charities. They also hindered and insulted police forces who were attempting to carry out their duty. Their leaders have now been arrested.

"The arrested ringleaders will be brought to trial on charges of disturbing the peace and public order," the official communique promises.

"The stories about the Nazi atrocities are as true as the stories of the German atrocities in Belgium during the war," he insisted. He denied that he dismissed Prof. Bergel from the staff for political reasons.

(Continued from Page One) brothers were found guilty on nineteen counts and were sentenced to a total of seven months in jail and \$7,425 in fines.

The defendants appealed the case to the Circuit Court of Appeals which ruled that the wage and hour provisions of the code were unconstitutional but sustained the lower court on the other counts. Immediately, the government seized upon this case as a clear test of the whole NRA and appealed to the Supreme Court to overrule the Circuit Court on those two counts. At the same time the Schechters appealed the other seventeen counts. The Supreme Court decision was a complete victory for the Schechters.

Tel Aviv to Erect Museum In Honor of Poet Bialik

Nine hundred persons subscribed to the testimonial banquet. Dr. David E. Wezlein, Superintendent of Public Instruction, was the toastmaster.

Achimeier Will Keep Palestine Citizenship

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) JERUSALEM, May 27—The Palestine government today decided to cancel its decision to revoke the citizenship of Abba Achimeier, Revisionist leader who is now in prison for anti-government propaganda.

Mr. Achimeier will be released August 4. It is understood that he will be permitted to remain in the country as a full-fledged Palestine citizen.

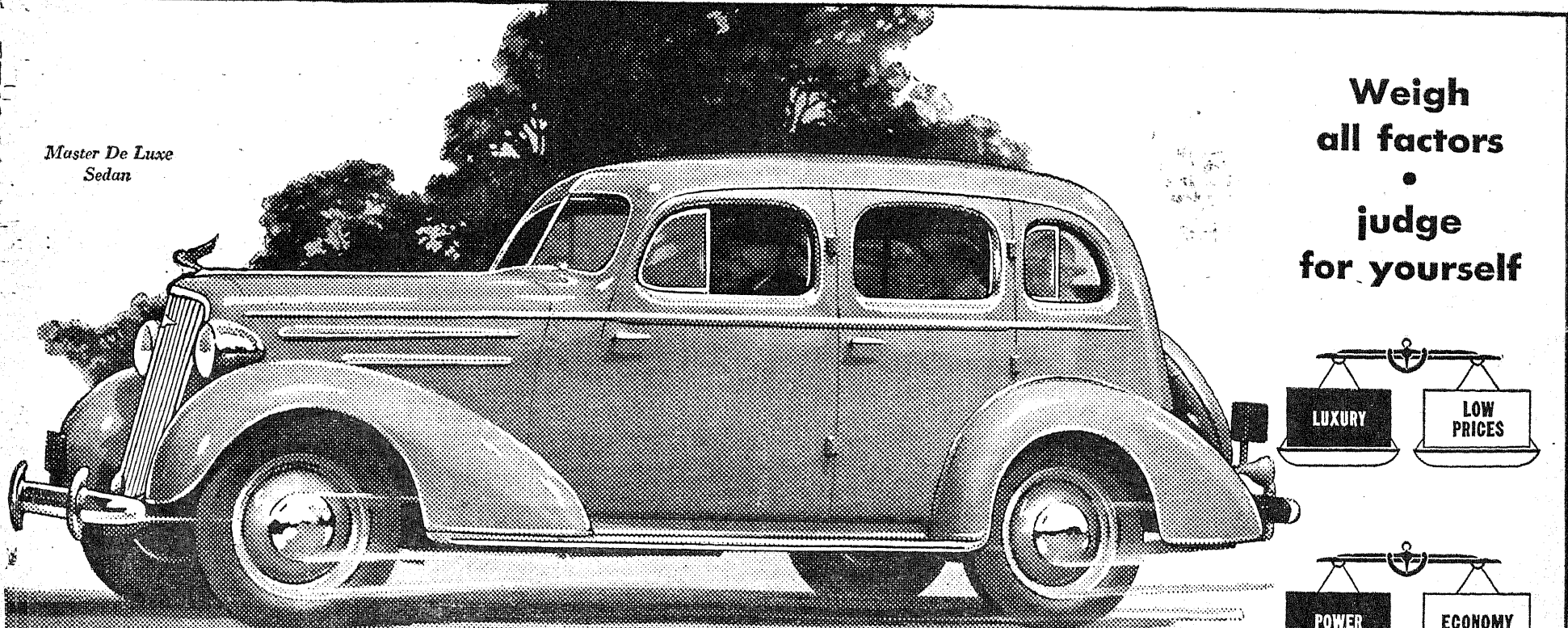
Ask Nazi Citizen Law in Austria

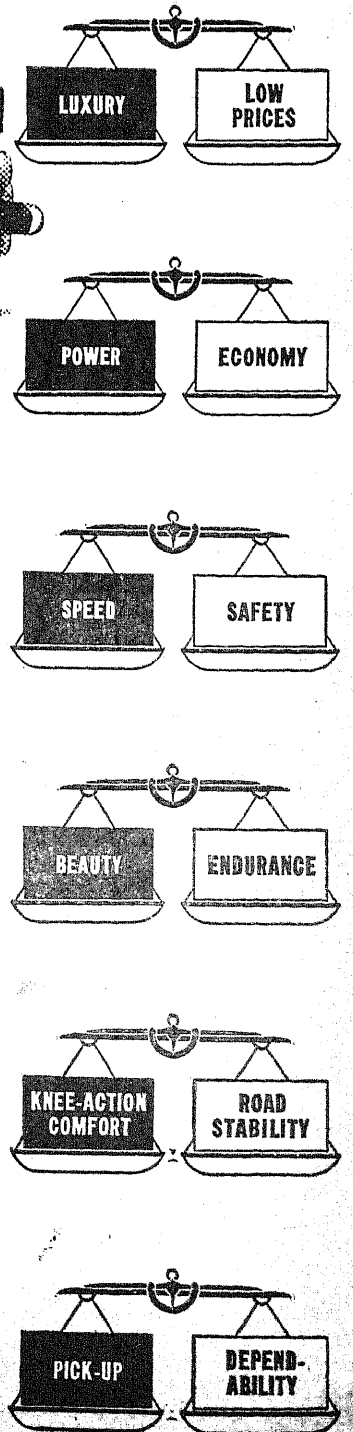
