Put Curbs On Students In Rumania

Cabinet Enacts a Series Of Restrictions to Insure Peace

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BUCHAREST, June 3—The Ru-manian Cabinet today approved a number of measures aimed at maintaining peace in the universities and preventing anti-Jewish out-breaks there. The measures approved are:

2. No student should be per-mitted to join a student organization which is not recognized by the university authorities.

3 Students are to be prohibited from attending political meetings.

4. No student is to obtain spe-

4. No student is to obtain special rights and privileges.

The students of the universities in Rumania will have to sign a pledge that they adhere to the above conditions, the Cabinet decree provides.

Cemetery Desecrated

A number of Nazis were arrested today in Oldenburg for desecrating the old Jewish cemetery there on the night of May 28. The vandals the night of May 28. The vandals destroyed many tombstones, among them that of Peter De Vries, who was a godson of the late Grand Duke Nikolaus of Oldenburg. De Vries was killed during the war and the Grand Duke ordered that his body be removed from the battlefield to the Oldenburg Jewish cemetery.

One Will Be in Poland, First Returns Indicate Other in Palestine, Parley Decides

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency WARSAW, June 3-The All-Ponities, called to decide the most fitting way to perpetuate the mem-ory of Marshal Pilsudski, concluded today with a decision to create two memorial foundations in Pilsudski's name, one of which is to be in Poland and the other in Palestine. A central committee consisting of

130 members was elected by the conference. This committee is to appoint an executive from its own ranks to carry out the decision of the conference.

The representatives of the Zion-ist Central Committee in Poland announced that they will not parti-cipate in the Pilsudski memorial committee unless the funds raised by the foundation for Palestine are spent through the Jewish National Fund for planting a Pilsudski forest.

Separate Body Wins By Wide Margin (Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, June 3-First returns coming in today on the results of yesterday's plebiscite of the Zionist Revisionists, on the question of whether or not to form an inde-pendent World Zionist Organization, indicate an overwhelming vote in the affirmative.

The plebiscite was carried out throughout Europe, Palestine, the United States and Canada.

The following returns have thus far been received from cities on the continent and in Palestine by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency Office

Vienna Votes 'Yes' In Vienna 1,467 voted for the es

tablishment of the proposed inde pendent organization, and sixty-four voted against.

In Warsaw, 5,415 cast votes, of which 5,257 were for the creation of a separate body. The complete re-turns for all of Poland will not be known before tomorrow.

In Jerusalem the first returns show 812 votes for and 24 votes against establishing a separate Zionist Organization.

In Tel Aviv, 3,832 voted for and sixty-seven against.

The Resolution

The resolution which members of the Revisionist Party were called to vote upon read:

"The Zionist Revisionist Organization proclaims the immediate es-tablishment of an Independent Zionist Organization and directs Zionist Organization and directs the Executive Committee to con-vene in December, 1925, its Consti-tuent Congress on the basic prin-ciple of a Jewish State in Palestine and on the basis of a Herzlian Shekel."

'Non-Aryans" Serve

Not only will men failing to pass the medical examination be re-jected, but also such as are 'un-worthy to serve" owing to previous serious convictions by law courts involving the deprivation of civic rights. As regards the "Aryan" question, the Army appears to have prevailed over the racial fanatics who wished it laid down that no person of "non-Arvan" origin was worthy to serve. Pure-blooded Jews are excluded, but "non-Aryans" and men with wives of "non-Aryan" origin may be admitted to active service with the colors if they apply and are found suitable as the result of the general personal impression made by them and of a test of "political reliability." All "non-Ar-yans" will be subject to the obligation regulations applying to per-sons liable to serve. "Non-Aryans" sons liable to serve. "Non-Aryans" who are allowed to serve will be eligible for promotion, but in case of war "a special regulation of this difficult question must be made," which the Fuehrer himself reserves the right to determine.

It is laid down in the Military aw that serving soldiers may not take an active part in politics.

"It is clear," said tieneral von Reichenau, "that during his short term of service the soldier must concentrate his entire physical and mental energy to his training in arms, and that he can only be subordinate to a single authority, that of the Wehrmacht." Consequently, during their military service, mem-bership of the Nazi Party or its associated organizations remains in abeyance for all soldiers, as does their right to vote in elections or

Eves on Mexico

The anti-Semitic campaign in Mexico which has been renewed this week, need not be underestimated. The petition of the Golden Shirts to the Mexican government asking for the with-drawal of citizenship from Jews should not be taken lightly.

Behind the Golden Shirts are a number of Mexican leaders who have an influence on the politics of the country. In addition to the Golden Shirts, there is the so-called "Pro-Rasa Committee' which advocates racial purity in Mexico along the same lines as it is being advocated in Nazi Germany. There are also the Society for the Protection of Mexico and the Association of Mexican Nationalists—two nationalistic organizations engaged in spreading anti-Jewish sentiments in the

Anti-Jewish Demonstration

Only a year ago the Golden hirts were the first group in Mexico to organize public dem-onstrations in Mexico City against the Jews. At a time when the Mexican authorities prohibit demonstrations of the League against War and Fascism, the police of Mexico City did not in any way hinder the anti-Jewish demonstrations of the Golden Shirts.

As a result of the increased anti-Jewish spirit now prevailing in Mexico, leaflets can be seen posted in the streets af Mexico City reading: "Friendly Coopera-tion Between Jews and Mexicans Is as Impossible as Hitler and Einstein Dining from One Plate. Another poster appeals to the Mexican unemployed to "think of the 10,000 Jews who came to Mexico and are taking bread away from the Mexicans." "Use your rights and drive the Jews out of our country," the appeals urge.

Press and Government

The attitude of the Liberal press and of the Mexican government, though they are not anti-Jewish, is also not sufficiently pro-Jewish. The Liberal press Liberal press dares not come out openly against the anti-Semitic propaganda be-cause it fears losing the advertisements of German firms which most of the newspapers depend. The government, while officially assuring full protection to the Jewish population, is nevertherless not in a position to control its local authorities, a large proportion of whom are outspokenly anti-Semitic. It is an established fact that the ported the activities of anti-Semitic groups.

Intervention Can Help

Under such circumstances, it is easy to understand why the 16,000 Jews now residing in Mexico are in constant fear for their lives. The majority of the 16,000,000 Mexican population is still primi-The anti-Semitic agitation may therefore bring tragic consequences if not properly checked

Some time ago a Committee to Some time ago a Committee to Protect Mexican Jewry was form-ed in America. This committee, in May, 1934, intervened through Washington against the Jew-balting activities of the Golden Shirts in Mexico.

Irish Paper Comments On Zionist Split

The Irish Times of Dublin, commenting on the secession of the Re-visionists from the Zionist World Organization, says in an editorial:

After two thousand years the tribulations of the Jewish people are not ended. There are signs, moreover, that Jewish affairs become a world concern ere long. The Zionist Party has split how seriously we cannot judge until events show whether the new departure has as strong a following as at first appears. Mr. Vladimir Jabotinsky, the organizer of the Jewish regiment which fought in the Great War for the liberation of the Holy Land, has gone out from the official party, demanding that a claim be made for the establish-ment of a free Jewish State on both sides of the Jordan. a claim, of course, goes far beyond what British policy has secured for the Jewish people in their ancient fatherland—a "na-tional home," a region in which numbers of the race may settle and live in the manner of their ancestors, speaking the Hebrew tongue and cultivating Hebrew learning in a university of Jerusalem, but only as equal citizens with other races, under the flag of the Mandatory Power.

League Can Force Danzig to Obey

The Manchester Guardian, writng on the outcome of the petition of the Danzig Jews to the League, savs editorially:

Though by the terms of inter-national treaties and the League Constitution the Jews, like all other religious and racial minorities in Danzig, are protected from any discrimination, yet since the National Socialists first gained power in 1923 they have been subjected to a systematic boycott hardly better than they might expect in Germany itself. The officials of the government, who have taken oath to respect the constitution with all its guarantees against oppression, have in nearly every case also pledged themselves to the National So-cialist faith, of which anti-Semitism is a fundamental tenet. Those who thought otherwise, who imagined that the callous terrorization of the Jews in Germany would pass with the first ardor of the "revolution," are refuted by the fresh outbreak of those brutalities in Germany to-

An interesting picture of the life of the half million Jews in the Ar-gentine was given yesterday by M. Stoliar, editor and publisher of Die Stollar, equor and published of Mac Yiddishe Zeitung, the largest Jew-ish newspaper in Argentina, who is in New York to investigate immigration problems in the United States for the Argentine govern-

"Anti-Semitism in Argentina is an imported product," Mr. Stollar stated in the course of an interstated in the course of an inter-view. "Until the rise of Hitlerism in Germany, no one in the Argen-tine knew about anti-Jewish feel-ing. Since Hitler came into power his agents have, however, invaded Argentina and infected the peaceful atmosphere with anti-Jewish propaganda."

Propaganda Little Feared

Although the majority of the 150,000 Germans in the Argentine are not poisoned with Nazism, the Jews in that country fear little of their anti-Jewish propaganda, Mr. Stoliar explained. The Jewish Stoliar explained. The Jewish leaders there consider the present situation temporary. They are cer-tain that the wild Nazi propaganda will not succeed in spoiling the relations between the Jews and the Argentinian people.

The Jews, Mr. Stoliar said, are contributing to the agricultural de-velopment of the country just as much as to other phases of life.

Speaking of the Jews as farm Speaking of the Jews as farm workers, Mr. Stoliar declared that the 26,000 who are now living on the soil in the Jewish colonies in Argentine offer the most striking example of Jewish abaptability to land work. "These 26,000 Jews live a normal and productive life and constitute the strongest wea-pon against any kind of anti-Semitism."

300,000 Ashkenazim

Mr. Stoliar related that of the half million Jews in the Argentine today, 300,000 are Ashkenazim who came mainly from Russia, Poland and other East European countries. The other 200,000 Jews are of Sephardic origin.

tural and relief institutions. The

"I am proud that Argentina is my home," Mr. Stoliar stated, empha-sizing that of all the countries he visited in South and Central America, Jewish life in the Argentine is more stabilized and more secure.

Mr. Stoliar will remain in the United States for more than a month. In addition to studying the immigration problem in America for the Argentine Government, he will also make an extensive study of the newspaper industry in the United States.

Hope Is Voiced Roosevelt Will Protest to Nazis

Jews Warned Against Meekness by Wise At Order's Parley

(Special to the J.D.B.) ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., June 3 -The hope that President Roosevelt will sooner or later come out with an official statement against the persecutions in Nazi Germany was expressed here today by Rabbi Stephen S. Wise, addressing the forty-eighth annual convention of the Independent Order Brith Abra-

Rabbi Wise warned the Jews of America not to be meek and to protest energetically against any anti-Jewish discrimination in the United States. He spoke of the danger of anti-Semitism in America and emphasized that numerous colleges in America are nests of Nazi propaganda.

Italy Is Praised

Reviewing the Jewish situation in Europe, Rabbi Wise praised Italy for its friendly attitude to-wards the Jews and emphasized that he fears for the future of the Jews in England because of the growth of the Mosley movement

Rabbi Wise praised Soviet Rus-Bia for its fight against anti-Semit Ism. He criticized the Soviet gov-ernment, however, for its suppression of the Hebrew language and for the prohibition of the Zionist movement in that country.

In Poland the present policy of the government brings indescribable misery for the Jewish popula-tion, Rabbi Wise told the delegates at the convention. The danger of anti-Semitism in Rumania is great despite the fact that King Carol is liberal in his attitude toward the Jews.

Attacks Hungary's Leaders Rabbi Wise bitterly attacked the

Jews of Hungary. The situation of the Jewish population in Hungary, he asserted, is very precari-ous, but the Jewish leaders there no not make the slightest attempt to fight for their rights.

Rabbi Wise appealed to Brith Abraham to participate in the up-building of Palestine and to establish in Palestine a colony named after the Order in connection with its fiftieth anniversary. He also appealed to the delegates to work hand in hand with the American Jewish Congress.
"The Order should concentrate

on winning the Jewish youth into its ranks," he said. "It should ac tively participate in all matters concerning Jewish life in the United States.'

the Jordan. 2. That a public loan be floated, That a public loan be floated, guaranteed by the government of Palestine jointly with the Jewish Agency, to enable the colonization of 100,000 Jewish families on land

on both sides of the Jordan.

3. That the Mandatory shall encourage the industrialization of Palestine by appropriate tariffs and international trade treaties.

In his address, Prof. Chernowitz pointed out the serious handicaps imposed on the transfer of lands by the Turkish Code, which is still in force in Palestine. This code makes the transfer of clear title to land almost impossible and at hest a very expensive and long-drawn-out affair, Prof. Chernowitz declared. and he demanded that it be abolished and a modern, civilized code adopted for the entire Mandated area of Palestine


