Tour to Aid Reich Exiles Completed

J. McDonald Arrives in Hopeful Mood; Denies He'll Resign

Denying reports from abroad that he plans to resign as League of Nations High Commissioner for Jewish and Other Refugees from Germany, James G. McDonald, accompanied by his wife, returned Thursday from Rio De Janeiro aboard the Munson liner, S.S. American Legion. The Commissioner had spent the last three months touring Argentine, Brazil and Uruguay, studying the possibilities of colonization of refugees in those countries.

Though he would make no definite statement as to the colonization prospects in the Latin-American countries, Mr. McDonald seemed optimistic. He was impressed with the future of the countries he had inspected and he believes that the refugees could play an important part in their upbuilding.

Argentina Confident

"In Argentina and Brazil," he said, "there is a general feeling of confidence that the present improvement in business will continue. In both countries plans are being energetically pushed for the diversification of the basic agricultural products, through the expansion of cotton and fruit crops in Argentina and cotton, rice and tobacco in Brazil.

"Indeed," he continued, "as soon as one really comprehends the truly continental size and the wide diversity of soil and climate of these two countries, it becomes obvious that they possess almost limitless possibilities. They are in the fullest sense countries of the future. I am confident, therefore, that many refugees will be permitted to make their contributions (Continued on Page Eight)

But Sidesteps Queries On Whether He Is **Anti-Semitic**

NEW BRUNSWICK, N. J., June 6-Stammering and confused by questions of his alleged anti-Semitism, Dr. Frederich J. Hauptmann. German professor at the New Jersey College for Women, refused to commit himself on the Jewish question at today's session of the Rutgers University trustees investigation into the charges that Hauptmann recommended dismissal of Dr. Leinhard Bergel, an instructor, because he was anti-Nazi.

He did, however, vigorously defend the Hitler regime in Germany and denied that any Jewish books were ever burned or that Jewish professors were exiled.

"We cannot and we will not allow the Jew who has been pushed out of our State and cultural life, to entrench himself more firmly in economic life," the paper writes, adding that this would be "more dangerous" because too much non-Jews are still patronizing Jewish stores.

Reichsminister Rudolf Hess, Hit ler's right-hand man, in a speech delivered last night, declared that there are still 33,500 Jews in Prussia employed in industry and artisanship, and 90,000 Jews employed in trade and commerce.

The statistical department of the Reichsvertretung der Deutschen Juden, the supreme Jewish representative body of Germany, informs the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that these figures are based on a vocational census taken before Hitler came into power.

The number of Jewish employes in trade and commerce, the organization reports, fell by twenty per cent by June, 1933, as compared with the census figures of 1925.

He demanded for the Zionists the right to control all Jewish institutions in Germany and claimed that they are today the leading force of Jewry.

Capital Comment

WASHINGTON.

N October 14, a new agreement of friendship, commerce and consular rights will become effective between the United States and Germany. This pact replaces the existing treaty which, among other things, contains an unconditional most-favored nation clause that has not been written into the new agreement.

It was Germany which last Ovtober served notice on the United States that the unconditional most-favored nation clause would have to be abandoned. This step was taken by the Hitler government because of Germany's inability to obtain foreign exchange, which necessitated pacts for special concessions and barter agreements with countries willing to supply the Reich with necessary raw materials largely in exchange for German-made goods.

IN granting concessions to other countries, Germany disregarded unconditional most-favored clause which required that similar concessions be granted the United States. The effectiveness of the boycott in the United States against German-made goods, greatly added to the difficulties of the Hitler government. At the same time, Germany discriminated against American holders of Dawes loan notes, an act which was contrary to treaty provisions and brought forth several strong protests from Secretary of State Hull.

Those who are opposed to the administration's foreign trade policy read into Secretary Hull's approval of the new agreement with Germany lines which forecast an abandonment of this country's leadership in efforts to break down foreign trade barriers. They hold Secretary Hull's acceptance of the new agreement to be the first step away from reciprocal trade agreements and a departure from the principle embodied in the mostfavored nation clause.

meet a practical situation. new agreement was signed to protect American nationals and trade interests in Germany. Without a clear-cut understanding of the status of international relationships between the two countries, chaos would result after the existing treaty expires.

Because the new agreement does not contain the most-favored nation clause, the United States will no longer have to extend to Germany trade concessions which are being extended to other countries with whom the United States has treaties containing such a provision. And in all likelihood, trade concessions granted to Germany under the existing treaty will be withdrawn when the new agreement takes the place of the present pact next October. All of this means that German goods may have increasing difficulty in enter ing American markets.

GERMANY'S economic life slowly is being stifled as a result of loss of her export markets. Information reaching Washington from United States government observers in Germany reveals that the export situation remains one of the weakest spots in German national economy. This is evidenced not only by the shrinkage of exports but also by the rapid decline in the ratio of exports to the total industrial production. The reports show that while in 1928 and 1929 about thirty-three per cent of total German industrial production was exported, the percentage has now declined to about twelve per cent.

The reports to Washington officials point out that the German government realizes that the absorption of the remaining 2,250,000 unemployed can come only from a substantial recovery of exports through a fresh impetus, and it also realizes that the former methods of export subsidies is no longer practicable. In view of this, the Hitler government has appealed to all manufacturers urging them to push export business for the national interest at all costs in order to produce the amount of foreign exchange for the purchase of indispensible raw materials.

Butcher Workers Revisionists Here Funeral Rites Sunday

Prices — Others Are Picketed

As kosher butchers throughout the city continued reducing prices in response to demands by the City Action Committee Against the High Cost of Living, 3,000 members of the Hebrew Butcher Workers Union were preparing Thursday for a city-wide strike with wage and hour schedules as the major issue.

Mrs. Sarah Licht, secretary of the action committee, representing Jewish housewives who are attempting to force wholesale meat dealers to cut prices, reported that almost 500 kosher butchers agreed to reduce prices from four to five cents on various cuts of meat.

Pickets were withdrawn from the stores of these butchers. However, picketing continued in full force throughout the city in front of shops which remained open and refused to reduce prices. Five pickets were arrested Thursday on charges centering around their efforts to keep customers out of stores.







A WEEK'S EVENTS IN REVIEW

The Stamps That Luxembourg Sells to Aid Refugees





It took the Duchy of Luxembourg, tiny State bordering Betgium, France and Germany, to initiate an unique idea to help the political exiles from Germany. Here are pictured the stamps which the government has issued as a means of providing for the refugees who have found a haven within her friendly borders. The stamps portray the various professional types they are intended to help. Gimbels is selling the stamps in New York, both to dealers and the public. To date more than \$1,000 worth have been sold. They are also being forced to oppose a measure which is considered by many as a democratic step toward the establishment of a parliament in which Jews, Moslems and Christians in Palestine are to give expression to their respective views.

Jews of World Must Join Fight on Assembly

It is for this reason that the Jewish fight against the establishment of a Legislative Council in Palestine requires the concentration of the Jewish people all over the world. Zionists as well as others interested in the Jewish welfare in Palestine will have to be mobilized to combat this pending danger, which will forever prevent Palestine from becoming not only a Jewish State, but even a Jewish National

Home. The Arab press in Palestine announced this week that whether the Jews wish it or not, the Legislative Council will be established as soon as the High Commissioner, Sir Arthur Wauchope, returns from London at the end of the Summer. Sir Arthur has made up his mind on this subject and has even threatened resignation if the Council is not established. What the resignation of Sir Arthur may mean to the Jews, it is needless to say, since he has proven to be the best High Commissioner from a Jewish viewpoint-in many respects even better than Sir Herbert Samuel.

Agency Cites Growth Of Jewish Development

In the annual memorandum which the Executive of the Jewish Agency submitted this week to the Mandates Commission, the problem of the projected Legislative Council is not dealt with. The memorandum is devoted chiefly to the growth of Jewish development during the past year, and points with pride to the fact that the Jews have brought into Palestine not less than \$50,000,000 during 1934.

The memorandum of the Jewish Agency also emphasizes that the Jews spent, in 1934, \$35,000,-000 on the acquisition of 111,000 dunams of land. Of this area, only 62,000 dunams were acquired from Arabs. The rest was purchased from Jews who had bought the land and resold it for higher prices.

The extent of Jewish land speculation in Palestine is revealed in the report by the fact that for the 62,000 dunam bought from the Arabs, the sum of \$8,240,000 was spent, whereas for the 49,000 dunams bought from Jews, a little less than \$27,000,000 was paid. The land acquired from the Arabs was of course less cultivated than the land acquired from the Jews.

Sokolow Complains Of Immigration Curbs

The covering letter of Nahum Sokolow accompanying the memorandum submitted by the Jewish Agency complains that no justice is being done to the Jews by the existing immigration restrictions and that civil service in Palestine is not sufficiently open to Jews.

It is significant that Sydney Moody, Assistant Chief Secretary of the Palestine government, who represented the government at the Mandates Commission session in Geneva, referred in his report to the split between the Zionists and the Revisionists. There is no doubt that the Palestine government will utilize this split for its own interests, since it has already referred to it before the Mandates Commission.

Revisionists Vote For Independent Body

The Zionist Revisionists in the plebiscite which they conducted throughout the world last week, voted in overwhelming majority to establish an Independent Zionist Organization competitive to the present Zionist Organization. Vladimir Jabotinsky, the Revisionist leader, addressing a meeting in Vienna, indicated that the new Zionist Organization which he will establish will not hesitate to bring up matters before the Colonial Office and the Mandates Commission. He declared that the Zionist Organization has no monopoly to represent world Jewry and that Article IV of the Palestine Mandate definitely provides also for other groups interested in Palestine.

This open threat deserves consideration since not less than 100,000 persons participated in the Revisionist plebiscite. All were previously members of the Zionist Organization. In additoin to them, there are thousands of Revisionist sympathizers who are not members of the Revisionist Party but who are nevertheless interested in the Zionist move-

World Congress Must Heal Breach in Zionism

The next World Zionist Congress, in Lucerne, which opens August 27, will therefore be faced with the duty of finding a way to bring the Revisionists back to the Zionist Organization. With the danger of the legislative assembly imminent, unity in the Zionist ranks is necessary now more than ever before.

The report submitted by the Jewish Agency to the Mandates Commission states that a total of 42,359 ewish immigrants entered Palestine during 1934. Of this number, 9,429 were from Germany.

The Jewish situation in Germany will no doubt drive many more thousands of Jews into Palestine in the immediate future. The Nazi Minister Frick, addressing a meeting last week, openly stated that the government considers that "there is no protection for Jews in Germany." He appealed against using violence against Jews but made it clear that with a little patience the Reich will be rid of the Jewish question.

Sterilization Drive Opened in Reich

Simultaneously with Frick's speech, a campaign was started in Germany last week for sterilization of Jews or those married to Jews. This campaign has long been advocated by Julius Streicher and is now receiving support from Nazi leaders who hitherto opposed Streicher's extreme Jewbaiting attitude.

In a number of townships in Germany Jews were attacked last week and younger Jews were driven out of their homes. The Nazi government seems to feel that the old generation of Jews in Germany is bound to pass away anyway. The problem is only how to get rid of the young Jews. It is for this reason that the government is encouraging Jewish emigration from Germany to Palestine and other countries. It is also for this reason that the German government does not oppose the Zionist movement in Germany.



The Nazis spread the rumor that the Jews had concealed weapons and they made this the excuse for searching their homes and attacking them. However, they found no weapons to justify their charges. One Saturday morning, as the entire Jewish community was gathered in the synagogue, the tramp of marching feet was heard outside. Brownshirted soldiers roughly banged open the doors and ordered the service to stop. They said they had been informed that the weanons were concealed in the synagogue. They looked under the seats. searched every nook and cranny in the basement and balcony-and found nothing. They were about to leave when the commanding officer happened to notice the curtains of the Ark.

FOR MANY years I have known the Chief Rabbi of a certain large German city. Although I could never comprehend the almost pathological intensity of his German patriotism and his anti-Zionism, I have always respected him as a man of courage and principle. He served as a Chaplain at the front during the War and emerged with a distinguished rec-

His mental suffering during the first few months of Nazi rule was pitiful to behold. For Hitler challenged every principle he held sacred. But so deep were the inner sources of his strength that Hitler could not shake his faith, his courage or his self-respect.

One night the Nazis broke into his house and arrested him. He was shoved into a waiting car and driven to the outskirts of the city. They stood him against a wall and pointed their rifles at him. Then they gave him a paper to read. If he would sign it, they would free him. If not, they would shoot him immediately. He read the statement hurriedly and found it contained a confession that he had been responsible for spreading false atrocity propaganda, and a statement that the charges of Nazi cruelty against the Jews were unfounded. He refused to sign his name to these lies.

"Aren't you afraid of what we will do to you?" the commanding officer asked him.

The Rabbi replied in the words of Jonah, "Ivri Onochi V'yoreh Adonoy"—"I am a Hebrew and I fear only God."

Perhaps because they were afraid of the repercussions from killing so prominent a man, they let him go. But they had given him the occasion to display that indomitable faith of the Jew not only in God, but in his own integrity. which is as impervious to Nazism as it has been to all the barbarisms of the past.





Stories With a Sting

TIME: THE PRESENT. By Tess Slesinger. 376 pp. New York: Simon & Schuster. \$2.50.

JESS SLESINGER is much more at home writing short stories than novels. "The Unpossessed," the novel she published last ar, impressed me as a desperate attempt to string out a series vivid and striking impressions in the form of a novel-an

attempt inevitably doomed to failure.

I think the reasons for Miss Slesinger's disability in the longer form are precisely the origins of her brilliance in the short story. She was born in 1905 of a family of middle class New York Jews. It is a fair assumption to judge the nature of her family life from such stories as "The Friedman's Annie," in which clear lines of conflict are set up between the principles and aspirations of the daughter of the house, and the solid, conventional life of the household. This conflict is compensated by a destructive, intellectual cynicism, for only thus can the rift between

satiric, bitingly destructive story cannot be composed. But such a story will only cohere as a novel if the author is able to set up a counterfoil to the poor puppets he undertakes to destroy. The opposite is true in the short story. The finer the satire, the more swiftly it destroys its objects. Brevity is at a premium. This is revealed perfectly in the keen-edged stories in "Time: The Present."

Miss Slesinger never whips herself into a fury over the objects of her contempt, and that is one of the sources of her power. She is always the cold, calm recording angel. She sees and she writes. She lets facts and actions speak for themselves. And the record of facts and actions is sufficient to annihilate Mrs. Colborne, the divorcée in "After the Party" who is troubled with a type of neurasthenia which only wealthy women can afford, and for whom her doctor prescribes the diversion of celebrity-hunting; it is sufficient to extinguish the hopes of the whitehaired boy, Joey Andrews, who thinks that he has permanently escaped the bread line because he has gotten a job during the Christmas rush in a department store and outstripped some of the regulars in sales totals; and it virtually obliterates Miss Betty Carlisle, the pretty secretary-receptionist Bender, Inc., Advertisements, who prefers to practise the time-honored device for self-advancement, romancing with her employer, while the rest of the office force organizes and goes out on a pathetically futile strike.

OF the earlier stories the only one worth noting is "White on Black," which recounts how a certain liberal private school included in its enrollment each year a certain small number of Negro children-oh, well washed, carefully referenced, and all that-to teach the highly respectable white children democracy. The Negro children, having been so carefully selected, were apt to be the leaders of the class in the junior grades; but as athletics diminished and social functions such as dances increased in importance, they gradually played more inferior rôles. Miss Slesinger describes with fine shadings the gradual change of sentiment which culminates in the graduation dance. Paul Wilson, three years ago the hero of the class, has not even attended. But

"He was as beautiful as he had been three years before, but his face was different, hardened perhaps, so that the dapper tan clothes he wore made him cheap and flashy. He still wore pointed shoes with cloth tops.

This story, loaded though it is with overtones and implications, is surpassed in richness by the last and longest story in the volume "The Answer on the Magnolia Tree." It would take a more delicate pen than mine to suggest here the content and manner of this bitter-sweet sketch of life in a girl's college-a theme much used, but never more pungently than

You will find so inspiration, no suggestion of a better way of life. in Miss Slesinger's stories. you should read them because they illuminate with a clear, white glare the institutions an dpeople around you whom you have previously seen through the shimmer of sentiment and prejudice.

An Old Libel Exposed

One of the principal lines of argument adopted by anti-Semites in known writer an Hassidic and Caperpetuating the hideous blood libel is to detach passages from the Talmud and other rabbinical writing from their contexts and so distort them into references to ritual murder.


The leading exponent of this system is Dr. Erich ischoff, whose work "Das Blut im Juedischen Schriftum und Brauch" (Blood in the Literature and Customs of the Jews) has proved the mainspring whence this form of blood-libel draws its inspiration. Much of what appears today in the Streicher press is derived directly from this source.

Unenlightened Gentiles are bound to be intrigued and puzzled when they read page after page of "Talmudic" quotations all of which seem so manifestly to encourage the charge of ritual murder. Not being versed in Rabbinics, they cannot see for themselves the distorted character of these citations,

A special value therefore attaches to a volume now issued by Dr. Chajim Bloch of Vienna, the wellbalistic subjects. The book is entitled "Blut und Eros im Juedischen Schriftum und Leben" (Blood and Love in the Literature and Life of the Jews) and consists of a methodical exposition of the passages cited by Bischoff, the whole constituting a thorough exposure of the anti-Semitic argument.

Remarkably enough Bloch does not make immediate reference to the contemporary situation. He discuses the accusation per se and refutes it not only in its Streicherian, but in all its forms. His work is based on the deepest scientific research, but eschews technical and 'scientific" terminology. It is written simply and clearly for the layman. It will provide a correct orientation for the non-Jew who is not a professional scholar, but who might otherwise be seduced by the blood libel.

Among the subjects discussed are "Human Blood in the Old Testament," "Human Blood in the Mishnah." "Permitted Shedding of the Blood of Animals," "Shedding of Blood in the Rabbinic Codes," the "Views of Maimonides," the "Blood of the Godless," the "Blood of non-Jews," "Thou Shalt Not Murder," and "The Jewish Woman."




Dr. Philip S. Bernstein to Speak to 6,000 at Montreal Parley


