Tour to Aid Reich Exiles Completed

J. McDonald Arrives in Hopeful Mood; Denies He'll Resign

Denying reports from abroad that he plans to resign as League of Nations High Commissioner for Jewish and Other Refugees from Germany, James G. McDonald, accompanied by his wife, returned Thursday from Rio De Janeiro aboard the Munson liner, S.S. American Legion. The Commissioner had spent the last three months touring Argentina, Brazil and Uruguay, studying the possibilities of colonization of refugees in those countries.

Though he would make no definite statement as to the colonization prospects in the Latin-American countries, Mr. McDonald seemed optimistic. He was impressed with the future of the countries he had inspected and he believes that the refugees could play an important part in their upbuilding.

Argentina Confident

"In Argentina and Brazil," he said, "there is a general feeling of confidence that the present improvement in business will continue. In both countries plans are being energetically pushed for the diversification of the basic agricultural products, through the expansion of cotton and fruit crops in Argentina and cotton, rice and tobacco in Brazil.

"Indeed," he continued, "as soon as one really comprehends the truly continental size and the wide diversity of soil and climate of these two countries, it becomes obvious that they possess almost limitless possibilities. They are in the fullest sense countries of the future. I am confident, therefore, that many refugees will be permitted to make their contributions

Rutgers Man Defends Hitler In Bias Probe

But Sidesteps Queries On Whether He Is Anti-Semitic

NEW BRUNSWICK, N. J., June 6—Stammering and confused by questions of his alleged anti-Semitism, Dr. Frederick J. Hauptmann, German professor at the New Jersey College for Women, refused to commit himself on the Jewish question at today's session of the Rutgers University trustees investigation into the charges that Hauptmann recommended dismissal of Dr. Leinhard Bergel, an instructor, because he was anti-Nazi.

He did, however, vigorously defend the Hitler regime in Germany and denied that any Jewish books were ever burned or that Jewish professors were exiled.

Under cross-examination by Sidney J. Kaplan, Dr. Bergel's attorney, Prof. Hauptmann said that some of his best friends are Jews.

Kaplan handed Dr. Hauptmann the written question of one of the trustees:

"Do you believe the anti-Semitic policies of Germany a good thing?"

The witness examined the slip of paper at great length. Then he gulped, flushed red and looked at the ceiling. "The question is up to the German government," he stammered finally.

Pressed for a further reply, Dr. Hauptmann hedged again and said haltingly, "It is within the power of the German government to decide on our own racial problems."

Dr. Hauptmann denied during the course of the day's testimony that he or members of the German department which he heads, spread Nazi propaganda among the students of the college.

Avers Nazis Will Never Halt Drive

Must Not Permit Jews To Entrench in Trade, Beobachter Warns

BERLIN, June 6—The renewed anti-Jewish campaign in Germany is not a victory of the radicals in the National Socialist Party but is the natural consummation of a National Socialist demand which will never be dropped, the Westdeutscher Beobachter, one of the leading Nazi organs, declares today.

"We cannot and we will not allow the Jew who has been pushed out of our State and cultural life, to entrench himself more firmly in economic life," the paper writes, adding that this would be "more dangerous" because too much non-Jews are still patronizing Jewish stores.

Speech by Hess

Reichsminister Rudolf Hess, Hitler's right-hand man, in a speech delivered last night, declared that there are still 33,500 Jews in Prussia employed in industry and artisanship, and 90,000 Jews employed in trade and commerce.

The statistical department of the Reichsvertretung der Deutschen Juden, the supreme Jewish representative body of Germany, informs the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that these figures are based on a vocational census taken before Hitler came into power.

The number of Jewish employees in trade and commerce, the organization reports, fell by twenty per cent by June, 1933, as compared with the census figures of 1925.

Push Drive For Reich Control

Non-Zionist Leadership Is Assailed by Kurt Blumenfeld

BERLIN, June 6—A renewed demand for complete control of Jewish life in Germany was made today by Zionist leaders, addressing a public meeting of the Zionist Federation in Berlin.

Kurt Blumenfeld, former president of the Zionist Federation of Germany, who is now working for the World Zionist Executive in Palestine, criticized the old trend of German-Jewish life and accused the non-Zionist Jewish leaders in Germany of having led German Jewry away from Jewishness. He demanded for the Zionists the right to control all Jewish institutions in Germany and claimed that they are today the leading force of Jewry.

"The Zionists are substituting German Jewry for unlimited Judaism in place of the limited Judaism which the non-Zionists preach," Mr. Blumenfeld said. He criticized the attempts to make Palestine a land for saving individuals only.

Build Scroll Room On the Queen Mary

LONDON, June 6—For the first time on any ship, a Scroll Room is being provided for Jewish religious services on the Queen Mary, British rival to the Normandie, it was announced today.

Two kosher kitchens and a kosher pantry are being installed, and two Jewish cooks and a supervisor will be engaged to look after the Jewish menus. The Queen Mary will make its first sailing to New York in 1936.

Austria Burns Library Seized During Revolt

Valuable Books Owned By Poale-Zion Party Fed to Flames

VIENNA, June 6—The Austrian authorities today burned the entire library of the Jewish Socialist Zionist (Poale-Zion) party, which was confiscated during the Socialist uprising in Vienna in February, 1934.

The library contained important cultural workers and a number of unique publications. Jewish leaders had made an effort to obtain the books from the authorities for the Jewish Community Library. The effort, however, was not successful.

It was stated here today that the blaze was set in defiance of the police authorities. It has not been established whether the highest government officials knew about the bonfire of the Jewish books.

The Deutsche Volksblatt, a Nazi publication in Austria, came out today with a renewed campaign against the Jews, and with slogans to boycott Jewish stores. Despite the reports that Nazi papers will not be permitted in Austria, the Deutsche Volksblatt conducts its anti-Jewish campaign freely and urges Christians to make their purchases in "Aryan" shops only.

The Reichspost, official organ of the clerical section of the Government Party, publishes an editorial in which it draws the attention of the Nazi government to the fact that "National Socialism originally developed without hindrances in Austria."

Air Views on Migration At Geneva

Political Reasons Keep Transjordan Closed, League Is Told

GENEVA, June 6—The question of opening Transjordan to Jewish immigration came up at today's session of the Mandates Commission of the League of Nations, during the discussion on the report submitted by the Palestine government on Palestine and Transjordan.

A number of members of the Mandates Commission asked whether there are any possibilities for admitting Jews into Transjordan. Sydney Moody, Assistant Chief Secretary of the Palestine government, who is representing it at the session, explained that in principle there is no obstacle to the Jews' entering Transjordan, but that politically, there are certain reasons which dictate against the admission of Jews into that part of Palestine.

Migration Problem Aired

The question of Jewish immigration into Palestine was also discussed at length at today's session. Questions were asked as to the immigration of Arabs into Palestine. Mr. Moody said that the number of Arabs entering Palestine is insignificant.

A great part of today's discussion was devoted to an examination of the situation in Transjordan, especially to the question of the frontiers between Transjordan and Hedjaz. The position of the harbor in Akaba, Transjordan, was also examined.

The Mandates Commission also examined a number of petitions on Palestine. The rapporteur on the memorandum of the Jewish Agency, was Penha Garcia of Portugal.

Prof. Jellinek Is Victim Of 'Aryan Paragraph'

BERLIN, June 6—Prof. Walter Jellinek of the University of Heidelberg law faculty was dismissed from his post today under the "Aryan paragraph." His father, Prof. George Jellinek, who died in 1911, was an internationally known authority on constitutional law.

Untermeyer Probes Charge Hospital is Flouting Boycott

Samuel Untermeyer wrote Thursday to officials of the Beth Moses Hospital, Brooklyn, for an explanation of charges by employees that hospital officials had pressed for the deportation of Dr. Joseph Kahn, German-Jewish leader of the workers and that the hospital is using German goods.

Both charges were vigorously denied by Dr. M. L. Dryfus, superintendent of the hospital, in a statement to the Jewish Daily Bulletin. He characterized as "nothing but a rumor" the accusation

that an attempt had been made to secure Dr. Kahn's deportation.

Mr. Untermeyer said he wrote the letter after receiving a communication from the Beth Moses Hospital Workers' Council complaining of "this outrageous plot to deport to Nazi Germany a young Jewish doctor."

Dr. Kahn was described as active in trying to secure the reinstatement of employees allegedly locked out of the hospital after a two-hour stoppage by 100 employees May 18 in protest against low wages and long hours.

Capital Comment

WASHINGTON.

ON October 14, a new agreement of friendship, commerce and consular rights will become effective between the United States and Germany. This pact replaces the existing treaty which, among other things, contains an unconditional most-favored nation clause that has not been written into the new agreement.

It was Germany which last October served notice on the United States that the unconditional most-favored nation clause would have to be abandoned. This step was taken by the Hitler government because of Germany's inability to obtain foreign exchange, which necessitated pacts for special concessions and barter agreements with countries willing to supply the Reich with necessary raw materials largely in exchange for German-made goods.

IN granting concessions to other countries, Germany disregarded the unconditional most-favored clause which required that similar concessions be granted the United States. The effectiveness of the boycott in the United States against German-made goods, greatly added to the difficulties of the Hitler government. At the same time, Germany discriminated against American holders of Dawes loan notes, an act which was contrary to treaty provisions and brought forth several strong protests from Secretary of State Hull.

Those who are opposed to the administration's foreign trade policy read into Secretary Hull's approval of the new agreement with Germany lines which forecast an abandonment of this country's leadership in efforts to break down foreign trade barriers. They hold Secretary Hull's acceptance of the new agreement to be the first step away from reciprocal trade agreements and a departure from the principle embodied in the most-favored nation clause.

AN examination of the facts will readily show that such is not the case. Secretary Hull acted to

meet a practical situation. The new agreement was signed to protect American nationals and trade interests in Germany. Without a clear-cut understanding of the status of international relationships between the two countries, chaos would result after the existing treaty expires.

Because the new agreement does not contain the most-favored nation clause, the United States will no longer have to extend to Germany trade concessions which are being extended to other countries with whom the United States has treaties containing such a provision. And in all likelihood, trade concessions granted to Germany under the existing treaty will be withdrawn when the new agreement takes the place of the present pact next October. All of this means that German goods may have increasing difficulty in entering American markets.

GERMANY'S economic life slowly is being stifled as a result of loss of her export markets. Information reaching Washington from United States government observers in Germany reveals that the export situation remains one of the weakest spots in German national economy. This is evidenced not only by the shrinkage of exports but also by the rapid decline in the ratio of exports to the total industrial production. The reports show that while in 1928 and 1929 about thirty-three per cent of total German industrial production was exported, the percentage has now declined to about twelve per cent.

The reports to Washington officials point out that the German government realizes that the absorption of the remaining 2,250,000 unemployed can come only from a substantial recovery of exports through a fresh impetus, and it also realizes that the former methods of export subsidies is no longer practicable. In view of this, the Hitler government has appealed to all manufacturers urging them to push export business for the national interest at all costs in order to produce the amount of foreign exchange for the purchase of indispensable raw materials.

Butcher Workers Threaten Strike

500 Dealers Reduce Meat Prices — Others Are Picketed

As kosher butchers throughout the city continued reducing prices in response to demands by the City Action Committee Against the High Cost of Living, 3,000 members of the Hebrew Butcher Workers Union were preparing Thursday for a city-wide strike with wage and hour schedules as the major issue.

Mrs. Sarah Licht, secretary of the action committee, representing Jewish housewives who are attempting to force wholesale meat dealers to cut prices, reported that almost 500 kosher butchers agreed to reduce prices from four to five cents on various cuts of meat.

Pickets were withdrawn from the stores of these butchers. However, picketing continued in full force throughout the city in front of shops which remained open and refused to reduce prices. Five pickets were arrested Thursday on charges centering around their efforts to keep customers out of stores.

Revisionists Here Vote for New Body

2,986 Ask Separate Zionist Organization in Poll; 148 Against

A total of 2,986 members of the Zionist Revisionist Party in America voted for the establishment of the Independent Zionist organization and 148 voted against it in the plebiscite of last Sunday, according to a statement issued Thursday from the headquarters of the Revisionist party in New York.

"The Zionist Organization has no monopoly now in representing world Jewry," the statement says. "The newly established Independent Zionist Organization will permit every Jew to vote, provided he recognizes the principle of a Jewish State in Palestine."

BLACK on WHITE

BERMUDA.

A BOARD the S.S. Statendam en route to this scorched isle a group of six men sat at a table one evening, in the ornate dining salon, formally attired and proudly American. While somewhat short of real swank, the cruise was one that does not cater to persons on relief, and these six were a few pegs above the average on the passenger list. The vice-president of one of the most important American corporations, the head of a large advertising organization, an outstanding insurance broker, a journalist of some reputation, etc.—a fair enough representation of our upper middle orders.

They picked uncertainly among the French names on the absurdly long menus, wondering what the syllable concealed. They tasted tentatively the dishes set before them. And they made conversation. You know the sort of table talk I mean—polite, routine stuff, without lift or passion or inner driving force.

The talk, like the food, had an important look to it, but no authentic relish, no abandonment. The Supreme Court decision on the N.R.A., the antics of the stock market, the trivia of this and former ocean journeys, a few comments on this play or that movie.

But suddenly, through some obscure association in the conversation, someone mentioned potato pancakes. And the intrusion of the humble *latke*, strange as you may think it, changed the atmosphere magically.

NO MORE oxygen needed to be pumped into the flagging conversation; it began to breathe through its own nostrils. Voices were touched with passion at last and words echoed an inner relish. Vociferously most of the six men boasted that never and nowhere were there potato pancakes such as his mother made—crisp, brown, succulent and golden, and subtly superior to all other pancakes of all other mothers. The journalist averred that his wife is an artist in the domain of *latkes* and the vice-president, throwing all dignity to the ocean winds, insisted that they could not possibly come up to the high standard of his early memories. The various ways of serving this plebian delicacy were warmly described and hotly disputed, and the dishes with French names hung their heads in humiliation as the fervor deepened.

Under the white tuxedo coats and commercial self-importance and characteristic American faces, the memory of Jewish pancakes. It meant youth and mother and in a crude fashion also race. It is no accident that the most intimate holidays and ceremonials of all races are so often symbolized by some special food served on the occasion.

P. S.—The ship's chef was induced to make some next day for luncheon for the six nostalgic Americans. They did not appear on the menu, but they were Pancakes-a-la-Kovno, the vice-president having provided the formula. And they were good.

TO DESCEND hastily from these sublime heights to the level of the ridiculous:

While American Jews are boycotting German steamship lines, certain shipping companies operating in America are boycotting Jews. They run cruises to which Jews are

admitted only on a quota basis. I do not know the percentage, but that does not affect the principle.

Naturally they do not advertise this exclusion, but they use it as a sales argument in reaching a certain type of American clientele. It would be a healthy move, it seems to me, to expose these lines. There is nothing either in American law or human decency which permits them to bar men and women because of their race or religion. If the facts were made generally known, thousands of non-Jewish Americans who now patronize these

A WEEK'S EVENTS IN REVIEW

The Stamps That Luxembourg Sells to Aid Refugees



It took the Duchy of Luxem-
bourg, tiny state bordering Bel-
gium, France and Germany, to
initiate an unique idea to help
the political exiles from Germany.
Here are pictured the stamps
which the government has issued
as a means of providing for the
refugees who have found a haven
within her friendly borders. The
stamps portray the various pro-
fessional types they are intended
to help. Gimbels is selling the
stamps in New York, both to
dealers and the public. To date
more than \$1,000 worth have been
sold. Prof. Einstein assisted at
the sale during the week.



The Mandates Commission of
the League of Nations at its ses-
sion in Geneva this week, was
told by the representative of the
Palestine government in plain,
non-diplomatic language, that the
High Commissioner of Palestine
has definitely made up his mind
to establish a Legislative Coun-
cil in the country.

The establishment of such a
Council, against which the Jews
have been fighting, will endanger
the Jewish achievements in Pal-
estine at a time when the Jews
are still a minority in the coun-
try. Furthermore, it will make it
possible for the Palestine govern-
ment to hamper Jewish develop-
ment in Palestine whenever it
wishes. With the Arab members
of the Legislative Council at its
side, the British representatives
in the Council, together with the
Arabs, will be in a position to
adopt anti-Jewish decisions when-
ever it may be in the interests
of the Palestine administration
to do so. The Jewish representa-
tives in the Council will always
remain in the minority, since the
Council will be composed of
Jews, Arabs and government offi-
cials.

Standing of Agency
Will Be Affected

Establishment of a Legislative
Council in Palestine will also di-
minish the protective value of
the Jewish Agency. Now that no
such Council exists, the Jewish
Agency is looked upon as the
body representing Jewish inter-
ests in Palestine before the Man-
dates Commission. With a mixed
Council established, the danger
exists that the Mandates Com-
mission will recognize the Coun-
cil as the parliamentary body
representing all groups in Pal-
estine—the Jews as well as the
Arabs.

It is no wonder therefore that
the Jews, without distinction as
to party affiliation, strongly op-
pose the proposed Council. The
Mandatory Power, however, seems
extremely keen on having the
Council established. Once such
a Council is established, the Pal-
estine government feels that it
will be in a position to wash its
hands of many of its obligations
towards the Jews under the Man-
date. Through the Council the
Palestine government can pass
certain laws which, if issued by
the government itself, would re-
sult in Jewish complaints to the
Mandates Commission. Enacted
by the new Parliament, however,
the way to any complaints is
blocked since that body will sup-
posedly represent the will of the
majority in Palestine.

Council Project First
Launched in 1921

The question of the Council,
which has been of great concern
to Zionist leaders, is not a new
problem. It came up as far back
as 1921. The Zionist Executive
was told then that unless it
agreed to the eventual establish-
ment of a Legislative Council in
Palestine there would be no Pal-
estine Mandate. The British
government openly warned that
the League of Nations might not
ratify the Mandate if the Jews
did not agree to the creation of
a legislative assembly. The Zion-
ist Executive was told that this
change would not interfere with
the operation of the Mandate.
The Zionist leaders therefore
had no choice but to agree.

Fortunately for the Jews, the
Arabs were at that time opposed
to a legislative assembly and the
plan fell through. Now this plan
is in the process of crystallizing
itself into a law. The Zionist
leaders are thus placed in a dif-
ficult position. They are being
forced into opposing something to
which they had once agreed.

They are also being forced to
oppose a measure which is con-
sidered by many as a democratic
step toward the establishment of
a parliament in which Jews,
Moslems and Christians in Pal-
estine are to give expression to
their respective views.

Jews of World Must Join
Fight on Assembly

It is for this reason that the
Jewish fight against the estab-
lishment of a Legislative Coun-
cil in Palestine requires the con-
centration of the Jewish people
all over the world. Zionists as
well as others interested in the
Jewish welfare in Palestine will
have to be mobilized to combat
this pending danger, which will
forever prevent Palestine from
becoming not only a Jewish State,
but even a Jewish National Home.

The Arab press in Palestine
announced this week that whether
the Jews wish it or not, the Leg-
islative Council will be estab-
lished as soon as the High Com-
missioner, Sir Arthur Wauchope,
returns from London at the end
of the Summer. Sir Arthur has
made up his mind on this sub-
ject and has even threatened re-
signation if the Council is not
established. What the resigna-
tion of Sir Arthur may mean to
the Jews, it is needless to say,
since he has proven to be the
best High Commissioner from a
Jewish viewpoint—in many re-
spects even better than Sir Her-
bert Samuel.

Agency Cites Growth
Of Jewish Development

In the annual memorandum
which the Executive of the Jew-
ish Agency submitted this week
to the Mandates Commission, the
problem of the projected Legis-
lative Council is not dealt with.
The memorandum is devoted
chiefly to the growth of Jewish
development during the past
year, and points with pride to the
fact that the Jews have brought
into Palestine not less than
\$50,000,000 during 1934.

The memorandum of the Jew-
ish Agency also emphasizes that
the Jews spent, in 1934, \$35,000,-
000 on the acquisition of 111,000
dunams of land. Of this area,
only 62,000 dunams were ac-
quired from Arabs. The rest
was purchased from Jews who
had bought the land and resold
it for higher prices.

The extent of Jewish land
speculation in Palestine is re-
vealed in the report by the fact
that for the 62,000 dunam bought
from the Arabs, the sum of
\$8,240,000 was spent, whereas for
the 49,000 dunams bought from
Jews, a little less than \$27,000,000
was paid. The land acquired
from the Arabs was of course
less cultivated than the land ac-
quired from the Jews.

Sokolow Complains
Of Immigration Curbs

The covering letter of Nahum
Sokolow accompanying the mem-
orandum submitted by the Jew-
ish Agency complains that no
justice is being done to the Jews
by the existing immigration res-
trictions and that civil service in
Palestine is not sufficiently open
to Jews.

It is significant that Sydney
Moody, Assistant Chief Secretary
of the Palestine government, who
represented the government at
the Mandates Commission session
in Geneva, referred in his report
to the split between the Zionists
and the Revisionists. There is
no doubt that the Palestine gov-
ernment will utilize this split
for its own interests, since it has
already referred to it before the
Mandates Commission.

Revisionists Vote
For Independent Body

The Zionist Revisionists in the
plebiscite which they conducted
throughout the world last week,
voted in overwhelming majority
to establish an Independent Zion-
ist Organization competitive to
the present Zionist Organization.
Vladimir Jabotinsky, the Revi-
sionist leader, addressing a meet-
ing in Vienna, indicated that the
new Zionist Organization which
he will establish will not hesi-
tate to bring up matters before
the Colonial Office and the Man-
dates Commission. He declared
that the Zionist Organization has
no monopoly to represent world
Jewry and that Article IV of the
Palestine Mandate definitely pro-
vides also for other groups inter-
ested in Palestine.

This open threat deserves con-
sideration since not less than
100,000 persons participated in
the Revisionist plebiscite. All
were previously members of the
Zionist Organization. In addi-
tion to them, there are thousands of

Revisionist sympathizers who are
not members of the Revisionist
Party but who are nevertheless
interested in the Zionist move-
ment.

World Congress Must
Heal Breach in Zionism

The next World Zionist Con-
gress, in Lucerne, which opens
August 27, will therefore be faced
with the duty of finding a way to
bring the Revisionists back to
the Zionist Organization. With
the danger of the legislative as-
sembly imminent, unity in the
Zionist ranks is necessary now
more than ever before.

The report submitted by the
Jewish Agency to the Mandates
Commission states that a total
of 42,359 Jewish immigrants en-
tered Palestine during 1934. Of
this number, 9,429 were from
Germany.

The Jewish situation in Ger-
many will no doubt drive many
more thousands of Jews into Pal-
estine in the immediate future.
The Nazi Minister Frick, address-
ing a meeting last week, openly
stated that the government con-
siders that "there is no protec-
tion for Jews in Germany." He
appealed against using violence
against Jews but made it clear
that with a little patience the
Reich will be rid of the Jewish
question.

Sterilization Drive
Opened in Reich

Simultaneously with Frick's
speech, a campaign was started
in Germany last week for sterili-
zation of Jews or those married
to Jews. This campaign has long
been advocated by Julius Streich-
er and is now receiving support
from Nazi leaders who hitherto
opposed Streicher's extreme Jew-
baiting attitude.

In a number of townships in
Germany Jews were attacked last
week and younger Jews were
driven out of their homes. The
Nazi government seems to feel
that the old generation of Jews
in Germany is bound to pass
away anyway. The problem is
only how to get rid of the young
Jews. It is for this reason that
the government is encouraging
Jewish emigration from Ger-
many to Palestine and other
countries. It is also for this rea-
son that the German government
does not oppose the Zionist move-
ment in Germany.

Shavuoth and 3 Nazi Tales

PERHAPS I shouldn't even mention the German situation in this Shavuoth article. For Shavuoth is devoted to the eternal, and Hitlerism is a momentary aberration. And yet, the very timelessness of the holiday grows out of its relation with the temporal. For according to tradition, the fifty days preceding the festival are known as Sefirah and commemorate with sorrow the massacres of Jews under the Emperor Hadrian and during the Crusades. In this period Jews avoid occasions of rejoicing.

Then came Shavuoth. Originally a harvest festival, it became after the destruction of the Temple a holiday to celebrate the giving of the law and a period of consecration to the timeless truths of the Torah. Shavuoth turns the mind of the Jew from the momentary to the eternal, and at the same time provides the Jew with the resources with which to meet the problems of the hour.

PERHAPS then I will be forgiven for relating three German experiences that came to my attention in a recent visit to Naziland and which, in my opinion, tell the essential message of Shavuoth to the Jewish people in a troubled time.

The town of Lubeck was the scene of ugly raids in the early months of Hitler's rule. The Nazis spread the rumor that the Jews had concealed weapons and they made this the excuse for searching their homes and attacking them. However, they found no weapons to justify their charges. One Saturday morning, as the entire Jewish community was gathered in the synagogue, the tramp of marching feet was heard outside. Brown-shirted soldiers roughly banged open the doors and ordered the service to stop. They said they had been informed that the weapons were concealed in the synagogue. They looked under the seats, searched every nook and cranny in the basement and balcony—and found nothing. They were about to leave when the commanding officer happened to notice the curtains of the Ark.

"What's behind there?" he demanded, and without waiting for an answer, he tore open the curtains. There stood the Scrolls of the Torah.

"So these are your weapons!" he shouted.

"Ja," replied the Rabbi, "Dies sind unser Waffen."

ONE DAY when I was in Berlin, the newsboys were hawking a special edition of Streicher's notorious Stuermer. On the front page was a large photograph of a bearded Jew, riding on a garbage wagon between two Nazi soldiers. The caption said: "This is what ought to be done to all the Jews of Germany."

I looked closer at the picture and recognized from his clothes that the prisoner was an Eastern Jew, perhaps a Rabbi. However, it wasn't so much his clothes that struck me as the expression on his face. There was a look of ineffable dignity and quiet self-assurance

that was in such marked contrast to the ugly, gloating, almost bestial expressions on the faces of his captors.

He knew that he represented the truth, whereas they were the instruments of error. His faith was in the forces of light; they were the harbingers of darkness. He was serving the ideals of the ages; they served a man of the hour. The future, he was certain, rested with him, not them.

FOR MANY years I have known the Chief Rabbi of a certain large German city. Although I could never comprehend the almost pathological intensity of his German patriotism and his anti-Zionism, I have always respected him as a man of courage and principle. He served as a Chaplain at the front during the War and emerged with a distinguished record.

His mental suffering during the first few months of Nazi rule was pitiful to behold. For Hitler challenged every principle he held sacred. But so deep were the inner sources of his strength that Hitler could not shake his faith, his courage or his self-respect.

One night the Nazis broke into his house and arrested him. He was shoved into a waiting car and driven to the outskirts of the city. They stood him against a wall and pointed their rifles at him. Then they gave him a paper to read. If he would sign it, they would free him. If not, they would shoot him immediately. He read the statement hurriedly and found it contained a confession that he had been responsible for spreading false atrocity propaganda, and a statement that the charges of Nazi cruelty against the Jews were unfounded. He refused to sign his name to these lies.

"Aren't you afraid of what we will do to you?" the commanding officer asked him.

The Rabbi replied in the words of Jonah, "Teri Onochi V'yoreh Adonoy"—"I am a Hebrew and I fear only God."

Perhaps because they were afraid of the repercussions from killing so prominent a man, they let him go. But they had given him the occasion to display that indomitable faith of the Jew not only in God, but in his own integrity, which is as impervious to Nazism as it has been to all the barbarisms of the past.

\$7,500 Subscribed To Boston J. N. F.

Half of Quota Pledged at Luncheon Opening New England Campaign

BOSTON, June 6—One-half of Boston's quota of \$15,000 in the Jewish National Fund campaign for the redemption of land in Palestine was subscribed at a luncheon in honor of Maurice Levin, New York department store owner, at the local chamber of commerce.

Speakers were Rabbi Harry Levy of Temple Israel Elihu D. Stone, head of the New England Zionist region; Carl Freyfus, publisher; Rabbi H. H. Rubenovitz, chairman of the New England J.N.F.; Mrs. Abbot J. Epstein, president of Boston Hadassah; Philip Potash, director of the New England J.N.F., and Mendel N. Fisher of New York.

The opening of the Boston campaign marked the official launching of the New England \$50,000 drive.

Milk Is 'Sun-Bathed' To Increase Vitamins

"Sun-bathed" milk, treated with ultra-violet rays, is being introduced by the Borden's milk company in the metropolitan area. The process used increases the milk's vitamin D content. The new milk

is called "Irradiated Vitamin D Milk."

Dr. Henry T. Scott of the Wisconsin Alumni Research Foundation explained that this vitamin is "required by the body for forming strong bones and sound teeth. It is needed by infants to help protect them from the serious disease called rickets."

The Stage in Review

'Parade' a Clever Satire

Anyone who wishes to spend a very pleasant evening, should go and see "Parade" at the Guild Theatre. It is a clever satire, well performed and richly staged.

Jimmy Savo, who makes his first appearance with the Theatre Guild, is the recipient of most of the applause of the audience. But many others taking part in the review richly deserve the appreciation of the public.

A mixture of Charlie Chaplin and Eddie Cantor, Jimmy Savo is considered the greatest exponent of pantomime in the world today, and rightly so. His role is open to much vulgarity, but he skilfully avoids the danger of being vulgar.

The ballet numbers in the review are excellent. They are well planned and convey to the audience the spirit intended. Certain scenes like "Send for the Militia," "Flight from the Soviet" and "Bon Voyage" are very clever. Others are very striking with their colorfulness and ideas.

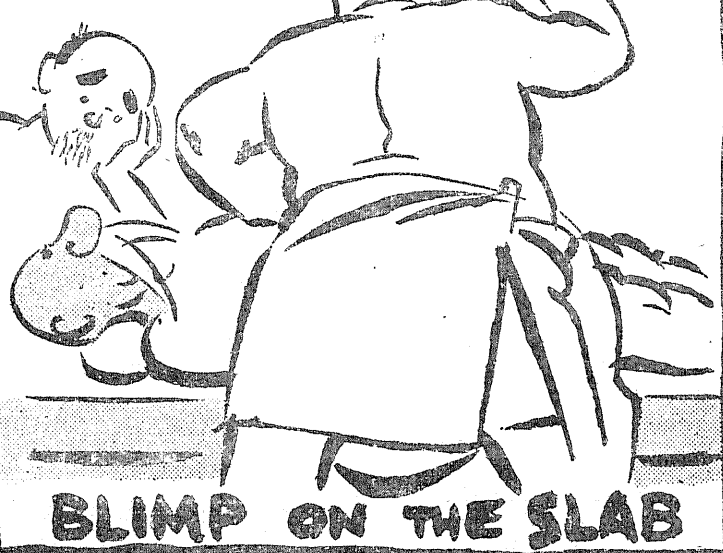
Charity Aides to Hold B'klyn Housewarming

In the Book and Literary World

Stories With a Sting

TIME: THE PRESENT. By TESS SLESINGER. 376 pp. New York: Simon & Schuster. \$2.50.

TESS SLESINGER is much more at home writing short stories than novels. "The Unpossessed," the novel she published last year, impressed me as a desperate attempt to string out a series of vivid and striking impressions in the form of a novel—an attempt inevitably doomed to failure.

I think the reasons for Miss Slesinger's disability in the longer form are precisely the origins of her brilliance in the short story. She was born in 1905 of a family of middle class New York Jews. It is a fair assumption to judge the nature of her family life from such stories as "The Friedman's Annie," in which clear lines of conflict are set up between the principles and aspirations of the daughter of the house, and the solid, conventional life of the household. This conflict is compensated by a destructive, intellectual cynicism, for only thus can the rift between personality and environment be bridged, or at least minimized.

This psychological situation is astonishingly common among young American Jews, and it accounts in part for the dearth of Jewish novelists, despite the great interest of the Jews in literature. For it is an old axiom—now honored in the breach—that an author's attitude toward the theme of his novel must be constructive and that he must have faith in his characters. Without this faith, the lift and surge required to carry through an organic novel cannot be attained.

"He was as beautiful as he had been three years before, but his face was different, hardened perhaps, so that the dapper tan clothes he wore made him cheap and flashy. He still wore pointed shoes with cloth tops.

"Why, Paul!" I said.

"He looked up, caught my eye, and shifted his away as though he had failed to recognize me. He looked down at the floor and spoke in a low voice. 'Miss, would you mind finding my sister Elizabeth Wilson inside and say her brother is waiting for her?'

"I... I left him standing there against the wall, his hat over his eyes, snubbing his former classmates, while they passed their former god and leader, some of them too happy to distinguish his features under that hat, others no doubt turning from him to prevent his embarrassment, and even, on that happy night, to spare themselves."

This story, loaded though it is with overtones and implications, is surpassed in richness by the last and longest story in the volume, "The Answer on the Magnolia Tree." It would take a more delicate pen than mine to suggest here the content and manner of this bitter-sweet sketch of life in a girl's college—a theme much used, but never more pungently than here.

You will find no inspiration, no suggestion of a better way of life, in Miss Slesinger's stories. But you should read them because they illuminate with a clear, white glare the institutions and people around you whom you have previously seen through the shimmer of sentiment and prejudice.

An Old Libel Exposed

BLOOD AND LOVE. (Blut und Eros im Juedischen Schriftum und Leben. By Chajim Bloch, Senzen-Verlag, Vienna, Austria. Price s.7.50.

One of the principal lines of argument adopted by anti-Semites in perpetuating the hideous blood libel is to detach passages from the Talmud and other rabbinical writing from their contexts and so distort them into references to ritual murder.

The leading exponent of this system is Dr. Erich Ischoff, whose work "Das Blut im Juedischen Schriftum und Brauch" (Blood in the Literature and Customs of the Jews) has proved the mainspring whence this form of blood-libel draws its inspiration. Much of what appears today in the Streicher press is derived directly from this source.

Unenlightened Gentiles are bound to be intrigued and puzzled when they read page after page of "Talmudic" quotations all of which seem so manifestly to encourage the charge of ritual murder. Not being versed in Rabbinics, they cannot see for themselves the distorted character of these citations,

and are therefore apt to go away shocked and "convinced."

A special value therefore attaches to a volume now issued by Dr. Chajim Bloch of Vienna, the well-known writer on Hassidic and Cabalistic subjects. The book is entitled "Blut und Eros im Juedischen Schriftum und Leben" (Blood and Love in the Literature and Life of the Jews) and consists of a methodical exposition of the passages cited by Bischoff, the whole constituting a thorough exposure of the anti-Semitic argument.

Remarkably enough Bloch does not make immediate reference to the contemporary situation. He discusses the accusation *per se* and refutes it not only in its Streicherian, but in all its forms. His work is based on the deepest scientific research, but eschews technical and "scientific" terminology. It is written simply and clearly for the layman. It will provide a correct orientation for the non-Jew who is not a professional scholar, but who might otherwise be seduced by the blood libel.

Among the subjects discussed are "Human Blood in the Old Testament," "Human Blood in the Mishnah," "Permitted Shedding of the Blood of Animals," "Shedding of Blood in the Rabbinic Codes," the "Views of Maimonides," the "Blood of the Godless," the "Blood of non-Jews," "Thou Shalt Not Murder," and "The Jewish Woman."

Rabbi to Address Social Work Group

Dr. Philip S. Bernstein to Speak to 6,000 at Montreal Parley

MONTREAL, Que., June 6—More than 6,000 persons are expected to attend the sixty-second annual meeting of the National Conference of Social Work which opens here Sunday. Rabbi Philip S. Bernstein of Temple B'rith Kodesh, Rochester, N. Y., will be the principal Jewish speaker.

Rabbi Bernstein, who this year worked with Father T. Lawrason Riggs, Catholic chaplain, and Dr. Everett R. Clinchy, Presbyterian minister, in building up religious tolerance throughout the country, will speak on his work at the conference.

Among the other 300 speakers will be Dorothy C. Kahn, Philadelphia relief administration; Ruth Z. Bernstein of the National Council of Naturalization and Citizenship; Abraham Goldfeld of New York; Jacob Kepces, superintendent of the Chicago Jewish Home Finding Society; Harry L. Lurie, executive director of the Bureau of Jewish Social Research, New York; Deborah Rosenblum of the Jewish Board of Guardians, New York, and Harry Feinberg of the Detroit Jewish Social Service Bureau.

One of the important questions to be discussed at the conference will be that of organizing the emigration of Polish Jews into other countries. Projects with regard to constructive relief for those Jews in Poland who are not in a position to emigrate will also be discussed.

Wayne University Honors Detroit Man

Confers Doctorate Upon Fred M. Butzel for Activity in Social Work

DETROIT, June 6—Fred M. Butzel, Detroit's outstanding Jewish leader, has been awarded the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws by Wayne University.

The citation awarding the degree to Mr. Butzel stated:

"His active interest in the problems of human social adjustment has made him a leader in organized social work. We have turned to him in his wisdom and kindness of heart for guidance and comfort, for in him we have seen the law, tempered with justice and mercy, serving human needs."

An attorney by profession, Mr. Butzel, who is a graduate of the University of Michigan, has devoted most of his life to social service, primarily in the Jewish field. He has served as president of the National Conference of Jewish Social Work, for a number of years was a member of the board of the

Detroit House of Correction, is associated with practically very important civic movement, is honorary president of the Zionist Organization of Detroit and was the general chairman of the Allied Jewish Campaign held last month.

The Commissioner admitted that a rising tide of Fascism is a handicap to the culmination of his colonization projects but he believes that it will, in due time, be overcome. He stated that with the return this month of his colleague, Dr. Samuel Guy Inman, from Central America and Mexico that the possibilities of immigration will have been investigated in fifteen Latin-American countries.

Mr. McDonald was pleased with the "marked cordiality" with which Dr. Inman and he had been received by governmental authorities everywhere. This, he ascribed in part, "because of the personal regard felt for Dr. Inman by leaders in all of the countries of the

South, and in part to the fact that most informed Latin-Americans to whom racism is incomprehensible, look upon the refugees from Germany as they would upon the victims of a catastrophe in nature—an earthquake or a flood."
