

# Dies Alien Bill Is Assailed In House Report

## Measure Brings U. S. Nearer to Fascism, Mrs. O'Day Says

(Special to the J.D.B.)  
WASHINGTON, June 17—A bitter attack against repressive alien legislation, Mrs. O'Day warned five Caroline O'Day of New York, in a minority report which attacked the Dies bill which is designed to provide for the exclusion and expulsion of alien Fascists, Nazis and Communists.

Opposing enactment of anti-foreign legislation, Mrs. O'Day warned Congress that legislation of this type will bring the United States nearer to Fascism. She pointed out that "There are now pending a great variety of repressive measures, ranging from a bill which would prevent any alien from holding a job to bills which would put in prison any of our citizens advocating doctrines not shared by the majority."

"If all this mass of bills should be enacted there would be no appreciable difference between this country and the countries of the Communists and Fascists against whom the (Dies) bill is aimed, Mrs. O'Day cautioned her legislators. "It will not do to say that because Communists and Fascists in their own lands have blotted out all civil liberty, we must oppose them by adopting the same methods. To do so is obviously to reason in a circle. Moreover, it may be noted that measure of this character have represented one of the early steps in the growth of all forms of Fascism in Europe."

Addressing herself specifically against the Dies bill, Mrs. O'Day said that it would be "primarily because it is merely a new manifestation of the type of repressive legislation which has always proved a tragic failure in this country. It is a new form of the Alien Act of 1798 which raised so great a storm of protest from the country, led by Jefferson and Marshall, that it was never enacted."

Mrs. O'Day warned Congress that enactment of the Dies bill "would lead to the imposition of a new system of espionage over our entire country to that which was in effect during and after the World War with notoriously sterile results."

"The Dies bill, the Representative from New York said, founded upon the fallacy that ideas and beliefs may be effectively changed or suppressed by legislation. Another fallacy which contributes to its proposal is that we can ever substantially help our economic difficulties by getting rid of aliens who compete for jobs with our own citizens."

Mrs. O'Day termed the Dies bill "a part of a regrettable movement, sponsored by certain sections of the press and certain organizations, and which the Department of Labor nor the Department of State nor any other branch of the administration has asked for this bill, Mrs. O'Day reported."

Conservative public opinion of the country is apparently opposed to this type of legislation, she said. "The country has been harmed by bitter experience that laws repressing ideas and opinions have always merely helped to drive underground such ideas and opinions, to intensify the public discussion, and to embitter and make martyrs of their proponents," she added.

Mrs. O'Day is a member of the House Committee on Immigration and Naturalization. The Dies bill which she opposes, has been reported favorably to the House by the committee.

# 11 Jews Are Acquitted Of Plot Against Hitler

COPENHAGEN, June 17 — A sensational case of eleven foreign-born "inculcated" Americans, allegedly plotting to assassinate Hitler in Germany, fizzled out in court here today when the charges against the eleven were dismissed.

Two of the eleven, however, were convicted for another minor offense. One of them is George Mark, a member of the committee. The other nine were fully cleared by the court.

In Berlin, and Israel B. Brodie of the Jewish Economic Committee for Palestine. Dr. M. J. Krupat of New York presided at the session. The speakers on Palestine and Central and Eastern Europe told of various success in occupational re-direction effected in Poland, Germany, Palestine and Soviet Russia. Dr. Lvovitch pointed out that in Poland considerable success in re-educating Jews away from commercial and professional occupations to industrial work has been achieved.

**Keep Private Effort**  
In the earlier session yesterday, Dr. I. M. Rubinow of Cincinnati discussed the relationship between Jewish private philanthropy and a general program of public relief. He declared that with the expansion of public financing of social relief, success in occupational efforts must not be dropped by the Jews, especially insofar as they concern institutional activities.

Dr. Rubinow said, "must remain a special Jewish responsibility, as long as a conscious Jewish group remains."

Personality adjustment in modern Jewish life was discussed at a dinner session of A. A. Roback of Boston and Benjamin Malberg of the New York State Department of Mental Hygiene. Dr. John Slavovitch of the Jewish Welfare Guardians of New York presided.

An important discussion of the type of child coming into child care institutions at the present time was held before a group of institutional executives. Benjamin L. Winfield of Newark, N. J. presided.

## Soltes Deplores Disunity In Jewish Ranks

LAKE PLACID, June 17—The Jewish Center in its relationship to Jewish life and to matters pertaining to youth organization was discussed at the general resurgence of the Jewish youth movement in America, was discussed today at the session of the Conference of the National Association of Jewish Center Executives.

Dr. Mordecai Soltes, director of education of the Jewish Welfare Board, in analyzing the role of the Jewish Center in the Jewish community, declared that one of the distressing features of the current tragic situation has been the failure on the part of Jewish and non-Jewish Jewry to close their ranks in facing a ruthless, powerful foe.

**Dignity Suffers**  
"Instead of closing our ranks we have beheld the disheartening spectacle of public demonstrations of disharmony, disavowal of responsibility and cooperation, mutual recriminations which detracted from

the dignity of Jewish life and rendered the Jewish front in America feeble and ineffective," Dr. Soltes said.

Dr. Soltes emphasized that this state of affairs has a degrading influence upon the morale of Jewish teachers. He also disclosed that more than ninety per cent of the 2,000,000 Jews in New York did not respond at all to the appeals of the Joint Distribution Committee and the American Palestine Campaign.

"The vast majority of our adults continue to shrink their Jewish communal obligations without compunction," he said.

**Urges Sharing Burdens**  
Dr. Soltes voiced the conclusion that it is necessary to inculcate in the rising Jewish generation a keener attitude of responsibility and readiness to share Jewish burdens. Both the Jewish center and Jewish education should manifestly get their respective clientele to think in community terms, he urged.

"One important way of accomplishing this highly desirable end is to afford them frequent opportunities to participate in projects and undertakings calling for specific deeds and the submergence of individual self-interest for the welfare of the larger groups," Dr. Soltes recommended.

Louis Kraft and Miss Ray Wechsler, both of New York, spoke on the same problems yesterday at a session presided over by E. J. London of the Jewish Welfare Board.

# 10,000 at Rites For Yosl Cutler

Labor Groups, Schools Honor Yiddish Author Killed In Auto Crash  
Approximately 10,000 persons participated in the funeral services for Yosl Cutler, Jewish author, cartoonist and creator of the Yiddish Marionette Theatre who was buried on Sunday at the cemetery of the International Workers Order.

Dr. Cutler was killed last week in an automobile crash in Iowa Falls.

The funeral procession started from the Yiddish Center on Irving Place and 14th Street. Representatives of labor organizations and schools formed a guard of honor. Members of the editorial staff of the Jewish Daily Bulletin, New York, Jewish daily on which Cutler worked, were the principal speakers at the ceremonies.

A memorial meeting for Cutler is being arranged for tomorrow at the Fifth Avenue Theatre on Twenty-eighth Street and Broadway.

# 40,000 Children in Poland Seen Needing Medical Care

WARSAW.—The Jewish Health Organization, Toz, of Poland has carried out a statistical medical investigation embracing many thousands of Jewish children, which shows that the number of children needing assistance this year has increased by thirty per cent compared with last year, and sixty per cent since 1932.

certain groups in connection with the forthcoming elections to the next World Zionist Congress, was voiced at the conference by Dr. Schmorak, one of the outstanding figures in the Zionist movement in Poland.

"The Laborites may just as well take over the entire Zionist administration if they receive a majority. The General Zionists have no interest in participating in an Executive which will depend upon the favor of the Left Wing," Dr. Schmorak said.

Dr. Rubenstein, another leading Polish Zionist, demanded the regulation of labor relations in Palestine. He spoke against the establishment of the independent labor organization by the General Zionists and expressed the hope that some way may be found for cooperating with the Histadrut, provided the latter agreed to eliminate politics from its labor platform.

# 36 at City College Win Phi Beta Kappa Keys

Thirty-six seniors and undergraduates of the Gamma chapter of Phi Beta Kappa, national honorary scholastic fraternity, according to an announcement yesterday by Dean Morton Gottschalk, secretary of the admissions committee.

The most conservative estimates of the Toz reveals 40,000 children are in need of medical and sanitary care. The Toz central office states that it is receiving appalling reports of the situation of the Jewish population in the provinces, especially the living conditions of the children. Almost the entire Jewish population of Tver and of Orel, 17th Volhynia, are on the verge of starvation.

In Sokol, Galicia, most of the school children who have been medically examined look like skeletons, many suffer from tuberculosis and trachoma and skin diseases, and there are hardly any children who have been spared by this year's epidemics.
