Labor Issue **Causes Split** At Cracow

General Zionist Parley Is Broken Up After All-Night Session

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
CRACOW, June 18—The World
conference of General Zionists Conference broke up this morning after an allnight session, resulting in a split in the ranks of the World Federation of General Zionists.

The split occurred in connection with the demand of numerous delegates that the General Zionists es-tablish their own labor organizatanish their own habit organiza-tion in Palestine to counteract the influence of the Histadruth. The British delegates led the opposition to this demand.

It is understood that as a result of today's split, the faction known as Group A of the General Zionists will form its own World Union with headquarters in London.

Schwartzbart Resigns

Meanwhile, Dr. Schwarzbart, the president of the World Federation of General Zionists, resigned his presidency today when the confer-nce closed this morning without reaching an agreement on the controversial issue.

During the all-night session, a suggestion was made by Ben-Zion Mossinson, leader of the General Zionists in Palestine, to postpone the question of the establishment of a General Zionist labor organization until after the Zionist Congress in Lucerne. This suggestion only aggravated the situation.

In addition to disagreement on the labor question, a rift developed between the majority and the dele-gates from Britain on the question of internal party discipline. The Executive Committee of the World Federation of General Zionists de-manded that all groups affiliated with the Federation agree in advance to carry out the resolutions to be adopted at the conference by (Continued on Page Four)

Curb on Japs' Palestine Trade Aired at Geneva

Dumping of Cheap Goods Discussed as League **Body Ends Hearing**

GENEVA, June 18 - The Man dates Commission of the League of Nations today completed its hearing on Palestine. It will present of the League of National Council.

The Mandates Commission took up the question of blocking the Japanese trade expansion into Palestine. In view of the fact that Japan is no longer a member of the League of Nations, the ques-tion was discussed as to whether she should continue to enjoy the same customs privileges as other countries enjoy in Palestine as members of the League.

It was reported at the session of the Mandates Commission that Japan now occupies seventh place in Palestine imports and that it is continuing to flood Palestine with cheap products with a view to reaching third place.

A final decision on the Japanese trade issue will be adopted by the Mandates Commission at its next session in the Fall. At this ses-sion it was announced that the Palestine imports from Japan in 1934 totaled about \$3,000,000, as compared with \$1,750,000 in 1933.

A similar resolution was adopted a few days ago by the Polish Socialist Trade Unions.

Greek Taxi Drivers Jailed For Part in Salonica Clashes

SALONICA, June 18 - Seven Greek taxi drivers were sentenced to four days imprisonment each for participating in the anti-Jewish street attacks which took

place in Salonica several days ago. Following Jewish representation, strong police force has been assigned to the Jewish quarters in order to prevent a recurrence of anti-Jewish incidents.

General Kondylis, Vice Premier and Minister of War, who became a national hero when he crushed the Venizelist uprising in March, addressing a large mass meeting here, said that he had always had warm sympathies for the Jews.

"The Jews can always rely on me," he said. "As long as I am in the government they need have no fear for anything."

Front Soldiers Union Advises 'Gesture On Principle

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, June 18—The Union of BERLIN, June 18—The union or Jewish Front Soldiers issued a manifesto today advising Jewish youths of conscrition age to file their petitions with the military authorities for permission to serve Germany.

The manifesto was issued despite the fact that the conscription regu lations make it clear that Jews will not be admitted to the army.

The filing of such petitions is necessary in order to assert the in-alienable rights of the Jewish population in Germany, the manifesto states.

Army Bar Emphasized

At the same time the West-deutscher Beobachter, the leading Nazi organ in Western Germany, came out today with an article on the conscription, emphasizing that Jews should not expect that they will ever be admitted to military service.

"Military service is a service of honor which is only for Germans and not for Jews," the paper writes.

and not for Jews," the paper writes. The exclusion of Jews from military service was also the subject of a lecture delivered at Freiburg University by Frof. Brich Wolf, a member of the faculty. "Military service is not a privilege but a responsibility," Prof. Wolf said. "It. sponsibility," Prof. Wolf said. "It is not desired that this responsibility should be carried by people of alien race, although the same people may continue to enjoy un-restricted legal protection in trade and unhindered exercise in their religion."

What Jews Have Done for Leeds

LEEDS, ENGLAND.

Leeds is a city of multifarious industries, but if by ill-chance it were at any time to lose its clothing trade it would be like Hamlet without the Prince of Demmark, an article in Men's Wear, a trade publication, declares. Leeds began its career with wool. For 400 years, so the records show, it was pre-dominantly woollen. Following the

commantly woonen. Following the confining that provided in the wholesale the trade. For long years the clothing industry (introduced to Jews sowed and others reaped. Who the city in 1855) has now established the first provided the complain that now so many lished itself as the largest single clothing business in Leeds are complain. lished itself as the largest single industry within its boundaries. And it has made Leeds one of the biggest clothing centers in the world. One firm alone employs 10,000 workpeople, and the most world. One firm alone employs 10,000 workpeople, and the most recently-compiled statistics show that nearly 10,000 males and more than 36,000 females are employed in the industry—or nearly one-tenth of the population of the city.

The big majority of clothing firms in Leeds are owned by men of Jewish persuasion. The working conditions are unquestionably of the best, and compare favorably and frequently excel those obtain-ing in the best managed establishments of other industries. Rough-ly speaking, there are some 200 establishments in and around Leeds today and, according to many responsible people in the trade, expansion is not only still going on but is likely to continue for years to come.

The Role of a Knife

In a survey of the history of the Leeds clothing industry, the story would be incomplete if there were no mention of the part played by the invention of the bandknife for cutting cloth. This knife was made by a Leeds enginering firm in collaboration with the late Sir John Barran, and from 1858 to the present day it has been used for cutting suits in bulk.

All the authorities claim that this machine-knife has had en enormous influence in cheapening the cost of production, and without its aid it is questionable if the firms which started in the early days of the es-tablishment of the clothing trade on Leeds could have lived. By the employment of this ingenious de-vice, of course, a large number of suits of clothing can be cut out in an incredibly short time.

Created Sales Outlets

At any rate, it was after the in-roduction of the bandknife, in 1858, that the cuting-out of the parts for the making of suits went on at such a speed that the makersip could scarcely bring over Rus-

trolled by Jews? Moreover, they have not been content with the making-up of cloths. They have set up a great organization for sell-ing them. Thus at the present time there are hundreds of retal shops in different parts of the British Isles controlled by Leeds Jewish clothiers.

What a difference to the early years when Mr. William Campbell travelled his wares! He had to bear the rebuffs and insults of indignant retail tailors, who often threatened to "kick him out" if he dared to show his face again. His calm reply was: "Well, you will t." How true! have to come to it."

Succeeded on Jewish Labor

One of the earliest Jews of prominence in the Leeds clothing trade was Herman Friend. John Barran's firm succeeded largely because Jewish labor was found for him, and it was Herman Friend who found that labor. John Barran, who was the son of a London gunmaker, came to Leeds to be an assistant to the late Alderman Gresham, pawnbroker and clothier, and he eventually opened a little shop as a clothler on his own ac-count at the south end of Leeds Bridge. About 1856, Herman Friend Bridge. About 1856, Herman Friend made up ready-made clothes and took them to be sold in John Bar-ran's shop. That was the small beginning of their business relationship.

Before that it was the habit of working-men to wear fustian cloth-ing or cast-off clothing of their better-off neighbors, but the era of cheap ready-mades changed all that.

However neither Herman Friend However neither Herman Friend nor any of the earlier Jews who set themselves up as employers reaped the full measure of the prosperity which came to the trade from this small beginning, and it was only after the dawn of the twentieth century that Leeds Jew-ish ciolthers launched out both as manufacturers and retailers. Only then did they come into the field as competitors for the rich harvest which might have been theirs for

the asking in the earlier years. Responsible for Prosperity

No one denounced the introduc-tion of cheap Jewish labor into Leeds more than the Gentile working-man, but, whatever effect the presence of the Jews had at that time in keeping down wages, one must at least acknowledge today that it was Jewish labor which

made possible the present-day pros-perity in the Leeds clothing indus-try, the Men's Wear article states. Thus in the history of the Jewish community in Leeds and its influence upon the clothing trade the name of the late Mr. Herman Friend is writ large. He was the only tailor among the first hundred Jewish settlers in the city and In addition to the part he played with John Barran in the founding of the clothing industry, he was the creator of the divisional labor system which really made the trade what it is today.

Campaign for Polish Jewry The annual convention of the Federation of Polish Jews has authorized its Executive to start an independent campaign in America to raise funds for Polish

Despite all the misery now be or bespite all the misery now being experienced by the Jews in
Poland and despite the sincere
desire of every Jew in this country to help them, it would hardly be practical for the Federation of Polish Jews actually to start a campaign of its own. Such a campaign was started in England recently and although it was backed by all groups in British Jewry, it turned out to be a flat

The British Example

The Federation of Polish Jews in America cannot afford to speculate as to whether a spe-cial campaign in America for Polish Jews would be a success. Polish Jews would be a success.

Before starting such a campaign, the Federation must make sure that it will have at least some measure of success. Otherwise, measure of success. Otherwise, not only will the Federation be discredited but also those who may agree to assist in the cam-

It must not be forgotten that the special campaign started in England for Polish Jewry was backed by such personalities as Chief Rabbi Hertz, Neville Laski, Leonard Monteflore, Nahum So-kolow and others. If, notwithkolow and others. If, notwith-standing all this backing the campaign in England is already con-sidered a failure, one must be extremely optimistic to expect that such a campaign in America will have a different result.

J.D.C. Is Best Qualified

The proper thing for the Federation of Polish Jews to do is to exercise more pressure upon the Joint Distribution Committee to increase its assistance to the Jews of Poland. The Joint Dis-tribution Committee, with its apparatus and its traditions, could do more for the Jews of Poland than any other organization, if it would only assign more funds for this specific work.

That the leaders of the Joint That the leaders of the Joint Distribution Committee are fully aware of the plight of Polish Jewry is apparent from the report submitted last week by Dr. Bernhard Kahn to the Executive of the J.D.C. in New York. It is one of the most illuminating re-ports on Poland that I have ever ports on Foland that I have ever read. It gives a graphic picture of all aspects of the situation there as well as of its causes. It is an expert analysis on the present day plight of Polish

The fact that Dr. Bernhard The fact that Dr. Bernnard Kahn found it necessary to make a special study in Poland before coming to the United States is the best evidence that the Joint Distribution Committee has no intention of neglecting Polish Jewry. It is only a question of how much influence the leaders of the Federation of Polish Jews in America can exercise on the Joint Distribution Committee to obtain the maximum relief pos-

The Joint Distribution Committee at present has on its hands plenty of obligations. It has to worry about the Jews in Germany, the German-Jewish re-fugees outside of Germany. The Jewish situation in Rumania also presents a problem to the Joint Distribution Committee, But with all this, the leaders of the J.D.C. seem to realize that their greatest problem today is that of se-

> MILWAUKEE, June 18 — With \$5,000 already transmitted to the national office of the Jewish National Fund, the Milwaukee campaign committee has pledged itself to raise \$45,000 more in the next five years for the establishment of a "Milwaukee colony" in Palestine.

The \$5,000, raised during a recent drive, was sent as a down payment for purchase of \$50,000 worth of land in the name of Milwaukee

This is the first time any city has purchased Palestinian land in its own name and pledged itself, through a resolution and contract, to raise a definite sum for establishment of such a colony.
