Greece Allots Sum to Repair Slum Quarters

Cabinet Member Stirred To Action by Visit In Salonica

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) SALONICA, June 21—Impressed by the poverty and misery of the Jewish population in Salonica, the Minister of Interior, M. Kyros, now on a visit here, decided on the spot today to allocate a substantial sum of money for the immediate repair of the houses in the slum district where the poorest part of the Jew-ish population resides.

The Minister also announced that the government would provide fur-ther assistance for the improve-ment of conditions in the Jewish slums in Salonica.

In a statement to the press, Minister of Agriculture Theotokis, ex-pressed the hope that the decline

pressed the hope that the decline of the Jewish population in Salonica is only temporary.

"I know what Spain lost by expelling the Jews, and what Greece has to gain by retaining the Jews," the Minister said. "I am glad to see the Jews of Greece rapidly assimilated in the life of our coun-

Minister Theotokis emphasizes that it is the program of the Greek government to assist in every way the complete assimilation of the Jews in Greece.

Would Lift Student Bar In Hungary

Catholic Deputy Urges End of Quota Law Of 1920

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BUDAPEST, June 21—The elimination of numerus clausus restrictions on Jewish students in the Hungarian universities was demanded here at the parliamentary session last night by Rudolf Ruppert, Catholic member.

Mr. Ruppert pointed out that in justice to the young generation of Hungary, it was high time that the numerus clausus, which has been in existence fifteen years, be abolished. He emphasized that under the present exchange regulations. when Hungarian citizens are not permitted to take money out of the country they cannot study in foreign universities. It is therefore in the interests of Hungary, he said, to admit freely all students who seek to enter her universities.

"When the numerus clausus was introduced in 1920, the young men of our present generation were only children at that time. Why should they suffer now?" the Cathoshould they suffer how the case.

"Why should the unity of our nation be disrupted by regulations which may have been justified fifteen years

ago, but not now? ago, but not now?"

Will Go to London to Air Plans for Palestine Legislative Body

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) JERUSALEM, June 21—The Jew-ish Telegraphic Agency was in-formed today that Sir Arthur Wau-chope, the High Commissioner of Palestine, will proceed to London about the middle of August in con-

The regulations governing the elections of Chief Rabbis and the Rabbinical Council of the Palestine Jewish Community were made public here as approved by the government

These regulations provide for a Council of five-year duration. The election procedure places power in the hands of the lay and religious representatives in the proportion of twenty-eight laymen to forty-two rabbis. An election committee will rabbis. An election committee will be formed of four appointees of the existing Rabbinical Council, and four appointees of the Vaad Leumi.

Curb Violence. Is Mayor's Plea To Polish City

Grodno Official Asks Aid Of Youth and Mothers Against Rioting

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) WARSAW Tune 21-In an effort to prevent further anti-Semitic disturbances in the city of Grodno, where sixty Jews were injured and one killed in the reeent riots, the Mayor of Grodno, Victor Misky, issued an appeal to the population "to enlighten those who have been misled."

"Those who beat defenseless peo-ple, rob or destroy their posses-sions, smash windows, do not build, but destroy unreasoningly, work harm to their country and to them-selves," the appeal states.

The Mayor addresses his appeal especially to the Polish youth and mothers.

"Polish youth, do not let your-selves be drawn into disturbances which is in the process of rebuild-which is in the process of rebuilding, demands the utmost effort on the part of the whole of its population to maintain order and peace, so that it should be possible to carry on constructive work.

"Polish mothers, you gave your

sons to Poland, to fight for indepen-dence. Do not let your children be drawn into barbarous disturbances, which will be a stain on their honor," the appeal emphasizes.

Franconia Takes Vote From Jews

Those Naturalized from 1922-1929 Affected By Streicher Edict

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, June 21—The govern-ment of Franconia, which is ruled by the notorious anti-Semite Julius

Streicher, today cancelled the citi-zenship of all Jews in Franconia who were naturalized between 1922 and 1929.

A lecture on racial problems in Germany was delivered by Herr Streicher last night to the political police in Munich, the capital of Ba-varia. In his lecture, Herr Streich-er declared that the worst enemy of Germany is the Jew and that the political police should see to it that no "Aryan" girls keep company with Jews. Sued by Nazi

Mr. Simonstein was fued by the Nazi official for "spolling his repu-tation." The court ruled that "any German, not only a Nazi official, can bring court action for slander against a Jew who spreads a ru-mor that he patronizes Jewish enterprises."

Says Revisionists

Back from Palestine Be Held in Sept.

The first World Congress of the Independent Zionist Organization. which is now being formed by the Revisionists, will be held in Sep-tember, probably in Praha, William B. Ziff, president of the Zionist Re-visionist Organization of America, declared Friday in a press statement on his return from a trip to Palestine.

"The policy of the newly formed organization will be to submit every

important question to a general important question to a general plebiscite," Mr. Ziff said.

Relating his impressions of Falestine, Mr. Ziff asserted that the orange industry in Palestine Is about to face the most desperate crisis in its history.

"The general impression in Pal-estine is that the British government is trying to put a stop to Jew-ish immigration and intends to put over the Legislative Council as a sounding board," he stated.

Interfaith Body To Be Formed By Canadians

Will Be Modeled Along Lines of Similar Group Here

MONTREAL, June 18—A national Conference of Jews and
Christians in Canada, similar to
that existing in the United States, for the promotion of racial under-standing and suppression of bigotry and doctrinal prejudice, will be established in the near future as the result of a meeting of Protes-tant, Catholic and Jewish ecclesiastical dignitaries held in the Monte fiore Club here.

The meeing was held under the ahirmanship cahirmanship of Rabbi Harry Stern, and on the suggestion of Rev. T. W. Jones, of Calvary United Rev. T. W. Jones, of Caivary United Church, Very Rev. Arthur Carlisle, Dean of Montreal was appointed chairman of a provisional committee to study ways and means of organizing the new institution.

Those present at the meeting included Rev. Father Robert Barry of the Catholic Charities, Boston; Rev. Dr. Everett Clinchy of New York, director of the National Conference of Jews and Christians of the United States; Rabbi Philip Bernstein, of Rochester, N. Y.: Rev. Dr. F. W. Kerr, of St Andrew's United Church, Westmount; Dean Arthur Carlisle, Rev. David A. Mac-Lennan of Emmanuel Church, Montreal; Dr. C. E. Silcox, of Toronto, president of the Social Service Council of Canada and Rev. Dr. A. Lloyd Smith, of Dominion Dougles Church, Westmount.
