According to the full text of the compulsory labor law only "pure 'non-Aryans'" are barred from the compulsory labor service. "Semi-Aryans," however, are admitted under the provision that they will not be allowed to become superior officers in the labor service.

Jews Ask 20 Seats in Polish Sejm

Seek 9 in Upper House; Deputies Abstained in **Electoral Law Vote**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

WARSAW, June 27-The Jewish members of the Polish Parliament announced today that they had abstained from voting yesterday on the new parliamentary electoral law because it curbs Jewish representation.

Twenty Jewish seats in the Sejm and nine seats in the Senate were demanded yesterday in the name of the Jewish faction by Deputy F. Rothenstreich, during the discussion in the Sejm on the new elec-

Deputy Rothenstreich emphasized that the Jews can never agree to be limited to four deputies since they constitute ten per cent of the entire population. Even if they were given a maximum of six seats in the Cejm, as proposed in some government circles, it would hardly satisfy them.

Not Content With 6

"Even if six Jewish deputies are returned to the Seim under the new law, they will be elected by non-Jewish votes and will therefore not be able to represent Jewish interests," the Jewish spokesman declared.

Deputy Rothenstreich expressed the fear that Jewish representatives in the Sejm who will be elected by the grace of non-Jewish voters may even oppose Jewish interests in the fear that they may lose their seats.

The Polish Parliament under the new electoral law will consist of more than 200 deputies. Dr. Rothenstreich's demand for twenty seats in the Sejm is based on the proportion of the Jewish population as compared to the general population of the country.

100 Quitting Poland Daily; 3,583 in May

WARSAW, June 27-An average of more than 100 Jews are now emigrating daily from Poland, according to official statistics made public here today.

The figures published show that during the month of May 3,583 Jews left the country. Of this number, 2,511 emigrated to Palestine.

Rabbi Urges CarefulStudyof Coughlin Plan

He's Not Anti-Semitic, Dr. Marcus Tells Chicago Parley

CHICAGO, June 27-The suggestion that Father Coughlin's social justice program "merits the careful attention and concern of the Jew." was made by Dr. Jacob R. Marcus of Cincinnati at today's session of the annual convention of the Central Conference of American Rabbis.

Dr. Marcus's discussion of Father Coughlin came during a report on contemporaneous history and liter-"There is one mass movement today," he declared, "that merits the careful attention and concern of the Jew. I refer to Father Coughlin's National Union for Social Justice. This movement apparently liberal and even radical in certain respects.

"It is unfortunate and deeply to be regretted that Coughlin links with specific Jewish names the international forces which he stresses as sinister. It is also to be re gretted that contrary to the spirit pealed to his hearers to remember pealed t ohis hearers to remember that 'When it comes to law and when it comes to representation in Congress, don't forget this is a Christian nation.'

"Coughlin is not an anti-Semite. Therefore, it is hoped he never will through inadvertence afford anyone the opportunity to associate him with anti-Semitic forces of reaction and hate."

New Colonial Secretary Says He Will Not Lift Restrictions

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) LONDON, June 72-The hopes that Malcolm MacDonald would display a more liberal policy towards Jewish immigration into Palestine, suffered a setback today when the new Colonial Secretary officially informed Col. Josiah Wedgwood that he will take no steps toward changing the restrictions against admitting Jews into Palestine, Transjordan and Cyprus.

The information was given by Mr. MacDonald to Col. Wedgwood in written form. It came as a reply to a demand from Col. Wedgwood that German Jews be permitted freely to enter Palestine, Transjordan and Cyprus.

Cites 'Absorptive Capacity'

"Immigration into Palestine must be governed by the economic absorptive capacity of the country," MacDonald's letter says. "The High Commissioner of Palestine is showing every sympathy toward the plight of German Jews. He must, however, observe the principle of absorptive capacity."

With regard to Jewish immigration into Transjordan, the former Premier's son refers to a reply-already given on this question by Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister, his predecessor, in which he stated that "the High Commissioner of Palestine is not able to recommend the encouragement of Jewish settlement in Transjordan."

Answering the question about Jewish immigration to Cyprus Mr. MacDonald writes that "free immigration into Cyprus would be prejudicial to the interests of the inkabitants there."

England and Germany

LONDON.

Some time ago I had occasion to write on British public sentiment and pointed out that, at the time, it had just veered away from a point close to acceptance and toleration of Nazi Germany.

In the month that has elapsed since that writing, the tide has swung and swung again. Hitler's speech to his puppet Reichstag was responsible for a complete shift in official, newspaper and public sentiment. British leaders, almost without exception, hailed the speech as witness of Hitler's desire for peace. Lord Snowden, ex-Socialist, insisted in a newspaper article that the speech be accepted at its face value. Bertrand Russell analyzed Hitler's new program for world peace and concluded it should be given a trial.

Government spokesmen declared that the British government accepted the speech-indeed, discussions regarding naval limitations are now proceeding in London between England and the Reich as one fruit of the Hitler oration.

THE press, almost unanimously, praised Hitler's pacific stand and even the Laborite Daily Herald was loud in its protestations that the Nazi leader be given an opportunity to prove his sincerity.

But-Hitler's Goering continued to build airplanes. Even Lord Rothermere, whose newspapers have been pugnaciously defending the Hitler regime, realized that and parallelling peans of praise for Hitler in the Rothermere papers, were almost frantic appeals for more British planes to protect Britain from attack-though even the Rothermere papers concede that Germany is the only possible attacker.

Observers were therefore treated to the spectacle of, on the one side, long protestations that Hitler means peace and on the other a full-blown recruiting campaign for the Royal Air Force. Some 60,000 young Britons heard the call for volunteers for the R.A.F. and besieged the recruiting offices for England's new front-line defense force.

RNGLAND, in general watched this new recruiting activity with interest—and something of re lief. And took all the protestations about peaceful intentions of her neighbors calmly. England is well on the road to economic recovery and wants to stay on the road. Wars and European adventures are not at all to her liking. The Englishman today wants peace and quiet, to be out of the European mess and to be let alone. But he does not want to be bombed out of

World. So, the old mistrust of Germany has been creeping back. Reports of General Goering's "honeymoon" tour among the old German Empire's war companions-Bulgaria, Hungary and Yugoslavia — have added to the suspicions that Germany is up to something or other that may bode no good.

* * * IT WAS in this atmosphere of half-awakened suspicion that the Prince of Wales, a war veteran, proposed proffering the hand of friendship to German war veterans. The idea of former foes meeting in friendship, their former enmity forgotten, struck the English as a particularly chivalrous gesture. For a day or two-but no longer-England breathed the spirit of friendship with an old foe. Then the reaction set in.

Viscount Castlerosse, writing in the Daily Express, described some American gangsters he had encountered. "Al Bannion," he informed his readers, "was shot when shaking hands with a rival.

"The Germans likewise view life through spectacles different from ours. They have the same morals as other gangsters.

"They glorify war. They wish to dominate the world; they wish to treat the English and the French as they have treated the Jews and hope to treat the Catholics.

"Shake hands with the German by all means, but keep your eyes on his other hand-

 $\mathbf{B^{UT}}$ the feeling toward Germany is in the hands of the Nazis themselves. Every pacifistic statement of Hitler is given the benefit of the doubt but every statement, so far as it affects British opinion, is militated against by some new outburst of Nazi cruelty and stupidity. The persecution of the dissenting pastors is having its effect in clerical circles which have previously furnished the Nazis some of their most vocal apologists. The persecution of the Catholics is stir-

ring a large group of Englishmen. Nazi Germany is creating the most effective propaganda against herself, at least so far as England is concerned. General sentiment may apparently turn in favor of the Reich but such manifestations may only be temporary. England wants to be let alone and the Englishman realizes today that Germany is the only danger to his peace and quiet.

The Chicago Conference

Many Jews in America will agree and many will disagree with the points of view expressed on the current economic problems in America at the convention of the Central Conference of American Rabbis which is now being held in Chicago. All will admit, however, that the Conference's attitude towards the experiments now being made in American economic life by the Roosevelt administration is of great interest.

The difficulties which the Roosevelt administration face lie in the fact that it has to fight on two fronts. It must fight both capitalism and radicalism. In this respect the task of the Roosevelt administration is much more complicated than the task of a Fascist government which fights Communism only, or the task of a Communist government which fights capitalism only.

Having organized capital against it, no less than it has Communism, the Roosevelt administration depends largely upon the support of those who do not side with either of these two camps and who see the faults of both ex-

Firm on Social Justice

It is from this point of view that the recommendations on social justice made at the Central Conference of American Rabbis will be viewed with great interest by all those who are far from extreme radicalism but who nevertheless see the injustices inflicted by organized capital in America. Legislation on child labor, limitation of working hours, regulation of wages, social security—all these requests voiced at the convention in Chicago are only in accordance with the basic principles of justice as advocated by Jewish religion.

It was advocated at the convention that the basic enterprises in the United States be socialized, and that the national income in America be redistributed in a way that would spell justice for the average American citizen. These views may be considered by many as radical, but they actually recommend a system which has long been practiced in many European countries.

Hesitant on War

The attitude taken by the conference on war, suggesting that a national referendum be taken in America before a declaration of war can become effective, will be considered by many as naive. A nation either enters or does not enter into a war. Once the United States reaches a point where such a referendum becomes necessary, it will mean that the United States does wish to participate in a war-and no referendum will prevent it.

The resolution expressing itself outright against war, which was recommended to the Conference by its committee on international peace, received ninety votes, while thirty-two voted against it, and thirty-one voted for it with reservations. shows that although the majority of delegates is against war, there is no uniformity of opinion on this question in the ranks of American Reform rabbis, despite the fact that it has been discussed during the year from many pulpits of all denomina-

A Suggestion To the Reich Veterans

The London Daily Herald, commenting editorially on the reception given to the German war veterans in England, says:

If they do sincerely wish for the friendship and the goodwill of British ex-Service men and of the British nation, then they have indeed to rid our minds of certain memories. But these are not the memories of the war years. They are recent.

How can there be a genuine fraternization while the British guests have in mind the fact that other German war veterans, no less gallant than their hosts, are held, and some tortured, in concentration camps?

They may say no word, being bound by the laws of politeness. Or, if the subject is mentioned, they may politely accept the explanations and assurances given to them. But, though they may accept, they cannot believe: for the facts are too notorious.

The irony of the situation is that many of these men, be they Socialists or Communists or Jews. have suffered imprisonment or worse precisely on account of their devotion to those ideas of peace and international understanding of which Herr Hitler is now so eloquent an advocate.

If he desires the friendship of Britain for Germany, the openinf of his political jails and concentration camps will do more to achieve his end than a hundred

Appeal to Use \$45,000 to Aid NEWS Returnes Here Retugees Here

Sum Will Be Allocated To Local Agencies; **Drive Is Lagging**

A \$45,000 appropriation to aid German refugees at present in New York City was announced yesterday by the United Jewish Appeal. The funds will be allocated to local agencies equipped to care for the refugees.

The announcement was made by E. Edwin Goldwasser, Nathan Straus and Michael Schaap, cochairmen of the Greater New York appeal, who pointed out that the response of New York City to the campaign has been "disappointing."

"The inadequate response of the fortunate people of this city," they said, "indicates that they can have no conception of the magnitude of the problems of their brethren abroad. Millions of men, women and children are in dire need in Germany, Poland and other lands. Their only hope of survival is through assistance of the Jews of America.

"This appeal dare not fail."

Prof. Albert Einstein declared at dinner given in his honor by the Appeal at the Hotel Commodore Wednesday night that "all available Jewish forces must be put at the disposal of the current relief activities.'

He warned that the "moral disintegration and intensified national egoism" of the present day requires that Jews be vigilant in preserving Jewry. The upbuilding of Palestine is of primary importance, Prof. Einstein declared.

"Without Palestine," he asserted, "the horrors of recent years would have been even more terrible and the demoralization of the Jewish

people far greater."

(Continued from Page One) only possible places to which the German Jews can emigrate.

In answer to Rabbi Samuel H. Goldenson's statement at an earlier session that Judaism is a religion rather than a civilization, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland tonight declared, "If we regard Israel as a religious community exclusively, there would be no room within its folds for myriads of our people who are non-religious and who can accept neither the theology of Judaism nor the code of religious observances, orthodox or reform, and who are yet very loyal and active Jews."

Sees Room for All in Judaism

"But being a people and not a religious community," Dr. Silver continued, "there is room for those who do not wish to be Jews and who declare that we have no portion or inheritance in our father's house. And these are being tragically reminded in some parts of the world today that even though they forsake their inheritance in their father's house, they will not find tehir portion or inheritance any where else in the world."

Reject Peace Resolution

After a long and heated discussion, the delegates yesterday rejected a resolution drafted by the committee on international peace pledging its members not to support the war under any circum-

Instead, a committee was appointed to bring into this session a substitute resolution which would state the attitude of the Conference toward peace with particular reference to whether it was opposed to all forms of war.

An attempt by Rabbi Abraham J. Feldman of Hartford to attach to the original resolution an amendment, "except in case of invasion of continental United States," failed.

· Back Referendum on War

Other recommendations of the committee, which were approved by the Conference, are:

1. Approval of a constitutional amendment requiring a national referendum to declare war, except in case of invasion.

2. That the Conference at the next convention devote an entire session to the question of war and peace.

- vere in efforts for disarmament. 6. That Congress support Sena-

Revalue God Concept

As a symposium on a revaluation of Reform Judaism which was opened by Rabbi David Philipson of Cincinnati, Dr. Felix A. Levy of Chicago, vice-president of the Conference, and Dr. Samuel C. Cohen, professor of theology at the Hebrew Union College, Cincinnati, presented papers on a revaluation of the concept of God.

Dr. Levy, speaking from the standpoint of modern philosophy, laid down the principle that "Judaism is uncompromisingly theistic and Reform Judaism cannot be otherwise. Humanism and all other atheistic philosophies and Judaism are contradictions in terms.

"As Liberals we must take cognizance of all contributions that science and the increase of knowledge have made to the God idea. However, we do not have to change the God idea, but only deepen and widen the concept."

Dr. Cohen, in his paper on "The Idea of God in Judaism Historically Considered," said that the Jewish doctrine of ethical monotheism affirms (1) The reality of a living God; (2) God is best conceived as personal, not in the sense of anthropomorphism, but of individuality, intelligence and will; (3) He is the creative principle who called the universe into being and sustains it by his wisdom and might; (4) He makes not only for order in physical nature but also in the life of man.

On Palestine Trip

Given Farewell in Boston; to Attend Zionist Congress At Lucerne

Rabbi Stephen S. Wise, president of the American Jewish Congress, will sail for Europe and Palestine tomorrow on the Ile de France. He will spend a month in Palestine, following which he will attend the World Zionist Congress at Lucerne. Afterwards he will confer informally with a group of Jewish leaders under the auspices of the Committee of Jewish Delegations and the Zionist Congress Executive Committee.

About 200 persons bade farewell to Dr. Wise at a dinner in the Hotel Tourraine, Boston, Wednesday night. The dinner marked the close of the Jewish National Fund campaign.

Lauding M. Ussishkin for his services to Zionism, Dr. Wise stressed the necessity of acquisition of land in Palestine, a point which Ussishkin always empha-
