Swiss Ban Sale of Three Nazi Papers

Bar on Stuermer and Two Others Seen as Retaliatory Act

Geneva, July 2.—The Swiss government today officially banned the sale of Julius Stuermer's anti-Semitic weekly, Der Stuermer.

The Alleman, Nazi publication appearing near the Swiss frontier, and Reichsbote, the organ of the German living in Switzerland, were also prohibited.

According to the official order these three papers may no longer be sold in any part of Switzerland.

This act by the Swiss government follows directly on Germany's prohibition of the Basler Nachrichten, a Swiss newspaper, from being circulated in Germany.

Relations between Switzerland and Germany have been considerably strained. The tension became all the greater, when a few months ago, Berthold Jacob, a German Jewish journalist seeking refuge in Switzerland was kidnapped, beaten unconscious and forced across the Swiss border into Germany by a Swiss journalist.

The Swiss government made protestations to Germany and to the League of Nations, and finally Germany had to back down and agree to submit to a trial of the case at the World Court at The Hague.

Ever since there have been a series of reprisals and retaliations between the two nations. The Jewish issue has figured prominently, with Switzerland refusing to tolerate anti-Semitic propaganda from Germany.

Only two days ago, the Stuermer was banned from the streets of Zurich.

4,186 Jews Entered Palestine Last Month

JERUSALEM, July 2.—A total of 4,186 Jews entered Palestine during the month of June, according to a report made public here today.

The categories under which these Jews came to Palestine were as yet not specified.

Reich Court Refuses to Allow 'Aryan' to Take Jewess as Wife

Berlin, July 2.—The court at Wetlar, near Frankfurt-am-Main, yesterday upheld the decision of the registrar in a local village who refused to issue a marriage license to an "Aryan" and a Jewess.

The registrar had refused to publish the marriage bans stating that he would not aid in the corruption of German blood by allowing intermarriage with Jews. As a good Nazi, he said, he could not permit such a marriage to take place.

Achmeire Allowed To Keep Citizenship

JERUSALEM, July 2.—The Palestine Government today informed Achmeire, Achmeire and Messars, Yevin and Dviri, three leaders of the Revisionist Brith Hahibronim, alleged terrorist organization, that they will not be deprived of their citizenship. Whether the government permits them to retain the franchise in the future, it was emphasized, depends on their good behavior.

Peace Leaders Warn Reich On Anti-Semitism

Relations with England Hurt by Acts, Parley Tells Embassy

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, July 2.—The International Peace Congress now in session here today sent a communique to the German Embassy in London pointing out that Anglo-German relations are being severely damaged by a persistence in the use of force in their anti-Jewish discriminations.

The letter points out, too, that there can be no friendship with a country who resorts to such barbarism as does Nazi Germany in its treatment of the Jews.

Today's session of the Congress was addressed by Miss Estelle Sternberger, executive director of the World Peaceways, and the only American delegate attending the Congress. Her subject was: "Publicizing and Advertising Peace."

Other speakers at today's session were Hon. Arthur Henderson, British labor leader, and Sir Norman Angell, British statesman and peace leader.

The communist follows on the heels of a resolution adopted a few weeks ago by Federation of League of Nations Societies at its Congress in Brussels. The resolution condemned Germany for its anti-Jewish legislation and asked the League of Nations and all member governments to intervene effectually to secure the restoration of social and political rights for the Jews in Germany.

The resolution went on to call the situation which now obtains in Germany, "an outrage to the conscience of all civilized humanity."

Clashes between them and Jewish councillors have been frequent. On May 29, the Endek councillors attacked the Jewish members of the council with knivels and pieces of furniture. A bloody riot resulted in which several Jewish councillors were injured, one of them severely. The police finally had to intervene to restore order. The riot started when one of the councillors shouted "Down with the Polish Hitlerites." Socialist councillors were also the butt of this attack.

In voting against the municipal budget the Endek aldermen had declared that they were doing so for anti-Semitic reasons.

Khalidi Party Voices Its Opposition to Jewish National Home

JERUSALEM, July 2.—The Arab Reform Party recently organized by Mayor Hussein Khalidi, the new chief executive of Jerusalem, today published its program for the first time.

The program voices the opposition of the Reform Party to the establishment of the Jewish National Home in Palestine. It also demands that England make a treaty with the Palestine Arabs, whereby Palestine shall become a part of the federation of Arab countries.

In general the program demands the Palestine Arabs shall be treated similar to that enjoyed by the Moslems in Iraq.

JNF Acquires Large Acreage From Arabs

Gets 25,000 Dunams in Northern Palestine In Trade

JERUSALEM, July 2.—The Jewish National Fund today reported that it has acquired a new piece of land in the Beisan district, in the vicinity of Beth Alfa.

The new tract of land, some 25,000 dunams in area, was not purchased, but was gotten from the Arabs in exchange for another piece of land. This new tract will round on the Jewish holdings in the Beth Alfa neighborhood, in the northern part of Palestine.

The new acquisition of the Jewish National Fund, is considered to be of great strategic importance, and is looked upon as being almost equally important as the recent acquisition of the Huleh concession.

ZOA Alters Structure; Parley Ends

3 Basic Changes Made; Rothenberg Relected To Fourth Term

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., July 2.—The thirty-eighth annual convention of the Zionist Organization of America concluded today, reflecting unanimously Morris Rothenberg as his fourth term as president. Louis Lipsky, the American member of the World Zionist Executive, was unanimously elected honorary president.

The convention voted a sweeping reorganization of the fundamental structure of the Zionist Organization of America, adjusting the administrative system in America to function along the same lines as the system of the World Zionist Executive.

3 Changes Adopted

The changes decided upon were adopted as an amendment to the Constitution. They provide:

1. That the executive authority of the Z.O.A. shall be vested in an executive committee consisting of the officers and seven additional members to be elected at the annual Zionist convention.

2. That the Executive shall be responsible to the administrative committee.

3. Each member of the Executive who is not an elected officer shall be in charge of a specific department to be assigned to him by the Executive in the same manner as the members of the Executive of the World Zionist Organization.

The Executive was elected, consisting of seven vice-presidents, a secretary, a treasurer and seven executive members with portfolio. The vice-presidents were: Rabbi Solomon Goldman of Chicago; Judge William M. Lewis of Philadelphia; Max Shulman of Chicago; Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland; E. L. Stone of Boston; Nathan Strauss of New York and Harry Freedberg of Kansas City.

Morris Margulies was reelected secretary and Harry D. Plent of Mount Vernon was elected treasurer.

Problems of the Hiltseverein

BERLIN.

THE PROBLEMS which face the Hiltseverein der Deutschen Juden in its work of organizing German-Jewish emigration, and the difficulties which the organization faces and the progress it has made are described in the report of Dr. Mark Wischnitzer, general secretary of the Hiltseverein, made at the recent annual meeting of the organization.

When the Hiltseverein first turned its attention toward the German-Jewish emigration problem, Dr. Wischnitzer declared, it was faced with apparently insuperable difficulties which, to a large extent, have now been overcome.

"The main difficulties," he said, "could be classified under five heads:

"1. When the great stream of emigration started in 1933, the doors of most countries were closed. In others, immigration was restricted by hampering provisions concerning residents and the right to work.

"2. The emigration of Jews from Germany, unlike its emigration from the East European countries, had no nuclei, no groups of relatives and friends living in other countries to help the newcomers, strange to the new conditions, since for many decades there had been no emigration worth mentioning of Jews out of Germany.

"3. Information about the possibilities of immigration and settlement was almost nonexistent.

"4. There were in the overseas countries relief committees to assist those in need, but no Committees to receive and organize immigrants who had to find means of livelihood.

"5. The logistical economic structure of the German Jews made it impossible for preparation for emigration to be adequate so that there was insufficient capacity for adaption to new conditions.

"The experiences which were gained in 1933 were useful in helping to rationalize the emigration movement in 1934," he continued.

"The most substantial obstacle, the restrictive measures in the immigration countries, nevertheless continued because of the economic crisis. It is essential to undertake a far-reaching extension of the emigration aims and to adapt emigration aims as far as possible to the different conditions in all the various countries of the world.

The Balance of Power

Amity Couldn't Last

It couldn't last—this Anglo-Saxon cordiality. Several times in the past few years the relations between these two victorious enemies were fraught with tension. Artificial stimuli of one sort or another kept the patient alive. But the war was inevitable. Crystallization of the foreign interests of both powers showed two divergent roads. And so England and Germany take one another by their beards—and France stands alone.

The economic balance of power was bound to overcome England's superficial antagonism to Nazism and to its continued violent anti-Semitism. We rejoiced when England voiced her stern disapproval of Hitler and his sadistic designs, but we could only depend on England—our proven friend. And we were depressed at our own government's failure to raise its voice in horrified protest.

Hitler's Orgies Continued

But Hitler's orgies went on—the Jews suffered. It was purely an "internal matter" for the German "people" to settle. Even England, in its comparative modern tradition of freedom and democracy accepted this cataloging of the Jews as an "internal matter" too.

It was too bad that the German government was controlled by despots and it was a pity these despots murdered and ostracized a section of the population, but England and Germany might be of use to one another—the lineup of nations for the next war, and after all, it really was none of England's business; it was an "internal matter."

Where Safety Lies

We have no one to look to for help—no one to give us real protection. We are at the mercy of nations' quest for economic supremacy. Our safety lies not in looking to the conscience of the world. That conscience may exist—but the world is little troubled by it. Our safety lies in the eventual destruction of nations' greed and the elimination of predatory interests. So long as these exist, our safety lies in the need for a convenient and defenseless target for man's avarice. We need not fool ourselves that such protection and freedom as we now possess in some countries will continue.

And we are now painfully aware that the "internal affairs" of a sovereign nation are truly internal. If we become a part of this new, but hardly surprising, friendship between Germany, our enemy, and England, our friend.

A Few Suggestions

The type of government of any given nation has nothing to do with that country's usefulness in world politics. Capitalistic France and Germany fight France and Russia. Democratic England extends a friendly hand to tyrannical Germany. And as the type of government carries no weight, so does a country's treatment of its citizens matter little.

Let us do a little supposing. In the next war suppose England and Germany fight France and Russia. And suppose the United States throws in its lot with England and Germany. Suppose Palestine is used to recruit immigrants for its proposed Jewish Britain. Suppose Jewish legions find themselves side by side in the trenches with "Nordic"

World Press Digest

Low State of Chivalry in the Third Reich

Under the heading, "Nazis Equivocal," the New York Herald-Tribune comments editorially on the Goebbels' attack on the Jews at last Sunday's Nazi rally in Potsdam Airport. The Herald-Tribune says:

It was at this season last year that Reichsfuehrer Hitler turned the stomach of the whole English-speaking world with his blood-spouting words with his less party "purgé." Possibly a certain number of Americans, who are trying to be sympathetic with the Nazi régime, have since then persuaded themselves that the hysterical "elimination," in which such persons as General Von Schleicher and his wholly innocent wife lost their lives, was an unpleasant necessity. Even these folk must be perplexed and distressed, however, to learn from news reports that the celebration in Berlin of the anniversary of the "purgé" that the Nazi hierarchy has no desire to bury the memory of it but to refresh it, through the official oratory of Propaganda Minister Goebbels, with pomp and pride.

It must be with some misgivings, also, that the Nazi apologists in the United States, who Herr Goebbels used the occasion to denounce the German Jews with unabated rancor. His attitude, unfortunately, is directed toward an element which the Third Reich, according to many recent official statements, proposes to denationalize (except for its obligation to do some service in wartime), to disenfranchise and to limit to fewer economic opportunities than it enjoyed in the medieval ghetto.

Most seem to any American worthy of the name wholly inconsistent with the official assertion that the Jews are henceforth "guests" in Germany.

It is the undeniable right of a sovereign government to withdraw the privilege of citizenship from unbecomingly residents. But in all modern civilized countries it has always been recognized that equity imposes upon a government, which denies one class of men the defensive political weapons of the citizen the obli-

gation to give them special protection and consideration. This principle was recognized even in dark, chaotic and brutal thirteenth-century England, where the King's Jews" enjoyed the special protection of the sovereign against mob prejudice, the petty tyranny of the nobles and the persecution of the ecclesiastical courts. The vituperative eloquence of a Goebbels, designed to whip up popular hatred against the Jew, even while it assures the nation that the Jew is politically defenseless and socially taboo, is official testimony to the non-German world that chivalry in Germany has fallen lower than in any jungle on which the Nazis care to put a finger.

Montefiore Kin Dies in London; Backed Herzl

Sir Francis, 75, a Grand-Nephew of Famous Philanthropist

LONDON, July 2.—Sir Francis Montefiore, grandnephew of the great Jewish philanthropist, Sir Moses Montefiore, died here today. He was 75.
Sir Francis was for many years president of the board of elders of the Spanish-Portuguese congregation in London, having first assumed the office in 1904.
When the Theodor Herzl inaugurated the movement of political Zionism, Sir Francis Montefiore became one of the leading supporters of the movement in England. He rendered Dr. Herzl many valuable services in the latter's efforts to achieve recognition for his Zionist aims in the higher circles of British society. Since the death, however, he had not been active in Zionist work.
Sir Francis inherited the baronetcy from his great-uncle Sir Moses Montefiore.

Funds Wanted For Refugees in Paris

French Committee Training Exiled German Youths For Life in Palestine

Increased funds for training German Jewish youth for migration to other countries was asked by the French Committee for Refugees in a report made public yesterday by the American Joint Distribution Committee. The French Committee operates camps for the outcasts of France where German refugee youths receive a six-weeks' training course. The report said that the funds which had been collected by the Jewish community in France are not sufficient to provide thoroughgoing social relief. Those refugees who cannot stay in France are sent to Palestine, Brazil, Paraguay and Chile, the report said.
The committee reported that 500 young people have been sent from the camp to Palestine. The Paris group at present consists of thirty-five boys and girls, most of them suffering from undernourishment. They are given garden-work and their health is cared for during the six-weeks' period. At the same time they are taught Hebrew and their whole mode of life is changed to fit them for Palestine.

Parents Protest Firing Of Warsaw Teachers

WARSAW, July 2.—The Federation of Jewish Parents in Warsaw protested against the authorities against the wave of dismissals of Jewish religious teachers from the elementary schools.
The reason given for these wholesale dismissals is the need to economize. The Parents' Federation, however, pointed out that the dismissals are affecting almost exclusively Jewish teachers and that this spite the fact that there are not sufficient Jewish teachers in the public schools in Warsaw.

Landless Arabs Lined

JERUSALEM—Of the 3,235 applications for admission to the government of landless Arabs, 550 heads of families have been admitted. More than 2,500 claims were disallowed. Eleven new claims were submitted in 1934, but they failed to circumvent the restrictions of the law.

"We Jews have nothing to fear from good Christians," the popular comedian asserted. "We are their brothers and sisters. But I am afraid of people who pretend to be good Christians and those who are not good Jews."
The actor scored Father Coughlin as a person who "has not an atom of sincerity in his entire system."

111 Exiles Entered Chile in 5 Months
