Nazis Widen **Drive Over** Large Area

Mayor Is Ousted From Post for Trading With Jews

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, July 4—Despite the ef-forts of conservative elements in the present Cabinet to check the mounting tide of anti-Semitism in Germany, out of fear of the effects such publicity might have on the international negotiations in which Germany is at present engaged, the radical leaders of the Nazi party continue to gain the upper hand in their anti-Tewish policy.

developments today indicate that the attack on the Jewish position has been intensified through-out the country. The anti-Jewish boycott has been renewed with fresh vigor, and Jews are being barred from an increasing number

of places. In many instances acts of hoolianism have been officially sanctioned and in some instances the German government, through its Ministry of the Interior, has even punished Nazis for relenting somewhat in their hatred of the Jew.

Traded With Jews, Fired Thus the Ministry of the Interior today dismissed Mayor Graebner of Schellert from his post for allegedly trading with Jews. In stripping the mayor of his position, the Ministry of the Interior declared that it intends to hold this case up as an official warning to other Nazi flunkeys who may forget them-selves so far as to have any relations whatsoever with Jews.

In Thuringia the district chief has just taken stern disciplinary measures against the farmers in the southwest part of the State who continue to trade with Jews. As a warning to the other farmers, the most prominent farmer in the district was today excluded from the Nazi Party, and all good Nazis were ordered to shun him.

Other farmers in the section were warned that if they are caught trading with Jews again they too will be thrown out of the party and will be ostracized from the society of all "true Aryans." Attack by Dr. Gross

Nazis Beat Up 'Aryan' Who Defended Jew

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, July 4—A pure 'Arvan' was attacked by a mob in Goerlitz today for daring to tear down an anti-Semitic sign that had been pasted by Nazi hooligans on a Jewish shop.

The courageous German was badly messed up by the angry Nazi mob, and was arrested by the police. After having been locked up at the local police sta-tion, the German was forced to replace the sign in its former po-sition on the Jewish shop.

Polish Jews Must Offer **United Slate**

Otherwise May Not Get 6 Seim Seats, J.T.A. Is Informed

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)
WARSAW, July 4—The election of the six deputies to the Polish Sejm, allotted to the Jews under the newly enacted election laws, is conditional upon the creation of a united Jewish electoral list, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learned today from authoritative sources.

If no united Jewish electoral list is presented, however, then the en-tire Jewish population of Poland which comprises more than ten per cent of the whole Polish popula-tion, is in danger of being unrepresented even nominally in the next Sejm, it was learned.

3 Zionists on Slate

Should the Jews unite on a single election list, then in all likelihood the Jewish deputation will be made up of three Zionists, two members of the Agudah, and one representative Jewish industrialist, it is revealed by the same sources.

The General Zionists, however, came out with a declaration the other day stating that they will abstain from participating in the elecstain from participating in the elec-tions to the Sejm because they be-lieve them to be merely a sham election, since the new election laws virtually deprive the Jews of direct representation. The Poale Zionists and the Bund-

ists, too, have indicated that they will most likely refrain from participating in the elections.

Jewish leaders demand that the Jews be allotted a representation in the Seim according to the proportion of Jews to the general population in Poland. Since the new Seim will have 200 deputies, (Continued on Page Four)

guishing a year in prison, Dr. A. Meisel and A. Rabinowich, leaders of the Bund, Jewish Socialist organization, were released here today. The two Jewish Socialists were

sentenced to prison for their radi-cal sympathies when the present dictatorship came power more than a year ago. All poltical organizations were then declared illegal and were ordered dissolved. The various Jew-

ish organizations, including the Zionists, the Bund and the Poale Zionists, were also declared illegal. The Poale Zionist leaders were given the privilege of leaving the country for Palestine. The leaders of the Bund were sent to jail. Only the Agudah, Jewish Ortho-

dox organization, and representing only a fraction of Latvian Jewry, was permitted to carry on, and its organ is today the only Jewish publication appearing in Latvia.

Fight War, U.S. Senator Urges Jews

Veterans Hear Plea by Clark at Arlington Memorial Rites

(Special to the J.D.B.)

WASHINGTON, July 4-Senator Bennet Champ Clark of Missouri, member of the Senate Munitions Investigating Committee, today appealed to the Jewish War Veterans of the United States to develop a "militant public sentiment" against war.

Addressing several hundred veterans gathered for the patriotic services in the amphitheatre of the Arlington National Cemetery, Senator Clark pointed out that the wave of religious persecution now sweeping through several countries of the world "is the best example of the frightful results of the World War."

Senator Clark said that prospects for war "are more imminent today than in 1914." He cited the rapid growth of dictatorships and said, "Liberalism and democracy are now fighting with their backs to the

Pays Tribute to Jews

In a tribute to the Jews, Senator Clark said that "they are a great people of the highest cutural attainments and come from a land which is the very cradle of liberty." He told his listeners that it cannot be said that Jewish citizens lack patriotism in any country in which they choose to live.

In a plea for the abolition of war, Senator Clark urged the adoption of pending legislation which would keep the United States in a neutral position in the event of war among the nations. He hit at the propaganda of munitions makers and said that in Europe there are now a million and a half more men under arms than in 1914.

The patriotic services today constituted the second annual Independence Day observance sponsored on a nation-wide basis by the Jewish War Veterans of the United States. Cant. William Berman, commanderin-chief, also addressed the gather-ing. He said that the Jewish veterans had dedicated themselves to upholding the principles of dem-

46SIR.—Some remarkable views about Germany have been ex-pressed in letters to The Times during the past week. Mr. G. M. Young has asked the outside world to 'suspend' judgment' on Nazi policy. Sir John Marriott has sup ported the plea so far as Nazi a Sir John Marriott has supwithin Germany are concerned, though graciously reserving to us the privilege of continuing to hold and express views regarding Nazi action in the foreign field. Dr. John Murray has brought forward the novel idea that perhaps Hitler is the great democrat in disguise. To use his own phrase, 'Hitler is not so very far from the kingdom of democracy.'

"It is an old idea that we get the sort of government we deserve. the sort of government we deserve.
The writer, who is an American,
hopes that Mr. Young, Sir John
Marriott, and Dr. Murray will not
get a Nazi government or anything like it. But if there are very many professed Democrats who, like them, do not care really obstinately about the preservation of human rights and democratic processes of government, and who have paid no attention to the development of the technique by which those processes have been destroyed in one country after another, then there is ground for believing that that is precisely hat they deserve.

Discriminated against as Jews, thou-sands of young men-most of sands of young menthem people with a higher education—seek a solution to their economic problems by accepting Catholicism which opens the doors of certain institutions doors of certain institutions somewhat wider for them as "non-Aryans."

And the Polish authorities are not mistaken in their assumption. The convert, becoming the repthe administration of the Jewish Community, knows whom he is to serve. He knows that he is a government agent. Despising as he does Jews and Judaism, he tries to serve his master to the best of his ability, and goes out of his way to heap trouble upon the Jewish communal institutions

which he is to control.

The Polish authorities are happy. For them the convert is the best "expert" on Jewish affairs and the most beloved "rep-resentative" of Jewish interests. Unhappy are, however, the real Jewish leaders—those leaders Jewish

whose influence on Jewish life is being lowered almost to nothing by the appointed government commissars, deserters from the Jewish religion.

Miss Mistral admonishes the South American populace to reject the methods and prejudices of Nazi Germany, and not to follow in the footsteps of Hitler's cohorts whose anti-Semitism is a reversion to medievalism. She enumerates a list of Jews who achieved greatness

"The persecution of the Jews," Miss Mistral stresses in her appeal, "is berbaric and benighted and is harmful to the world even as much as to the Jews."

Dr. Nirenstein. NotedEducator. Is Dead at 58

Argentine Economist Was Friend of Prof. Einstein

(Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

BUENOS AIRES-Dr. Mauritzio Nirenstein, noted economist and literateur, and one of the leading personalities in Argentinian intel lectual circles, is dead here, was 58 years old.

Dr. Nirenstein came to tine as a young boy with his father, who was among the earliest Jewish immigrants to settle here. The Nirensteins came from Galicia.

The professor was secretary of the Buenos Aires University and lectured on philosophy and literature in the faculty of jurisprudenc He also wrote considerably, and his translation into Spanish of Heine's "Romanzero" is considered among the best Spanish translations of the German-Jewish poet's works.

In his younger years Dr. Niren-stein became estranged from Jew-ish life, when he married the daughter of a local German scholar. His house was a typical Christian home, and his sons were raised in the Christian manner. This re-sulted in a great internal spiritual struggle, which became intensified after the "patriotic" anti-Semitic excesses in Buenos Aires in 1919, when his own son was one of the leaders of the patriotic anti-Semites

This had such a tremendous ef-This had such a tremendous ef-fect on Dr. Nivenstein, that he again became interested in all things Jewish, and he was very active in Jewis hilterary circles here. He was a strong advocate for the establishment of a special chair for Hebrew literature and chair for Hebrew literature and Judaism in the philosophy faculty

Dr. Nirenetein was a warm friend Dr. Nirenstein was a warm triend of Prof. Albert Einstein. Prof. Einstein had presented a picture to him on which was inscribed: "Wherever Nirenstein enters there neace doth reign."

Dr. Nirenstein was laid to rest at the aristocratic cemetery in Buenos Aires. His widow, who has a warm regard for the Jews, did not permit any Christian rites to be performed. any Christian rites to be performed. Leaders of Argentine and Jewish literary and educational circles eulogized him. Representatives of the various student bodies also par-

Rabbi Zlotnick's report of recent new land acquistions of the Jewish National Fund were received with enthusiasm.



Court Ruling Is Awaited By Kashruth Body

Expect Verdict Tuesday In 'Plumbas' Suit by Poultry Firm

Supreme Court Justice Peter Schmuck is expected to give a decision next Tuesday in the request of the S.S.&B. Live Poultry Corp. for an injunction restraining the Kashruth Association of Greater New York from forcing the poultry market to use the association's plumbas, or leg bands, to attest that the fowl is kosher-slaughtered.

In the hearing before Justice Schmuck, Allan Deutsch, counsel for the plaintiff, accused the asso-ciation of "mercenary" motives. Rabbi Nachman H. Ebin, chairman of the association's administrative committee, replied with an affidavit declaring that the association was

not only making no profit, but was incurring a deficit.

At the hearing George Z. Medalie entered the case as counsel for the association.

Explains Cost

Rabbi Ebin asserted that the suit constituted a challenge to the or thodox rabbinate and the Hebrew religious laws. He said that the plumbas cost the association \$1.30 a thousand and were sold to dealers at \$10 a thousand, the differ ence being consumed by salaries for supervisors and rabbis and by administrative expenses.

The plaintiff seeks to restrain the association from publishing statements that its product is not kosher because it does not use the

At the convention, Rabbi Israel Dushowitz announced his resigna-tion from the presidency, a post he had held for a long time. No rea-son was given for the action.

Polish Federations to Meet in London Sept. 7 to Air Relief Problems

An international conference of federations of Polish Jews to con-sider relief for the Jews in Poland will be held in London September 7, it was announced vesterday.

The date was set so that the conference could be held right after the World Zionist Congress, which opens at Lucerne August 20. This was done at the request of the Fed-eration of Polish Jews of Palestine.

Jews were once burned alive in the square where the statue now stands. A tablet still remains with the inscription, "Jewish dogs were burned here."
