# **Bar Rejects** Racial Ban In Austria

Will Not Allow Planned Discrimination, Ass'n Resolves

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) VIENNA, July 5-Declaring itself unequivocally opposed to the intro duction of the racial principle in the legal profession the Union of Bar Associations for the whole of Austria today adopted a resolution calling for the preservation of status quo as regards admission into the bar associations, and also as regards the general set-up of these

This action came as a result of reports emanating from authorita-tive sources that the government was contemplating division of the present bar associations into two separate bodies, one for the "Aryans" and one for "non-Aryans."

The government had also indi-cated that it desired a change in cated that it desired a change in the method of electing members to the executive councils of the bar associations, and that instead of the previous system of direct elec-tions, it would call for the substi-tution of a system of nominations and the council of the substi-tution of a system of nominations candidates.

This was interpreted as being a direct move against the Jews, who form a majority of lawyers engaged in the legal profession in Vienna. Officially, however, it would appear that it was merely desired to exclude those lawyers who had migrated into Austria from the secession States after the

MOSCOW, July 5—Children in Soviet Jewish schools are not in-terested in the Soviet literature, a survey conducted in the New Zla topol Jewish autonomous region shows.

All without exception re plied that they find no interest at all in the works of the new Soviet writers and that they preferred the works of Tolstoy, Gogul, Pushkin and other writers of the pre-revolu-

tionary period.

With regard to Jewish writers the survey disclosed that the children have little interest in Jewish literature. They know very little merature. They know very little about the Jewish writers of the pre-revolutionary era and have no regard for the works by the Jew-ish Communist authors.

### 12,000 Acres Owned By Jews in Cyprus

LONDON, July 5-Reporting on the increase of Jewish colonization in Cyprus, an island in the Mediterranean slightly north of Palestine and under British con-trol, the Morning Post states today that Jews now own about 12,000 acres on the island with a gross value of £72,000.

The largest Jewish settlements on Cyprus are located near Li-massol and Famagusta.

# Palestine Boom Is Attributed to Jewish Capital

### Immigration Is Cited by Bank Head as Behind General Prosperity

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, July 5-A year of prosperity for all branches of trade in Palestine as a result of Jewish capital and immigration was described here at the annual general meeting of the shareholders of the Ottoman Bank which operates in Palestine.

Delivering the annual report. Six Herbert A. Lawrence, chairman of the general meeting, pointed out that the prosperity in Palestine has been due to the continued influx of Jewish immigrants and Jewish capital."

Sir Herbert emphasized that the sir herbert emphasized that the imports into Palestine are too large as compared with the courtry's exports. This adverse trade balance, he said, he attributed to a greatly increased demand for foodstuffs and building materials caused by immigration.

"The difference," Sir Herbert ex-plained, "is covered by subscrip-tions from abroad to Jewish institutions, capital expenditure of immigrants, and receipts from tourist traffic. The financial position is satisfactory. The pr 1935 are encouraging." The prospects for

# New Boycott **Unit Started** In Poland

Jews Form 'League to Protect Polish Products

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) WARSAW, July 5-Following the announcement that the Anti-Hitler Committee in Poland might be officially liquidated, the most promi nent Polish Jewish merchants organized a Jewish League for the Pro tection of Polish Products, it was learned here today.

An outline of the set-up of the new organization, whose declared purpose it is to boost the sale of Polish-made products in place of goods coming in from other countries, was forwarded today to the authorities for official approval.

The announcement that the Anti-Hitler Committee might be officially dissolved was made yesterday, together with a declaration from an official source that further activity of the Committee might endanger Poland's diplomatic rela-tions with Germany.

Warn of Prosecution Members of the Committee were at the same time warned that re-sumption of their boycott activities

against Germany would entail legal prosecution. Actually the Anti-Hitler Boycott

Committee in Warsaw has been suppressed since June 19, when the police suddenly raided the head-quarters of the organiztion, seized its records and confiscated the lists of its members throughout the country. The boycott offices were sealed, and the leaders were warned against continuing with their boy-cott against goods made in Nazi Germany.

# 582 Deserted Faith, Budapest Report Reveals

BUDAPEST, July 5—A total of 582 Jews in Budapest were con-verted to Christianity in 1934, it was revealed here today for the first time when the annual report of the Budapest Jewish community was made public.

The greatest number of conversions, the report states, was re-corded among the professional elements who deserted their faith in the hope that they would thus be enabled to engage in the practice of their profession, unhampered by racial discrimination.

### 25 Native-Born in New List of Disfranchised; Lawyers Hit

More Jews

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, July 5-The movement Completely to distranchise Jews in Germany gained further impetus today, when the Deutschreichsanzeiger published its latest list of Jews who are deprived of German etterophic. citizenship.

Twenty-five names of Germanborn Jews are contained in the list, In addition a large number of Jews are listed who were born in other countries but had become naturalized German citizens before present regime came to power.

Ruling on Lawyers

The total elimination of even the few Jewish attorneys who were still permitted to practice in Gersun permitted to practice in Germany is decreed today by the Labor Court at Magdenburg. The court ruled that while the practice of law involves the consideration of the race of both the attorney and the client, and that therefore all third authors of Laws hed how a limited number of Jews had been permitted to continue defending Jewish clients, this was only a temporary expedient.

The court declared that the time has come to call a halt. Jewish litigants will therefore not be allowed to employ Jewish barristers in the future, the court ordered, adding that otherwise there would always be a certain number of Jew-(Continued on Page Eight)

WASHINGTON.

REFORE many more months roll around, Germany may be expected to bring up the old question of a trade agreement with the United States. Washington observers are anticipating this move for two

reasons. In the first place Germany has failed in repeated efforts to negotiate a trade pact with the United States. Because of her intense need for raw—

materians, produced in the United States and the fact that she compot pay for these materials unless she sells more of her own goods here, Germany will not give up her angling for a trade agreement with this country. In the second place, Dr. Hans Luther, German Ambas-Dr. Hans Luther, German Ambas-sador to the United States, is on a brief leave of absence in Berlin, where he is expected to take up German-American relations.

A MBASSADOR Luther is expect-A ed to return to the United States in a few weeks in spite of reports coming from London that he may be replaced. These reports, by the way, have been cropping up ever since Hitler came into power. The reason for this is quite evident. Dr. Luther has been an adherent of the old Streseman regime. For some time, it has been thought possible that on account of his nonidentification with the Hitler party organization, he might at any time be asked to make way for an am-

affiliations. Official quarters in Washington do not anticipate that Dr. Luther will be replaced. Although his Nazi affiliations are not pronounced, it is well known that he has carrying out Hitler's instrucbeen carrying tions to the letter.

LAST WINTER Ambassador Lu-ART WINTER Ambassador Lu-ther was one of the main ne-goliators for a barter agreement with the United States through which Germany would have been enabled to obtain much-needed American cotton in exchange for her own goods. Ambassador Luther her own goods. Ambassador Luther and his friends would have suc-ceeded in this piece of business had it not been for Secretary of State Hull who objected to the deal which the Germans were drawing up with George N. Peck, head of the Import-Export Bank. Secretary Hull's objections were backed up by President Roosevelt and the whole plan fell flat.

Several House members already have given ex-pression to their feeling. One of these was representative 'William M. Citron of Connecticut, who incidently points out that the United States must be watchful that the spirit of intolerance which has prevailed in Mexico does not spread its poisons into our country.

Jewish life in America was overshadowed this week by the Zionist convention held in Atlantic City, and by the annual meeting of the Central Conference of American Rabbis in Chi-

It was for the first time that the Central Conference of American Rabbis elected to presidency a rabbi who is a Zionist. It was also for the first time that Conference of reform rabbis adopted a neutral stand on the Jewish work in Palestine in place of its former attitude of opposi-

The Zionist rabbi who elected president of the Confer-ence is Dr. Felix A. Levy of Tenule Emanu-El in Chicago

There was an attempt at the Chicago convention to induce the participants not only to give up opposition to Zionism but take an outspokenly pro-Zionist attitude. This attempt was, however, fought by the older members of the Central Conference. The decision on neutrality was reached as a compromise. Gained Attention

### Airing Public Issues

The Central Conference attracted a good deal of attention not only mong Jews but also among non-Jewish circles in America, because of the many issues which it considered, including the issue of war, of Amer-ica's participation in the League of Nations, of socializing certain industries in the United States and of redistribution of capital. While a resolution "to refuse

to support any war in which this country or another country may country or another country may engage" was rejected by the Con-ference, the session decided that a special committee be named to formulate the Jewish attitude to-wards peace in relation to the Jewish view on war in past history. Thus, no definite stand was taken on the war and peace issue. The committee named will report its decision at the next conven-

### Rabbis Support Senator Nye's Program

While refraining from commit-While refraining from commit-ting itself definitely on the war issue, the Central Conference recommended that Congress sup-port "without abatement," the program of the Committee headsed by Senator Gerald P. Nye to take the profit not only out of war but also out of the preparations for war. The Conference also went on record as opposing compulsory military training in Colleges, pulsarial and the conference of the conference colleges, universities and high schools.

The question of marriage and divorce occupied a good deal of attention at the meeting. Recommendations were made that the Jewish Rabbinate be trained to guide young people in the problems of marriage and family life. It was specified that courses on the subjects of marriage and family life be given in the temples.

### The Zionist Convention At Atlantic City

Quite different from the Chicago gathering was the annual convention of the Zionist Organization of America held in Atlantic City. Taking place immediately after the election of delegates to the Zionist Congress this conference was supposed to give expression to the attitude which the Zionists of America would like to adopt with regard to many problems concerning Palestine and, especially, to the problem of the internal friction between the General Zionists and the Laborites

The discussions at the conven-tion in Atlantic City made it clear that the Zionist movement in America, though supporting the Laborites as labor unions, intends to fight the political ambitions of the Palestine Labor Federation to dominate the entire Zionist movement. Many bitter words were uttered by numerous speakers against those Zionisi leaders in America who conducted pro-Histadruth propaganda during the recent elections of delegates to the Zionist Congress. Some of these leaders paid for their pro-Histadruth propaganda by not being elected at the convention as delegates to the World Congress.

### Rothenberg Presents New Plan of Operation

The main issue at the Zionist convention in Atlantic City re-volved around the question of how to enlarge the Zionist ranks in America. Mr. Morris Rothen-berg, president of the Zionist Organization of America, rightly pointed out that there is a great sentiment now in the United States for Palestine, but this sentiment is not being properly utilized by the Zionist Organiza-

Mr. Rothenberg therefore submitted to the convention a plan to convert the Zionist Organiza of America into a body which would unite practically the entire organized Jewry of the United States. He suggested that local committee be formed in 141 cities in the United States, comprising representatives of all the synagogues, temples. Jewish centers and other local organizations willing to participate in the work for Palestine. These local committees would be given representation at the annual Zionist convention in America. The American Zionist movement would thus have the right to American speak not only in the name of small group of organized Zionist members, but in behalf of practi cally all of American Jewry.

With the 4,000,000 Jews in the United States there is no reason why the Zionist Organization of America should count only 18,000 mem-bers most of whom are—as the recent election of delegates to the Zionist Congress provemembers on paper only.

Most of the delegates felt that something should be done to prevent the growth of imports of Nazi goods to Palestine. Builds a 'Cosmic Bridge' In Collaboration With Dr. N. Rosen

Prof. Albert Einstein's latest contribution to science is a "cosmic bridge" which will aid in linking the infinitesimal atom and the heavenly astronomic system into one unified system, it was disclosed on Friday.

Working in collaboration with Dr. N. Rosen at the Institute of Advanced Study at Princeton, Prof. Einstein evolved a series of mathe matical equations which prove that space and matter are phases of the same thing.

The announcement of the new theory was made in an article in the Physical Review. His new the ory presupposes a new particle much smaller and simpler than the previously discovered atom and

When, after a round robin of palace intrigues, Solomon robin of palace intrigues, Solomon is designated as the successor of his illustrious father, there is a reat deal of muttering and dissent. Here is a weak, almost beardless youth, a poet and dreamer, a pup-pet in the hands of his scheming pet in the hands of his scheming mother, Bathsheba. (Had she not arranged that David should see her withing on the housetop, and thus won herself a royal spouse?) And, what was a more immediate mis-fortune to the populace, Solomon was a victim of the wiles of neigh-

For no sooner had David died. than King Hiram of Tyre, a noted center of commerce, sent his prize salesman (who bore a suspicious resemblance to the king) to inter-view Solomon and to remind him of his father's project, the building of a temple. Solomon imme-diately sees himself as the tool of a high destiny, and not only con-firms his father's suggestions, but doubles the orders for materials and the dimensions of the building. There is, however, labor trouble in Jerusalem, and in order to ease the payments of the necessary taxes, Solomon gives ear to the coun-sel of the leading agitator, Jereboset or me leading agitator, Jerebo-am. In order that all the fruits of the enterprise shall not go to foreigners, it is stipulated that a Hebrew worker shall be employed side by side with every imported Tyrian artisan, even to the cutting of cedars on Lebanon.

MEANWHILE the dreamy, poetically inclined youth has beome involved with women. first is Abishag, a skilled courtesan. The second in Magsala, the daughter of the Egyptian Pharach, whom Bathsheba has in-vited to become Solomon's bride,

The reader may be assured that there is no asper-sion of things sacred to the Jews in the telling of this story of the building of the temple. In fact he is rather shrewd in getting at the nature and habits and attitudes of these biblical Jews, as for instance when Hiram of Tyre is made to when Hiram of Tyre is made to say, "They're never going to pay that debt: They don't like it, and what they don't like they think is an affliction." You will be hard put to find pleasanter hammock reading for lazy summer days than "Solomon, My Son!"

Among the non-Jews of whom there will be many different por-traits are Lord George Gordon, who ended a tumultous, hectic life as a convert to Judaism, and Richard Brothers, self-styled "Prince of the Hebrews and Nephew of the Almighty," who died in a lunatic asylum before being revealed as new ruler of the world. Brothers was the first to proclaim the theory that the English are the descend-ants of the Ten Lost Tribes—a theory greatly subscribed to today in many classes of British society.

that "the authorities remained in-active until the municipal sanita-tion workers joined the hooligans." Touching upon the anti-Jewish riots which followed the next evening in Forstadt, near Grodno, the memorandum declares that a detail of ten policemen would have been sufficient to check the hooligans from invading Forstadt. This detail was, however, not assigned by the authorities.

"The pogron in Forstadt was even more terrible than in Grodno and lasted from ten o'clock in the evening until two the next morn-ing without any interference whatever on the part of the authori-ties," the memorandum says.

The memorandum enumerates all Jews who were wounded by the hooligans and estimates the number of seriously injured Jews at more than fifty.
