## Reich Firms Told to Fire Jews First

### Labor Court Rules They Must Go Before 'Aryan' Help

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)  
BERLIN, July 15—Non-"Aryan" and half-"Aryans" are to be fired first whenever dismissals are in order, the Labor Court in Cologne ruled today.

From now on, the court order decrees, a German employer must hold on to his "Aryan" employees to the very end. If conditions should become such that it is necessary for him to lay-off part of his help, Jews and other non-"Aryans" must be the first to go.

Fifty-two more names were added today to the list of non-"Aryans" who have been deprived of their German citizenship by the Nazis. The report states that this number of denaturalizations took place in the provinces today.

#### Declassed Increases

The total of those deprived of their citizenship in the Third Reich is mounting from day to day, as the campaign to strip Jews and other non-"Aryans" of their rights continues to gain momentum.

In an article entitled, "Is the Jewish Problem Solved?", the Deutsche Volkswirtschaft, German economic organ, complains that while the Jewish problem in public life has been solved through the simple expedient of expelling the Jews, Jews are still allowed to carry on trade under the guise of anonymity.

Jewish businesses, the paper says, are being carried on under "Aryan" names and with "Aryan" employers, thus fooling the "Aryan" public to the greater profit of the Jews.

#### Nazi Generosity

This, the journal says, only demonstrates again the great generosity and tolerance of the Nazi regime, which has taken no steps to eliminate this condition.

"Thus, the Jewish problem is far from being solved," the paper emphasizes. It goes on to assail German Jewish businessmen who continue with their firms and do not show proper gratitude to the present government for not having confiscated their property, while

## M'Donald Asks Central Body To Aid Exiles

### Refugee Commissioner Hopes League Will Set Up Unit

LONDON, July 15—Hope that the next session of the League of Nations will consider a proposal to establish a central organization for all refugees, in order to provide them with passports and other consular protections, is expressed today in The London Times in a letter published by James G. MacDonald, the League's High Commissioner for Refugees.

This central body will operate directly under the supervision of the League of Nations, if Mr. MacDonald's expectations materialize.

Mr. MacDonald also expresses his desire that the League of Nations will assist the Jewish and other philanthropic organizations engaged in solving the problem of the refugees from Germany. "There are now in France not less than 10,000 refugees whose life is difficult," Mr. MacDonald states in his letter.

A session of the Governing Council of the League to deal with the refugee questions will take place in London this week.

## Hagibor Club Captures Czech Water Polo Title

## Belgians Put Red Badges On Peddlers

### Special Emblems Brand Non-Citizens, Mostly Jews, in Market

BRUSSELS, July 15—Special badges were introduced today by the Belgian authorities for market peddlers of foreign citizenship, ninety per cent of whom are Jews.

The order issued today provides that those peddlers who are not Belgian citizens must display red emblems in distinction to the blue badges which the Belgian citizens will display.

This distinction is causing grave consternation among the Jewish peddlers, who are chiefly subjects of Poland and other east-European countries. A campaign against permitting foreign Jews to trade in Belgium has been going on for several years. The government, however, paid little attention to this drive. Introduction of the special badges for foreigners is feared to be the first step towards the realization of the demand for restrictions on foreigners trading in the local markets.

The Belgium government today conferred the knighthood of the Order of Leopold upon R. Goldmintz, a Jewish diamond dealer, active in Jewish life in Belgium.

## Artists Jailed After Assault

### Poland Protests Arrest Of Brothers in Nazi Attack in Danzig

DANZIG, July 15—The Jewish brothers Zeidenbaitel, both internationally known painters, were attacked today in the streets of Danzig by an organized group of fifteen Nazis.

Despite the fact that the two artists are Polish citizens, they were arrested by the Danzig police on the charge of attacking Storm Troopers. The Polish authorities in Danzig are making representations to the Danzig Senate.

The Danziger Echo, the only Jewish newspaper published in the German language in Danzig, expresses grave concern today over what it terms "unmistakable symptoms" showing that the Danzig authorities have decided to treat the Jews as scapegoats for the financial difficulties now being experienced by the Free City.

The paper points out that the Jews are the ones who are suffering most from these financial troubles, which are a result of the devaluation of the Danzig currency.

"The Jews are the greatest victims of this devaluation, since the majority of them are engaged in trade and have incurred great losses with the decline in the value of the Danzig gulden," the paper declares.

## Zionist Union Winning Polish Congress Poll

### Laborites Press General Party as Disorders Mark Balloting

WARSAW, July 15—Disturbances marked the Zionist Congress elections in several places in Eastern Galicia, according to reports reaching here today. Numerous ballot boxes were demolished in several districts.

The elections, which took place Sunday, gave the General Zionist Union, which is opposed to the present Zionist Executive, 31,261 votes in the 120 districts which have thus far reported.

The General Zionist Confederation, which is headed by Dr. Chaim Weizmann, received 3,193 votes, the Laborites polled 30,890, Mizrachi 10,725 and the Jewish State Party 4,539.

Reports have not yet been received from 180 small districts.

In Lemberg the results were: General Zionist Union, 4,671; General Zionist Confederation, 1,464; Laborites, 3,220; Mizrachi, 1,185, and the Jewish State Party, 877.

The forty-six mandates for delegates to the Zionist Congress allotted to Eastern Galicia will probably be divided as follows: General Zionist Union, 19; Labor 19; Mizrachi, 5; Jewish State Party, 2, and General Zionist Confederation, 1.

## Zion Growth Emphasized By Flexner

### But Note of Warning on Boom Also Sounded In Report

Emphasizing the striking economic development of Palestine, but sounding at the same time a note of warning against the dangers of land speculation as well as other boom conditions which have become noticeable, Bernard Flexner, chairman of the board of directors of the Palestine Economic Corporation of New York, yesterday submitted the eighth annual report of the corporation to its stockholders.

The report reviewed the activities of the corporation for the year 1934. It attributed the present prosperous conditions of Palestine to the unprecedented immigration and influx of capital within the last few years.

#### \$70,000,000 on Deposit

It estimates that bank deposits in Palestine totaled \$70,000,000 at the end of 1934.

The Palestine Economic Corporation, according to Flexner's report, has assets netting \$3,391,450, of which \$2,803,152 is invested in Palestine and the balance is held pending investment.

Net profit for 1934 amounted to \$33,208.

The corporation carried on its activities in Palestine through subsidiary institutions along enlightened social-economic lines. In the main, the work of the corporation has been to aid basic industries and to help the economically weaker elements of the population on a strictly business basis to become independent productive citizens of the country.

#### Many Loans Made

Through the Central Bank of Cooperative Institutions in Palestine, loans are made to credit cooperatives, agricultural cooperatives, consumers' and industrial producers' cooperatives. This bank has issued over \$9,000,000 in loans since July 1922 and has received repayment of \$7,700,000.

The loss in bad debts has amounted to 3/10 of 1% of the loans made. There were 114 cooperatives indebted to the bank for \$1,434,000 at

## 'Half-Billion Estate' Dwindles To \$25,000 as Myth Explodes

A myth about a \$500,000,000 estate allegedly left by Leopold Weissberger, Hungarian-born Jew, which resulted in not less than 1,200 inquiries from namesakes all over the world, including the United States, was exploded today by the United States consul in Sydney, Australia, where Weissberger died.

According to information gathered by the consular official and conveyed to Joseph Protter, an attorney, of 15 Park Row, who represents American relatives of Weissberger, the deceased left an estate

of about \$25,000, and not \$500,000,000.

The Jewish Telegraphic Agency offices have been flooded with inquiries from all corners of the globe concerning the identity of Weissberger, who died in Australia in 1888, leaving no relatives. So many Weissbergers in America and in other countries felt that they were legal heirs of the deceased that a great number of them went to the expense of employing lawyers to press their claims.

Weissberger was born in Hungary of a poor Jewish family.

## Frankfurter Zeitung Risks Ire Of Nazis in Dreyfus Comments

FRANKFURT-AM-MAIN, July 15—A courageous editorial on the passing of Dreyfus in the Frankfurter Zeitung, one of the leading daily newspapers, provoked great consternation today in official Nazi circles.

The editorial emphasizes that the outcome of the Drayfus case "should strengthen the faith of those who refuse to admit that the State should be based on any other foundation than justice."

This emphasis, which is contrary to the spirit prevailing now in Germany, is taken by many as a

direct reprimand to the Nazi government. The obituary starts by pointing out that suspicion against Dreyfus was first aroused only because he was a Jew. It goes on to declare that "the real significance of the Dreyfus cause celebre lies in the victory of the idea of justice over despotism and political passion."

The obituary article on Dreyfus concludes by calling upon the people of Germany to remember those who sacrificed their careers to carry on the defense of Dreyfus for the sake of truth and justice.

The Belgian Nazis

PRAHA.

ALTHOUGH nearly all means of the "Dinaso" (Dietsche National Solidaristen) movement in Belgium, its employees and many other things about this Flemish Nazi organization may be obscure, one thing is quite certain—the abundant anti-Semitism of its leader, Herr van Severen.

The Bruges correspondent of the "Prager Presse" confirms this impression fully in an interview which he had with van Severen, who heads the pan-Flemish movement which aims at uniting all territories where Dutch and its dialect, Flemish, are spoken. This would necessitate the overthrow of the present Belgian and Dutch governments and the snatching away of a part of Northern France. The new country would be called "Dietschland."

Flemish movements of various kinds have existed, ceased to exist and reappeared during the history of Holland and Belgium. They have caused many a bitter hour to the leaders of the barely 100-year-old Belgium. Now, for the first time in history, such an one has been linked up with anti-Semitism and Nazism.

Since all, or nearly all, Fascist movements of this kind must boast colored shirts, Dinaso does likewise. Its emblem is green.

THE Bruges correspondent describes van Severen as a man of small stature, with sharp, hard eyes. His movements are not convincing. There is something artificial about them.

At the very beginning of the conversation, the "Leader" shows his aversion to journalists. In characteristic fashion he calls them "liars." But he gives himself away by saying, "Some time ago one of them wrote: 'van Severen despises the Hitlerists'. I will cite this liar before the judge!"

This is followed by a stream of "swearing words which show a boundless anti-Semitism."

ANSWERING a question, van Severen contends that he has no direct communications with the German Nazis, although he admires them. He denies that he receives the ample means necessary to keep up the propaganda of the movement, to buy the uniforms, and to furnish the "green houses" (the equivalent of the German "brown houses") from Berlin. He even gets excited when he speaks about the opponents of his movement who allege that the money is supplied by Germany. "I will bring these slanderers to justice, and I will prove that I do not get money from Germany!" he froths.

But when he is suddenly confronted with the questions, "Do

you sometimes make a trip to Germany? Are you in contact with leading personalities of the Nazi party?"—van Severen is taken aback. He is not able to give a straightforward answer. He maintains that everyone has a right to make trips to Germany. Of all the Nazi leaders, he knows only Rosenberg, he asserts.

ASKED about the means he intends to employ to bring his "Dinaso" party to power, van Severen declares that he will achieve his aim by propaganda only, striving to make his party the state party.

Yet another time, van Severen gives elusive answers when he is questioned about his attitude to Holland and the Flemish parts of France, where the movement necessarily must be a revolutionary one. Only one point is clear. He regards the Dutch Nazi leader, Mussert, as a traitor.

After listening once more to a detailed explanation of van Severen's aims, the correspondent reaches the conclusion they are very much akin to the principles laid down in Adolf Hitler's "My Struggle."

Van Severen goes far to confirm this opinion by crying: "We are nationalistic socialists, but not in the Marxian sense of the word. We are absolutely anti-Semitic, but accept the race principle only up to a certain degree."

The last question the correspondent put, "What is your attitude towards war," remains unanswered.

## Jewish Labor Wins Debut in London

### Agricultural Workers Send Delegation to Congress Of Landworkers

LONDON.—For the first time in its history the Congress of the International Landworkers' Federation, which just concluded its sessions here, had a Jewish representation. The Jewish agricultural Workers' Organization of Palestine, the largest and most important union in the General Federation of Jewish labor in Palestine, sent a special delegation headed by Zwi Luft, secretary-general of the Jewish union.

Mr. Luft explained to the Congress the specific character of the Palestinian organization, which, he pointed out, includes both landworkers and settlers on land who engage part of the year in other work. His statements about the achievements of the Palestinian Jewish landworkers, the forms of agricultural settlement in Palestine, (the Kibbutz and Moshavim) and the efforts to change fundamentally the economic and social structure of the Jewish people were received with great attention and interest by the other delegates to the Congress.

Many speakers following Mr. Luft urged that methods of the Palestinian Jewish landworkers be applied to other countries.

# Between the Lines

## New Winds In Hungary

The Hungarian government is now drifting towards the establishment of a strong Fascist regime. Emulating Italy, the government of Hungary is now on the way to suppressing the existing labor organizations, the Socialist party and a number of liberal bodies.

This forthcoming wave of Fascism in Hungary will, however little affect the situation of the Jews there. There are a great number of Jews in the Hungarian municipalities who will lose their seats as a result of the new policy of the Hungarian government. These Jews, however, will be deprived of their seats not as Jews, but as members of the Socialist party. The Jewish Community in Budapest has long disassociated itself from those Jewish aldermen who were elected on the Socialist ticket. The leaders of the Jewish Community in Hungary have even go so far to declare in a public statement that those Jews elected on a Socialist ticket should not be considered as representing the interests of Hungarian Jews.

## Nazis Will Suffer

Should Fascism become the official policy of the government, instead of the semi-dictatorial policy of General Gombos, the present war minister and virtual dictator of Hungary, the anti-Semitic Nazi movement will suffer by it not less than the Socialist movement. It will practically be declared illegal.

Even today the Hungarian government does not view with favor any Nazi propaganda. It prohibits the existence of Nazi organizations. It suppresses Nazi newspapers. Its opposition to Nazi propaganda is so great that recently a number of parents whose children wore the swastika were sentenced to pay a special fine and the children were expelled from school for a full term.

The present tendency of the Hungarian government to follow the Italian Fascist line makes it even more certain that Hungary will not permit the anti-Jewish propaganda which the German Nazis are financing in other countries abroad. The strengthening of the Nazi propaganda in Hungary would be injurious directly for the Hungarian state interests. Such propaganda would develop later into a propaganda for the annexation of certain parts of Hungary.

## Suppressing Anti-Semitism

The Hungarian government during the last year has tried not only to suppress the anti-Jewish propaganda which the Nazis are conducting but also any kind of propaganda in the country. It even indicated a desire to abolish the numerous clauses which still exist in some of the universities. Numerous pro-Jewish speeches were delivered in the parliament. Sentiment was developed in the country by certain members of the Hungarian cabinet in favor of Jews.

This attitude of the Hungarian higher authorities was appreciated by Jewish leaders in Hungary, especially because of the fact that Hungary borders so closely on Nazi Germany. In a declaration issued by the Jewish community of Budapest acknowledgment was made as to the fair treatment which the Jewish population received from the present Hungarian regime, and hope was expressed that the government of Gombos would con-

# Agudath Israel Compromise Is Denied by Rabbi

## Pact with Vaad Leumi Barred by Tradition, Spokesman Says

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

VIENNA, July 15—Denying reports that the Agudath Israel, extreme orthodox party, is negotiating with the Vaad Leumi, Palestine Jewish national assembly, Rabbi Joseph Zwi Duschinsky, chief rabbi of the Agudath Israel Community in Palestine, reiterated in an interview published here in the Agudist "Juedische Presse," that the Agudath will stick by its century-old ban against participation in a community which does not recognize unrestricted sovereignty of the Torah and tradition in all branches of its work.

Rabbi Duschinsky, who succeeds the late Rabbi Chaim Sonenfeld, is now in Vienna on his way back from a short stay in Carlsbad. In his interview, he also stated that the fact that certain rabbis have issued a statement against secession from the Kenesseth Israel, the Palestine Jewish community, in no way alters the stand of the Agudath. "We emphasize that we shall not abate one iota of our conception, which is to us a sacred religious behest," he said.

Speaking about the agreement between the Poale Agudath Israel, the Agudist Labor organization, and the Histadruth, the Palestine Federation of Jewish Workers, Rabbi Duschinsky said that the question of the accord is not actual at the moment, but that the Agudath is not adverse to a certain cooperation with other labor organizations.

"The problem of the Poale Agudath Israel," he continued, "seems to me to lie in the fact that there is still a shortage of skilled religious workers in the Holy Land, and there can be no ground for complaint if the religious building contractors in Palestine must deal with the workers of the Histadruth so long as the Poale Agudath Israel cannot supply the necessary trained workers."

## Meyer London Lauded At Dedication Rites

HOPEWELL JUNCTION, N. Y., July 15—An auditorium seating more than 3,000 persons was dedicated at the Workmen's Circle Camp yesterday in memory of Meyer London, Jewish labor leader, who served three terms as a Socialist in Congress from New York's lower East Side.

More than 800 representatives of the Socialist party, including Mrs. London, were present. Charles Solomon, 1934 gubernatorial candidate, described him as "an American in the true sense of the word."

It was recalled that London, who died in 1926, had introduced the first social insurance bill into Congress in 1915.

## Arabs Debate 'Free' Palestine If War Comes

### Issue of Independent States Reported Under Leaders' Advisement



# Nazi Congress, Keyed to Pitch, Opens in Brazil

## Anti-Semitic Rants Mark Session of Integralists, 'Outlawed' Shirts

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)  
SAO PAULO, Brazil, July 15—Although the Brazilian government this week closed down the anti-Nazi Alianca Nacional Libertadora organization, no obstacles were placed today in the way of the opening of the Congress of the Integralists—the Nazi organization of Brazil—in Rio de Janeiro.

Anti-Jewish propaganda conducted by the Integralists in Brazil reached its height today when numerous speakers in public addresses threatened "to get even with the Jews in Brazil." The speakers accused the Jews of being guilty of causing the crisis which is now taking place in Brazil, as well as throughout the world.

Signor Miguel Reale, the leader of the Integralists in Minas Province, in a venomous anti-Jewish speech, threatened the Jewish population of the province on the ground that it was responsible for the liberal movement in the country. He was particularly furious because the Jews are combatting the Integralists.

Despite the fact that the law prohibits the existence of uniformed organizations, the delegates at the Integralist Congress in Brazil appeared today in their green-shirt uniforms. The law banning the wearing of uniforms was adopted in the Chamber of Deputies last April. It provides for a maximum of three years imprisonment for anyone associating himself with a uniformed organization. A similar penalty is proscribed for conducting inciting propaganda against any part of the population.

## Name Rabbi Finkelstein To Union Regional Post

CINCINNATI, July 15—Appointment of Rabbi Philip Finkelstein to succeed Rabbi Philip W. Jaffa of Cincinnati, who resigned as regional director of the Northwest District of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, was announced today.

Rabbi Jaffa has been called to Congregation Beth Israel, Phoenix, Ariz. Rabbi Finkelstein will take over his new post in September.

the end of 1934. The major portion of the loans granted by the bank was for agricultural purposes.  
The Palestine Mortgage and Credit Bank grants housing mortgage credits and in the last few years has concentrated on providing inexpensive homes for agricultural and urban workers. It has built 374 houses in agricultural laborers' settlements, situated near the larger citrus colonies, and built the first 180 houses in Kiriath Chaim, in the Haifa Bay Region.

**Suburb Grows Apace**  
This suburb is growing very rapidly and by the end of 1935 it is expected that there will be almost 1,000 families living in the suburb. The bank has had no losses thus far and arrears in payments amounted to 1.4% at the end of 1934.

Through the loan bank the Palestine Corporation grants credits to small industrial undertakings. These loans, repayable over three to five years, enable the smaller factories to expand their plants through the purchase of machinery, stock and for the erection of factory buildings.

Thus far the bank has not incurred any losses in this activity and delinquencies amounted to 1.5% of the loans outstanding at the end of the year.

A fourth subsidiary of the corporation is the Palestine Water Company, which is engaging in supplying water to ten agricultural laborers' settlements. The company also operates an American drilling unit in partnership with Palestine Jewish Colonization Association (PICA), through which it has drilled a number of wells in the coastal plain as well as in the hill districts in northern Palestine.

**Figures in Hotel Field**  
The corporation is one of the principal shareholders of Palestine Potash, which is extracting chemical salts from the Dead Sea, and Palestine Hotels, the company which owns and operates the King David Hotel in Jerusalem.

The corporation likewise has made an investment in the Palestine Foundries and Metal Works, founded by one of the leading German industrialists. The factory is the first of its kind in the Near East and is located in the Haifa Bay industrial zone.

The officers of the Palestine Economic Corporation are Bernard Flexner, chairman of the board; Felix M. Warburg, honorary president; Julius Simon, president; B. V. Cohen and Robert Szold, vice-presidents; Walter E. Meyer, treasurer; Lawrence H. Marks, assistant treasurer, and Moses A. Leavitt, secretary.

## Col. Henriques Wins King's Jubilee Medal

Henriques, officer commanding the 1st Manchester Cadet Battalion, Jewish Lads' Brigade, has been awarded the King's silver jubilee medal, it was learned today. Colonel Henriques, who is now completing thirty-five years of service, commanded the battalion since its formation.

## Goebbels Is Scored By Liverpool Paper

LIVERPOOL, England.—Dr. Paul Joseph Goebbels, Nazi Cabinet member and aide of Adolf Hitler, is taken to task editorially by the Liverpool Post in commenting on the anniversary of the "purge" of a year ago. The editorial says:

"Neither Dr. Goebbels nor the other Nazi orators who during the week-end were supposed to be commemorating the 'purge' of last year seem to have ventured upon a review of the Hitler regime. What they did, especially Dr. Goebbels, was to indulge in embittered attacks upon certain sections of the German people, and from this it may be surmised that all is not as well under Herr Hitler as the Nazis would like it to be. Dr. Goebbels was contemptuous of the bureaucrats of the old regime, and it appears from this and other speeches that the Nazis do not like the officers of the Reichswehr.

## Street in Tel Aviv To Honor Dreyfus

TEL AVIV, July 15—The name of Col. Alfred Dreyfus will be commemorated in Palestine by naming a street after the late Jewish martyr.

## Vatican Organ Opens Attack On Third Reich

### Violation of Concordat Is Charged Against Nazi Officials

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)  
VATICAN CITY, July 15—Opening a strong attack against Chancellor Adolf Hitler's Third Reich today, the official Vatican journal, Osservatore Romano, sharply charged that the Nazis had violated their Concordat with the Vatican.

The clash was founded on several charges, principal of which was the issue of sterilization. In an address last week, Dr. Wilhelm Frick, Minister of the Interior, warned Catholics they must stop attacking the sterilization law. According to Dr. Frick, good Catholics must obey the law of the land under the Concordat.

On the other hand, the Osservatore Romano says Dr. Frick ignores the Concordat's guarantee to Catholics in Germany of freedom of worship in public and the right to profess their faith.

"For some time Catholics in Germany," says the organ, "have been passing through difficult times for defense of their dogma and Catholic morals and inalienable rights."


