Press Unanimous in Scoring Reich for Latest Nazi Riots

Work, in leading editorials, vester day greeted Hitlerized Germany for the anti-Jewish riots which took place on Kurfuerstendamm in Berlin on Monday evening.

Emphasizing that the accounts of what happened in Berlin are irrefutable, The New York Times

says:
"The official explanation of the rioting and terrorism in Berlin restaurants and hotels is that they were the work of 'irresponsible elements.' But the police did no-thing to make them keep order or to protect innocent and helpless persons. The Nazis who raged through the streets and forced their way into private houses and public places of entertainment may have been irresponsible, but at any rate they know or had been told exactly the people whom they were to assault. Their furor Teutonicus appeared to have something morbid or sadistic about it. It must be sel-dom that a mob anywhere will knock women down and beat and kick them as they lie half con-scious, but it was a common sight in Berlin on Monday. The reports read as if the brutal men guilty of such deeds were really gratifying a long repressed blood-lust."

"The world has been given another glimpse of Nazi mentality and methods," the Times says.
"Yet we shall be told again by the Nazis that Berlin is the very place to hold the Olympic Games, which emphasize good sportsmanship, fair play and respect for womanhood." The Herald-Tribune editorializes:

"Monday night's riot did not become in any sense a popular one until an organized band of Nazis had set the mob many examples of sadistic brutality and had demon-strated that the police who arrived on the scene were not there to afford their Jewish victims any protection whatever. But the fact that the inspiration of these disgraceful scenes was undoubtedly official, emanating from Adolf Hitler's intimate circle, is no apology for the insant zest with which the German populace takes part

Help Refugees, League Urged

nationalistic movement which is ow affecting almost every country in Europe. This movement is the outcome of a number of historical causes going back many years and is made exceedingly acute the economic conditions which are oppressing the world at present

Mr. McDonald emphasized that, out of a total of 80,500 refugees from Germany, the largest number has been settled in Palestine. There are today 27,000 German refugees located in Palestine, 6,000 in the United States, 3,000 in South American countries and 800 in other overseas countries. Eighteen thousand have been repatriated to countries of Central and Eastern Europe. Refugees still living in European lands number 25,700, Mr. McDonald said.

In his report he paid particular tribute to the work of the American Committee. Joint Distribution which has been the most active force in the provision of relief to the refugees in many countries.

Reporting to the governing body on his recent trip to countries of South and Central America to study economic opportunities and immigration possibilities for refug-ees there, he stated:

"In all Latin-America the largest economic possibilities are in Argentine and in Brazil, but it is prein those countries that the present obstacles to immigration are most difficult. Elsewhere in South and Central America the immigration restrictions are much less severe."

Commenting on the absorption of German Jewish refugees in Pales-tine, the High Commissioner declared that "Palestine continues to be the chief country of refuse That small territory, about the size of Wales, has absorbed on a per-manent basis more refugees than all other countries in the world to-gether. This is a record in which the organizations chiefly concerned may fairly take pride.

"But Palestine could not have absorbed these tens of thousands it it had not been for the preparatory work carried through during many years of self-sacrifice and devotion by the thousands who have striven ceaselessly for the ideal of a Jewish National Home. Nor is it without significance that Palestine continues to be one of the very few countries prosperous enough to complain of a shortage of labor.

"The refugees in Palestine are playing a constructive role not only in material things but also in the spiritual and moral upbuilding of their new homeland."

German Repatriation Impossible Referring to the possibility of repatriation to Germany of refugees unable to find openings in coun-tries of refuge, Mr. McDonald declared that "it is impossible for the organizations to recommend in any case any person who had fled Ger-many to return. The German government has taken drastic meas-ures against those returning, not only preventing them from taking employment, but confining them in

're-education camps.'" Of approximately 50,000 refugees who remain in Europe and who have not been able to emigrate overseas, "fifteen to twenty percent are non-Jews who have left Germany for political causes for reasons of conscience," High Commissioner McDonald reported. He stated that "owing to the falling off of the contributions for relief there is a grave position among some thousands of the refugees in Paris and Prague and among smaller number in Ameterdam and other centers. The position is particularly difficult for the non-Jews in these places because of the failure of the Christian hodies hither to, with the splendid exception of the Quakers, to raise funds for
