Court Soon To Review Danzig Plea

League Jurists to Hear Charges of Violation Of Jews' Rights

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) GENEVA, July 18-The Committee of Jurists appointed by the League of Nations to review the various petitions presented to the League against acts of the Danzig Senate, will meet before the end of this month, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learned today.

The Committee of Jurists will examine the petitions presented by Jews, Catholics and other bodies, and will present its report at the next session of the League, which will begin September 5. Captain Anthony Eden, the British diplomat, will be raporteur.

The petition of the Jews of Danzig against the present administration of the Free City was submitted to the League at its last session.
It charged the Nazi-controlled Senate of the Free City with passing unconstitutional laws affecting the rights of Jews in Danzig.

It demanded that the I force the Danzig Senate to abide by the constitution of the Free City, which guarantees the equality of all nationals of Danzig before the law. reads para-"Exceptional laws," graph 73 of the Danzig constitution, "shall be inadmissible. All men and women in Danzig shall have the same civil rights and duties. No legal privileges or disqualifications shall be practiced due to religion, birth or position."

The Jews of Danzig charged that nine laws aprogating Jewish rights were passed by the Danzig Senate since the Nazis gained a majority there, that the anti-Jewish boycott is being conducted with the support of the administration, and that in general the provisions of the League of Nations with regard to national minorities are being vio-

The body of jurists was appoint-ed to investigate the petitions and file a report, following the declara-tion of the president of the Danzig Senate that the Danzig government senate that the Datas government would be ready to repeal its anti-Jewish legislation if the unconsti-tutionality of these acts were es-tablished by a committee of jurists appointed by the League.

Since the organization of the Jewish Agency in 1929, Dr. Senator said, the attitude of the non-Zion-ists to Palestine has undergone a very fundamental change.

The time is now ripe to rally all pro-Palestinian forces around the Jewish Agency, he asserted. The Jewish Agency, he asserted. The Jewish Agency must be reorganized so that new groups and new people can be drawn into the work as re-quired by the present situation in Palestine.

Dr. Senator also gave a review of Dr. Senator also gave a review of the present economic situation in Palestine and pointed out that the prosperity in Palestine is a result of three things—the influx of new immigrants, the stream of private and national capitals coming into the country, and the internal development of agriculture and industry in Palestine.

Dr. Senator came to Europe with the mission of reorganizing the Jewish Agency.

Jews Worry Ecuador to Settle Over Threat In Bulgaria Refugees on Soil

Bill Proposed to Take Away Their Position

As a Minority

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) SOFIA, July 18—The entire Jew-ish community of Bulgaria is greatly agitated today as a result of the proposal of a new law to deprive minorities in Bulgaria of their national status.

If passed, this law would, in effect, make of the Jewish community nect, make of the Jewish community only a religious minority, depriving the Jews of whatever measure of autonomy in internal Jewish life they at present possess.

This law would mean the intervention of the government in the financial affairs of the Jewish community. It would probably result in the complete abolition of all Jewish schools in Bulgaria.

A special conference of Bulgarian Jewish communities took place here today to discuss the newly created situation and to work out a way of combatting the proposed law. It was decided to send a spe-cila delegation to the Bulgarian government with the request that the national status of the Jewish minority be maintained.

Boom in Palestine To Last, Says Cohen

Sir Robert Urges Britain to Let Jews Stay if They Can Find Work

LONDON, July 18—Declaring the prosperity of Palestine has come to stay, Sir Robert Waley Cohen, chairman of the Palestine Economic Corporation in London, urged at its board meeting here today that the British government return to its traditional policy and enable Jews to stay in Palestine if they can find

In his speech Sir Robert paid tribute to the Palestine Arabs, a ma-jority of whom, he said, appreciate what Jewish enterprise has contributed to raise the standard of living in the land.

Reich Littered By Propaganda Shrieking 'Liar'

Official Nazi Publication Says Jews Can't Live If Truth Prevails

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, July 18—Distribution of anti-Semitic propaganda in Berlin and the rest of the country continued unabated today despite assurances by Nazi authorities that the anti-Jewish outbreaks on Kurfuerstendamm were instigated by elements "inimical to the State."

In Berlin a manifest owas issued by the Judenkenner, the official Nazi anti-Semitic journal, saying that "the Jew lives on lies and dies of truth."

This reference was apparently made in connection with sharp criticism voiced abroad against this week's anti-Jewish riot in Ber-

The manifesto was ordered posted in various factories and offices in Berlin. The order was issued by local Nazi "workers' cells" lead-The text of the manifesto reads:

"German National Comrade, do you know that the Jew lies to you, robs you, cheats you, and calls you 'cattle'?

50,000 Families to Till Seven Vast Land Tracts

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) LONDON, July 18-The government of Ecuador has officially agreed to large scale Jewish settlement, placing 1,250,000 acres of land at the disposal of Jewish col-

onization agencies, it was announced here today. The agreement, which was nego-

tiated by Dr. Brutzkus, head of the Emcol, Jewish emigration and colonization organization, has already been signed by Don Jose Velasco Ibarra, president of Ecuador, and will go into effect as soon as it is ratified by the conference of Jewish territorialist societies, which is scheduled to meet here over the

The Ecuadorian government is setting aside for Jewish colonias-tion seven tracts of land, mainly forest land, which are capable of maintaining 50,000 tamilies. This land is being offered on a three fiveyear option. A condition of the government is that devails ment of the land botton before the expiration of the options.

The new colonies must be built along cooperative lines and they must keep an "open door" for non-Jewish refugees as well. It is also stipulated that the colonies be so conducted as in no way to harm the company nestion of the vertice. the economic position of the native population.

The agreement also sets forth that the colonization of Jews in Ecuador shall have no autonomous basis, and that Spanish must be the official language of the colonies.

The announcement that the government of Ecuador has officially agreed to set aside for the disposal of Jewish colonization agencies sufficient land capable

of maintaining 50,000 Jewish families may be of interest not only to Jewish institutions inter ested in the fate of German and Polish Jews but also to the

League of Nations.
Only Wednesday James G. Mc-Donald, the High Commissioner for Refugees, appealed to the League of Nations to take over League of Nations to take over the responsibility for settling the Jewish refugees from Germany along the same lines as it did with regard to the Greek, Assyrian, Armenian and other re-

If the League of Nations claims that it finds no territory for set-tling Jewish refugees, this is no longer a valid excuse. The 1,250, 000 acres of land now allotted by the government of Ecuador for Jewish settlement inva invalidates territory where Jewish refugees can be admitted.

Not Complete Surprise

The news which comes from Ecuador is not a surprise to those Jewish circles which were quietly conducting negotiations with a number of smaller govern-ments to colonize Jewish rements to colonize Jewish re-fugees in their lands on a large scale. Such negotiations were conducted with the Portuguese government to obtain a territory for Jewish colonization in An-gola. Such negotiations are being conducted with the French government for the admittance of Jews in Syria. Such negotiations were also conducted with the gov-ernment of Ecuador.

The details of the agreement reached between the Emcol, the recently formed Jewish Emigration and Colonization Society, and the president of Ecuador, which were made nublic vester day in London, have seen kept secret for various technical rea sons. They were made public yesterday only in connection with a conference of Jewish ter were made public ritorialist organizations whice opens in London this week-end.

This conference, which will be addressed by prominent non-Jews interested in the present Jewish situation in Europe, was organized by representatives of central Jewish organizations interested in constructive relief for European Jewry. The organizers of this conference are people of recognized repute as far as Jewconstructive relief activities are concerned.

A New Chapter Opens

Should the agreement with the Ecuadorian government be rati-fied at the London conference, a new chapter will be opened in the history of Jewish colonization: Not only Jewish refugees f Germany will be facilitated ed to Ecuador, but also from Poland and other countries where the Jewish popu lation is suffering oppression

There is no doubt that the Ecuador agreement also will attract the interest of such organi-zations as the Joint Distribution Committee, the Hilfsverein and the Jewish Colonization Association. Personal Glimpse Of the Nazi Terror

The Berlin correspondent of the Manchester Evening News, report-ing on the boycott of the Jews in Germany, writes:

The anti-Jewish boycott spreading from Julius Streicher's realm in Franconia and that of his disciples in western and southeastern Germany to Berlin, whose Jews hitherto have been free from the grosser and more open forms of persecution. Today in Neukolln, a largely industrial and formerly Communistic district in the north of Berlin, Streicher's Brownshirt followers closed a Jewish-owned ice-cream store with all the familiar attendant features of this kind of anti-Semitic activity.

I visited the district this evening. Crowds were standing in front of the store, which had been locked earlier in the day. The windows had been plastered with sheets torn out of Strei-cher's newspaper Stuermer containing hideous caricatures and offensive cartoons of Jews. sheets of the Sturmer were fastened down at the corners with printed labels bearing the words "To buy from the Jews is to be a traiter to Germany." A patrol of three uniformed Nazis walked slowly up and down the street in front of the shop with copies of the Sturmer.

At each end of the street con-

ies of the Stuermer were on sale. I did not, however, see a single copy sold to the un-uniformed working-class neonle in the streets. A Nazi party officer in uniform was in conversation. in uniform was in conversation, with a group of Nazis in mufti who were wearing their party badge. There were a good number of other Nazis about in uniform and in Mufti. Two policemen were on duty near the shop.

The ordinary people in the undertones. They contented themundertones. They contented them-selves chiefly with looking in si-lence at the Stuermer cartoons plastered on the window. I saw no sign that they approved of the closing of the shop. The only comment made to me was by a woman—women are less cowed "When is this lunacy going to be stopped?"

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) WARSAW, July 18-Establish-ment of the third National Fund for cultural purposes, bearing the name of the late Hebrew poet laureate Chaim Nachman Bialik will be considered at the forthcoming World Zionist Congress, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency was informed today by reliable sources close to the Hebrew World Union and Tarbuth in Poland.
