HEEDLESS OF WARNINGS, NEW YORK PRESS DRIVE ON JEWS

BERLIN, August 1. (JTA) -- The Jews of Germany today had new evidence of the determination of the Nazi authorities to push their anti-Semitic campaign in the face of world disapproval and even the warnings of Dr. Hjalmar Schacht, Minister of Economics and president of the Reichsbank.

On the heels of the report, obviously emanating from inspired Nazi quarters, that a "truce" on activities against the Jews had been declared following a conference of Hitler, Goering and General Von Blomberg, Jews were presented with evidence that the "truce" was a figment of the imagination calculated to appease foreign sentiment.

Yesterday, the municipal press and the propaganda office issued warning to Jews who were flocking or reported to be flocking from the provinces to this city, to stay away. The warning stated that Jews without money will not receive city relief and will be sent to the workhouse until their expulsion can be arranged.

As this warning was being issued, Dr. Schacht was making a speech, while dedicating a bust of Hitler in the Reichsbank Hall, in which he voiced strong disapproval of Nazi strong-arm methods. Dr. Schacht warned that a continuance of the disturbances will bring economic ruin to the nation, "whether these disturbances occur in the intellectual or economic field."

That his warning, as those he has uttered in the past, has little chance of being heeded, becomes increasingly apparant as instances of anti-Jewish activities continue to pile up.

Yesterday, Willi Zeyn, noted German film director, was expelled by the Reich's Film Chamber for lending his name to a film produced by a Jew.

Hans Hinkel, newly appointed Commissar for Cultural Activities, issued an order prohibiting "Aryans" married to Jews from continuing in cultural activities of any kind.

It was learned today that Dr. Yoffe, a Jewish lawyer, abducted by Nazis during the Kurfuerstendamm riots two weeks ago, has not been heard from since.

The Mayor of Quedlinburg, declaring that Jews are unable to comprehend German culture, issued an order prohibiting them from visiting the cathedral, museum and palace there.

For displaying her husband's war medals in her front window on a placard reading, "These medals were won by a Jew who lost his life for Germany during the war," a Jewish widow in Coblenz was today in the "protective custody" of the Coblenz Authorities.

On Budapesterstrasse in Berlin, a Jewish store manager was shot by an "Aryan" following a quarrel during which the latter suddenly whipped out a revolve and, shouting "Jewish swine," fired four shots into the Jew. The incident was not reported in today's press.

STAY-OUT-OF OLYMPICS SENTIMENT GROWS

NEW YORK, August 1. (JTA) -- Sentiment here continued to mount today in favor of the United States withdrawing from participation in the 1936 Olympics in Berlin.

The Daily News, tabloid newspaper with more than 1,500,000 readers, publishes an editorial teday strongly urging that America absent itself from the international game.

Yesterday, Commonweal, influential Catholic weekly, called upon members of the Catholic Church to boycott the event.

Last night in White Plains, Jeremiah T. Mahoney, president of the Amateur Athletic Union, addressing a dinner of the Committee of 100 of the Jewish Education Association, renewed previously voiced objection to American participation in the Olympics. He said the A. A. U. at its convention here in the fall will carefully investigate the question of participation.

DEMAND SAFETY FOR DANZIG JEWS

WARSAW, August 1. (JTA) -- Protection for Danzig Jewry was demanded today in a telegram sent in behalf of Polish Jewry to the League of Nations Council now meeting in Geneva.

The telegram was signed by Rabbi Dr. Schor, Dr. Joshua Gotlieb, Deputy Dr. Hartglass and Rosmarin, and A. Mazur, Jewish Community leader.

Yesterday a delegation from the German Refugee Committee in Poland had an interview at the Foreign Office about the anti-Jewish acts of the Nazis in Danzig, and they were promised assistance by the authorities.

DANZIG PAPER CONFISCATED

DANZIG, August 1. (JTA) -- The Danziger Echo, only Jewish newspaper in the German language published here, was confiscated today by the local censor before it went to press.

The last number of the Danziger Echo, published last week, was also confiscated by the authorities for printing a correspondence from Berlin reporting the anti-Jewish excesses there during and after the Kurfuerstendamm riots.

RED HUNGER-STRIKERS PROTEST

JERUSALEM, August 1. (JTA) -- An official statement issued by the authorities here today in connection with the hunger-strike of 52 Communist prisoners who are protesting because they are being treated like criminal prisoners, points out that the Palestine law is similar to the English law in this respect and does not permit political prisoners to receive special treatment unless the Courts verdict expressly recommends it.

"It is not up to the discretion of prison officials to accord special treatment to political prisoners," the Government's statement declares.

The government also points out that only three of the prisoners, including a woman convicted of theft, are forced to wear prison clothes.

The hunger-strikers, says the official statement, are under the care of government doctors. All are taking water and they are in no immediate danger. Two of the strikers however, have been removed to the prison hospital, and one, who is suffering with tuberculosis, was removed to the Government Hospital.

PICK DELEGATES TO POLISH-JEWISH PARLEY

NEW YORK, August 1. (JTA) -- The Federation of Polish Jews in America tonight chose five delegates to represent it at the World Conference to be held in London, September 7-11, for the purpose of adopting measures for the aid of the three and one-half million indigent Jews in Poland.

BUENOS AIRES, August 1. (JTA) -- The Polish Jewish societies in Argentine will be represented by three delegates at the forth-coming world conference for the aid of Polish Jews. Conferences to chose delegates will also shortly be held in Brazil, Uruguay, Paraguay and Chile, it was learned here today.

MEXICO, August 1. (JTA) -- Mr. Rosenberg, editor of the only Yiddish newspaper in Mexico "Der Weg", was chosen yesterday to represent Polish Jews in Mexico at the forthcoming London World Conference of Polish Jews.

TEL AVIV, August 1. (JTA) -- The following delegates were elected to represent Polish Jews in Palestine at the World Conference in London in September, Mr. Grosskopf, M. J. Fried, vice-president of Federation of Polish Jews in Palestine, Dr. Friend, J. L. Wollman, and A. Weiss.

MONTREAL, August 1. (JTA) -- Polish Jews here decided today to send one delegate to the Conference of Polish Jews in London in September, and also decided to send A. Welkofsy to Toronto tomorrow, to persuade Polish Jews in Toronto to do likewise.

LONDON, August 1. (JTA) -- The Central Bureau in charge of organizing the forthcoming World Conference of Polish Jewish Societies to plan a relief program for their indigent brethren in Poland, announced today that it has received information from Polish Jewish in most European countries that they will send delegates to the conference.

It is now definite that Holland will be represented by Dr. Taubes, and Austria by Dr. Kreppel, Luxemburg, Germany, France and Belgium have also already chosen delegates. The Central Bureau of the Jewish Cooperative and Economic Committee in Poland will send observers to the Conference.

HUGE CROWDS AT LESZCZYNSKI BURIAL

WARSAW, August 1. (JTA) -- Huge crowds followed the funeral cortege today of Joseph Leszczynski, noted Polish Jewish writer editor and leader of the Jewish Socialist movement, who died Monday at Otwocks.

Numerous delegations of Jewish trade unions, the Polish Socialist Party, the Socialist Zionist Party, the Trotzkiites, and the Jewish Socialist Party "Bund," marched after the hearse, carrying their banners and wreaths. A band played revolutionary airs. The hearse was covered with a red flag.

Leszczynski was buried at the Warsaw Jewish Cemetery next to the grave of the late "Bund" leader B. Michalevitch.

Joseph Leszczynski, a brother of the noted Jewish economist, Jacob Leszczynski, was born in Horodischtsch, Poland in 1884.

BULGARIAN-JEWS RECEIVED BY PREMIER

SOFIA, August 1. (JTA) -- A special delegation representing the Bulgarian Jewish communities was today received by Premier Andreja Toscheff. The delegation demanded that the national status of the Jewish minority in Bulgaria be preserved and that the minorities electoral principle be abided by.

The Jewish Communities sent the delegation to the Premier as the result of a proposal made here two weeks ago for a new law to deprive the national minorities in Bulgaria of their national status. The new law would consider the Jewish minority merely as a religious body, and would deprive the Jews of autonomy in their internal community life. The law would also empower the Government to intervene in the financial affairs of the Jewish community and in the operation of its schools.

The Premier admitted that the Jewish demand was justified and promised the delegation the support of the Government, saying "My government is very favorable to the Jews, after all, we are all members of one big family."

The delegation also expressed its apprehension about the legalization here last week of two anti-Semitic organizations, Rodna Zashchita and the National Legion, while other political organizations are still banned in Bulgaria.

The Premier assured the delegation that the government would not permit any new anti-Semitic activities, as these would be harm-ful to Bulgarian interests, he said.

FREE ARABS OF MURDER CHARGE

JERUSALEM, August 1. (JTA) -- The Court of Appeals today acquitted the Arabs who had been sentenced for the murder of the Jew-ish farmer, Blonder, of the colony at Afuleh.

Blonder was murdered by Arab thieves when he tried to prevent the theft of threshing equipment from the Jewish colony.

6 JEWS KILLED AS CURIE HOUSE FALLS

WARSAW, August 1. (JTA) -- The bodies of six Jews were recovered today from the ruins of the four-story birthplace of Mme. Curie, discoverer of radium, which collapsed here yesterday-- burying at least a score of persons.

Six more are reported missing.
