ANTI-NAZI ACTIVITY TO BE PUNISHED BY DEATH

BERLIN, AUGUST 2. (JTA)-- Activity against the Nazi party and its various subsidiary organizations will be punished by death as treason, it was disclosed today by Roland Freisler, state secretary for the Ministry of Justice.

Under Freisler's plan, foreigners would also be liable to serious punishment for anti-Nazi activity. It is expected that the plan will be included in a forthcoming new penal code.

Meanwhile the anti-Jewish campaign throughout the country continued unabated. In Goslar, the City Council decided not to change the name of its Judenstrasse. Instead the council ordered erection of a sign reading, "This street recalls ancient times when Jews, tolerated as guests, were forced to live only here."

The Koenigsberg Zoo in Berlin, once a much-frequented meeting place for Jews, was barred to Jewish visitors today and a notice to that effect posted at the entrance.

Meanwhile, one death was reported as a result of the Kurfuerstendamm riot of July 16. Dr. Kleinfeld, a Jewish physician, died yesterday of injuries received at the hands of Nazis who dragged him from a cafe, beat him into unconsciousness and left him in the gutter.

Secret police officials denied that Werner Neumann, killed as "a peace disturber who attacked a secret policeman," was Jewish.

REPORT NEW JOB FOR STREICHER

PRAHA, AUGUST 2. (JTA) -- Julius Streicher, Number One anti-Semite in Germany and publisher of the pornographic Jew-baiting Stuermer, will be appointed head of a special department for Jewish affairs soon to be created, it is reported today from Berlin.

The Prager Tageblatt, which claims to have the information from authoritative sources, asserts that Streicher's candidacy for this job is being supported by Nazi party headquarters at the Brown House in Munich, although the Foreign Office and the Ministry of Trade are opposed to it for fear of repercussions abroad.

LACKED PALESTINE FARE, COMMITS SUICIDE

WARSAW, AUGUST 2. (JTA) -- After waiting eight years for a certificate permitting him to go to Palestine as a pioneer worker, Josef Urbach, 26, well-known in Lowicz Hechalutz circles, today committed suicide for lack of 150 zlotys, less than thirty dollars, the sum necessary to pay his fare to Palestine.

500 GET SOVIET SPECIALIST DIPLOMAS

MOSCOW, AUGUST 2. (JTA) -- More than 500 Jewish young men and women have been graduated this month from Jewish technical and professional schools in Soviet Russia, it was reported here today.

They are now qualified specialists in various fields, including agriculture, building, mechanics, etc. All have already been placed, some in Jewish collectives in various parts of Russia, some in the general Russian enterprises, and others in the Jewish autonomous region in Bureya, the report states.

EXTENT OF JAPANESE 'DUMPING' IN PALESTINE

JERUSALEM, AUGUST 2. (JTA) -- The full extent of Japanese dumping in Palestine was revealed today when the Customs Department published an official report for exports and imports for the month of March.

The report reveals that while Japan imported from Palestine only five dollars worth of goods during the month, it dumped goods to the value of £ 82, 477 close to half a million dollars, during the same period.

Charges were made today by the owners of the "Meshi" silk mills, owned by A. S. Sachs of Passaic, New Jersey, which were forced to shut down last week as a result of Japanese dumping, that every type and quality of silk manufactures by local importers, and that huge quantities of silks copied from the Palestine product, were then shipped from Japan to Palestine.

3,222 JEWS ARRIVED IN U.S. IN HALF YEAR

NEW YORK, AUGUST 2. (JTA) -- A total of 3,222 Jewish aliens arrived in the United States between January 4 and May 31 of this year, according to a report made public by the Hebrew Sheltering and Immigrant Aid Society today.

Of the total 1,845 were immigrants, the report stated. The HIAS took custody over 1,732 Jewish aliens pending contact with their relatives.

It was revealed that 47,370 persons had applied to the HIAS information Bureau during the first half of this year. In addition requests were received from 3,750 persons abroad to locate relatives here.

The Ellis Island Bureau had 3,568 inquiries and served 7,649 kosher meals to those detained on the island. The Shelter Department provided 185,188 meals and 21,004 nights of shelter to Jewish homeless and unemployed

WARSAW JEWS HOLD ANTI-NAZI RALLY

WARSAW, AUGUST 2. (JTA) -- A huge mass meeting was held here last night to protest against the anti-Jewish atrocities in Germany.

Leaders of Polish Jewry and Sejm deputies addressed the meeting. Resolutions calling for a united boycott action against Nazi Germany and for foreign intervention to curb the anti-Semitic excesses, were cabled to the Board of Jewish Deputies in London, as well as to the League of Nations, which was also asked to protect German-Jewish refugees.

The Society for the Defense of Home Industries organized a month ago by Polish Jews to replace the German Boycott Committee which was dissolved by the Polish authorities was today legalized by the Government.

The German Boycott Committee was dissolved on the insistence of Germany in the negotiations between Germany and Poland for a renewed trade agreement between the two countries.

SAXONY SEEKS TO EXPEL POLISH JEWS

WARSAW, AUGUST 2. (JTA) -- Led by District Chief Mutschmann, a striking campaign is being waged against Polish Jews who settled in Saxony since the war, information received here today revealed.

According to the report, seventy Jewish families were ordered to leave Saxony immediately. Since German regulations forbid the export of German currency, the refugees are forced to leave all their possessions behind.

They have appealed to the Polish consul against their expulsion and against the confiscation of their property, and it is expected that the consul will intervene on their behalf.

NAZI CARDS WARN JEWS IN LONDON SUBURB

LONDON, AUGUST 2. (JTA) -- Scores of cards with the inscription "Britons do not allow Jews to tamper with white girls", have been strewn in the gardens of a number of houses in Waremead Road, Ilford, a suburb of London, the London Star reports.

The inscription is printed in black letters on a white background and is superimposed on a red swastika.

There is an air of mystery connected with the incident, since the cards were found in the back gardens, and there is no way to the gardens on this street save through the houses themselves. The occupants of the houses claim to be on the friendliest relations with Jews. The local branch of the Fascists also disclaim any responsibility for the cards.

The police are investigating, since similar complaints about anti-Semitic manifestations in the town have been made frequently in the past three months.

SPLIT IN ORTHODOX LABOR ZIONISTS

JERUSALEM, AUGUST 2. (JTA)-- Several old members of Hapoel Hamizrachi, the orthodox labor Zionist organization, among them some of the founders of the organization, have quit the parent body because of dissatisfaction with its present policies. They have formed a separate organization to be known as "Original Hapoel Hamizrachi".

It is understood that the new wing will request recognition as a separate group at the forthcoming world convention of the Mizrachi organization, which will take place in Lucerne on the eve of the World Zionist Congress.

NAME KATZNELSON RADIO AIDE

JERUSALEM, AUGUST 2. (JTA) -- Dr. A. Katznelson, member of the Vaad Leumi, Jewish national council in Palestine, was appointed by High Commissioner Arthur G. Wauchope to serve on the Program Advisory Committee in connection with the new Palestine broadcasting service soon to be established.

The committee will consist of five members representing Jews Arabs, and the Government education and press departments.

SCHWABACHER DIES ON COAST

SAN FRANCISCO, AUGUST 2. (JTA) -- Louis A. Schwabacher outstanding Jewish civic worker, and president of the Hebrew Home for the Aged died here today. He was 66 years old.
