NAZIS PLANNING TO STARVE-OUT JEWS

BERLIN, August 8. (JTA) -- Systematic starvation of Jews to force them out of provincial cities has been undertaken by the Nazis on a wide scale, it became apparent today from reports reaching Berlin from many parts of Germany.

The reports gave startling confirmation of the recent order to all members of the Nazi party to make August the bitterest month for Jews in the history of Germany.

While the campaign to starve Jews out of the provincial cities got off to a flying start today, in Berlin Nazi chieftains were in conference to map out plans to keep the same Jews from taking refuge in the capital. The conference was called by Wolf von Helldorf, Berlin's police president, and Julius Lippert, Nazi commissioner for Berlin. Plans to introduce food restrictions for Jews in Berlin were discussed by the Nazi leaders. A plan to revoke the licenses of Jewish cafes and confectioners was also broached, it is understood.

The starvation drive took on the most serious proportions in towns and cities throughout Pomerania and East Prussia. Grocers in those provinces have been ordered by the Nazis to refuse to sell to Jews. Hotels have been instructed not to accommodate Jews with room and board. Most hotels in these districts have suddenly sprouted signs announcing "No hotel accommodations for Jews." Similarly, restaurants have been ordered by the Nazis to display signs announcing that "We Don't Sell to Jews."

The food situation for Jews throughout the Reich has thus become acute. Only those Jewish families fortunate enough to have in their employ non-Jewish servants are able to obtain food by the expedient of sending the servants to do their shopping.

In Berlin, a large sign has been erected by Nazis in Oranienburger Street in front of the headquarters of the Berlin Jewish Community. The sign shows a picture of a Jew stripped of his clothes. The inscription under it is: "This is how we will force Jews to leave Germany."

In Essen, Frankfurt-am-Main, Chemnitz, Bad Mannheim, Limburg, Bad Homburg and numerous other cities, Jews were thrown into a panic by anti-Jewish demonstrations by uniformed storm troopers. In the district of Hanover alone, twenty-two demonstrations against Jews as "racial enemies" were staged by the Nazis last night.

Street demonstrations in Braunschweig were addressed by Prince Schamburg-Lippe, who was sent specially by Propaganda Minister Goebbels, he announced, for the purpose of fighting "Jews and other dark forces of Germany."

At a meeting of hotel keepers, owners of furnished apartments and delicatessen stores in Rheinsberg, it was decided not to serve Jews in the future and to display the sign "Jews not served here."

In Mannheim an order was issued to city officials obligating them to help in the anti-Jewish fight. In Pomerania an order was published prohibiting non-Jews from having personal commercial association with Jews.

The Voelkischer Beobachter reports today that the Municipality of Breuningweiler, Pfalz, decided "in recognition of Jewry's responsibility for the greatest misfortune of the fatherland, and because Jews are the greatest opponents of Hitler," to ban Jews from acquiring property or settling in the municipality.

Artisans, tradesman, or peasants having dealings with Jews cannot receive municipal contracts, the decision states.

Pointing to an anti-Jewish pronouncement made by the acting evangelical Bishop of Berlin, Provost Eckert, as proof, the Voelkischer Beobachter, announces today "The Church admits, in the name of Christendom, that Jewish influence must be exterminated."

Provost Eckert had issued a statement condemning an article written by an executive member of the Berlin Mission, and appearing in the Berlin Mission organ, wherein it was conceded that "Jews are capable of great historic achievements."

The acting Bishop alleges that the founder of the mission, Adolf Stoerker, "acting in the spirit of Christ, Luther and Adolf Hitler attempted to free Germany of the disintegrating influence of Jewry."

ARBITRATORS CHOSEN IN JACOBS KIDNAPING CASE

BERLIN, August 8. (JTA) -- The German and Swiss governments have agreed on the appointment of arbitrators to examine the case of Herr Berthold Jacob, the German-Jewish journalist who was kidnapped in March on Swiss soil, and is now in prison in Germany, it was learned here today.

The chairman of the arbitration board will be Dr. Raphael Erich, Finnish Minister in Stockholm. The German representative will be Baron von Freytag-Loringhoven, German member of the Permanent Court of Arbitration at the Hague, and the Swiss will be represented by Professor Max Huber of Zurich, formerly vice-president of the Permanent Court of International Justice.

There will also be two neutral arbitrators.

MIZRACHI URGED TO LEAVE ZIONIST ORGANIZATION

CRAKOW, August 8. (JTA) -- Delegates of thirty countries are attending the Mizrachi World Conference, which opened here today.

The executive committee of the Polish Mizrachi organization, introduced a resolution demanding that the World Mizrachi organization leave the Zionist Organization if the Congress at Lucerne fails to accept a series of resolutions proposed by Mizrachi against the alleged spread of atheism in Palestine.

The executive committee of the Polish Mizrachi also urged that Mizrachi should not participate in the next Zionist Executive.

DE HAAS, NEWMAN, REVISIONIST CONGRESS CANDIDATES

PARIS, August 8. (JTA) -- Jacob de Haas, American Zionist and one-time collaborator of Dr. Theodor Herzl, and Rabbi Louis I. Newman, of New York, will be General Zionist candidates for the forthcoming constituent congress of the New Zionist Organization being established by the Zionist Revisionists, the organization's headquarters announced here today.

ARABS CREATE NATIONAL FUND

JERUSALEM, August 8. (JTA) -- The Arab National Fund was registered here today with the stated purpose of buying, acquiring and leasing land for Arabs. The land thus obtained, it was announced, will be cultivated and developed by building projects.

AGUDAH PRINCIPAL DIES

VIENNA, August 8. (JTA) -- Dr. Samuel Deutschlander, principal of the Keren Hatorah school, and founder of the Beth Jacob schools of the Agudath Israel, extreme orthodox Jewish party, died here today at 47.

PALESTINE SURPLUS GROWS IN MAY

JERUSALEM, August 8. (JTA) -- The Palestine government today officially announced that the treasury surplus for the month of May totalled £500,000.

TISHA B'AV AT WAILING WALL

JERUSALEM, August 8. (JTA) -- The Wailing Wall was thronged with thousands of Jews today, who came to pray on Tisha B'Av, day of mourning for the destruction of The Temple of which the wall is a relic.

The event passed peacefully. It was the sixth anniversary of the beginning of the bloody anti-Jewish riots that swept Palestine in 1929.

RIVKAH GALIN, POETESS, DIES

NEW YORK, August 8. (JTA) -- Rivkah Galin, Yiddish poetess and teacher, died here today at the Montefiore Hospital. She was 45. Miss Galin was noted for her poems for children. She was born in Lechowitz, Poland.

AMERICAN'S HALF-MILLION BEQUEST ACCEPTED

WARSAW, August 8. (JTA) -- Despite the refusal of the anti-Semitic Endek (National Democrats) majority in the Municipal Council of Bromberg, in Polish Pomerania, the government today officially accepted the half-million dollar bequest of an American citizen, Mrs. Lena Cohen, for the poor Jews of her birthplace.

LATE FLASHES

HITLER AWARDS CROSS TO JEW

JERUSALEM, August 8. (JTA) -- Reichsfuehrer Hitler has awarded the Hindenburg Cross to Hans Davidsohn, Jewish proprietor of the Zion Hotel in the Jewish quarter of Haifa, it became known here today.

Davidsohn has accepted the award.

The German Consul here sent the cross to Davidsohn with a letter, in which was included a citation from the Reichs Chancellory.

BERLIN, August 8. (JTA) -- Julius Streicher, high priest of anti-Semitism in Germany, today received his first official, invitation to speak in Berlin on the Jewish question. He will deliver an address Aug.15 at the Sportspalast which seats 15,000 persons.
